





EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Time certainly flies, it seems only like last month that I was writing a column for the C.T.S.N. Here it is July and I am now writing my twelfth.

A lot of things have happened in that period. The sport itself has been well supported at the three National Championships held in the past year culminating in the successful D.T.L. Championships at Echuca.

Membership is on the increase, although this is offset by the numbers who for reasons best known to themselves. have not renewed their membership for 1986 - we must retain members as well as attract new shooters - perhaps you can help with this.

Costs are increasing in all areas and this obviously does cause some concern for the Executive Committee who are very aware of the problems that are confronting all sports not just Clay Target Shooting.

We have seen two National Olympic Discipline records established, Terry Rumbel at the O.D. Nationals in Brisbane (Trench) and Craig Meuleman at Illawarra (Skeet).

Adrian Cousens established a new skeet break record in November at Melbourne and all events at the Trap Nationals were more than well supported.

There have been changes on the various National Committees with a new member, Kay Woods from Tasmania on the Management Committee as well as a new Vice President in Jim Scott.

We have a National Coaching tour arranged for November when Phil Murray from the U.S. will hopefully pass on his experience at Skeet shooting to the many who wish to attend his coaching clinics. This is a plus for Skeet Shooters and the benefits will be long lasting.

The National Training Squad under the direction of Peter Quire is having a live in training Camp early this month at the Institute of Sport in Canberra.

Having recently been able to have a first hand look at the facilities that are available at the Sports Institute, I am certain that we will only have our shooters benefit by their involvement.

We are being represented at the Commonwealth Games and World Shooting Championships where we intend to do well in both trench and skeet and have a five man team competing at the World Skeet Championships in the U.S.A. where again we hope to do well.

These are the happenings that are readily seen and maybe accepted as standard. Not so however as there is a lot of involvement from many who at times appear to be just a few.

While at National level we do not always fully appreciate the involvement at other levels, we nevertheless understand the importance, your club needs YOUR support to operate as efficiently as YOU the member require. So too then does support need to be extended to YOUR Zone and ultimately YOUR State if the standards that YOU the shooter are demanding, are to be achieved let alone maintained.

Many shooters are willing to assist and say they only have to be asked and they will be only too pleased to help. Remember all the hard work your Club/Zone/State Secretary does on your behalf - don't wait to be asked, instead volunteer to assist with whatever you are able to.

years to possess and use a firearm. Shooters under the age of 14 years are not permitted under any circumstances to possess and or use a firearm.

Correspondence confirming this advice has been forwarded to all Queensland Club Secretaries.

Juniors shooting illegally (outside the rules of the Qld Firearms Act) are not permitted on any Club Grounds and are not protected by any form of Insurance.

If in doubt please see your Qld Club Secretary for a copy of the Q.C.T.A. Advice.



The Club saw shooters come from Sydney, Melbourne, Cobar, Dubbo, Griffith, Wagga and Canberra. On the Saturday we saw a good but hard program set, and as the day progressed we watched a well known young shooter in Michael Diamond from Sydney take out the sash and A grade with a score of 141/150, AA grade was won by Melbourne shooter Bill Iles scoring 94/100.

Winning the B grade section was B. Hall from The Rock scoring 89/100. T. Murray from Tullibigeal with a score of 76/100 took the C grade honours.

On Sunday, the second half of the 200 target Trench Elimination the shooters had an easier program set, and Bill Iles took out the O/A and AA grade honours shooting 97/100.

A grade belonged to Michael Diamond with 96/100, B grade again to B. Hall with 91/100 and T. Murray once again took out the C grade with a good performance of 90/100.

In conjunction was the 200 target ISU Skeet elimination round. There were eight shooters contending with the O/A and A grade won by J. Cole shooting 175/200. B grade B. Kennett won with 160/200 and C grade belonged to P. McWilliam with 121/200.

