



Eliminations for the National Team to represent Australia at the South Pacific Shooting Federation Championships have now been completed.





1985 NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

Despite the weather, which had been described as being typically Victorian, the 1985 Skeet Championships attracted record numbers, just short of the magical 200, which for skeet shooting augurs well for the future. The Melbourne Gun Club was prepared for the large attendance and their club grounds were once again turned out in magnificent condition.

The V.C.T.A., as the Organising Committee, were in readiness to conduct the first computerised National Skeet Championships. The office, under the supervision of the A.C.T.A. Administration Manager, Peter O'Donnell, was also in readiness with the accustomed manual system and each function was providing a back-up for the other.

The manual system with Executive Members Kaye Woods, Jim Scott and Laurie Connors were well experienced in their role while the computer was being "let loose" for the first time.

Despite the many problems that in the main were brought about by the power dropout (this has now been rectified) the system for future Nationals is most definitely heading towards full computerisation and this will be evident by the procedure that is being prepared for the Trap Nationals in April.

Overall, the manual system may have finished ahead over the carnival. However the computer is now in full training and will be a force to be reckoned with from now on. Particularly in Victoria, where the V.C.T.A. has been converted.

EVENT ONE: CITY OF MELBOURNE SKEET CHAMPIONSHIP

With competitors totalling 156 for this event, the stage was set for a magnificent introduction to the Championships.

Despite the rain, which by now was coming down heavily, the shooting was of a high standard. After a prolonged shoot-off, John Summers emerged the overall winner with 162/162 from a very determined Mervyn Hass of Toowoomba who recorded a very meritorious 161/162.

Best lady in the event was Maree Rooke from Wagga who returned a 49/50, Junior Mark Old, Melbourne who shot very well for his 47/50 and the Veteran shooting in fine style, Ray Melville of Tamworth with a 50/50.

All shooters appreciated the fact that the rain was a problem; however, John Summers was certainly not complaining.

The Melbourne Gun Club are to be congratulated for the quality of trophies they awarded to all grade winners. Well done Melbourne Gun Club and President Bob Buchan.

EVENT TWO: NATIONAL SKEET CARNIVAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Again, entries exceeded the 150 nominations, only just with 151, however sufficient in quantity and quality to produce some good shooting.

The weather showing slight improvement again did not enhance the shooting, but there were many good performances, none better than Adrian Cousens, Melbourne, who recorded a magnificent 118/118 to edge out John Summers in a shoot-off. John, although shooting consistently, missed and was left on 117/118 with Mervyn Hass continuing his good form with a consistent 111/112.

Best lady, Carol Ogden from Melbourne was out to do well on 48/50, Mark Old was again the best Junior with a fine effort of 46/50 and Alf Najar from Wakehurst was the winner of the Veterans with a well-shot 47/50.

EVENT THREE: AUSTRALASIAN SKEET CHAMPIONSHIP

Again, 151 entries, with shooters from all States competing. All eyes however were on the eventual winner, Adrian Cousens, who looked as though he couldn't miss, and neither he did for 127/127 was enough to defeat another good competitor in Rob Dower from S.A.G.C. who shot a 126/127.

All grades were keenly contested with good scores being consistently recorded.

Best Lady, again, was Carol Ogden with a 48/50 and determined to do better. The Juniors trophy was won by Mark Old who shot well for his 47/50 and that old campaigner Ray Melville was there again to take out the Veterans with a 62/62.

EVENT FOUR: ALL STATES SKEET CHAMPIONSHIP

The man who could do no wrong, Adrian Cousens, was again the focal point, for as fast as they let them go he shot them down. Adrian who was trying not to show the strain that he was obviously feeling never let himself down and was well on the way to recording a magnificent championships result.

Even though he was shooting well, Adrian certainly did not have things all his own way. Jim Briggs from Hobart was pushing the event right out and at 136/137 the Championship was decided with Adrian Cousens shooting 137/137.

