FROM THE PRESIDENT'S CHAIR



By now you will have read, in the August C.T.S.N. about the A.C.T.A. Property Debentures the Executive Committee are inviting you to participate in.

It is our belief that shooters should be given the opportunity to participate in the future growth of your Association and as your National President, I urge you all to give the Debenture Program your deepest consideration.

You will agree it is imperative that the Association purchase their own premise, as soon as possible. This will be done as soon as we have funds in hand, to enable us to do just that. We could borrow from the Bank to make up any short fall in funds, but with the increase in interest rates it was decided to ask you, the shooters, for your support. If we had asked the Bank for a loan, we would have placed another burden on shooters' funds and as we did not wish to do this, the reason for the Debenture Program is selfexplanatory.

We all know there is no future in renting office space, paying rent each week will only deplete our funds, and in the end, we will not have any funds left.

I believe it is imperative we purchase an office suitable for our needs, not lavish, but practical. We can then start to build up an asset which we can all be proud to pass on to the future clay target shooters of Australia.

The debentures are open to all State Associations, Zones, Clubs, individual shooters, or groups of shooters. Already one State Association has promised \$3,000 and now we are asking for your support.

Just to summarize: the debentures close on the 30th November, 1988, minimum \$1,000 for a maximum period of 10 years, 7.5% interest payable annually on 1st December each year. We are asking you to invest \$150,000 in the future of your Association.

DEBENTURE **PROGRAM**

AN INVITATION TO MEMBERS ONLY

A legal document is being prepared to allow for the implementation of a Property Debenture Program to allow the Association to purchase a building to establish a permanent home for the administration of the sport and to cater for the needs of its members.

The following clauses along with any other legal requirements will be included in the Debenture Document: A. Debentures to be of a minimum of \$1,000 or multiples thereof.

- B. In the event of a debenture holder's death occurring, the debenture to be immediately available to the deceased estate.
- C. In the event of a syndicated debenture holder's death occurring, the payment of any syndicated share will be the responsibility of the remaining syndicate members.
- D. Debentures to be for a maximum period of ten (10) years.
 E. Debentures to be repaid within a ten (10) year period (maximum) in accordance with annual results achieved by the Association.
 F. A maximum of 150 debentures be available at \$1,000 each or alternatively a total debenture issue of \$150,000.
 C. Internet to be read according to find the first state of \$150,000.
- G. Interest to be paid annually at a fixed interest rate of 7.5% with 1st December being the effective date.
- H. Secured by floating charge.
- J. Floating security to become a fixed security on the purchase of
- property for the purposes specified in the debenture invitation to members.

Applications from registered shooters, clubs, Zone and State Associations are now being received and will continue to be received up to and including 30th November.

Pages Out Of The Past. March 1968 National Trap Championships South Australian Gun Club Bolivar, South Australia

The program commenced with the Champion of Champions Cup. This attracted a field of 224 shooters, some five shooters shot a possible 50-50. An interesting shoot-off saw well-known Paul Marshall of Hobart, Tasmania, take out the coveted award with a score of 92-92.

The grounds of the S.A. Gun Club were a credit to President, Bob Mules, and his untiring committee.

It was noted that Bob and a few others stayed out at the Club on Wednesday night after the National Shoot, and had things fairly well cleaned up by midday the next day. During the cleaning up operation a rather funny thing occurred. Bob picked up about 500 disposable paper cups and put them in a 44-gallon drum, which had been burning earlier, but had gone out. FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR PETER QUIRE

AUSTRALIAN OLYMPIC TEAM COMPETES IN THREE WORLD CUPS

Most nations intending to send teams to the Olympic Games in Seoul this year sent their Olympic Teams to the European World Cups. The Australian Olympic Federation funded the Australian Shooting Team and Coach, to attend these events as the competition was equal to Olympic and World Championship standards.

It was apparent with the Clay Target shooters that they improved their performances as they went along, becoming stronger and stronger with each event. The first World Cup was held in Suhl in East Germany, a town steeped in the traditions of shooting sports. The whole community is involved in some way in the historic crafts of gun manufacture.

Pistol and Rifle events were contested as well as Clay Target. Australia's best results were: John Maxwell — Olympic Trap, shot 194, equal 5th score to be placed 10th on count back. The event was won by Pera of Italy with 197; Alan Smith — Free Rifle, Men's Prone. 596, placed 10th. Lvov of Russia won with 598; Phillip Adams — Free Pistol, 561, 10th place. Papanitz of Hungary won with 657.

The shooting range at Suhl is magnificent. It has excellent facilities. As Suhl was first cab off the rank, and most shooters had had little practice, John, Alan and Phillip must be congratulated on their world class performances.

