EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

On a serious note your attention is drawn to the illustration and accompanying notes contained in the C.T.S.N. relating to the fitting of safety arm guards by all clubs to all traps. Without going into detail a very serious accident was avoided during the Wagga Pre-Nationals more by good luck than by good management. I am pleased to be able to report, however, that Adrian Cousens, the person involved, is making a good recovery from the blow that he sustained and should soon be seen around the shooting grounds. Having recently spoken with Adrian he is anxious to "hit a few" and with this approach he is obviously well on the way to recovery.

The compulsory fitting of safety arm guards is a matter that is presently before the Executive Committee for decision. With the comments that have already been received there is no doubt that a positive decision will be taken; once this has been determined all clubs will be advised accordingly. Don't wait for the Executive to make a decision — have the matter discussed at your club to see that this safety procedure is adopted without waiting for it to become mandatory. The time spent in waiting could well be time spent in ensuring the safety of all who have authority to be involved with the traps at your club. Our thanks go to Colin Burt, who, having recognised the problem that could arise, has prepared an illustration of what would be an acceptable form of trap arm safety guard.

During the National Skeet Championships at Wagga Colin Burt, as National Coaching Director, met with the A.C.T.A. Management Committee to discuss his role as National Coaching Director prior to the permanency of the position being established. During the discussions he was asked about his involvement in N.S.W. with products allied to the sport of clay target shooting. This involvement was perceived by Management to be a direct conflict of interests in relation to his employment as full-time National Coaching Director funded by the Australian Sports Commission.

While no request was made by the Management Committee so far as the continuance of his involvement was concerned Management were advised by Colin that financially he would not be able to survive. Management decided that they were not prepared to accept what they felt was a conflict of interest and did make the following decision:

"After giving full consideration to the difficulty of the situation Colin Burt was advised that as there was no choice available to the Association other than to accept the decision made by him to continue with his commercial activities his position as full-time National Coaching Director could not be confirmed and steps would be taken to fill the vacancy which would be at the expiration of the completion of duties in accordance with the Contract of Employment under which he was to have been confirmed as National Coaching Director."

Advice has been received from South Australia that they are not able to host the 1991 National Trap Championships. These have now been allocated to Western Australia, who will be holding the Trap Nationals for the first time since 1985. As the 1993 Nationals were allocated to W.A. an early decision is being sought to re-allocate the 1993 Trap Nationals to South Australia, who hopefully will be in a position to host the Nationals at that time.

In addition to the 1991 Trap Nationals South Australia have relinquished the 1991 Olympic Discipline Nationals owing to the uncertainty of the completion of a second trench layout at the International Shooting Complex. A decision on re-allocating the 1991 O.D. Championships will be taken at an early date.

Information has just come to hand that N.S.W. shooter Michael Diamond has had back-to-back wins in the Sport Australia Awards, being named Junior Male Athlete of the Year, which is a fitting end to a year in which he has excelled. Well done Michael.

In closing, 1990 will be no different in many respects to other years, although with the benefit of experience gained during the '80s the decade will hopefully produce some exciting times for the sport, commencing internationally with the 1991 World Championships in Perth, culminating hopefully in Australia hosting the 1996 Olympic Games in Melbourne where the Melbourne Olympic Committee are leaving no stone unturned as they say in their efforts to win the Games for Australia. What a boost it would be for shooting in Australia if this was to happen. We wish them well on behalf of all sports in Australia — particularly the shooting sports.

1872 AND FORWARD...

More stories about our earlier days Gun Clubs

Continuing the story – from September C.T.S.N.

Once again I am very much indebted to the many people who have responded to my plea for information relating to our early days of gun club activity throughout Australia. Of course in the very beginning, only live bird competition was practised. Clay target shooting did not emerge until around 1920 when many of the live bird clubs then adopted clay targets. Some of these clubs went on to become well established clay target clubs to the present day.

The following stories from gun clubs that have early early beginnings make interesting reading that I am sure the modern clay target shooter will enjoy.

Mount Gambier Gun Club, S.A.

