



I am pleased to be able to report on the success of the Oceanic Shooting Championships which were held in Adelaide in conjunction with the ACTA National Olympic Discipline Championships.

STATE SHOOTING PARK which is the home of the International Gun Club was the venue for the Multi Discipline International Championships which attracted a record number of competitors including shooters from Germany, China, USA, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, New Caledonia and Western Samoa.

Through the courtesy of the SA Government and the Department of Sport and Recreation this permanent shooting ground will grow in stature as the years go by and with generally minor improvements will prove to be an excellent venue for the 1998 Commonwealth Games if SA are successfully in their bid on behalf of Australia. We wish them well and thank in particular Mr George Belchev representing the SA Government and David Macfarlane from the Commonwealth Games bid office for their valued support.

As a result of the excellent performances of the Skeet and Trench Teams at the Oceanic Shooting Championships in Adelaide, Australia has four of a possible six Quota positions for shotgun at the 1992 Barcelona Games.

OCEANIA SHOOTING FEDERATION

The Bi-Annual General Meeting of the Oceania Shooting Federation took place in Adelaide during the course of the Oceanic

Shooting Championships. For the first time in many years a new Federation, Western Samoa, joined the Oceania Federation with an expression of interest received from New Caledonia who have received conditional membership.

Being the Bi-Annual meeting of the Federation nominations were received for all positions. Australian delegates to the region Alan Maher and Tibor Gonczol were respectively elected as Vice President and Chairman of the Technical Committee.

Oceania President, Mr Graham Hudson from New Zealand was re-elected unopposed as was Mr Michael Watts, New Zealand Secretary of the Oceania Federation.

An expression of interest was received from New Zealand for the conduct of the 1993 Oceanic Shooting Championships. When advising of their interest for 1993 New Zealand gave notice that they would be seeking to gain approval from the Federation to host two successive Oceanic Championships as it would enable the experience gathered in 1993 to be capitalised on for 1995 which should result in a more professional and economical staging of the Championships which under the auspices of the UIT are so important to the countries in the region, in particular Australia and New Zealand.

NATIONAL OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The shooting results from the O.D. Nationals are contained elsewhere in this month's CTSN and will no doubt prove to be of interest to those who have a keen interest in the ISU side of the sport.

A number of excellent performances were recorded and for their efforts those who were involved both as competitors and organisers are to be congratulated.

Next month's CTSN will carry a report on the Championships which were an outstanding success and enjoyed by all who attended despite the hot and windy conditions which prevailed throughout the course of the week.


NATIONAL ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE


SUMMARY:

- The proposed organisation structure has been prepared in keeping with the existing Articles of Association. Should a revised constitution be accepted minor amendments may be required to meet constitutional requirements.
- 2. The recommendation proposed for State Associations has been

- prepared in keeping with the recommendation from the Management Committee to the Executive Committee.
- The recommendation proposed for State Associations is to ensure that the views of shooters have been discussed by Discipline Sub-Committees within the State prior to State Council's deliberation.

STATE ASSOCIATIONS (recommended for adoption)

- To elect as members of the National Executive Committee, persons whose areas of expertise would be considered suitable to assume a role on Management (if so elected) to administer a designated portfolio.
- To elect within the framework of their State Executive Committee, Sub-Committees in a manner that would be in keeping with the National structure.
- To submit recommendations to the National Body that having first been discussed by the respective State Sub-Committees have received the approval of the State Executive Committee.

Lost Bird

THE POWER OF THE POSITIVE IMAGE

Ross Williams has been writing a weekly shooting column for the sports section of *The Weekly Times*, Australia's biggestselling rural newspaper, since 1977. The following article is reprinted by permission from that column.

There are three sides to successful shooting: having the right equipment for each discipline, developing the necessary physical skills, and mental preparation.

Of these, the last is arguably the most important. It is the reason why top marksmen and markswomen often call their sport a "mind game".

Mental preparation covers a variety of techniques, all of which are important. But none is more important than visualising every detail of a perfect shot, running it over in the mind again and again.

