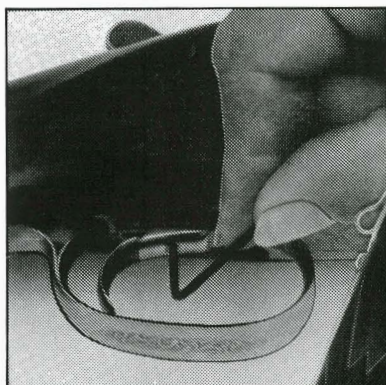

The various Committees are putting in the time and effort that is needed to ensure that the sport of Clay Target Shooting continues to progress and they with your assistance will do just that.

As well as A.C.T.A. meetings, both myself and Peter Quire attended the annual meeting of the Australian Shooting Association on November 30.

This body which represents all disciplines to the International scene including the Australian Olympic Federation and the Commonwealth Games Association plays a vital part in World Shooting, the Oceania area in particular.

Delegates at the meeting chose to re-elect Peter Quire to the International competitions Committee and elect myself to the position of Vice-President.

Both Peter and I are aware of the importance of the positions entrusted to us and we will endeavour to carry out our respective duties to the best of our ability.

Internationally 1987 may prove to be a very difficult year for with the changed conditions for the Olympic Games it will not be an easy task to obtain quotas for Australia.

Our own International Shooting Committee are facing this problem at the moment and while it is a difficult situation that we are confronted with, the end result will depend on our overall ability to both attend and compete at the various qualifying competitions that will be conducted overseas.

A number of our leading shooters have already indicated their wish to compete overseas and for other than the World Moving Target Championships those doing so will be meeting their own expenses.

Bearing this in mind their dedication must be fully appreciated by those who think that perhaps this should always be the case, for in the event of any Australian shooter gaining a quota position for the 1988 Olympic Games, that quota position is not for the shooter, it is for the country that the shooter represents. Therefore all the personal costs and success achieved will not guarantee the shooter a place in the team. **He really is shooting for this country isn't he!**

Let us make certain that those who love their sport and are prepared to make the sacrifices that they do at least carry with them our very best wishes as they attempt to obtain a quota position at the Olympic Games for Australia first and themselves second.

Don't forget the Olympic Discipline Championships in Perth next month. They provide the first opportunity to shoot the Olympic Trench and I.S.U. Skeet at the magnificent complex in Perth.

Following closely behind will be the 1987 Trap Nationals to be held in Brisbane during April and planning in conjunction with the Queensland State Association is well under way.

As an Association we have our obligations to our members and we look forward to carrying them out especially for those shooters who have a commitment to the sport.

Good luck with your shooting throughout 1987.

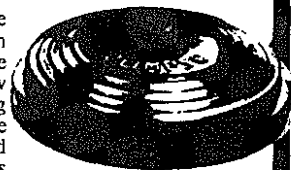

TAMWORTH CLAY TARGET CLUB

The Tamworth Club conducted their Annual Open Trap Shoot over the weekend of the 6th and 7th September. For the first time the Club was able to obtain valued sponsorship from Joe Chiappetta of Gambarms (Aust) Pty. Ltd. This was in the form of a Fiochhi Tournament which carried an automatic shot gun valued at \$600 to the overall winner and also the "Gambarms" Trophy event, which also saw the overall winner receive an automatic shot gun valued at \$600.

As all Clubs will appreciate, sponsorship is the "lifblood" for any Club no matter how big or how small and Club officials cannot thank Joe enough for his generous sponsorship.

The Club must be left scratching their head though — because even though they advertised widely and for many months beforehand — numbers were only in the mid-50s.

Many ideas have been suggested, and long hours have been put in to try and alter the situation next year, with the promise of continued sponsorship from "Gambarms" — the club have decided to move their Open Trap shoot off the first weekend in September and it will now be conducted on the 2nd weekend in September.

This move — it is hoped — will allow those shooters who cannot be in two places at once to attend Tamworth along with their other favourites.

