

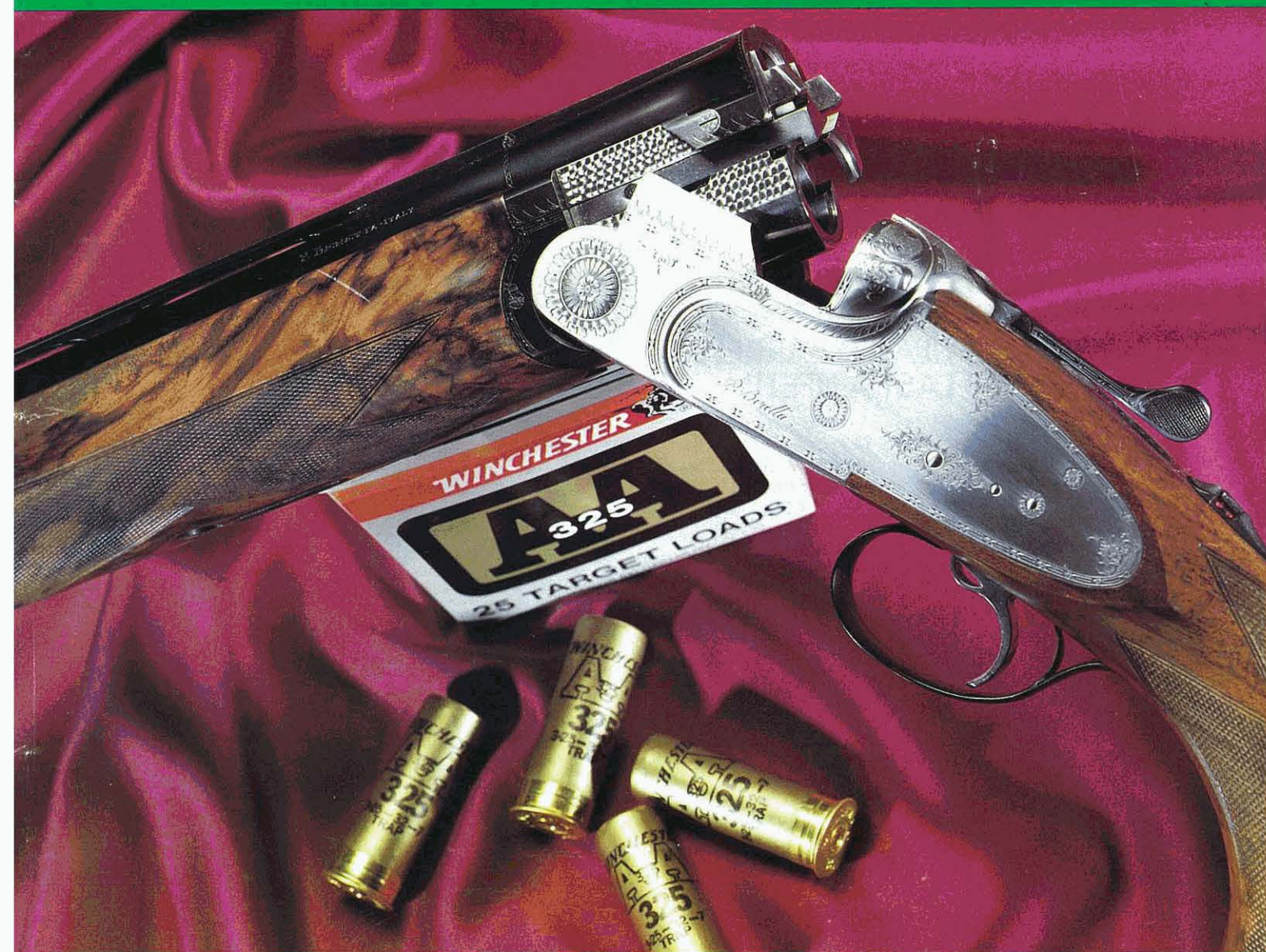

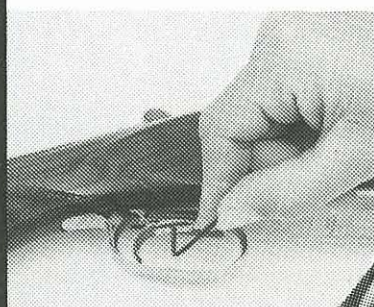

AMENDMENTS TO RULE BOOK

The following two rules relating to sweepstakes are to be included in the A.C.T.A. rule book. Effective 1.4.89.

