



1993 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

The State Shooting Park at Virginia, SA, home of International Gun Club, was a picture. The weather, although windy, was generally kind, and the atmosphere was a happy one right through the Nationals. These were the first Trap Nationals in SA since 1983, when the Championships were conducted at the SA Gun Club, a little closer to town at Bolivar.

Saturday, March 27

In a departure from the usual programming, the State Open Shoulder to Shoulder Teams Match was shot prior to the official opening of the Championships. This was a good move in that the dignitary opening the Championships was able to present the badges and ACTA Cup to the winning team, and more people were in attendance for the official opening to add extra colour to the proceedings.

All states fielded strong teams for the Shoulder to Shoulder Match, with the Northern Territory proving too strong and notching up back-to-back victories with 124/125 from Tas 123, Qld 123, NSW 122, WA 122, Vic 121 and SA 120.

Greg Chan had great pleasure in accepting the Cup on behalf of fellow team members; Peter Hoare, Tony Brown, Brett Hall and Phil Grove.

A new Perpetual Trophy for the best presented team, donated by the South Australian Clay Target Association, was won by New South Wales Open Team, South Australian Women's Team and Northern Territory Junior Team. All teams were very well turned out and a credit to their states.

The Hon Greg Crafter, SA Minister of Recreation and Sport, officially opened the Nationals in a very colourful ceremony. All State Teams marched in to the swirl of the pipes, taking up their places under respective state flags. The Minister presented badges and the ACTA Cup to the victorious team from NT and fired the first shot, assisted by SA State Coaching Director, John Ellis.


Russell Mark, Geelong, Vic; and Bob Brown, New Zealand. Button Powell was first to leave, missing his first target in the shoot-off. George Scaf and Robert Viney missed their 54th, Bob Brown his 56th - so we had the placegetters still going. Anthony Kowald, the junior from 13 metres; Kim Nealon from 19 metres and Russell Mark from 22. Kim missed his 59th target - on went the junior and the Olympian. The 74th target got away from Anthony, Russell shot his and it was over. Russell remarked at the presentations that Anthony was shooting so well that the only way he would lose was by getting tired walking from 13 to 22 metres and back again after each target.

A first for the Trap Nationals was the appearance of a team from the Australian Sports Drug Agency, on Handicap day, to carry out some tests.

Northern Territory, winning team State Shoulder to Shoulder Match.



GRAND AUSTRALIAN HANDICAP - 50T

A field of 379 was squadded for the Handicap, well down on Wagga last year, but significantly ahead of Adelaide in 1983.

Mark Warnock from Rockhampton got the event underway in windy but fine conditions. At the end of the fifty, seven possibles shot off for the Royal Blue Sash, Gordon Hall Perpetual Trophy and Silver Australia Badge. They were Anthony Kowald, a junior from Katanning, WA; George Scaf, Gold Coast & Albert, Qld; Kim Nealon, Majura Park, NSW; Robert Viney, Geelong, Vic; former winner of the Handicap, 'Button' Powell, Hermitdale, NSW;

Sunday, March 28

DOUBLE BARREL CHAMPIONSHIP - 50T
Event sponsored by Fuller Firearms

Sunday dawned fine, with a strong wind blowing from the west. Just before noon the wind rose to gale force and with it some rain squalls scudded across the grounds. Within 20 minutes the wind abated, the rain stopped and better conditions returned for the competitors.

Entries totalled 426 for the blue ribbon event of the Trap Nationals. While this figure was almost 100 down on Wagga in '92, it was still up on Adelaide in '83. Possibles numbered 25 after the 50. 22 AA Graders, 1 B Grader and 2 A Graders. After one run through the traps, 9 shooters were still in - 8 AA's and the lone B Grader and Veteran, Keith Mules.

At 130 targets the field was down to four: Jason Jolly, Mark McInnes, Russell Mark and Terry Boucher. Jason missed at 135, Mark McInnes let target 139 escape, while Russell and Terry pressed on. Finally Russell missed target 262, Terry shot his and became the Double Barrel Champion for '93. This was a fine effort from Terry, who had not competed much in the past two years. He was presented with the Miroku shotgun from Fuller Firearms, the Jock Wilson Perpetual Trophy, Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia Badge.

In the Grades, Russell Mark topped AA Grade with 261/262, Ossie Hayek A Grade 57/58, Keith Mules B Grade 50/50 and Veterans, and Junior Anthony Kowald, who had finished second in the Handicap, took out C Grade first with 49/50.

