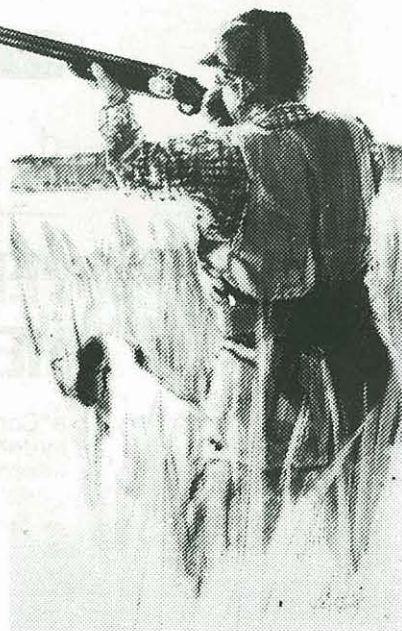

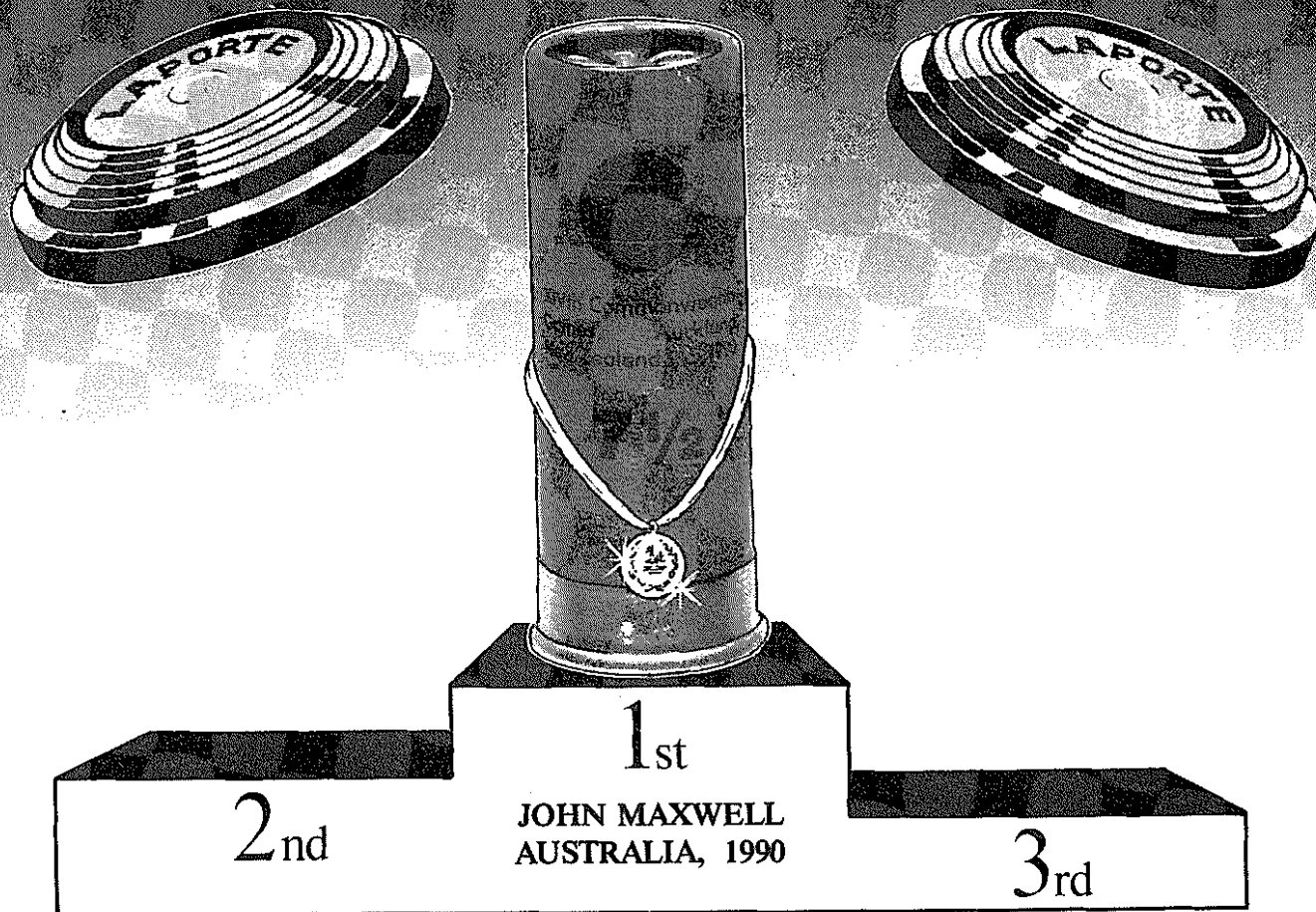

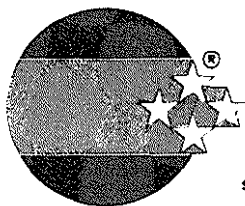

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

All clubs by now would have received an illustration of two additional safety arm guards which are suitable for installation on both Winchester and Ibis traps. Should any club wish to produce their own guards using the diagrams provided then they are free to do so. Alternatively they can be purchased ready for installation from Ibis Traps Pty Ltd at a cost of \$75. We thank Ken Burton for his willingness to make his drawings available to those who wish to produce their own safety arm guards, and we also thank Bruce Burns from Winchester for his co-operation in enabling Ibis Traps to design a safety arm guard suitable for installation on Winchester White Flyer traps. As previously advised all traps are to be fitted with safety arm guards by March 31 — please co-operate in this regard.

