AUSTRALIAN SPORTS COMMISSION

STATE PRESIDENTS MEETING — DRAFT CONSTITUTION

A meeting of State Presidents took place in Melbourne on Monday 29th October to discuss a draft constitution prepared in conjunction with the members of the National Executive Committee and the Association's legal advisers.

The meeting, chaired by National President Jim Scott, was made possible by the financial assistance received from the Australian Institute of Sport to whom we express our appreciation for their continued support.

State Presidents attending the meeting were Mick Watson (WACTA), Peter Hayman (NSWCTA), Graeme Michell (SACTA). Owing to the unavailability of Alan Kenny (Tas), Glenn Woodhatch (Vic), Tom Meadows (Qld), these States were represented by Jock Bryan (TCTA), John McVitty (VCTA), Robert Nugent (QCTA).

Over what was a full day's meeting the draft constitution generated considerable input from all who attended. As a considerable amount of work had been done over the past 18 months, the meeting was able to address the draft in detail.

Matters raised of a legal nature were addressed by Mr John Isaac and solved to the meeting's satisfaction.

The recommendations that arrived from the meeting are to be placed before the Executive Committee for further deliberation prior to a final draft being placed before member clubs for their consideration.

COMPUTER COMMITTEE

The Computer Committee headed by Pud Burgess has been active over past months and with only minor investigations remaining will shortly be installing new computer equipment at the National Office. Why is this needed? Well to answer that question it is necessary to appreciate that the existing computer system which has served so well over the past 9-10 years is no longer able to fulfil the needs of the Association with parts and service on breakdown now almost impossible to obtain.

The new system will enable greater efficiency within the office and once settled down should provide the myriads of information which often requested, we have been unable to provide.

ACTA ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

Prior to discussion on the draft constitution State Presidents were advised of a management recommendation currently before the Executive Committee which if adopted would allow for greater input by member clubs to the affairs of the Association. The recommendation is yet to be determined, however all were in agreement

that the proposed organisation structure coupled with the revised draft constitution would prove to be an asset to the Association as it moved closer to the year 2000.

SKEET AT TOWNSVILLE

Following the completion of the Commonwealth Skeet Titles at Townsville, a meeting of interested skeet shooters took place to discuss matters of mutual benefit to skeet shooters and the sport of clay target shooting. While the ACTA welcomes comments, ideas and suggestions from within the sport it cannot accept them unless they have been discussed at state level. They are to be directed to the ACTA through the elected shooters representative to the National Shooting Committee whose elected role is to pursue the matter in the best interest of the sport. This procedure is applicable to all three disciplines of clay target shooting with the elected shooters representatives being, Skeet: Robert Buchan; D.T.L.: Peter Hayman; I.S.U.: David Menck.

This document, if approved, will become a by-law of our Constitution. Likewise it will be sent to all State Associations and Clubs for their consideration.

A lot of work has been done by the members of the Management Committee and Alan Maher, in drawing up this new document and I thank them all for their contribution. I honestly believe, and I look to you all for your support, that if both these matters are accepted by the shooters at the A.G.M., it will go a long way towards putting the ACTA on a very sound footing and we can look forward to the 21st Century with confidence.

When you read this document you will see we have gone back to each State asking them to set up sub-committees to advise them what each discipline requires. Any suggestions from these sub-committees will come through the State Association on to the ACTA.

At ACTA Executive level, sub-committees will be formed to handle these suggestions. Each member on the National Executive will be on one sub-committee. As I said, when I became National President I wanted a team effort and with the adoption of this proposal this is at last becoming a reality. From now on anyone on the National Executive who does not perform I will want to know why.

Following the State Presidents' meeting the Management Committee set out and visited no less than four computer companies. Many hours of work had been done beforehand and I thank Pud Burgess and the people in our Melbourne Office for their help with this most important project. At the end of a rather long day a decision was made to purchase a new computer, laser printer and word processor plus all the gear that goes with it.

I am confident that this will go a long way to add to the efficiency of the ACTA Office. It will also be a considerable cost saving measure, especially with the laser printer and the production of the CTSN.

So if anyone out there is looking for a well used 13 year old computer, the ACTA has one available.

SHOOTING RULES – AMENDMENTS

When advising members of these three amendments to the rule book it is opportune to again reinforce the following comment:

"While there will not be a review of the rules until the expiration of the five-year period following the last review, any matters regarding rules that are brought to the attention of the Association will be taken into consideration and is considered to be beneficial to the sport, implemented at the earliest opportunity."

For other than administrative changes, the procedure that applies for rule changes is as follows:

Rules Committee: R. Smith, NSW (Chairman); J. Murphy, Tas.; J. McVitty, Vic.; initially take the matters that are brought before them under consideration.

National Referees Association: K. Selwood (NT), T. Catling (WA), A. Kenna (Qld), R. Mules (SA), R. Smith (NSW), R. Buchan (Vic), J. Murphy (Tas) are canvassed for their opinion, which is made known to the National Rules Committee.

National Rules Committee: Take into account the decisions reached by the members of the National Referees Association and in the event of receiving support to a suggested rule change place a recommendation before the:

Executive Committee: Two representatives from each State Association plus the National President vote on a decision to be taken.

As can be seen, the matter of rule changes or amendments is not taken lightly nor is it done hastily for all of the above take time. Should the Executive approve a recommendation from the National Rules Committee rest assured the matter at hand has been well aired before the decision is taken.

Having said all of that I now advise of two amendments to the rules effective immediately.

HANDICAP RULE REVIEW

A review of the existing handicap rule has been underway since June 8th. A draft revision of the rule as presented by VCTA and NSWCTA has been before five groups for consideration with a total of 33 eligible to record a vote: National Executive Committee, State Associations, National Referees Association, State Rules Supervisors, Shooters (DTL) Representative.