WOMEN'S DOUBLE BARREL CHAMPIONSHIP - 50T

Run in conjunction with the Open Double Barrel Championship, the Women's event attracted 26 starters. This too was sponsored by Fuller Firearms and was keenly contested. Desiree Huddleston, NSW, shot 49/50 to win outright and receive the June Gawith Perpetual Trophy, Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia Badge, from Margaret Denton, Qld, in second place 48/51, with Robyn Langley, NSW, third 47/51.

JUNIOR DOUBLE BARREL CHAMPIONSHIP - 50T

Also run in conjunction with the Open event, 31 Juniors were squadded. This Championship was again sponsored by Fuller Firearms. Two 49's shot off for the title: Daniel Signorotto, Vic, and Anthony Kowald, WA. Both missed the 9th target in the shoot-off, so on they went until Anthony again missed at 14. Daniel shot his and was delighted to be the Junior Double Barrel Champion for '93 and receive the Anthony Bradshaw Perpetual Trophy, the Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia Badge. Seven 48's shot off for third place. This shoot-off developed into a real battle between Nathan Cassells and Roland Zanca, both from Victoria. Finally Nathan outlasted Roland, shooting 112/114, to take third place.

Monday, March 29

WOMEN'S & JUNIOR STATE TEAMS MATCHES

Monday dawned fine and clear. Shooting got underway with the State Teams Matches for Juniors and Women. Three States fielded teams in the Women's event - won convincingly by NSW, represented by Loz Lloyd, Jannene Kidd and Lyn Blake 69/75 by 4 targets from Victoria, with South Australia in third place.

Teams representing NSW, Vic, SA, NT, and WA fought out the Junior Teams Match. Victory went to the Northern Territory team of Brett Hall, Chris Cattermole and Charlie Athanasion, with an excellent 73/75 from NSW 71 and Victoria 70.

This was a very good double for the Territorians, with the Open Team having beaten all the States on Saturday.





WINCHESTER 28 GRAM LOADS

The movement in target loads is certainly becoming plain. We're seeing them become steadily lighter. Winchester has been very busy as a result, making three new cartridge lines.

This article looks at the 28 gram shot weight, the range which incorporates a total of four new loads, all identified very sensibly by their muzzle velocities – dram equivalents are potentially tricky ways of labelling cartridges, because their meanings change with the shot weights. By now, Australian shooters are well and truly familiar with the muzzle velocities they prefer, and this system of naming the loads is a good one.

First is the gold cased 1200, which is designed as a mild, first barrel load and is offered in 7, 7½, 8 and 9.

Then we have the 1250, and this is presented in two different cases: the red one contains 28 grams of the usual three percent antimony shot; the black one is designated 1250HA and is loaded with the new high antimony shot. This is not intended to be one cartridge dressed up twice, but it is seen as two different loads.

The last in the series is the black coloured high brass 1300HA. This is loaded only in the higher antimony shot, and is available in 7, 7½ and 9.

Some implications of the 28 gram load for Down the Line shooting were covered in detail in the October 1992 issue of the ASJ. It was the theme of that article that change is not easy to usher in, but after it's arrived it soon becomes the way things are, and in due course it appears to be the way things always were.

So it comes about that these loads are rapidly gaining popularity, and for good reason. They are diverse in what they offer, and they have obviously been put together with the idea of allowing shooters as much leeway as possible with regard to cartridge selection.

As regular readers will know, there is a great deal that can be gained from experimentation with shotgun ammunition. Just by changing cartridge, there are many adjustments that can be made to results downrange. These include pattern expansion, pattern shrinkage and pattern quality improvement.

The shooter using factory loaded trap ammunition to shoot Down the Line is a classic case of someone who needs to be able to do this. Every time he steps back another metre, a new variable is thrown into the already complicated equation that operates when a shot is fired at a clay.

Having the ability to understand the boring and preferences of the gun you live with is much facilitated by having a wide range of choices within any line of factory loads. To go up or down a half shot size can be a very wise move at times, and you can't do it if the factory doesn't offer it. When you change brands to achieve the change of shot size, so much more is likely to go wrong that the advantage you're looking for in changing can be lost along the way.

So, it's good to see that the loads that could be going to turn into standards for trap are offered in many configurations.

Winchester ammunition has always been noted for its attention to detail, and stripping and testing the different loads on the test bench showed that nothing has altered in that department. The factory's chief boast has long been its quality control, and this is good enough to be beyond dispute. It is also good to know that shooters who become familiar with these cartridges should be secure in the knowledge that they won't be undergoing internal changes some time between now and whenever they pick up their next case of them.