The Commonwealth Games are over for another four years with the Australian team overall producing record results. Contributing to these excellent performances was the Australian Shooting Team who certainly achieved their fair share of medals, in particular we must single out shotgun's own John Maxwell for his outstanding effort in winning gold for himself and Australia. Well done, John. While not as successful as John, the other team members certainly gave of their best and as a shooting team under team manager Robert Smith, were excellent ambassadors for Australia.

When reading this month's C.T.S.N. the Olympic Discipline Nationals will have been completed with the next major events being the Moscow World Championships and the Oceania Games. Eliminations will take place to produce the teams for both of these events which are very important ones for Australia as they lead the way to gaining entry to the shotgun events at the 1992 Barcelona Olympic Games.

The Trap Nationals this month and by all reports they will be well attended. The T.C.T.A. have prepared well for the return of the Nationals to Tasmania and we trust they will be well supported which will in turn reward them for their efforts on your behalf.

The 1990 Annual General Meeting will also be held this month. Owing to the earlier than usual month of the trap nationals, the annual report and balance sheet is unable to be published in the C.T.S.N. prior to the A.G.M., however all clubs will receive a copy of the annual report approximately two weeks before the meeting date with the April C.T.S.N. containing the annual report.

Good shooting to all, particularly those competing in the 1990 National Trap Championships.

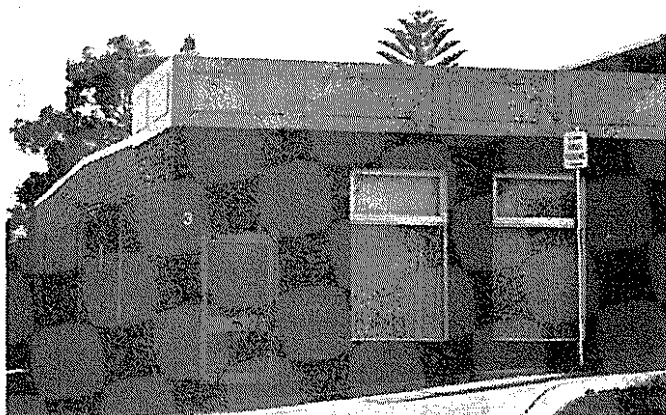

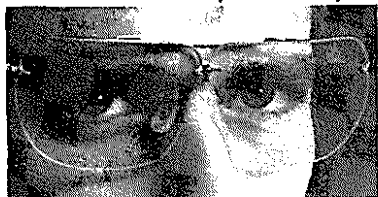
HANDICAP RULE

Shooters intending on competing in the 1990 National Trap Championships are advised that cartridges will be available for purchase on the ground of the Tasmanian Gun Club from Winchester and Scorpio, both of whom are licensed to the A.C.T.A. for cartridge sales on the ground for the period 21st March-30th March which embraces both the Pre-Nationals and National Championships. Cartridges other than from Winchester and Scorpio will not be available on the grounds during the Pre-National and National Championships.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

— NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 Targets in brackets of 25 one visit only to the traps for all titles.
3. While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets/75 Targets.
A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the change over for each 25 targets.
Should the two minutes time limit be exceeded by any shooter then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET shall be incurred.
5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score.
Any score sheet not carrying the shooter's signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
8. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so.
Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT.
Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
9. Any unauthorized shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalized FIVE (5) TARGETS.
10. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
12. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.
13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
14. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for.
To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
15. Persons paying a reduced nomination are considered eligible for all High Gun Awards, Section(s), and Overall. Competitors must compete in a clear majority of programmed events to gain High Gun recognition.
16. The Overall Winner in any event shall not be eligible for additional recognition in any Grade or Section (full

nomination). Competitors other than the Overall Winner in any event shall be eligible for recognition in any Grade or Section in which they are eligible to compete (full nomination). Competitors entering in any specific section of an event shall only be eligible for recognition in the section entered (reduced nomination). ONE NOMINATION ONLY MAY BE PAID - OPEN OR SECTION.