With the risk of repetition, Carol Ogden shot a magnificent 57/58 to record her third win over the carnival. Thomas Weis from Darwin took out the Juniors award with his 49/50 and our New Zealand visitor, genial E. McRae, was the best Veteran with his 49/50.

EVENT FIVE: COMMONWEALTH SKEET CHAMPIONSHIP

Entries again over the 150 with a total number of 159 shooting.

Good shooting in all grades was producing the good scores that competitors were looking for.

Shoot-offs decided all grades with Reg Clarke from N.S.W. taking out the event with 162/162 from Adrian Cousens who finally missed one after shooting a new skeet National Break of 518.

Reg Clarke, an experienced shooter by any standard, showed that he was certainly not lacking in temperament and kept the pressure on for what appeared to be an eternity.

An excellent effort from the winner who defeated a shooter who was really in form.

Carol Ogden continued her form to record a well-shot 97/100 with Thomas Weis from Darwin recording 92/100 for the Junior and Ray Melville again the best Veteran with 98/100.

The overall trophy donated by Olimpyc Targets was well appreciated by the winner and indeed all shooters.

EVENT SIX: 16th AUSTRALIAN SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

The premier event, after shooting so well for three days, Adrian Cousens was the man to beat.

Displaying all of his undoubted skill, Adrian was the eventual championship winner with the Ladies, Junior, Veterans Double being taken out by Carol Ogden, Thomas Weis and Ray Melville respectively.

Olimpyc Targets provided a magnificent trophy to the overall winners and the support given the A.C.T.A. by Sergio Zuffo and his Company is very much appreciated.

Some great performances: Carol Ogden, winning five of six events — Lady; Mark Old, winning three events — Junior; Thomas Weis, winning three events — Junior; Ray Melville, winning four of six events — Veteran; Adrian Cousens, winning four of six events — Open; Adrian Cousens, Australian Skeet Break Record — 518; State Shoulder to Shoulder — Queensland — 247-250.

As always, space does not allow the recording of the many other notable achievements recorded at this most successful of National Skeet Championships. Many names

have been mentioned, many have not. To those whose efforts have not been recognised the shooters who competed know who you are and will certainly alert others to your skill.

All results from the 1985 National Skeet Championships are published separately in this issue of the C.T.S.N. and we thank you for playing your part in 1985. WAGGA, N.S.W. 1986







OUR HISTORY IN WORDS & PICTURES

CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS CUP WINNERS, EARLIER DAYS

Frequently we hear questions asked as to who were the previous winners of our prestigious title, the Champion of Champions cup, and also who in the past has been the High Gun in the International match for Australia. Delving through the archives it is interesting to note the names, several of whom recur in both events over the years.

The Champion of Champions cup was first mooted in 1936 (this was the year we became a National Association). Following the donation of a handsome sterling silver Champion of Champions cup by the world champion shot Donald Mackintosh, the cup was won in the year of inauguration by Horrie James, then manager for the gunsmithing firm of Donald Mackintosh.

Very little information is available concerning the conditions of championship shooting in the years prior to World War 2. We do know however that championships were shot from lane 3, each competitor shooting five targets from this position on several visits to a single trap. The event itself was a one-day program and attracted a field of some 35 to 40 competitors, mostly local shooters.

This was a pattern that remained until 1948. In 1937 the event was won by Len Bertram, a stalwart of the sport in its initial stages in Victoria. He won the event on the 77th round. A feature of the event was that he was shooting with an ancient Leo Mills gun that he had paid $\pounds7.10$ (\$9) for.

The following year 1938 W.N. Lancaster of Mildura was the winner. Lancaster was only declared winner after a protest had been lodged and dismissed. His score was 47/50 on both occasions. Horrie Donelly of Melbourne was the 1941 winner. His score was 52/60. Donelly won again in 1948 with a score of 49/50 under the most vile conditions.