The clay shooters and myself went on to Yugoslavia while the others went to Munich. The Grand Prix of Europe was held in Osijek in the north of Yugoslavia, close to the Hungarian border. It is a small town of great antiquity, set in a rural area. The Yugoslav people were extremely friendly and hospitable.

Russell Mark came 10th with 186 in the Olympic Trap event. Lavrinenko of Russia won the event with 192, a truly remarkable performance as the wind was blowing so hard it really blew the clays out. There were 94 contestants.

The Australian Trap Team, 8th in the European Grand Prix.

The third world cup was in Bologna, Italy. We had to be in Bologna almost as soon as the shooting finished in

Osijek. The Italians have the most sophisticated set-up of computerized scoring and squadding I have seen. The squads are chosen by computer, one from each country. Bologna is a large city in the north east of Italy. There were five trench lay-outs and four skeet lay-outs.

John Maxwell — 5th overall, with 214; Russell Mark — 8th overall, with 190. The event was won by Cioni of Italy with 218.

The Australian Trap Team were placed 5th from a field of 105 competitors.

The Skeet shooters, Ian Hale and Michael Inguanti, were unfortunately counted out of the cut off even though they shot 144, several went into the finals with 144.

Double Trap. The team did extremely well in the Double Trap event, held for the fist time. **Domingo Diaz**, 3rd; **Australian Team**, 2nd.

This was a tremendous effort as our team has not had the opportunity to practise, whereas some of the teams had been training for twelve months. This result and my observations confirm my belief that the Australian Down the Line shooters will do extremely well in double trap, and as it is to be a new Olympic discipline, we have a very bright future in Double Trap. It is exciting to watch and exciting to be in.

The sequence of three World Cups held over a period of three weeks is a great idea for Australians, it enables them to participate in more than one World Event in a short

space of time. I hope that this sequence will be repeated in the future.

Just for your information, the service provided for the European shooters at these events is really something. Each gun manufacturer brings along their portable workshops. They do alterations or repairs on the ground. Because shooting is such a recognized and respected sport in Europe, and because of the numbers of people involved, the gun manufacturers and cartridge companies go out of their way to woo the shooters.

It was a very successful tour for the Olympic Clay Target team: a team 2nd, individual 3rd, 5th, 8th and two 10th. No one can dispute that our trap shooters are world class, and the results augur well for the Olympics.

Winchester Australia is to be congratulated and thanked for making cartridges available for the Australian team members. They were much appreciated by those who accepted the Winchester offer.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS IN 1991.

As many of you will know, Australia has applied for the World Championship event in 1991. The W.A. Clay Target Association has made an excellent application, and, if granted, there will be a separate competition for women shooters. Women's team events, as well as women's individual events will be held, so all Olympic Trap (trench) and Olympic Skeet shooters, start practising. Our women shooters have had to compete against the men for places in overseas teams. This is an opportunity for Australia to show the world just how good our women shooters are.

Level 3 Accreditation: Congratulations to Greg Chan of the Northern Territory. Greg is the sports 6th Level 3 Coach.

Bill Stevens: Bill has resigned as Queensland's Coaching Director. He was a foundation member of the National Coaching Council, and has contributed greatly to coaching in Australia and Queensland. Thank you, Bill, from me personally for your support and input. You will be missed at the Council meetings, and thank you on behalf of the shooters of Queensland. Arthur Kenna is acting State Coaching Director, and is a well known Queensland shooter and coach.

MACKINTOSH TEAMS 1988

Scores to hand produce a mixed bag of results for the Australian teams. In the open event, Australia with a score of 7393/7500 finished 16 targets ahead of Canada with their score of 7377.

In the ladies event, Australia's 1390/1500 was not enough to retain the title and in fact put the team into third place behind Canada 1443 and England 1394.

A similar situation in the junior teams event where the Australian score of 1411/1500 put the team into third place behind Canada 1428 and Ireland 1421.

Congratulations to our open team for their meritorious win and also to our ladies and juniors who found the opposition a little too strong.

The big improvers, Canada, whose scores while not recorded in '87, indicate that they are the ones to beat when next we shoot the Mackintosh International Teams Event.

N.S.W. I.S.U. ANNUAL FUND RAISING CARNIVAL

Canberra International Gun Club this year hosted the New South Wales I.S.U. Sub-Committee's annual Fund Raising Carnival over the June long weekend.

The carnival, which is the I.S.U. Sub-Committee's oncea-year opportunity to put together a few dollars to promote and administer Olympic Discipline clay target shooting within the state, this year took on a slightly different format in that 350 targets were programmed for the three day weekend — all Olympic Discipline Trap.

day weekend — all Olympic Discipline Trap. The events — The Eastern States Olympic Trap Championship, The Eastern States Ball Trap Championship and The Eastern States Double Trap Championship.

