

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

As you may recall, the Annual Meeting in Echuca directed that the Association migrate from a Company Limited by Guarantee to an Association under the Associations Incorporation Act (1981).

I am pleased to say that this transfer has now taken place and that we are now the Australian Clay Target

Association Incorporated.

What this transfer really means however, is that acting upon our legal advice we have taken the necessary steps to protect our members. This protection does not extend to clubs as such as they are entities in their own right and responsible for their own actions.

It is hoped that all clubs will, if they have not already done so, make the move to become an Incorporated body, similarly all State Associations should also make the same move and ensure that they have the protection that Incor-

poration offers.

The paperwork to become Incorporated is minimal as is the cost. The protection is immense and should not be ignored. The problems that can be caused may never happen to you, then again they might, and of course, then it would be too late.

Make the small effort, become Incorporated and do it as

soon as practicably possible.

O.D titles in Perth this month, Trap Nationals in Brisbane next month, a lot of good competition is available for those who wish to participate.

The National Referees Association did meet in Melbourne on February 14. Owing to printing deadlines it is not possible to detail their findings. These will be published once they have been presented to the National Executive Committee for their final decision. This will be in April at the Nationals so until that time, at least, there are no changes to the status quo.

Please have a close look at the program notice for Brisbane as the rules of competition are quite clearly set

out for all to read.

These conditions will apply to all future Nationals varying only in relation to the requirements of each particular discipline.

They have been made in the best interests of the sport and those competing. It is trusted that they will be accepted by all for the same reasons.


I look forward to meeting as many shooters as is possible at Brisbane. So until then, good shooting to all.



NOTIFICATION OF CHANGE OF ADDRESS:

First off this month I would like to remind all club committees, when you have a change of office bearers — in particular the Secretary, PLEASE ADVISE THE A.C.T.A. AND THE STATE ASSOCIATION. On too many occasions I notice the Secretary's name on adverts in this magazine as being someone totally different to the name that I have on my register. Your Club will be the one that misses out on information if we don't have the correct address.

1987 STATE PROGRAM BOOKS:

There have been a number of Clubs who have contacted me looking for 1987 books. I'm afraid that if your Club did not order their books by the required date — you will not get any. The ordering system as it stands at present, has been in operation for some four years, that being — the order forms are sent out to all Clubs, and must be returned by the 31st August along with the cheque for the ordered number. The State Association then has printed the number that have been ordered.

So this will act as an early reminder for the 1988 books — make sure your Secretary sends in the order on time.

MONTHLY NEWSLETTERS TO ALL CLUBS:

How many of you are aware that a newsletter is sent to all Clubs within the State? Do you ever see them or have them read at meetings? They have been going out each month for the past four or five years.

These newsletters are the only other means of contact between the State Association and the Clubs and usually have important details contained for the benefit of all club members.

It is a little frustrating and disappointing to find that most clubs don't pass these newsletters onto their members — by way of putting them on the notice boards of the club etc., so much so that it is being considered that it may be necessary to phase out the monthly ones and concentrate on putting the information into the Waratah State Notes — this will be considered at the next State Executive Meeting.

REFEREES RE-APPOINTMENT:

Notification has been received from the A.C.T.A. regarding re-examination of referees — this will be sent out quarterly and referees listed will be contacted to arrange for their re-examination.

FROM THE COACHING DESK:

The first of the Zone Coaching Clinics will be held at the Guyra Gun Club on the weekend of the 7th and 8th of March. This Clinic will be conducted by Zone Coach, Roy Shephard and State Coaching Director, Col Burt. Everyone will be welcome to attend as there will be instruction for all levels, videos, etc. etc. Coaching and instruction on trap, skeet, I.S.U. Skeet and Trench shooting will all be covered. Don't forget — everyone is more than welcome to attend.

From the Club coaching point of view — most club coaches have completed their Level I Coaching Accreditation which makes them qualified coaches. If your Club Coach isn't accredited how about making the suggestion that he do the course — it's not hard and it really is better to have qualified coaches giving instruction. On the other side of the coin — if your qualified coaches have given shooting away or are no longer interested in coaching — it is suggested that other shooters be encouraged to do the Level I — further information can be obtained from the State Coaching Director — Col Burt — (067) 65 9386 A.H. only.

FROM THE NORTHERN ZONE:

Inverell R.S.M. Gun Club are gearing up for their Northern Zone Ball Trap Championship and Continental Championships. Saturday 21st March from 12.00 noon they will conduct the 50 Target Zone Ball Trap and on the Sunday from 9.00 a.m. they have the Zone Single Barrel Continental, Point Score Continental and Double Barrel Continental scheduled. Lunch will be available on SUNDAY. You are always welcome at Inverell and certain to have a great time.

