

CHAMPIONS OF OUR SPORT PAST AND PRESENT GEORGE BIGGS NEWTON THOMAS

Newton Thomas is legendary as one of Australia's most outstanding Clay Target shootes and one of the finest duck shooters I've ever had the pleasure of shooting alongside in the duck swamps of New South Wales when game was really plentiful. His uncanny ability to accurately point the shotgun was nothing short of amazing. I well remember one year we were shooting the International Teams Match on the old Australian Gun Club grounds at East Burwood, Newton headed our squad of five shooters and I followed him on lane two with Paul and Sperry Marshall from Tasmania on three and four, and for the love of me I can't remember who the fifth shooter was. However, the International Match that year was 100 targets up with a team of 20 shooters, four squads of five shooting 25 targets at a visit, five targets from each lane before moving. Apparently something of a record for fast shooting was established by the squad when we learned that the squad had been firing at five targets every 12 seconds. Newton went on to gain High Gun honors that year with a perfect score of 300/300 points. A performance that he repeated seven times over the years.

Newton's interest in shooting began as a boy when he was raised on the family property at Barham in New South Wales. He had been a proficient handler of firearms since the age of eight, and was widely acknowledged as a better than average hunter very early. It was during the years of his youth that Newton developed a broad knowledge of native Australian flora and fauna, knowledge that in later years was to make him a valuable adviser to various Government conservation agencies.

Newton became totally involved with the improvement of shooters and shooting generally with Australia and with Charles Whitia he started off the schools shooting program over twenty years. He organised and participated innumerable instruction days at schools teaching literary thousands of young shooters.

After gaining his matriculation certificate, Newton left school but demonstrated an almost insatiable appetite for

Melbourne Olympic Garnes of 1956 provided an opportunity for Australian shooters to see what Olympic trap shooting disciplines was all about. However, installation of equipment etc. did present quite a few problems, one of the little problems called for the development of a completely new type of clay target that would withstand the extra trust of the Olympic trap which would throw the target up to 75 metres without breaking. learning. He read extensively, and through books and personal observation developed still further his extensive knowledge of the Australian outback.

Because of his bush shooting experiences, Newton became an expert in the use of all types of firearms on the target range.

However, it was his love for the shotgun which predominated and he became a formidable opponent, firstly at live pigeons and finally Clay Target competition.

In the early days of World War 2, Newton enlisted in the army and his knowledge of firearms was put to use. After a short stint in Darwin he was transferred to repatriation hospital in Melbourne with suspected typhoid. Although it turned out to be a false alarm, Newton was transferred to civilian employment with the Department of the Army and was given a senior ballistics job in Brisbane.

After the war, Newton Thomas joined I.C.I., which was then the only major cartridge manufacturer in Australia.

Newton's position was titled "Field Technical Officer" and provided him with an opportunity to combine business with pleasure, and he became widely recognised as a top authority on all matters relating to shooting.

A number of new products were given tough field tests by the young expert, who also filled a useful public relations role for I.C.I. due to his total honesty and credibility.

However, it was probably through his competition shooting activities that Newton Thomas was most widely known.

He modelled his target shooting style on that of champion pigeon shooter "Calrossie" Sutherland, who was also an I.C.I. personality.

After moving to clay target shooting, Newton amassed an enviable record of appearances in Australian Mackintosh Trophy teams, winning his way into twenty two teams, in which he achieved the exalted position of Team High Gun on seven occasions.

Newton Thomas' greatest single attribute apart from his integrity, was his ability to concentrate totally on the task at hand. This approach ensured success and these successes were usually at the highest level.

As an example, Newton won the following events in Australian Trap and Skeet Championships.

Champion of Champion Cup - 3 times;

Double Barrel Championship — 4 times;

Single Barrel Championship — 3 times; Double Rise Championship — Once; Skeet Championship — Once;

Australia-New Zealand Trap Championship — Once.

Followers of the Australian clay/busting scene will recognise that this is a complete list of all the Australian national titles in the standard disciplines (that is, excluding Olympic Trench and International Skeet) and is a feat that has never been repeated.

In the mould of a true champion, Newton turned to administrative activities as his way of putting back into the sport a return for the enjoyment he had derived from it as a participant.

In 1974 he was appointed as coach of the Australian shooting team which competed in the World Championships held in Berne, Switzerland.

That team was managed by Mr W.R. Morgan of Tasmania, who later joined the A.C.T.A. National Coaching Council, of which Newton was the Chairman.

Then in 1975 Newton was selected to attend an advanced coaching program at one of the world's most renowned firearms training centres, the Fort Benning Advanced Markmanship Unit, run by the U.S. Army.