It was the last occasion that the event was shot in Victoria on Kings Birthday weekend. The day was

Frank Johnson was 1954 International High Gun, score 99/100. Sperry Marshall was 1955 and 1958 Champion of Champions with a score of 75/75 and 90/90 respectively. Paul was also two-times winner of the title in 1959 with a score of 90/90 and in 1968 with 92/92. Sperry in 1974 and 1975 also took out High Gun honours in the international teams match with scores of 320/321 and 299/300 points.

described as the vilest in the history of the event. The venue was the Coburg Gun Club at North Coburg. After the 1947 series the event was switched to the March period which has proved so satisfactory ever since. The event was also transferred to the newly established grounds of the Nobel and Blackburn Gun Club which later became known as the Australian Gun Club at East Burwood, where a three-trap field layout was available. The program was also increased to cover two days of the Labor Day weekend.

In 1950 Jack McCraith won the Champ of Champions with a score of 59/60.

In 1951 George Biggs and Neville Bassett, Qld tied with a possible 50/50. Both shot on, Biggs finally winning with a score of 69/70.

1952 saw Fred Burns the winner with a score of 60/60. Newton Thomas took out his first Champion of Champions title in 1953, the score 55/55.

1954 was Allan Quinton's year to take home the cup. Allan withstood a strong challenge from Newton Thomas to run out the winner, his score being 55/55.


Sperry Marshall of Hobart was the winner of the 1955 title with a brilliant 75/75, whilst the 1956 winner was Clem Mudford of Preston Vic. Clem's score was 94/95.

The National Championships were shot at Bankstown Sydney in 1956, the first occasion outside Victoria.

The following year, 1957, saw the tournament staged at South Coast Gun Club, Southport, Queensland, for the first time on this occasion. The winner was N.S.W. shooter R. Faunt with a score of 84/85.

1939 saw the start of the now famous international match, when the competing teams were England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales and Australia — Australia really appearing for the first time. The home countries had established the international many years earlier.


The opening match in 1939 was shot on the old Bentleigh ground of the Victorian Clay Target Club. The ultimate High Gun for the match went to Eastern Hill fireman Athol Love. Love mentioned as he was coming up for the



In 1938 these four shooters won the World Championship at Monte Carlo in France, shooting a combined score of 95/100 pigeons from 30 yards. This was acclaimed at the time as an unbelievable feat, as to shoot 22/25 won most individual single World Championships. This was the first time an Australian Team shot overseas and in Australia these four shooters won almost every Championship before them over 20 years. They have all passed on.

On Donald McIntosh's 80th birthday he came to Coburg Club on invitation and we had the Scottish Regiment there. Donald McIntosh told me as President he could put 100 score on the board. In those days you got a red disc for a kill and a white one for a miss. He shot his first one, then pointed his gun elsewhere and got two white ones, giving him 100.

I am indebted to Jack McCraith for his contribution to the history of our sport — Clay Target Shooting. 120th round that his legs were getting "rubbery" and he did not think he could go another round of five targets. However he came out the winner on the 125th round. The international series then finished for the duration of the war and were not resumed until 1948.

Bill first took up shooting Clay Targets in 1930 at the age of 10 years at the Old Bentleigh Gun Club grounds which later merged with Nobel Club at Tottenham. Today he is a member of Melbourne Gun Club and is still shooting Clay Targets 55 years later. He must surely qualify as one of Australia's longest shooting shooters.

He began shooting skeet in 1966 and was the first shooter to shoot a 100 straight break at skeet at the Australian Gun Club grounds in 1967.

In 1971 and 1976 Bill organised the first teams of Australian Trench and Skeet shooters to visit Singapore for the Pesta Sukan Games. On each occasion Bill captained the teams who were successful in winning Gold, Silver and Bronze.

Bill Delaney was one of a small group of shooters who were responsible for American-style skeet being accepted for competition. Prior to this point we shot an English version of 21 targets per round. This change took place during the early 1950s.