George Steele of the above club forwarded a cutting from their local newspaper "The Border Watch" where it reported that a large number of spectators and club members were on the ground to witness the shooting held on October 21, 1872, quote "The shooting was fair and several gentlemen killed all their birds". The club was formed on August 3, 1872 with R.J. Turner as President



and W.E. Burton as Secretary. The site of the first club is now where the new Government Wood and Forest plant is situated.

Werribee Gun Club, Vic.

The first main recorded shoot of the Werribee Gun Club took place on January 21, 1882 at Werribee Park, home of Thomas and Andrew Chirnside. It was a picnic day where 2000 people gathered and pigeon shooting sweepstakes were among the main attractions. Most people came by train from Melbourne and then by coach.

March 30, 1882: The pigeon shoots were won by Werribee's William Ison Jnr, who was perhaps the best shot in the colony.

In 1914 a big shoot was held at the club on the south side of the railway line near the racecourse on Geelong Road; our present shooter and life member Bill Cations was the trapper boy aged 13 years.



Werribee Gun Club (clay target) was formed in June 1935 on Mr W. Missen's property at Hoppers Crossing. Clay targets were then becoming more popular than live birds. I would think Fred Burns had something to do with this shoot as he was the owner's stepson. After the war years the club was reformed in 1953 to raise money for the first Werribee kindergarten. The club moved in 1954 to grounds at Ballan Rd, and then in 1972 to Leakes Rd.

Korumburra Gun Club, Vic.

Gun Club at 'Burra 75 years ago ... story from Tom Gannon and David Stone.

The first meeting to form the current gun club at Korumburra was held in a car at the Outtrim recreation reserve.

At the time a few enthusiasts had an occasional shoot at Outtrim, at McDonald's Track and at Wonthaggi. But because they were shooting across sanitary depot trenches at Outtrim, another site was sought.

In the course of forming the present club it was found that there had been a club whose bank account at the State Savings Bank at Korumburra had not been used since 1912, and contained £15.

"That 15 quid got us our first stationery, and really helped us get off the ground," foundation and life member Dave Stone, of Loch, recalled last weekend.

Dave, John Green, of Bena. and Tom McGaw, of Leongatha, were authorised to find a site for the club around Korumburra.

"There was a lot of Crown Land around, but most of it was leased to the adjoining farmer. The best site was the one where the club settled, though it was not nearly as flat as it is today.

"The shire council helped us no end by levelling the site with heavy machinery.

"The gully over which the club shoots was covered with tall blackwoods; they had to go.

"The late Bob Makeham donated our first target throwing machine. It was the old Snipe trap that Wonthaggi sold for f20 when it put in a Damo. Wonthaggi could have got more than f20 for it, but let us have it at a low price to help us get airborne. Years later we sold it for \$30.

"Before we got the Snipe we were shooting with a borrowed Plus trap in front of some bales of hay.

"The office for a start was a car. Then we used to hire two steel framed portable shelters covered with tarpaulins.

"The wind used to cause havoc with squad sheets in that unsatisfactory set-up. Finally Ron Blythe erected the steelframed, galvanised iron building that is today's clubhouse.

"In October '65 we held our first proper, ACTA registered shoot of three events with trophies.

"The tower was a great windmill stand that John Hamblin, then of Poowong, saw being unused at Drouin South. He knew the people on the farm were only too happy to have it taken away. John got it to the ground where a few of us did some welding. The concrete foundations had been laid, and on a Saturday afternoon, without charge to the club, Keith Black, then of Korumburra, used his crane to stand it up.

"The South Gippsland Field and Game branch erected the skeet houses and installed the first manually-operated skeet traps.

"What the club has today is the result of a lot of time and generosity of those early members.

"A lot of development money was also furnished by early members taking \$50 debentures, one or two of which were repaid each month, as finance permitted."

Very little information about the team is available, however it is reasonable to assume that it was the forerunner to what we now have and know as the Mackintosh International Match. Australia first entered the Mackintosh International Match in the year 1939 and has competed each year since then except for a break of nine years during World War II.

Len Baker . . . A golden oldies record in our sport over the years

We only shot about twice a year in the country gun clubs as things were pretty tight during The Depression, so we didn't get much practice. As I had a family of eight and also work commitments as a shearer and share $5\frac{1}{2}$ days a week with the pay 27 shillings and threepence a hundred, not much capital was there to play with. Now it's \$127 a hundred.