During his visit, the Australian established a lasting friendship with Colonel Bill Pullum and Colonel Parmentier — Bill Pullum is the author of the advanced markmanship book titles "Three Position Rifle Shooting".

The contacts established by Newton during his visit have proved to be most helpful in connection with arrangements leading to more recent visits to the centre by Australian shooting athletes and coaches.

Since the Switzerland tour, Newton held a number of other official team positions including manager of the shooting section of Australia's 1978 Commonwealth Games team, which competed in Edmonton, Canada.

However, Newton's biggest contribution to the development of clay shooting came from his appointment as National Director of Coaching, firstly in an honorary capacity, in September 1977.

Then in January 1979, he became the Association's first full time Coaching Director, a position which was made possible by a generous financial grant of \$60,000 over three years from the Australian Government.

Newton immediately created and implemented a National Coaching Council, and with the support of its members, proceeded to introduce a novice training scheme. In this project, substantial assistance was obtained from "Bricky" Gunn the Coaching Director of the New Zealand Clay Target Association, and Tibor Gonczol, Coaching Director of the Amateur Pistol Shooting Union of Australia.

At a later stage, Newton enlisted the aid of the Confederation of Australian Sport Coaches Assembly, and worked closely with Mrs Val Beitzel to prepare a clay target proposal for a level one coaches accreditation scheme, which was eventually accepted by the government

sponsored Australian Coaching Council.

In the last two years of his life, the shooting sport's hero achieved the pinnacles of personal achievement.

Firstly, in January 1980, the sport of clay target shooting gained national prominence when Jenkin Newton Thomas was listed in the Australia Day Honors list as a recipient of the ORDER OF AUSTRALIA MEDAL — an award of which Newton was extremely proud as it accentuated his intensive loyalty to Australia.

The second achievement occurred in April 1981, when Newton was coach of an Australian shooting team competing in a top class international competition in Mexico. The team brought home several medals including three gold and one silver.

Australian shotgunner extraordinaire, Jim Ellis produced an incredible performance to win the Gold Medal in the Olympic Trench competition, a victory which was a total reward for the dedication and patience shown by the combination of coach Thomas and athlete Ellis.



TIM CATLING

This month we introduce you to Tim Catling, delegate for Western Australia. Tim started shooting in 1954 and has been involved in the administration side since the year of 1957. During his time as an administrator he held the position of Club President, W.A. State President (1971/72) and State Coaching Director of W.A. since the inception of the Coaching System six years ago. He has been a member of the W.A.C.T.A. Executive for the past twenty years or so.

Because of Tim's long association with Clay Target Shooting, his experience gained him selection as Team Manager of the Australian Shooting Team which ventured to Scotland in 1985. He is also a regular sight at National Series where he undertakes the role of Shoot Marshal.

At present he has his work cut out for him by being a representative on three important National Committees, WA delegate to the National Executive Committee, International Shooting Committee Member and a member of the National Management Committee.



NEIL HARDY

Neil Hardy is a dental surgeon in private practice in Townsville. He has been shooting clay targets for thirteen years, enjoying all disciplines with most success at Skeet, making the state team in seven interstate skeet team matches and the state shoulder to shoulder team on three occasions. Neil was secretary of Townsville Gun Club in 1976, 1977, 1978 and 1979 and a committee member since. He was President of the Northern Zone of QCTA in 1977, 1978 and 1979 and has been a councillor for the northern zone on the QCTA state council since its start in 1978.

He is the only original state councillor still serving, and was President of the QCTA in 1979, 1980, 1981 and 1982. Neil was elected to the National Executive in 1978 and this year completes ten years on the Executive, having been on their management committee in 1984, 1985 and 1986. He is looking forward to having his four children (shortly trappers) as active clay target shooters.

1987 N.S.W. STATE SKEET CARNIVAL

We say it every year — bigger and better than the last and 1987 is no exception. The Moree Gun Club was the venue for this year's carnival held on the 7th, 8th and 9th August.

On arrival at the Club on the Friday morning, we were greeted by a large "Welcome to Moree Gun Club" sign and along with warm, sunny conditions, and expertly prepared facilities, everything looked set for a great Carnival.

