A.C.T.A. DOPING POLICY

The Executive Committee of the Association have unanimously endorsed the acceptance of the policy of the Australian Olympic Federation in relation to any action to be taken as a result of tests undertaken by the A.O.F. on any athlete registered with the A.C.T.A. Similarly the A.C.T.A. do adopt the policy of the Australian Commonwealth Games Federation in relation to any action to be taken as a result of tests undertaken by the A.C.G.A. on any athlete registered with the A.C.T.A.

It is trusted that clay target shooting is never placed in the situation whereby any person is affected as a result of drug testing by either the A.O.F. or the A.C.G.A. and that the performances of our athletes remain controlled by ability, and not by the use of non-acceptable substances.

TASSIE NEWS

1990 TRAP NATIONALS

Dates: Pre-Nationals — 21-23 March; Program — Details published at a later date; Nationals — 24-30 March.

Shooters please note that the Nationals program will be conducted over seven days and not six as is the usual practice. Monday 26th has been set aside as a lay day to be used to finalise the Double Barrel Championship if necessary. Those shooters not involved may wish to take advantage of the tour organised to visit our local vineyards and sample their wares.

Seven Traps will be used for competition with two practice traps being available throughout the Nationals including the Monday lay day. Black targets will be used.

Venue: Tasmanian Gun Club, Evandale.

Evandale is a small historic town in a rural setting 23 kilometres from the Launceston city centre — travelling time approximately 20 minutes.

The Gun Club grounds are 2 kilometres south of Evandale on the Nile Road and are currently being upgraded to National standard. Substantial off road

parking will be available for all competitors.

The T.C.T.A., in conjunction with Dine & Associates and Tourism Tasmania, have put together several holiday packages based around the Nationals, tours — if there is sufficient interest on every day — pre-booking is essential, travel packages by both sea and air, transport to the grounds etc. Full details and booking forms are available from T.C.T.A. — Ms K. Woods, PO Box 82, KINGS MEADOWS, 7249. Phone (003) 44 7916; Dine & Associates, 351 Liverpool St, Hobart, 7000. Phone (002) 34 1424; or from Tourism Tasmania outlets in all states.

Shooters who may wish to take advantage of the daily bus service from Launceston to the Gun Club could be faced with the problem of where to leave their guns and ammunition during the day. The T.C.T.A. is happy to organise on behalf of groups or states the hire and erection of either a tent or caravan for this purpose. If you wish to take advantage of this we do ask that you contact us early. No guarantees can be given for late bookings.

Accommodation in the Launceston area could be limited, to a certain extent, due to the National Polocross Championships being held at the same time so an early booking is recommended. Accommodation bookings are available through Dine & Associates and the Tourism

Tasmania outlets.

The T.C.T.A. Nationals Committee has already started preparation of the grounds and is currently upgrading the facilities. The Committee is very enthusiastic and is determined to make the 1990 Nationals a successful event as well as enjoyable for the shooters and their families.

Tasmanian shooters who would like to offer their services to assist the committee during the Nationals or with the working bees are asked to contact the State Secretary, Kaye Woods.

PUBLIC LIABILITY POLICY IN THE INTERESTS OF ALL REGISTERED SHOOTERS

The Public Liability Policy that has been arranged for the A.C.T.A. by C.E. Health Casualty & General Insurance Limited is designed to provide specific protection for the Association and its registered members.

The A.C.T.A. Public Liability Insurance Policy protects the Association and its members from being sued for alleged negligence/blame attaching to an incident causing

property damage or bodily injury.

If any person is injured in any way where no blame can be attached to the A.C.T.A. and its members, any claims that may be made would not be recognized under the policy conditions as it would be classified as a claim against a policy that the person may have in force on a personal basis or in the case of a registered shooter, a policy arranged for them by the A.C.T.A.

Protection is afforded to the following who, subject to certain conditions, are considered to be members of the A.C.T.A.

