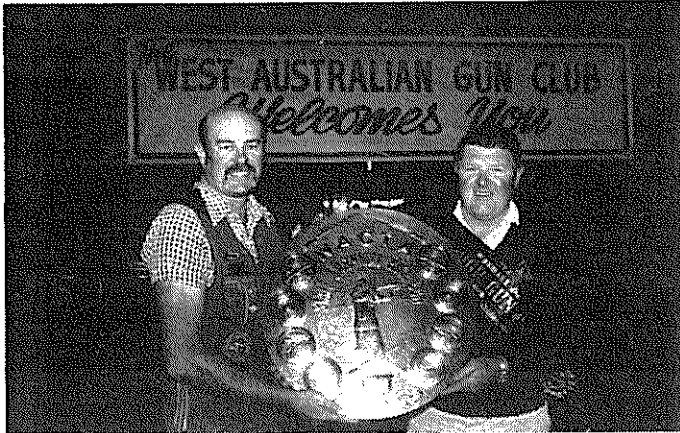

Well they have done just that, and one can only marvel at the effort and dedication a small band of people have put into a club to keep our sport going.

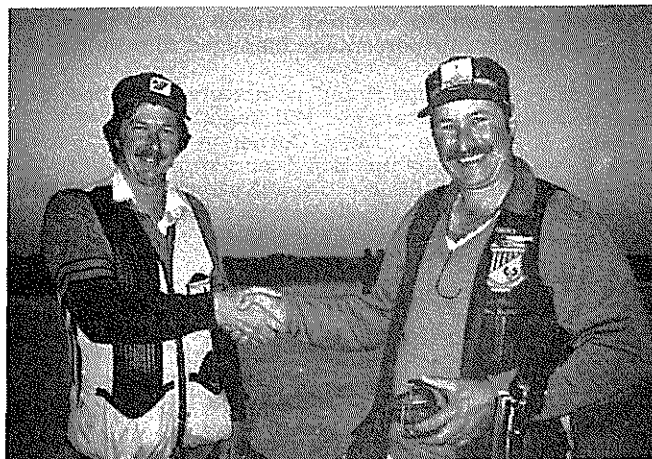
In less than 12 months a site was found close to the small country town of Meningie.