Competition commenced on Friday afternoon with the 50 target Qld/NSW/Vic Challenge Championship, and from the 61 shooters, seven possibles were returned. Those in the first shoot off were Bill Clark, Bruce Barlow, Doug Jackes, Reg Clarke, Kevin Weatherall, Chris Hughes and Geoff Walters. The overall winner was Chris Hughes with a score of 69/69. I understand that following this win Chris — who now resides in Melbourne — has a transfer fee of \$500.00. Someone did say that Bob Buchan had agreed on that fee!! 1st in "AA" Grade was Bruce Barlow from Sydney with 68/69. Kevin Weatherall's 50/50 gained him 1st in "B" Grade, the "C" Grade winner being Lew Tosolini with 46/50. The Ladies trophy went to Maree Rooke with 45/50 and Josh Balogh was the Junior winner.

Saturday morning dawned fine and sunny again and 76 shooters were on hand when shooting commenced in the 50 target 7th N.S.W.C.T.A. Skeet Championship. The Victorians continued their trek to the trophy table with Bill Sangster taking 1st in "A" Grade with 58/59 from Alan Blease. Young Tamworth shooter, David Michie's 50/50 edged out another Tamworth member, Kevin Weatherall for the "B" Grade trophies. Local "Bar Tender", Bob Mackay was able to give Moree a mention when he shot 47/50 to win 1st in "C" Grade from Lew Tosolini. With the completion of the 100 targets on the Saturday, the 15 member N.S.W. State Skeet Team was finalised not before a shoot off however, that finished up using white targets under the lights. Sunday morning was again perfect conditions, and with the team in place for their photo session, State President, Robby Smith and National Vice President, Jim Scott presented each member with their badge and team pocket, and for the first time this year, each member received two packets of shells, courtesy of A.C.T. Ammunition.

In the "A" Grade ranks, Jim Wilberforce was the victor over Maree Rooke. David Michie was getting very close to "A" Grade, runner up to David was Geoff Moore from Swan Hill with 48/50. Bathurst member, John Harris, won "C" Grade with 49/54 from Brian Dowell from Tumut. The Ladies section was a very popular win to Lee Wilson from Melbourne with 41/50 and Josh Balogh was the winner in the Junior division.

Maree Rooke recorded 21/25 to win the Ladies trophy and Josh Balogh was the Junior winner.

After a mammoth shoot off in the last event, Laurie Chelepy had to go again and shoot off for the overall high gun trophy, his running mates being Doug Siggs and Reg Clarke — all having finished with 172/175.

The Overall High Gun Trophy, donated by Col and Jenny Burt was won by Chelepy with a final score of 221/224.

Ladies High Gun winner was Maree Rooke with 162/175, Josh Balogh from Canberra was the Junior High Gun winner and Ray Melville won the veterans High Gun.

FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

PETER QUIRE

THE HONORABLE SPORT OF CLAY TARGET SHOOTING

I believe it is important for we clay target shooters to be proud of our sport. Especially at this time, when there is general public condemnation of firearms and anything to do with them. I do not know of any clay shooter past or present who used their gun for anything other than ligitimate purposes. If they had, they would have been excommunicated from our sport. It is so easy for the general society to lump all who own guns together. We can no more carry the guilt for the actions of a mentally disturbed person than any other section of society.

We are obviously the result of a number of influences in our lives and I will argue that organisations such as the Clay Target Association and its members are, in fact, a counter balance, a sane and rational influence on all those who come in contact with it and its members. We teach gun safety, respect for human life, and the placing of the instrument we use, in our sport, that is a gun, in the perspective that it should be, and that is, that it be used only as an aid to perfecting a skill in a controlled and responsible fashion.

Our use of a gun, and our philosophy is unfortunately counter-balanced by a continual bombardment of a good deal of the population with the vista of the modern fictional heroes. Many of those who look no further than the gun, to blame, for what appears to be a rash of unbalanced young men, acting out their fantasies by shooting everyone in sight, overlook the fact that there has always been easy access to firearms in Australia. My wife Barbara talks of the period after the second world war when most of those returning had at least one weapon in the house. As a city girl she remembers all the lads in the street having a .22 rifle. She purchased one from Myer for her brother on his 16th birthday for three pounds. No licences, no registration. He would strap it on his back and head for a friend's property to shoot rabbits. Now because of the pressure of population, that situation is obviously not desirable, but the point is that it is not the guns but the use that they are put to that counts.

The difference is in the way the heroes of television or video are depicted as solving their problems now. There always have been heroes with guns, the children have always played cowboys and indians or some such game. But the heroes of our childhood and teenage were honorable. They used legal and moral solutions to problems, the Dirty Harry and the Rambo and such like, are indistinguishable from those they pursue. The ends justify the means. As a society we seem to more and more adopt this idea, respect for the person who goes about life in a moral caring way is replaced by respect for those who use any means to achieve an end.

So my message is, be proud to be a clay target shooter, an example of the proper use of a gun.

SKEET NATIONALS IN W.A.

