

The Australian Clay Target Association will hold their ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING on Friday, April 5 at Langley Plaza Hotel, 221 Adelaide Terrace, Perth, at 8.00p.m.

Note: Delegates' register will be open from 7pm, closing at 8pm.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
- Squads of 6 to shoot 50 Targets/75 Targets in brackets of 25 one
 visit only to the traps for all events except the National Double
 Barrel Championship where squads of 6 shoot 100 targets in
 two visits to the traps. Double Barrel refer Point 22.
- While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets/75 Targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two minutes time limit be exceeded by any shooter then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET shall be incurred.
- 5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be resquadded towards the end of the event.
- Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooter's signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- 8. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- Any unauthorized shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalized FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 10. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 12. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 14. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
- 15. Persons paying a reduced nomination are considered eligible for all High Gun Awards, Section(s), and Overall. Competitors must compete in a clear majority of programmed events to gain High Gun recognition.
- 16. The Overall Winner in any event shall not be eligible for additional recognition in any Grade or Section (full nomination). Competitors other than the Overall Winner in any event shall be eligible for recognition in any Grade or Section in whiter they are eligible to compete (full nomination). Competitors entering in any specific section of an event shall only be eligible for recognition in the section entered (reduced).

- nomination). ONE NOMINATION ONLY MAY BE PAID OPEN OR SECTION.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Competitors using automatic shotguns during the National Championships may recover their empty shells providing they have obtained an automatic I.D. card when nominating.
- Nominations will close daily at 11.00 a.m.
- 20. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
- 21. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 22. DOUBLE BARREL Any shooter who is late for his/her second round of 50 targets shall incur the loss of one target and be re-squadded towards the end of the event.

TRAP NATIONALS – CARTRIDGES

SHOOTERS INTENDING TO COMPETE IN THE 1991 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS ARE ADVISED THAT CARTRIDGES WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE FROM WINCHESTER AND SCORPIO, BOTH OF WHOM ARE LICENSED TO THE A.C.T.A. FOR CARTRIDGE SALES ON THE GROUND FOR THE PERIOD EMBRACING THE PRE-NATIONALS AND NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS.

CARTRIDGES OTHER THAN FROM LICENSED SUPPLIERS, WINCHESTER AND SCORPIO, WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE ON THE GROUNDS DURING THE PRE-NATIONALS AND NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS.

HANDICAPPING – NATIONALS 1991

To make it easier for all concerned — office staff, handicapper and shooters — we would like all shooters to please note and adhere to the following points:

- Please present your current 1991 handicap card for stamping before nominating. Also your up to date 1990 card.
- Nominations will not be accepted unless cards are stamped by the handicapper.
- 3. Any shooter unable to produce a 1991 handicap card, must produce a club receipt as proof of ACTA registration.
- 4. Such shooter shall be allowed to compete on handicap and grade given. But any moneys or trophies won shall be held by the ACTA until proof of handicap and grade are verified.
- Rule 2.1(m). Should it be found that a shooter deliberately misled Management regarding his grade and/or handicap, the shooter will be suspended for a period of three months.
- If an error is made on your card, have your club secretary or handicapper neatly rule out the error, rewrite it correctly, stamp and sign it.
- Any obvious low scores entered on handicap cards just prior to the Nationals that enables a shooter to be downgraded, will not be taken into consideration. Rule 2.7(a).
- Please watch the handicap board, if your name appears on the board, please report to the handicapper's office.
- If you do not wish to be downgraded, please advise the handicapper's office.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION - ENTRY

Entry into the 1991 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 1991 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors must produce their 1990 and 1991 registration cards, before nominating, to the 1991 Nationals Official Handicapper. Where a competitor was not registered for 1990 he must produce his 1991 registration card.

DIVISIONS

The competition will be divided into a number of divisions except in the 39th Australian Double Barrel Championship, where there is a separate Australian Women's Double Barrel Championship and an Australian Junior Double Barrel Championship, as well as the 37th Single Barrel Championship where there is a separate Women's Single Barrel Championship.

Shooters may only nominate in any one section of an event — Open, Ladies, Junior, Veteran.

Shooters who are eligible for, and elect to pay a reduced nomination (60% of open nomination) to enter a specific section, shall be eligible for the section entered, as well as all High Gun awards.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before sashes/medals/trophies are awarded.

When team selection is involved shooters shall be eligible for the open team irrespective of the section nominated for. In addition to open teams, shooters shall be eligible for team selection for the section nominated, Ladies, Junior or Veteran.

To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

AGE QUALIFICATIONS

Veterans — are those competitors over the age of 65 years on April 6, 1991.

Juniors — are those competitors who, on April 6, 1991 will be under the age of 18 years.

STARTING TIME

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am with the exception of the National Double Barrel event which shall commence at 8.00am on Sunday April 7.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be resquadded towards the end of the event.

Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

CARTRIDGES

Cartridges of the competitor's choice may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships from Winchester and Scorpio both of whom are licensed to the ACTA for cartridge sales on the ground for the period embracing the Pre Nationals and National Championships.

