# TRAP NATIONALS QUESTIONNAIRE

Competitors in the Double Barrel Championship at the 1990 Trap Nationals were provided with a questionnaire in an attempt to obtain their opinion on various items concerning the National Championships. The results of the survey are published below to inform those who assisted in the gathering of the information of the survey and to inform others not in Tasmania as to how competitors responded to the various questions contained in the survey.

The information gathered from the Tasmanian Nationals will have been discussed by the National Executive Committee during May and a report on their findings will be printed at an early date.

- 5. Are you in favour of 100 target events? Yes 81, No 90.
- 6. Would you attend the Nationals if 100T events were intro-
- duced? Yes 113, No 58. 7. Would you prefer to shoot a National event over one day? Yes 145, No 26.
- Would you prefer to shoot a National event over two days? Yes 23, No 148.
- 9. Would you prefer to do away with graded events? Yes 48, No 123.

#### Comments . . . Majority agreed on:

- A National Ground in the Eastern States area.
- Review and improvement required in relation to the current handicap system.
- Majority feel that to do away with graded events is to do away with the average shooter.
- Nationals should be held at more centralised locations.

# LADIES SKEET BREAK RECORD

Wagga Gun Club member Maree Rooke shot what is believed to be an Australian Ladies record at the recent Victorian Clay Target Association State Championships.

Shooting at the Melbourne Gun Club, Maree recorded a 20-target break on Saturday plus an additional 12 targets in the shoot-off. On Sunday 15th April Maree broke 100 targets in the State Skeet Championship plus an additional 8 targets in the shoot-off for the State title to finish with a skeet break totalling 140. Congratulations Maree on an outstanding effort.

# THE TOM GLENN CUP

A small group of 12 Australians attended the New Zealand National Championships conducted at the Belfast Gun Club in Christchurch from the 10th to 16th March. The smaller than average number was perhaps because our own Nationals were only a few days away.

The Tom Glenn Cup match was set down to be shot after the NZ Single Rise, which is the equivalent of our D/B. The Glenn Cup is an annual event shot between Australia and New Zealand and it was NZ's turn to host the event.

An elimination to decide the Australian Team was conducted over the Single Rise and comprised our best six scores. There being a neat six possibles, Australia's team comprise D. Anton, M. Facer and M. Fisher (NSW), J. Murphy (Tas), M. Swale (Qld), and T. Catling (WA).

Because the NZ Single Rise shoot-off ran over until the next morning, the teams match was transferred to late afternoon on the second day. Conditions of the second day were a little unpleasant, with light steady rain all day although it was calm.

Finally the match got underway with NZ winning the toss and electing to shoot first. After their first half of the targets they had recorded a score of 59/60, which we proceeded to match.

So the tension mounted as NZ shot another 59/60 for the good total of 118/120. Australia produced another 59/60 for a tie. However as the rules of this event state that the holders of the Cup, in this case Australia, have to be defeated, we retained the Cup for another year. The next Tom Glenn Cup match will be shot in Perth, WA in 1991.

A second team event, NZ versus the other overseas countries, became a goodwill type event. The USA making up a team entitled North America and shooting against Australia and New Zealand. This was won by North America. Australia's team of J. Murphy, B. Kable, T. Catling, S. Collins, R. Godfrey and M. Facer enjoyed the friendly atmosphere of the event and again goodwill was created among everybody.

#### **INDIVIDUAL PERFORMANCES**

There were many good efforts by the Aussies during the week with always one or two in the shoot-offs.

However the shooter who wreaked havoc among the Kiwis was Mike Fisher of Sydney.  $\hfill \hfill \hf$ 

Mike won both the Points and D/Rise Championships as well as High Gun over the National events. This was a wonderful effort. Mike is a pleasure to watch shoot, as he is always correct in his approach and his timing is near perfect.

Final comment — The comradeship among the Australians was a pleasure to be part of and much fun was had by all.

# KNOW YOUR STATE COACHING DIRECTOR



#### **STUART BROWNING**

As well as being an Executive Committee Member for Tasmania, Stuart holds the position of the State's Coaching Director. He has forwarded the following article which proves most interesting.

#### **DO YOU VALUE YOUR HEARING?**

The ear is made up of three sections: The outer, the middle and the inner.

