Much work was done leading up to and including these meetings. We had a very relaxed and friendly meeting and I thank all those people who attended for their effort. I-believe we are at last working as a team for the good of Clay Target Shooting.

Firstly, I would like to thank Jack Matthey, Victoria, Paul Weis, NT, Richard Brook and Neil Hardy, Qld., on your behalf for their services while on the National Executive. I welcome the new members who have replaced the above people onto the Executive, Glen Woodhatch, Phil Grove, Noel Deeley and Robert Nugent.

Twenty recommendations from the Sub-Committees were put before the Executive. All but one were approved. A report of these and other matters can be seen elsewhere in the CTSN.

The matter of the re-appointment of Colin Burt as NCD was first on the Agenda. This was fully discussed. The vote was taken by a show of hands and was defeated. The only Executive members who voted for his re-appointment were those from the two States which had instructed them to do so. The Executive have appointed an ex-Army man, Lt. Col. Mr Guy Boileau. I welcome Guy to the ACTA. You can take it from me coaching will continue to grow and flourish under the guidance of this gentleman.

On Friday morning the Executive met for a few hours. Our Solicitor, Mr John Isaac, from Molomby & Molomby, came along and spoke to us about our new Constitution. Some minor changes may have to be made before a copy can be sent to all State Presidents for their comments and input. Then a meeting with all State Presidents will be held before a final draft is drawn up for our next AGM.

Following this meeting we all travelled to Mount Waverley to inspect our premises and met our hard working girls in the office. I understand, from the reaction I have received from the Executive, the trip was well worthwhile and appreciated by all.

The National Double Barrel Championship, to be held in Perth next year, will be conducted over 100 targets, to be shot on one day. We hope to hear your reaction to this event while at Perth. Starting next year there will be a Women's and Junior threemember Shoulder-to-Shoulder Interstate Teams Match to be shot at the DTL and Skeet Nationals.

Don't forget the World Championships to be held in Perth next year. Starting with the Grand Prix on the 2nd-4th November; Trench 7th-9th; Skeet 10th-12th; presentations 12th; finishing up with the doubles on the 13th. A Women's and Junior team will be included in these championships. We are still asking, and are hopeful, of obtaining funds to assist these people.

A draft of two separate Handicap Rules have been referred back to the State Associations for their consideration. Replies by the 31st October please.

The matter of a National Shooting Ground in the Eastern States is again on the minds of the Executive. State Associations have been asked to recommend a suitable location.

You will be pleased to know we will be shortly purchasing a computer, desktop publishing etc. Not only will this increase our office efficiency, but will go a long way toward reducing our CTSN production costs.

A development plan put forward by Bob Fox was discussed at length. With Bob's plan, together with assistance from others, it is planned by this time next year that we will come up with a proposal which will improve the overall management of the ACTA. This will be more efficient and give shooters the opportunity to have more input.

The proposal to have a five-member Shoulder-to-Shoulder International Team Match to compete against the Mackintosh countries is now before the respective countries.

A new two-year agreement between our major sponsor, Winchester, and the ACTA has been reached. I am confident it will be of great benefit to us all. This agreement includes all three disciplines. I sincerely thank Winchester on your behalf, for their wonderful support of Clay Target Shooting.

The ISU elimination shoot has just concluded at Melbourne Gun Club. I thank the Committee of Melbourne Gun Club for the use of their grounds. There are a number of new faces in the six-man team for the World Championships to be held in Moscow. Congratulations to the team members and we all wish you the best of luck for these most important championships.

Don't forget the Skeet Nationals to be held at Townsville commencing Thursday 20th September, 1990. I look forward to seeing as many skeet shooters as possible. Northern Queensland is a wonderful place to spend a few days holiday. I can recommend it.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES



Firstly, I am pleased to advise that Guy Boileau has joined the Association in the capacity of Director of Coaching operating from the National Office. Guy has had considerable and varied experience ranging from his 28 years service as an officer in the Australian Army to his more recent experience in youth development and research positions.

The responsibilities of the Director of Coaching will be to ensure that the standard of coaching currently available to the sport is maintained and improved through the National Coaching Council, which is the body resonsible for implementing the ACTA Coaching Program in all States through State appointed Coaching Directors.

Particular emphasis will be placed on the development of the sport and again this is an area that relies heavily on contributions from State Coaching Directors. I do not foresee that the Director of Coaching will be involved in direct coaching as the Executive now sees a need for an administrator to service the sport in conjunction with the National Coaching Council.