Once registered with the A.C.T.A., no alterations will occur that would change the club status of any shooter, within the respective calendar year.









Because of the safety factor we are always situated a reasonable distance from residences and I can see no way we can create any degree of noise pollution.

This may be your last chance to protect your sport and relaxation so - WRITE NOW.



This is true of the great "Calrossie" whose real name was Jack Sutherland, a gentlemanly character of small stature whose shooting ability was great.

Jack Sutherland was 89 years of age when he died after a short illness. He had remained at the peak of shooting for 50 years.

In March, 1948 he emerged from retirement at 69 years of age to win his 104th championship and second Commonwealth galah championship. He had stopped shooting for seven years previous to this win, and had not had a lot of practice in the year before the event.

Jack Sutherland had won championships in Italy, France and England, and had also competed at Monte Carlo, which was the top venue in trapshooting when the sport was at its peak in 1928.

He set a world record of 128 birds straight in one competition.


Strangely enough Jack Sutherland, in his shooting days, wore spectacles when working in his office, as also did Newton Thomas. Calrossie discarded his when he was shooting, while Newton changed his for others which gave him better vision at long range. So if any shooter feels he is handicapped by not being blessed with perfect sight, these two great champions should give him new heart!

Calrossie took his shooting name from the town in South Gippsland in which he managed a creamery, and he used to enjoy the anonymity it gave him with the general public.


Newton Thomas bought a Greener side-by-side pigeongrade gun with which Jack Sutherland shot during his competition days, and I fired a few shots from this gun from time to time. It was a heavy, beautiful gun, and bored full-choke in both barrels.

Both Newton Thomas and Fred Burns were proud to have been taken under the wing of the great Calrossie, and both admired him above all other shooters. The Rick Hannan perpetual trophy was won by Ross Mylrea 174/185.

Next year a bigger, better 2 day shoot, see you there.

All reports were circulated to clubs in writing, well before the meeting, for perusal. The Treasurer's report showed the Zone Council in a sound financial position, with \$5,500 to its credit. A good year of activity was experienced within the Zone for 1985, and it is anticipated 1986 will continue in the same vein. The Championship was sponsored by the Royal Hotel in St Arnaud. One of our top international shooters in days gone by, Mark Little, runs this hotel, along with his family. Great to see Mark is still involved with our shooting.

Saturday November 9, 1985

Melbourne Gun Club conducted a Testimonial Shoot for well-known shooter and administrator of our sport, George Biggs. It was well attended by many of his old and new shooting mates, who turned up to compliment him on his involvement and interest in the development of our sport over the years. I took the opportunity to talk with George and compile a little of his history.

I found George's interest in clay target shooting began right after World War 2 in 1945 when he was invited to join the old Coburg Gun Club, situated on the banks of the Merrie Creek behind Pentridge Prison at North Coburg. This club was the forerunner of what is now the Metropolitan Gun Club. Prior to this time George had been involved in rifle and pistol shooting.

In 1947 he accepted a position with the old established Melbourne sporting goods firm of Hartleys Ltd, as manager of their firearms, archery and camping department. During ten years with Hartleys he became greatly involved in shotgunning and clay target shooting Australia-wide. It was here George learned a great deal about guns and ammunition and how to use them.

Apart from serving on several gun club committees, George was also President of the Australian Gun Club at Burwood for a period of eight years. Several National Championships were held on this ground before they became rotated around the states.

In recent years he has become much more involved with the instruction and coaching side of our sport. He finds this work very rewarding as it allows him to put to work the vast amount of experience and knowledge he has acquired over the years.

Recently he wrote and published the first Australian book on the subject of shotgunning, namely "Trap and Skeet Shooting". From time to time he has also written articles for sporing magazines on shotgun shooting. At the moment George is heavily involved in the making of video films on shooting techniques.