TARGETS AND TRAPS

Targets through the program are to be magpie and will be supplied by Winchester Australia. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers.

All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

CLASSIFICATIONS

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified — an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard.

This applies to trap grades, open, ladies, juniors and veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that regrading and rehandicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Ladies, Juniors and Veterans who have elected to enter the open section will be indicated on the High Gun Scoreboard as: OL, OJ, OV

PRACTICE

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships. Tickets may be purchased at the designated area.

CASH PRIZES

Cash prizes will be awarded in all events with the exception of the Grand Australian Handicap and Deauville Doubles, to the Overall winner and the winner of each grade.

The cash prize for the overall winner shall be calculated on 50c per nomination, the grade winner shall also be calculated on 50c per nomination.

SHOOT-OFFS, CONTINUATION OF EVENTS

If, for any reason, the event cannot be completed on the day it commences, the management reserves the right to stop shooting at any time if considered necessary.

In such a case, the competition will recommence where it left off, on the following day.

Catering

The catering service will be provided by an outside contractor. Arrangements are being made for meal services to be available with an extensive but practical menu.

Trade Displays

Commercial organisations associated with clay target shooting have supported the tournament by establishing displays of

products connected with the shooting sports. These displays will be located in an area specifically designated for trade exhibits. Competitors and visitors to the ground are encouraged to support these trade displays as, in this way, exhibitors can be encouraged to maintain their support for clay target shooting.

Parking

Ample parking is available for the cars of competitors and visitors. The parking area will be clearly marked. Please do not park in any area as being reserved, as freedom of movement is required at all times — PLEASE CO-OPERATE.

Souvenirs

In addition to a variety of souvenirs which will be offered by commercial supporters of clay target shooting the Australian Clay Target Association will merchandise a souvenir 1991 National Championship Badge.

HIGH GUN AWARDS

Overall High Gun Award: A Beretta SO5 Sidelock Trap Gun, cased (valued at over \$10,000), donated by Olin Australia — Winchester Division will be presented to the competitor with the highest aggregate score over the official program.

The J. Newton Thomas Trophy: (A perpetual cup plus memento) will be presented to the competitor with the highest aggregate score over the Trap Nationals event, together with the ACTA Gold Australia Badge, royal blue sash, and the Ron Porter Remembrance Trophy.

Ladies High Gun Award: The Eley Perpetual Trophy, royal blue sash and a gold medal together with a suitable trophy donated by Mrs Joan Scott, will be presented to the woman competitor with the highest aggregate score over the six official events.

The Bill Iles Junior High Gun: This perpetual trophy will be presented to the junior shooter with the highest aggregate score over the six official events plus a royal blue sash, gold medal and trophy.

Cec Herbert Veteran's High Gun Perpetual Trophy: Royal blue sash and gold medal and trophy will be presented to the competitor, aged 65 or over, who scores the highest aggregate over three events. These are the Australian Double Barrel Championship, the Australian Single Barrel Championship, and the Australia/New Zealand Trap Championship.

Everett and Attwood Junior Aggregate Award: A gold medal will be presented to the junior shooter with the highest aggregate over the three Mackintosh Team qualifying events.

Val & Fred Horton Perpetual Trophy: Will be presented to the veteran shooter who has the highest aggregate score of the six official events.

Val & Fred Horton Perpetual Trophy: Will be presented to the oldest shooter competing at the National Series.

HIGH GUN SCOREBOARD

A special scoreboard will be maintained which will show the progressive scores for the top 20 positions only. Additionally, this board will show details of progressive aggregate leaders from day to day. This board will be used to show details of regrading or handicap changes which have been made on a daily basis.

PRESENTATION OF TROPHIES

Where possible throughout the series, presentations of trophies shall be made on a daily basis, with High Gun trophies presented at the completion of shooting on the final day.

TROPHIES

All perpetual trophies to remain in the care and custody of the Australian Clay Target Association until the 1992 National Championships.

SATURDAY APRIL 6 — 8.30am OFFICIAL OPENING OF THE NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS followed by THE INTERSTATE SHOULDER TO SHOULDER TEAMS MATCH

Teams of five shooters representing each state in Australia have been selected in their home states following an elimination and selection procedure. The winning team will be presented with the ACTA Cup and each member will receive a memento badge.

Defending State: Tasmania.

SATURDAY APRIL 6 42nd GRAND AUSTRALIAN HANDICAP

Details: 50 targets, broken to count, double barrel, both barrels of equal value. To be shot from ACTA handicap marks, squad system, in one visit to the traps. Ties are to be broken by shoot-off, squad system, miss and out.

Nominations: Open \$28, L/J/V \$17. Optional sweep (not graded) \$3. An optional purse of \$5 will operate on this event, divided 60%, 30%, 10%.

Trophies and Awards: The outright winner will receive the Gordon Hall Perpetual Trophy together with a suitable trophy.