As at the close of voting (31-10-90), a total of 26 votes had been received with the pattern of voting clearly indicating a majority preference to retain the existing rule as against adopting either of the two proposed alternatives.

Owing to the decision that has been reached the existing handicap rule will remain the rule until such time as the rules are taken under review in their entirety.

It is strongly recommended that clubs give serious consideration for the inclusion of more handicap events when preparing their shooting program. Handicap shooting has occupied a high position in clay target shooting in years gone by, a position which can be regained with the support of clubs and in particular those who enjoy clay target shooting where all are equal.

NATIONAL SKEET C

With a total of 162 competitors taking part, the 1990 Nationals were underway at the picturesque and well presented Townsville Gun Club, with the first event the traditional State Teams Shoulder to Shoulder Match. Prior to the State Teams Match, all teams assembled under their respective State flags and participated in the opening ceremony which was attended by what appears to be the greater majority of those who were to compete on the first day.

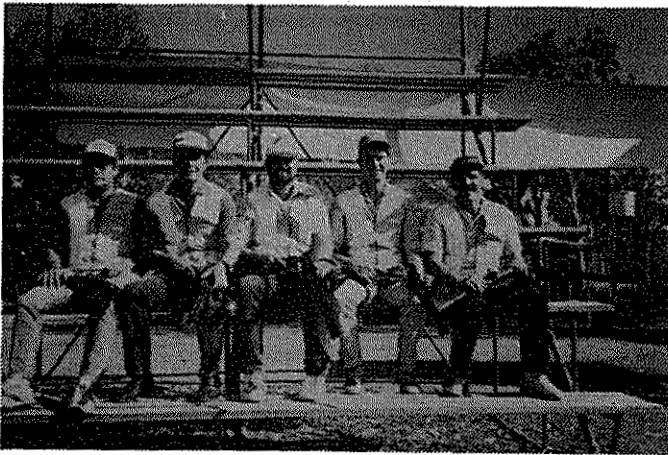
The large attendance at the opening ceremony certainly did not go unnoticed by Mr Mark Stoneman State member for Burdekin who had been invited to open the championships and fire the traditional opening shot. Conditions were warm and windy and the background a little different from what is generally experienced. The State Carnival held over the previous weekend plus the Pre-national Program had enabled shooters to shoot the ground prior to the Nationals and all were anxious to do well.

STATE TEAMS

With all States other than Tasmania taking part the favourites appeared to be the Victorian team who along with all shooters take great pride in representing their State in Shoulder to Shoulder competition.

Under the watchful eye of Mr Mark Stoneman the Queensland team made a bold attempt to take out the teams match with a well compiled 234-250. Their efforts however were two shots short of the winning team New South Wales whose team score of 236-250 won for the State, the 1990 Teams Match and for the Team members the honour of having their names inscribed on the Perpetual Trophy as a permanent record of their individual and team performance.

NATIONAL SKEET DOUBLES CHAMPIONSHIP — 25PR. Sponsored by B.R.A. Insurance Pty Ltd

The first of the individual events, the Doubles Championship, attracted a field of 128 competitors including a total of 60 Queenslanders for the 1990 Nationals at Townsville.

Being a Doubles Event the elusive 50-50 proved to be just that as not one competitor was able to achieve the possible. Many good results however including Justin Ehrenreich (Q/J) whose score 51-54 won for him B Grade and the Junior section of the Doubles Championship. Another whose score was showing signs of what was to be in later events was Maree Rooke from Wagga whose 49-52 as well as the ladies section.

The familiar name of Ted McRae from Timaru NZ also appeared among the winners winning the Veterans section with a well shot 44-50. The best performance however belonged to Brisbane's Dave Dundon who took overall with a score of 49-50 and won for himself the title of National Skeet Doubles Champion for 1990.

Interesting comments were made on the fact that the Doubles did not count so far as the Championships High Gun Titles were concerned. This had been brought about as a result of an approach to the ACTA Executive in May of 1989. While the approach to the Executive was successful, general opinion has appeared to favour the fact that the Doubles should be included as part of the High Gun

CITY OF TOWNSVILLE SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS — 50T

Being the first of the standard skeet events and the only 50T of the Nationals, competitors were anxious to not only commence well, but to also give themselves a good start toward the coveted High Gun donated by Browning through the Australian Agent, Fuller Firearms.

Competitors had increased to 144 and better scores were appearing on the board. Robin Bailey WA shooter and former member of the National Executive Committee made his presence known with a first 49-50 to take A Grade. 1989 National Champion Christian Naudin shot 50-51 for first AA. Inverell's Mark McInnes was too strong overall to record a victory in the event with 54-54. Maree Rooke (L) 48-50 and Justin Ehrenreich (J) 52-55 again won their respective sections with Alf Najjar from Wakehurst taking the Veterans Section with a score of 47-50. Conditions were still windy with the targets proving elusive for those who had not quite settled in although all would agree the targets were there to be broken.