Before coming to the details of the tests, it should be noted that a major selling point of the new loads is the antimony content of the shot.

Around the traps recently a lot of emphasis has come to be placed on the role of antimony in making shot. The trap shooting community has survived the change from 32 grams to 28 as the maximum shot load, despite the early misgivings of many, and people are beginning to learn that if they are handicapped by the lighter shot weight, so is everybody else they're in competition with, and it tends to equal out in the end.

What it has meant, though, is that more input is required from the shooter. The onus is coming back onto the nut behind the butt to find a way of restoring as much as possible of the lost advantage of four extra grams of shot. It stands to reason that for the longer shots, at least, there may now be a slightly greater tendency for the pattern to thin out. This may introduce some element of a handicap for a shooter, and increasingly so in the case of the more deliberate shot.

On the other hand, at the closer ranges, for the first barrel work, it's doubtful whether a change for the worse could be noticed at all when the 28 gram load is put in the hands of the vast majority of shooters. This is so much the case, and shooters are working it out for themselves so rapidly, that an unexpected swing to the lighter load has been taking place in the shooting of sporting clays. People don't have to select a light load for this discipline, but more and more of them are, so what's happening?

The answer is that there are probably many pluses that go with the 28 gram load, and these were initially not recognised. Increasing use brings about more awareness of them, and I foresee that the trend will continue.

The Universal and the International previously constituted the whole 28 gram range, and the buyer approval they gained was in part due to the way they ushered in the very useful size 7½ shot. This advantage remains, and has now been significantly opened up by the creation of not two but three velocity levels, and further extended by the shot hardness choices now available.

By offering two levels of antimony, Winchester has made a move to offer the shooter of any discipline a way of countering any degrading of pattern density that may follow from switching to the lighter 28 gram load from the heavier 32.

Historically there has never been a really standard antimony content in shot. But around the world, we see approximately three levels. These start with 0.5% to 1%, found in the cheaper shot usually sold for hunting and reloading; then there is the standard two to three percent which finds its way into most good quality hunting and trapshot, and is usually chosen for good target ammunition. Finally there is the highest level, which begins at about four percent and goes up to a nominal six percent, and this is relatively rare around the world. You tend to find it showing up sometimes in the best live pigeon ammunition from Europe, where people pay an absolute premium for highest quality shot. It also tends to be plated with nickel or copper when it gets to that level.

Plating adds many manufacturing steps and, while it may give benefit, it also increases expense. The changes it makes to patterns, contrary to widespread opinion, usually involve making them more open rather than tighter. In this case, Winchester have stopped at the point of making two antimony levels, and in my opinion that was a wise move.

Their aim was obviously to give shooters the option of a tighter load, to be used as an insurance second barrel when the clays are getting well out. Plating the shot might have been a popular move – people tend to assume it works better than black shot – but in terms of pure efficiency in keeping patterns tight, all else being equal I'd take high antimony black shot over high antimony nickelled shot any day. I've tested it often enough to know which is the real tightener rather than the perceived one.

Just how much pattern tightening comes about is a matter for each different gun and shooter to establish.

In using these loads, it should always be borne in mind that antimony doesn't break targets. Only individual pellets do that. Selecting a higher antimony cartridge simply because of its antimony content is no guarantee that it will break a steady percentage of more targets, in just the same way it's not possible to predict that few targets will be found to break when you change from 32 to 28 gram loads and start using them in the first barrel. It just doesn't work that way.

If the pattern stays together more at the longer ranges, it must have shrunk at the closer ones. Unexpectedly tighter patterns cause misses. The shooter is thus well advised to think carefully about which applications need tighter, denser patterns before rushing into higher antimony shot.

My usual shot hardness tests indicated that the pellets throughout the whole line were in fact of two different hardnesses. Those regular readers who've made their own

hardness testers will understand when I say that number 7 shot from the 1250 came in at 33% on the crush test, while the high antimony number 7 gave a 25% crush. The lower the figure, the harder the shot, of course. Compare this to cheap European 0.5 antimony with a crush value of 43%.

In the standard loads, the shot is exactly the same as other Winchester shot, taken from both factory loads and bottles for sale to reloaders, as measured over many years. This according to my hardness measurement comes in at a fairly steady three percent of antimony.

