


Australian International Skeet Team — July 1986 World Skeet Championship in San Antonio, Texas, U.S.A.

As you are aware, the team for these events were selected at our National Championship at the Melbourne Gun Club in 1985 and comprised Adrian Cousens, Robert Dower, Bill Iles, Eugene Kavanagh and John Summers. However, when John withdrew, his place was taken by the second reserve, Brian Thomson, as Alec Crikis was unavailable because of his commitment to the Commonwealth Games.

Pre travel arrangements were organised mainly by our Executive Director, and there were no hitches to our schedule, that entailed us all meeting in Melbourne prior to departure from Tullamarine, at 12.30 on July 19th, other than Brian, who had an urgent business commitment that prevented him from leaving with us that day.

We left by Continental Airlines and flew via Aukland and Honolulu for a stop over at Los Angeles for the night. Somewhere along the line we had lost a day, as it was still the 19th and we had flown most of one night. As it was still daylight after we had booked in and refreshed ourselves after the long trip, we took the opportunity to have a look around Hollywood for a couple of hours.



Next morning we had a problem in that we missed the plane, mainly because Bill wouldn't get going, Eugene was hungry, Robbie admitted the long case he carried contained a gun, and took a long time to convince the authorities that the steel spectacle case picked by X-ray in his hand, luggage, was not a hand grenade or something. On top of this, we had to go about a mile to the gate only to have the attendant slam the door in our face with the comment that the plane was full. After a four hour wait we managed to catch the next flight to Houston in Texas, and arrived with 15 minutes to spare to catch our original connection to San Antonio which had been delayed for a couple of hours for some obscure reason. However, our hire cars were on hand as ordered, and we were soon at the La Quinta Motor Inn which was to be our home for the next week or so.

Next morning we drove to the National Gun Club which is the Headquarters of the National Skeet Shooting Association of the United States and made ourselves known to Ann Myers their Executive Director. We were told that no practice would be available on the grounds for the next two days. However, we were able to pick up the cartridges made available to us for practice by Winchester/Olin through the good offices of Bruce Burns of Winchester Australia. Our shooters were very appreciative of this gesture by these supporters of our sport.

Having had prior communications with Phil Murray (who is due here soon for our Skeet Coaching Seminars),

we decided to travel up to the Pine Valley Gun Club at Conroe where he worked, for a couple of days practice, although it was 240 miles away. Luckily petrol over there is about the same price per gallon as we pay per litre. The roads are so good that it took us less than four hours even though we had to pass through the outskirts of Houston. This Club is at present run as a business by Jim Cook, a pretty good Skeet shot in his own right, and he looked after us very well, allowing our shooters to practise whatever they wanted in regard to gauges etc, with some assistance from Phil with coaching. We found that Doug and Michelle Siggs from Brisbane were also availing themselves of this hospitality and opportunity to practice and subsequently both shot very well at the Championships. They were also attempting to shoot enough targets to qualify for U.S. grading as our grades are not recognised over there, but our shooters did not have time for this and had decided to all register as 3A. This Club is to close in a few months time as a new complex is being built, at a cost of some millions of dollars, and will have two trench, 5 DTL, 5 Skeet fields, simulated field and provisions for some rifle and pistol facilities, as well as restaurant, motel and camping areas.

That day we drove back to San Antonio and out to the ground the following morning to register for the events which consisted of Preliminary Events in 12gge, 28gge, 410 and 12gge Doubles all of 100 targets followed by a Champion of Champions Event consisting of 25 targets in each gauge.

The Championship Events that followed consisted of Doubles, .410, 28gge, 20gge of 100 targets followed by the 12gge Championship and teams event of 250 targets over two days. A complete breakdown of the teams scores and percentages follows but I must say I was extremely proud of Adrian's effort in shooting 250/250 in the teams event and in the shoot off with five others which was in rounds of doubles, managing to come in second to a previous winner of the event in Bob Ukanalis of the United States. As a team we ended up 7th with a score of 1221, the winners being a team lead by Phil Murray that only dropped 8 targets in the 1250.

Our performance was all the more meritorious I believe, because we had left home where the temperatures were around freezing to compete in conditions around the 100°F every day, the maximum being 107° on one day. Most evenings it was still around 100° at 7.30.