- 1. State Associations
- 2. Registered Clubs
- 3. Registered Shooters
- 4. Voluntary Workers
- 5. Club Visitors participants and observers
- 6. Life Members/sponsors
- 1. STATE ASSOCIATIONS Organising and controlling shooting events in accordance with the rules and regulations of the A.C.T.A.
- 2. REGISTERED CLUBS (A) Subject to payment of the prescribed affiliation fee as may be decided by the A.C.T.A. from time to time.
- (B) Organising and controlling shooting events in accordance with the rules and regulations of the State Association (respective) who are operating under the rules and regulations of the A.C.T.A.
- 3. **REGISTERED SHOOTERS** (A) Subject to the payment of the prescribed registration fee as may be decided by the A.C.T.A. from time to time.
- (B) Acting in accordance with the rules and regulations of the club (respective) which is operating under the rules and regulations of the State Association and A.C.T.A.
- 4. VOLUNTARY WORKERS (A) Acting in accordance with the rules and regulations of the club, State or National Association whilst undertaking their voluntary duties.
- (B) Provided always that such voluntary workers are registered as members of the Australian Clay Target Association on the master register maintained by the Australian Clay Target Associations with a description of their duties.

Additions to or deletions from this master list are to be notified to the A.C.T.A. office as they are known.

NOTE: Voluntary workers to be registered with the A.C.T.A. are to be restricted to those persons likely to assist on a voluntary basis only.

Paid personnel such as trappers, trap mechanics or any other paid staff are subject to the provisions of the workers compensation act and protection must be obtained for them from the appropriate authority.

- CLUB VISITORS (Participants and Observers)
- (A) Must be registered as such (club visitor) on the register to be maintained by each club for that specific purpose.
- (B) Must at all times be under the control and supervision of registered A.C.T.A. shooters.

- (C) Must be participating in accordance with the rules and regulations of the respective club, State Association and A.C.T.A.
- (D) Visitors, other than children who must be under the care of a responsible person, must at all times sign the visitors' book which must be provided by all clubs for that purpose.
- (E) In the event of a visitor or visitors to the club negligently causing injury or damage to any person or property, any actions that may be taken would need to be directed towards the person or persons concerned.

NOTE: Any organised event for participating visitors, such as school children etc, who are not registered shooters with the A.C.T.A. must first of all have been officially ratified by your club at a constituted meeting and minuted accordingly.

Should this requirement not be complied with then difficulties could and may possibly arise in the event of a claim under the Public Liability Policy.

- 6. (A) Clubs who have life members or similar, where no affiliation fee is paid to either the Club or the A.C.T.A. by reason of their inactivity in the sport at Club and/or A.C.T.A. level are fully protected under the same conditions as would apply to "registered shooters".
- (B) Clubs who may have sponsors or the like attending their premises as "Honorary Members" on a more frequent basis than would be seen to be a visitor are fully protected under the same conditions as would apply to registered shooters.
- 7. Clubs conducting events that are outside the rules pertaining to regular competition, which are broadly known as "Novelty Events" are fully protected under the terms and conditions of the A.C.T.A. Public Liability Policy providing that all other conditions relating to the safety etc. have been complied with.

This protection extends to shoots conducted between different shooting disciplines such as a combination of Clay Target and field game.

8. Clubs electing to become Incorporated bodies should be able to use the master A.C.T.A. Policy to fulfil the requirements of Incorporation, therefore eliminating the need for any club to maintain a Public Liability Policy in addition to the A.C.T.A. master policy unless cover in excess of \$2,000,000 is required.

Paid employees must at all times be protected under the workers' compensation act.

9. Situations arising that may not be covered in this policy summary will be clarified upon request.

The existing policy therefore extends to all persons likely to be on the grounds for a Club, State or National event.

The need for individual Club or State Associations to undertake a policy of their own is eliminated other than they may require cover for an amount in excess of the existing \$2,000,000.