KNOW YOUR DELEGATES:

Second in the series is Northern Zone Delegate, David Menck:

Formerly a keen game shooter when living on the Lachlan River at Forbes in the central west of New South Wales, David took up clay target shooting after having had a few shots on various friends' properties after game had become a bit scarce in 1977.

David joined Parkes Gun Club in 1977 and was immediately bitten by the bug, travelling quite a lot around the state, until transferring with his employer, Dalgetys, to Sydney in early 1979. In Sydney, he joined New South Wales Gun Club, and from there became increasingly more interested in the Olympic Disciplines of clay target shooting he had been lightly exposed to, at such places as Griffith, Downside and A.C.T. International Gun Clubs, and to a certain extent on a few overseas trips.

By the time David was transferred to Tamworth in late 1980, he had already travelled to such places as Indonesia, Singapore, Malaysia, New Zealand and New Caledonia shooting targets and becoming increasingly more involved in I.S.U. shooting.

In 1981 when the state I.S.U. Sub-Committee was restructured, David became further involved as a delegate and was elected Deputy Chairman under Barney Rooke in 1982, a position he held for the following twelve months until taking over as Chairman in 1983; a position he still holds.

In 1982, David was appointed a Referee Examiner for both Trap and Skeet and in 1985 was elevated to the position of State Rules Supervisor. In 1984, David added to his qualifications as a referee by completing an International Judges Course in New Zealand and was subsequently appointed U.I.T. Judge in 1985.

David currently continues to hold his positions as Rules Supervisor and Trap and Skeet Referee Examiner, and is a member of the executive of the New South Wales Clay Target Association. He was also appointed last year as a member of the A.C.T.A. International Shooting Committee and has retained his position for a record four years as Chairman of the I.S.U. Sub-Committee.

David's further international experience during the past few years includes further trips to New Guinea, New Caledonia, New Zealand, Thailand, China, Hong Kong, Singapore, Malaysia and more. David is a great advocate of International experience.







LETTER TO THE EDITOR

With all the anti-hunting and gun outlawing propaganda being broadcast over the last twelve months, and especially leading up to this year's duck season, it may well be an opportune time to let members know exactly what is going on.

The group that has been attempting to make life difficult for us, has been the Animal Liberation Movement and its associated splinter groups. The campaign co-ordinator, Mr Laurie Levy, has stated that there are only two duck seasons left, and he and his group are religiously working toward this aim. Levy has for the past two years, been saturating the media with his anti-duck hunting propaganda, pressurising the politicians, and generally making claims and accusations, using Government statistics out of context. If one was to look at the media coverage of duck hunting up until last August, you could easily be excused for thinking that the animal libbers were winning the battle.

Mr Levy however, forgot about something at the start of his campaign, and now, he is beginning to have his eyes opened.

He forgot about the 400,000 firearms owned in Victoria where his campaign is centred.

He forgot about The Victorian Field and Game Association with their conservation record for saving wetlands and waterbirds.

He forgot about The Sporting Shooters Association with their record for conservation and management of deer, and other fully protected native animals.

He forgot about the Australian Clay Target Association with their record for sporting achievements in International competition, and fostering of Junior shooting events, and their hundreds of members who enjoy their shooting every weekend.

The average shooter in Victoria, whether he be target shooter or hunter, is a totally responsible citizen who through his membership of any of the above organisations, has made a huge contribution to our society by saving endangered native animals, conserving wetlands, and other habitats, and by keeping Australia in the top rungs of International Target Shooting competition.

Back in November 1985, the shooting organisations were trying to lift the ban on Sunday shooting, and Mr Levy vehemently opposed any change to the law. The shooting organisations won that battle, and he lost.

In February 1986, the libbers tried to have the duck season cancelled before it started, the V.F.&G.A. applied to have the season started early in February instead of March, for those of you that don't remember, the season started in February, we won and they lost again.

After the opening weekend, they staged a demonstration on the steps of Parliament House with dead protected species, and called for an immediate cessation of hunting. The season continued right through to the end of May: we beat them again.

After the lead poisoning incident at Bool Lagoon in S.A. they claimed from Government documents that 1348 kilograms of lead pellets were fired into Lake Buloke on opening day 1982. They again demanded that duck hunting be ceased whilst research was conducted. They forgot to mention that there has never been a case of lead poisoning recorded at Lake Buloke or anywhere else in Australia, and that the incident at Bool Lagoon was caused mainly through water levels and cattle grazing being managed incorrectly.

