Applications for which will enable Tasmanian and Queensland shooters to compete in the National Trap Championships at Wagga in April are to be forwarded to: Sergeant Neil Faust, Firearms Registry, P.O. Box 2514 GPO, Sydney NSW 2001 Telephone (02) 288 8926, Fax (02) 288 8933.

Details which will be required are: Name, Address, Date of Birth, Shooters Licence Number, Firearms Serial Number, Gun Description, Arrival and Departure Dates within New South Wales.

Please allow a minimum of 10 days for your permit to be processed and include with your application a cheque/money order to the value of \$25.00.

After reading the write up on the shoot at International Gun Club on page 8 February CTSN, I would like to point out a matter that is not correct, it concerns event 2 Sunday 20th — The Handicap.

The article states that four shooters shot a possible, each of them losing a metre in the process; this would be possible if the event was held on different meterages, i.e.: 11–15, 16–18, 19–21, 22–25 and each shooter was in a different group. This was not the case as the article tells that the event was paid 1st, 2nd, 3rd, in this case only the first and second shooter should have been penalised, unless all four shooters had shot 50t straight from their ACTA handicap marks.

In a handicap where placings are 1st, 2nd, 3rd only 1st & 2nd would receive a metre providing they both have shot a possible, if no possibles and 50 straight have not been shot only 1st place would receive a metre.

At Lot 11 Uhlmann Road, Burpengary we now have constructed three down the line layouts in a lovely setting amongst the remnants of a pine forest. All layouts are facing south and are fully operational. The shooting background is all blue sky as the remaining noncommercial pine has been removed. Shelter from the sun has recently been erected with provision for the capture of rain water.

The club has an application for a Commonwealth grant in place to help towards the construction of a club house. News on the success of this application should be available in March/April of this year.

The committee of the club has worked extremely hard to get the grounds to this present level of development and is justifiably proud of its achievements. The club grounds are situated within nineteen hectares of land leased from the Queensland Lands Department and administered by the Caboolture Shire Council. The club is very fortunate and grateful that the lease it has secrued runs for a period of thirty years. The lease is actually gazetted as a "Shotgun Range" and is believed to be the only one in existence with this level of official sanction.

At the time of writing the club has conducted two successful competition shoots and is rolling along nicely. The accompanying photograph shows the three shooters who participated in our first



shoot-off. From left to right: Bill Stevens, Ron Daniells and Bill Chain. At time of reading there should be two more shoots under our belts.

The members have been so preoccupied with construction that there has been little time to spread the word that the club is operational. It is hoped that this article will reach those shooters who may be unaware of our position and who may wish to come and look our facilities over. Look forward to seeing some of you there. 1992 WINCHESTER 'TOP GUN' WINNERS

The 1992 Winchester 'Top Gun' Awards have commenced on the 1st of February. These awards are based on rewards of ammunition for winners of various categories of competitions at ACTA, Club, State or National levels for users of Winchester Target Loads.

The first major competition under this scheme was the South Australian State Trap Carnival, conducted at the International Gun Club, Virginia, on February 1 and 2. In State Championships, Winchester are providing 2 cases of ammunition for the overall winner in the Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Point Score Champioships, and one case of ammunition for the Lady and Junior High Gun winner over the carnival. Participants in the scheme undertake to use solely Winchester Target Loads for the remainder of 1992 and have registered their names for eligibility in the program.

The Single Barrel Championship was the first event up for grabs, and the popular winner was Robert Andrews from the Bordertown Club in the state's far east. Robert was using Winchester 28 gram loads for the first time in this event and shot 72 targets straight for a fine victory.

28 gram loads have proved very popular amongst the lady shooters and the overall high gun winner in this section was Tracy 'Cyclone' Gray from the Broken Hill Club using Winchester Ammunition. Tracy received 500 rounds of the target loads of her choice for her win.

Some notable near misses from "Top Gun" entrants over the weekend, but none the less outstanding achievements were from Robert Dower who finished second in the Double Barrel Championship and achieved a break of 266 targets, just 34 short for one free case of shot shells. Richard Dean also shot very well to finish second to Robert Andrews in the Single Barrel Championship and also second to Russell Mark for the Overall High Gun.

Winchester users also won the State Point Score Championship and the Junior High Gun, but unfortunately had not entered into the award scheme as at the time of competition.