Once Guy has settled into his new position all State Coaching Directors will be brought together at a seminar which is partially funded by the Australian Sports Commission. This will enable him and the State Coaching Directors to establish goals and objectives for coaches at all levels as they attend to their very important roles. The values of coaches from club level through the zones to the State Coaching Director is often an under appreciated area in this (and other) sports, hopefully with the concentrated effort of the Director of Coaching this will eventually be reversed.

The duty statement for the Director of Coaching appointment will require Guy to be involved in the National Office administration where his administrative abilities should soon prove to be an asset to the Association. On your behalf I wish him well in his new role and have assured him that he will receive the support of our members on whose behalf he is working.

While on administrative matters I would direct you to the section of this month's CTSN which relates to matters arising from the series of National Meetings held in mid-May. The meetings commenced, for those who were involved with the first meeting on Tuesday 8th May, finishing on Saturday 12th May with a full day's meeting of the National Executive Committee.

Many matters were discussed and decisions taken that will reflect on the sport in the years ahead, an often spoken message that is worth repeating, not all will be pleased with decisions made and in some instances possibly some not made however without exception all decisions were taken in the best interest of the sport and its members. The Melbourne Gun Club hosted the elimination for the World Sporting Championships which certainly produced some interesting results when 1990 Commonwealth Games Team Members failed to make the team in both Olympic Trap and Skeet.

This shows that there is some depth in talent as the trap team contains two members who are still eligible to compete internationally at junior level. Only one member of the skeet team from the 1989 World Championship Team will be competing in Moscow with Ian Hale not eligible for the eliminations. Final scores were:

Owing to the stringent conditions that are applied by the Australian Olympic Federation, the only fully funded member of the teams is Michael Diamond, other team members will be required to meet their own costs with a \$1000 contribution to each by the ACTA. Funding had been approved by the AOF for both R. Mark and J. Maxwell, however as neither shooter made the team the funds are not able to be allocated elsewhere. On behalf of the sport we thank particularly the Melbourne Gun Club for the use of their excellent facilities which continue to reflect credit on the club and its members. Commiserations to those whose efforts over the 300T of the eliminations did not quite produce the result that they would have wished.

The World Shooting Championships in Moscow will possibly be the most important Championships that our shooters have ever competed in for they will be used to gauge Shooting's participation at the 1992 Olympic Games. Funding is no longer the province of the Australian Sports Commission so far as team assistance is concerned, this responsibility has been given to the Australian Olympic Federation who will provide assistance for those who are considered capable of making the last 16 at the Olympic Games. In short no longer will funds be available to gain experience, athletes must be capable of showing they have the ability before they will be considered for funding assistance. One only hopes that we are not entering into a period where those with private means will be able to afford to enhance their opportunities and those who may be of superior skills without private means cannot.

The Australian Shooting Association is well aware of the problems facing the sport over all shooting disciplines and must do all in their power to ensure that when athletes are being considered for assistance at whatever level, those participating in the shooting sports are not overlooked or disadvantaged in any way. A points system has been arrived at which will ensure that all shooters are treated equally within the overall sport, this system effectively commences at the World Shooting Championships and is explained elsewhere in the CTSN. If you are an interested and active shooter in the ISU Disciplines, please make certain that you read and understand the procedures that do apply so far as the ultimate goal of Olympic selection is concerned.

Planning for our own World Championships is well underway with a visit by the UIT Technical Adviser, Mr Gary Anderson of the USA, set down for late November/early December of this year. In addition it is believed that Mr Horst Schreiber, Secretary General of the UIT will also be in Australia as part of the Melbourne Olympic Committee's bid for the 1996 Olympic Games, this being so an inspection of the Whiteman Park Shooting Complex in WA will be on the agenda.

During the World Championships in Moscow the opportunity has been given to us to meet with the UIT Technical Committee to discuss Australia's preparation for 1990. This meeting will be attended so far as representation is concerned by Peter Quire, 1990 World Shooting Team Manager for all Disciplines and Robert Smith, Shotgun Team Manager. In addition as part of the UIT requirement I will be addressing a meeting of the UIT General Assembly in Moscow at the time of the World Championships and will also participate in discussions with the Technical Committees of the UIT. The WA State Government and the Australian Sports Commission are funding the visit to address the UIT General Assembly which I will be doing not on behalf of the ACTA but on behalf of Australia which is the host country in 1990. The commitment given shooting in particular shotgun shooting, by both the Australian Sports Commission and the WA State Government must not be underestimated. We in turn must ensure that our parts are played to their fullest capacity and in this regard Peter Quire representing the World Championships Committee, myself as Vice President of the Australian Shooting Association and Secretary General of the 1990 Shooting Championships together with the assistance of Robert Smith, Chairman of the National Shooting Committee look forward to the discussions that will take place with the UIT during August.