Sporting Shooters' Association national president and running target coach, Keith Tidswell, had an experience that highlighted the value of this routine. The competition involved was running boar, but it could have been DTL, skeet, Olympic trap, tower, ball trap, flush, ZZ, simulated field — or indeed any other target discipline.

"One time, before a South Australian championship, our range equipment had been out of order for some months and we had been unable to practise. Yet three of us broke the record that had stood for seven years," he said. "What happened? All we had been able to do for our preparation was mental training techniques — thinking the positive over and over again."

Obviously there is no substitute for real shooting, for the body must be so attuned to using the firearm that much of the process of firing a shot is done subconsciously, he added. Only then can the mind take over.

The mistake many shooters make, however, is allowing negative mental images to creep into their minds, Tidswell said. He explained as follows:

 When a competitor leaves the line, someone will often ask, "How did you go?"

This is not the time to recall the mistakes, to analyse every detail of the muffed chances, for that simply reinforces the negative. It's much better to recall the good shots and talk about them.

• Eliminate the word "Don't". It invariably introduces a negative, doubt-creating attitude or a negative mental image, and often produces the very result that we wanted to avoid.

Imagine handing a young child a glass full of water with the instruction, "Take this over there and don't spill it." The picture created in the child's mind is that of spilling the water.

But if we say, "Keep the water in the glass", the mental image is quite different: it is positive, achieveable.

Therefore advice should be worded positively: "Squeeze the trigger", "Increase your lead on this target", or "Keep your head on the stock", for example. This applies not only to comments by coaches but also to the instructions shooters give themselves.

- When listening to such advice, shooters should rehearse the desired change in their minds. That is, they should picture themselves performing the necessary actions, from their viewpoint behind the butt. In this way, it is possible to learn from a mistake without reliving it.
- Wherever possible, analysis of performance after a match should focus on successes. Which is more profitable — to discover why we scored a ten or broke a clay, or to discover why we did not?

"Surround yourself with the positive; use positive self-talk. If you are instructing people, use positive statements, paint positive images . . . there is no place for negative thoughts in a successful shooter's mind," Keith Tidswell said.

RULE CLARIFICATION

Release Triggers

Delete Rule 4.11B(1) Guns and Loads Replace with 4.11B(1)

"A.C.T.A. shooters suffering from some condition which would make the use of a Release Trigger desirable, shall obtain a statement signed by the President and Secretary of the shooter's home club that the shooter suffers from such condition and shall present the statement to a Rules Supervisor for consideration.

A Rule Supervisor shall by whatever means he determines, have the applicant examined on his understanding of the use of a Release Trigger device.

The Rule Supervisor shall forward the statement from the shooter's home club to the ACTA together with his decision on the application on the appropriate form provided by the ACTA who will advise the applicant accordingly.

Where a Rule Supervisor has satisfied himself that the applicant understands the use of a Release Trigger device the shooter shall be included on the master register of release trigger users and his Handicap Card shall be marked accordingly by the ACTA."

RULE CLARIFICATION — AMENDMENT

RULE 6.2 TO READ

- (A) No shooter shall have a handicap greater than 5 except when Club Management programmes D Grade (handicap 6) and then for that event only. A shooter must not shoot in a grade higher than his best performance. Once having attained a grade he may elect to remain in a higher grade at the time of re-registering or reclassification.
- (B) Once attaining B Grade, a shooter cannot be re-classified as C Grade without receiving approval from the State Handicapper. Once attaining "A" Grade a shooter cannot be reclassified as "C" Grade. Once attaining AA Grade he cannot be re-graded to B Grade. Other than in the authority vested in rule 6.3.

RULE 6.1 (G) TO READ

Grades. After shooting the next 200 targets and each successive 200 targets the shooter's handicap and grading shall then be adjusted according to the handicap and grading formula.

A shooter may have his grade increased after shooting 200 targets but must shoot two consecutive groups of 200 targets at a lower grade percentage to be down graded. All scores after the last grading must be carried forward onto new handicap card.

Any C Grade shooter having recorded a 50 target break shall be re-graded to B Grade.

AA Grade 97% and over — Handicap 0; A Grade 94% and under 97% — Handicap 1; B Grade 87% and under 94% — Handicap 2 or 3; C Grade 80% and under 87% — Handicap 4 or 5.