KILPATRICK IS NEW HOT SHOT AT WINCHESTER AUSTRALIA

At 36 years of age, Brian Kilpatrick has spent half his life in the firearms industry.

Starting out some 18 years ago in the retail/wholesale area, Brian then served a short stint as sales representative with a leading firerarm importer prior to joining Winchester nine years ago. Duties at Winchester have included Customer Service Manager, Sales Representative and now Customer Service/Internal Sales — Australia.

Brian's love of firearms soon led to his intense involvement in shooting sports and for the past 22 years has been an active competitor in a variety of shooting disciplines.

Of all the shooting disciplines it is the International Practical Shooting Confederation (I.P.S.C.) style of shooting that offers Brian the greatest challenge and the greatest rewards.

I.P.S.C. competition is a modified version of police and military style shooting that may require movement during the match.

In a typical match targets include rectangular cardboard targets about 39" \times 18" and steel reaction targets of various sizes and styles. Some targets may be partially covered to increase the degree of accuracy required and penalty points are given for misses.

The scoring system is based on actual points scored minus penalties divided by the time taken to complete the match. With the variable factor of time taken into account the perfect score can never be achieved and the challenge never ceases.

After five years competition under tough I.P.S.C. conditions, he has won a series of state titles and now, the Australian National Championship title.

Brian will now lead the Australian team in the World I.P.S.C. Championships, to be held in Orlando, Florida, September 16 through 21, competing against 300 other highly ranked competitors from 25 nations.

Held in San Antonio, Texas, our shooters will in a few short days experience the varying degrees in temperature as they leave the Australian winter for the hot American Summer.

Some of the members who have competed before in this event will remember the hot 40 degree days from last time and will no doubt have learned from the experience.


While in America they will have the opportunity to shoot against U.S. Champion Phil Murray, who will be visiting Australia in November to conduct Coaching Clinics in all States.






CENTRAL AUSTRALIAN MASTERS GAMES:

OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE NOTES

With winter now well and truly on us, our elimination series and the conducting of major Olympic Discipline carnivals in New South Wales is taking its well earned rest for a few months, with the exception of the elimination to be held at Griffith Gun club in a few weeks time.

During this period, our National teams will be competing at the Commonwealth Games in Scotland in late July, and the World Championships at Suhl in East Germany, during early September. The New South Wales I.S.U. Sub-Committee has also once again received an invitation to compete at the Pesta Sukan Games in Singapore in early August, and there will be a contingent of our state's I.S.U. enthusiasts heading over there.

The Sub-Committee's annual fund raising carnival was once again successful, although there were quite a few that did not give their support. The benefits of the Sub-Committee's efforts to raise a few dollars will hopefully soon be seen by those dedicated enough to make an effort.

After five of the eight Olympic Trap eliminations the positions for training squad spots are still wide open, with John Maxwell still leading field, but like all others, needing to register more scores to even be eligible. In the I.S.U. Skeet, Brian Prosser still has a slight edge over Christian Naudin and promising junior Mark Agar, but there are still three more eliminations left to be conducted.

The programs for the 1987 events are hopefully well nearly completed, and it is anticipated that the year will really get off to a good start at the state I.S.U. Carnival, this year to be conducted over three days (shot 75, 75, 50) at Guyra on the long weekend in January.



As many would know New South Wales has been allocated the I.S.U. Nationals for 1988, the bi-centenary year, and plans are now well underway to conduct the biggest and best ever I.S.U. Carnival, on a new ground to be commenced shortly. More of that later.


CLUB SECRETARIES SEMINAR:

I know that 90% of shooters do this but it is the 10% that the onlookers remember — and that's the image we create.

What about you "ten percenters" having a look in the mirror (through the eyes of a spectator) — I'm sure you will be surprised by the result if you upgrade to the standard of the other competitors.

Len continues, while on the subject of dress — what about a few more STATE BLAZERS around the traps?