The Skeet Nationals will shortly be with us and if the front cover of this CTSN is a true example of the Townsville Gun Club then all who have indicated their intention to compete in September have something to look forward to. Club President Tom Comerford with his willing assistants and the assistance of Bev Grice, a very capable secretary of the QCTA, have promised a most enjoyable Skeet Championships, all that is needed is for you to compete.

Dates for the next three Nationals have been set as follows: SKEET: September 20th-23rd, Townsville Gun Club, Qld. O.D.: January-February, State Shooting Park, Virginia, SA. TRAP: April 6th-11th, Whiteman Park Shooting Complex, WA.

The Olympic Discipline Nationals will be shot in conjunction with the Oceanic Championships which will provide Olympic Quotas for all shooting disciplines for the region. So far as shotgun is concerned there are two quotas available in both Olympic Trap and Skeet. Last time the Championships were held Australia won all four quotas although unfortunately one had to be returned owing to lack of funding by the Australian Olympic Federation.

Congratulations to President Jim Scott (NSW) and Vice President Ross Silvester (WA) on their being re-elected unopposed by the members of the National Executive Committee. When congratulating Pud Burgess (NSW) and Box Fox (NT) on their election to the National Management Committee I must also say farewell and

ELEY NEWTON THOMAS AWARD

Nominations for the 1989 Eley Newton Thomas Award have been before the judging panel for consideration using the established criteria of: "For the person who has done the most to promote Clay Target Shooting in the previous twelve months".

The Eley Newton Thomas Award is to be received by Mr Mike Fisher from the New South Wales Gun Club for his work on behalf of the ACTA to produce a computer program for the running of National Championships. The program will be used in 1991 at the Perth Trap Nationals following which it will be made available to those Clubs and State Associations who wish to computerise their shooting events.

As Mike has left Australia for his home in Dallas, Texas, the Eley Newton Thomas Award will not be able to be presented to him in person which would have given the Association the opportunity to publicly applaud his efforts on behalf of the sport of Clay Target Shooting.

We wish Mike well for the future and assure him that where clay targets are being thrown in Australia he is most welcome.

In anticipation of this being so please forward a badge to: ACTA, PO Box 557, Mt Waverley, Vic. 3149. thank you to Neil Hardy (Qld) who has retired from the National Executive Committee after a valuable and often underestimated 11 years of service to the Association.

Two new members were appointed to the Executive from Queensland, Robert Nugent from Roma and well known Noel Deeley from Gemfields replacing Neil Hardy and Richard Brook from Goondiwindi who had also contributed greatly to the Association during his term on the National Executive. From NT, Phil Grove was welcomed by the President as was Glen Woodhatch, President of the VCTA who was attending his first National Meeting.

One major decision arsing from the meetings of the National Executive was the one to renew the sponsorship agreement with Winchester which had been in operation for the last three years. With their move to become Clay Target suppliers no one will be surprised to read that part of the sponsorship involves some usage of targets available through Winchester. This was not as difficult as one may first think as Winchester have no wish to enforce their products on the sport, in turn they have indicated their desire to have continued opposition in all areas they participate in.

In this regard it is intended that for 1990 targets for the Skeet Championships will be Olimpyc Targets as will targets for the Olympic Discipline Championships in 1991 with targets for the 1991 Perth Trap Nationals obtained from Winchester.

Winchester's support of the Association over the last three years has been magnificent and with the new agreement even more support is given to Clay Target Shooting as all three disciplines will be sharing in the sponsorship which amounts to approximately \$40,000 per year over the next two years.

With this form of support our National Championships are at possibly their highest ever level so far as trophies are concerned. We certainly trust that those who are supporting target shooting are in turn supported by Clay Target Shooters.

OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE:

Team events at National ISU Championships shall be determined over the first 150T of the National Championships.

OCEANIA CHAMPIONSHIPS (Held in conjunction with the 1991 National Olympic Discipline Championships):

Ladies and Junior Teams will participate in the Oceania Championships. Teams to be selected from scores achieved over 75T Badge Match plus first 200T of National Championship Program in both Trap and Skeet.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS (1991):

- (A) Ladies and Junior Teams in both Trap and Skeet will be included in the 1991 World Championships.
- (B) Ladies and Junior Teams will be self determined by scores achieved individually over the 400T of the 1991 National Discipline Championships.

NOTE:

- The decision to have teams determined over 400T (first past (i) the post) for both Ladies and Junior Teams is based upon established precedent for previous Junior Team Selections.
- (ii) The decision is not in conflict with the open team selection procedure which takes into account the funding and athletes approval system operating under the control of the Australian Olympic Federation for all International events up to and including Olympic Games.