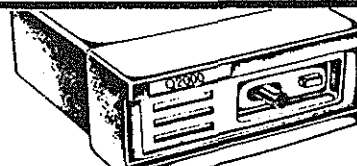

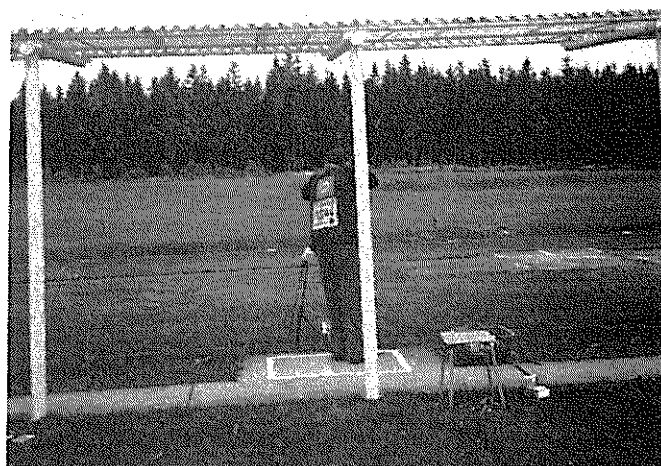

1986 N.S.W. STATE TRAP CARNIVAL

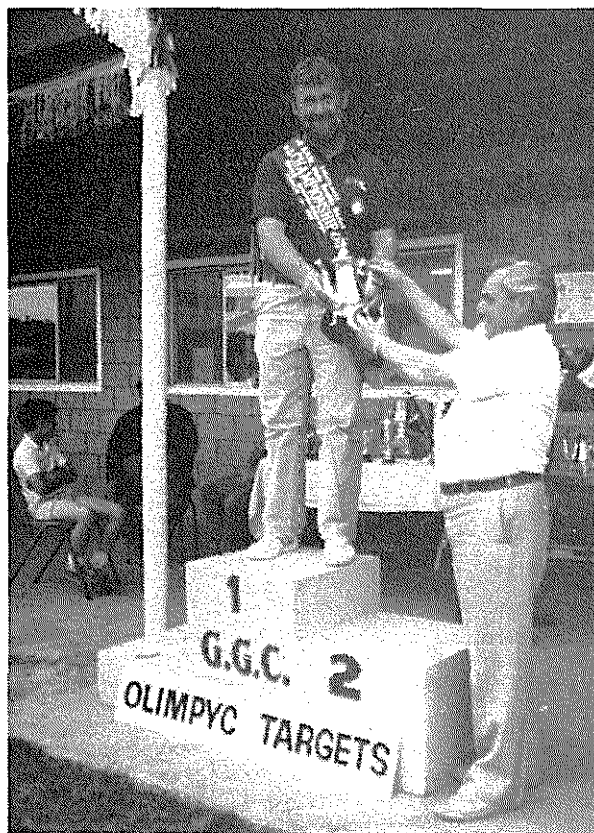

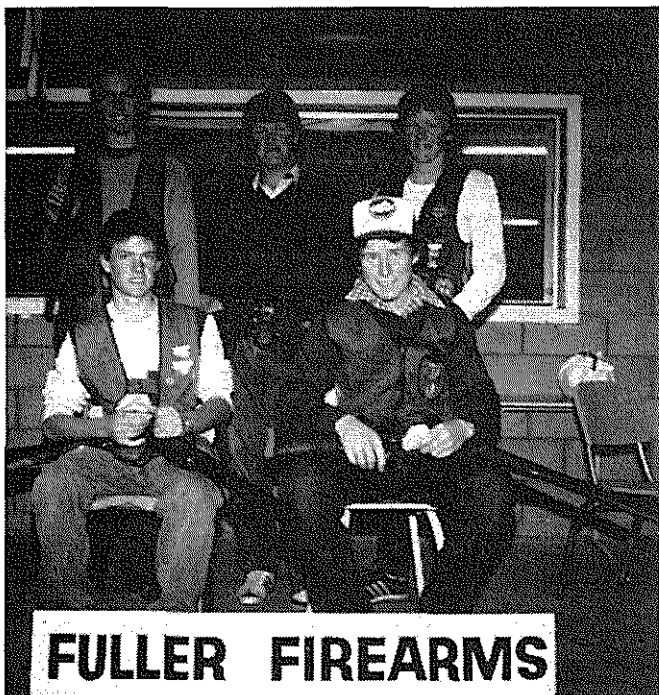

Les James, President 1981-82 and an Honorary Life Member.