The Skeet Nationals to be held in Perth in November promise to be every bit as good as the I.S.U. Nationals held there this year. The 10 skeet layout will mean smooth running of the event. The W.A. organisers always put on an excellent event and it will give the W.A. shooters a chance to shoot in a Nationals competition. Those planning to participate at the Nationals will most probably already be training for the event and working on their technique, as well as practising their mental rehearsal, visualising being there, if they are familiar with the grounds, and going through the actions of the round of skeet in their minds.

For those who have not been to the Perth Complex, the grounds are the best Skeet grounds in Australia, built to world standards, each ground being exactly the same, and the traps are automatic Winchesters. The background is uniform on all traps, and I have been told that the grounds are in superb condition.

If any skeet shooter is having trouble with his or her preparation, discuss the problems with your coach. If they are not available, contact the Zone or State Coach.

The skeet shooters in W.A. are extremely keen and are making the most of their coaches' expertise, so the rest of Australia, be prepared.

A PROFILE ON OUR HISTORIAN

GEORGE BIGGS



George Biggs' interest in clay target shooting began right after World War 2 in 1945 when he was invited to join the old Coburg Gun Club situated on the bank of the Merri Creek behind Pentridge Prison at North Coburg. This club was the forerunner of what is now the Metropolitan Gun Club, prior to this time he had been involved with rifle and pistol shooting.

In 1947 George accepted a position with the old established Melbourne Sporting Goods firm of Hartleys Ltd, as Manager of their firearms, archery and camping department, wholesale and retail. During his 10 years with Hartleys he became greatly involved in shotgunning and clay target shooting Australia wide, at the same time learning a great deal about guns and ammunition and how to use them.

From 1957 to 1959 George worked with the firm of Donald Mackintosh — one of Australia's oldest gunsmithing companies. It was here that he absorbed a great deal more knowledge about the art of gun fitting and gun smithing from Mr Horace James, Australia's leading authority on both subjects.

During 1960 George was offered and accepted a position with the Adelaide Firearms manufacturing firm as Sales Manager for Victoria and Tasmania, this firm was the only company in Australia to manufacture sporting guns and rifles. He saw this move as a further opportunity to gain further knowledge into the manufacturing side of firearms. In 1967 George set up his own business as a firearms and ammunition dealer and shooting consultant. He continues in this business today in a semi-retired way.

George Biggs' administration involvement in the sport goes back to almost the beginning of his first shot at clays which was at the Coburg Gun Club, where he was hijacked onto the committee after three months of membership.

A year later he found himself elected to the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee where he served a term of 25 years under six presidents, finally retiring from the position at Launceston in 1975.

Apart from serving on several gun club committees he was also President of the Australian Gun Club at Burwood for a period of eight years. Several National Championships were held on this ground before they became rotated around the states.

In recent years George has become much more involved with the instruction and coaching side of our sport. He finds this work very rewarding as it allows him to put to work the vast amount of experience and knowledge acquired over the years.

Recently George wrote and published the first Australian book on the subject of shotgunning, namely "Trap and Skeet Shooting". From time to time he has also written articles for sporting magazines on shotgun shooting, and is currently involved in the making of video films on shooting techniques.

In 1977, together with "Pud" Burgess, George submitted a plan to instigate a National Coaching System. This plan was later approved by the A.C.T.A. and put into action with the appointment of Newton Thomas as Director.

During his 40 years of continuous registration as an A.C.T.A. shooter, he has not at any time been inactive in any A.C.T.A. official capacity, his record speaks for itself:

- Victorian State Coaching Director 1977-1983.
 First Official A C T A Beferee Examiner appoint
- First Official A.C.T.A. Referee Examiner appointed October 1948, retired from the position 1983. During this period, held the position of Rules Supervisor for approximately 12 years.
- 1955 appointed to the handicapping board, together with Luke Doyle forming a handicapping panel for the Association. This position continued for several years until the card system was introduced.
- Currently Hunter safety accredited firearms instructor and examiner for the firearms consultative committee, Victoria.
- Australian National Coaching Council accredited Level 2 Coach.
- A.C.T.A. Official Historian.

His major shooting achievements include the following: Australian National Double Barrel Championship; Australian National Champion of Champions Cup; Australian National Skeet Champion.

George has won a total of 42 Commonwealth Championships, including double barrel, single barrel, mixed targets, double rise, walk up and skeet. A total of approximately 450 titles including State, District and Club Championships.

He became the first Australian shooter in 1976 to shoot 200 straight in skeet competition, also holding the skeet straight record of 215 for 4½ years before it was broken by Ian Hale. George was the first shooter to reach the 27 yard handicap mark.