17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Competitors using automatic shotguns during the National Championships may recover their empty shells providing they have obtained an automatic I.D. card when nominating.
19. Nominations will close daily at 11.00 a.m.
20. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
21. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

HANDICAPPING — NATIONALS 1990

To make it easier for all concerned — office staff, handicapper and shooters — we would like all shooters to please note and adhere to the following points:

1. Please present your current 1990 handicap card for stamping before nominating. Also your up to date 1989 card.
2. Nominations will not be accepted unless cards are stamped by the handicapper.
3. Any shooter unable to produce a 1990 handicap card, must produce a club receipt as proof of A.C.T.A. registration.
4. Such shooter shall be allowed to compete on handicap and grade given. But any moneys or trophies won shall be held by the A.C.T.A. until proof of handicap and grade are verified.
5. Rule 2.1(m). Should it be found that a shooter deliberately misled Management regarding his grade and/or handicap, the shooter will be suspended for a period of three months.
6. If an error is made on your card, have your club secretary or handicapper neatly rule out the error, rewrite it correctly, stamp and sign it.
7. Any obvious low scores entered on handicap cards just prior to the Nationals that enables a shooter to be downgraded, will not be taken into consideration. Rule 2.7(a).
8. Please watch the handicap board, if your name appears on the board, please report to the handicapper's office.
9. If you do not wish to be downgraded, please advise the handicapper's office.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION — ENTRY

Entry into the 1990 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 1990 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors must produce their 1989 and 1990 registration cards, before nominating, to the 1990 Nationals Official Handicapper. Where a competitor was not registered for 1989 he must produce his 1990 registration card.

DIVISIONS

The competition will be divided into a number of divisions except in the 38th Australian Double Barrel Championship, where there is a separate Australian Women's Double Barrel Championship and an Australian Junior Double Barrel Championship, as well as the 36th Single Barrel Championship where there is a separate Women's Single Barrel Championship.

Shooters may only nominate in any one section of an event — Open, Ladies, Junior, Veteran.

Shooters who are eligible for, and elect to pay a reduced nomination (60% of open nomination) to enter a specific section, shall be eligible for the section entered, as well as all High Gun awards.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before sashes/medals/trophies are awarded.

When team selection is involved shooters shall be eligible for the open team irrespective of the section nominated for.

In addition to open teams, shooters shall be eligible for team selection for the section nominated, Ladies, Junior or Veteran.

To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

AGE QUALIFICATIONS

VETERANS — are those competitors over the age of 65 years on March 24, 1990.

JUNIORS — are those competitors who, on March 24, 1990 will be under the age of 17 years.

TIME STARTING

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am with nominations closing daily at 11am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be resquadded towards the end of the event.

Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any

refund of nominations paid.

CARTRIDGES

Cartridges of the competitor's choice may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the carnival through suppliers licensed to the A.C.T.A.

TARGETS AND TRAPS

Targets through the program are to be black and will be supplied by Olimpyc Targets. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers.

All throwing equipment will be electrically operated.

CLASSIFICATIONS

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified — an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard.

This applies to trap grades, open, ladies, juniors and veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that regrading and rehandicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Ladies, Junior and Veterans who have elected to enter the open section will be indicated on the High Gun Scoreboard as OL, OJ, OV.

PRACTICE

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships. Tickets may be purchased at the designated area.

CASH PRIZES

In all events with the exception of the Grand Australian Handicap and Deauville Doubles, cash prizes will be awarded to the overall winner, and to first to third placegetters in each grade.

These cash prizes are calculated as follows: **Overall winner** receives 50c per nomination in the event. **Grade winners** receive 50c per nomination in the particular grade. Second in each grade receives 40c per nomination in the grade, third 30c.

SHOOT-OFFS, CONTINUATION OF EVENTS

If, for any reason, the event cannot be completed on the day it commences, the management reserves the right to stop shooting at any time if considered necessary.

In such a case, the competition will recommence where it left off, on the following day.

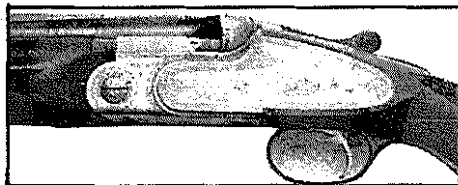

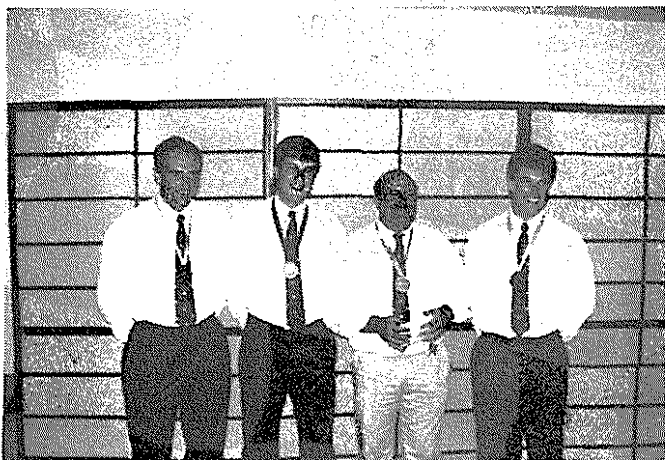
GOLD AT LAST!!