Competition got underway on Saturday morning in bright sunshine and warm spring conditions.

The first event was a 15 target double barrel eye opener cash divide. Those to return 15-15 were Tom Turner (Jnr), Michael Wolstenholme, John Fryer, Chas Riegert, Bud Sweeney, Andrew Futter, Mick Blenman, Peter Fitzallan, Harold Batson, Mark Melbourne, Terry Mitchell, Joe Chiappetta, Grahame Wyatt, Tom Turner (Snr) and Graham Wilson.

The 25 target Tamworth and District Double Barrel Championship followed, with eight possibles being recorded. The overall winner was in-form Guyra shooter Roger Vidal with 74-74. Grade placings were as follows: AA: Mick Blenman 73-74, Greg Scott 50-51; A: Rex Whitten 56-57, Terry Mitchell 27-28; B: Stuart Stanley 42-43, Rod Taylor 36-37; C: Phillip Allen 24-26, Lachlan Cameron 23-26.

Shooters were now well and truly warmed up for the 25 target double barrel Fiochhi Tournament. From the 56 shooters only six possibles were returned. The proud owner of a new automatic shot gun is Terry Mitchell from Singleton with 54-54, the remaining places being 1st in each grade 500 shells and 2nd in each grade 250 shells.

The afternoon events concluded with a 20 target double barrel handicap with sweeps in meterage groups.

11-14m: Steve Hellier 19-20, Phillip Allan 18-20, Bill Hodges 17-20, Anne Wyatt 17-20; 15-17m: Michael Simpson, Doug James and Don Thrift 20-20; 18-20m: Ceasar Diaz, Terry Mitchell and Stuart Stanley 20-20; 21-25m: Angelo Piazza 20-20, John Fryer and Peter Fitzallan 19-20.

Also conducted over the first day's events was a two-member teams competition for the Lindsay Bull Memorial Trophy. Lindsay was one of founding members of the Tamworth Club and served in many positions of office in the Club, and at the time of his death in August, 1985 he held the position of Club Treasurer. The trophy was kindly donated by his family, with his wife Maisie being on hand to present it, the winners being John Fryer and Ceasar Diaz from Newcastle with a score of 165-170.

The trophy will now become an annual competition to be shot for on the first day of the Open Trap Shoot.

Sunday morning also dawned fine and sunny and 57 shooters took part in the 15 target point score cash divide. Only five possibles resulted, Doug Ellis, Roger Vidal, John Kent, Rex Varley and Tony Aceti.

The 25 target Country Capital Point Score Championship was the next event, and the overall winner was John Fryer of Newcastle with 117-117. The remaining grade placings went to: AA: Doug Ellis 116-117, Roger Vidal 83-84; A: Neil Scott 75-75, Allan Coyle 74-75; B: Galvin Martin 78-81, Tony Aceti 77-81; C: Lachlan Cameron 73-75, Steve Hellier 72-75.

The "Gambarms" 30 target Double Barrel Trophy event was next up and the second shot gun found a home in Guyra after a very long shoot off, the winner overall being Doug Ellis with 167-167 — he and Tom Turner (Snr) really got down to it! AA: Tom Turner (Snr) 166-167, Col Burt 120-121; A: Terry Mitchell 64-65, Tony Aceti 54-55; B: Errol Duggan 84-85, Mark Melbourne 30-31; C: Steve Hellier 39-39, Clem Foster 38-39.

The last event for the weekend was 10 Pair Double Rise — Loomberah Valley Championship. The overall winner was Tom Turner (Snr) with 19-20. AA: Chas Riegert 28-30, Col Burt 25-30; A: Peter Fitzallan 18-20, Tom Turner (Jnr) 15-20; B: Stuart Stanley 17-20, Harold Batson 15-20; C: Bill Hodges 23-30, Steve Hellier 22-30.

With all events concluded, only the high gun winners had to be decided. The winner of the overall high gun was John Fryer of Newcastle with 247-255 — with a further five shooters right on his tail with 246!