- 10. Cover is extended to include (A) Visitors attending National State Zone, International Championships are exempt from the requirement to sign a visitors register.
- (B) Member to member whilst participating in any event.
- (C) Erection, demolition, alterations, additions to buildings including club house and trap houses for the portion of the work undertaken by voluntary workers does not extend to any works carried out or undertaken by contractors or sub-contractors.
- (D) Registered shooters involved in coaching or instruction are indemnified.
- All shooting events must be sanctioned under the rules of the National body.
- 12. NOTE: Club shooters, not registered with the A.C.T.A. are not covered under any circumstances other than operating as a voluntary worker at an organised event. This category of shooter-member is solely a club responsibility and insurance cover should be considered at all times as a club expense.

13. FOR INFORMATION. Further extensions included within the policy are Member to member, Food and Drink Care, custody and control, Medical and welfare facilities. Tenants' liability, Hoists, cranes and unregistered vehicles, Car Parking, Cross liabilities.



THE BERETTA A303 TRAP GUN

Ron Forsyth



The 303 is a well known action which has achieved a lot of market acceptance. The gun's lines are attractive, and it handles well.

Well seasoned trap shooters will not have too much of a hard time making up their minds about what kind of gun they want to shoot. The obvious favourite is the under and over, with its semi-auto opposition trailing so far behind that there is really no contest.

However, there are lots of ways that the auto has an advantage when viewed against the alternatives. In all cases, it seems to me that the prime measure of a shotgun's usefulness is its handling qualities. If they make the gun alive and responsive in your hands, then the gun is a useful piece for you. If they make it inert and difficult to move, then regardless of decoration and even quality as such, then the gun is not for you.

The Beretta 303 is by now a legendary action on which I don't need to use up space describing laboriously. Suffice it to say it is time tried, and has been used in just about every theatre of operations, and has been found to get the job done reliably for shooters all over the world.

In a trap gun, I personally don't like to see too much muzzle heaviness. I agree that there must be a different distribution of balance in the target gun from what is usually found in a field gun, but it is not so much the case that it has to destroy all the liveliness that a gun should have. And this is a very real possibility in a piece designed for mounting before the target is called for. Some shooters do like a very pronounced forward heaviness, but in many ways it can be an excuse for a manufacturer not to put any effort into striking off the barrel steel in order to get a bit of life into the muzzle end. It is far cheaper not to have to bother

I was pleasantly surprised with the handling of this gun. It has an ease of pointing that is often absent in cheaper trap guns. Partly this is so because there is only one barrel to contend with. Much of the weight that can slow down a double barrelled trap gun is not a problem here because the second barrel is replaced by the operating mechanism, which is housed in the fore-end. This is significant because it means the weight is closer to being between the hands, and is consequently less hard to shift in the swinging of the gun.

The rib is most suitable for a target gun, being eye catching and suitably matt finished. It is 10 mm in width, and made without any taper. It seems to me to be well defined to the eye, glare free and sharp, offering a good sighting picture.

I found the operation of the gun to be very appropriate for target shooting. In the old days, using a magazine repeater of any kind implied that there'd be a good deal of clunking and banging during the cycling of the action. In this case, the reloading process is carried out with no announcement of its taking place. After the trigger is pulled, there is no indication to the ear at all that the action is operating.

In a word, the gun is sweet to shoot. Recoil is very mild, and muzzle jump is low. This aids second barrel recovery, which is most important in all forms of trap shooting.

In appearance, the gun is pleasing. The receiver is jet black, and is set off by the breech bolt, which will be evident in the accompanying photographs. The bronze coloured safety catch is easily accessible, and it operates positively. There is a swell to the trigger guard which appears to be designed for use with gloves in cold weather. The action frame, of course, does duty on the well known field gun which comes with the Mobilchokes.

There are differences between the trap and field model 303s, naturally. There is a magazine cut-off facility in the latter, which allows the cartridge in the chamber to be taken out for getting through a fence or replacing with another of different shot size for a special purpose, without disturbing the contents of the magazine. In the trap model, this is not necessary, and so it is not offered. This is a way of saving money, avoiding building in a facility which would have no use.