Rule 2.9(e)

& 6.10(f) The inclusion of either compulsory or optional sweepstakes at National Championships and their method of division to be at the discretion of the Executive Committee.

Sweepstakes if included for National Championships shall be determined by scores off the gun and shootoffs shall not apply.

Summary: Optional graded sweepstakes will be conducted at the National Trap Championships with payouts on each group of targets to first place only. Sweepstakes for the Grand Australian Handicap will not be graded owing to the handicap conditions of the event. The Double Rise Championship will have an optional purse only.

LADIES SINGLE BARREL CHAMPIONSHIP

An offer received from Faye and Ken Burton of Kerang Ibis Traps Pty Ltd for the introduction of a Ladies Single Barrel Championship shot in conjunction with the National Single Barrel Championship has received the approval of the Executive Committee with the first championship to be decided at Echuca.

The Ladies Single Barrel Championship will be contested annually with the winner to receive the Ladies Perpetual Single Barrel Champion Trophy donated by Kerang Ibis Traps Pty Ltd, the Silver Australia Badge, Royal Blue Championship Sash and a memento of the perpetual trophy. Medals will be awarded for those ladies finishing second and third overall.

On behalf of all ladies entering in the event from Echuca onwards we thank Faye and Ken Burton for their trophy support.

STATE POSTAL TEAMS MATCH 1988

The results from all states for matches shot during 1988 have produced some interesting results and disappointing aspects.

The disappointing aspects being the lack of results in the I.S.U. matches where only one state forwarded results for trap and skeet. The interesting result was that the Junior High Gun was won with a perfect 75/75 for the sixth time out of seven occasions.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS — PERAZZI TROPHIES

With the retirement of Mr Les Turner from Evans & Balfour, continuance of the traditional presentation of a Perazzi trophy to the winners of all National Titles has, with Mr Turner's assistance, been taken over by Austral Gun Company Pty Ltd through the courtesy of Company Manager Mr John Fuller who has become associated with the Perazzi Company.

On behalf of all shooters who have received a Perazzi Trophy and for those yet to achieve this distinction, I would like to express the Association's appreciation to Les Turner for his support over the many years and thank John Fuller from Austral Gun Company Pty Ltd for his support in ensuring the continuance of the by now traditional Perazzi trophies.

GOING TO THE NATS' AT ECHUCA?

Ever missed a target because you thought you didn't see it properly?

Perhaps the correct shooting glasses would help.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

— NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A \$5 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 Targets/75 Targets in brackets of 25 one visit only to the traps for all titles.
3. While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets/75 Targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the change over for each 25 targets. Should the two minutes time limit be exceeded by any shooter then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET shall be incurred.
5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be re-squadded towards the end of the event and incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
6. Should a shooter being late for his squad elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score.
Any score sheet not carrying the shooter's signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
8. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
9. Any unauthorized shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalized FIVE (5) TARGETS.
10. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
12. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.
13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
14. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for.
To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
15. Persons paying a reduced nomination are considered eligible for all High Gun Awards, Section(s) and

- Overall. Competitors must compete in a clear majority of programmed events to gain High Gun recognition.
16. The Overall Winner in any event shall not be eligible for additional recognition in any Grade or Section (full nomination). Competitors other than the Overall Winner in any event shall be eligible for recognition in any Grade or Section in which they are eligible to compete (full nomination). Competitors entering in any specific section of an event shall only be eligible for recognition in the section entered (reduced nomination). ONE NOMINATION ONLY MAY BE PAID — OPEN OR SECTION.
 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.
 18. Competitors using automatic shotguns during the National Championships may recover their empty shells providing they have obtained an automatic I.D. card when nominating.
 19. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am.
 20. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
 21. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS HANDICAP CARDS

Nominations will not be accepted from any shooter who cannot produce a stamped handicap card or have the handicapper approve the reason for not being able to do so.

All shooters from AA to C Grades must present their card to the handicapper for stamping prior to nominating.

FIREARMS REQUIREMENTS

Echuca 1989

Authority has been obtained for persons resident outside Victoria during the period of March 27 to April 9 (inclusive) to possess, carry and use a firearm for the purpose of practice, participating in and travelling to and from the National Trap Championships at the Echuca Gun Club, Victoria.

This authority also extends to persons travelling to and from Australia for the reason indicated with advice of the authority made available to the Customs Department.

Practice targets — 10 for \$2.00 under the control and supervision of the **ECHUCA GUN CLUB**.