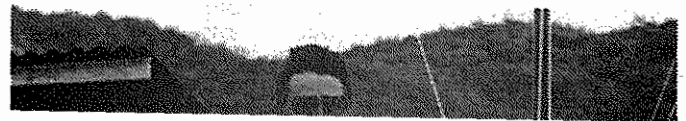
ALL STATES SKEET CHAMPIONSHIP 100T

Event Sponsor: Olimpyc Targets/Scorpio Cartridges

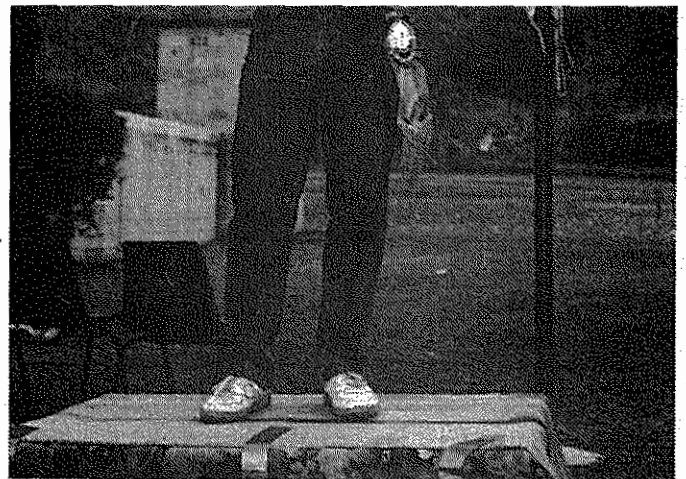

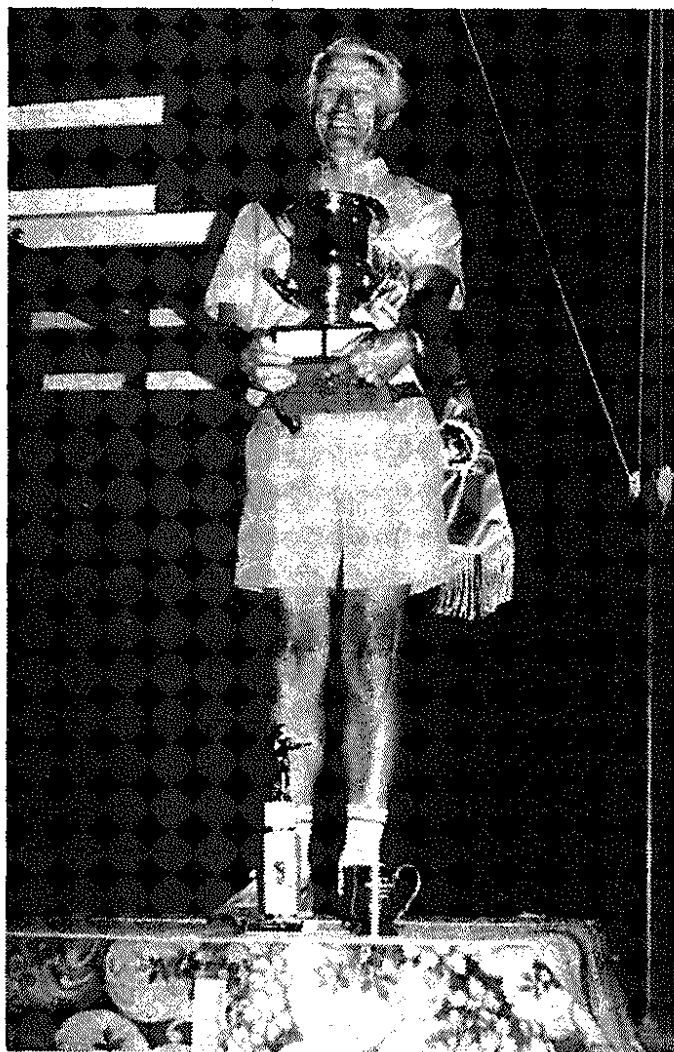

JUNIOR HIGH GUN 350T

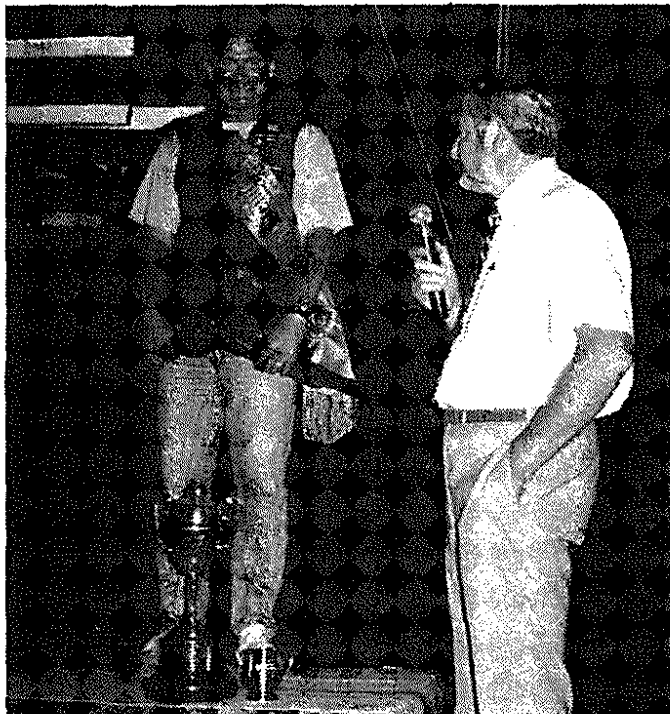

DUCK BAN — PROPOSED LEGISLATION — W.A.

I am pleased to be able to advise shooters that the Executive Committee have approved a grant of \$5000 from the legislation reserve to the West Australian Clay Target Association to assist in a concerted campaign to ensure that this legislation is not proceeded with.

RELEASE TRIGGER — MASTER REGISTER

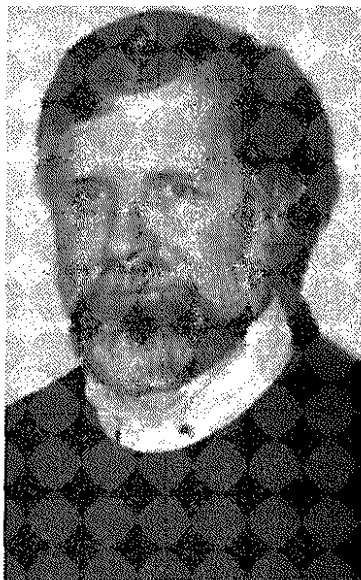

SOME COMMENTS ON GUN HEADACHE



Ross Williams has been writing a weekly shooting column for the sports section of the The Weekly Times, Australia's biggest-selling rural newspaper, since January 1977. The following article is reprinted by permission from the 18-1-89 edition.