This leaves the manufacturer free to spend money in providing the things that the trap gun does need — such as the monte carlo stock, which requires more wood than the lower field stock.

The wood in the test gun is well coloured and with visible grain. One of the gun's features is the insertion of a recoil spring inside the stock. This is a major factor in reducing felt recoil during firing. The spring damps vibration of all sorts, not just recoil, but the kind that comes from the moving parts that fly around at quite some speed in any repeating firearm.

Considering the relatively light weight of what is after all a trap gun, the combination of recoil spring and gas operated action certainly managed to make the lightness to be no disadvantage at all. There is a slim ventilated recoil pad fitted, with a black spacer, and this aids in making the gun less likely to slip from the shoulder.

Still on the matter of wood, the chequering is competent and most functional, on both the pistol grip and the foreend. In the case of the latter, it wraps itself right around so that in whatever way the shooter chooses to grasp it, there is good contact with a non-slip surface.

I found the pistol grip to be fairly pronounced in its curve, which is in keeping with the tradition Beretta has set from many decades back with its trap guns. The idea is that the gun comes set up so that there are as many checks as the maker can engineer against the shooter adopting a different position in his mounting of the gun. In the case of the trap gun, it is particularly important that rhythm be adopted and that the shooter always does exactly the same thing — that is what the long breaks are all about. The sharper angle to the pistol grip helps to lock in the hand, and make it fall to the same position on the trigger each time the gun is fired. This in turn makes for better trigger control.

Stock length is fourteen and a quarter inches, which is not enormous, especially considering it includes a recoil pad already fitted as standard. Drop at comb is one and three eighth inches, and at heel about the same, which is a pretty normal measurement for a down the line gun.

Mean point of impact accordingly was about 20 centimetres above the point of aim, a figure that seems to me to be most appropriate for a trap gun. Any adjustment to that can be easily made by the owner who feels like fine tuning it. There is plenty of wood on the stock to play with, and the comb could easily be relieved to get the pattern either up or down, in accordance with personal preference. In addition to the usual methods of removing a little wood in the appropriate places, the 303 offers a system where the stock drop may be adjusted by means of spacers which are inserted internally, along the stock bolt. This is an excellent idea, and allows the shooter to make his first adjustments without permanent alteration to the wood of the stock.

There are good, easily followed photographs in the manual that accompanies the gun which show all the routine operating procedures, including the fitting of such

The fore-end is not as bulky as those of many gas operated guns. Personally, I found this to be a good thing. I believe that the higher the fore-end sits in the hand, the harder it is to point instinctively. For a gas operated semiauto, this is a small and relatively slim one.

The metal on the gun had the Beretta touch all over. The bore was spotless, with no traces of machining, and all the finishing was up to a good standard. The barrel blacking was lustrous and well done.

Doing a little measuring around about, I find thirty thou. of choke. The barrel is nominally an improved modified. The choke was pretty standard in construction, covering about six centimetres in length and with about the last two of that being made up of parallel.

Minimum barrel wall thickness was .054", which is pretty hefty. This is not a barrel that will bend easily.

The barrel length is a little under 73 centimetres, or twenty-eight and three quarter inches, which of course adds to the receiver length to make a long sighting plane and to keep the gun swinging steadily.

Tested with Winchester 325 sevens, the gun returned very nearly patterns to nominal specifications — 69% in fact (where 65% is nominal improved modified and 70% is nominal full, though most full chokes these days run a lot tighter than that).

There is no complaining about this percentage. It's as close to its nominal perimeters as you could hope for. The distribution of the patterns was exactly normal, on the five point scale of poor, normal, good, and average. Any handloader prepared to put in a bit of work would soon make loads that a choke of this dimension could get up into the good bracket. If I were using this gun myself, my first move would be to try eights, to see if the pattern would come down a bit in density.