Practice not available during or before the Opening Ceremony — Mackintosh Open Team Matches and Presentations.

HANDICAPPING — NATIONALS 1989

To make it easier for all concerned — office staff, handicapper and shooters — we would like all shooters to please note and adhere to the following points:

1. Please present your current 1989 handicap card for stamping before nominating. Also your up to date 1988 card.
2. Nominations will not be accepted unless cards are stamped by the handicapper.
3. Any shooter unable to produce a 1989 handicap card, must produce a club receipt as proof of A.C.T.A. registration.
4. Such shooter shall be allowed to compete on handicap and grade given. But any moneys or trophies won shall be held by the A.C.T.A. until proof of handicap and grade are verified.
5. Rule 2.1(m). Should it be found that a shooter deliberately misled Management regarding his grade and/or handicap, the shooter will be suspended for a period of three months.
6. If an error is made on your card, have your club secretary or handicapper neatly rule out the error, rewrite it correctly, stamp and sign it.
7. Any obvious low scores entered on handicap cards just prior to the Nationals that enables a shooter to be downgraded, will not be taken into consideration. Rule 2.7.
8. Please watch the handicap board, if your name appears on the board, please report to the handicapper's office.
9. If you do not wish to be downgraded, please advise the handicapper's office.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION — ENTRY

Entry into the 1989 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 1989 with the Australian Clay Target Association.

Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors must produce their 1988 and 1989 registration cards, before nominating, to the 1989 Nationals Official Handicapper. Where a competitor was not registered for 1988 he must produce his 1989 registration card.

DIVISIONS

The competition will be divided into a number of divisions except in the 37th Australian Double Barrel Championship, where there is a separate Australian Women's Double Barrel Championship and an Australian Junior Double Barrel Championship, as well as the 35th Single Barrel Championship where there is a separate Single Barrel Championship.

Shooters may only nominate in any one section of an event, Open, Ladies, Junior, Veteran.

Shooters who are eligible for, and elect to pay a reduced nomination (60% of open nomination) to enter a specific section, shall only be eligible for the section entered.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before sashes/medals/trophies are awarded.

When team selection is involved shooters shall be eligible for the open team irrespective of the section nominated for.

In addition to open teams, shooters shall be eligible for team selection for the section nominated, Ladies, Junior or Veteran.

To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

AGE QUALIFICATIONS

VETERANS — are those competitors over the age of 65 years on April 1, 1989.

JUNIORS — are those competitors who, on April 1, 1989, will be under the age of 17 years.

TIME STARTING

Each day's event shall commence at 9am, with nominations closing daily at 11am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be resquadded towards the end of the event and incur a penalty of the loss of one target.

Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

CARTRIDGES

Cartridges of the competitor's choice may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the carnival through supplies licensed to the A.C.T.A.

TARGETS AND TRAPS

Targets through the program are to be black and will be supplied by Olympic Targets. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers.

All throwing equipment will be electrically operated.

CLASSIFICATIONS

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified — an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard.

This applies to trap grades, open, ladies, juniors and veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that regrading and rehandicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Ladies, Junior and Veterans who have elected to enter the open section will be indicated on the High Gun Scoreboard as OL, OJ, OV.

PRACTICE

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships. Tickets may be purchased at the designated area.

CASH PRIZES

In all events with the exception of the Grand Australian Handicap and Deauville Doubles, cash prizes will be awarded to the overall winner, and to first to third place-getters in each grade.

These cash prizes are calculated as follows: **Overall winner** receives 50c per nomination in the event. **Grade winners** receive 50c per nomination in the particular grade. Second in each grade receives 40c per nomination in the grade, third 30c.

SHOOT-OFFS, CONTINUATION OF EVENTS

PRESIDENTIAL REPORT 1988

It is with great pleasure that in my first address to you as President I am able to report a successful year by the A.C.T.A. not only with a record increase in membership but for the first time in a number of years your Association has finished the year with a surplus mainly achieved as a direct result of the careful attention to expenditure over income as well as the additional income which resulted from an increase in membership owing to the firearms controversy which was mainly centred in New South Wales and Victoria. While a surplus has been achieved in real terms, we are only restoring the losses that occurred in previous years, which is a significant achievement in itself.

As my predecessor said in his report last year, the incoming Executive should be mindful of registration fees and must not lose sight of the need to stay in line with the national CPI. I agree with his comments as I believe it would be irresponsible for any future Executive to allow the A.C.T.A. to run at a loss over a number of years as has happened in the past. We all must bite the bullet and keep as close to inflation as possible, otherwise we will not nor would any similar organization expect to remain in business for long.