PEOPLE who fire a lot of shots in a single session — clay target shooters, for instance — can suffer from a temporary but annoying complaint known as gun headache.

The most obvious cause is jolting of the head during recoil. No doubt many gun headaches are simply the result of repeated mild concussions.

In some instances, however, there may be a more specific cause. It seems that headaches can be caused by pinching of the nerves which pass between the top vertebrae of the neck. If the shooter's head receives a sharp kick from the buttstock, it will pivot backwards, directly affecting those headache-related nerves.

Either way, it's easy to see why ill-fitting stocks, failure to hold the firearm properly and excessive recoil are all capable of promoting headaches.

Powder fumes are responsible in some cases. The nitrates and nitrites produced by modern smokeless propellants are vasodilators. That is, they cause the blood vessels to enlarge, including the ones inside the skull. The resultant increase in blood volume raises the pressure inside the skull and thus causes the headache.

Because these substances are absorbed rapidly through the lining of the nose, mouth and lungs, and at a slower rate through the skin, some shooting situations make us more susceptible.

For example, the fumes are more likely to accumulate in the vicinity of a busy firing line on a very still day. Repeaters also increase the likelihood of exposure. With pump, lever and bolt actions, small quantities of the fumes are released near the shooter's face whenever the action is cycled at the shoulder after firing. In the case of self-loading rifles and shotguns, of course, that happens every time a shot is fired.

The fumes are less when smaller amounts of propellant are used: a .22 rimfire, for instance, has such a tiny powder charge that the fumes are negligible. The same is true of light target loads used by centrefire pistol shooters.

Furthermore, people apparently can become accustomed to the effect of the fumes as time goes on.

A third cause of gun headache is noise. Consequently, ear muffs or ear plugs can provide a cure — though wise shooters, especially participants in club shoots, already wear such protection to guard against hearing damage traceable to muzzle blast.

Self-loading rifles and shotguns need a special mention. Some are worse than others, but all have inherently rowdy actions. Though the sound of the action cycle is partly or wholly hidden by the report, it remains an intense source of noise close to the shooter's ear. More importantly, much of it is transmitted through the shooter's skull bones in the form of vibrations.

This, together with the fume problem, may explain why some shooters find they are more likely to get a headache when they use a self-loader, despite a reduction in the felt recoil.

We should not forget that match pressure can play a part. Headache is a normal response to nervous tension in many people.

In summary, a number of things can give rise to gun headache, and two or more can be operating at the same time. The solution to the problem lies in eliminating the possible causes, though this may be easier said than done.

COACHING CORNER

High Performance Coaching

In most sports there are only a small number of Australian coaches capable of coaching competently at international level. The Australian Coaching Council (ACC) has developed a program aimed at increasing the pool of coaches at this level who would also be potential future national coaches.

The High Performance Coach Award Program is a post Level 3 development award designed to augment existing (proven) high performance coaching abilities to ensure that Australian coaches are equipped to coach successfully at international level.

A High Performance Coach must be able to:

- Plan, conduct and evaluate
 - practices
 - periodized training programs
 - training camps
 - competitive tours
 - the development of the specific fitness, mental skills, techniques and tactical ability of athletes
- Teach advanced skills and strategies
- Analyse advanced skills and strategies.

The High Performance Coach should also be able to:

- Assist athletes to plan their careers
- Design talent identification systems
- Select national teams
- Select and work effectively with appropriate sports science people
- Make effective use of sport information systems
- Relate to media.

After extensive research, both in Australia and in other highly developed sporting countries, the ACC has developed a coach development program based around the major tasks in coaching high performance athletes. Coaches must be able to carry out tasks in three major areas:

- Preparing the athlete for competition
- Planning the athlete's development
- Leadership and management.

Within each of these major areas are a series of sub tasks. Each candidate will undergo an evaluation (including self-evaluation) and counselling process with the ACC and the coach's National Sporting Organisation so that an appropriate individual program can be developed.

Once a coach's program has been agreed upon and prioritised, the ACC will set up the program using any of the following methods which will best suit the individual candidate:

- Coaching Apprenticeship
- Individual Tuition — Coach/Scientist/ other expert consultant
- Approved University/College Courses
- Coaching Practicum
- Specialist, Approved Seminars/Short Courses
- Individual Reading/Study/Course
- Elite Coaches Seminar (National/State)
- Australian Coaching Council Special Education Courses.

A major aspect of the program will be a coaching apprenticeship (unless the candidate is already the national coach). Probably the best single tool for high performance coach education is to put the aspiring coach in a practical setting with elite athletes as an apprentice to the very best coaches in that sport.

Each candidate's program will be jointly approved by the ACC and the coach's National Sporting Organisation. The Australian Sports Commission will provide funding for a number of programs each year.

SPORT SCIENCE — UPDATE ON PROGRESS

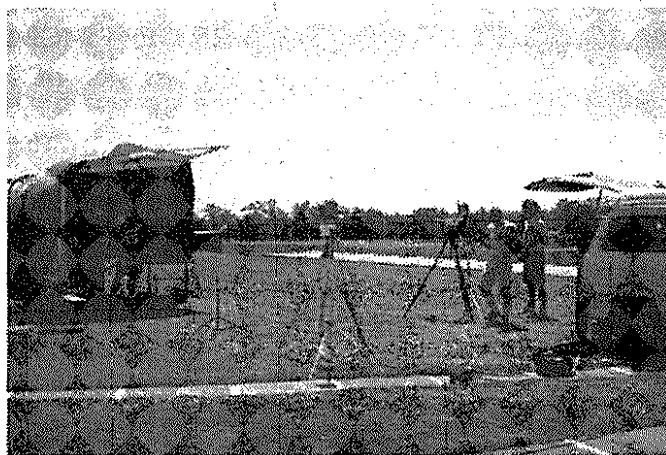

Guy Boileau has given us the opportunity to inform you of the progress that has been made to date on the sport science research on the *Perceptual-Motor Characteristics of Elite Performers in Aiming Sports*. We will limit this note to the study on the clay target shooters.