NATIONAL TRAINING SOUAD:

Any member of the National Training Squad winning individual gold-silver-bronze at any full World Shooting Championships, Olympic or Commonwealth Games shall gain automatic entry into the following year's National Training Squad, being included in the order of qualification (if applicable) or as an additional member of the Squad providing that he/she has participated in the program that determines the composition of the National Training Squad.

NATIONAL ALLOCATIONS (Subject to Grounds):

- 1992 Skeet Western Australia
- 1993 Skeet New South Wales
- 1993 Olympic Discipline New South Wales
- 1994 DTL Victoria

GENERAL:

- (1) The introduction of 28gr loads for all disciplines as from 1.1.92 was put to the Executive as a recommendation arising from the National Shooting Committee - The Recommendation was not approved.
- Draft Rules for a completely revised handicap rule were pre-(2)sented from NSW and Victoria with the decision to refer both drafts to:
 - (A) Members of the National Executive Committee
 - (B)State Associations
 - National Referees Association (C)
 - (D) State Rules Supervisors

Should a clear consensus not be obtained for either of the two draft rules or alternatively the retention of the existing handicap rule by 31st October the matter will be determined by the National Executive Committee and become effective as at 1st January 1991.

PLEASE NOTE:

As the handicap review is being undertaken at various levels of the sport please contact your State Association or State Rules Supervisor if you require details on what is being proposed.

(3) Arising from the Trap Nationals questionnaire the matter of a National Shooting Ground has been referred to State Associations together with a request for recommendations on areas in New South Wales and Victoria that may be suitable with the proviso that they must be able to carry a minimum of 20 DTL Grounds.

(4) REGISTRATIONS 1991

Following the recommendation from the 1990 Annual General Meeting, registrations for 1991 have been kept within the CPI with the following fees to apply:

Full Member	\$43
Second Family Member	\$27
Veteran (under 65)	\$27
30 years long service member (under 65)	\$27
Junior (under 18)	\$10

IUNIOR MEMBERSHIP (5)

The decision was taken to raise the junior age level for registration to 18 years. This will become effective as at 1st January 1991 for all juniors who at the date of registration are under the age of 18 years. The date of registration being the date upon which registration is processed by the issue of a current handicap card.

(6) TROPHY VALUES/NOMINATIONS RULES (3.18) (3.22) (3.23) (7.8)

Following the Annual Review of the above rules, no changes will take place for 1991.

ACTA PRESIDENTIAL MEDAL 1990

Note: The receipt of any nomination does not necessarily relate to the awarding of a Presidential Medal.

Nominations received will be placed before the Management Committee for their consideration and decision.

OLYMPIC GAMES SELECTION SYSTEM

The purpose of this system which is an agreed document between the Australian Shooting Association and the Australian Olympic Federation is designed to be both simple and fair, with the basic guidelines being Rule 29 of the Olympic Charter, which states:

"National Olympic Committees are reminded that, while the Olympic Games welcomes the youth of the world, it is physically impossible to accommodate all of the youth of the world and they are asked to use discretion and send to the Games only competitors adequately prepared for high level International Competitions."

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for consideration of recommendation by the ASA to the AOF an athlete must:

- 1. Shoot the appropriate Minimum Qualifying Score (MQS) at the appropriate International Competitions, and
- 2. Score points under the ASA Ranking System as detailed in Appendix A (see below), and
- On the basis of performance in recent International Competition, be likely to finish higly placed in the next Olympic Games, and
- Demonstrate a satisfactory standard of physical fitness, which must be maintained.

ATHLETES

The basis of ASA recommendation to the AOF shall be that athletes will be recommended on the basis that:

- 1. They have met the athelete eligibility criteria, and
- 2. They are likely to finish in the top 18, and
- 3. Australia has an Olympic Quota place or "Wild Card" in the event.

TEAM CHANGES

All athletes and officials should clearly understand that they are liable to have their membership of the Team terminated at any time by the AOF for breaches of the AOF's Doping Policy, the AOF's Competitor's and Official's Agreements, discipline or misbehaviour; illness, injury or other medical reasons; loss of form, team unsuitability or reassessment for any reason whatsoever.

Any such athlete or official may be replaced.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF TEAM

It is the sole perogative of the AOF to announce and make public the names of Athletes and Officials chosen under this system.

APPENDIX A — OLYMPIC SELECTION RANKING SYSTEM

(As mentioned above.)

1. This system is based on points gained as a result of participation in Major World Championships, in the World Shotgun Championships, and in the World Cups of the UIT, with a competitor finishing in 1st to 16th place.

First place 16 points, sixteenth place 1 point.