I have no doubt the firearms legislation in New South Wales and Victoria helped boost our membership to a record 10,676 and I appeal to you all to make every effort to increase our membership even further, the gun laws have not gone away they are still there. The more shooters registered with the A.C.T.A. the better opportunity we will have to fight those in the community who would like to impose greater restrictions on our members by the introduction of oppressive gun legislation.

As you all know we are still renting premises at Mt. Waverley. We are continuing to look for suitable premises within the area for not only are we thinking of our staff as regards travelling but we are looking for a growth area as was the case with the Blackburn office. It was hoped the debenture premium would have helped finance this program, however, only two states and very few shooters showed any interest. It was a disappointment that you the shooter did not support this program which would have assisted in establishing the financial stability of the Association for the years ahead and provided a permanent home from which to conduct the affairs of the Association.

The Accident Insurance Policy which came about as a direct result of the direction received from member clubs at the last Annual General Meeting has been well received other than for those few clubs who are yet to honor their commitment, however, it is sincerely hoped that for those few clubs the recognition and acceptance of the importance of this member benefit will not be reliant upon claims against the policy.

The Olympic Games came and went during the year and again very little coverage of shooting on television. To our team members we congratulate them on their fine efforts. Although they did not win any medals they all gave of their best and for that I say thank you. Thank you for all the time, effort and money you put in to representing your country and the A.C.T.A. at the Olympic Games in Seoul.

Again there were the three national championships held during the year. Brisbane Gun Club the venue for the Olympic Discipline Championships, Wagga Gun Club for the DTL Championships and Melbourne Gun Club where the Skeet Nationals were held. All were considered to be successful, although the attendance at Wagga was very disappointing. No doubt there were many and varied reasons for this including the Brisbane Expo which would have kept competitors away from many sporting events as well as our own.

To all of the people who assisted with the Nationals, the clubs who hosted the Championships and the State Associations who ran them on behalf of the A.C.T.A. I thank you all for a very fine effort. It should be remembered the majority of those who help are voluntary and for this they are to be commended. They give their time so you and I can enjoy our sport and their involvement is very much appreciated.

Coaching in Australia is going from strength to strength under the guidance of our National Coaching Director and the State Coaching Directors. A successful seminar was held during 1988 in Adelaide which was attended by all State Coaching Directors as well as an in depth seminar at the Institute of Sport in Canberra which was also very successfully conducted. Unfortunately, as we know our National Coaching Director, Peter Quire, has chosen to return to the workforce and will be devoting his time and expertise to the running of his own business. We wish him well and on behalf of all members thank him for the role he played in establishing our international shooters at the highest level of competition.

During the year a number of members left or resigned from the National Executive Committee including two long serving members Roy Holtfreter and Laurie Connors, both of whom were on the Executive for longer than I care to remember and have given many years of faithful service to the A.C.T.A. To both Roy and Laurie as well as the members who departed during 1988, I would like to thank each and every one of you for a job well done representing shooters at national level.

A number of new members joined the Executive Committee during the year and we welcome these people. The A.C.T.A. Executive is only as strong as the members who serve it, therefore, we must at all times be aware of the need to work as a team and not as individuals for we have been elected to the National Executive Committee to represent shooters of Australia and to do our best for clay target shooting. There is a very small element on the Executive Committee who fail to recognize this and would do well to remember the reasons as to why they were elected to represent shooters from all states on the Executive Committee and not just the shooters from their own state.

I am confident that 1989 will see a strong combined Executive working towards achieving the goals that have been set. This will happen if we combine as a team which I am sure will be the case.

To the new Skeet Shooters Association, while I understand what they are endeavouring to do for skeet shooters, I would have thought if one or two from their association were prepared to stand for an administrative position and go through the normal channels then they would eventually have become valued members of the National Executive and their voice would be heard where it would do the most good, thus achieving their aim with the minimum of cost and effort to their Association.

The support given to me by my Vice President, members of the Management Committee and the Executive Committee is most appreciated and I look forward to working with them again in whatever capacity during the coming year.

To all the supporters and sponsors of the A.C.T.A. of which there are many, including the Australian Government, I thank all for your continued support throughout the year. Without this help we would not be where we are at present and we look forward to the continuance of our long established relationships.