Going back to the registration process, that is for all events you wish to enter, at the one time, and has to be fed into the computer, which enables you to receive a print out showing your squad, the field you are on out of the 29, the time you start, and your position in the squad, together with all purses and options you have taken up. Naturally this takes a long time to tabulate and check and I am grateful to those shooters who had been through the process before for their assistance, for the couple of hours involved. However, once done you can settle back and con-

centrate on your shooting knowing that you are programmed for the whole shoot. Over 1000 individual shooters were catered for at these events so you can imagine the statistical data involved. I cannot see that computerisation to this event could be a viable system for us in the foreseeable future as the costs are enormous.

NSSA has spent over \$200,000 to get where they are today, \$60,000 of which they spent on a system that did not work and had to be discarded. They have ended up with 11 VDU's, a very fast printer and two slower ones, a permanently employed software expert who is still nor satisfied with the system, seven other permanents apart from ground staff, to cater for their 14,000 Skeet shooters. The staff increases to about 40 when the shoot is on.

An hour and a half was allowed for each squad to shoot its 100 targets which were naturally all taken from the one layout, and very few went over their time and it was up to number one in the squad to see that this did not occur. Possibly this is the reason that so much vocal encouragement was given by the leader during these events.

Although two of our shooters had "four barrel sets" it was appreciated by the others the willingness of the Americans to make guns available when required for the other gauges. However I do not believe we are ready to adopt all the gauges as they have done, but if another is warranted probably the 20 gauge would be the most practical.

Sporting Clays (or Field as we know it) has not taken off over there to any great extent but a rather elementary course was set up on a no cost for clays basis to introduce this type of clay busting to their Skeet shooters in their

spare time. It proved very popular and was in use any time I was down that way. It certainly shatters the ego to have a go at these with the .410 as I know to my cost, and perhaps the shooters sporting the T-shirt, "I love Skeet but hate the .410" had also had a try. Another innovation was the biodegradeable clays they were using over the water which were guaranteed completely soluble and not toxic to your HOGS. Bob Dower proved the best of the Aussies at this, carding a 21/25 in one round, with his 12 gauge of course.

Over the period of the Championships many new friends were made and renewed. Our special thanks to the President of the New Zealand Association and his wife for their hospitality. I also was invited by the local sporting commentator to join him on their Saturday morning radio program, with Jim Cook, and we had a general discussion about shooting generally in both countries.

After the events were over we had a day or so to look around San Antonio and their Hall of Horns at the Lone Star Brewery, the remains of the Alamo and its history, together with the River Walk are well worth seeing if you are ever in Texas.

The 43 hours elapsed time it took to return as far as Melbourne is best forgotten but the experience gained by these shooters, I am sure, will be used to advantage in upgrading our competitions here. Their reports to our Executive will certainly be taken into consideration at the appropriate time. On their behalf, I must thank the Association for giving us the opportunity to see what Skeet is all about under different circumstances.

COMMONWEALTH GAMES

PETER QUIRE, COACH/TEAM MANAGER

The Commonwealth Games in Scotland were marred by the boycotts. Those attending could not help but share the disappointment of those athletes recalled by their governments at the last minute. The line of national flags grew less day by day. In Olympic Trap and Skeet however there was still an excellent competition of very high standard, with the Commonwealth records broken in one skeet event. The Scots were friendly hosts and with weather as cold and windy as they have it is easy to see why they invented Scotch Whisky.

Kippen was 100 ks from Edinburgh, so we were bussed to and fro each day. The shooting facilities were excellent, but the inclement weather and gale-force winds and rain made life difficult for everyone.

Terry Rumbel won our first medal, our team won four in all. He won the silver medal in the Trap Badge match with a 95/100. John Primrose of Canada won Gold with a 196 and Domingo Diaz was equal 6th with 91/100. In the Skeet Badge Match Ian Hale won the Bronze Medal with a 95/100. Alex Crikis shot a 94/100.

In the Teams events Terry Rumbel and Domingo Diaz took the Bronze Medals. They shot equal score with the Northern Irish Republic who took Silver on a countback. Peel and Bowden of England won the event with 185, Rumbel and Diaz shot 183. Congratulations to Terry and Domingo on their medals. In the Skeet pairs Ian Hale and Alex Crikis took 4th position.

The individual events saw Ian and Alex shoot 188 and 186 respectively. N. Kelly of the Isle of Man shot 196 to win the event.

