



INFORMAL COACHING



Ross Williams write a weekly shooting column for the sports section of *The Weekly Times*. Australia's biggest-selling rural newspaper. He also has a syndicated column in a number of provincial papers. This article is reprinted by permission from the latter.

For a beginning shooter, a visit to a club practice session can be a valuable experience or a complete turn-off.

If a skilled coach is available, the newcomer usually goes home with a satisfied feeling and the determination to learn more. But the absence of a coach can easily mean a barrage of confusing and sometimes conflicting advice from well-meaning members.

Some clubs take the view that all experienced members should be ready to do some informal coaching as the need arises, so they try to ensure that the old hands know the basics of introducing new shooters to the sport. Guidelines are placed on noticeboards; a few even run periodic training programs to improve their members' instructing skills.

The following pointers seem to be widely accepted:

- A beginner needs to have confidence in the instructor plus a single style of explanation. Therefore members should not butt in when a colleague is instructing. Where others believe they can contribute, they should speak quietly to the instructor, not the learner.
- Ear and eye protection should be available. No learner should be allowed to shoot until he or she has been shown the basic safety procedures, range safety commands and signals.
- With raw beginners, cartridges should be issued singly at the firing line or shooting station, not beforehand.
- Shooting should be preceded by instruction with empty firearms.
 The instructor demonstrates the whole skill, then breaks it down into small, manageable parts. In the case of clay target shooting, these might be stance, mounting and swing.

The trainee practises each component separately before putting them together and practising the whole skill.

- Ensure early success by way of easy targets (provided other shooters in the same squad or detail agree), plus mild cartridges and reasonable gun or rifle fit.
- Firearms must remain unloaded until the trainee's feet are firmly fixed in the shooting position. (For prone rifle shooting, the trainee should be lying down with body correctly positioned before cartridges are issued).
- The instructor should stand close behind the shooter, ready to intervene physically. Novice shotgunners, for example, are apt to swing the gun around if they score a hit; the instructor has to be ready to block this instinctive movement.
- The instructor should not step away from the trainee until the firearm has been opened and unloaded.
- Feedback should be specific not "You missed behind", but "You lifted your head" or "You stopped your swing". Furthermore, the beginner needs to be told what to do to correct the fault.
- Positive comments should exceed negative comments by a large margin, so the instructor MUST find things to praise.

- At the end of the session, sum up the trainee's strengths and weaknesses and send him or her away with something to practise at home.
- Ensure physical comfort. Since lightweight shotguns accentuate
 recoil, they should be avoided. Stance and hold should be
 watched. Clothing in the shoulder area should be adequate, but
 not so loose as to bunch up underneath the butt. Similarly, warn
 females against bra strap buckles under the recoil pad, as these
 can produce cuts and abrasions.

EARLY CLUB DAYS IN VICTORIA & TASMANIA

1936, three years before World War II, trap shooting in Australia was just beginning to get interested in a new kind of trap shooting "Clay Targets". It was a period when live bird clubs were deciding to get behind the new kind of trap shooting, at what some live bird shooters called "mud pies". It was an interesting observation to note that a few of the well known live bird shooters could not or did not want to continue with clay target shooting. Actually what did happen was the introduction of a completely new group of clay target shooters. Unfortunately with the outbreak of World War II in late 1939, trap shooting was more or less put on hold for the next 5-6 years.

I am indebted to a friend in Tasmania and a member of Burnie Gun Club (one of Australia's oldest clubs), Mr Bob Young. Bob sent me a clip of the "Weekly Times" of October 1936. It details gun club shooting reports and an article headed "The Effects of Gun Recoil" by "Crossbolt". It makes interesting reading, however I am not sure about comparing it with the sport of boxing, how say you? The report on skeet shooting was "made up" event as skeet was not a part of our competition at that time.

POINTS TO WATCH

It might be argued that it doesn't require the fourth of a second for the mind to realise a miss which the eye can see instantly, says Charles Askins in a chapter of his book, "Wing & Trap Shooting", dealing with the effect of recoil. When the mind has just concluded a strenuous piece of work, like aiming and firing a gun, it pauses an instant before tackling a fresh problem. Combining this cessation of brain recording with the shock of recoil which causes the brain to cease acting entirely for a space of time, however small, and we have a loss of at least a quarter of a second, perhaps more.

In fact, so far has the bird flown meantime, that the gunner despairs of being able to reach it, and so withholds his fire.

Recoil and its effects upon the shooter are worthy of careful study. It effects everyone, but in varying degrees. It has been observed that the most noted pigeon shots are men of strong physique, some of them seeming almost impervious to recoil, on the same principle that a pugilist might without blinking an eye take a blow on the jaw which would render an ordinary man unconscious. The jar of a shotguns recoil and the blow of a fist differ only in the extent of shock and the time needed to recover. The shotgun may knock you out for perhaps not more than the tenth of a second, while the fist blow might 'put you away" for ten minutes. Nevertheless, no matter how hardy the constitution of a man, there is a shorter or longer space of time after a shot is fired when he can do nothing apart from acting involuntarily, for the brain has been momentarily shocked into a state of coma. Notwithstanding this, the nerves and muscles can be taught to accomplish orders given previous to this shock, maintaining certain actions automatically, or as we say, from habit.