A few memories are as follows:

- 1932 The Finley Clay Bird Gun Club was formed at a site at the Rock.
- 1934 Then it was moved to the Reserve (present rice shed), when the war broke out and they went into recess until 1948.
- 1936 The Official Opening of the Melbourne Clay Bird Association.
- 1948 Finley Gun Club moved to Rourkes Property until 1952 and then went into recess. The club has since been reformed on the Tocumwal Rd and is still in operation. The opening was attended by the late Horrie James (Ducks Back).
- 1952 I moved to Tyabb and helped to form the Gun Club there in 1958.
- 1953 Joined the Frankston Gun Club which was on Bill Twyeroul's property.
- 1955 I was a member of the Australian National Team.
- 1956 I was a member of the Victorian State Team.
- 1970s Helped to form the Lightning Ridge Gun Club.
- 1978 Helped to form the gun club at Boort, Vic., which is still in operation near the lake.

The New Zealand Commonwealth Games Team was in attendance along with two of our best juniors in Brett Dunstan and Micheal Diamond. While numbers were down the standard was high.

The first event was the South Island I.S.U. Skeet and Trench Championships.

I.S.U. Skeet: Day One saw Ian Hale shoot an excellent 98/100 and lead John Wooley and Craig Meuleman 95/100 into what was to be an event between the three.

Persons travelling to W.A. are reminded that they must be in compliance with the W.A. Gun Laws if carrying firearms into Western Australia.

Individual temporary permits are available and must be obtained at the first available police station upon entering Western Australia. A fee paid temporary permit can be issued for a maximum of three months at a cost of \$2.00 per month or part thereof. You will be required to provide a current shooter's licence (not applicable to residents of Qld. or Tasmania), proof of club, association membership by means of a shooter's registration card, along with proof of the serial registration number(s), of the shotgun(s) carried.

The 1990 World Shooting Championships Team to compete at Moscow will be determined from the members of the 1990 National Training Squad over an elimination series. ACTA justification to apply.

The International (U.I.T.) Final System shall be used in all events. Nominations for each event will close at a time determined by the Tournament Director. All nominations include a contribution to the Olympic Discipline Fund.

OLYMPIC DISCIPLINES INTERNATIONAL TEAMS – NATIONAL TRAINING SQUAD SELECTION PROCEDURE

1. NATIONAL TRAINING SQUAD

A. Composition

- (i) Olympic Trap/I.S.U. Skeet, A 6 member (Open) squad shall be named as a result of scores achieved at each year's Olympic Discipline Championships.
- (ii) In addition to the Open squads, a junior shall be named for each squad.
- (iii) Junior involvement (other than as a member of the open squad) shall be at "own expense."
- (iv) The junior named in each squad * shall not be eligible for open team selection.
- (v) The National Training Squad must be prepared to comply with all reasonable requests made of them including:

(a) Maintenance of fitness levels that may be determined.

(b) Maintenance of competition performance that may be determined.

(c) Participation in specified scheduled competitions. B. Teams

Australian Team selection shall be determined from members of the National Training Squad.

- C. Eliminations
 - (i) Australian Team selection shall be determined through the conduct of an elimination program(s).
- (ii) Participation in any scheduled elimination shall be at the expense of the competitor unless otherwise determined.
- (iii) All persons commence the elimination program on an equal score basis.
- (iv) Where more than one elimination is conducted scores will be carried forward.
- (v) In the event of any persons not being able to provide an acceptable reason for non attendance at any scheduled elimination then his/her position on the National Training Squad shall be forfeited with the position being offered to the next qualified person according to the scores recorded from the Olympic Discipline National Championships from which the National Training Squad was determined.

