



LENGTHENING FORCING CONES

This is lengthening the existing taper from chamber to barrel from around 15-25mm long to 44-48mm long, depending on the diameter of the barrel. In existing barrels the shot on the outside row races forwards and gets deformed by the sharp angle of the cone, and therefore does not fly truly and gives you the 'fliers' on the outside of the pattern. If you lengthen the taper, then the shot does not get deformed, which gives much more even and denser patterns as the flyers are now being put to use in the pattern proper. It also reduces recoil by allowing a longer time for the shot to get into the smaller diameter of the barrel over a longer time which has the effect of a push type recoil rather than a sharp jolt type recoil.

Is enlarging the whole length of the barrel. This gives: (a) less recoil; (b) better patterns, especially for 1 ounce shells; (c) shorter shot string; (d) the ability to give tighter chokes as if you bore the barrel out .010" bigger then a 34 choke becomes a full choke.

CHOKE ALTERATIONS: Chrome or Non Chrome \$60/Barrel Choke Regulating \$140/Barrel

We can just bore out chokes to a particular size or we can regulate the pattern to throw a particular pattern at a nominated distance with a nominated cartridge and shot size e.g. 60% pattern with a 325, 8, at 40 metres.

SPORTING COMMUNITY ENDORSES BUDGET

The Confederation of Australian Sport has reacted positively to today's sporting budget.

The Budget delivers an increase of about \$7M to sport to bring the total Sport and Recreation Budget to around \$75.8M.

The Confederation has acknowledged the role of Sports Minister, Mrs Ros Kelly, in ensuring that the Government honours previous commitments to establish an increased budget for Australian sport.

The Executive Director of the Confederation, Mr Dene Moore, said that the sporting industry was at last achieving appropriate recognition. "The sporting budget is an investment in Australia's future", Mr Moore said.

Independent research has shown that sport:

- employs over 150,000 people throughout Australia;
- as an industry accounts for about 1% of the gross domestic product, or approximately \$2.58 per annum;
- with over 6 million registered participants in sport, makes an enormous contribution to the health and fitness of the nation and plays a major role in preventative medicine;
- involves a vast network of volunteers whose contribution has been valued at approximately \$1.7B dollars per annum;
- is a major contributor to our international recognition and exposure and plays a vital role in the creation of our national identity.

"The Confederation does not expect individual sporting bodies to receive any significant increases in their individual funding as a result of this budget", said Mr Moore. "We are however delighted that the Government has accepted the Confederation's view that sporting facilities require urgent attention." The Budget includes an amount of \$8M towards the establishment of a new Community Recreation and Sporting Facilities Program.

The Coniederation has also expressed its strong support for the budget allocation of \$2.3M for the first full year of operation of the Australian Sports Drug Agency including allocations for drug testing.

"The Confederation will continue to argue for a balanced approach in the application of this sporting budget", Mr Moore added. "Australia's sporting system must receive attention to all its elements including junior participation, administrative improvement and coaching standards as well as funding international competition and supporting our top athletes".

AUSTRIAN TRAP CHAMPIONSHIP TO AUSTRALIA

Continuing his success at International level, Geelong Chub's Russell Mark outshot the rest of the field to win the Austrian International Olympic Trap Championship which concluded on August 25.

Ās conditions were extremely poor it was not possible to conclude the match on the second day with shooting resuming on the Sunday morning for those squads who had not been able to complete their last rounds and a result a six man final was not shot. With rounds of 25 24 24 25 25 23 23 22, Russell's winning score of 191/200 was four targets ahead of second place with a further two targets between second and third.

It has certainly been a great year for Australia on the international scene with both Russell and John Summers recording great World Cup performances.

RIVERINA ZONE CARNIVAL

The New South Wales Riverina Zone Carnival was held at the Griffith Gun Club on August 31. Sixty-eight shooters attended and shot in drizzly rain and cold conditions early, but weather did improve during the day.

The eye opener saw 25 shooters record the possible. In the Zone Double Barrel Championship only six qualifiers were required to shoot off, after the first 25 shoot off targets only three competitors remained. These shooters continued smoking targets with G. Thatcher being the eventual winner on 76/76 from R. Ehlers 75/76.

The Ladies Double Barrel Championship was shot in conjunction and was won outright by Lyn Blake with 22/25. Helen Sanders gained second place with 17/25. The Johnny Cox Memorial Shield was also contested in conjunction and was won by the Tumut No 1 team with the score of 119/125.

The Zone Pointscore Championship was won outright by Steve Guest with the only possible. Tony and Chris Salafia then fought out AA grade with Chris the eventual winner scoring 128/132.