The purpose of this study was to determine some of the skills that distinguish expert performers from those people who might be classed as average or novice performers. We were specifically interested in how the shooters moved the gun in response to the target and when in the motion they pulled the trigger. Secondly, we wished to determine if expert shooters were better than the control subjects in tasks such as identifying targets in slides that were quickly flashed up on the screen, predicting when an object would reach a certain point and indicate the time it would reach this point by pulling a trigger, visual acuity and eye muscular balance and many other tests.

We were hoping that by identifying those skills in which the experts were far superior to the controls (non-expert shooters), coaching and instructional methods could be developed that would focus in on these skills to help beginning and promising shooters to reach their peak of skill development as early as possible.

After a number of practice trials, we identified a method of collecting the data that would work in the field setting. We wanted to track the position of the gun barrel, shoulder, elbow and wrist as they moved in space. To do this, we placed five highly reflective markers on these points and took video recordings at high speed (200 frames per second — normal video operates at 25 frames per second) from two cameras. Two cameras were required in order to use mathematical relationships between the positions of these markers as "seen" from both cameras to reconstruct the actual position in three dimensional space. [Note: A picture from a single camera is a two dimensional view of the scene and thus two pictures are required to reconstruct the real, three dimensional picture.] In addition to the filming of the subjects as they shot the targets, some electronics were developed to monitor certain events.

A microswitch was attached to each of the three traps from which the targets were released. This switch, when activated by the release of the target, caused a bank of light emitting diodes (LED) to illuminate. These lights were picked up by the video cameras and were stored on tape, along with the images of the retroreflective markers. Thus the time of release of the target was known very accurately. These same LEDs were also illuminated by the sound of the gun firing (once or twice). In addition, to these times, the time from release of the target until it first appeared in the field of view of

the shooter was determined. These critical timing events thus allowed us to break down the very complex movement into a series of smaller segments.

We filmed 12 shooters (5 experts and 7 controls) as they shot at 20 targets. We attempted to make the exercise as similar as possible to a real competition however it was not possible to have the shooters rotate through the five shooting positions as would occur in a normal event. We did encourage the subjects to take as much time as necessary between shots and insisted that they take a short break after shooting five shots. The traps were set up so that for every five targets, two went left, two went right and one went down the middle. The shooters did not know in which direction the trap was going to be released.

Once these data (20 trials or shots) are collected on videotape, the information has to be extracted from the videos and stored on computer. This job will be completed at the Department of Human Movement Studies, University of Queensland, with specialised equipment designed for this task. While this job is far from complete (it takes about two days to get the data from one subject on to computer!) our preliminary results seem promising. We are able to accurately locate the positions of the markers (to within $\pm 2\text{mm}$) in space and the timing information is accurate to 0.005 second.

The data on the perceptual and visual aspect of the study have not been gathered for all subjects yet (we have tested about 5 subjects to date). However, as soon as these data are available we will provide results to you.

While there is still a considerable amount of work left to do on the project, we are confident that the information that we derive will provide accurate and useful information back to the sport. We would also, in closing, like to thank Mr David Menck and Mr Peter Stein for their invaluable contribution to this project and their willingness to co-operate and make things run smoothly. In addition, it should be noted that Brisbane Gun Club provided us with unlimited use of their facilities during the data collection and preliminary testing stages and also provided, free of charge, the targets that were used. We hope to keep you up to date in the future as the data are analysed and results come to hand.

FROM YOUR STATE COACHING DIRECTOR

Trapshooting today has reached an era of individual professionalism. Although this aspect has been with the sport for a long time the only great difference between the past and present is that the average winning scores are somewhat higher and there are far more AA grade competitors.

If a present day competitor expects to become a consistent winner he or she must first build a shooting career upon a proper foundation. This may be accomplished in two ways. The first, and most proper approach being trial and error; the second approach being

proper coaching and correct training. With the trial and error system many shooters never improve, they either become discouraged, frustrated, run out of money, quit or become another statistic of the silent majority.

Today shooters need proper assistance and to learn correct methods of breaking targets. A shooter can accomplish this with proper coaching from an accredited or professional coach.

Natural ability today is not enough to win consistently. If you, the shooter, want to become a consistent winner then it might be in your best interest to acquire the services of shooting instructors.

Within every trapshooter there is a desire to win and be recognised as a consistent competitor or even a national champion and it is within grasping range with proper instruction and a positive attitude on your behalf.

Even with the best type of equipment, the most positive attitude and instructions from a coach, it's a hard road to the success ranks.

Setting up your goals to become a better than average shooter or a national champion, you must become a thinking type of shooter. To become a winner on the shooting circuit today requires learning advanced skills, training and dedication. Trapshooting is a sport of learning the basic skills, styles, absolute self mental control, self confidence, target concentration, trigger control and dedicated practice.

Proper coaching will make it quicker and more satisfying to accomplish your goals. Always accept instructions with a positive attitude as this will help you in obtaining the most out of coaching.

Do understand however, that if you think that by taking shooting lessons you will become an overnight success, alas this is not the case and your chances are slim.

The coaching only makes the final result easier for you to accomplish.

Having received the skilled instruction from a shooting seminar, clinic or individual instruction then it's a matter of practice, discipline and a shooting routine (and possibly continued coaching).