D. Training

- (i) The A.C.T.A. will endeavour to obtain training camp facilities at the Australian Institute of Sport on an ongoing basis.
- (ii) Wherever possible a minimum of three months notice of approved training camps will be given to all members of the National Training Squad.
- (iii) All members of the National Training Squad plus the added junior(s) are to attend all training programs unless an acceptable reason (N.C.D./Nat. Shooting Committee Chairman) is given at the time of notice of any inability to attend.
- (iv) In the event of any persons not being able to provide an acceptable reason for non-attendance at any scheduled training program then his/her position on the National Training Squad shall be forfeited with the position being offered to the next qualified person according to the scores recorded from the Olympic Discipline National Championships from which the National Training Squad was determined.
- E. Doping Drugs

All members will be bound by the conditions governing the illegal use of substances in accordance with the regulations of the Australian Olympic Federation, Australian Commonwealth Games Association and the Australian Shooting Association.

2. INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION

A. No member of the Association shall be eligible to compete in any international event without having recorded a score in competition equal to or better than the minimum performance score as may be determined from time to time. As at 1.1.90 Olympic Trap 182/200

I.S.U. Skeet 184/200

- B. No member of the Association shall be eligible to compete in any international event where his/her attendance would be recognised as being a representative of Australia without having received the prior consent of the Association through the National Office.
- C. Any person who fails to gain or omits to apply for approval to compete internationally and competes in any international event where he/she is recognised as being a representative of Australia shall be deemed to be ineligible for selection in any team or gain approval to compete internationally for a period of twelve months from the date of the event contested.
- D. Any person who having gained the approval of the Association competes in international competition shall within one month from their return to Australia submit to the National Office full details of his/her scores and performances.

3. INVITATIONS

Any person who may receive a personal invitation to train or compete outside of Australia may only do so with the consent of the Association if his/her training and or competition is recognised as being representative of Australia as against involvement on a personal basis.

4. COMPETITORS ACCEPTANCE

- A. Any person who as a result of the scores recorded by them are named as being a member of the National Training Squad, are to advise the National Office of their non-acceptance of a position on the National Training Squad if they are not prepared to accept the conditions of the Association which have previously been advised to them via the C.T.S.N.
- B. In the absence of any advice as in 4A all members of the National Training Squad have indicated their acceptance of the terms and conditions relating to the National Training Squad and International involvement under the auspices of the Australian Clay Target Association and the Australian Shooting Association.
- C. All team members must be prepared to sign a team members agreement and abide by the conditions therein.

5. JUSTIFICATION COMMITTEE

- A. Shooters selected to represent the Association by any method that may be determined by the National Executive Committee shall be subject to gaining approval from the Justification Committee.
- B. The National Shooting Committee of the day shall assume the role of a Justification Committee.

6. DETERMINATION

- A. The terms and conditions of membership of the National Training Squad together with accompanying conditions relating to the Olympic Disciplines shall be reviewed on an annual basis by the National Shooting Committee.
- B. The terms and conditions of membership of the National Training Squad together with accompanying conditions relating to the Olympic Disciplines are as agreed to by the National Executive Committee of the day.
- C. The terms and conditions of the National Training

Squad together with accompanying conditions relating to Olympic Disciplines shall be published in the November issue of the C.T.S.N. for the ensuing year.

- D. The Executive Committee of the day shall be the sole arbitrator in any area of dispute.
- 7. EXECUTIVE AUTHORITY

The Executive Committee of the day reserves the right to at any time amend, substitute or cancel any or all of the terms and conditions relating to the Olympic Disciplines format as described herein.

8. NOTE: In certain years it may be necessary to name teams without adopting the preferred elimination program which enables teams to be named as close as possible to the competition dates.

AROUND THE TRAPS

What is happening to the sport of clay target shooting? I started my involvement with the sport around 1957-58, and over the years that followed attended many major tournaments in N.S.W., S.A. and Victoria. These included our National Titles as well as tournaments where motor cars were first prize in the main events. I was also part of the administration team at Mildura Gun Club, when they too provided a car as first prize in their main tournament over the Queen's Birthday weekend in June. As many as 145 shooters competed in this event with a car as first prize and cash for second and third.

The equipment used to shoot over at most clubs in those days, as well as Mildura, was a snipe trap with a lever action release. The person operating the machine was known as the "Puller". Nearly all the country clubs I attended attracted some 50-plus shooters to their monthly Saturday afternoon club shoot. Their programs carried a Handicap and Championship event with good trophies for first, second and third being offered. A front marker trophy in the championship and back marker's trophy in the handicap event was also sometimes made available.