George was also involved in submitting a plan to the A.C.T.A. to instigate a National Coaching system. This plan was later approved by the A.C.T.A. and put into action with the appointment of Newton Thomas as Director.

During his 40 years of continuous registration with the A.C.T.A. George has not at any time been non-active in clay shooting administration. His long list of responsibilities over the years include:

Victorian Official A.C.T.A. Referee Examiner appointed October 1948 and retired from the position 1983. During this period he held the position of rules supervisor for approximately 12 years.

In 1955 George was appointed to the handicapping board together with Luke Doyle, the A.C.T.A. Secretary co-opted, making a handicapping panel for the Association. This situation continued for several years until the card system was introduced.

George is currently Hunter safety accredited firearms instructor and examiner for the firearms consultative committee, Victoria, Australian National coaching council accredited level 2 coach, and A.C.T.A. official historian, a very time-consuming and responsible assignment, one that will be appreciated by all in the long term.

Major shooting achievements include the following: Australian National Double Barrel Champion Australian National Champion of Champions Cup Australian National Skeet Champion.

George has won a total of 42 Commonwealth Championships, including double barrel, single barrel, mixed targets, double rise, walk-up and skeet, a total of approximately 450 titles including State, District and Club Championships.

From 1957 to 1959 he worked with the firm of Donald Macintosh - one of Australia's oldest gunsmithing companies. George absorbed a great deal more knowledge about the art of gun fitting and gunsmithing from Mr Horace James, Australia's leading authority on both subjects, whilst working with this firm.

During 1960 he accepted a position with the Adelaide firearms manufacturing firm as Sales Manager for Victoria and Tasmania. This firm was the only company in Australia to manufacture sporting guns and rifles. This move was a further opportunity for George to gain further knowledge in the manufacturing side of firearms.

In 1967 he set up his own business as a firearms and ammunition dealer and shooting consultant. George continues in this capacity in a semi-retired way even today.

His administration involvement in the sport goes back to

almost the beginning of his first shot at clays, which was at the old Coburg Gun Club. George was elected on the committee of this club soon after joining. A year later he found himself elected to the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee where he served a term of 25 years under six Presidents, finally retiring from the position at Launceston in 1975.

He became the first Australian shooter to shoot 200 straight in skeet competition. He also held the skeet straight record on 215 for 4½ years before it was broken by Ian Hale.

George was the first shooter to reach the 27 yard handicap mark.

He has been a member of the Macintosh International Shooting team on 12 occasions and a member of the Australian International Skeet Team four times.

As well he visited the United States, shooting at the Grand American and other clubs.

He has visited New Zealand on several occasions, shooting at their National Championships.

His longest break without a miss at trap is 356 straight.

George, from all Australians, thanks for your personal contribution to our sport. Your efforts are appreciated and will long be remembered by all.


It is with deep regret that we of the Tamworth Gun Club (NSW) announce the sudden passing on August 15 of Lindsay Bull.



VICTORIAN I.S.U. CARNIVAL By Laurie Connors





FANTASTIC

THE WORLD'S GOLDEN PIGEONS!

by John Monk

In actual fact, these pigeons are not gold in colour at all, but blue, whether blue-barred or blue-checkered, but always blue. They are small, strong, fast, sinewy birds, at least one year old, and quite unpredictable as to flight and velocity. They are especially bred, quite extensively, in Spain, for pigeon shooting, and their breeders supply all the important pigeon shoots, though Portugal still uses its own species of pigeon.

The "golden" tag is found in the large purses offered for winning these shoots.

Author's Note:

I wrote this paragraph on February 16, 1965, when writing of the shooting exploits of one of our greatest shotgunners, and one of our last remaining live-pigeon exponents. Pigeon shooting and all live-bird shooting from traps has been banned in Australia since 1958, but it is followed in many countries throughout the world.

Keath Veall is one of the greatest of our shotgunners, and travels regularly overseas to shoot pigeons on the overseas circuits. While he is almost unknown to anyone but keen shotgunners in Australia, Keith's name is still magic overseas, where he is regarded as a great Australian and world-class sportsman.