The winner will also receive the ACTA Silver Australia badge, royal blue sash and the Perazzi trophy donated by Austral Gun Co. Second placegetter will receive a trophy, together with a medal, third placegetter will receive a trophy and medal.

Handicap Group Trophies: 1kg Winchester 374AA Shotshell powder will be presented to the shooter who, being unplaced overall, has the highest score in the following groups: 11-15 metres, 16m, 17m, 18m, 19m, 20m, 21m, 22-25m.

Ladies Division: Winner to receive a medal and trophy. Junior Division: Winner to receive a medal and trophy.

Veteran Division: Winner to receive a medal and trophy.



SHOTSHELL CODING

Ross Williams has been writing a weekly shooting column for the sports section of **The Weekly Times**, Australia's biggest-selling rural newspaper, since 1977. The following article is reprinted by permission from that column.

Many moons ago, I took some reloaded shotshells from a pouch which had lain untouched for some time. It then dawned on me that I didn't have a clue about the contents of the shells. The weight of the shot charge, the size of the pellets, the wad and the nature of the powder charge were all in doubt.

What if I had thought the reloads contained sevens or nines and let fly with a bunch of SGs at a clay target ground? Or tried to down a lamb-killing boar with a trap load? Clearly the mystery rounds were not only a nuisance but a safety hazard.

Once I used to code-mark every reload. Then, as my loading activities expanded, I began to cut corners.

Eventually I decided that I only needed to pencil details on the storage boxes, avoid mixing different loads in my jacket pockets or whatever and return unfired cartridges to the right containers.

Then somewhere along the line I had the lapse which left unidentifiable cartriges in the pouch. I had fallen into the old, old trap — telling myself that I wouldn't let a mix-up happen instead of making sure that it couldn't happen.

So, suitably chastened by the experience, I went back to my original practice.

Code marks must be applied with something that is durable yet easily erased. Most felt-tipped markers with spirit-based ink seem to work well — the marks resist rubbing when dry, but turps wipes them off in a flash. Water-based ink is useless.

The code itself has to be as simple and unambiguous as possible. It hinges on the variety of loads employed by the individual for example, if you never change anything except the shot size, you only need to write the appropriate letter or number (SG, 3, 6, 7 etc).

On the other hand if you require a comprehensive code, you could try the following:

- ★ On one side of the base write A, B, C, D, E or F, representing 25, 28, 30, 32, 34 or 36 grams respectively, plus the shot size. Thus D6 would stand for 32 grams of No. 6.
 - ★ On the other side of the base, write three letters.

The first letter stands for the powder charge. For example, A might indicate "19.5 gns Green Dot", B might indicate "24 gns Vectan A1" and so on.

These letters plus their meanings are recorded in a notebook, even though it doesn't take much to remember the details of the more commonly used charges. If you run out of alphabet (and only the most avid experimenters will), you can use the letter as the symbol for the powder and write the charge weight in front of it.

The second letter represents the wad. Here you can establish a pattern that is easy to remember: W for "Winchester AA white", P for "Winchester AA pink" and so on.

And the third letter? This stands for the primer. Again a pattern based on initials is possible — F for "Federal 209", say.

Thus the sequence AWF would mean the shell contained 19.5 gns of Green Dot plus an AA (white) wad and Federal 209 primer.

- ★ If anything extra has been done, such as shortening the petals on the wad, dividing the shot charge or placing a card wad in the bottom of the shot cup, it can be covered by an additional letter. Examples might be: C for "cut petals", L for "longitudinal dividers", D for ".135 inch card wad insert" (D because it is the first letter of the word "disc").
- ★ In like fashion, times fired or times reloaded can be shown as a number on the brass wall.

There is no need to include details of the hull and crimp in the coding system, for we can tell what we have by looking at the hull itself

RULE CLARIFICATION — ISU SKEET

GUN POSITION

The current edition of the UIT's Special Technical Rules for Clay Target Shooting (dated 1st January, 1989) clearly outlines the requirements for gun position and jacket marking in ISU Skeet events.

These rules state . . .


S.6.23a "Until the target appears the competitor must stand in the ready position with both feet in the shooting station boundaries holding the gun with both hands (see Fig. 1). The gunstock must be in contact with the body of the shooter with the toe of the stock on or below the marking tape (see Fig. 1) and must remain in that position until the target appears.

S.6.23b No prolongation of the gun butt is permitted. To aid the referee in controlling the position of the gun, a mark approximately 25cm long and 2cm wide MUST be permanently affixed (see Fig. 1) on the right side of the outer garment (left side for left hand shooters) according to the height of the crest (top) of the individual's hip bone. The outer garment is any shooting coat, vest, sweater, shirt etc which is worn by the shooter and visible to the referee and jury during shooting."

The points that need emphasising from the rules are as follows:

- The gun position may be anywhere on or below a line from the crest of the hip bone to the centre of the stomach (approx).
- Shooters jackets MUST have a marking tape PERMANENTLY affixed to their jackets.
- 3. The gunstock must be touching the body.