The competitive yet casual attitude around the clubs was a delight to see. Over the years we watched a steady improvement, where today we have the best of equipment in automatic hopper fed traps, shooting rules to compete under, that I believe are in the competitors' favour and fair to all. As well, most clubs provide good back-up facilities in clubrooms and amenities. Yet we are now witnessing a steady decline in our sport, by shooter attendance at club and major tournaments. As well, the family involvement is fast disappearing from the club rooms, and in fact has already disappeared from some clubs altogether. One does not see many new faces getting involved in administration at any level.

The recent Victorian State Carnival hosted at Melbourne Gun Club was a glaring example of change. What should and has been, one of the best shooting tournaments in Victoria, seems to be heading for recognition as just another club shoot. Shooter attendance was well down at this State Carnival and if the quality of trophies provided for such a major event continues, it is very doubtful if we will see any improvement in 1990.

Another change confronting the shooter is the fact that the 1991 D.T.L. Nationals will not be conducted in S.A. as planned. I am told the reason for this is that there is not a ground in S.A. that complies with the criteria laid down to host them, or has the required number of traps to hold them. This being the case, S.A. is requesting a swap with

W.A. and opting for 1993, when perhaps they might be ready. Here we go again. Kicking the shooter in the hip pocket! The majority of shooters are in Victoria, N.S.W. and Queensland. We conduct the Nationals in Tasmania in 1990, which I agree with, and then because S.A., whose administrators have known for five years in advance what is required to conduct the Nationals, suddenly decides it is not ready and sends shooters to W.A. There is no doubt W.A. will make sure the Nationals are well run and profitable for the A.C.T.A. However, shooters from the States who regularly attend and support our Nationals will have to pay the extra cost to get to this one.

Maybe our top administrators need to put a little more effort into trying to make things work as has been previously programmed to the benefit of all concerned, instead of taking the easy way out, passing the "Buck",

Let us not procrastinate and bury ourselves in red tape, for once do something positive so that we too are part of the united front and not disinterested spectators. After all, it is your money Ralph.

Surely we can get more input from the news than we have been getting. The silence has been deafening. Finally are there any shooters out there who agree with me, if so take the time to either write in as I have done or discuss the matter with your Club President. Be involved while there is still something to be involved in.

As a competition clay target shooter and keen hunter, like 80% of A.C.T.A. members, I feel we are being outgunned by the enemy and we have to do something about it. NOW.

IN RESPONSE.

I would like to comment on the letter from Mr Graham Ash, as printed above.

Firstly, I would remind not only Mr Ash, but all shooters, that the A.C.T.A. is the custodian of all shooters' money, including the legislation fund. The Executive must act responsibly when handing out any money from this reserve.

The V.C.T.A. asked for funds, rather late in the election campaign, nevertheless the Executive forwarded \$10,000 to them from the legislation reserve. As with all funds from this reserve, the Executive require an audited statement to show where the money was spent. So far this statement has not been forthcoming from the V.C.T.A.

I have asked Alan Maher to comment further on Mr Ash's letter as I believe some points in his letter are incorrect.

AN EXPLANATION.

The following explanation is offered to assist in obtaining a clear view of the matter at both state and national levels.

So far as gun legislation is concerned the A.C.T.A. cannot in all fairness adopt a policy for all members. At the present time two states, Queensland and Tasmania, do not impose licensing requirements while others have varying conditions that have to be met. Because of this the A.C.T.A. can only and does support each State Association in their own right as against adopting a national policy that for many members would see them in a lesser position than they currently have.

In Victoria the Štate Government only recognises the Shooting Sports Council of which the V.C.T.A. is a member. The A.C.T.A. as a national body has no voice in state issues and in Victoria this is the province of the V.C.T.A. through its affiliation with the Shooting Sports Council

The fighting fund is and always has been used for the purpose for which it was founded with N.S.W. recently receiving an amount of \$10,000 with a similar amount made available to the V.C.T.A. The V.C.T.A. request for assistance from the legislation fund was met with minimum delay, maybe not to the dollar amount requested but nevertheless an equal amount to that made available to N.S.W.