The new line is undoubtedly harder than that, which puts it into the higher hardness band described above. Unfortunately, however, there is no way to guarantee any shooter that his shot will bring about patterns which are this or that much tighter than the ones that will be shot with the mid-range antimony.

When I patterned them through my customary quarter choke test barrel, I found that the loads, despite their velocity range from 1200 to 1300 fps, all gave pattern percentages very close to the nominal boring. For instance, the 1200 in 7½ gave 51%, while the 1250 gave 48%, both of which are classic improved cylinder figures.

This is good. It suggests that the shooter using the new ammunition is not going to be faced with an unexpected pattern density change when using it; it also equates pretty closely with the Universal and International, which operated at about 50% out of the same barrel. In this way, someone moving from these older loads to the new ones could expect a smooth transition.

The many combinations of cartridges and barrels tested for this brief report all came in between normal and good on the Oberfell and Thompson pattern quality scheme of poor, fair, normal, good and excellent. Most were in the normal area. A quarter choke (.014") is not going to be most folk's idea of the best bet for target ammunition designed for Down the Line; the second test barrel at three quarter choke, .025", is more along the style preferred by the trap shooter, and that was what was used for the second test.

The outcome was similar. The 1250 in size 7 gave 65%, which is exactly the nominal three-quarter boring. The 1250HA gave 64%, near enough to identical, a percentage point or two either way being no odds at all in a test string of ten patterns.

However, the key point comes about in the way that while the percentages of these patterns were similar, the distribution was not. As soon as the patterns were tightened in the move from quarter choke to three quarter, the higher antimony shot was found to give increased central thickening to the patterns, even though the overall percentage remained similar.

This means the reduced shot distortion was prone to take pellets out of the exterior of the pattern circle and put them into the centre. This in turn give the high antimony load an edge at the longer ranges.

Just why this phenomenon was present less in the more open choke I can't say. Probably it reflects the liking of the individual barrel. However, it gives a hint to the canny shooter who's looking for the best way to maximise the higher antimony shot effectiveness.

To prove the point, I took the 1250, and the 1250HA and the 1300HA back to fifty yards, and shot them all through the same three quarter choke barrel, interested in finding the answer to only one thing, and that is whether the higher antimony loads gave denser patterns at this overlong range.


I continued with the three quarter choke barrel because I wanted to place the loads under conditions as testing as possible. In fact, the results did show a higher strike when the antimony was used. It was not a big disadvantage, but it was one worth having. There was a two percent tightening of patterns as I passed from the 1250 to the 1250HA, and then another three percent tightening between the 1250HA and the 1300HA.

Winchester have of course run their own trials. In one such series, a full choke test barrel was used with the 1250 and the 1250HA using 7½ shot. The forty yard pattern figures were 75%, the HA shot produced 65%. These figures show a significantly greater gain for the higher antimony shot, and it may well be more representative than the test I conducted. A lot depends on the individual gun.

To sum up, it would not be difficult to work out a combination of these cartridges to shoot trap with. They are a good and sensible line of product. I would endorse careful manipulation of the available shot sizes, and, working with that in mind, I would select from the 1200 or the 1250 for a first barrel load. For a second barrel, someone shooting off fifteen metres may find the 1250 does the job perfectly well, depending on the choking of the individual gun. A change from number 7½ to 7 is likely to bring a couple of percent more pattern, and there may be more to come with the HA, and possibly more again, depending on how the individual gun responds to the 1300HA compared to the 1250HA. As the propellant changes, so might the patterns, and the 1300 uses a slower burning powder than the 1250. This usually but not always helps to tighten patterns.

The handicap shooter needs to compare the 1250HA with the 1300HA. Full chokes show far less response to changes of propellant than do more open chokes, and so this makes it harder to give blanket advice. It is like a lot of shotgunning, a highly individual thing. But as a general piece of advice to help gain the best of these loads, a back marker simply needs to shoot a run of six of each of the 1250HA and the 1300HA onto blank paper at fifty yards, then count and average the total strikes in the thirty inch circle to see which is the higher. That will be the one to go with for the second barrel.





SHOOTERS PROFILE



Name: Jon Whittakers
Date of Birth: 28-5-43

Date commenced shooting:

Early in 1973 I went shooting for the first time in a sandpit outside Deniliquin using a handcocked thrower and an old Greener Double Barrel. After a very enjoyable day I thought this was something I would have to try again.

The first gun club shoot I attended was the Deniliquin Grand Prix in October 1973 where I missed five of the first six targets I shot at. Things had to get better!