Wednesday morning, 17th January, is the start of what our Shooters Russell Mark, John Maxwell (Trench), Ian Hale and Craig Meuleman (Skeet) have been training for for months, the 1990 Commonwealth Games in Auckland, New Zealand. So after a six hour delay in Sydney it is off to the Land of the Long White Cloud to do battle.

Thursday was taken up with accreditation at the Games Village then off to the Waitemata Gun Club to check if all the firearms and ammunition had been transferred to the club by customs who had taken possession of all firearms and ammo for the duration of the games. The temptation of having a shot was too much for Russell who joined a squad for a round of practice. The Waitemata Gun Club is very similar to that of Illawarra N.S.W. set high on the hills out over a very picturesque valley.

The next day was practice with both the trench and skeet fields in full swing and with most nations taking part, all the boys shot very well with John and Russell looking forward to the badge match the next day.

Badge Match Day One for the Trench shooters began in very light rain and dull conditions with one Gold, three Silver and five Bronze medals up for grabs. Most shooters recorded low scores for the day. Russell McGowan of New Zealand led the field after the first 50 targets on 47/50, our Russell was in equal 4th place on 44/50 with John in equal 5th place on 41/50.

Day two was very windy and the leaders' scores took a nose dive. Russell and John were handling the conditions very well. Russell finished with a fine 47/50 for the day to take the Gold medal with 91/100, two targets clear of Kevin Gill (England) and Gary Peacock (Scotland) on 89/100. John finished with a 45/50 for a total of 86/100 and picked up one of the five Bronze medals in equal 8th place.

Monday the 22nd was the badge match day for Skeet, with one Gold, three Silver and four Bronze medals on the line. As there are two skeet layouts this 100 target match was shot in one day.

After the first 50 targets Ian was leading the field on 49/50 with Ken Harman of England. Craig was not far off the pace on 45/50. Most shooters were finding the conditions a little tough. After a break for lunch and a redraw of positions and squads it was back to work.

Ian shot a pair of 23s to finish on 95/100, one target behind Nigel Kelly (I.O.M.), Ian Marsden, (Sco) and Andrew Austin (Eng) on 96/100, Craig shot a 47/50 to finish on 92/100 in 8th place and a Bronze medal. Ian and James Dunlop of Scotland shot off for the third Silver medal. When they were still equal after three shoot off rounds of (24, 23, 25), it was decided to give an equal medal to both shooters. Nigel Kelly of the Isle of Man won the Gold medal after a fine 25/25 in the shoot off.

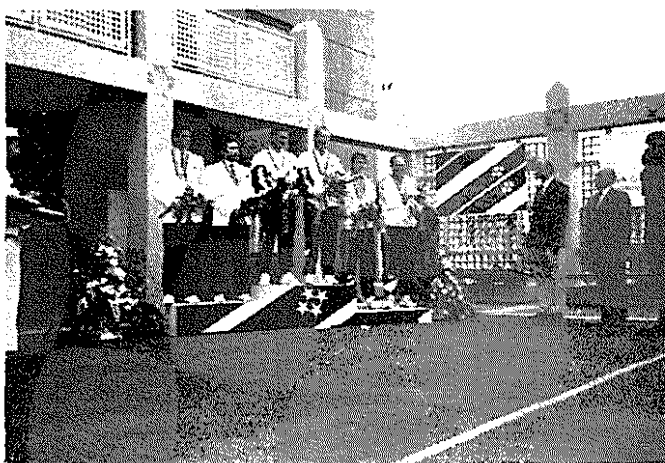
The next two days were taken up with practice and the

opening ceremony. This was an experience our shooters will never forget, especially with their family and friends in the stands.

Day one of the Games saw the Trench shooters in second place after the first 50 targets of the pairs competition. John shot a fine 47/50 and with Russell's 43/50 they were only one target behind England on 91/100. Next on 89/100 were Malta and Wales (N.Z. 88/100). Everybody was still finding the targets and layout hard to handle. The weather was fine with a light breeze.

After the first round of 25 targets on day two of the pairs in perfect conditions, we had caught the English pair with Russell shooting 24/25 and John 22/25. The Welsh team were three targets back in third place. Russell and Ian Peel (England) were in Squad One, Russell shot 20/25 and Peel 23/25. John was in Squad Two and shot 22/25 to put the English pair six targets in front. With one shooter to shoot, Wales were closing the gap and with their shooter in Squad Four and the Englishman in Five, the pressure was on.

The Welsh shooter shot 23/25 to equal us on 178/200 for the Silver medal. We took Bronze on a count back. Kevin Gill (England) shot 22/25 to give them Gold on 181/200.

Saturday saw the badge match for our Skeet shooters in very gusty wind conditions. Again, the match was shot in one day.

After the first 50 targets the English and New Zealand teams were in the lead on 93/100. Cyprus were in second place on 92/100. Our boys were in third place with Scotland on 91/100. Ian had shot a pair of 24s. Craig shot 43/50.