The C Grade 14 metre high gun was taken out by one of the newest members of the local club — Steve Hellier with

224-255 — Steve certainly shot very well over the weekend and if he continues in that direction it will not be long before he has stepped up a grade and is at the winners' dais again. Well done Steve.

The Ladies High Gun went to Georgina Mitchell with 224-255 and Junior High Gun to Tom Turner.

The Commonwealth Bank Trophy, a High Gun award for Tamworth members, was won for the second year in a row by Col Burt with 246-255.

All in all a very good weekend's shooting — a pleasing result for the club's new President, Geoff Walters, and his committee.

So don't forget — Tamworth open D.T.L. in 1987 will be the second weekend of September.

FIRST ANNUAL BOB HORTON MEMORIAL

A new perpetual trophy has been established by the ACT International Gun Club in memory of the late Bob Horton, an American ballistics engineer and gunsmith of international reputation.

Known as the Bob Horton Memorial Junior Achievement Award, it is an incentive trophy for junior DTL shooters. It will be awarded annually to the club's best C grade junior (cumulative scores over 8 DTL championships). The 1986 winner is 11 year old Stuart Gault of Weston, ACT.

Monthly junior DTL trophies are also awarded, and are now being hotly contested by a full squad of youngsters each month.

The trophies are sponsored by Kessell and Associated Pty Ltd, a Canberra environmental and computing company. Its Director, Steve Kessell, is also the club's first Vice President. Kessell, who was introduced to clay target shooting by Horton at the age of 10, sees the trophies as a fitting memorial to a man who spent considerable time and energy over many decades encouraging youngsters to shoot competently and safely.

ONCE A SHOTGUNNER ALWAYS A SHOTGUNNER

In reply to my recent request for information concerning the very early activities of Gun Clubs in both Western Australia and Queensland, my problem being that I had no evidence of live bird shooting in either of these two States prior to the introduction of clay targets around 1920, although I was sure that some shooting activity would have taken place as it did in all other States.

I would also like to hear from my friends in Queensland. Perhaps someone has a good story to tell — if so I'd like to hear about it, together with a picture or two if possible. Stories from any of our old-timers would be most welcome.

I'm indebted to Mr Tom Holt in Western Australia for the following letter which details his early shooting experiences in Western Australia since the age of 12 years.

Dear George,

I am writing to you re. your article in the last issue of the Clay News in reference to the early years of shooting and in particular Western Australia.

Firstly allow me to introduce myself. Name: Tommy Holt. I am 69 years of age and have been field shooting especially ducks since I was 12 years old. My father bought me a Liege double barrel hammer gun from I. & W. Bateman's of Fremantle for 2 pounds 10 shillings. It was brand new and I used it quite successfully for 20 years. We used to ride pushbikes to Jandakot, an outer suburb of Fremantle approximately 10 miles from the city centre. There were many small swamps and lakes in this area and plenty of black ducks and some teal. Cartridges — Grand Prix were 5/- per box but we used to save up and buy 100 per year from Boans (a big department store in Perth) as a special pre-duck shooting open season for 16/- per hundred. Incidentally times were tough and 100 shells was my total supply for the duck shooting season. Consequently, we didn't do much flying shooting although my father and his brothers were exceptionally good wing shots. I don't think I have ever seen better.

The boys used to crawl on our bellies sometimes for hundreds of yards, pushing our guns ahead of us just to get a sitting shot and then often wait a considerable time for the birds to swim into range and bunch up. As I said before it was the time of the Great Depression as we made every shot pay a dividend. Times have changed — in those days we considered a bag of two blackies and a teal or two a real good weekend. It wasn't much use getting any more birds even if we had been able, as our mothers had no refrigeration so the birds had to be cooked and eaten as soon as we arrived home. Our gear consisted of 1 pushbike, gun strapped along the main bar of the bike, cartridges, 1

blanket and some food, plus a billy in a sugar bag slung over our backs. This is all we were able to carry and lasted us from Saturday lunch time till Sunday afternoon and then home and back to work or school on Monday. Incidentally these lakes and swamps still exist in Jandakot and the ducks are there in the season in thousands but these areas are now heavily populated and shooting is not allowed. We didn't have much money in those days, but we had two marvellous attributes in abundance, youth, and unbounded enthusiasm for hunting. We lived very close to the earth.