The outer ear is the part that is seen, and it opens into the ear canal. The eardrum separates the ear canal from the middle ear. There are three small bones — the hammer, anvil and stirrup located in the middle ear. These bones transfer sound. The inner ear contains the balance nerve endings in the semi-circular canals and the hearing nerve endings in the cochlea, which lead to the brain.

Sound vibrations or waves enter the outer ear and strike the eardrum, causing it to vibrate. The vibrations are then transferred from the eardrum along the hearing bones to the cochlea, which is filled with fluid. The vibrations cause the liquid to move and stimulate the tiny nerve endings. The endings are attached to make up the hearing nerve. The vibrations then become nerve impulses and go directly to the brain, where the impulses are interpreted as sound. The brain can then distinguish the kind of sound — a phone ringing, machinery in a factory, a gunshot.

If a noise is too loud, it will begin to kill the nerve endings in the inner ear. If a person experiences prolonged exposure to loud noise without hearing protection more nerve endings will be destroyed, resulting in hearing loss and ringing.

Sound is measured in two ways:

1. decibels (dB) and

2. pitch - frequency of sound vibrations per second.

The decibel scale runs from 0 dB, the faintest sound a human ear can detect, to over 180 dB, which is the intensity of sound of a rocket launch. Most hearing experts agree that continual exposure to noises of 85 dB or more, without the use of hearing protection can be damaging.

Frequency is measured in cycles per second or hertz (Hz). The higher the pitch the higher the frequency. A low pitch such as a deep voice makes fewer vibrations per second than a high voice.

Symptoms people begin to notice is ringing in the ears, a condition called Tinnitis. For some, this experience occurs after a particular noise exposure and diminishes within hours or days. Others are not so lucky and have to live with this condition 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Tinnitis is more noticeable in quiet environments. Tinnitis is permanent and cannot be corrected.

With shooters, because of a head shadow effect, one receives more noise exposure than the other. Therefore the left ear is usually worse for right handed shooters and vice versa for a left handed shooter.

For personal safety and health, protect your ears from repeated or continuous exposure to any sound above 80 decibels.

There are only two basic types of hearing protection: ear muffs and ear plugs. Both have advantages and disadvantages. Muffs tend to get in the way of head gear and sometimes cause problems when mounting the gun as they contact the comb of the stock. Plugs are more compact, more comfortable and do not interfere with head gear or gun stocks.

Hearing loss is insidious, and begins at the higher frequencies where it may not be noticed at first. But as years go on, it shows up more and more. This means that a shooter, who has the ability to hear someone loud and clear talking one to one at age thirty may well be into the progressive deterioration which means that at age forty he may have trouble sorting out what's being said in a crowded room, and at age fifty will need a hearing aid.

We have all seen older members of gun clubs who are plainly suffering from hearing loss.

# GERALDTON GUN CLUB 1990 MID-WEST GAMES REPORT

#### APRIL 21st and 22nd

The City of Geraldton hosted the 1990 Mid-West Games, with approximately 3000 competitors from 18 shires in 41 nominated sports taking part. Competitors came from all parts of the Mid-West Region, ranging from the Wiluna Shire in the north to the Coorow Shire in the south.

The Games are run along similar lines to the Olympic and Commonwealth Games with the shires, in effect representing the various countries. Competitors then compete for gold, silver and bronze medals in individual and team events depending upon the sport involved.

The Geraldton Gun Club hosted a six-event Clay Target programme over two days with shooters coming from the Northampton, Mullewa, Greenough and Geraldton Shires.

Saturday April 21st saw 18 shooters competing in the two events scheduled.

The first event was 50 Target Skeet with B. Chandler shooting 50/50 which gave him the gold medal in A Grade, D. Hilsz won gold in B Grade with 48 and G. Cammock winning gold in C Grade with 45/50.

The second event was a 50 Target Skeet Teams event, with competitors nominating their 3-man team. This was won by B. Chandler 47/50, D. Hilsz 47/50 and S. Horo 44/50 with a combined score of 138/150 which gave them all a gold medal. The silver was won by the team consisting of D. Wellington, R. Burton and G. Cammock with a combined score of 126/150 and the bronze went to G. Kelly, E. Daw and P. Stuart with 120/150 after a shoot-off with L. Watson, G. Wulff and F. Bombara.

Sunday April 22nd saw 27 shooters competing in the four events scheduled.

The third event was 25 Target Single Barrel with gold in A Grade going to B. Boschetti with 20/25, gold in B Grade to G. Kelly with 21/25 and gold in C Grade to G. Cammock 23/25.