- 2. Major World Championships have a multiplying factor of 2.
- 3. The qualification period covers the duration of the UIT competitions offering Quota places. However, it is expected that the period would be completed prior to the 31st December of the year preceding the Games.
- 4. Points achieved as per 1 and 2 above will be aggregated across the three best results achieved in the period as defined in 3 above.
- 5. A constantly upgraded Ranking List to be maintained and published by the ASA after each World Championship or World Cup in which ASA representatives participate.

CHAMPIONS OF OUR SPORT ... part 1 Past and Present

By George Biggs, ACTA Historian **DONALD MACKINTOSH** — World Champion Australian Shooter and founder of our sport

Well before those of us who are shooting today were born, Donald Mackintosh was making a name for Australia on European shooting grounds and at the leading gun clubs of England in the 1890s.

The following stories are personal sketches by Donald Mackintosh and unnamed Australian journalists of that time and were published in leading Melbourne daily newspapers and magazines.

I am indebted to Mr John Green, photographer, of Cressy, Tasmania for the old Donald Mackintosh catalogue No. 9 printed in the early 1920s. At this time one could buy a new "Purdey" hammerless shotgun for around £165 or \$350 in today's money.

One episode remains fresh in Mac's memory of an outing he had with the renowned American wing shot, Dr Carver, in Yarrawonga district, when the cracks were out after snipe and any other attractive live targets offering. Mac winged a galah, and Carver chased down a beautiful young swan. As the doctor was anxious to take away to his American home something purely Australian, they exchanged birds, and the great record holder ever afterwards cherished that galah as a domestic pet. He told "Mac" when the two sports met in Monte Carlo many years later that it was still living and flourishing in its Kentucky home — and talking like a bullock driver. As for the swan — that also still survives.



From The Gun, Notes by G.H.T.

In the early years of the present century, while Donald Mackintosh was emblazoning the name of Australia in Monte Carlo by his remarkable ability as a trap-shot, Jack Sutherland, a youngster in the Gippsland district, was an ardent user of the scatter gun in the field. His dreams of attaining to the prowess of the champion Donald were treasured thoughts, but his remote existence in a little country village presented no scope for him to have a "try out". His great change came, however, when at the age of 16 he was given permission to attend the local gun club shoot to compete in a programme of sweeps. He appeared on the grounds with an old 50/- gun, and home-filled "black powder" cartridges. The result of his shooting - something like two out of three birds satisfied him that he would do better on his next try. As time went on he obtained a better gun and smokeless cartridges. Almost from the outset of his career his form marked him down as a shot out of the ordinary, until at the present time he is well-known throughout the length and breadth of Australia as the champion "Calrossie" — winner of 27 important title matches.

When he left these shores in November last to take part in the fashionable Monte Carlo shooting carnival, his brother sports in the shooting world confidently predicted that he would emulate the skill and sportsmanship of the veteran Mackintosh, who lived for 10 years in Monaco. During his sojourn there Mackintosh won the Grand Prix de Monaco (the coveted prize of the meeting each year, on one occasion), and in his last season (1908) was successful in obtaining the highest aggregate. As a tribute to the sportsmanship of the veteran, the International Sporting Club de Monaco each year includes in its programme a 10,000 francs match, known as the "Prix Mackintosh".

The present Monte Carlo meeting opened on January 6, with the Prix d'Ouverture. "Calrossie" got on the job early, with a 10-break, which gave him an outright win for the 2500 francs prize, in addition to a 50 per cent division from the entry money. He followed up this win on the next day by winning outright the Prix de Saint Hubert, which was worth a similar amount in prize money. His score on the second day was five straight. The events for this week include four matches of 10,000 francs each, and the Prix Francois Blanc, for 20,000 francs, and Medaille d'Or (gold medal). Although he has been seen in action on only the two occasions, he is already named as the most probable winner of the Grand Prix and is a warm favourite.

C.B. Meadway, another Melbourne Gun Club shooter in Monte Carlo, also competed in the events, but he missed his second bird in the first and his fifth bird in the second. This is Meadway's third successive year at these matches. On his previous visits he has held his own against the large fields that compete, and has managed to collect sufficient prize money to clear his full expenses.

About 1936 — Trap-Shooting by Donald Mackintosh CLAY TARGET CLUB

The Victorian Clay Target Club fired its first shot last week at Bentleigh in a five-acre field, near Bentleigh railway station, the property of Mr T. Cormick, who generously placed it at the club's disposal, and the club fittingly made him a life member. The site, facing west with a perfect background of landscape for miles, is ideal for a gun club.