Wherever I go, I wear mine and on every occasion a shooter will ask particulars as to how to get one. I have written it in the News several times — however, for the new shooters (or the old shooters who haven't read the News before) I'll give full particulars:

Len raises the question of Common Mark or Handicap shooting ... He writes: When I started shooting 32 years ago, all Clubs shot 3 handicap sweepstakes, 1 trophy event (handicap) and 1 District or Club Championship.

The basis of this was to encourage new shooters into the sport — the Championships were always won by a back marker and the handicaps gave the new shooter an opportunity to share some cash. Recently, one Club (in the Central West) shot 5 events — ALL OFF HANDICAP and 57 SHOOTERS attended.

Quite a lot were behind 20 metres and they said that they attended as the handicap events offered them more of a challenge than 15 metre shooting.

One shooter stated that "with 15 metre shooting you know you will probably have to shoot 100 plus targets to win a graded event and the cost to the shooter is getting prohibitive — plus the additional cost to the Club in targets and time lost whilst they are shooting off".

I know of another Club (with more registered shooters than the above club) who recently shot a full day program — all off 15 metres graded and 27 shooters attended.

IS THERE A MORAL IN THIS?—Think about it, look at the results through the eyes of a new shooter — THEY ARE THE LIFE BLOOD OF YOUR CLUB.



FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR



COACH ACCREDITATION SCHEME

I have been asked to explain the operations of our National Coaching Scheme, as many in our sport are still unsure of its structure.

Firstly just a short history of the scheme and the reasons for it being set up. Coaching in Australian sports, not just clay target shooting, had in past years, been based on handed down knowledge, and it was not always the person with the best approach to developing someone else's ability, who handed it on. We all know the feeling of receiving advice and information from four or five different, helpful shooters, often advice based on what suited them, not necessarily what was best for the shooter.

In 1977 the Sport and Recreation Ministers both State and Federal, made the following recommendation:

"The Commonwealth undertake as a matter of urgency the co-ordination and development of a national system for the training of coaches."

This was done, and the National Coaching Accreditation Scheme was born, with the objectives of:

1. Establishing a national education and accreditation scheme for all Coaches in all sports.

2. Provide the opportunity for Coaches to undertake some training in their sports coaching.

The Australian Coaching Council was formed, it has 12 members, 6 Government and 6 sporting members, it has the responsibility for implementing and promoting the scheme. We submit our coaching courses to that body for approval, they must meet the standards set by the Council.

The Australian Clay Target Association was one of the first sports to recognise that the existence of a body of coaches with a high standard of proficiency was an important step in the development of clay target shooting at all levels. 47 sports are now part of the scheme. The Level 1 Accreditation Course was submitted and accepted in 1980, at that time the A.C.T.A. had already set up the structures for the implementation of the National Scheme. They are: The National Coaching Council of the Australian Clay Target Association, consisting of the seven State Coaching Directors and the National Coaching Director

National Coaching Director.

State Coaching Director.

Zone Coaches. Club Coaches.

It was our aim as a sport to have all clay target coaches accredited under the Federal Scheme, so that when accredited they are recognised coaches of a standard level, (most of course, are well above that standard in their ability), that is recognised by all sports, and Government bodies.

Our sport now has 263 Level 1 coaches and 33 Level 2 coaches. The Level 3 course has been submitted to the Australian Coaching Council for approval. It is our aim that all Club Coaches should be at least accredited to Level 1 standard, Zone Coaches at Level 2 accreditation standard and State Directors at Level 3.

State Directors are responsible for the over-seeing of the scheme within their states and should be consulted on the appointment of Zone Coaches within their states. The Zone Coach must be at least accredited at Level 1, when appointed to that position.

The Zone Coach in turn is responsible for the Club Coaches within their zone and should be consulted by the Clubs before an appointment of a Club Coach is made. It is the responsibility of the Zone Coach to make sure the Club Coaches reach the required proficiency and pass the necessary tests.