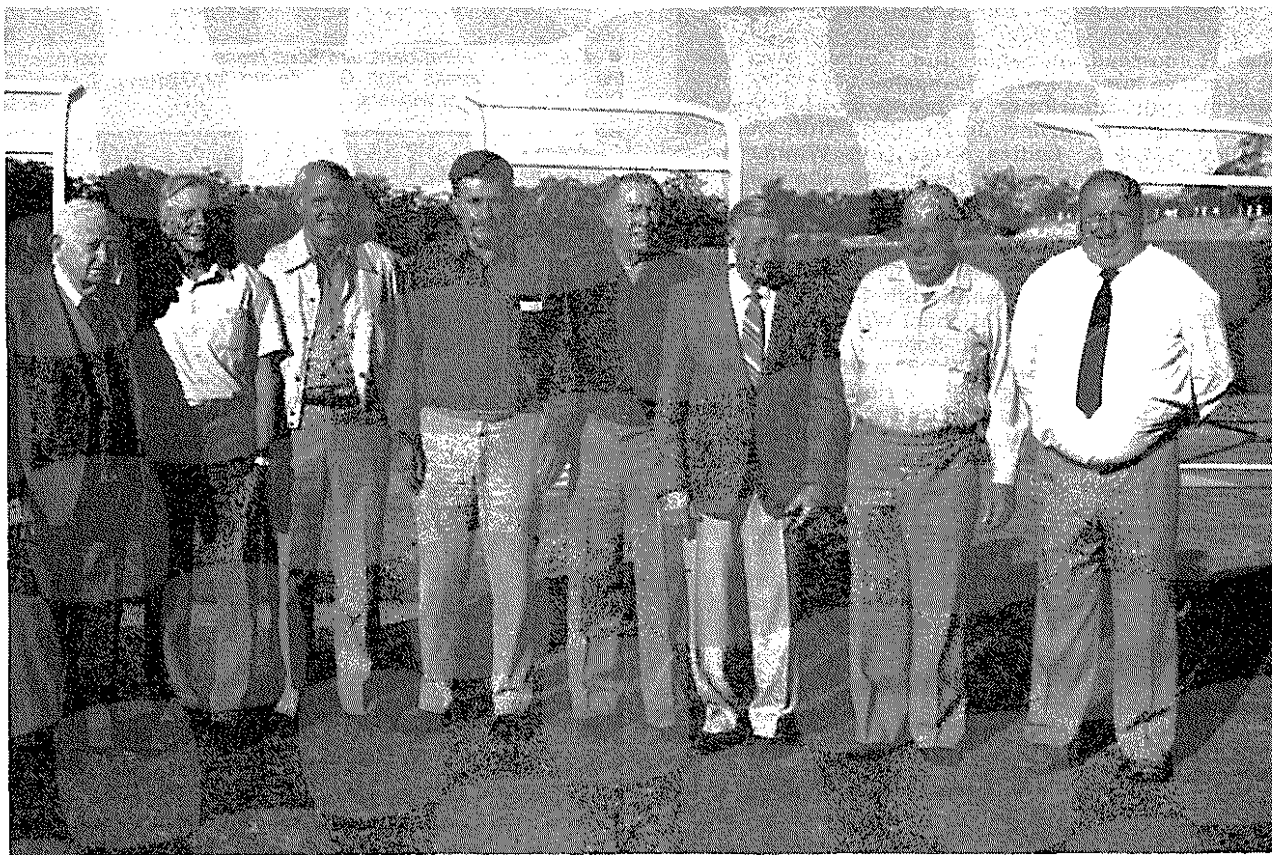
Col. Wheatley, President 1983.

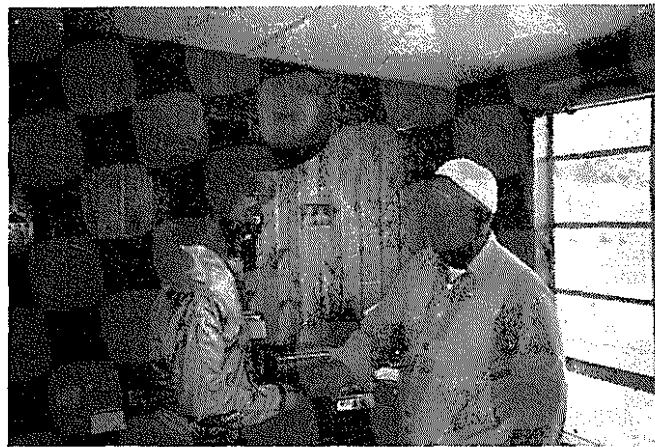


• Grant Thatcher receiving his Overall High Gun trophy from Club President, Brian Dowell.

Without wanting to go over old ground, I must point out that our initial invitation was at your request and made in good faith approximately 12 months ago.

We have kept you informed at all times on the preparations that had been made regarding the coaching clinics that have been organised around the country in accordance with your requirements to which the response has been overwhelming. The damage that will result from your non appearance is immeasurable, unfortunately shooting will be the loser and in particular, shooting in Australia as not only have we lost faith with the shooters, we have also lost face with the National organisations that have been involved with your visit.

It is fully appreciated that a persons family etc. must always take priority, however, to be treated so discourteously by receiving advice by mail on the very day of your planned departure for Australia that you would not be making the trip is almost beyond belief.

Any attempt made by this Association to conduct future coaching clinics with coaches from overseas will be almost impossible to organise until such time as the memory of this venture has faded into obscurity. In the meantime the Skeet shooters from Australia have been left with bitter memories of what could have, and with a little foresight and courtesy from our invited guest, should have been a most memorable experience which would have raised the status of Phil Murray and the skeet shooters in Australia.