The serious trap shooter with a single barrelled gun is at far less of a disadvantage than some people suppose. All he has to do to gain the same results as a shooter of a double gun with its two chokes is to make sure that he finds and uses two different loads, the first of which opens the patterns, and the second of which tightens them, in accordance with the range at which he normally shoots his

He then has the great advantage — the lowered recoil. Far more shooters suffer from flinches than ever realize it, I'm afraid. The gun that doesn't ever inflict pain is about the best way to avoid developing one, too.

All of which gets me to something of a conclusion. There may be a number of sensible uses for this gun, but one of them would surely be as a club gun for the beginning trapshooter who is just being introduced to the sport.

Many wives and teenagers as we all know fire their first shots at clays down the line. It was so in my case, and it might have been in yours, too. The beginner doesn't need to have the tripe kicked out of him - shooting is supposed to be fun.

By the same token, lifting a gun that is too heavy is not a lot of joy, either, and the gas operated semi-auto offers the best of two worlds here, being light enough to be handled

more easily than many of the more experienced trap shooters' guns, and undoubtedly being pleasant to shoot at the same time.

The stock being as it is on the shorter side gives me the impression that just conceivably Beretta have not been unaware of the possibility that this is the way the gun

As yet another pointer in this direction, it is by no means expensive. It could easily do duty as a first trap gun, or a casual shooter's gun, if not as the club's, designed for loan. You could certainly shoot it all day and be none the sorer for it, and that in itself is a big plus.

By and large, I think this is good value for money. Very tidily machined, and with the high quality steel that Beretta is famous for, there is no doubt that the gun would have a very long life expectancy. It balances well, it operates smoothly, and its smooth swing and generally pleasant feel belie its modest price tag.

THE WAY IT WAS AND SHOOTING TIPS FROM THE OLD MASTER

Recently, while searching through some of our history material I came across an old catalogue that had been printed by Donald Mackintosh. This had been written during the early days of his business as one of Australia's first specialised gun shops. At this stage of his career Donald Mackintosh had returned from his world travels where he competed in competitions throughout Europe and the U.K.

He first visited England in 1896 where he spent one year returning again in 1900 to spend the next nine years. "Donald" worthily represented Australia in European and British shooting circles, gaining much prominence as a successful competitor in the most important shooting events in the old world.

In the year 1900 Australia sent three male competitors to the Paris Games, one of them was Donald Mackintosh, who at that time was classed as one of the best shots in the world. In Paris he won gold medals for game and live bird shooting.

On the home front "Donald" was always ready to help his fellow shooters. I vaguely remember having the pleasure of first meeting him when I was a young fellow in my mid teens. At this time "Donald" had established his gun shop business in Bourke St, Melbourne and helping him as his Manager was an up and coming shooter named Horrace James. "Horrie" as he was known, went on to become a leading authority on firearms and how they should be handled. He was also responsible, together with Donald Mackintosh and the backing of I.C.I. Ammunition Co., in establishing the Nobel Clay Target Club; the mother club of all clay target shooting clubs — first operating in a large quarry at West Footscray. Later I.C.I! took a greater interest in the club and relocated it on ground level.

At a later date the Victorian Clay Target Association came into being under the secretary-ship of a retired army man, Colonel C.W. Thompson. This Association, although not very strong, was nevertheless the origin of a properly organised and correctly administered Clay Pigeon Shooting Association in Australia. Chairman of the day was Mr H.G. James. At a meeting of the Victorian Clay Target Association in the mid 1930s Colonel Thompson relinquished his position and Mr Bill McCullough was appointed as Secretary/Treasurer/Editor, a position Bill was to hold for the following 30 years. "Bill" was proud of the fact that during his time in office he was never opposed either officially or unofficially within the knowledge of those who really know. Shooter registration at that time was two shillings and six pence, i.e. 25 cents. Bill acted in an honorary capacity until well into the late 1940s.