All the best for the remainder of the 1992 Winchester "Top Gun' year.

NEWCASTLE CLAY TARGET CLUB LOST THE BATTLE — WON THE WAR

When elected to the committee in 1986 we took over a club with no money and a letter from the Hunter District Water Board, our landlords of thirty years, telling us that the lease on our club site was to be terminated. It's been a long battle from then to the recent opening of our new club and the battle field is strewn with greenies, bureaucrats, politicians, environmental impact statements, anthropological studies and all tiers of government.

Our Merewether site was acquired by the State Government for a recreation area but as everyone knows shooting is not a legitimate recreation. So the greenies won the first battle and we were given notice to quit. With the election of the present Government and the assistance of George Keegan our local independent, we managed to negotiate a reprieve and were given several extensions of time. After being offered and accepting sites from various bureaucracies, only to have them taken back off us again, we finally secured the lease on our Lake Macquarie site with the help of the Land Board at Maitland. Those negotiations took four years during which our members continued support resulted in us accumulating \$60,000 from shooting fees.

Despite several promises from various politicians, governmental bodies and councils we got no Sport and Recreation grant or any other funds to help with our relocation. At our final general meeting at Merewether 24 members, through a show of hands said they would help to build a new club with our limited funds and I am proud to say that all 24 turned up for work. With typical Newcastle guts and determination our members literally built the new club with their hands using materials we begged, borrowed and according to some suppliers practically stole. On many occasions members who had come straight off dog watch would have breakfast and still turn up to work at the club all day. With our ageing membership it was always a talking point as to who had the "crookest" back as we spent 20 weeks shovelling dirt, fencing 80 acres, welding, plumbing, plastering, painting, wiring and concreting.

The bottom line is that with our \$60,000 and five months of voluntary work, we now have a pleasant club house with full amenities, three trap layouts, 2 skeet layouts and due to the generosity of one of our members an almost completed trench layout. We are presently negotiating the purchase of more traps and hope to be shooting simulated field shortly. On the weekend of 21 and 22 March we are having the official opening two day shoot with \$7,500 worth of trophies including a Beretta Shot Gun and \$2000 worth of Puma Knives (see inside back cover).

Our club's not as flash as some, but we can miss more targets, tell more lies, and drink more rum under the gum trees than most. More importantly, we won the war.

Dear Editor,

At a recent two day open shoot in NSW, with a field of 140 shooters, I took the opportunity to conduct a petition.

My petition was in relation to the mandatory use of 28 gram/loz cartridges to be introduced by the ACTA Executive in January, 1993. Over the two days I received 131 signatures from the shooters on the ground objecting to the mandatory use of 28 gram loads, a fair indication I believe to amend this situation, which has been arrived at by the ACTA Executive on behalf of all shooters who have not had the option of at least to air their views on 28 gram loads.

I am a clay target shooter of many years experience and I can not accept this mandatory use decision that has been adopted in a nondemocratic way by the ACTA Executives. If this type of legislation is to be forthcoming in the future I can only suggest to the ACTA Executives that there will be a drastic reduction in registration of shooters in the coming years.

How about giving the shooters a voice on such a major topic. Yours faithfully,

The decision of the Executive Committee to introduced 28 gram loads was a decision in keeping with the authority of clause 23 of the Associations Statement of Purpose and Rules which clearly defines the authority of the Executive to make what are democratic decisions in relation to the introduction of new rules of shooting or amendments to existing rules. Quite simply the decision to use 28 gram loads is a rule change and like some, many or all rules changes, not necessarily accepted by all. There does appear however to be no doubt that the decision has been generally accepted for the benefits that the sport will obtain in this time of noise and lead pollution not withstanding the benefits of less recoil etc.

LOOK WHAT HAPPENED 10 YEARS BACK

Browsing through some coaching report material the other day I came across a report I had made out after attending a three day seminar on youth firearms training for teachers in secondary schools. At this time our National Coaching System had been operating less than a couple of years and many of our ACTA clubs were offering their club facilities for teaching the students safe gun handling and how to shoot the clay target. As you read this story you will no doubt become aware of the great opportunity we had at that period in time to promote the sport of clay target shooting, but most importantly the opportunity to train young people to eventually become safe and responsible firearm owners. As evidence of this is the fact that a 10 year old Russell Mark was a pupil at this seminar in Jeparit in 1981. Russell's achievements at Olympic Trap and American Trap shooting in our history book soon to be published.