A secret to success is learning the proper basics, learning a style that is suited to you and making use of the gained information in trapshooting techniques.

Remember, take all the information offered with a positive attitude for future use! Apply or modify the information into a style that will help you achieve higher results and develop a routine through self confidence and practice. Note the shooting magazines and books on trapshooting.

It's your choice — struggle for years to break higher scores or consult a coach from our coaching panel for the easier approach to better scores.

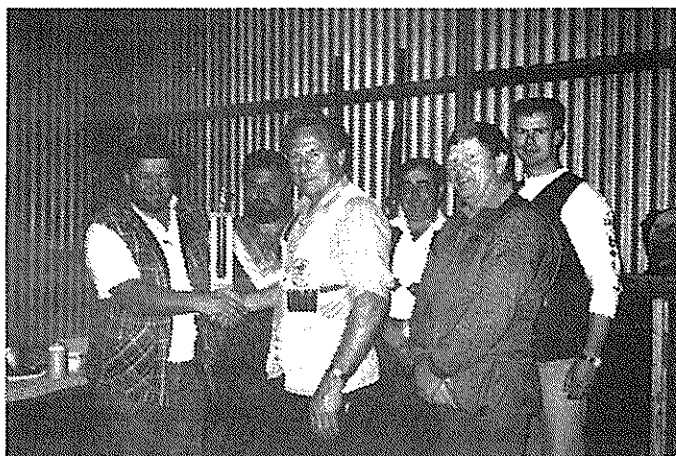

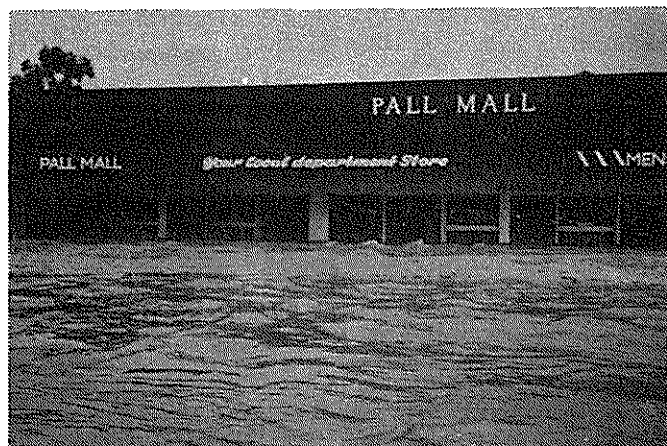
CHARLEVILLE GUN CLUB

1991 REGISTRATIONS

Registrations for the 1991 year will be accepted by the National Office as from 1st December 1990, if accompanied by the appropriate registration fee.

Full Member	\$43
Second Family Member	\$27
Veteran (over 65)	\$27
Junior (under 18)	\$10

In addition a special concessional membership is available for those shooters who having attained the age of 60 have a non-broken period of 30 years as a registered shooter with the Association.

Persons qualifying for concessional membership ARE NOT granted veteran's status until such time as they have attained the age of 65. Concessional (Long Service) Membership — \$27.

1991 HANDICAP CARDS

For other than Zone, State or National Championships, shooters who are registered in 1990 are able to compete in 1991 (January only) by producing their 1990 handicap card. This exemption will allow sufficient time for clubs to forward applications to the National Office from where current 1991 handicap cards will be issued with minimum delay.

As from February 1st no person shall be eligible to shoot without first presenting their 1991 handicap card verifying their shooting details.

REFLECTIONS OF THE 1956 OLYMPIC GAMES

Since running the story in *Clay Target News* a few months back concerning the 1956 Melbourne Olympic Games Trench shooting events and the performance of the winners of gold, silver and bronze, I have received some related information.

I recently received a letter from my friend Len Bird of Bateau Bay, NSW, advising me of the following somewhat sad story. This story will no doubt be of interest to those Australian shooters who were around at the 1956 Olympic Games, they will remember the brilliant shooting form of Liano Rossini, the gold medallist and top performer at the games shoot.

Len Bird's letter to me goes on to advise of a friend in Charlie Fabbri, who is a lifelong friend of the Rossini family and a schoolmate of Liano Rossini. Charlie recently went to Italy to visit the Rossini family and to pay his last respects to Liano. He had passed away at the age of 60 in 1987 and is buried in the family tomb with other members of the Rossini family.

As a matter of fact he is buried just above his father Enrico Rossini who was a champion clay target shooter having won the Italian Championship in 1956, the same year his son Liano won the Olympic Championship in Australia. Liano's son has taken over the family business in Rome and is carrying on the business that his grandfather Enrico Rossini carried on, he is keeping his fathers name going in the shooting game.

The Rossini family tomb is in the Monte Acuto Cemetery, Province of Ancona, which is situated in the centre of Italy about 350km north of Rome. Rossini family friend Charlie Fabbri has supplied the photos of the Rossini family tomb where Liano and his father are buried.

Since that time he has become heavily involved with the administration of the Club, holding the position of President for five of the past six years. He has also been a Zone Delegate for five years and a member of the State Council for two years. He also holds the position of State Handicapper.

Graham has a lot of ideas on where South Australia should be heading with this sport and is looking forward to representing his State on the ACTA National Committee.



EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Sir,

After receiving your letter of October 17 I feel that further comment on the subject of "release triggers" is warranted.

The first authority for the use of a release trigger was granted in 1974 to Hawkesbury shooter Reg Clark and since that time a slow but steady acceptance of their use has been wide spread. Over the last few days I have spent a small fortune on phone calls and the fax talking to numerous people all over the country about this subject and based on the content of the conversation taken place I have listed below a number of points that I think need further discussion. If we are to review the rules they should be looked at in their entirety, not superficially as is the case just recently.