I suppose you wonder what the foregoing has to do with the history of shooting in W.A. I joined the Perth Gun Club in 1950, was granted a life membership some years back and am still active in our new club, the W.A. Gun Club. I have in my possession a seven-day chiming clock that was won by my grandfather in Kalgoorlie in 1904 with the following inscription: Presented by Nazzuchelle and Downs to Goldfields Gun Club Pigeon Trophy won by T. Holt 4/11/04.

I have also a large silver cup inscribed as follows: Amerlite trophy, Presented W. Sandover and Co. Won by Tobias Holt, Osborne Park Gun Club G. Curtis Sec. 1904.

Osborne Park is a suburb of Perth and both firms Nazzuchelle and Sandover are still operative in the West.

Tobias Holt was my grandfather. My own father (deceased) often told me stories of the various sporting events held in Kalgoorlie about the turn of the century. Kalgoorlie was booming and famous sportsmen came from all over the world to Kalgoorlie. My dad said live bird shooting was very popular and drew large crowds. It was usually held on Sunday mornings at the back of a hotel on the famous Boulder block. This hotel was managed or owned by a notorious character called Bull Bennett. Apparently bookmakers were allowed and Dad said bets of 100 guineas were often placed on the outcome of one shoot. It was the heyday of gold and the bets were settled in gold guineas. Dad said it was really nerve-wracking to go out to shoot and hear the bookmakers shooting the odds on a kill. They were mainly side bets and didn't benefit the actual shooter. My father also said seven kills from 10 birds was considered exceptional shooting.

I don't know whether the foregoing is of much use or interest to you George but it serves to illustrate that to my knowledge shooting both live birds and clays, plus of course field shooting has been actively pursued in the West since the turn of the century at least, and most probably before that. My father told me stories of the invasion of the rabbit hordes across the Nullarbor, the initial excitement they created and of course the plentiful targets for shooters. Dad told me that at times the wild turkeys migrated, and he saw miners shooting them from mine poppet heads.

I have met you on your tips to the West and I read with interest your articles in the Clay News. I do hope you find something of interest in my ramblings and there is more if you are interested.

DAY ONE: City of Wagga Championship — 50T

At the conclusion of the 50T there were no less than 16 shooters who had shot the possible. The shoot offs of course as are intended do break up the field and at the end of the first event of the Championships the results will show that, continuing on with his consistent shooting, Adrian Cousens from Victoria was the overall winner with a fine 133/133. Wagga shooter Maree Rooke was proud of winning the ladies' section of her home town Championship with a score of 48/50 with Mark Crevatin a most promising junior from Victoria taking out the junior section with a score of 47/50. Our usual visitor from N.Z. Ted McRae was again right on target and with a score of 61/63 the Veterans title was secured.

EVENT TWO: All States Skeet Championship — 50T

Defending champion Adrian Cousens was again right on target and at the completion of the first 50T he and eight others had shot the possible.

What a long day this turned out to be. At 7.45pm shooting was still taking place and a late finish was not in doubt. Finally at 8.15pm it was all over and again Adrian Cousens had outstayed the field with a repeat of his first event score of 133/133. It wasn't all that easy however as John Summers took his score to 132/133 and kept the winner honest all the way.

Carol Ogden from Melbourne with a well shot 50/50 took the ladies section with N.T. junior Thomas Weis continuing his good shooting from 1985 to be the top junior with a 49/50. Ray Melville from Tamworth, N.S.W. had decided that this event was his as far as the veterans section was concerned and his 48/50 proved him to be correct.

DAY TWO — Event Three — Australasian Skeet Championship — 50T.