With a redraw of squads and positions for the final 50 targets the pressure was on. Ian shot another 24/25, Craig was feeling the pressure a little and shot 20/25. We were now looking at a Bronze medal with New Zealand, Wales and Cyprus. In the next round Ian lost his pair on station five for a total of 95/100 and with Craig's 22/25 for a total of 85/100. We finished in sixth place on 180/200. The Scottish pair of Ian Marsden and James Dunlop took Gold on 189/200, England Silver on 185/200 and New Zealand Bronze with 183/200.

It was now time for the individual events with Trench to be shot first over three days of 75, 75, 50 targets with no final.

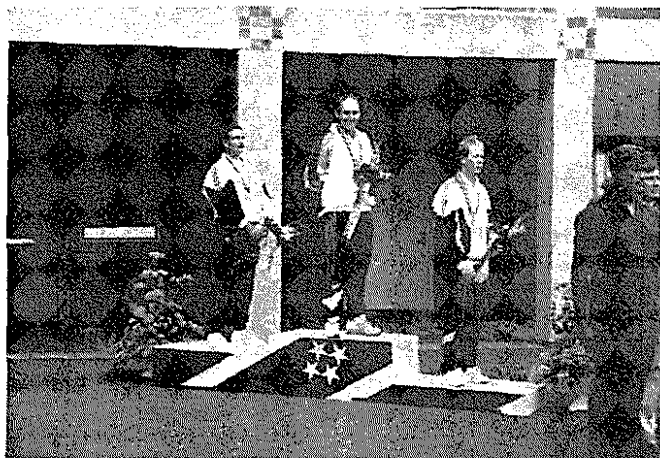
Day one in overcast conditions and drizzling rain saw Russell lead the field on 70/75 (23, 22, 25). John was in second place on 69/75. Nobody had yet mastered the range as can be seen from the scores. Russell's 25 was one of only six to be shot over the 400 programmed targets.

The next day it was still overcast with changing light conditions. Kevin Gill shot a 70/75 to take the lead on 138/150. John had moved into second place with a 68/75 (21, 23, 24) for 137/150 with Russell next on 136/150 after a 66/75 (22, 23, 21). Ian Peel was on 135/150.

With the final 50 targets to be shot in very overcast conditions with some heavy rain and with the scores so close, it was pressure day for all. Russell and Kevin Gill were in the same squad watching one another with John following in the next squad.

Russell got off to a bad start with 20/25. Kevin Gill shot 23/25 to give John a chance at the lead but John also shot 23/25 to remain one target behind. Ian Peel shot a 22/25 and moved into third place so all the medals were to be decided on the last round.

With Russell shooting 22/25 in his final round for a 178/200, he had to wait until Ian Peel shot in the last squad to see if he had a chance at Bronze. Kevin Gill shot 22/25 to finish on 183/200 and left the gate open a little for John. It was nail biting stuff, especially for John's family who were looking on. John had to shoot 23 to tie, 24 or better to win. So under extreme pressure John shot an excellent 24/25, missing his second last target, to win **GOLD ON 184/200**. Ian Peel took Bronze on 179/200.

Individual Skeet competition began in very overcast conditions with light rain and changing winds. This event was shot in two days (100 targets per day). On arriving at the ground the shooters found the targets that had been set were far faster than those they had trained on.

Ian and Craig both began with a 22/25. Craig followed this with a 23/25 to be in fourth place after the first fifty targets. Ian was finding the going and decisions tough and shot a 19/25 to be in equal thirteenth place on 41/50. The next fifty targets saw Craig shoot 45/50 to be placed sixth on 88/100. Their worst scores in years, not one shooter shot a 25 on the day. Ken Harman (England) led the field on 92/100. Andrew Austin, also of England, was next on 92/100.

Day two began again in overcast conditions but with targets much slower than day one. Ian and Craig both got off to a good start as did those leading the field. Ian shot a 48/50 and Craig a 46/50 in the morning session. Ian finished his last fifty with a 47/50 to lift himself to eighth place on 179/200. Craig finished in tenth place after a 43/50 for a total of 177/200. Ten 25s were shot today against none on day one.

Ken Harman of England and Georgios Sakellis of Cyprus both finished on 187/200 one of the lowest scores ever, with Andrew Austin of England and Desmond Davies of Wales both on 184/200. Shoot offs were required for all medals.

Ken Harman took Gold after missing his last shoot off target for a 187/200 + 24, Georgios Sakellis Silver 187/200 + 23 and Andrew Austin Bronze 184/200 + 24.

I believe the **GOLD MEDAL** won by John was a fitting reward for the many years of hard training and determination he has put into this sport. It was a moment he will never forget especially as he shared it with his mother, son Jason and Yvonne. For myself and his fellow team members it's a memory we shall cherish forever.