What a great pity it is that today we don't have the coaching and firearm training facilities to the junior and newcomers to our sport that we had a few years back.

1981–82 Gun safety and shooting activities for the junior and the novice.

The year of 1981 in Victoria will go down as a big step forward at clay target shooting for both junior and novice shooters.

Many hundreds of secondary schoolboy and schoolgirl students and boy scout groups have enjoyed the opportunity that is available at Victorian Clay Target Clubs, to learn from accredited club instructors how to go about using a shotgun in a safe, responsible manner and to learn something of the technique involved in shooting moving targets. The main aim at this level is not to try to produce an army of expert shotgunners and hunters — this is something that will be available at a later stage in the person's life. At this point strong emphasis is placed on safe and responsible attitude to firearms use and handling for the junior shooter.

Educational systems today are placing more emphasis on life time sports. A recent survey by the Victorian Education Department revealed among other things that a total of 110 schools have regular weekly or monthly shooting activity. It was also shown that the safety record was second to none. The assistant director of secondary education in Victoria, Mr Neil Bavington, has said that statistics have shown shooting activities to be a very safe sport — obviously due to very strict gun safety training procedures that apply.

Jeparit Gun Club in western Victoria was recently the venue for a three day gun safety seminar for teachers. The first one of its kind with educational department approval.

The seminar, which I was invited to take part in was organised by Mr Lyn Barr, Principle of the Rainbow High School. A total of 38 teachers together with outside guest speakers discussed the many issues that go with school participation in shooting activities and firearms safety training.

Mr Brian Mark of Winchester Australia Pty Ltd opened the seminar and introduced the guest speakers and lecturers who would be taking part in the program.

Mr Lyn Barr related the history of gun safety instruction in Victorian schools. He outlined requirements for safety, a place in the curriculum and what support was available. The role of commercial firms and the part played by industry in support of gun safety programs in schools.

Mr Neil Bavington explained the legal responsibilities teachers have regarding their pupils and which cannot be handed on to anyone else. This means that accreditation of teachers could be the solution.

Highlighting the three days of this most fruitful workshop was the launching of the gun safety manual for secondary students by Mr Bernie Dunn MLC of the National Party. The manual was compiled by Lyn Barr and subsidised by Winchester Australia Pty Ltd. Lyn has indeed done a first class job in putting this manual together.

The coaching division of the Victorian Clay Target Association is very much aware of the increasing interest being shown by schoolboy and schoolgirl students in clay target shooting and gun safety courses — especially in country areas, boy scout groups are also involved. This is a welcome trend and the coaching council is delighted because we are geared to handle this situation in the best possible way with trained instructors at zone and club level. However, because of the increasing numbers of junior pupils some clubs are naturally concerned at the increasing costs of providing this service which can become somewhat of a burden to a small club if they have to provide targets as well.

Generally, clubs involved with junior instruction provide their ground facilities such as traps, electric power, club rooms, etc free of charge. All coaching and instruction work is provided free by members of the Victorian Coaching Council who do this work on a voluntary basis. In most cases, pupils provide their own guns and annunition. Several of the larger clubs, for example, Metro Melbourne, Wangaratta, Warmambool have a weekly training program where the attendance is around 30–35 each week, 50 weeks of the year. At least 85% of Victorian gun clubs are actively engaged in a youth firearms training program — it would be conservative to say that in excess of 8000 junior and novice shooters would go through the training program in the past year. The VCTA is grateful for the yearly financial help provided by the

The VCTA is grateful for the yearly financial help provided by the Victorian Police Department towards our school by firearms training program. Without this aid it would not be possible for many clubs to provide their ground facilities and clay targets, plus cartridges etc, at no cost to the junior student.

Very few shooters would know of the extent to which our two ammunition companies, namely Winchester Australia PL and Eley Ammunition, contribute to our youth training program.

Both companies sponsor schoolboy/girl championships. The 1981 title was held at Melbourne Gun Club and drew a crowd of 320 secondary school students from all parts of the state. Trophies were for first and second in junior and senior section and likewise in the girls' class.