SHOOTING TIPS FROM DONALD MACKINTOSH

Cartridges are made to fit the gun, not the gun to fit the cartridge. A 2% inch case won't fit a gun chambered for 2% inch cases. If used, it injures the gun's action. But a 2% inch case can be used with safety in long chambers.

The best shooting results are obtained from good cartridges, which mean good caps, good powder, good combination of wads, good shot, uniformity of pressure, and correct turnover.

Patience and practice are necessary to success. The novice may begin at sitting game. As he progresses he must endeavour to kill while game is running or flying. The eye and hand soon get to work in unison, though the observations of results of every shot helps towards the correction of errors.

Coolness is of importance. The gun should be carried while approaching game to enable its quick adjustment to

the shoulder, but never walk with finger on the trigger. Keep both eyes wide when when aiming. This, in some cases, needs patience, but the results will amply reward you.

Shoot at game going from you a little above it. If crossing to right or left, a little ahead of it, but more ahead the farther the game may be from you. If rising, shoot a little above the object, according to distance and speed of flight. The wind will often aid the flight of birds; hence the distance ahead must be in accordance with the speed. If game is coming towards you, flying low, shoot slightly under it.

Self-consciousness is often the bane of the competitor on nearing the scene of competition. This attacks nearly everyone — the seasoned shooter as well as the novice. It is a species of stage fright. Now, to correct this, remember the words of the song — "You are not the only pebble on the beach". Hence you need not think the eyes of the world are on you. Go out to the mark determined to kill, and you'll do it — ten to one. The other competitors are thinking ever so much more of themselves and their chances of winning than they are of you. Don't forget this.

Hold the gun with the left hand grasping the barrels well forward, with elbow slightly bent, equally firm or loose, with both hands, but I recommend a firm grip of the weapon.

A "miss" is no disgrace, but try not to make one too often.

In sweep shooting, it is sometimes well to let discretion be the better part of valour. Thus: An invitation to "divide" is always worth consideration. Obstinacy in that direction sometimes means loss of a share in a good prize, and mayhap a good friend. In my many engagements throughout the world my refusals to "divide" can be counted on the fingers of one hand, but those were by the ill-timed advice of friends.

You must acquire method in shooting at the traps. There are occasions when slow, deliberate shooting is best — say, on a calm day, when birds are slow. But on windy days, and when birds are strong in flight, a quicker method is needed, even "snapping" at the fall of the trap, giving no "run" to the bird. Again, a middle course is sometimes required.

The range of a 12-bore gun is limited. A kill can be made by a fluke at 80 to 100 yards. To expect this as a general rule is too much. The good killing range will be found not to exceed 50 yards. This verdict is the result of my long experience in shooting, and answers an oft-asked question.

Always carry your gun "safe". Keep muzzle pointing towards the ground, or in the air. Do not get through or over a fence with a loaded gun in your hands; and do not stand a loaded gun down, to be picked up again later on. Whenever you place a gun down, whether for a brief or long period, be sure to extract any cartridge that may be in it before doing so.

Important factors towards success in matches at the traps are the "bend" and "balance" of your gun. A gun that points, easily and naturally, in the direction you look, is the gun you must have to shoot straight, even at stationary objects. At birds on the wing, now and then going like "greased lightning", it is absolutely essential. If your gun does not possess these qualities, your chance is hopeless.

There are a variety of aims. Each is necessary on the particular kind of bird aimed at. The principal are: (1) the snap; (2) the snap, with lead; (3) the "hold on"; (4) the "hold

on", with lead.

To use each and all in their proper place, one must be in perfect "form". Such form is necessary in order to use a second barrel well and effectively; a perfect shooting gun and perfect cartridge are also needed. This combination, with a good nerve, will see you safely through, no matter what company you are in.

The use of the expert clay pigeon trap, if you get the right kind, are excellent for practice. I practised with them twenty years ago, and could get in form by careful and

regular practice. I stock them, also the birds.