So far as comment in the C.T.S.N. is concerned this is the domain of the V.C.T.A. through its affiliation with the Shooting Sports Council. As nothing was forthcoming from this area would it have been a correct and proper action for the national body to have spoken on the matter on behalf of Victorian shooters so far as policy was concerned?

ALL IN A DAY'S SHOOTING

5000 Double Rise

Springtime in New South Wales brings out many unusual and interesting activities. Jacarandra trees blossom, cricket whites adorn the ovals, trout begin crawling out on the bank and double rise mania starts! Did I say double rise mania? What, pray tell, is double rise mania?

The phenomenon called "double rise mania" happens when five blokes get together and decide to blast away at more double rise targets than has ever been shot at before in the history of trapshooting in Australia! That is exactly what happened on 18 November 1989 at the Cowra gun club when five lean, mean, target-hungry shooters fired at 2500 pair of double rise targets. That's right, 500 pair for each shooter for a total of 5000 targets which is a marathon record.

The event had been planned for weeks and all five shooters were looking forward to the day with great expectations. The shooters making up the historical squad were Jim Smith, Dick Piotrowski, Angelo Piazza, Glenn Kable and Mike Fisher. Jim and Dick were from the local Cowra area (Blayney) while Angelo, Glenn and Mike were all from Sydney.

The day began with a heavily overcast sky and light fog covering the trapline. It had rained the night before but the threat of bad weather didn't faze this group. The shooters used the early morning time to set the trap. fill the house with targets, set up the phonopull system and organise guns and shells. Finally, we were ready and at 8:50 AM the action started.

The targets were shot in subevents of 25 pair with a short break after each 100 targets. The shooting progressed steadily all morning and the squad took a 30 minute tea break at 11:00. At this point each squad member had fired at 300 targets. The shooters were feeling fine and the scores were improving so after tea everyone was back into it.

Shooting continued for another 2½ hours when the squad stopped for a 45 minute lunch break. At this juncture the shooters had registered 600 targets eacn. Everything was still working perfectly but, as you might imagine, the shooters were beginning to feel the strain.

The lunch break must have been what the squad needed because after lunch the scores immediately improved. Some of the shooters were shooting their highest scores over the complete event. The squad continued throughout the afternoon with only short breaks and at 4:15 the marathon was completed with the breaking of the last pair and the establishment of a new marathon double rise record -2500 pair!

You are probably sitting there asking yourself why anyone would want to shoot 5000 double rise targets. Well, this group had several reasons and we want to share them with you. Firstly, the shooting of the marathon and the writing of this article have been done with the hope that it will encourage more clay target shooting by extending an open invitation to other shooters to form a squad and beat our marathon scores. We have put our numbers up so how about you?

Secondly, we wanted to emphasise the fun involved in shooting the double rise event. Remember the first time you shot double rise and all the fun you had trying to hit'em two-at-a-time? Well the fun and excitement are still there and if you enjoy burning powder as much as we do then have a go at 500 pair! Who knows, there might be several shooters at the 1990 Nationals hanging up a perfect 50x50 like Russell did in 1989.

Our third and final reason was that we did it for the pure enjoyment of doing it! The five members on this squad enjoy trapshooting and there are times when we can't get enough. This marthon certainly helped fill the bill!

You couldn't organise an event like this without the help of some very considerate people. The members of this record-setting squad would like to thank club president Noel Dwight and the Cowra Gun Club members for helping run the marathon; the referees George Bunting and Len Bird; the scorers Meryle Fisher and Lybby Bunting; phonopull operator Michelle Piazza and finally, Angus Mitchell for donating the phonopulls that worked perfectly over the full course of the marathon.

Some fourteen months ago, the State Coaches meeting moved a motion recommending the fitting of Trap Arm Guards throughout Australia. Now after the incident at the Wagga Skeet Nationals, the problem is solved, with the A.C.T.A. making the fitting of Arm Guards compulsory.