Preferred discipline:

DTL as this was the major competition in my area when I started. I have shot quite a bit of skeet and trench in my earlier shooting days, but DTL remains my preference.

Gun details:

My present gun is a Browning B7 Trap gun with an adjustable stock by Kevin Wright and a Winchester 101 Skeet gun.

The Browning replaced an old Winchester 101 Trap gun in 1984 when the Winchester was rather worn out and I got a good deal to purchase the Browning. The 101 sits in my office unsold as it holds some pretty good memories.

Ammunition used:

In my early days I used to be an Eley man, but now in a major shoot I use Winchester cartridges - AA300 7 till the one ounce shells and now 1250 7½. I have used a lot of hand loads over the years.

Influences on shooting career:

A good friend of mine Kim Bucholtz who used to shoot a lot in the 70s was the person who invited me to the sand pit in 1973, so that was a big influence. Also Kim was a great shooting partner and traveller in the 70s when we covered more kilometres than I care to remember, going to shoots anywhere in three states.

I have probably received more good advice from Ron Glenn - another shooting mate from Deniliquin - than anybody else. Ron has a great ability to pick up technique mistakes we all seem to make from time to time.

An 'incident' at Cosgrove in 1974 (I won't go into details but remember that one you guys) probably gave me reason to be far more determined than I might have been.

Very influential on me also was my ability some years ago to get into a shoot-off with Bill Iles time and time again when, whether I shot one or three hundred in a shoot-off he invariably cleaned me up. I could count the times I beat him on one hand (all small events) but all that practice used to get me a few victories elsewhere.

Coaching:

(As above) The hard school of 'defeat'.

Successes:

1. 5 National Championships.
2. 11 times in the Mackintosh International Team from 1979 on.
3. 5 person International Team shooting in Wales in 1992.
4. 4 times in the 5 man International and Glenn Cup Teams.
5. 10 times in the Victorian State Trap Team and once in the Trench.
6. In the Victorian State Shoulder to Shoulder 5 Man Trap Team 6 times.
7. A few Commonwealth, State and Club Championships.
8. Held the Australian 15 metre break record (471) for a few months in 1982 (seems rather irrelevant after Russell Mark's performances last year).
9. Deniliquin Sportsman of the year in 1981-82 and 1987-88.

Favourite shooting ground:

I have no particular ground but there are many grounds that I have had a hell of a lot of fun at.

Home club:

Is really Deniliquin Clay Target Club but to compete in Victoria many years ago I also joined the Echuca Gun Club. I am still a member of Echuca as it is hard to leave a club where you've been a part of so much success in the Allan Brown Team's Match held during the Nationals.

International teams:

Mentioned earlier.

Shooting superstitions:

Nothing really, which should put you in a better position to win. I mean wouldn't you just love to be in a shoot-off with someone who had forgotten to bring his favourite purple underpants to a weekend shoot?

Highest break:

471 at Wagga in February 1982 (in 108f heat which nearly wrecked me).

Club involvement:

On the committees at Deniliquin and Echuca at various times and also Deniliquin Club President from 1976 to 1983.

Advice to new shooters:

I am sure a lot of shooters would be a lot more successful if they had a gun suited to them instead of they themselves trying to suit the gun. Have a 'qualified' person look you over for gun fit.

Two important factors in shooting are concentration and confidence. It is hard to be confident if you've never shot well so work very hard on the concentration of just hitting the next target. If you are successful at that, sooner or later you will win something to give you some confidence. The theory is that this should make it easier to win more, but if you regularly run into someone like Russell Mark where you shoot I am afraid I can't offer anymore advice except to keep trying (all the good guys fall over sometime - try to be there when they do). If that doesn't seem worth the effort it is probably a good time to re-check your golf swing.

Shooting goals and methods to achieve:

My main aim in shooting has always been to get enjoyment from what I am doing. If success comes as well, that is a bonus. One of the better days I remember having was to shoot over 500 with one miss in the middle and one at the end and I finished up the day with one 2nd (to Bill Iles again) and took home a \$20 frypan. I think of the day as how many targets I shot, and how I shot them, not of how small the trophy value was for the effort. I would much rather win than lose, but when I am beaten (happens too regularly these days) too bad, have another go next week.

As for the future, if I don't win another good event I feel that I've had a pretty good run and I am happy with what I have achieved, but you never know, I think I can pop out of the woodwork a few times yet!

Outstanding performance in preferred discipline:

I thought winning the National Double Barrel Championship in Griffith in 1979 which was the first National event I had competed in would have been the biggest highlight for me but any of the next four made me feel just as good.