Possibles at the 50T mark stood at eight including our visitor from New Zealand, Graeme Webber, President of the N.Z.C.T.A., with John Wooley who is a New Zealander/Australian also sharing the limelight.

Despite the rigors of working full-time in the Nationals Office, emerging only to shoot, Col Burt recently appointed Coach of N.S.W. was showing the field that he knew what it was all about and with a final 89/89 Col from Tamworth was the proud winner of his first National Event. A very popular win and considering his work load a very meritorious one.

Many good scores recorded right through the grades and while we may only be seen to be recognising the winners this is not meant to be the case. Full scores are published elsewhere and full credit must be given to all who recorded results — you have not been forgotten, space just does not allow for other than a brief summary of each event.

Ray Melville and Carol Ogden had by now strung together two successive victories in the respective sections with scores of 50/50 for Ray and 48/50 for Carol. Mark Crevatin was again back in the thick of things and his score of 48/50 was good enough to take out the junior section, his second for the Championship.

EVENT FOUR: A.C.T.A. Golden Jubilee Championship — 50T

A most prestigious event which produced a field of 155 and 17 possibles which for once did not include Adrian Cousens who having just shot a 501 break (only the second ever recorded in Australia) appeared to have lost the concentration for which he has become well-known.

the targets as well as anyone on the ground evidenced by his winning total of 110/110 and was a proud recipient of what is now a collectors item, the Golden Jubilee Championship Overall Sash. Again many fine scores including Jim Wilberforce with his 109/110 to take first place in A Grade.

Carol Ogden with a 56/58 and Ray Melville who recorded a 49/50 were both on a treble and Thomas Weis from the N.T. had joined Mark Crevatin of Victoria with two Championship wins each to date.

DAY THREE — Event Five — Commonwealth Skeet Championship 100T

The first of the big titles, with 15 shooters clean at the 50T half way mark it looked as though a very interesting competition was going to take place. However, at the 100T mark the field had been reduced to three possibles, International Alex Crikis, Laurie Chelepy from Queensland and N.Z. International John Wooley. First to go was Alex Crikis at 105/106. With an even contest taking place, the experience of John Wooley may have taken over. This did not eventuate — Laurie Chelepy all the way from Rockhampton won the Commonwealth Championship with an excellent 135/135 and the title was saved for Australia.

Carol Ogden recorded an excellent 96/100 to take the ladies event and her fourth title from the Championships. Thomas Weis again on target with his 96/100 secured for himself the junior section and his third carnival title.

Ted McRae foiled Ray Melville's attempt at a quadrilla when he won his second title with a well-shot 97/100.

DAY FOUR — Event Six — 17th Australian Skeet Championship — 100T

With a field of 164 there were six possibles at the end of the 100T, Laurie Chelepy, Queensland; Ben Dudenas, Victoria; Craig Meuleman, Victoria; Adrian Cousens, Victoria; Hank Theunissen, New South Wales; and Col Burt, New South Wales.

This was obviously the one title that was special above all others and the intensity of the competition was evident. Defending champion Adrian Cousens was anxious to record his fourth title which would set a record, breaking that of three wins by Ken Lowry.

Col Burt was shooting well and had his supporters, not the least being his anxious wife Jenny busy working in the office. All of the final six shooters were keen as would be expected and at the end of the day the experience gained by Adrian Cousens over the years stood him in excellent stead and with a score of 189/189 he retained his title and set a new record of four victories in the National Skeet title.