Here in the very shadow of the old Melbourne Gun Club's grounds, this new club has started just about a half century since the old club fired its first shot. The Melbourne Gun Club sent marksmen abroad and upheld the prestige of the shotgun against the finest shots, until Australia's name is a household word on any shooting ground the world over. My earliest recollections were in the early nineties when many wealthy city men, young squatters, eminent city businessmen, and men of letters met to try conclusions here with the gun. J.L. Purves, the leader of the Bar, the president, made the club one of the most genial for real sport and humour the world over, while the late Sir Rupert Clarke, their patron, endowed it with many fine prizes. On two occasions a £1000 handicap event was held with success, and a massive silver challenge cup stood for years, the envy of all crack shots to have their names inscribed on it.

As I have visited many gun clubs in Europe, it is very natural that I should draw comparisons, and when I see 50 shooters for this inaugural meeting I consider it the finest I have ever seen. Besides the competitors, their families came along to see them take part, and made the day, what all sport should be, a happy social gathering.

The club is equipped with the very latest automatic trap, which automatically selects the angle flight of every target thrown. This target is similar to an ordinary saucer in shape, being 4in. in diameter, and being made from a composition of clay and pitch, which breaks readily when struck with a few pellets.

Most brilliant shooting was shown by the ex-president of Nobel's Clay Target Club, Mr B. Anquetil; Mr H.G. James, president of Nobels; and also Donald Corbett, winner of the handsome foundation cup; E. Tricks, G. Vypond, J. White, C. Corbett, "Calrossie", and D. Mackintosh.

Councillor C.T. Butters, president of Moorabbin Shire, declared the ground open, and D. Mackintosh fired the first shot.

The president (Mr Lew Bertram) presented the prizes, and he and the honorary secretary (Mr G. Townsend) made everybody welcome.

* * *

CHALLENGE CUPS

A few reminiscences of these three Final Challenge Cup Competitions below will interest shooting men.

A few little incidents entering into the humour of these competitions will interest my young shooting friends today. I had many friendly battles before winning the Melbourne Challenge Cup, being the holder on ten occasions. When the final stage was reached it resulted in a tie, and the late J.L. Purves, QC (who had himself held it five times) remarked: "Oh, why bother coming back for your cartridges every shot. Take your magazine out, you will kill them 'till the cows come home.'' (Score 61 out of 64.)

A cup was shot for in Paris in the famous Bois de Bologne. On each of the three competitions a different nationality tied namely, H. Journer (France), Edgar Murphy (America) and Marquis de Villavisiocia (Spain). Like the old Melbourne Gun Club, jokes went round, and an American wag, noticing my earnestness to win, began to pile up various things, such as coats, empty cartridge boxes, &c., under the cushion of the big deck chair I sat in until it was heaped to the arm rests. I sat on the chair as if feather-coated, much to the amusement of my wag friend and his followers, who, after the victory, gave me a hearty handshake and a hearty laff. Score (50 straight), 30 yards.

The English Challenge Cup was shot for on the Gun Club's grounds at Wormwood Scrubs, London, under International champion conditions, £25 each, and attracted entries from over a dozen nationalities, including America.

Unlike other clubs, no barracking entered the game, and it is still dreadfully fresh in my memory going out on the mark in dead silence, 24 times in a tie with Mr Vernon Barker (then Champion of the Gun Club, England). On the previous Saturday, I had a similar experience with the same man. When nearing the final, in dead silence, our footsteps on the asphalt being the only sound. I overheard an old veteran remark, "Vernon will beat this man." Colonel Ned Hopwood replied in most dignified tones, "Oh, no, there is no certainty; this man shot him to a standstill last week." On nearing the final Mr B. suggested tossing a coin, and on my decision to keep on he had a good old brandy and missed the easiest bird in the whole three competitions. Score 60-62, off 30 yards.

Now, as an older and perhaps a wiser man I will say, in the words of the Hon. R. Beresford, these were stirring times, but, after all, was it really worthwhile — Give me a day in the field at snipe, where I first learned how easy it was to miss.

Australia was represented by the greatest marksman of them all - Mackintosh by name.

This paragraph appears in the book called "Beresford's Monte Carlo", published recently by the Hon. S.R. Beresford, who was a competitor for 25 years, and winner of many championships.

"The Jockey", Paris, in a long and interesting discourse on

shooting, winds up by contrasting the performances of the world's famous shots who have contested at Monte Carlo as follows:

"Mr Mackintosh's performances at Monte Carlo, together with his records made in England and Australia, are such that, in a word, we declare him the Champion of the World".

A Gold Medal was presented to Mr Mackintosh on making the unique score of 100 consecutive breaks at clay targets, at his home town, in aid of the Local Hall.