The fourth event was 25 Target Double Barrel Points with S. Horo winning gold in A Grade with 73/75, G. Kelly with gold in B Grade with 72/75 and G. Cammock with gold in C Grade with 67/75.

The fifth event was 25 Target Double Barrel with M. Watson 23/25 gaining gold in A Grade, T. Harris 25/25 and N. Milligan 21/25 getting gold in B and C Grades respectively.

The final event was 10 Pair Double Rise with B. Boschetti getting gold in A Grade with 16/20, J. Griffiths 15/20 and V. Oliveri 10/20 getting gold in B and C Grades respectively.

The Skeet High Gun sash was won by B. Chandler with 97/100 who found himself elevated to AA (not Alcoholics Anonymous) for his efforts and runner-up in this section was D. Hilsz with 95/100.

The Trap High Gun sash was won by G. Kelly 125/145 after a shoot-off with T. Harris, both from B Grade.

The Overall High Gun sash for the two days was won by A Grade's S. Horo with 211/245 and runner-up was J. Griffiths with 210/245 in B Grade.

Other notable performances and statistics from the shoot were those of Gordon Cammock who won a medal in every event, he ended up with three gold, two silver and one bronze.

Bert Boschetti nominated for four events and won a medal in each of them, ending up with two gold, one silver and one bronze.

Steve Horo showed you did not have to win all events to win the Overall Sash, ending up with two gold and one silver.

The same could be said of John Griffiths who only won one gold and one silver in B Grade.

Vince Oliveri improved all day — gaining a bronze in the fourth, a silver in the fifth, a gold in the last event after a shoot-off with G. Cammock.

Overall the shooting was closely contested, with little separating a gold to a bronze in each grade.

Medals for events held on Sunday were presented to shooters by Deonne Bridger who is the Australian Junior Target and Field Archery Champion.

# **1990 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS**

After an absence of some 15 years the Trap Nationals returned to the Tasmanian Gun Club at Evandale and while not as well attended so far as mainland shooters were concerned they certainly gained support from the registered shooters in Tasmania. Commencing under difficulties with the absence of State Secretary, Kaye Woods due to illness, the Nationals were very well conducted by TCTA officials. With a hard working and efficient Office Manager in Molly Bryan, their fears of maybe not having the experience to conduct a National Championships were quickly dispelled and to their credit the happenings that take place behind the scenes were attended to with the utmost efficiency. One of the more pleasing aspects which highlighted the Tasmanian commitment was the appearance of Kaye during the Nationals "just after some time in hospital, just to make sure that everything was going okay" — it was.

The opening ceremony which involved all State Shoulder to Shoulder teams was most impressive with all teams marching to take up their position under their respective State flags to the accompaniment of a Scottish piper. Opening the Tasmanian Nationals the State Premier, The Hon. Michael Field, commented on the pride that Tasmania does take in hosting major sporting events, none more than our own clay target championships. Under the guidance of National Executive member and State Coaching Director Stuart Browning, the Premier fired the opening shot of the championships and while not successful in breaking the target the Premier was obviously enjoying the break from the rigours of parliamentary duties.

Cameras came from everywhere to record the winning team whose members included the well known and very experienced Sperry Marshall to the junior member of the team Royden Swan. Possibly another first for Tasmania was the inclusion in the team of their two National Executive Committee members, John Murphy and Stuart Browning. Not left out was Michael Burling whose score of 25/25 made him an outstanding contributor to an outstanding win for Tasmania, Well done Tasmania and all States for the sporting manner in which the Shoulder to Shoulder match was competed.

The first national title of the championships is the handicap which traditionally produces some surprise results. With a field of 313 including shooters from New Zealand, Singapore and America the title event was full of interest right through to the last shot fired which produced a new national champion, this time from the Northern Territory club at Ayers Rock with John Warren a very proud and excited winner with his score of 86/86 from the 16m mark. To win John had to outstay some good shots and finally did this when well known Victorian Tony Bradshaw missed his 86th target from 20 metres. Another very pleased winner was Wonthaggi's Lyn Gray whose score of 55/58 from the 14-metre mark won the ladies section. NSW junior Jason Gilkes also showed his liking for handicap shooting, taking out the junior section from 16 metres with a very well shot 55/56. A popular win in the veterans to 19-metre shooter Kevin Aylett from Devonport, Tasmania who is a strong supporter of the nationals wherever they are held.