In the individual Trench Terry Rumbel shot 189 to come 4th, Domingo shot a 187. T. Peel of England shot 195 to win Gold.

The Commonwealth Games is a special meeting of sports people with a common historical link, but independent racial and national pride. It would be a great loss if this sporting contact between Commonwealth peoples were to stop. I believe that problems are solved by meeting on a people-to-people basis, where human similarities are more obvious and important than are political differences.



REPORT ON COACHING IN QUEENSLAND

It is very obvious to see that the coaching scheme is operating successfully in Queensland, not just by the improvement in scores being shot, but also by the uniformity seen in stance, gun mounting etc.

Apart from coaching clinics being conducted by club and zone coaches throughout the State, the State Coaching Director Bill Stevens also conducts a major seminar in each zone annually.

These seminars are used to: (a) upgrade accredited coaches; (b) register and instruct new coaches; (c) examine coaches for accreditation; (d) hold discussions on problems which coaches encounter.

The coaching year runs from 1st July to 30th June each year. The venues for the 1986-87 year are:

Northern Zone: Held at the Charters Towers Gun Club, this was a very good seminar, made interesting by a contribution from Arthur Kenna on visual aids, and how to use them. All the coaches found this interesting, and gained many useful ideas.

Central Zone: To be held at Gladstone Gun Club on the 6th-7th December. The National Coaching Director will be attending this one, and we are looking forward to his contribution to this.

South-Eastern: Schedules for Toowoomba Gun Club on 13th-14th December. Again we hope to have the National Director attend, plus zone coach Martin Gough will be arranging a guest speaker so it will be one the coaches won't want to miss. Martin with assistance from Gerry Chizzotti have made a video called "Smokin' Targets". This is very interesting and clubs wishing to view this should contact Martin.

Western Zone: Venue not decided on at the time of writing.

All coaches in Queensland are urged to discuss reloading safety at all their seminars and clinics, to ensure maximum safety for all shooters who reload their own ammunition.

Registration for Level 2 accreditations are increasing, with many coaches taking advantage of the Correspondence Course, while others have done their Level 2 at the T.A.F.E. Colleges.

By the end of 1986 each zone should have an accredited Level 2 coach.

'This will only improve shooting in this State, and we congratulate those coaches who give of their time and effort to promote this sport in Queensland.

As well as this you will obviously obtain a better understanding of the rules which in turn will lead to greater enjoyment of your chosen sport of Clay Target shooting.

An era closed on Clay Target shooting with the passing of Edward Charles Andersen, fondly known to all as Eddie, on July 10th, 1986. Eddie was in his 87th year and will be sadly missed by all. He was a keen sporting man and his greatest love was clay target shooting. He was a keen member of both Warwick and Ballandean clubs.

When Ballandean staged the first and only "Car Shoot" with a car as first prize, in May 1964, Eddie was responsible for making three electrically loaded and fired traps to be used by the club. These traps were much better and more reliable than any other traps available.

He faithfully maintained and serviced the traps for both Ballandean and Warwick for over twenty years. At Ballandean he won his last shooting championship at 80 years of age.

Life membership was awarded to him at Ballandean in 1962, and at Warwick in 1965 Eddie was predeceased by his only daughter Betty, also a life member of the Warwick club, in 1980.

He was a quietly-spoken man, and one of nature's gentlemen. Our sincere sympathy to his wife Kit.

ANNUAL FOUR-DAY SHOOT



Well the combination of the best weather in Australia at this time of the year plus top shooting, fishing and good facilities proved irresistible to over 100 shooters at this year's annual shoot at Darwin. It was the best turnout for many years and a good weekend was had by all.


thus saving the club time and money on the shoot-off. Thanks gentlemen, that is real sportsmanship.







The Geraldton Gun Club's annual Crayfish Carnival was held on the 2nd and 3rd August and there were a massive 127 nominations for the weekend. I was most impressed by the way Club President Mick Watson had the club and members looking and performing so well; also the hospitality and the meals made the carnival the best I have attended. There were two State events on the programme and congratulations go to D. Fox and W. Jackson (Collie) on winning the State D/D Championship, and to Murray Alexander (W.A.G.C.) for winning the prestigious State D/B Championship. The hospitality of the Geraldton Gun Club shooters carried on for the following week, when Eddy Toomey, Alan Hocking and Hedley Harmer took Darryl Wiese and 13 others to Little Pigeon Island on the Abrolos Group. Darryl tells me that the three hosts entertained the 14 visitors to a 5-Star quality few days, as well as a very informative look at where the survivors of the "Batavia" shipwreck came ashore and built shelter for themselves and lived for six months in 1629.