One last point and perhaps the most important. Alan Maher who has been a great support to me since I have been President and the three girls who work in the office — Leanne, Sandra and Tina — the people you and I take for granted — a special thank you to you all. It has been a trying year for them moving premises and not knowing when and where the next move will be. In my short time as President, as well as my years as a member of the National

Executive, I have found our present staff to be the best and most efficient the A.C.T.A. have ever had.

In closing — to the future, new premises, larger membership, bigger and better national championships,

working more closely together, breaking more and more targets, enjoying our sport. All of this can be achieved, and will be achieved, with your help.

It is my pleasure to be able to present to members the 1988 Annual Report and Balance Sheet of the Association.

In presenting this Report the traditional format of reporting to members has been adhered to.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Following the retirement of Mr R. Holtfreter, members of the Executive unanimously elected N.S.W. member Mr Jim Scott from Dubbo to the position of National President. Having served two terms as Vice President Mr Scott responded immediately to the position and throughout the year was untiring in his efforts which were at all times in the best interests of the shooter. Many long hours have been spent working towards improving the Association and with presidential duties added to his large workload, 1988 was a very busy year.

To assist in the running of the Association, Mr Leighton Martin was elected as Vice President and was fully supportive in his role — ever-ready to contribute, Leighton's experience gained after many years as a member of the Executive was of great benefit.

Many changes occurred throughout the year and with the retirement of Roy Holtfreter and Laurie Connors a great deal of accumulated experience was lost to the sport. Other members to resign throughout the year were Murray Alexander (W.A.), Jim Bitossi (N.T.), Ken Selwood (N.T.) and Robert McDonald (Vic) all who contributed to the Executive during the term of their appointment.

During 1988 only one full meeting of the Executive took place, however, Sub Committees did also meet throughout the year and all meetings were considered to be beneficial to the sport. Reading from the 1986/87 Report the same message is still very much the case, "it is hoped that the decisions made throughout the year are accepted in the manner in which they were determined, that being in the overall best interests of the sport as a whole and its participants in particular".

On behalf of all registered shooters we record the appreciation for a job well done and welcome those who, while being newly appointed to the Executive, are keen to work on behalf of the sport. MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

As the Committee responsible for the conduct of the Association between meetings of the Executive, the Management were extremely busy during the year as they attended to their responsibilities which included the responsibility to act on behalf of the Association in the

capacity as members of the Premises Committee. A number of properties have been looked at during the year with only one being considered suitable, unfortunately owing to the timing involved in obtaining Executive approval the property in question was sold prior to auction and what was considered to be an excellent property purchase was not to be. The urgency of purchasing a property has not been lost on Management, however, the urgency is counter-balanced by the need to purchase the right property.

MANAGEMENT MEMBERS: J. Scott, N.S.W.; T. Catling, W.A.; L. Martin, S.A.; N. Hardy, Qld. have all attended to their responsibilities in a most exemplary manner and are to be commended on their efforts on behalf of all shooters.

During 1987 the Executive as a whole showed their confidence in Management with their encouragement for Management to assume more responsibility than had previously been the case. This confidence was certainly not misplaced during 1988 and the Association will benefit accordingly if they are able to operate in the same manner in ensuing years.

NATIONAL SHOOTING COMMITTEE

Restructured during the year this Committee, chaired by Robert Smith (N.S.W.), does number amongst its members three shooters elected from the general membership each to represent a distinct discipline as well as the needs of shooters in general.

It is to be hoped that shooters take advantage of the shooters' representatives and advise them of any matters that could well be addressed at national level.

PROMOTION COMMITTEE

AUSTRALIAN SHOOTING ASSOCIATION

A busy year for the A.S.A. with teams travelling to Europe for World Cup Competition.

All teams acquitted themselves as would be expected with Australia's Shooting National a much respected country. Shotgun continues to be represented at the A.S.A. by Executive Director, Alan Maher, who occupies the position of Vice President, and National Coaching Director, Peter Quire, who is also a member of the International Competitions Committee. The role of the A.S.A. is most important for it is the platform from which we gain international recognition and entry into the Commonwealth and Olympic Games competitions. With the advent of a New General secretary the efficiency of the Association has become more and more noticeable.

NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

This area of the sport continues to grow with level three coaches appointed in most states. With the assistance of the Australian Sports Commission State Coaches attended a live-in seminar during the year. The benefits of these seminars are commencing to show and will greatly assist coaching development programs in all states. National Coaching Director, Peter Quire, was kept busy throughout the year with his additional duties as National Team Manager and will be looking to all State Coaching Directors for continued assistance during 1989. As well as National Team Manager, Peter was honored with his appointment as Shooting Coach for the Australian Team at Seoul.