He has been a member of the Mackintosh International Shooting team on 12 occasions and a member of the Australian International Skeet Team four times. Visited the United States in 1978 shooting at the Grand American Handicap and other clubs — gained experience from their youth trapshooting instruction system and training methods used at Fort Benning.

Visited New Zealand on several occasions, shooting their National Championships. Highest score without a miss at trap shooting is 356. Member of Interstate Skeet Team 14 times.

All in all, George's record certainly does speak for itself, and the sport is obviously better for his involvement.

NOTICE TO ALL **MEMBERS CONCERNING GUN** LAWS

The New South Wales Government and its Police Minister, Mr George Paciullo, has reacted to recent events in announcing a "gun crackdown" in New South Wales. The two facets which impinge on all New South Wales shooters' ability to enjoy their sport are:

 Prior Police permission to purchase;
 Individual firearm registration with good cause!

Much constructive work has been done by your Executive in the Firearms Consultative Committee to protect your interests. A submission of over 1,000 pages was researched by SSAA Executives against registration. Not one page was submitted in support of registration.

Where is the evidence that tough gun laws work? Obviously the people proposing tougher gun laws cannot find support because it does not exist! Your rights are about to be further restricted as a sop to an alarmist media which shows a concerned public only one side of the firearm debate. This will also affect almost all disciplines of shooting.

We suggest you write a letter to the Premier, Mr Barrie Unsworth MP, Parliament House, Sydney, expressing your opposition to the knee-jerk reaction of the Government and insist that he focus upon the real problem which is crime. Secondly, you should contact your local State Government Member of Parliament and make an appointment to express your point of view. This is your right and you should not be put off by any delaying tactics, etc. Thirdly, you should telephone the Premier's office and verbally confirm your opposition on 228 5555.

Also, in the short term, we urge you to send a Messenger Delivered telegram to the Premier, Mr Barrie Unsworth MP, Parliament House, Sydney, expressing your opposition to the knee-jerk reaction of the Government.

It is strongly suggested you persuade your friends to join a recognised Shooting Association in order that you . . .

WARATAH STATE NOTES

FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

As President of both the New South Wales Clay Target Association, and the Southern Zone, I am rather concerned about the future financial situation of your State Association.

At the last state meeting held recently in Dubbo, lengthy discussion once again took place on the proposal to implement a State Ground Levy. This Zone, along with many other zones, voted against the implementation of this levy, and once again the proposal was defeated.

Although it was defeated, the general feeling amongst the Executive Members was to take the proposal of raising funds back to their zones and explain the importance of this levy, either 50 cents at each shoot or \$5 a year, or any other means of raising funds.

In answer to your questions and to those of many other shooters, YES — these or any other means of raising funds would at this stage only help to accumulate funds for the State Association.

The question now arises what would we use these funds for? Recently, the State Secretary sent your club a list of what these funds could and would be used for.

We as a State body do not have the means of raising funds as that of your club, such as the running of shooting programs. The majority of our funds come from: (a) State Government Grants; (b) Sponsorship; (c) Profit from the State Trap & Skeet Carnivals. If these three means of financing your State Association were to cease we could not operate as we do today for very long, nor could we afford to finance a State Secretary or Coaching Director.

As a low profile sport such as ours it is extremely difficult if not almost impossible to get outside assistance. I know this only too well when it comes time for me to arrange sponsorship for our State Carnivals.

Most representatives from the Zones to the State Association Executive are all voluntary and attend these meetings for the love and development of Clay Target Shooting.

I along with every member of the State Association Executive cannot impress on you and your club members enough the need for more funds. I can assure you they will be put to good use.

I would welcome any suggestiosn you may have on this matter. We seem to have investigated all means of raising these funds, but you may well be our saviour; if not please discuss this matter amongst your members once again.

STATE SKEET CARNIVAL





DARWIN 1987 ANNUAL SHOOT

As usual the Darwin Gun Club's Annual Shoot was held over the first weekend in August. This is a long weekend up here and is dominated by sporting events, particularly the Darwin Cup. Also, as usual, the weather was magnificent, although some of the Victorians had trouble adjusting to the sudden change after a plane flight from a southern winter to about 30°C.

We were delighted to see a lot of new faces as well as so many regulars. Darwinites are more aware than anyone of the tyranny of distance and the effort, not to mention expense, required to travel to and from Darwin to any other major centre in Australia. This species is slow maturing and consequently the authorities were forced to delay the opening of the season by a month.

Ken Stevens then went on to rub salt in the wounds by winning the skeet after a one target shoot-off with local Phil Grove. 