I would not know the total cost to Winchester and Eley of sponsoring these youth training programs but I'll make a guess and say many thousands of dollars for which L as State Coaching Director am delighted and thankful. So next time you may be tempted to buy a packet of foreign shells, think about it.

During October last, Melbourne Gun Club playing host to senior scout units from Bayside Troops who were introduced to safe gun handling and the art of shooting moving targets.

The boys (37 in all) were given a talk on firearms awareness and safety, also films on trap and skeet shooting were shown, followed by practical shooting instruction. Winchester supplied 500 cartridges and Melbourne Gun Club the clay targets all at no cost.

RECORD ATTENDANCE AT VICTORIAN SCHOOL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Melbourne Gun Club on July 29 was the venue for the fourth School Boy and School Girl Annual Clay Target Championship. Some 375 students from 57 schools, each fired at twenty targets from 15 metres to decide the winners for 1982.

Shooting commenced at 10 am and finished by 3 pm, the competition being single barrel shooting only.

Nominations were up by 53 on last year. No doubt entries would have been higher had Victoria not been in the grip of a severe flue epidemic during the winter months which kept big numbers of students and teachers away from school.

Victoria has in excess of 115 secondary schools statewide participating in a firearms training program. Many gun clubs provide their facilities and coaching help at no cost. It is at this level where the students get their introduction to Clay Target shooting and firearms awareness. Numerous club personnel, teachers and club coaches came along with their school teams to help with the duties of refereeing, scoring etc. 357 students fired at something like 8000 clay during 5 hours of shooting. Full marks must go to all concerned with AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET NEWS — MARCH 1992 the organising of the program. Six of the Melbourne Gun Club's 9 traps were put into service and judging by the rapid increase in numbers, I'd take a guess and say that next year we could expect to have to use 9 traps.

What a great thing it would be if eventually it could result in all states joining in the tournament so that we have a National School Boy and School Girl Championship each year with all states participating.

Winchester Australia has sponsored the Championship since its inception several years ago. A lot of credit must go to Lyn Barr, Principal of Wangaratta High School who has organised the Championship each year from the beginning. Lyn also wrote the Gun Safety Manual for secondary schools. This manual is the most comprehensive booklet I have seen on the subject of safe shotgun handling. Winchester Australia are to be congratulated on their gesture of underwriting the cost of printing and producing the manual.

Generally speaking the standard of shooting was excellent right down to junior boys.

Gun handling and correct approach to the task of shooting moving clay targets was something I really admired considering that with few exceptions most boys and girls were not using what we could term the properly fitting gun, which is no doubt the most troublesome detail with youngsters growing up.

WOMEN IN COACHING

There is a general concern in Australia and other western countries about the dearth of female coaches involved in sport. Coaching is often a male domain especially at the elite level of sport where even female teams generally seem to be guided by the men. The females who do commit themselves to coaching appear to remain in the role for less time and subsequently have fewer aspirations for moving into more advanced coaching or administration roles.

One of the reasons for women having less involvement with administration and coaching is that within sporting organisations the proportion of women with power and influence is much smaller than the number of women participants would warrant. A second reason would appear to be those constraints associated with the expected female role. For example, women are often restricted to home based activities due to child care and home responsibilities and therefore have less opportunity for recreational activities. In simple terms, women often feel that they need to leave coaching to spend more time with the family and friends. Cultural and prevailing norms additionally widen these inequalities with males having greater entitlement to opportunity and money for leisure activities.

The above are possibly major reasons as to why women have not taken a more active role in coaching within our sport. Another reason found is the image of shotguns and their use being perceived as a male orientated sport. These days the barriers are slowly being broken down, but that is due to the concept of our coaches and technology, by presenting a softer feel with regard to the recoil and noise associated with firearms.

We have now a few qualified female coaches at Level 1, even less at Level 2, but it appears, because of such a small number of shooters presently in this particular area, our ladies seem reluctant to undertake the knowledge of coaching. We as shooters, have to attempt to coerce more females, whether family, friends or strangers into the sport by disuading their possible inlaid fears in relation to noise, recoil, weight of firearms, and in particular the firearm itself.