AUSTRALIAN SPORTS COMMISSION

During 1988 our sport again received very valuable assistance from the A.S.C. including the funding of a full time National Coaching Director. The Sports Commission are very supportive of the shooting sports and as an Association we endeavour to provide the utmost co-operation at all times. Through the Sports Talent Encouragement Plan our athletes again receive assistance to enable their training to continue in the required manner. The Institute of Sport provides a training camp during the year which all in attendance agreed was very worthwhile and must be continued. The Australian Sports Commission have been very supportive over the years and we certainly appreciate the manner in which they assist, not only this Association, but sport in general. It has been a pleasure to be able to work with the Commission throughout 1988.

AUSTRALIAN OLYMPIC FEDERATION

As part of Australia's Olympic Team preparation, Olympic team members competed in World Cups prior to the Games and the experience achieved will hold them in good stead in coming years. We extend our appreciation to the A.O.F. for the financial assistance which enabled participation in Europe. However, we express our disappointment in the fact that a hard-earned quota spot was returned by Australia owing to the A.O.F.'s non-acceptance of a fully qualified shooter with the spot won by an Australian being given away to be competed against.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS COMMITTEE

As Australia received advice during 1988 that the bid to gain the 1991 World Shotgun Championships had received the approval of the U.I.T., an Organizing Committee was formed to commence planning. With the Championships to be held in Western Australia, the Organizing Committee, under the Chairmanship of Past President Roy Holtfreter, have already met and commenced the initial planning for what must be a successful championship.

MEMBERSHIP

Once again club membership was stable with the anticipated increase in registered shooters evident very

early in the year. The reasons for the increase are well documented and although the problem that was being faced is not quite as apparent as before, it has not gone away and it would be a backward step should those people who joined the Association to gain its protection, decided they no longer needed it. The problems are still there and we must all play our part in ensuring that as well as obtaining new shooters to our ranks, we retain those who we have. Registration fees were increased for the year with the increase most nominal. A glance at our financial standing will quickly see that small increases are warranted if we are to maintain our financial viability.

STATE ASSOCIATIONS

The co-operation received in previous years from State Associations continued throughout 1988 and the benefits of having experienced administrators will be seen in the years ahead. State Governments continued to provide financial support and this support is reflected in the areas of administration and coaching which is approaching an all time high.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE: The I.S.U. Nationals were conducted at the Brisbane Gun Club and were well organized by the Q.C.T.A. in conjunction with the host club. While not one of the largest competitions in terms of numbers, the O.D. Nationals rank very highly in terms of importance.

One of the major concerns is location for, as would be appreciated, the needs of the Association would be very difficult to maintain should any move cause a loss in staff numbers. While the needs of the Association are paramount, the benefits of the years of experience and understanding of what is involved with administering clay target shooting must not be underestimated.

During the year we lost the services of Karen Scales because of a move, and Karen's position has been filled by Mrs Sandra Miall, who has very quickly settled into her distinct area of responsibility and in doing so has become well known to the many people who contact the office.

Tina Costello and Leanne Day have both been with the Association since our days at Blackburn with Leanne's years of service extending back as far as the A.C.T.A. office in Swanston Street. Tina is responsible for all accounting duties with Leanne continuing her role with the C.T.S.N. and general membership.

I would like to take this opportunity to publicly thank Sandra, Tina and Leanne for their efforts during 1988 as they went about their respective duties in a most efficient manner. Good staff is hard to find and we are most fortunate to have the services of these three "girls".

SUMMARY

Membership increased in 1988 and must be maintained at all costs. The year was a good one from a financial result point of view, however, I must point out that the surplus achieved in 1988 did no more than replenish the funds that had been lost over the previous eight years when losses stood at \$129,240 against a surplus over the same period of \$55,077 which reflects an accumulated loss of \$55,307. Taking into account the 1988 surplus of \$73,493 we have achieved a loss of \$540 over the last nine years being an average of \$60 per year. The need to maintain the registration fees with at least the C.P.I. is never more evident.

In closing, it has been a mixed year for the Association gaining in assets losing a wealth in experience — gaining new members, losing others. We have, as is always the case, a difficult year ahead. With the support of all registered shooters the road to a very stable Association will be more easily navigated.