This year's State Coaches meeting, held in Melbourne on 26th November, was very successful. Every State was represented and despite some problems experienced by nearly all the coaches, I am pleased to report that coaching in Australia is in good hands.

Some of the decisions made at the meeting will become of great assistance to the rank and file shooters in the very near future.

The small pink covered booklet — A Quick Check List for Down-The-Line — has been updated and when printed will include the important fundamentals of skeet shooting also.

The publication, called An Introduction to Clay Target Shooting — Trap and Skeet — has been updated and will be reproduced in colour and include quite a number of photographs, making it an attractive handout to new shooters.

Also agreed at the meeting, was a monthly article to be printed in the C.T.S.N., by each State Coaching Director, on a rotation basis — starting with Victorian Coach Len Cook in this issue and followed by: Murray Alexander (WA) February, Arthur Kenna (QLD) March, Greg Chan (NT) April, Don Stevens (SA) May, Stewart Browning (TAS) June and Col Burt (NSW) July.

The articles will be of interest to all shooters, particularly those who wish to know a few of the finer points of the sport.

The State coaches are also working on standardising the Accreditation throughout the country for all Level I and II courses. Once approval is gained from the Australian Coaching Council — the suggested changes will be produced into a "kit" form and the aspiring coach will have all the necessary information and reading material to complete the course.

As National Coaching Director, I would like to congratulate the State Coaches for their dedication to the position they hold and thank them for the support they have shown me in my first six months at the helm.

Thanks also to Alan Maher for his time at the meeting to record the Minutes.

SAFETY COLUMN

A recommendation is before the National Executive Committee to make it a compulsory requirement for all traps to have safety arm guards fitted.

To assist in this regard specifications have been included in this issue of the CTSN which indicate quite clearly what will be required. All clubs are advised via this column that safety arm guards are to be fitted to all traps by March 31, 1990, following which time an inspection will take place to ensure that this safety rule has been complied with in all instances. (Subject to Executive Decision on Recommendation).

SPECIFICATIONS

TRAP ARM GUARDS

- 1: The Guard shall be built in such a way as to prevent persons being injured by the action of the throwing arm.
- The Guard will consist of a ring of metal.
- 2: The guard shall not be closer than 50mm to the extremity of the throwing arm and not further than 100mm.

Explanation: 50mm Minimum – so as a person's hand holding the guard is clear of the throwing action of the arm.

- 3: The guard shall be of a minimum section of 25mm x 10mm Aluminium or 25mm x 6mm steel – and securly supported by the head of the throwing device.
- 4: The guard shall be fitted in such a way that it finishes between 25 - 50mm below the travel of the throwing arm.

SHOOTERS CORNER

- Q. Why does the A.C.T.A. consider a junior to be a person aged under 17 years at the time of registration as against a junior at International level being a person aged under 21 years in the year of competition?
- A. This matter is currently under review and should any decision be taken to amend the junior age limit it will be announced in the C.T.S.N.
- Q. Could you please explain the rule relating to high gun shoot offs in relation to the types of targets to be shot.
- A. Rule 1.25(b) quite clearly states that where varied types of events have been included on the program, the shoot off shall comprise of rounds two of each type of targets applicable to the program. For example, if a points event is on the program then a round of two points targets must be included in the shoot off for the high gun, similarly if points have not been included on the program then they take no part in any shoot off for the high gun.

*This of course does not apply at National Championships where rule 1.25(a) covers the situation quite clearly.

- Q. 1) If a shooter wins an event without shooting the possible he receives a 1 metre penalty. 2) If a shooter wins an event scoring 10/20 he receives a 1 metre penalty. 3) How can clubs encourage people to shoot handicap events if such harsh penalties are applied?
- A. It is because of this type of question that the handicap rules are currently being reviewed for reform. Your question requires three answers.
 - 1) This is due to the handicapping rule 2.3(E).
 - 2) The rule governing this is covered under rule 2.3(F).

3) Refer to rule 2.9(A) with the amended \$7.00 value. Having discussed your question with the Victorian State Handicapper, I cannot answer as to why overall handicap and group winners are treated differently on penalties; e.g. Shooting possibles. This will be taken into consideration as the handicapping review takes place.