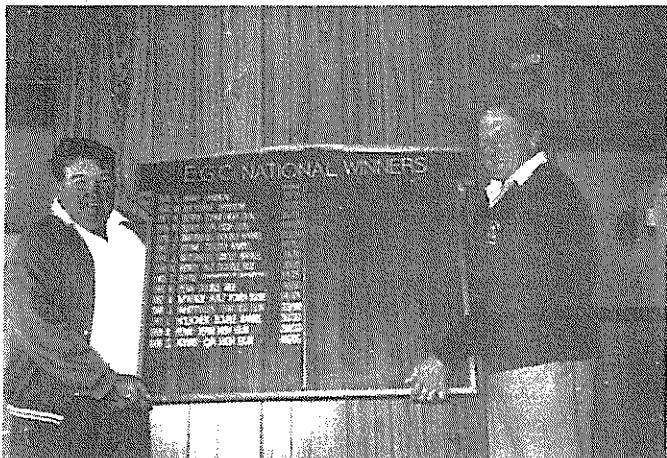

If you feel you have the ability and the dedication required to win a World Championship – contact your State Coaching Director and he will give you the necessary information.

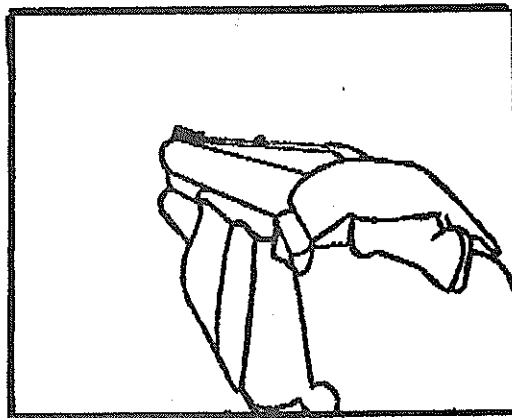

We have just shown the Commonwealth that Australia is a great sporting Nation, why not in 1991 show the world that we can out-shoot them as well.

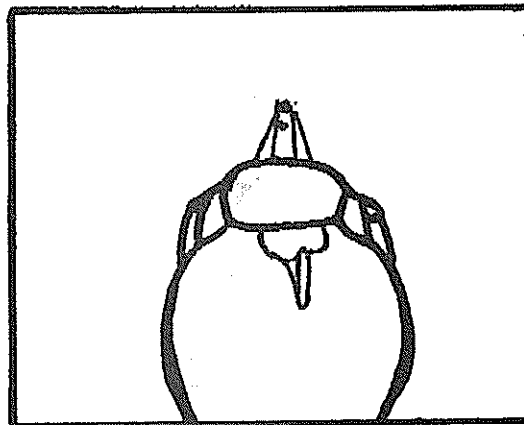
In the November C.T.S.N., I wrote an article on the proper use of the eyes in shooting. Included in the article was a section about those people who have the problem of being say right handed and have a master left eye. To this I suggested two (2) solutions. One being to change to the left shoulder and the other was putting a small spot on a pair of shooting glasses which would make the front sight obscured to the master eye.

Since then I have read an article in an American coaching book which offers another solution.

As seen in the diagrams hereunder, a small strip of metal fixed to the side of the rib would do the same job as the exercise explained with the spot on the glasses.



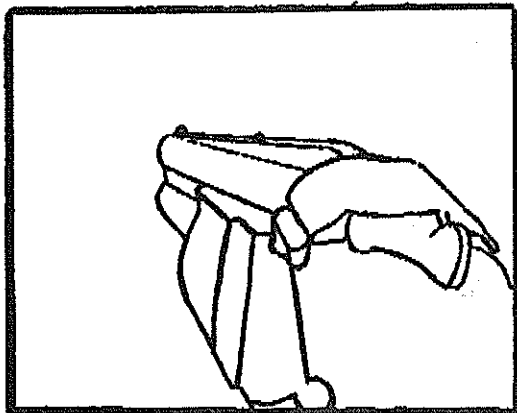

SHOOTER'S CORNER

Q: I was under the impression that there would not be any changes to the rules until a period of five years had elapsed since the last review of the rule book. As there have been a number of rule changes in recent issues of C.T.S.N. could you please explain the reasons why.

A: The last review of the A.C.T.A. rule book took place effective 1.4.88 with no further review contemplated before 1993. This does not mean, however, that rule changes and/or amendments will not occur, for as you have rightly pointed out they have been occurring. Quite simply it means that for other than rule matters that are brought to the attention of one of the Rules Committee, there is no intention to conduct a formal full scale review until 1993.

Q: I read with interest the question on the handicap system in the Shooter's Corner, January C.T.S.N. It is my opinion that there must be equality as to when a competitor receives a handicap penalty. I would like to make a few suggestions that may be of assistance when the handicap system is reviewed:

- (1) If a competitor wins an open handicap he should receive a 1-metre handicap penalty.
- (2) If a competitor wins overall or first place in his section in a grouped handicap he should receive a 1-metre handicap penalty.
- (3) Handicap sweepstakes will be more difficult for handicap penalties to apply because more than one competitor may receive first place compulsory division.
- (4) The only handicap where there should be no penalty is a handicap eye opener (e.g. 10 target eye opener before a handicap championship).
- (5) Competitors' scores should have no bearing on whether or not a competitor receives a handicap penalty; the trophies received are the same if the competitor shoots

a possible or not.