I would like to thank President, Jim Scott, Vice President Leighton Martin and Management Members Neil Hardy and Tim Catling for their total support throughout 1988 and assure them and the members of the National Executive Committee whose support is also appreciated, that the National Office will continue its efforts to provide shooters with the services they require throughout the coming year.

OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE NATIONALS

With the O.D. Nationals returning to Melbourne for the first time since 1985 the Victorian Clay Target were keen to host a successful Nationals Competition and hopefully see some excellent results recorded. The conditions on the opening day were very hot, 35°, and as the sky darkened later in the afternoon the wind really started to show its dominance.

The dark sky looked very ominous and the rain very threatening. Fortunately for the shooters the rain, being the most concentrated in such a short period since records were kept, stayed away from Lilydale and produced what was record flooding in the city and southern metropolitan area — so the shooters were lucky! — or were they? — for the scores on Day 1 of the Commonwealth Championship were well below expectations.

COMMONWEALTH OLYMPIC TRAP CHAMPIONSHIP — 200T

The first round of 25 targets produced the opening shock when 1988 Olympian Russell Mark could only manage a 16/25 and being 9 down after 25 a challenge was being faced. Another Olympian in Victoriano Domingo Diaz found the conditions a little more to his liking than most and at the completion of the first day of shooting the Commonwealth Trench Championship was being led by D. Diaz with a 72/75 being one target ahead of Brandt Woodward and Cobar shooter and New South Wales Executive Member Arthur (Pud) Burgess. A bunched-up field followed these three headed by Michael Diamond and Jim Ellis, both on 70. Making a comeback after a year's absence Terry Rumbel from Guyra was sitting on 68 and looking forward to improving his position.

Day Two and Domingo Diaz was proving that consistent performance as against an up and down performance would always hold you in good stead and after repeating his first day 72/75 and a score of 144/150 had him a clear leader by two targets from Olympian John Maxwell whose second round 72 was an improvement that was most welcome for him. Sitting third 141/150 was Pud Burgess, two ahead of Michael Diamond and Jim Ellis who had both dropped a target from their first day 70. Russell Mark was giving his best and with a second day 69 was giving the leader a 10-target start.

completion of the round Domingo Diaz had outstayed all opponents to take out the Commonwealth Olympic Trap Championship with a score of 216/225. In second place with a last round 25/25 was Michael Diamond whose final round forced John Maxwell into third place after a count-back. The best performed lady was Georgina Mitchell from Guyra with a score of 144/200 in this most difficult discipline. Unfortunately there were insufficient entries in the Junior Section to record a winner:

STATE TEAMS MATCH

With the rain making things a little difficult, all six states competed for the Shoulder to Shoulder Match with a New Zealand team competing by invitation.

The depth of ability in New South Wales was highlighted by the composition of the team which did not include well-known names such as Maxwell, Rumbel and Diamond and as the last target was broken a comfortable 3 target win by the New South Wales team headed by Jim Ellis with juniors Filipo Petriella and Craig Tilley providing able support — well done N.S.W.

With a field of 32 shooters all anxious to commence well the first round produced few surprises with Ian Hale and Craig Meuleman setting the pace with their respective scores of 73/75 and three targets ahead of the rest of the field headed by John Summers and David Cunningham. One shot behind on 69 was New Zealand shooter John Farrell who is well known to Australian shooters and Olympic Quota Qualifier Michael Inguanti from Frankston Australia Gun Club.

To prove the point and degree of difficulty of I.S.U. skeet as against standard skeet, 1988 National Skeet Champion Arne Forsberg from Western Australia was 13 targets away from the leaders. Another finding the targets elusive was Jim Bridges the quiet man from Tasmania who was not at all pleased with his 59.

Day Two and conditions hot and humid although this did not appear to concern the multitude of flies who were a nuisance at all times. Better scores for some and disappointing results for others saw the gap between the leading shooters widening with the field well headed by Craig Meuleman whose second day 74/75 has him as the top of the leader board on 147/150 three shots clear of second place held at the halfway mark by Ian Hale on 144/150. John Summers first day 70/75 was not improved upon and although clearly holding third position with his 139/150 would not be overly pleased. Three shooters on 136/150 with Brian Thomson on a countback holding fourth place from Dave Dundon from Queensland and New Zealander John Farrell — a long way to go before the Championships are completed, however, with the last 50 targets remaining of the Commonwealth Title a huge effort was to be the order of the day if final positions were

to be improved upon.

Unfortunately I.S.U. skeet does not as yet attract lady competitors and therefore the ladies section was not contested.