Keith Veall, one of the finest marksmen in the world today, in my opinion, one of the three top gunshots in Australia, told me of these pigeons and the world of big shooting circuits in an interview he gave for Sporting Shooter magazine.

Keith, an alert, athletic-looking man in his early forties, gives the impression of being bigger then he is, mainly I think, because he is quick of thought and so assured. Friendly, Frank — often devastatingly so — his manner fails to hide the brilliance that is to be found in all top sportsmen whose calling demands quick decisions; hairtrigger appraisals of the situation in hand, together with the assurance and confidence to make the best of that situation.

Keith Veall, once one of the few backmarkers overseas, and still one of the backmarkers in his sport today, when there are somewhere between 20 and 30 on these marks, told me of pigeon shoots, purses and professionals overseas where the sport of live-bird shooting still survives and is immensely popular among people of every walk of life.

Live pigeon shooting is still popular in most States of North America, Mexico, Cuba, various South American countries; in Egypt, Italy and Sicily, Belgium, Spain and Portugal. (Though other birds are shot in most of these countries, when one talks of serious shooting — the elite of the competition — it is always pigeons).

The stakes are high for skilled shooters, and even gunners who are not particularly outstanding are able to snare a fair amount of prize money. An example of the high stakes offering are shown in the Shooting Calendar.

In Madrid, 2,000,000 pesetas. In Mexico, the Championship of Mexico offers 50,000 dollars (U.S. dollars). The Championship of the Mediterranean, decided this year in Algiers, carries prize money of 1,000,000 Deenas. This is to be held in March. The Championship of Europe, held in Milan, from 1st to 17th April, carries prize money totals of 25,000,000 Lira. The Championship of The World, held from 23rd to 30th June, 40,000,000 Lira.

This is merely a mention of the larger programmes conducted on the circuits.

There are innumerable smaller ones, and, in some countries, shooting is held on every day of the week! Even if some particular day is not listed, shooting can be arranged. This prize money is in addition to the betting, which is always popular where live bird shooting is held. But the betting system is not simple, nor is it easy to win money, any more than from bookmakers anywhere.

Usually there are 100 pigeons an hour released, and this number plays havoc with the punters' averages! Decisions are made on the actual outcome of the competitor's bird. The bookmaker pays only on whether the bird is killed or lost. (When live birds were shot in Australia, the bet was paid only if the bird was killed with the first barrel.)

Competitors usually only place a bet to give themselves some insurance against missing the target, for with the prize money so high deliberate misses do not pay. But anyone who wants to try their luck on the big money circuits should spend some time studying the betting systems with some expert such as Keith Veall, as they can prove quite difficult for a man not used to them.

As with all sports, the cost of entering the competition can be high, though with visitors (such as Australians) the entry fee is scaled down to around 1 per cent of the fee. Women shoot for nothing, as do men over the age of 70 years. Pigeons are a great part of the outlay, these costing the competitor about 16/- (\$1.50) each.

Living conditions are excellent, Keith says, with prices ranging through the scale from cheap to highly expensive. Travel is quite good, many competitors taking trains, cars and planes. Many Americans use their own cars to travel from shoot to shoot. This is made easier by the fact that circuits are organised in such a way that the shooting follows a circular pattern.

There has often been speculation among shooters in Australia as to whether one can actually earn a living shooting on the big overseas circuits. Keith Veall says this is quite possible for a good shot, with the earnings very high. Advertising fees for a top gunner are of course high as the sport attracts a great number of wealthy patrons.

In years gone by there was quite a wide gulf between the professional and the amateur shooter, but this now is almost non-existent. But this is now taking place all over the world, as "shamateur" sports and sportpeople fall by the wayside. As more people realise each year, it is the sport that is important, not some ridiculous outmoded ideal of snobbery.