The rules relating to these points are clear and the penalties applied to each breach of the rules are laid down (a warning for the first infringement, followed by the loss of one target for subsequent violation).



As incorrect gun position is a breach of the rules, so is the failure to have a permanently affixed mark on the shooting jacket. For many years, shooters have seen it as the responsibility of referees or jury members to 'tape' competitors prior to commencing a competition. This is not correct. As having a tape permanently fixed to the outer garment is a mandatory requirement of entry to the competition, it is the responsibility of the shooter and shooters who do not comply with the rules may be penalised accordingly.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Sir.

WHAT'S GOING ON??

Victoria by the roster system used was to host the 1991 Skeet Nationals. They have always, since their inception been conducted in November, but because of the 1991 World Championships to be held in Perth W.A. during that month, it became necessary to make a change of date for these titles.

We were led to believe the club where the titles were to be hosted had a problem with the date selected in that weather conditions could be unfavourable at that specific time. The month of May was then mooted as the preferred date to hold the titles by the selected club.

However regardless of unpredictable weather conditions, September appeared to be the most suitable time and was supported by the majority of states for valid reasons that can be explained. This we believe was confirmed after two postal votes were taken from within the National Executive.

Whilst we have no desire to get involved with the politics that exist at VCTA administration level, we are prepared to get involved far enough to request an explanation as to why our club after hearing of the problems, made a genuine offer to provide the facilities necessary to host these titles during September, the month selected by the ACTA (copy of letter herewith).

The VCTA has not as yet acknowledged our offer in writing or given any explanation as to why our club was not acceptable. Our enquiries have gained the knowledge that the Skeet Nationals have been handed back to the National Body to be allocated elsewhere. Perhaps the Skeet Shooters' representative on the National Shooting Committee could explain why he has allowed this tournament to leave Victoria when in fact the ACTA wanted the 1991 Skeet Nationals in this state.

The Victorian Government, if not today has in the past assisted our sport with the allocation of funds badly needed for the development of our sport. They no doubt will be delighted to hear the VCTA has returned the 1991 Skeet Nationals and allowed them to be hosted in, and by, another state.

Mildura Gun Club has also contributed to and supported the development of the sport, and given the opportunity will continue to do so.

It appears to us, some of the decisions made for the 1991 Skeet Nationals have been made by the selfish few, and not in the best interest of the sport.

EDITOR'S REPLY

The National Skeet Championships were allocated to Victoria for 1991. With the World Championships being held in Perth it became necessary to depart from the traditional November period with September being considered by the Executive Committee as being the most suitable month in which to shoot the Championship. This decision was relayed to the VCTA who in turn advised of their preference for the month of May as the grounds of the Melbourne Gun Club, the competition venue, were in danger of being flooded in September due to the unpredictability of the weather.

With a second Executive vote being taken the result produced a clear majority of votes against May with the votes not in favor of May clearly favouring Victoria as the host state if a suitable venue could be obtained by the VCTA.

This decision was then given to the VCTA who after discussing the matter at a meeting of their State Council decided against hosting the Nationals at other than Melbourne Gun Club in the month of May. As a result of the decision taken by the VCTA the Skeet Nationals were offered to and accepted by the NSWCTA who will host the Championships at Wagga Gun Club from September 12th to September 15th.

The ACTA did not at any time receive advice from the VCTA as to the availability of an alternative venue in Victoria during the preferred month of September therefore I am unable to offer any explanation as to why the VCTA may have considered your club unacceptable, similarly I am unable to assist with any explanation as to why your club's offer to the VCTA has not been acknowledged.

Should further information be required I would suggest that you approach the VCTA on the matters that you have raised.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

In reply to the letter of February 28 directed to all members of the ACTA Executive regarding the 1991 Skeet Nationals from Mr Laurie Connors,

As a member of the Management Committee and also one with a major involvement in the re-organisation of the national association. I felt obliged to make some response.

At the outset let me say that I can understand and sympathise with the obvious frustration felt by you and your club. I would also like to make clear that I have no axe to grind regarding this matter.

After the Skeet Nationals were awarded to Victoria normal practice required the VCTA to allocate the venue to an affiliate club and recommend that for acceptance by the ACTA. At no time has the VCTA proposed a venue other than Melbourne Gun Club.

Although members of the National Executive may have privately sympathised with your club's bid, had the ACTA awarded the venue to a club other than that recommended by the VCTA the screams would have been heard across the land. The VCTA could have justifiably claimed undue interference in state affairs by the national body and, I have no doubt, other state associations would have "come out" in sympathy with the Victorians.

I personally believe that the ACTA had to act cautiously and whether we did so in the best interests of the sport possibly remains to be seen. For the smooth administration of the sport and in the interests of national unity, it is essential that the ACTA deals only with the State associations on these matters. The day we deliberately by-pass a State organisation in favour of a club would be the beginning of the end of the national framework, not to speak of the enormous goodwill, that has been painstakingly built up in this sport over the years. It is not a matter of guts — it is a matter of national unity.