It is vital that the Zone Coach be consulted about the selection of a Club Coach because as was stated at the beginning, not all people, no matter how good they are at their sport, have the necessary attributes to coach.

Coaching is an "honourable profession" and the Clay Target Association has been lucky enough to attract people of the highest calibre to fill the coaching positions.

Level 1 requires the coach to practise as a coach for 12 months before being accredited, Level 2 requires an extra two years before accreditation, and Level 3 requires that the coach have the three years practice of Level 1 and 2 plus a further 3 years -6 years in all - as a practical coach, plus of course, the required theoretical learning.

Support your Club, Zone and State Coaches, they do a great job.

Coaches, please notify me if you have changed your address, so that I can notify the National Coaching Council, and keep those coaching reports coming in.

If anyone has a topic they would like discussed, don't hesitate to write and let me know, my address is in the front of the magazine.

It is engraved "Presented to the Nobel Clay Bird Club by "Lovers of the Gun" for Clay Bird Shooting".





SPECIAL REPORT. SKEET NATIONALS – WAGGA GUN CLUB

To keep all you 'skeeties' informed about the 1986 Skeet Nationals, here is a report for you.

Firstly we must thank the NSW Skeet shooters and the other skeet shooters who have supported NSW in holding the 1st Skeet Nationals in NSW.

Looking at the grounds with only three skeet layouts we wondered how we would ever get it into shape and build two more permanent layouts.

With the help of a small Wagga Gun Club Committee things are starting to take shape. With all the new layouts pegged out and all distance measurements correct the basic work began. 6 a.m. mornings started with concreting, the station pads and the bases for the skeethouses, the scoreboard area is now also concreted.

Once the concrete was set the brick layers were able to come out and start on the skeet houses. It started off looking like a pile of bricks, but now they have taken on full form. Safety fences are in the process of being erected, station pads are in their places, with the final roofing to be put on.

A working bee did a fine 'clean-up' job, getting rid of a lot of rubbish, picking up discarded shells (empty), mowing lawns, planting new grass, and burning off the grass. The Wagga Wagga City Council did an excellent job on grading the road.

For those who have been to Wagga Gun Club before, the access road is now twice as wide with \$1500 worth of gravel put down on the road. A total of \$2500 worth of work was done by the council. The parking and trade display areas have been levelled out and new grass seeds planted.

The trees were slowly growing and with the help of two committee members watering them after work or any chance they had, the trees sprang back into life. Many long hours and care were gone in one day after a farmer's sheep got into the club grounds and ate the new shoots off the trees, but with more care they will be back on the mend soon.

NORTHERN NOTES

HERE AND THERE

'Dazzling' Darryl Read is a little puzzled over his 'Dark Horse' description in last month's 'News'. Check the previous sentence, Darryl!

Art Blatt's book on Trap and Skeet shooting has been around for quite a while, but it's still possible to pick up points previously unnoticed. Thinking of sweeps, there's a chapter that should be required reading for every Club Committee member. It lists the enormous amount of options open to Clubs and Associations in Sweepstakes shooting.

Also, in the Skeet rules listed, it seems that only UP-WARD movement in grade can occur throughout the year, and downgrading, if warranted occurs at the beginning of each year. I didn't notice it in the Trap rules when I looked, but it's possibly there, too. What a wonderful idea to stop our professional and amateur 'Grade Cheats' in the A.C.T.A. How about it, Rules Committee? It standardises Grading and Handicapping, is less work for Club, State and National officials, and is a sensible, reasonable approach to a rule change that is long overdue.

KATHERINE KORNER

The Gorge city's annual shoot was poorly attended by local shooters (six) and subsidised by visitors (17). The ideas behind the shoot were sound, cash for all events, but were thwarted by the small numbers. For a 50 target event with 20 shooters, and with targets costing the Club 15 cents a throw, it doesn't take an Einstein to work out that shooter returns were not gigantic.