(6) Competitors who shoot second place should not receive a handicap penalty (why should second place get the same penalty as the winner) irrespective of the score shot?

Clubs may program more handicaps and competitors may be more willing to enter these types of events if the handicap system is equal for all involved in our sport. I hope these comments can in some way benefit our shooting — after all the sport is always bigger than the individual.

Jock Bryan (Nationals Handicapper 1990)

A: The points raised by Mr Bryan will be discussed by the National Rules Committee during their May meeting at which time a total review of the existing handicapping system will take place.

Q: Could you please explain to me how an event can be conducted, shot off the common mark with trophies given in handicap groupings?

A: The rules do not allow for this to take place. Common mark shooting is totally different from handicap shooting which is programmed to enable shooters to compete on a more equal footing than common mark where all shooters are equal.

Q: At what age is a member considered to be a veteran and has any thought been given to introducing a super veteran for those over seventy years of age?

A: A.C.T.A. veterans are those members who have attained 65 years of age. The subject of a veterans age has been discussed many times with the existing 65 years being considered the age to be used in competition. As there are not sufficient competitors actively engaged in competition over 70 years of age no variance to the veterans age is contemplated.

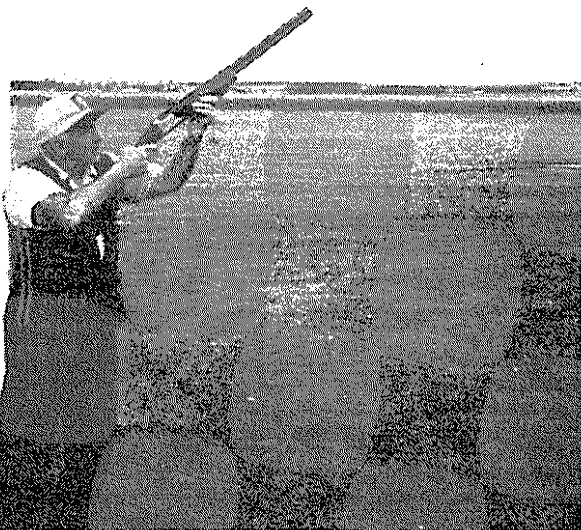

LET'S TALK ABOUT SHOOTING SKEET HERE ARE SOME TIPS ON WHAT IT'S ALL ABOUT

Skeet shooting originated in America in about 1920. It was developed to simulate and as a substitute for various types of field shooting. Today it has become as popular as trap shooting in all countries where clay target shooting is practised. It has, for some years, together with trench shooting, been a part of the Olympic Games and World Moving Target Championships.

Two forms of skeet shooting are practised in Australia, U.S.A. and New Zealand. They are known as American and International. Throughout most other countries and especially Europe, only International style is shot. International skeet only is shot at World Moving Target Championships and the Olympic Games.

International Skeet does not vary all that much from American skeet. Actually, the field layout is identical and the shooting progresses in the same way from station to station using eight stations in all. However, the targets are thrown farther — 71 yards as against 55 yards from American. Gun holding position prior to calling for target: a rule stipulates that part of stock must be touching one's hip below elbow in its normal hanging position. A three second delay or part of on the target's release after the shooters call, is another hazard. Other variations of rules and target shooting procedure like shooting doubles from stations three and five go to making International skeet more difficult and certainly an interesting challenge.

SELECTION OF YOUR SKEET GUN

There are available several different styles of guns suitable for skeet shooting such as the double barrel side by side. This type of gun usually comes with two triggers. Each barrel is differently choked, the right or first barrel to be fired is usually more open than the left.

The automatic is now manufactured by quite a few gun manufacturers throughout the world. Most of them are gas operated, making this type of gun more pleasant to fire due to less recoil effect.

The automatic's single barrel and single trigger make it a very easy pointing gun at clay targets. The only problem

is that the fired shell is automatically pitched out after firing and has to be picked up from the ground if we want them for reloading.

Autos have become much more trouble-free in recent years, even with some of the not-so-well resized reloaded shells. Autos are more often seen on the skeet field than at trap. The gas operated auto has a lot going for it as far as the lady shooter is concerned because it is softer to shoot and it points nice and easy. However, it must be fitted properly for the user. Cost of the auto is considerably less than the under and over gun.

By far the most popular gun over the past 20 years has been the under and over for both skeet and trap shooting in Australia.

As I have said earlier, the under and over shotgun is used by possibly more than 95% of all Australian trap and skeet shooters, mainly for its reliability, balance and ease of gun pointing. Names like Browning, Perazzi, Beretta, Miroku, Franchi and Winchester seem to dominate the trap and skeet grounds throughout Australia. They all do a first class job.