Now, I have no wish to comment on the VCTA's actions as that is the preserve of the Victorian affiliate clubs, I can only but suggest that is where you should be directing your attention as I firmly believe that the issue is primarily an internal matter for Victoria.

The ACTA made the allocation to Victoria for a number of good reasons and has been firm in its resolve that the event should be shot in that state.

I am sure that I speak for all the national executive in that had the VCTA recommended a venue other than Melbourne in September it would have been happily accepted.

DESIGNER ATHLETES?

In the years 1985 to 1990, the NSW ISU Sub-Committee designed and implemented a youth talent identification scheme with the objective of enriching and improving the core of ISU shooting in New South Wales. This labour of love, which became known as Project 91, appears to have had some beneficial effect on our younger men and women ISU disciples and those of you who may have an interest in this area may like to speak to Col Burt, David Menck and Brian Prosser about the Project.

Bear in mind that Project 91 was purely voluntary and based on resources available within our sport. Are there any grounds for supposing that with additional resources, such as the help of sports scientists and sports psychologists, a similar project might produce large verifiable benefits? Is it possible to identify, for example, ISU talent before the young person has handled a firearm? The answer to both questions appears to be "yes", if we look to an analogy in another sport.

Dr Allan Hahn, a physiologist at the Australian Institute of Sport, some years ago conducted tests on 77 elite Australian rowers, measuring strength, body dimensions, maximum energy output, oxygen uptake and performance in oxygen debt. The results of these tests were standardized to develop optimum characteristics of successful rowers.

A battery of field tests was refined to identify the necessary characteristics and in 1988 the tests were administered to approximately 500 secondary students. 47 of these students were subjected to further testing in the laboratory and 12 boys and 12 girls who passed this final screening were offered places in a specific training squad to train under expert coaches.

After sixteen months of rowing, crews from among these young people finished second in the junior fours at the Australian Nationals (other good young rowers might take 4-6 years to reach such a standard). Four of the girls and one of the boys were

subsequently selected to compete at the junior world championships in France, where the girls finished fourth in their final and the boys won a silver medal in the junior coxless fours. Subsequently, Allan Hahn said that these performances exceeded his expectations and that this project "will be used as a model for talent identification programs around (Australia)".

Where are we, in clay target shooting, in regard to talent identification and development?

The NSW ISU Sub-Committee has satisfied itself that Project 91 worked and indications I have received are that, properly supported with funds, sports scientists and sports psychologists, a similar project would be even more successful.

We have had in place for some time a five day residency programme at the Australian Institute of Sport. Places are available on this for selected young men and women. We need to take steps to review this programme to establish how costeffective and beneficial it is.

Talent identification, using scientific measurement of either experienced or untrained shooters is some years away. The reason for this is that we have yet to describe accurately the terribly important skill and psychological elements of our sport. Some sports scientists and coaches are getting a feel for these elements, but a lot of work remains to be done.

The details of Dr Hahn's remarkable work are sourced from the Third Report on the National Sports Research Programme, Canberra, October 1990.

OUR CHAMPION LADY SHOOTERS "TIM" READE 40 YEARS CLAY TARGET SHOOTING By George Biggs ACTA Historian

I am quite sure that "Tim" Reade could lay claim to the title of Australia's longest shooting lady clay target shooter. At my request Tim has given me the story of her forty years shooting clays. My first meeting with Tim was at the old Coburg Gun Club on the Merri Creek in Fawkner about 1950. The Coburg club later moved out to Epping and became what is now the Metropolitan Clay Target Club. "Tim' and myself began our shooting careers at the Coburg club, myself in 1939.



Tim's story goes on to relate her experiences and the many enjoyable occasions at club shoots around the country and of her successes at championship and handicap events in open competition with seasoned male competitors. In earlier days there was not enough lady shooters to warrant a separate section.

Tim started from 12 yards and worked her way back to be the first and only woman shooter to reach the 22 yards in handicap in the old system. Along the way she won quite a few championships all in open competition.

Tim recalls the first day she attended a club for her first crack at shooting clays at Coburg Gun Club. She relates how using a double barrel side by side hammer gun which did not fit her one bit and trying to hit a few targets, left her with a jaw and face twice its normal size. She decided there and then that this was the first and last time for her at clay target shooting. However after discussing her problem with George Biggs who was on the ground—he told Tim not to shoot any more that day and to come back on the next shoot and we will iron out the problems. George explained why the old side by side gun was not suitable for clay target shooting. He lent her his Browning U/O which fitted her

perfectly and after 40 years Tim is still using that gun. Tim would like to thank George for not only teaching her to shoot, but to really enjoy it.

It is my pleasure to be able to present to Members, the 1990 Annual Report and Balance Sheet of the Association. In presenting this report, the traditional format of reporting to members has been adhered to.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Comprising two appointed persons from each State Association plus an elected President, the Executive of the Association are the body responsible for the sport in conjunction with the four member Management Committee.