*

CLAY BIRD SHOOTING

Clay bird shooting is popular in England, Scotland, and America. In the latter country they shoot at targets more easily broken than the English clay bird, and also shoot, as a rule, from 15 to 18 yards (limit 24).

Although not so difficult to score on as live birds, it requires some skill and a good gun to score on them when over 20 yards, and one who thinks he could not miss one, let him have a try.

In big races, as they term it in America, it takes a score of almost 98 per cent to 100 per cent to win in very best company. Personally, I think they afford real, good, inexpensive practice, for I used one of these traps 25 years ago, and we will be happy to assist any sportsman interested in this fascinating pastime, and advise him on the conditions, club rules, gun, and cartridges with which he should be equipped to succeed. This will be our pleasure.

CHAMPIONS OF OUR SPORT . . . part 2

I am very grateful for the many letters, phone calls and personal talks I have with shooters and friends who have a great interest in the history of our game of clay target shooting worldwide. One such person is Jack McCraith who actually commenced shooting clay targets the very same day when we joined up at the old Coburg Gun Club located on the banks of the Merri Creek in Faulkner. The Coburg club later moved out to Epping to become the Metropolitan Gun Club.

Jack McCraith does not shoot a great deal these days but he still maintains a keen interest in the happenings of our sport. The following letter from Jack, relates his experiences at the 1989 Masters Games in Adelaide — it just goes to show you can be lucky.

George,

On my recent trip to Adelaide for the Veteran Games I shot at 50 targets twice a week for some four weeks and thought I had a good chance of obtaining a gold, silver or bronze medal in the over 70 years class. But I was disappointed to be in a squad that talked all the time, I asked if I could get into another squad, this could not happen until the following day. So Aimee and I decided to go to the Casino and have lunch along with a small gamble. She played one game of Keno and took 10 out of 10 numbers with a list of 80 numbers of which she got them. The odd of her winning that was 5,500,000 to I as they play 300 games a day with 1500 tickets each game. It was three years since it was last won. The prize was \$486,000 which turned out better than a medal.

Back to the Games, the running of the shooting was to perfection. With over 400 entries it was the most spectacular games from start to finish, but rifle and pistol shooting dominated the shooting section with over double the entries of the clay shooters. I only hope I can go to the next games and take a pair of earplugs.

Prior to 1950 the Champion of Champions Title was conducted as a two-day program and linked to the Australian International Mackintosh Teams Match. The Australian team of 20 shooters for the International Match comprised the 15 highest scores in the Champion of Champions Cup event plus five others to be chosen by the ACTA Selection Committee.

Team conditions were: 100 targets from 16 yards, 5 track system in 4 stages of 25t each. Kills only to count, 2¹/₄" shells, 1¹/₄oz No. 6 size shot. Best 15 scores will count in the competition, five lowest to be counted out.

Highlights of the 1948 Champion of Champions Cup — Conditions were 50 targets from 18 yards on April 24, shot for the first time over the Australian Gun Club's East Burwood layout. This had the unique distinction of being the first major contest in the Commonwealth to be decided over three automatic traps. It also enjoyed the further distinguishing aspect of attracting a field of 128

shooters. This again being an Australian record. Outright winner on the day was Horrie Donnelly with the score of 49/50. Donnelly was a top flight shooter for many years and held the Champion of Champions Cup in its last year before wartime recess 1941.

Jack McCraith was the runner-up after missing his 6th and 34 targets, to finish with 48/50. Roy Johns with 47/50 came in 3rd, he failed to cover his 6th, 19th and 31st targets.

"The dinner after the shoot" — The Association dinner which followed the big event was staged in the unusual surroundings of Vic Frankhauser's fruit packing shed. Nearly 130 attended the function and the building could have handled double the number. The Frankhauser family went to unlimited trouble to ensure the success of the gathering and shooters were loud in their thanks to this hospitable family.

Development of Skeet Shooting — Photo shows members of the Victorian Inaugural Interstate Skeet Team. 1965 saw the beginning of skeet shooting on a national scale. Teams of five shooters from each state competed on a postal basis. At a later date the team members were increased to 10 and then to 15.

Photo shows left to right: Ron Siede, Don McCraith, Newton Thomas, John Siede and George Biggs. Victoria were the winners at this time with a score of 121/125.

In 1970 Skeet shooting became a part of the Trap Nationals, and so a National Skeet Championship came into being. It was conducted on the first day of the National Trap program at Perth, WA.

As interest in skeet shooting continued to grow it became obvious that a one-day event was not enough to warrant the cost of travel and time to shoot at only 50 targets of skeet. A great deal of debate followed in support of a separate Skeet National Program and finally 1983 saw the First National Skeet Championships conducted at the Melbourne Gun Club.