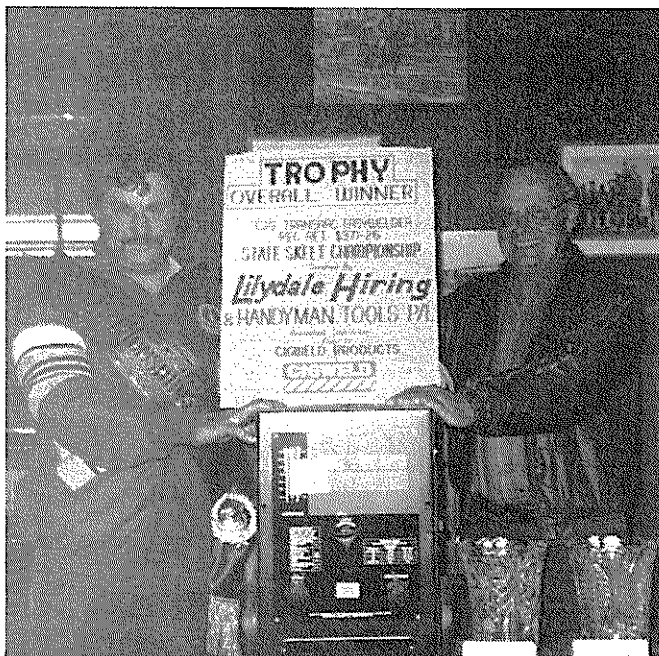
A decision will be made at the National Executive Meeting on the matter of re-examinations of registered referees.

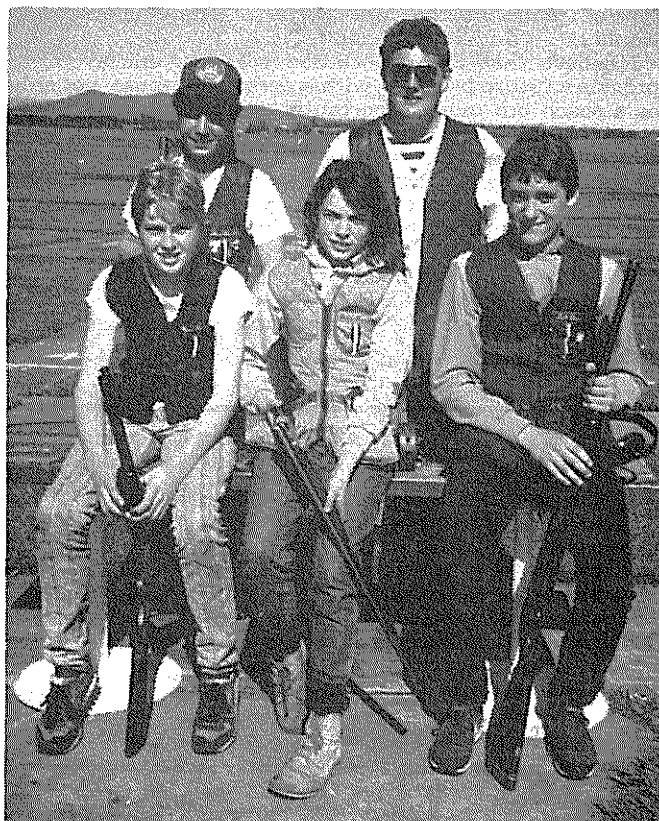

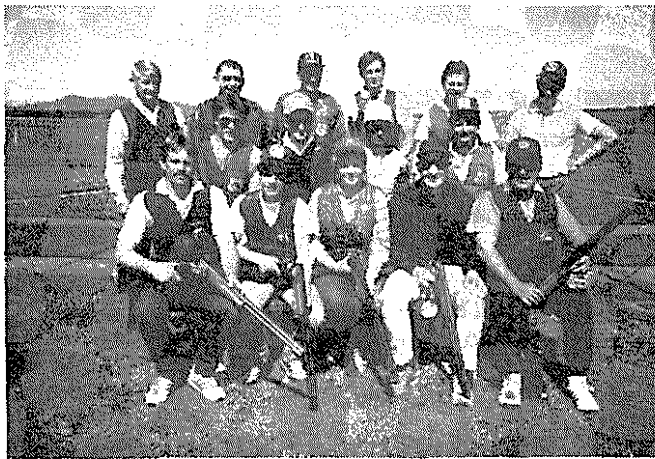