1. Why is that the shooter is checked for safety and not their gun?
2. Does the person doing the testing know how a release trigger is supposed to function? How should the trigger feel? How much trigger creep is felt before release? How much hold pressure is required to avoid let off?
3. The way the existing rule is structured with regard to who could qualify for permission to use a release trigger ensures that the indiscriminate use of release triggers cannot take place, i.e. a shooter who can substantiate a claim that their use of a release trigger is justified because of a disability that has impaired the performance of a shooter to produce their best (i.e. flinching or freezing) can apply through the club who in turn applies in writing to a referee examiner who tests the applicant.
4. The release trigger register should be brought up to date a.s.a.p.
5. All release trigger users should have their status recorded on their handicap cards.
6. Because of the nature of release triggers and their unique function it must be acknowledged that the person most qualified to test are long term users of release trigger guns.

7. If it is required that rules supervisors are the only people who can approve the use of a release trigger gun then I would suggest that they approve an application after sighting the letter from the club applying on behalf of the shooter and the test report from the person approved to conduct the test. In this way they can still control the issue of approval and can be satisfied that the applicants gun has also been certified for safe use by someone that knows what they are doing.

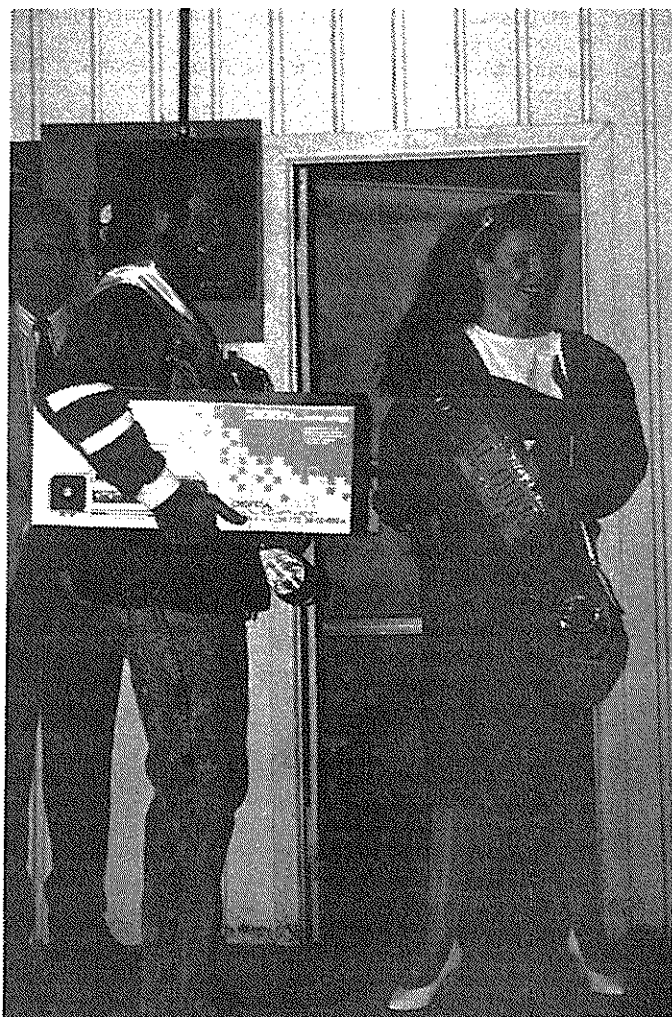
I hope that the comments above encourage a little more discussion on this subject.