I have tried to portray the shooting scene, taking only the high spots into consideration, so that readers may gain some idea of the immense following of live-pigeon shooting overseas, and also the ability needed to follow this circuit at a profit. Of course, if one has enough money and likes shooting, I could think of no better way of spending a holiday!

Keith Veall cannot remember when he first began shooting. He was always interested in the sport, but he recalls having, as a boy, a .410 shotgun with which he did a good deal of shooting. Interested in field shooting, he gained a great deal of practice in this, and, without realising it at the time, was handicapped in using the small-bored gun.

This was excellent groundwork, for when he finally progressed to his father's 12 gauge gun he found the extra pattern made for greater ease in shooting his target.

It was in the 1940's when his father took him to Melbourne Gun Club (the old club, at Tottenham). Keith shot live birds for the first time, running out a winner on his first shoot. He followed this with another win the following week, and of course the pattern was set. Young Veall had found his Valhalla.

Over the years he won countless competitive shoots, continuing field shooting too. This sort of practice, coupled with his love of the sport and his natural ability, fast reflexes and confidence, had to take his farther afield, so that it was natural that he find himself among the top guns in the overseas circuits. His vast experience of shooting has been sharpened in fields where the best guns in the world are pitted one against the other. He now has a greater knowledge of shooting and all the essentials that go to make one an authority among experts. He has encouraged so many young shooters to travel overseas and coached them into winning large purses. Peter Wray was one of his proteges, as was the 1963 World's Champion, Don Mayfield. Keith has many more years at the top of the sport — unless he loses interest along the way.

Some of the toughest and most dangerous back-markers on the overseas circuit are aged between 40 and 55 years. At this age a man has reached a stage of maturity and capable calmness. He is consistent and experienced. Unlike the young shooter, the older man has not the many troubles which beset young men trying to make their way in a very competitive world.

In an effort to gain all the information possible, I pressed many questions on Keith, who was more than willing to answer all of them in the fullest terms. Unfortunately, it would require a book to even begin to bring that information to light, but I will attempt to skate over the high spots.

Guns. Keith told me the guns used overseas were varied, though over/under guns were becoming most popular, reaching almost saturation point among the younger shooters.

Beretta, Browning, Breda and many other well-known makes are popular.

International regulations allow 10 gauge cartridges, though there is an extra metre of handicap for the competitor using this gauge. Italian Regulations do not allow the use of 10 gauge. International Regulations allow the use of 16 gauge, and the shooter may stand one metre closer to compensate for the smaller bore. Italian Regulations allow the use of 16 gauge too, but without any advantage in handicap.

So it would appear there is nothing to be gained from using bores other than 12. The most popular cartridge on the Continent is M.B. These cartridges have won many championships, both pigeons and clay target competition. (This was the cartridge used by the winner of the 1956 Melbourne Olympics.)

Shot is a particularly interesting subject, and has been the bone of contention between shooters for many years. We used No. 6 shot in Australia for years, and almost without exception. In 1950 Keith brought back some No. 7's from the Continent. These were discussed, but nothing done about them until 1951, when Keith used them here.

A winning streak is always followed, and 7's began to be used in Australia. Today the popularity swing on the overseas circuits is to 7's, 7½ and 8. Nickelled shot is used in the best loads.

The size of the shot depends a great deal on the handicap of the shooter concerned, and those shooting from 22 metres seem to be keen on No. 8. Most of the backmarkers, shooting from the 29 to 33 metre marks load 7½ or 7 in the second barrel. Some use 7's in both barrels. Again, this is a matter of personal preference.

Chokes. These again are a personal choice, and when shooting pigeons very open bores are not considered desirable, but other than this not much can be said on the matter, except that Keith advises not to use two full-choke barrels with identical shot-sizes in both.

Patterns. Keith gives advice so often given by champion gunshots. "The less known about patterns the better!" he advises. "Stay with good cartridges. Good performance gives good effects."