During the year no less than four new members were appointed as their State's Representative to the National Executive Committee replacing members who had served in some cases for many years.

Neil Hardy, first appointed to the National Body in 1978 and Richard Brook, appointed in 1987 both of whom gave excellent service in the roles as Executive Members were replaced as Queensland Delegates by Robert Nugent and Noel Deeley. Neil's experience and guidance at Management and Executive level as well as Richard's role as a member of the National Executive Committee will be a challenge for both Robert and Noel, however both have shown in their short term on the Executive that they will be excellent contributors to the future of the ACTA.

South Australia, George Steele and Northern Territory Paul Weis also vacated their positions during the year to Graham Michell and Phillip Grove. Graham as State President of SA and Phillip, State Secretary, NT, have both adapted quickly to the responsible National roles and will prove to be valuable members of the Committee. As in previous years, the Executive met on the one occasion only as a full Committee however as members of various Sub-Committees they were active in their roles on behalf of all registered shooters.

With the Executive acceptance of a new structure to administer the sport as from 1991 the coming year should see greater participation and additional responsibility which will no doubt reflect well on the sport in the coming years.

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Once again a very active committee throughout the year, President Jim Scott as Chairman and the Management Committee members worked well as a team throughout the year and instigated many changes that will carry the Association through the challenging years ahead.

As part of the Executive approved Organisational Structure that will be introduced as from May of 1991, greater responsibility will be given to the Management Committee which will in turn place a greater responsibility on those who fill Management roles.

If the Management Committee of 1991 follow the example set in 1990 then the Association will be in good hands as throughout their year of office all members gave willingly of their time and are to be commended for the responsible and careful manner in which they carried out their trusted roles. During the year skeet shooters representative Robert Dower (SA) did not seek reappointment and was replaced on the National Shooting Committee by Robert Buchan (Vic). One of the difficulties in the role of shooter representative is the lack of subject matter placed before them on behalf of the discipline they represent. One could say that this is due to the discipline not requiring change or improvement. However one could also say that is due to a lack of interest in matters related to the administration of the sport. As individuals let us each judge the correct reason.

AUSTRALIAN SHOOTING ASSOCIATION

As an umbrella body the Australian Shooting Association is the body responsible for Australia's participation in International Shooting events culminating with the Commonwealth and Olympic Games. Shotgun Delegates to the ASA, Alan Maher and Robert Smith attended the various meetings of the ASA and at all times endeavoured to represent the shooting sports to the best of their ability. Senior roles trusted to ACTA Delegates include that of Vice President/Management/International Competitions as well as Australian Olympic Committee Delegate and Delegate to the UIT.

The Annual General Meeting of the ASA produced a change in leadership with Alistair MacPherson, Chairman of the National Rifle Association replacing long serving Richard Willis as President due to his unavailability owing to personal commitments.

AUSTRALIAN OLYMPIC COMMITTEE

Australian Delegates Dick Willis and Alan Maher were active throughout the year on matters related to shooting over all disciplines. The introduction of a points system from where athletes can aspire to Olympic selection will prove to be beneficial in the long term, however certain difficulties have been encountered none less than the method used by the AOC when providing funds for International competition. Notwithstanding as a sport we are supportive of any system that enables our athletes to obtain solid performances that can be used to determine their ability at World level as they strive for Olympic selection.

AUSTRALIAN SPORTS COMMISSION

Continued recognition by the Australian Sports Commission is vital to Australia's success at International Level. In addition to financial support the Commission through the Australian Institute of Sport provides an opportunity for live in participation at the Institute for members of our National Training Squad at which time the facilities of the Institute are able to be exploited to their best advantage.

With the financial assistance that the sport and individuals are able to receive our image at world level is highly respected and our athletes are able to achieve the exposure they must have in International Competition.

Unfortunately due to changing circumstances the opportunity to attend the Institute during 1990 was not able to be accepted however we look forward to 1991 when time hopefully allows for a return to the Institute.

We look forward to strengthening our relations with the Commission and thank their officers for the support given to the ACTA during the year.

NATIONAL COACHING COUNCIL

With each State Association appointing a member to the National Coaching Council under the Chairmanship of National Director of Coaching, Guy Boileau the Coaching Council is primarily a body responsible for a level standard of coaching procedures in all States. A seminar took place in Melbourne during September at which time Guy Boileau newly appointed Director of Coaching was able to meet with members of the National Coaching Council for the first occasion.

Administering to the requirements of the Coaching Council is a difficult function to fulfil unless co-operation and support is

received from council members. This support for Guy was forthcoming from all members and as a result 1991 will see a noticeable increase in the activities of the Coaching Council.

DIRECTOR OF COACHING

Appointed in June 1990, Guy Boileau brought with him a wealth of experience with which he will be able to administer to the needs of the Coaching Council. A change of direction however has occurred with the role of Director of Coaching becoming an administrative function not allied to coaching duties which are recognised as being the responsibility of each State Coaching Director to implement at State Level.

Combined with Guy's role with the Coaching Council is that of administration within the National Office where his abilities were quickly to the fore.