Shooting was excellent in all grades, with possibles in events coming steadily. Tony Hare took the night Territory title with a particularly fine 50/50. J.D. won the Single Barrel Calcutta event with a 49/50 and Jim Bitossi won overall High Gun, after a 25 target Points Score last event in which it appeared he'd 'blown in'. Jenny Fabian gained the Ladies' award, without reaching the shooting heights of which she is capable, but also without suffering the 'interference' problems she's had in shoot-offs with husband Graham . . .

In the minor grades, Tom Weis, after being down-graded yet again to 'B' grade, had a fine tussle with Paul Seis in most events, and in 'C' grade. 'Sutty' from Jabiru and new shooter Glen Goding showed touches of class, particularly in their double rise shoot-off.

Breakdown of the shooters into grades revealed that 14 'A' graders, 6 'B' graders and 5 'C' graders competed, definitely a case of 'reverse subsidisation', lower grades usually propping up the 'A' and 'AA' grades. SAFETY SECTION

Quite a few shooters have complained of the requirement in Handicap shooting that guns be unloaded if anyone is on a more forward mark.

Some reasons given for complaint are: the speed of the squad is slowed down considerably; the shooter can see no reason for not having his shotgun loaded; it disturbs concentration having to place cartridges in the gun immediately prior to shooting; the list goes on ...

Taking these complaints in their turn leads us to these facts: The speed of the squad is slowed, but not by much. What it has done is slow down the shooter who has closed his gun illegally and is ready to fire before the previous shooter has reached the same mark. It definitely slows this type of shooter, who ranks time spent on the walks ahead of courtesy and safety.

Being unable to see a reason for having guns empty almost qualifies the reasoner for a 'cretin class' certificate. Tim Catling from W.A. gave the best reason when he cited the case of the handicap shooter of many years, and many yards also, who had a heart attack and collapsed on the walks. His gun closed, dropped, thus covering every other shooter on the walks. No, the gun didn't go off, thankfully. But, IF IT HAD, what do you reckon would have happened then and there to the handicap rules? Answer: the rule we've got now, but with a squad of 'dead 'un's' and casualties on our conscience. It would have been another classic case of 'closing the stable door', just the same as the present requirement for advising shooters to check barrels for obstructions may have saved the life of the Texas, Queensland shooter recently, had it been in force. Rules HAVE to be made to prevent the 'million to one' chance from happening.

As for disturbing the concentration. Well, if you're a stick in the mud, unadaptable to a change for the good, worried about putting cartridges in the gun because your concentration will be 'shot' — this worry coming after watching the previous shooter return to your mark — it's a real problem. But you won't make it as a shooter anyway if that's your attitude.

Let's face reality. The real reason for most complaints is the inertia of the individual. He resents change, especially a rules change which involves safety, as this means that it is implied that the shooter, personally, has been judged to be unsafe.

Going one step further with empty guns on the walk, I would like to see the 'magazine' gun rule applied to ALL types of shotgun.

 \bar{I} believe that ALL guns should be empty whenever a shooter is moving, either on or between walks. The only time a gun should have cartridges in the chambers is when the shooter is stationary on the walk from which he is to shoot, when there is no one in front of him, and when no safety hazard exists.

In defence of the above, I have seen, during the 'Wet' in Darwin, with the walks and surrounds saturated, a shooter moving, with cartridges in his gun's chambers, off the centre walk to walk four. He slipped on the greasy concrete-grass junction, and would have fallen but for the intervention of the referee, who, fortunately, was standing close by. Had the shooter fell, or dropped his gun, the competitors on walks four and five, and also the referee and scorer were greatly at risk. With no 'crackers up the spout', pride would have been the only party to have been liable to be injured.

I expect any long time shooter has seen similar 'near misses' in every Club in Australia. DO WE WAIT UNTIL TRAGEDY COMES ALONG BEFORE WE STEP IN?

DARWIN DIARY