There were no possibles in the Zone Single Barrel Championship. Five shooters with 24/25 shot off and T. Salafia won with a score of 38/39 from B. Hooper 37/39.

A Handicap Trophy event was held for the first time in several years and was won by M. Monteleone with 30/30 from K. Gelton 29/30. The Ladies Trophy was won by Lyn Blake after a shoot off with Liz Thatcher with a score of 21/28.





SAME HIGH QUALITY

HOW, WHY AND WHERE — To look for the Target

The next time you miss a target, ask yourself this question, "Did I really see that target leaving the trap bright and clearly?". Your answer will surely be, "Well no, not really, I only saw it after it got out a bit further causing me to make a hurried shot that resulted in a miss."

The problem of seeing the target quickly begins at the trap house which means we must focus our complete concentration on seeing the target as quickly as possible as it leaves the trap house. This advice applies for both trap and skeet shooters. I am quite sure some shooters will say — "OK, what's the big deal in seeing the target so soon?" Well the answer is simply the further out you see the target, the more certain you are prone to make a quick jab at it and stop the gun as you fire, and for sure the chances are you will miss the target. In order that you break target after target you simply must see the target clearly as it is leaving the trap every time you call for it.

The main reason shooters fail to see the target leave are lack of know how on what is the correct procedure in pointing the gun on the trap house before calling for the target. At this point we will assume that you have a trap gun that is suitable for clay target shooting and that the gun fits you correctly and that you have been instructed in the proper way to handle it. What you would be aware of is the importance of good gun fit and proper gun pointing and gun on shoulder position. If these details are not right, then you will never be able to correctly control your gun and if you are not able to do this, you will never be able to point accurately on the target. Hence your scores will suffer and you will possibly have a bruised shoulder and a sore cheek.

Gun point on the trap house

I never cease to be amazed at the number of shooters who pay scant attention to proper procedure when calling for the target.


It matters not whether you shoot one eye or two eyes, your concentration should be just over the front edge of the trap house roof where the target will emerge. This is the critical area where target travel direction will be known. You must completely disregard everything else while you form a quick mental picture of correct procedure of shooting the target. When this mental picture is complete, call for the target, you will find that the whole action of tracking the target, lead, fire and follow through, becomes easier and more of an automatic action — provided you keep your eye on the target and your face on the comb all the way out until the target is broken. This is my favourite technique and one of the basic fundamentals of shooting clay targets, both trap and skeet.

There are two methods of gun hold on the trap house. Possibly the most common style and one that most shooters have been instructed to practice is — to hold the gun with the front sight bead just sitting on the front edge of the trap house at the locations corresponding to each lane (see drawing).

With his gun held at this point the shooter will focus for eye contact with the target about fifteen inches up from the hold point where he will pick up the target angle as it leaves the trap. It is important that you do not move the gun until after the call and before the target appears. At this point you must be sure to keep your cheek down snug on the stock and keep it there all the way up and out to the point of breaking the target. Any diversion from this detail will mean a lost target for sure. The forend method is the one I would suggest for the shooter who has to close one eye.


Another method of gun hold on the trap house is the one I have used personally all my shooting career, but unfortunately it is only the shooter who shoots two eyes that can adapt this style. The method calls for the gun to be held at a point above the trap house up to 2½ to 3 feet depending on wind conditions. (See drawing) The shooter will still focus for eye contact with the target, actually looking under the barrels for the target. This is a style that has a lot going for it, in that it cuts down on gun movement and tends to make the shooter concentrate more intensely on seeing the target leave the trap, this is what we want. The shooter who shoots one eye cannot adopt this style because when the left eye is closed the view of the target leaving the trap is lost. To overcome this problem the one eyed shooter would have to wait for the target to arise above the gun. In so doing, he cancels out the advantage he would otherwise have.


The main advantages in the high gun hold are that the amount of gun swing is reduced and the actual gun movement is not so fast, therefore allowing for greater accuracy of gun point on the target.




(See drawing.) Lane 5 can be a problem for the right hand shooter if he does not position himself properly — an extreme right angle from lane 5 can frighten the hell out of the new shooter and a lot of not so new shooters if they are not prepared for it — so make sure your stance is right and that the gun and cheek position is right. Be careful not to let the stock get away from its position under your cheek, as is often the case. Keep cheek and gun stock together always. You will then be pointing the gun where your eye is looking.