The 1990 Skeet Nationals are to be conducted in Queensland at the Townsville Gun Club.

These Eliminations are to be conducted on either an Olympic Trap or Ball Trap layout. They are open to all competitors regardless of zone, but the Zone Team must be selected only from competitors who are registered with a club in that particular zone.

EVENT

75 targets plus a 25 target 'final'.

'Flash' targets will be used in the 'final'.

The programmed 75 targets will be used to select the Zone Team and these targets plus the 'final' will determine overall placings.

If a competitor has no ISU grading then their DTL grading will be used.

The top 8 Open and the top 4 Junior competitors over the 75 programmed targets will form the Zone Team which will represent their zone in the Zone Teams Match to be held in conjunction with the State Olympic Trap Championship.

TIES FOR ZONE TEAM POSITIONS WILL BE DECIDED BY COUNT-BACKS.

In the event of a Junior, who has nominated in both categories, finishing in the top 8, another Junior will be selected and placed in the Zone Team.

Registered zone competitors who finish in places 9 to 12 in the Open category and 5th and 6th in the Junior category will be emergencies for the Zone Team, but will be eligible to compete for a position in the State Training Squad.

Representatives of the Zone Teams will be notified by mail of their selection in the team and they will be required to notify the State ISU Committee if they will not be attending the State Olympic Trap Championship in November so emergencies can be contacted to fill their position.

A Zone Team Badge will be awarded to each team member at the commencement of the Zone Teams Match at the State Championship.

TROPHIES

The overall winner of the Zone Elimination will receive a sash and one case of 'AA' shells.

Winners of A, B, C grades and the Junior category are to receive a ribbon and a half case of 'AA' shells.

Second placegetters in the four categories are to receive a quarter case of 'AA' shells.

A trophy will be provided in both lady and veteran classes if there are three or more entrants in either category.

Only members who actually compete for their zone in the Zone Teams Match are to receive a Zone Team badge.

3. INTERSTATE POSTAL TEAM

Scores for the postal teams are taken over the second 100 targets of the State Title, and a Team High Gun sash will be awarded in both Open and Junior classes.

The Open High Gun to receive a Silver Victorian Badge valued at \$100. An Interstate Teams Badge is awarded to each member of both teams.

4. STATE SHOULDER TO SHOULDER TEAM

The first three Victorian placegetters over the 225 targets of the State Title will form the team.

This team will compete at the National ISU Carnival in a head to head competition against other competing states.

Members of this team receive a State shooting jacket, T-shirt, track pants and VCTA cap.

5. STATE TRAINING SQUAD

The top six Open competitors and the top two Juniors over the 200 targets of the State Title form the Training Squad.

If a Junior shooter qualifies for the Open Squad, another Junior will be selected.

The only stipulation on the eligibility for the Training Squad is that all members of the Squad must be members or emergencies of their respective Zone Teams.

All members of the State Training Squad are to receive free nominations for the National ISU Carnival to be held at the International Gun Club in 1991. These nominations must be taken by the shooter who wins the right to use them. If the squad member cannot attend the National ISU Championships then the nomination fee is returned to the State ISU Fund.

6. ZONE TEAMS MATCH

All members of each Zone are to shoot at the 200 targets of the State Title with the highest four Open scores and the two highest Junior scores to count for the team aggregate.

The winning team is to receive six cases of 'AA' shells and a trophy to those shooters whose score counted for the team aggregate.

7. THE JUNIOR HIGH GUN WINNER FROM EACH ZONE (275 targets) will receive a custom fitted shooting jacket.

Note: Zone winners must be registered in the zone.

Per medium of our ACTA News may I appeal to all coaches, accredited, or non-accredited, throughout our zone to contact me regards accreditation and their respective activities as regular reports are expected, wanted and above all required for our coaching program to progress.

St James Gun Club is continuing to perform well with Phil Pettit looking after junior and novice shooters at their shoots. Deniliquin is also one club which is taking a very keen interest in their young shooters, Colbinabbin has conducted training clinics which is pleasing to hear. However, I would appreciate some feedback so it can be passed on to our State Coaching Director. Bendigo has appointed a coach but little if any action is contemplated.

Mansfield Club is ready and willing when official confirmation has been received and I will be attending that training as soon as I am advised accordingly.

I regret I was unable to be present at our Zone Chmpionships due to a third trip to hospital, but now that I am out and about again I sincerely hope I can make up for lost time.

Clubs have only to contact me if they require my presence and assistance and I will do my very best to fit them in with other scheduled clinics.

Meanwhile I will see you where they shoot straight.