NOTE: Club Managements have the option of shooting D Grade under 80% — Handicap 6.

THE COACH IN THE EARLY 21st CENTURY

The following is a summary of an article published in August 1989 by Dr. Brent S. Rushall in CAHPERD Journal, and subsequently reprinted in "The Coaching Director", Volume 6 Number 1. "The Coaching Director" is the official quarterly publication of the Australian Coaching Council.

Brent Rushall is currently associated with the Department of Physical Education at San Diego (California) State University. He has been a profound influence on the development of formal coaching practice in this country, not least through his contributions as collaborator in, or sole author of, Australian Coaching Council publications.

I found the article of particular interest as it addresses concerns expressed to me by three ACTA coaches, Peter Quire, Ian Hale and David Menck, about the development of young shooters.

Young athletes should not be subjected to programs that approach those of elite performers until they have reached a high level of physical maturity. It is desirable to have young athletes spend more time in the developmental stages of a sport rather than in programs which assume that development has been completed. Olympic champions are getting older with each Olympiad (contrary to popular belief) and children should not be expected to compete against adults.

Young people should be helped to acquire a wide range of sporting skills, rather than being encouraged to specialise early. Early specialisation can lead to participation "burnout", the response to which may also hamper athletes later in their sporting careers.

The old practice of coaching athletes in groups will be discarded and coaching methods will focus on individuality. This will necessitate the development of new ways of organizing, teaching and monitoring the progress of athletes.

Coaches will refrain from training athletes hard until the athletes have become fully proficient in the skilled aspects of their sports. Current hard training of athletes who are not fully skilled leads to "ingraining performance inefficiencies".

Effective coaching will emphasize proper recovery from periods of intense training or competition. (Fundamental to this is the implementation of the "periodisation" of training which sets athletes in an environment of planned training, recovery and competition over long periods, such as a year.)

Programs and practices will be structured on sound principles of sport science. "Coaches will be breaking with current erroneous beliefs about many popular training methods and activities". Current unscientific approaches to certain sports lead to "superstitious behaviours in both athletes and coaches".

The coach will not be able to do all the coaching himself (or herself). The coach will team with other coaches, trainers and support staff. In particular, sport psychologists will play a major role in the development of athletes and the structures which support them. Sporting organisations will focus more on athletes than on coaches or administrators.

Coaches themselves will need to take part in continuing educational processes in order to achieve, and to retain, accreditation. It is to be hoped that coaching will be properly regulated to bring about an end to erroneous coaching practices. The effectiveness of coaching will be evaluated through scientific testing of the results of training programs and through athlete evaluations of the coach and his behaviour.

The foregoing summarises a longer article available in full on request from National Office. A useful summary of the concept of "periodisation" of training — with which Level 1 coaches will not be familiar — is also available. I would welcome comment on this summary, but make the preliminary comment that the article was written for consumption in the USA; some advanced sports in this country are already implementing some aspects of this proposal for the future.

A BRIEF PSYCHOLOGY OF COACHING

Before discussing the psychological aspects of coaching it is necessary to place the relevance of psychology to sport in its correct perspective. For example, in order for a Coach to have his team (or individual) reach the potential of which it is capable, he must examine three important areas -1, skill; 2, fitness; 3, the psychological aspect.

In most sports, a skilled team will beat an extremely fit but less skilled team, but when two teams are of equal skill, then the fitter team has an advantage. When two teams are of equal skill and fitness, it may well be the team which is superior psychologically that will be the victor. However, it should be clearly stated that superior psychological attributes can never make up for a lack of skill or fitness. Although the relative importance of each aspect may vary slightly with different sports, it is a belief that skill is the most important aspect, followed by fitness, and it is only when both of these have reached a very high level that the psychological attributes can be thought of as a deciding factor.

The concept of arousal is possibly a new term that is not familiar to many shooters. Simply stated, arousal refers to level of awakeness, alterness, attention or even emotional excitement of an individual, and it varies on a continuum from low to high. When we are at low levels of arousal (e.g. rather drowsy) our performance (both mental and physical) is very poor, but as we increase our level of arousal our performance greatly improves. At the other extreme if we are very highly aroused, tense and overly excited, our performance is also very poor. Between these two extremes we reach an optimal level of arousal and at this point we appear to give our best performance.