Shoot with 2 eyes open if you can

However, it's not the end of the world if you discover you cannot shoot with both eyes open due to the fact that you are a right shoulder shooter and have a left master eye. When this is the case you must obviously do one of two things — either change over and shoot from the left shouder, or stay with it on the right shoulder and close the left eye. Actually some of our prominent shooters do just this, and shoot very well indeed ... so don't worry too much about this problem.

One method I would suggest you try is to keep both eyes open as you look for the target leaving the trap, then as you swing the gun up to and on the target simply wink or close your left eye as the gun draws on the target and actually fire at the target with one eye shut. This practice will ensure a final alignment of gun and target. This practice may also help you to eventually keep both eyes open.

Here are a couple of tips that I have found helpful

- The recipe for good shooting is simply a good knowledge of the basic fundamentals involved in shooting moving targets and a complete application of them always. Gun fit, gun handling and gun mounting are vital statistics that should concern the clay target shooter.
- 2. Proper gun fitting and gun mounting will bring your gun and eye into alignment. You will then be pointing the gun where you are looking and if you keep your eye on the target, you should then have no problem — hitting the target!

RE: FREEZING ON THE TRIGGER

From time to time every shooter is confronted with "freezing on the trigger", either as a competitor or as a referee.

Two recent examples that I witnessed would have been better handled if the refusal rule had been utilised.

One competitor had a damanged knuckle on his trigger finger, as a result of a work injury that occurred many years previous. This person was obviously embarrassed that he had failed to simply pull the trigger because of his residual injury. My concern is that this person may believe that he is disadvantaged and therefore wasting his time continuing as a clay target shooter.

The second competitor was about to shoot his 25th Skeet Target, i.e. low house 8 (previous round was 25/25). He called for his target, aimed and pulled the trigger, it appeared that the trigger moved to the rear but did not disengage to sears, subsequently the referee passed the gun for testing, during the process an audible "click" was heard. The trigger, when tested by the referee, fired the gun, the shooter was in my view, beaten by not the target, but other circumstances.

Therefore it is my view that by extending the refusal rule to accommodate what is commonly termed, "freezing of the trigger". WHY

- 1. Take into account some shooters disabilities
- 2. Allow for an intermittent trigger mechanism fault
- 3. Lessen the need for release trigger guns
- Result determined by hitting or missing a target when the gun is actually fired
- 5. Less responsibility for referees

Finally, let's keep shooting simple.

Request for clarification of Rule 2.7a and associated problems.

Dear Sir.

Recently at a shoot, a B grade shooter shot an A grade score of 94.1% which automatically on that day took him into A grade.

At this shoot, a State Handicapper under section 2.7a ACTA rules, upgraded the shooter to AA grade.

At the time of the decision to upgrade the shooter, the State Handicapper did not know that the shooter had shot an A grade score; nor had he sighted the shooter's 1990 nor 1991 record card.

The State Handicapper stated — that he did not believe the shooter to be of AA standard, but his reason for this AA upgrading was that he believed the shooter to be an OBVIOUSLY undergraded B grade; and that this was the only way to stop him from competing in B grade.

Rule 2.7a states . . . "The State Handicapper has the right to grade any OBVIOUSLY undergraded shooter immediately . . .

Rule 2.1n states . . . "That a shooter MUST NOT shoot in a grade higher than his best performance . . ."

The section relied upon by the State Handicapper to exclude

shooters from competing in B grade is section 2.1n . . . This section states . . . "That once ATTAINING AA grade, a shooter cannot be classified as B grade.

The word ATTAIN means . . . to gain by effort . . . and any shooter graded to AA grade merely for the purposes of excluding him from B grade, has never attained AA grade.

At the same shoot, a B grade shooter who had not completed his 200 targets, was also upgraded into AA by the same Handicapper. The same reason of obviously undergraded was given. Within a matter of weeks, this shooter contacted the Handicapper, and was informed that he would be backgraded to his original B grade. This shooter has since been returned to B grade. This shooter had not shot any further competition targets, nor did he supply the Handicapper with any evidence of any physical disability allowing the State Handicapper to regrade him from AA to his original B grade.

The above section is clearly incompatable with the ACTA nules. In the next edition of the ACTA Shooters News, would you please publish a clarification/interpretation of the problems associated with the present day apparent interpretation of rule 2.7a.



- 1. The shooters card in question had been sighted and signed by the State Handicapper prior to the regrading.
- The shooters grading had been questioned by several clubs 2. within his own zone.
- The full State Executive sat and considered the shooters appeal against the decision of the State Handicapper. The appeal was rejected as requested.




JUNIOR SPORT SPONSORSHIP