Making the International five person team to compete in Wales was great but also being asked to be the manager of the team was quite an honour.

The most unusual good performance for me was to win the Victorian State Trench Championship in 1979, I still can't understand how that happened. Anyone seeing me trying to shoot trench lately would also wonder.

How you rate:

51-60:

You are a dedicated, consistent shooter who likes to improve (and win) and you are prepared to discipline yourself to achieve goals you have set yourself. You probably have already achieved representative status at one of the 3 levels available.

41-50:

You are a good shooter who has occasional wins and enjoys competing but you lack consistency and are sometimes disheartened with your shooting. You would like to do better.

26-40:

You don't often win trophies, probably don't get a chance to shoot very often (you could be a fairly new shooter) but with a bit of luck you feel you will improve one day.

15-25:

You probably shoot because you like the company or your best mate shoots or it gets you away from the spouse/parents/in-laws every now and then. Anyway it's more fun sitting in the clubhouse with a beer than standing out in the heat or rain.

Maybe you can see yourself in this assessment, maybe you don't quite fit any of the four descriptions. Whatever your rating you CAN improve your shooting. And wouldn't you like to?

Perhaps you don't aspire to be a National Champion or even to join the ranks of your club's AA grade shooters, but deep down, wouldn't you like to shoot just that little bit better than you do now?

Well, you can help yourself with one of the following:

1. See your local coach. If he/she isn't interested in helping (but he/she will be!) ring your zone coach. These days most coaches are dedicated people ready to work with you to achieve your goals. They are now professionally trained and must keep up their skills to keep their position as a coach.
2. Keep a diary of your shooting; a plain notebook with a page for each shoot with your scores, shooting conditions and most important why you think you missed the ones that got

away. Over a period of time you will see your progress, find out what you did last time to correct a problem or at least have essential information to assist your coach to help you.

3. Mental rehearsal. Take a quiet few minutes occasionally before a shoot (or even an event) to close your eyes and imagine (or feel) your way through the event(s), clearly seeing yourself 'powdering' the targets.
4. Set yourself an achievable goal for your shooting within a reasonable time frame. It may be just to attend more shoots this year or it could be to achieve a higher grade or percentage, or maybe go to the Nationals. Decide you will do it and you are halfway there.

Shooting clays is fun. The more you break the more fun it becomes. Don't kid yourself you can't have both! Go out there and DO IT!

COACHING COUNCIL

On Saturday 6th March 1993 the Queensland Northern Zone Coaching Seminar was held at Charters Towers Gun Club.

Attendance was excellent with six Level 1 coaches, three Level 2 coaches and thirteen individual shooters. A pleasing aspect to come from the seminar was the request by four of the members to undertake Level 1 accreditation and a request by a Level 1 coach to progress towards Level 2.

As State Director of Coaching, I was pleased to see this commitment to coaching by all present.

The opening of the seminar was handled by Mr Tom Comerford, who addressed those assembled on what is coaching and what coaches need to be striving to achieve.

Following on from the opening, I explained the ACC/ACTA Update Policy which applies to all coaches regarding their accreditation status as active and non-active coaches. A lengthy session was then held outlining items from the Fourth Elite Coaches Conference held in Canberra. A point discussed in depth was situational leadership, which is not something you do to people, but something you do with people. "Remember there is nothing so unequal as the equal treatment of unequals."

Andrew Larsen presented a lecture on vision, explaining some of the methods used by top coaches in the USA, where he had spent time under their instruction. This session held the attention of all and many questions were put to Andrew.

Bob and Arthur Scott had set up their chronograph and those present took the opportunity to try the performance of their pet loads. There were many good and interesting points discussed.

Angelo Zappala gave a talk on the value of using a pattern board to help Gun-Fit. All present were eager to learn more and to see how they and their guns performed. At the specially installed Pattern Plate a few surprising results were found regarding the pattern and where they were actually looking.

To finish a very complete day, Arthur Kenna gave a presentation on centring 'Preparation before it is your turn to shoot, focus on the target.'

All in all a good seminar, well attended and by the feedback received on Sunday, most thought it a well presented course out of which much was learnt. An opinion expressed was that a seminar every 12 months is too big a gap, with a 6 monthly seminar being preferred. A promise to put this point to the QCTA was given.



Next year a four person team will be conducted over the program. Teams will consist of one member from each age group, and will be picked at random from competitors competing over the full program.



Robert William Trigger passed away March 28, 1993.