Roy Holtfreter, our National President, has just returned from U.S.A. where he was managing the Australian team to the World Skeet Championships. One of the team members, Adrian Cousens, excelled to win second place overall—a mighty effort.

Also just returned from U.S.A. are two more international travellers from the West, Jasper Bright and Merv Neve (E.G.G.C.). They were competing in the U.S.A. National Trap Championships. Jasper is the oldest active shooting member in Australia and he was the oldest competitor in the U.S.A. competition.

Merv tells me he wore his new W.A.C.T.A. blazer every

day to the shoot and was constantly asked about Western Australia. Also the comment was that the A.T.A. should have a jacket like that — it looks great.

Some 900 squads of five shooters (4500) shot the Grand American Hcp, the winner gaining a prize of \$22,000 with a score of 98/100. Around 1800 targets S/B were shot over 73 traps in 10 days — a marathon by our standards. We as Western Australians can be proud of our three ambassadors to the U.S.A., bearing in mind the forthcoming America's Cup defence.

Northam Gun Club's carnival was held on 23rd and 24th August and saw a good field of shooters for their trap programme, including the State Continental D/B expertly won by Tod Harris (C.M.T.) with a score of 50/50. On the Sunday the State Champion of Champions, to keep it in the family, was won by father John Harris with a score of 98/100. The overall High Gun was won by State Vice-President John Fissioli. The Club President Bruce Maley and his committee are to be commended especially for enthusing their own Town Council to support the shoot in the form of trophies, making a formidable line-up of trophies.

Our Coaching Director has just concluded a five-day coaching clinic in the Far North — three days at Koolan Island and two days at Derby. They were the most intense he has experienced and a total of 31 shooters attended. He says that "after reviewing all that was achieved in these five days, the exercise was well and truly worthwhile and one that both clubs will be approaching the Dept. for Sport & Recreation for a similar seminar in 1987. I myself would like to thank the Dept. for assisting me to conduct these seminars and Mr Simon Leunig for doing the arranging."

In closing I am very pleased to see clubs are starting to use the trap guards on the trap machines.

Northern Notes

Here and there

Darwin Gun club hosted its most successful shoot for many years on the Picnic Day long weekend, with total nominations in excess of 120.

Mister '49er', Alan spence returned for another successful foray into the wild North, and brought the 'Quiet Achiever' Neil Berry with him. They shared many of the 'A' grade trophies, putting up breaks of 200 plus in so doing.

Alan, always the source of a quote or two on the shooting grounds, came up with another after he'd posted the possible in the Calcutta. 'You know,' he said, 'I was seeing them so well, and concentrating so much that if the target had shot through the legs of a naked Nullarbor nymph prancing on the pitch, I could have powdered it without powdering her.'

However, it was that dapper, debonair, political lookalike, Dick Ayres, who took the top trophy in an unexpectedly short shoot off. Reputedly, he was not amused at the antics of the consortium who bought him in the Auction, when said alliance 'went West' for a 'Night at the Opera' and left Dick in 'Duck Soup' without even shouting him a drink. We don't do it that way up here, Victorians! Perhaps it's time to combine prizemoney and Calcutta money, and split the total, say 70%-30%, buyers and shooter respectively, to stop the problems.

The shoot went well, but some aspects of management could be improved. Contestants in the shoot off of one event were not amused when told that, although ample daylight was left to shoot an extra thousand targets, the shoot off would take place next morning due to the possibility that the Social evening and Calcutta auction might be delayed. As one spectator remarked, 'What are they running? A restaurant or a shoot?'

Another shoot off between two local shooters, delayed with the consent of one, when the other was called away on urgent business, resulted in a Committee decision to delay the shoot of indefinitely. The remaining shooter, with justification at this most strange decision, protested. This happened after presentation of trophies for the day, and after two hours notice was given to the absent shooter. Under no cirumstances should he have been subjected to such an unreasonable delay. It was most embarrassing for all concerned, needlessly.

Perhaps these are isolated, and, perhaps minor points. It is the proliferation of a succession of these 'minor points' which, in many cases will ruin the reputation of a Club or a particular shoot.