The distance at which a man in form kills a good average bird rising from the trap is, say, three to four yards, and a slow bird, say 2 yards. Snap shots would reduce these figures by a yard, but snap shooting is not so reliable, as the snapshots gun is moving at too great a pace in comparison to the bird; whereas the hold on keeps with the flight of the bird. Most birds lowering in flight, especially down wind, are increasing in pace, which is simpler to notice than to allow for correctly. To allow for it you must increase your swing and lead.

I am often asked by men who love the gun, and who follow the sport of shooting — What is my chance of success were I to go to England and the Continent to shoot in competitions, as you did? Are our boys here, as far as your experience allows you to judge, equal, on the average,

to the shooters of the old world?

In most of the leading Gun Clubs shooting is held an important sport. In Paris the young King of Spain, Alfonso, frequently competes at the shoots, and he is no mean shot.

To make the rounds of the important clubs, a shooter will visit the following cities: Paris, London, Monte Carlo, Florence, Milan, Genoa, Rome, Venice, Turin, Naples, Brussels, Ostend, Aix-les-Bains, Spa, Namur, Lyons, Vichy, Bordeaux, Madrid, Vienna, Budapest, Moscow and St. Petersburg.

I always used cartridges of my own loading. I procured supplies of powder, etc. in bulk from England, and with the knowledge, experience and study of years, produced most

satisfactory results.

I had fully determined that when I should have completed my shooting tour abroad I would return to Australia and devote myself to importing and dealing in Guns, etc. and for that reason made a point of personally visiting the factories of the world's leading gunmakers, as those of Jas. Purdy and Sons, W.W. Greener, William Cashmore, Chas. Boswell, etc. I inspected the works of Eley Bros., Kynoch and Co., Curtis and Harvey, and many others. I was enabled to make terms which gave me distinct advantages to offer to Australians. I must point out that being a son of the soil of Australia, I kept well in mind the needs of Australia's sporting agricultural population. To that end I made careful selection of arms

which I knew would be suitable for farmers and the general country sportsman, as well as for the squatter and trap-shooter. I shall always be pleased to give my expert assistance to all, no matter what the extent of the transaction may be.

My eyes are on the fine shooting of some promising Australians, whom I shall be glad to assist with hints and advice if ever they decide to take advantage of their skill, as they should do, and make the tour of Europe, to compete at the leading clubs.

I want to say "right here", as the Yankees put it, that I do not think it possible to travel the world over and meet with a better average of good shots than is to be found in Australia, both in the field and in the traps. Before going abroad I had had a long experience, shooting all over Victoria and New South Wales for more than ten years, both at game and in prize shooting. Up to then, the general excellence of men I met was not so remarkable to me as it became after I had met shooters from all over the world, and got to comparing them with my fellow countrymen. It was then I was able to pronounce in favour of Australians.

Of course, there are fine opportunites for "our boys" to get practice in Australia, and, again, they lead a simpler life, much out of doors, keenly interested in athletics. Access to game is easy, there being no restrictions on free shooting, as abroad. Hence there are opportunities and conditions which conduce towards aiding Australians to reach a high plane of excellence as shots. It was with great pride that I contrasted our shooters with those from other parts of the world.

As to the chances our shots have in open competition with those in England and Europe, I know men — many of them — who could go to those countries and hold their own, and "a bit more", with the best the world can produce.

PIGEON SHOOTING AT MONTE CARLO AND ELSEWHERE

A few notes about the famous Gun Clubs of Europe will interest sportsmen. Monte Carlo deserves pride of place for completeness of its appointments. It has a palatial grand stand, on which the club, two years ago, spent £3000 in improvements alone. The comfort of members is assured by a staff of from thirty to forty attendants, who are always on duty, and whose sole aim seems to be the pleasure of members and visitors.

On Grand Prix day the elite of Europe may be found on the stand. The ladies are there in throngs, attired in exquisite costumes, taking great interest in the event.