The boxer does this when he starts a blow and sends it in after receiving such a jarring slap himself that he cannot remember when his own fist landed. If anyone doubts the effect of recoil shock upon the brain, let him try to recall the movements of his gun muzzle immediately subsequent to firing. In the case of the writer, his first distinct knowledge of where his gun is directed is when he finds it pointing below the target. Reasoning the matter out, he knows that the muzzle first flew up and then reacted downwards, but from anything the brain has actually recorded it simply dropped below the point of aim. Accepting the foregoing as true, there can be seen the need of acquiring such a habit of maintaining the swing — such an absolutely fixed habit as to require no direct brain control.

Warrnambool Club

A representative gathering of Western District trap-shooters assembled at Warmambool last Saturday to contest the Western District Pigeon Championship (Western District Gun Clubs Association), which was at 15 birds off 30 yards, three misses to

Association), which was at 15 birds off 30 yards, three misses to retire. The birds were fast and tricky, and failures were numerous, the honors eventually going to A.H. Lewis (Lismore), with 17-21, M. Arundel being second (15-20), and R. Crawley third (13-17). The attached sweep (miss-out) was won outright on the 5th round by Nelson (Koroit).

The winner has been shooting for a number of years with minor successes, but this is the first important title which he has won.

Followed a £25 Pigeon Handicap, which, owing to a shortage of birds, was divided on the fourth round by A. Baird (Warmambool), A. Lewis (Lismore), H. Smith (Noorat) and "Harkaway" (Lismore), two noms. each, and J.O. Tait, "Midlands", K. Urquhart, R. Morrison, M. Arundel and Dalmeny, one nom, each.

The final sweep off the "fence" was divided by Utting, T. Densley,
Tait, A.G. Dawson and J. Crawford.

Altogether 29 shooters were present, the championship attracting 23 entries and the handicap 24 double noms. and 17 stars. Lismore, Noorat, Terang, Koroit, Hawkesdale, Warrnambool and other districts were well represented.

Clay targets were thrown to complete a successful day, and some promising shooters at this class of shooting were discovered, so that it would not appear far distant when this progressive club may have a clay target club connected therewith.

Extraordinary Finish

The most extraordinary finish to a shooting match seen in Melbourne for years was the tit-bit of the Commonwealth sparrow championship conducted at Tottenham, under G.C.A. rules, by the Melbourne Gun Club last Thursday. At one stage six shooters were level in the lead, with a win in sight, and all six missed consecutively. Conditions were 21 birds from 23 yards, with three misses entailing an elimination. Shadows and a gusty southerly made conditions rather difficult, and all 39 competitors; were eliminated before the 12th round was reached. At the end of the series of 264 birds, 101 fell to the first barrel, 41 to the second, and 122 escaped. Howell (two seconds), Robinson (two seconds), and Metherall (three seconds) with sixes,

had the best sequences. When the final six went to the mark each missed the eleventh. "Calrossie", Jerrett and R. Craig dropped out on the 13th whereupon C. Max Howell (Ballarat), D.E. Robinson (Digger's Rest), and R. Metherall (Geelong) divided the optional sweepstakes. The 15th was fatal to Howell and Robinson, leaving Metherall to win with 12-15. This was the winner's sixth title in a little over 12 months.

Glenburnie Club

The Glenburnie Gun Club completed its programme for the season with a £20 pigeon match. The birds were a fast lot and, assisted by a rear wind, fully tested the shooters. Conditions of the match provided for double nominations and 23 shooters nominated. At the end of the eighth round J. Robinson still had both nominations going, and A.J. Janeway, A.H. Edwards, R. Wombell and J. Tregenza had one. These shooters divided the money. A missout sweep, in which 16 entered, was divided by J. Tregenza, A.H. Gilles and P. Wombell on the ninth round. P. Wombell scored 19-20 for the day, with two second barrels, and J. Robinson had an unfinished break of 16, with one second barrel.

Skeet Championship?

Thirty-three competitors shot for the Victorian skeet championships decided by the Melbourne Gun Club at Tottenham on Thursday. The event, which carried three silver cups, was shot at three rounds of seven each. An innovation was that the discs from the left boundary were thrown from a tower, while those from the right were propelled from ground level. When the final section began S. Reseigh, A.F. Burns and J. Brown (holder of the title) led by 13-14 from five others. Over the concluding stage Reseigh and Burns alone broke the lot. They shared the attached sweepstakes and then continued for the title, decided with another round of seven. Burns won with 27-28 to 26-28. This was Burns' second title, he having won the Victorian sparrow championship last year. He has been shooting over the traps for only 15 months.

Re: 28gr/loz loads as described by the sub committees as advised August CTSN.

Speaking for myself personally, it does not bother me as to what applies to National or International Championship shoots — sub para (i) as I am governed by my income as to what I can afford to pursue.

Sub para (ii) 1993 infers that 28gr loads shall be mandatory under the shooting rules of the ACTA — has concerned me to the extent that; it is going to involve considerable expense to change my reloading equipment to comply with the demands of the ACTA ruling. I am not sure that I can afford such a change. It has taken me some period of time to establish what I have today.

I am a member of two gun clubs and enjoy my days shooting when those dates come around at those clubs, I am sure there are others like me who wonder what do we do now? Form gun clubs independent of the ACTA and do our own little thing?

The decision that the sub-committees have taken in this matter was not very diplomatic - surely it would have been more prudent to have had the various gun clubs to have taken a preferential vote on this matter, and show some concern to ordinary small club members.



MILDURA GUN CLUB QUEEN'S BIRTHDAY SHOOT




The club is appreciative to Thomas Jewellers of Ballarat for their valuable sponsorship, making the Ladies trophy a much sort after prize.

The club is grateful for all those who helped to make the day a success and we hope to see you all again next year.