STATE TEAMS MATCH

Wet and windy conditions made the targets difficult for the five states who had entered the Shoulder to Shoulder match. Giving competition was a New Zealand team headed by John Farrell who were competing by invitation.

The very strong Victorian team of Ian Hale, Craig Meuleman and John Summers were always going to be difficult to overcome and the end result saw Victoria winning comfortably by 13 targets from New South Wales proving that so far as skeet is concerned Victoria's depth is very much evident. Our New Zealand visitors, however, would have come in second only two targets behind Victoria if they had been eligible to compete for the trophy and Shoulder to Shoulder team badges and are to be congratulated for their fine team effort.

Days four and five of the I.S.U. National Skeet Championship were keenly contested with Ian Hale replacing Craig Meuleman at the top of the leaders board at the 150T mark. Michael Inguanti had benefited from the experience and improved his standing by being in third place ahead of New Zealander Peter Lassen and fellow club member David Cunningham from Frankston Australia.

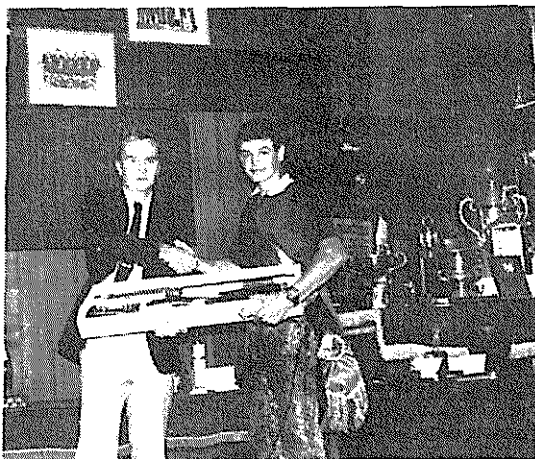

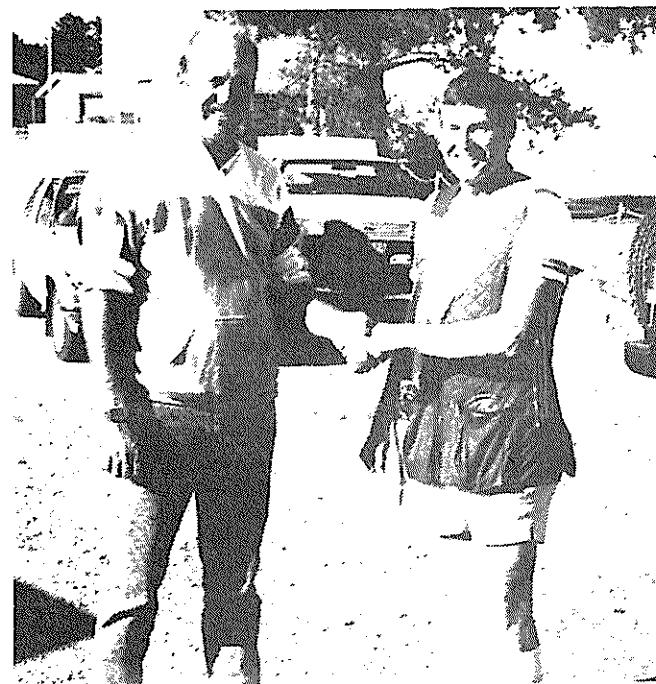

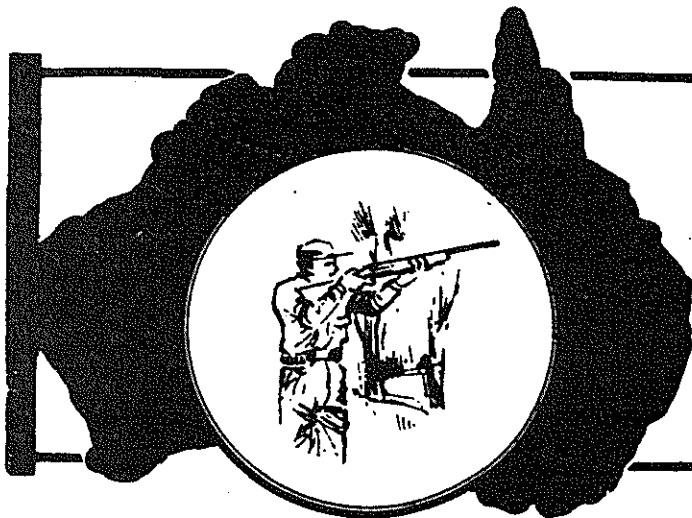