Wagering on the final result is, at times, very heavy, which tends towards testing the nerve of the most seasoned shooter. I remember one gentleman, an Australian, who stood to win £2000 in one wager, and he lost it by but one bird. He had backed himself at good odds to win straight out. The betting was often very exciting. On one occasion a young Englishman chose to plunge against my gun. He took fourteen consecutive wagers at £700 to £100 that there would be no kill. Fourteen birds were shot, and he lost £1400.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Further to our telephone discussion yesterday I am delighted to be able to confirm that the Australian Olympic and Commonwealth Games shooting fraternity has yet another world record holder.

On June 2, 1989 prone smallbore rifle shooter Barry Sturgess from Bundaberg, Queensland won the World Cup match conducted in Munich, West Germany. Barry beat a top international field of some 95 shooters. His winning score of 702.2 established a new world record for the English match (men's smallbore prone rifle). Barry also established a new world record score for the ten shot final of 103.2.

Barry has been selected by the Australian Smallbore and Air Rifle Association to compete in the XIV Commonwealth Games to be held in Auckland next year and in Europe as part of his pre-training program.

Barry is the third Australian Smallbore Rifle Shooter to have won a prestigious world cup event. Those who have achieved this distinction previously are Alan Smith in Zurich in 1985 and Don Brook in Munich in 1988.



BERETTA SUPPORT CANCER RESEARCH

Gardone Valtrompia (Brescia), Italy. The chief executives of the world's oldest industrial dynasty, Fabbrica d'Armi P. In recent years, the Foundation has established three fully-equipped laboratories at the Spedali Civili in Brescia, Italy, and sponsored a medical fellowship in the United States. It also participates in treatment with the prestigious Ludwig Institute for Cancer Research in Bern Switzerland.

"General Motors is delighted that this agreement benefits cancer research, because this has been a special cause for us for many years," Mr Smith declared. The General Motors Cancer Research Foundation, originated by Mr Smith, annually honours preeminent cancer research scientists. It has awarded \$3.1 million since 1978. Last month, the Foundation announced an international science journalism awards program to recognize excellence in reporting about bio-medical research with application to cancer.

The Beretta company, which traces its origins to the year 1526, enjoy international renown for excellence in the firearms industry. With facilities in Europe and the United States, Beretta manufactures and markets a diversified line of sporting arms and accessories, as well as law enforcement and military firearms.

Beretta received global attention on May 22nd when it was selected for a second contract by the U.S. Armed Forces, making it the sole supplier of the U.S. Military sidearm. Beretta has supplied the standard U.S. Military sidearm since 1958 and also provides the sidearm of choice for the French Gendarmerie and the Italian Military.







The death occurred on Wednesday 12th April, 1989 of Harry Franklin Cox of Hay, N.S.W., at the age of 73 years.

Harry or "Pitchfork" as he was known to the older generation of National Shooters, was recognized in the fifties and sixties as the Master of National Championship Shoot Marshals. During this period he was Marshal from 1954 till 1967.

His fantastic memory of names and faces was such that often at a big shoot, he would see shooters, say at the bar and he would remind them "Bill—you're in 67 squad—get your gun ready".

His organizing ability was such that he was appointed an official at the shooting section of the 1956 Olympic Games in Melbourne.

Harry was a shooter of some note and won numerous Championships in the Riverina area of N.S.W.

Harry was born at Hay and worked in the pastoral industry before joining the Armed Services in World War II. Upon his discharge he resumed in the pastoral area before joining the Hay P.P. Board as rabbit inspector.

As a young man he was an outstanding athlete and swimmer extending into Australian Rules Football, Shooting and Bowls.

He was a foundation member of the reformed Hay Gun Club, also serving at various times as President and Secretary. At the time of his passing he was a Life Member.

He also found time to serve on other committees in the town area and was rewarded by being elected Life Member of Hay Jockey Club and Hay Bowling Club.

Harry is survived by his wife Cossie and their six children. His largely attended funeral reflected the esteen "H.F." was held in the Hay District.