Saturday saw the conducting of the Olympic Trap event which was won (but not so easily) by Australia's best ever performed Olympic Trap shooter, Jim Ellis. Jim, like everyone else in the field, had a few early hiccups, but finally took overall honors by one target from N.S.W. coaching director, Col Burt of Tamworth. World Junior Olympic Trap Champion, Michael Diamond (fresh from again establishing himself as the best standard discipline trap shooter at the Wagga Trap Nationals) won AA honors, while B Grade went to Rod Prior, also of Tamworth, and C Grade to local shooter Jim Reid.

Eastern States Olympic Trap Championship: Overall — Jim Ellis 90/100; AA Grade — Michael Diamond 81/100; A Grade — Col Burt 89/100; B Grade — Rod Prior 68/100; C Grade — Jim Reid 66/100.

The second event of the three day program was the Eastern States Ball Trap Championship, and this saw Michael Diamond record a good victory on 95/100. Jim Ellis was next in the field and took AA Grade, with subcommittee chairman, David Menck taking A Grade, George Kazolis the B Grade winner and Jim Reid again taking the C Grade sash.

Eastern States Ball Trap Championship: Overall — Michael Diamond 95/100; AA Grade — Jim Ellis 92/100; A Grade — David Menck 90/100; B Grade — George Kazolis 83/100; C Grade — Jim Reid 74/100.

The final day of the carnival and the numbers of competitors improved for the event that all had been waiting for, the first ever Double Trap event, to be held in Australia. Many of those who had been on hand after the Ball Trap event on Sunday had already had a taste of things to come, as a few practice rounds of 10 pairs of 'doubles' had been thrown at the conclusion of the second event.

Surprisingly, this did not deter the real I.S.U. enthusiasts. Double Trap is certainly not an event for the faint hearted, it offers a real challenge.

After the first squad of the Eastern States Double Trap Championship, Col Burt (who incidentally can go down in history as shooting the first 'clean' pair of Double Trap targets — and David Menck who missed the first ever pair) was in the lead with 28/50. Other scores in the squad were mixed, down to around 11 and 12/50.

Best scores of the first round included 33/50 from Michael Diamond, Jim Ellis' 31/50, Steve Balough on 28/50 and a few others on 25/50.

Overall honors for the event finally went to the ever consistent Michael Diamond, with Jim Ellis taking AA Grade, David Coleman getting A Grade and Steve Balough B Grade.

Eastern States Double Trap Championship: Overall — Michael Diamond 33 + 33 66/100; AA Grade — Jim Ellis — 31 + 22 53/100; A Grade — Davie Coleman 25 + 29 54/100; B Grade — Steve Balough 28 + 21 49/100.

Unfortunately, due to a few minor trap problems, the final round of the Double Trap could not be conducted and the event had to be decided over two rounds. Perhaps this was enough!

FROM THE RULES FRONT

Rules relating to handicapping and re-handicapping

It is obvious from problems arising at clubs and questions constantly being asked of those who know a bit more about the rules, that there are still a great deal of shooters and administrators who do not fully understand the rules regarding handicapping and handicap shooting.

Generally, the rules have changed little for quite some years now, and to put the whole situation in a fewer words as possible:

- any competitor winning first place in a handicap event will be handicapped 1 metre, regardless of whether he has shot a possible or not.
- any shooter winning a section of a group handicap event, will be handicapped 1 metre, providing he has shot a possible.
- any shooter winning a double barrel, single barrel or point score event from behind his handicap mark, will be handicapped to the mark, providing he has shot a possible.
- any shooter who shoots 50 straight from behind his handicap mark will receive 1 metre handicap (providing it has not already been awarded for that event).

- handicap marks shall be adjusted as outlined in the rules relating to grading, i.e. AA Grade 18 metres, A Grade 17 metres, B Grade 16 metres.
- no competitor may shoot from any other handicap other than his ACTA handicap mark, unless in a novely event etc. Each target shot at from other than the correct handicap mark must be recorded as 'lost'.
- Other points that need to be attended to include:
- registering handicap targets on handicap cards. Unless a shooter has 200 targets recorded on his handicap card, he may not claim one metre, inward movement, when reregistering.
- handicap events must be shot to finality. Should two or more shooters decide to 'split' an overall trophy/purse instead of shooting-off, then all of those shooters should be handicapped one metre, regardless of whether they have shot the possible or not.

That's all for this month, good shooting, hope to see a big attendance at the State Trap Carnival.