Obviously then, one of the Coach's tasks is to have all his shooters at their optimal level of arousal so that they may give their best performance. The level of arousal can be affected by various means, drugs, shock, noisy music, or emotional outbursts by the Coach, but a convenient method (and perhaps a more healthy way) is by a sub-maximal amount of physical exertion. A solid burst of between five to eight minutes of vigorous physical activity is sufficient for most athletes to reach their optimal level of arousal.

However, Coaches should be warned that there are personality differences between resting and optimal levels of arousal and arousability. For example introverts are usually more highly aroused than extroverts and reach their optimal levels of arousal earlier with a similar amount of stimulation. Similarly, more anxious personalities are more quickly aroused than stable personalities. Coaches should be prepared to experiment with individuals in order to find optimal levels of arousal, but they must also beware of increasing individuals, levels of arousal too high (whether by exertion or a fiery emotional speech) as too high a level of arousal is just as unsatisfactory as a low level.

Similar to personality it is now possible to measure motivation as defined by a number of factors, and to obtain a score on each of these factors for each individual. The motivational profile measures five desire factors (drive, aggression, determination, conscientiousness and leadership) and six emotional factors (self confidence, coachability, emotional maturity, trust, responsibility and mental toughness). The desire factors give an indication of an individual's willingness to work hard towards accomplishing desired goals, whilst the emotional factors reflect an athlete's personal attributes and feelings about himself and his Coach.

CENTRING PROCEDURE

The centring procedure can be rehearsed mentally as well as physically. We ask shooters to mentally rehearse various aspects of the actual performance situations, and to incorporate in that rehearsal the application of the Centring Procedure.

By "centring" you are directly countering the natural reponses you make in stressful situations.

1. Stand with your feet slightly apart and your knees slightly bent. Your weight should be evenly distributed. (Test this by leaning forward, backward, side to side). You should be aware of tension in your calves and thighs due to the knee bend.

- Consciously relax your neck and shoulder muscles. Let your mouth drop open slightly to reduce the tension in your jaw muscles.
- 3. Breathe in slowly from the diaphragm. Inhale slowly. Notice you are extending your stomach. Consciously maintain the relaxation in your chest and shoulders. Don't let the inhale cause the chest to expand and the shoulders to rise.
- 4. Exhale slowly. Become aware of the feelings in your abdomen. Notice your stomach muscles relaxing. At the same time, let your knees bend slightly as a reaction to the increasing feeling of heaviness that develops as you exhale and you feel your body press towards the ground.

PROCESS

The exhale counteracts the natural lifting caused by breathing in, and helps to make your body feel steadier. This attentional break counters both the physical and attentional responses to stress. If you attend to these relaxing physical cues you cannot attend to the negative distractions and fears that upset performance. The downward spiral is broken, allowing you to regain enough control and to remind yourself of some constructive action or focus shift to get back in the game.

Centring allows you to quickly recover attention and briefly lower arousal. To be effective the breathing exercise must be followed by a focus shift to more relevant cues.

APPLICATION

At first you are slowed down by checking whether you are doing all the right things. After a few practice attempts, the procedure becomes more automatic. You find yourself monitoring tension levels while you breathe in and out. Very quickly, you can learn to centre in the time it takes to inhale and exhale.



Imost 15,000 veteran athletes are expected to visit Brisbane to compete in the Third Australian Masters Games from October 12-20.

Held as part of the First APOSA Festival of Sport, the games will attract past national and international champions as well as competitive mature-aged sports participants from approximately 40 nations.

The assistant general manager of the Brisbane International Games Ltd, Ms Lols Appleby, who was involved in the First Australian Masters Games, said veteran sports were one of the most exciting growth areas for sports participants throughout the world.

Ms Appleby said that organisers were keen to hear from potential participants.


"The Games are open to everyone and participants do not have to be registered with a sporting organisation to compete," she said. Entry applications open in March and close on August 30, 1991.