Congratulations not only to Adrian but to all the competitors with commiserations to the five who found Adrian's ability on the day just that fraction too much to cope with. While the records show that this may be so, Adrian did not have things all his own way as Ben Dudenas

F.I.T.A.S.C. CLUB TEAM — 400T

For the fourth successive year the Melbourne Gun Club proved to be just too strong for any other combination that

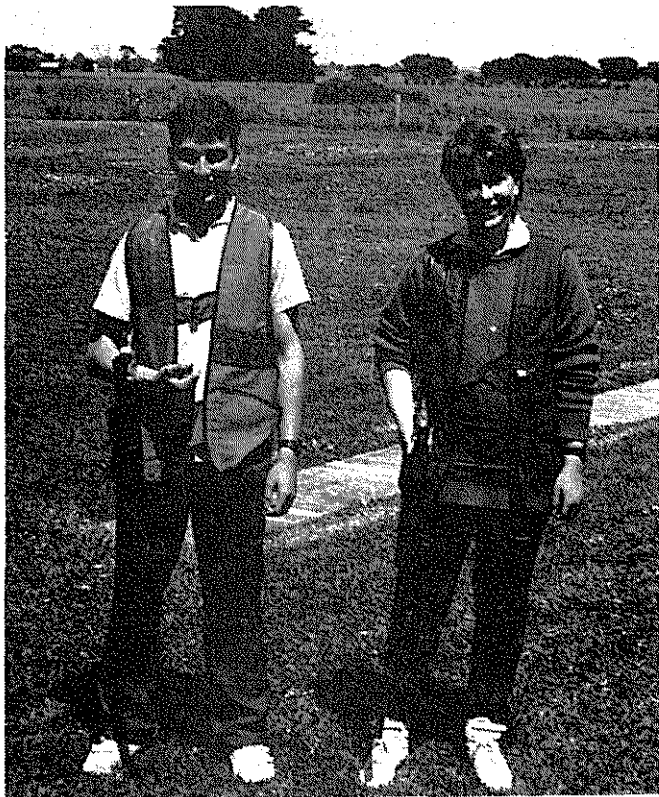
SOUTH WESTERN ZONE SCHOOLBOYS/SCHOOL- GIRLS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Brett Hucker, of Lake Bolac High School, returned a perfect score to win the Junior Boys' Section.

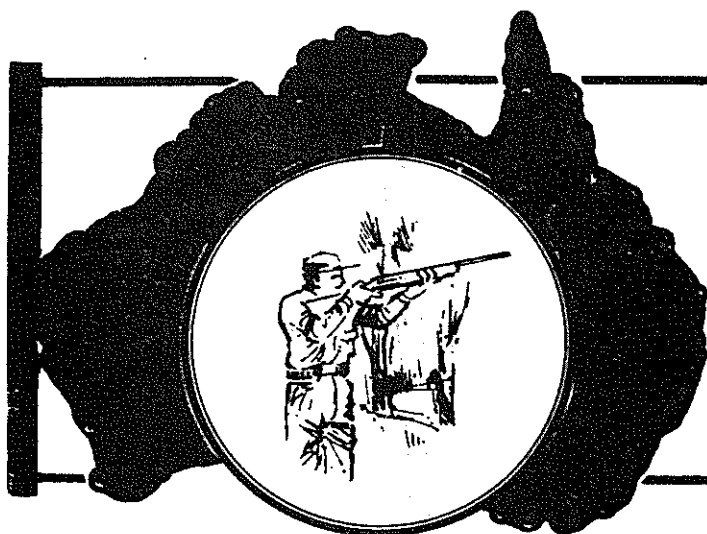
P. Riordan, of Monivae College, and Jason Williams, of Mount Clear Technical School, finished second and third respectively.

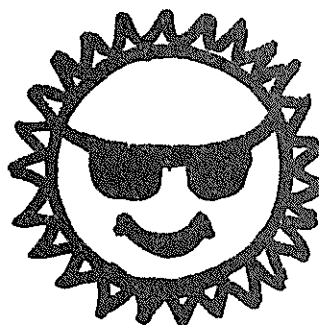

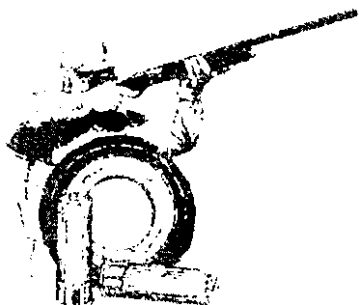