THE ROLE OF THE COACH



M. Alexander — W.A. State Coaching Director.

The role of the Coach is an ever changing one. It started within our sport with the person who helped start novices off and carried through to assist the more proficient.

This system has worked well throughout Australia and as experience is gained so the coaching system adjusts yet never losing sight of the fact that the coaching system must be available to all standards.

Of course this places a fair strain on our Club Coaches and it is inevitable when a Coach could not help an individual's problem, that shooter just stops and investigates no further. It is surprising how little our members know of this sport and its interconnecting arms. For the shooter who needs that extra help which seems out of reach, he can get his Club Coach to contact the Zone Coach and seek his assistance.

The Zone Coach generally has at his call a variety of coaching aids and he in turn has the assistance of the State Coaching Director. He in turn can supply or obtain most information and any technical data required. The State Coach can also go onto the National Coaching Director when the curliest of problems remains unanswered.

It boils down to, if you don't 'ASK', the System can't provide the answer.

The W.A. emphasis has been placed on this chain from the coachings inception and, apart from the odd hiccup, has proved successful. Because the system is used, Clay Target Shooters in W.A. are benefiting from improved standards and this in turn is reflected in the support the Department for Sport and Recreation gives to WACTA. The way in which the majority of our shooters present themselves also has many benefits as WACTA has an excellent rapport with the W.A. Police Department to the excent they recognise the W.A. Coaching Council assistance in their Police Trap Team.

The Armed Forces have also availed themselves of the W.A. Coaching Council's services and regularly have Skeet

training days. This has helped them in skill acquisition and is a regular part of their program, especially when you see how quickly the discipline these people have in their training helps them to quickly pick up and adjust to the necessary skill required in Skeet Shooting.

All this is beneficial to WACTA, ACTA and all State bodies for the different government departments have become aware of our sport and how it benefits them and the public in raising the standards of firearm awareness and safety.

Yet all this is of no consequence unless the system carries on, communicates and improves. Improvements that help can be as little as the novice coaching package put together by the W.A. Coaching Council, Department for Sport and Recreation and the W.A. Gun Club to ensure our novices received the correct information and introduction to the Sport, to the arrival shortly of a World Class Skeet Coach.

So now our Coaches find they must liaise with more outside the sport to gain expertise, finance, and to help improve the image of our sport. Not an easy task but one that does have its rewards.

But one thing remains and that is that all Coaches are human as well as being volunteers and it should be remembered that most times they assist others often to the detriment of their own shooting ability. Yet if we use our system and not consciously undermine it these same people will continue to give of themselves to improve shooters in ability, appreciation of this sport and above all, pride in yourself.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Sir

The Australian Skeet Team to the U.S.A. for the World Championships has very recently returned. However, before going home to Victoria, Adrian Cousens, a team member, contested the N.S.W. State Skeet Championship and other events conducted at New South Wales Gun Club.

In a discussion with him re the World Championships, I discovered that he had achieved a second placing in the premier event, the 12 gauge World Championship. To say that I was both excited and delighted at this news is an understatement. That such an achievement was made by an Australian after such short acquaintance with the American scene is, in my opinion, magic.

I was fortunate to be a member of the first skeet team to the World Championships in 1984. Seeing the very high standard of performance by the American shooters had convinced me that Australia was some five to ten years behind the top Americans. Apart from the greater opportunity for intense competition I am convinced that what favoured the American shooter was first that they shot the smaller gauges; this demands greater accuracy from the shooter but more importantly it allows him/her to more closely call the shot — the gun does not jump around as does the 12 gauge.

Second there is a lot of doubles shooting from all stations. This most certainly sharpens up the shooter — if you can shoot doubles from stations 3, 4 and 5 then singles become easier. It seems to me that doubles shooting can and should be introduced in Australia and certainly should be included in our Nationals.

One of the things which stands out in my mind regarding the 1984 trip to San Antonio was the .410 World Championship shoot-off; it went to over 300 targets. It seemed that visible pieces of broken targets were seen about every fourth target, the rest were smoke rings. This was truly an awesome display of shooting skill.

That Adrian Cousens was able to meet these very formidable shooters head-on and come very close to taking the lot is a truly commendable performance and supports the contention that Australian athletes can match the best when given the opportunity.