The Association will benefit from the combined roles of Director of Coaching/Office Administrator as will the National Coaching Council whose members have already experienced the services that Guy has to offer.

STATE ASSOCIATIONS

The support received from the secretaries of each State Association must not be underestimated for without their contribution the sport in each State would not be anywhere as well administered as is the case.

A recommendation is to be made in the new year to State Associations for them to restructure their State Council along the lines that are being introduced at National level. While it is only a recommendation it is trusted that the majority if not all States will support the recommendations from the Executive Committee.

COMMONWEALTH GAMES FEDERATION

Shooting was certainly one of the most successful sports at the Commonwealth Games in Auckland with a large number of medals won over the various disciplines that were shot. Shotgun was rewarded when Illawarra shooter John Maxwell won an individual gold medal in Olympic Trap, the first gold ever in a shotgun event at the Commonwealth Games. The Australian team of John Maxwell, Russell Mark, Ian Hale and Craig Meuleman all gave of their best during the games and are to be congratulated on their selection as members of the Australian Shooting Team. Through the Australian Shooting Association Australia is well represented at Commonwealth Games level by Peter Anderson and Alistair MacPherson.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS 1990

With the full World Shooting Championships held in Moscow competition for medals was always going to be tough. This certainly proved to be the case when some outstanding performances were recorded over all shooting disciplines.

The Australian Shotgun Team under Team Manager Robert Smith found the opposition to be too good on the days of competition and while not amongst the winners will nevertheless benefit greatly with the experience that was obtained.

Special thanks and appreciation must go to both Terry Morony and Reg Wagland of WA who are very actively involved in most areas of

the organisation and are totally committed to the success of the Championships in Australia as are all members of the World Championships Organising Committee.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION

OPEN

The 44th year of competition for the prestigious Mackintosh Trophy shot in Australia for the first time using 28gr/loz loads which may have accounted for the unusually low scores that were recorded which placed Australia 7270 in fifth position ahead of Wales, New Zealand and Zimbabwe.

Congratulations to Canada, the winning country whose score of 7371/7500 allowed for a reasonably comfortable victory over England 7337.

LADIES

Australia the defending country also found the going to be tough finishing in sixth position 1341 ahead of Ireland 1262. The England Team recorded an excellent 1446/1500 to defeat Canada 1416.

JUNIOR

Australia again the defending country found the opposition too strong finishing in fifth place 1392 ahead of New Zealand 1339. A tied score for first between Canada and Scotland 1473/1500.

MEMBERSHIP

A reasonably stable membership was achieved for the year despite the difficulties encountered in the economy. A trend from each previous year again showed out by the reduction in real numbers from the previous year of approximately 20% which was recouped by the registrations of new shooters or alternatively shooters registering after a break of 5 or more years.

If this historical reduction could be arrested for just one year then the Association would reap the benefit, not only financially but by the introduction of some 1000-1500 members whose presence would be felt where it is most needed, at club level.

CLAY TARGET SHOOTING NEWS

As a means of communication to our members the CTSN is considered in the sporting world to be equal to the best that is available. Posted monthly to each registered shooter at a nett cost of .21c per month including postage the CTSN represents excellent value as a means of communicating not only to members on National Office matters but as importantly the notification of the various shooting programs that abound throughout all states.

Not to be confused with any commercial publication available at a much higher cost on the news-stand the CTSN continues to reflect well on the sport as a publication and with the introduction of our yet untried Desk Top Publishing facility which will come on stream during the middle of 1991 changes will be noticed. Credit for the CTSN must be given to Leanne Day who understands the magazine and more importantly those who regularly subscribe for its services.

ACTA PATRON

Owing to the death during 1989 of Sir Henry Bolte, the Association approached the Right Honourable Mr Malcolm Fraser, AC., CH., with the request that he accept the position of Patron. Mr Fraser in his reply proudly accepted the role of ACTA Patron and we look forward to a close and long association with him. As a token of appreciation Mr Fraser was presented with a plaque denoting his role as ACTA Patron and we trust that it will occupy a prominent position in his office.

PRESIDENTIAL MEDAL

The Association's most prestigious award, the Presidential Medal was presented to Mr Reg Varley of Guyra NSW for his services to the Sport. Presentation was made at the 1990 Trap Nationals in Tasmania where Mr Varley proudly received the recognition of his peers, from President J Scott to join a list of worthy recipients who have been recognised for their contribution to Clay Target Shooting.

SPONSORS

Demands upon sponsors from club to National Level are ever present and increasing. Fortunately this sport is blessed with

individuals and organisations who are always quick to respond upon a call for sponsorship. To the many and varied sponsors who support the ACTA and Clay Target Shooting we say thank you and trust that the support you give is returned by those who benefit from the support that is so readily given.

ADMINISTRATION

One would only need to visit the office on one or more occasions to appreciate the heavy demands placed on the administration capabilities of the office by our members.