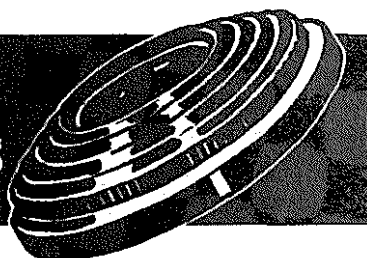

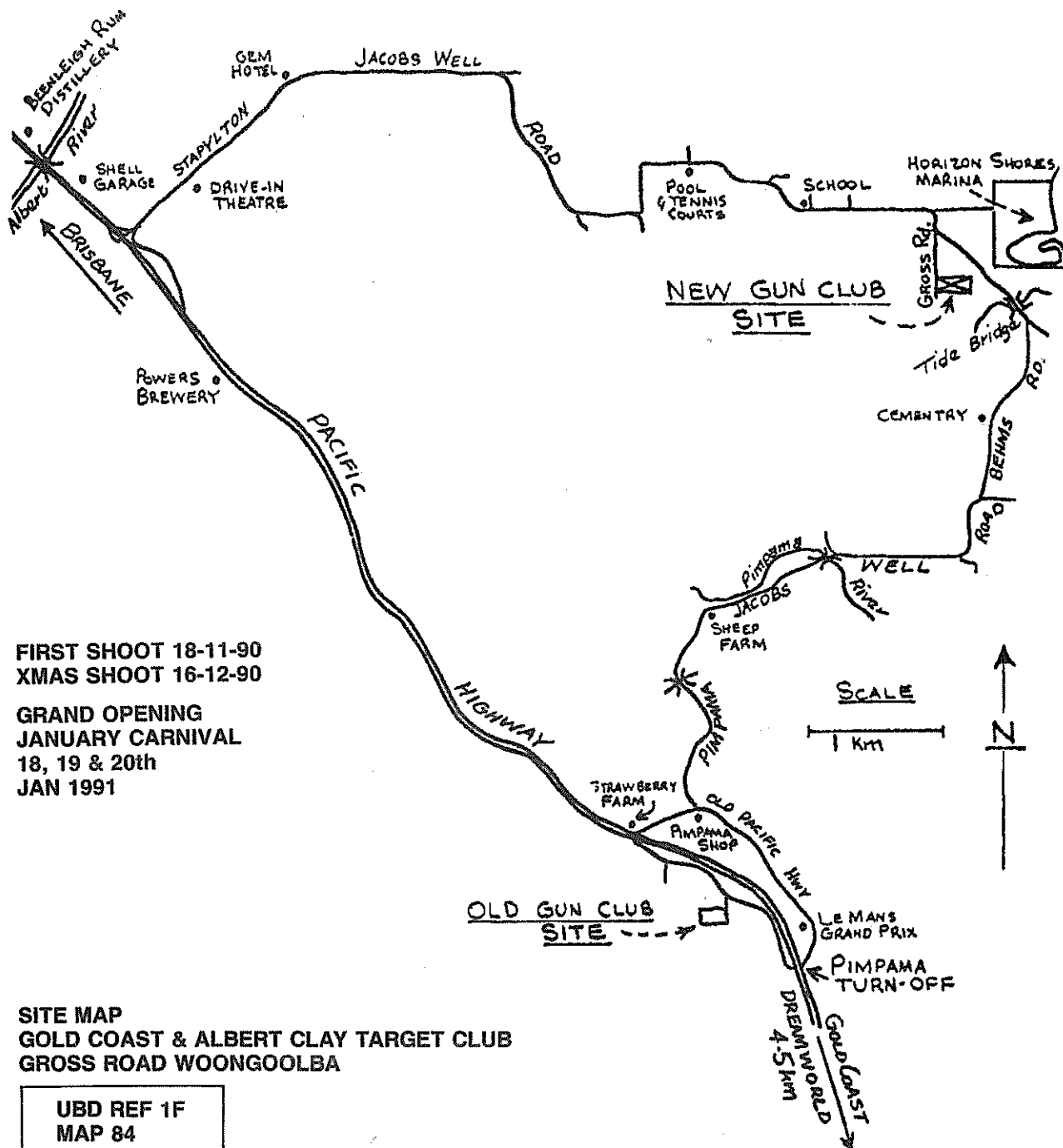

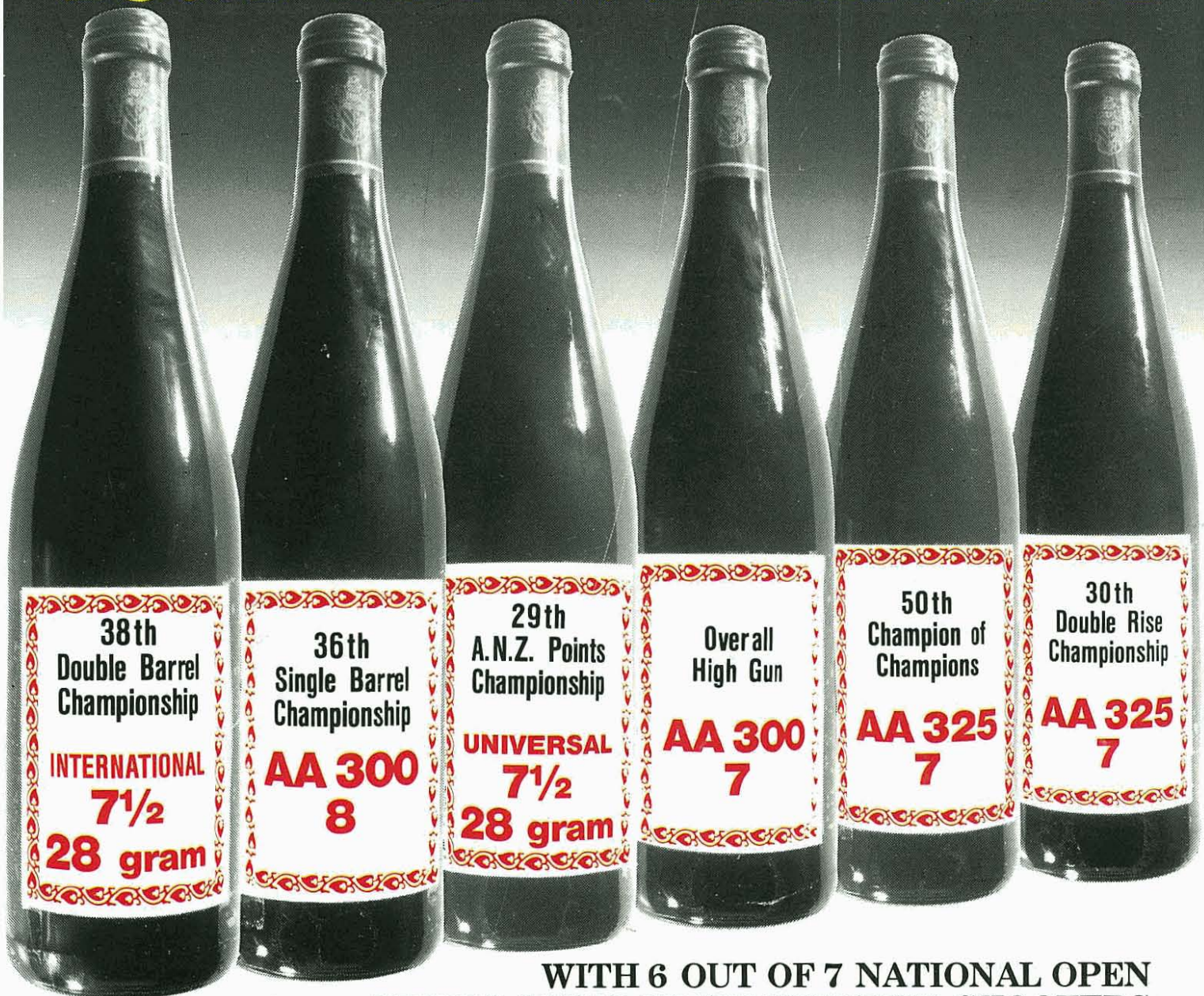