A great many skeet guns come from the manufacturer with a stock that has too much bend down — or in other words, too much drop at the comb. This problem will result in poor scoring due to your shooting eye being below the rib level when your cheek is resting on the comb. If you suspect that you have this problem, have your gun stock checked out by a competent person.

FUNDAMENTALS OF SKEET SHOOTING

Regardless of whether you shoot trap or skeet, the basic technique remains the same:

- Learn the fundamentals involved
 - Learn how to apply them
 - Learn how to practise them always, at all times.
1. Proper gun fit
 2. Correct gun mounting.
 3. Body and gun control.
 4. Good stance position.
 5. Gun and target relationship (sight picture).
 6. Watch for the target leaving the trap. See it bright and clear.
 7. Lead the target, fire and follow through.
 8. Select a good gun hold position relative to the trap house.
 9. Learn to concentrate.
 10. Shoot one target at a time and NEVER EVER think about the one you just missed, or how many more you have to shoot.

TECHNIQUES OF SKEET SHOOTING

Often we see shooters "fall into a hole" on a particular target, then go from bad to worse in an attempt to get back their form. They actually get to a stage where the target is lost before they even shoot at it — it does, in fact become a monster.

When this problem crops up we need to go back and have a look at the basic principle of skeet shooting.

We must be sure of our correct stance in relation to the position of gun holding and the spot where we wish to break the target. And if we are watching closely for the target to appear, this is done by focusing our eyes in the area around the trap opening, then our chances of breaking the target are very much better.

Remember, look hard for the target and continue to watch it until your gun catches up to and passes to establish lead and trigger let-off.

On stations 2, 6 and 8 it becomes necessary to use the left hand more in order to help in putting the barrels in line with the fast-flying target. It also helps in accurate pointing and establishing proper lead.

Position of the left hand on fore-end is vital. It should not be extended too far out. Best position for fast and accurate pointing is a couple of inches forward of the gun's metal action.

Station six is the opposite to station two only that it leaves the trap opening at a lower level. Bear in mind that low six is climbing more than high two. This means keeping your muzzle up on the target right from the start of your swing. This is why we must always have our gun point, prior to calling, right on the line of target travel.

Left hand position on fore-end for stations low six and eight can be extended a little further out. Not only will this give you a better muzzle pulling aid, but it will also give more accuracy of point on the fast moving target going from right to left.

Check your gun mounting to see that the butt is in the correct position on your shoulder — not further out on the upper arm. If this happens your cheek becomes separated from the comb during the process of pointing at the target causing inaccurate shooting.

Poor gun mounting is often the result of incorrect gun fit. Stock too long or too short, often skeet guns have too much bend down or too much drop at comb level, a low comb will cause low shooting on most skeet targets because they are mostly still rising when shot at — especially high two, low five and six, also low eight.

I suggest working at developing your own style that will give free and easy unrestricted movement of gun and body. Watch your stance from station to station and always be in perfect balance during the entire process of shooting at the target. Stand upright with head up and bring the gun to cheek — not cheek down to gun — with feet 12 to 14 inches apart. A tall, broad-shouldered shooter will need to position his feet as wide apart as his shoulders in order to be in balance while swinging with the target.

Remember — we cannot expect to hit our target if we are not pointing where we are looking. So if your gun does not fit properly, chances are we won't be pointing right. We will also have a similar position if we are incorrectly mounting the gun.

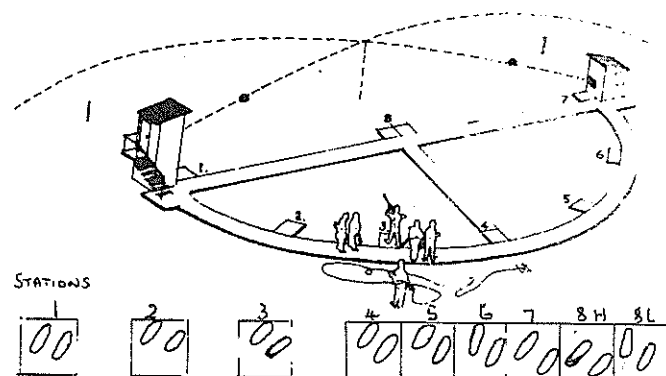
As the shot pattern leaves the muzzle it begins to lengthen. This is called stringing. Tests have shown that at 40 yards it has strung out to around 8-12 feet and is cone-shaped.

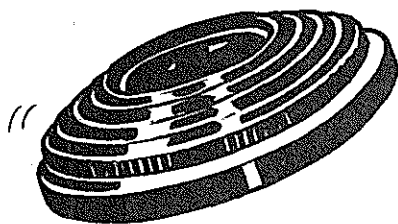
STANCE FOR SKEET

To shoot skeet successfully requires us to pay special attention to proper stance and body movement. We must remember to avoid any strained or tensed unnatural body and foot position. Not only does an unnatural position use up extra energy, it also restricts one's natural easy movements. It will cause a jerky gun swing. The proficient skeet shooter will always have a well-balanced body position from start to finish of each shot. He is, in fact, relaxed, but also alert.