Fortunately however the Association is well served by its employees who while seldom receiving brickbats less seldom receive bouquets for their efforts. Reading through last year's annual report the comment was made to "not expect miracles". As miracles are still expected particularly when it comes to CTSN deadlines please consider the demands placed upon the office by allowing for a reasonable time period in which to assist with the queries that are received.

NATIONAL OFFICE

Structural alterations took place during the latter part of the year when the interior of the office was redesigned to allow for a more efficient working area to be deployed.

Visitors to the office will no doubt recognise the advantages of the present design as against what had been inherited when first we leased the building prior to purchase.

A prominent feature is the magnificent Honour Board which was able to be obtained with the financial assistance of the NSWCTA who were the providers of a generous donation which enabled the Honour Board to be obtained.

A very pleasing decision taken during the year was to return to those who had assisted the Association with building debentures all moneys that had been made available to assist with the procurement of a National Office. The return of debentures was some eight years ahead of schedule and augurs well for the sound financial position the ACTA does enjoy.

It is without question, the National Office is very much a working office to which the many visitors to the office will no doubt attest. Being busy is one thing, capable another and in this regard, the ACTA is fortunate indeed to have in their employ people who capably administer their various roles.

SUMMARY

1990 has produced mixed results for the Association. Possibly the major disturbing matter is the continual albeit small erosion in numbers who are registering to shoot clay targets. No doubt the economic climate has an effect however the concern is there that we must at all costs make every effort to promote and encourage the sport.

Financially however the ACTA has never had a more solid base from which to operate. For many years we recorded losses on our balance sheet, this trend has now been arrested and for the third successive year a surplus of satisfactory standard has been achieved.

Finance alone however does not represent success; it is merely a part of what must be done to ensure the continuation of the ACTA as a major National Sporting Body through which our sport is promoted to the level of Commonwealth and Olympic Games.

I would like in closing to thank particularly President Jim Scott for his efforts and support throughout the year of office. In addition Vice President Ross Silvester and Management Members Pud Burgess and Bob Fox have also been very supportive to both myself and the important roles they fill.

I would also like to thank the members of the Executive Committee all of whom are assured that in the coming year we at the national office will do our utmost to provide them with support that is required for them to represent the shooters of Australia.

Finally, a vote of thanks to Leanne Day, Tina Costello, Antoniette Dal-Santo and Guy Boileau for their assistance throughout what has been an extremely busy and on some occasions an office where their capabilities instead of being recognised are taken for granted.

With 101 shooters taking part the field for the Commonwealth Title included a number of very experienced competitors including Commonwealth Games medallist John Maxwell who with fellow Commonwealth and Olympic Games representative Russell Mark were expected to be among the leading contenders.

the way and went into the final with a 5 target lead over Brett Dunstan whose experience in the 1987 and 1989 World Championships was holding him in good stead.

Heading this well credentialled group was Victoria's Russell Mark whose ability needs no further explanation and Frankston's Tony Rowe out to show the young ones how it is done.

At the close of the event Russell added to his Commonwealth Title with a total 215/225. Following a shootoff for overall second Tony Rowe 215/226 won the day outshooting Illawarra's John Maxwell 214/226 in a one target shoot off.

All in all excellent results with top class scores.







 State Trench Team Victors: John Maxwell, Jim Ellis and Michael Diamond.


State pride was evident in both the skeet and trench teams matches and with the honour of being able to represent their state all team members contributed well to their states performance.

Bob Andrews (Bordertown Gun Club) won the 60 target Champion of Champions event with a perfect 125/125.





ANNUAL SKEET CARNIVAL REPORT

The Tamworth Clay Target Club held the annual skeet carnival on the weekend of 16-17 February. The carnival actually began on the Friday afternoon with 2 rounds of skeet doubles. There were some 30 local and visiting shooters present to commence the carnival and some excellent scores were posted considering that doubles have only been introduced in recent times.

Saturday saw some 68 shooters from all over eastern Australia,

including Sydney, Melbourne and Brisbane and areas throughout the states, arriving for what has become one of the premier events on the skeet shooting calendar. There was some excellent shooting during the day with several shooters shooting all day without dropping a target on the programme which resulted in some hotly contested shoot-offs to decide the winners.

The handicap event on Saturday afternoon resulted in a popular win for a relatively new shooter to the sport. Tamworth shooter Ross Freestone eventually won the event after a long shoot-off with a total score of 150/158 which resulted in a promotion to B Grade as well as a fine trophy.

Cooler conditions on Sunday saw 71 shooters in attendance. Highlights of the day included the completion of a very fine 199/200 shot by Mark Agar of Sydney to take out the High Gun for the two days, an outright win in C Grade in the Northern Zone Championship for local junior George Barton (14) who also won the Junior High Gun and some very fine shooting by local and visiting shooters with some shooters only dropping 2-3 targets for the two-day programme.

It was pleasing to see the trophies being distributed to so many different shooters, but even more pleasing to see so many local shooters winning trophies when the most of the visiting shooters are usually at their peak in the sport and their grades. 