Dr Garth Newman, assistant director of Fisheries and Wildlife at the time, wrote to the Age Newspaper and stated that Lake Buloke had been monitored for seven years, and that lead was not a problem, and had never caused a problem in Victoria. The season continued, and we were successful again.

In August 1986, the V.F.&G.A. received National T.V. coverage of a nest box erection working bee at Sale in Victoria, which showed to the general public the conservation

that duck hunters undertake. The S.S.A.A. has received widespread media coverage with their work with Sambar Deer and Hog Deer projects.

In November 1986, it was proposed to have the 1987 duck season open at 10 a.m. There was only a very short time to object to this proposal. The V.F.&G.A. with the help of the A.C.T.A. clubs of Frankston-Australia, Metro, Melbourne, Wonthaggi and other clay target clubs, raised 12,000 signatures on a petition in only eight days.

Tens of thousands of hand written letters and form letters were sent in protesting about the 10 a.m. opening time. The result of all this was a change back to the same time as last year 7 a.m.

Only through very hard work, we were again successful. There are other campaigns to be fought, other battles on the horizon, and no doubt, other confrontations will be taking place before this article is even printed.

None of these successes however, have been without cost. The shooting organisations have had to use funds which were earmarked for conservation programs. Manpower had had to be diverted from programs designed to improve the sport. The toll on our manpower resources has been great. We are trying to fight a full time operation with part time people.

All shooters must join a club and give their support to their committee men and State executives, so we can continue to win

Most of all is the need for all shooting disciplines, clubs and associations to band together, so that co-ordinated campaigns can be launched against these opposition groups.

Give some thought at your own club level, what has your club done to help in the battle? Does your club have a Public Relations Officer who promotes your activities to the local press!

We can no longer keep our heads buried in the sand, it is time to dig in and fight. Think about it.

NEW ZEALAND TRENCH TITLE TO AUSTRALIA

John Maxwell from Illawara Gun Club has done it again and outshot the New Zealanders at their Nationals to record another win in the New Zealand National Title.

In generally overcast and windy conditions throughout the Nationals, John shot a magnificent 196/200 to equal the New Zealand record and take out the City of Christchurch Championship.

New Zealander John Wooley, well known in Australia, set a New Zealand record in the I.S.U. Skeet to win the City of Christchurch Championships with a score of 198/200.

of Christchurch Championships with a score of 198/200.
Commencing the National Titles, John Maxwell continued his excellent shooting to finish the first day with a 99/100 and repeated the score over the second 100 targets to finish with another record to his name 198/200. While breaking the New Zealand record of 196/200, John also recorded the highest Olympic Trap score by an Australian away from home.

John Wooley also maintained his fine form with a score

of 195/200 to win the I.S.U. Skeet title.

Final score over the 400T, were J. Maxwell (trench) Australia 196/200, 198/200, 394/400 J. Wooley (I.S.U. Skeet) New Zealand 198/200, 195/200, 393/400.

Congratulations on two outstanding performances.



HANDICAPPING NATIONALS 1987

To make it easier for all concerned — office staff, handicapper and shooters — we would like all shooters to please note and adhere to the following points:

- Please present your current 1987 Handicap Card for stamping before nominating. Also your up-to-date 1986 card.
- Nominations will not be accepted unless cards are stamped by Handicapper.
- Any shooter unable to produce a 1987 Handicap Card, must produce a Club Receipt as proof of A.C.T.A. registration.
- Such shooter shall be allowed to compete on handicap and grade given. But any moneys or trophies won shall be held by the A.C.T.A. until proof of handicap and grade are verified.
- 5. Rule 2.1 (m). Should it be found that a shooter deliberately misled Management regarding his grade and/or his handicap, the shooter be suspended for a period of three months.
- If an error is made on your card, have your club secretary or handicapper neatly rule out the error, rewrite it correctly, stamp and sign it.
- Any obvious low scores entered on handicap cards just prior to the Nationals that enables a shooter to be down graded, will not be taken into consideration. Rule 2.7.







 While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads.

All squads will be determined by the Nationals office, whose decision shall be final.

- Squads of six to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the trap for all titles.
- Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the change over for each 25 targets. Should the two minute time limit be exceeded by any shooter then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET shall be incurred.
- Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be re-squadded towards the end of the event and incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
- Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score.
 Any score sheet not carrying the shooter's signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 7. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so.

Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT.

Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.

- All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.