If we are able to successfully achieve a breaking down of these phobias and maternal responsibilities, then as time goes on, females will have greater representation alongside the males in the shooting and coaching fields. Thereby promoting and advertising this sport in a more open manner.

The ACTA, through its coaching system, is keen to pursue this subject and invite comment from those interested with emphasis on input from female members.

OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Competitors from all States and Territories travelled to Brisbane for the 1992 National ISU Championships. An international flavour was given to the Championships with the attendance of visiting shooters from New Zealand, United States of America and New Caledonia.

1992 COMMONWEALTH CHAMPIONSHIPS — TRAP & SKEET

In overcast and drizzly conditions a total of 30 shooters had nominated for the Commonwealth ISU Skeet Championship, with an additional 81 shooters nominating for Olympic Trap.

Conditions were not easy, as those who took part will attest, and this no doubt contributed to the scores which were posted on day one.

In the Trap event possible rounds of 25 were few and far between, with only four being recorded on the day, two of which were from 1992 Olympian, Michael Diamond.

At the completion of the day's shooting Michael Diamond at 72/75 held a one target lead over fellow Barcelona Olympian, Russell Mark. Showing the benefit of his experiences at many International and National events, Jim Ellis was sharing second position with Russell Mark on 71/75, with Victor Burgess from Tasmania next with his score of 70/75.

Desiree Huddleston was shooting strongly in the Ladies Event where, with the benefit of her participation in the Ladies World Championships and her dedication to improve her scores, she continues to show great improvement with her shooting with better things yet to come, finishing the day with a score of 66/75 to lead the Ladies section by nine targets.

With six shooters contesting, the Junior section competition was keen, with eleven targets separating first and sixth position. Redcliffe's Andrew Coco led the Juniors at the end of the first day's shooting, finishing on 65/75 — four targets ahead of Victoria's Matthew Howden and Tony Faranda, with Justin Bryant of Tasmania a further two targets away followed by Vincent Mollica of Victoria at 56/75 and Anthony Snooke of WA, 54/75.

In the Skeet event the experienced shooters were soon to the fore, with Ian Hale holding the top position with a solid 74/75. John Summers was continuing to show the benefits of his recent international competitions, holding second position at 73/75 — two targets ahead of Craig Meuleman and Tasmanian State Coaching Director, Stuart Browning. Bob Dower (SA) was keeping the more experienced shooters honest, finishing the day on 71/75 — ahead of Paul Ryland, 70/75.

The finals system, which had supporters for and against when first introduced, certainly appears to now be more than well accepted and generated a great deal of interest in both events.

First final shot was the Skeet Champioship, where Ian Hale held a one target lead over fellow Victorians, Craig Meuleman and John Summers, with David Cunningham a further two targets behind. The best round in the final came from Paul Ryland's 24/25, however after dropping a target and opening the competition up Ian Hale steadied with a final round of 23/25 to win the 1991 Commonwealth Title, sponsored by the Carindale Hotel Motel, with an overall score of 23/25 — one ahead of Craig Meuleman who also shot a final score of 23/25, with John Summers one target back on 214/225 after a final round of 22/25.

The Ladies competition was won by Frankston-Australia's Wendy Adams with a score of 155/200 from Wagga's Maree Rooke on 140/200.

With Andrew Larsen dominating the junior section, his final score of 181/200 certainly showed the benefit of his 1991 World Championship competition, and gave promise of many better scores yet to come.

Michael Diamond's well won reputation for shooting in finals was certainly put to the test on this occasion, and he would be disappointed with his score of 19/25. Brisbane Gun Club President, John Porter, and Warwick's Greg Newey both shot final rounds of 23/25, with Victor Burgess from Cressy Gun club shooting a final score of 21/25 — two ahead of Robert Thompson from Cobar Amidst all of this, Illawarra's John Maxwell, 212/225, dominated the final with a clean 25/25 to win for himself the 1991 Commonwealth Skeet Championship, sponsored by the Carindale Hotel Motel, from Queensland's Greg Newey with 212/225 (countback) and John Porter's 208/212.

In the Ladies section Desiree Huddleston, showing the benefits of her recent experience, was a comfortable winner on 175/200 from Dianne Reeves 148/200, with Bunbury's Christine Huggins finishing in third position with a score of 141/200 — three targets ahead of Cressy's Alison Blaskett at 138/200.
