This is a senior position which offers an attractive remuneration package by negotiation of around \$50k.

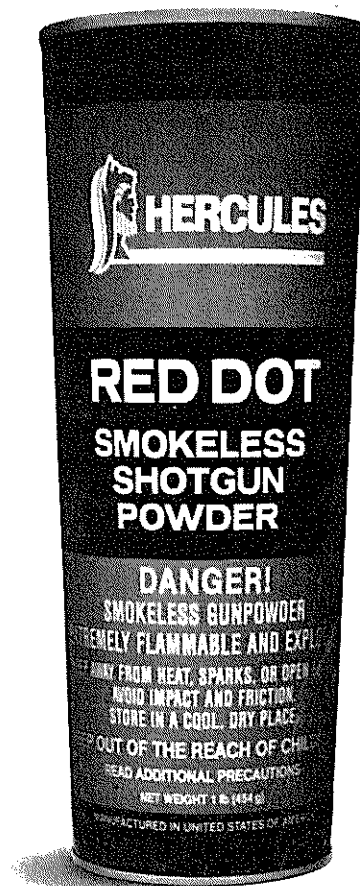

Expressions of Interest



Expressions of Interest are invited from suitably qualified Sports Administrators capable of assuming the role of National Executive Director of the National Rifle Association of Australia.

It is envisaged that the appointee would commence duty in early October, 1993, and that the effective transfer of all executive functions will occur after the appointee's successful conduct of the Association's annual National Championship to be held at McIntosh Rifle Range, Canberra, in November, 1994.

The Association is constituted under the Defence Act 1903, and its Council governs the whole system of Australian Rifle Clubs by means of State Associations, each having an elected Council. The peak Council of the NRAA comprises delegates from each State Association, from which is elected the National Executive. There is widespread Community involvement by men and women in our Clubs throughout Australia.

The National Executive Director operates the National Office, acts as Secretary and adviser to the NRAA Council, and generally acts as its Counsel and spokesperson upon public affairs.

Strong people management, administrative and sports promotional skills are required, as will be computer literacy and a knowledge of modern systems application in an office environment. The Head Office is presently located in an Eastern State.

Target Rifle Shooting has been practised in Australia under our aegis for almost 150 years.

The appointee would be expected to realise the ongoing promotional aims of the NRAA, which include the broadening of our disciplines to include the administration of all longarm target shooting disciplines except those already conducted by the Smallbore and Air Rifle Association Inc, and the SSAA.

The Association currently formulates the standard rules for Australian Fullbore, Service and Field, Target Rifle competitions, and participates in the National Coaching Accreditation Scheme, which produces Coaches from basic Club to advanced theory levels.

Current teams preparation activities include:

- (a) LOCAL — State and National Championships in Fullbore and 300M (UIT).
- (b) INTERNATIONAL — Bisley (UK) Championships and traditional International Matches (Fullbore). Commonwealth Games Competition (Fullbore). World Long Range Championships (The 'Palma' Match). Pan Pacific Match (Fullbore). World Championships (300M UIT). South Pacific Regional Championships 300M and Fullbore. Olympic Games (300M) subject to inclusion by host Country.

OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE NATIONALS — 1993

Darwin Gun Club in the Northern Territory played host to the 1993 Olympic Discipline National Championships, and what a magnificent job the Territorians did. When the decision to hold the Championships in Darwin was first arrived at, speculation mounted regarding the number of shooters who would travel the distance to compete, there was no cause to worry as numbers were on par with the 1992 series.

Upon arriving at the club the grounds looked a picture, aided by Phil Grove's 'for sale' Chevy prominent in the foreground. Many familiar faces were on the grounds with many not so familiar, I refer to the competitors who were there to compete in the Arafura Games which were being held in conjunction with the ACTA Championships. These competitors came mainly from Brunei, Taiwan and Taipei and included His Royal Highness Prince Haji Sufri Bolkiah of Brunei.

A great deal was mounting on this series, with each Championship, whether City of Darwin, Commonwealth or National event being as important as each other, as the total combined scores on each event selected not only the National Training Squad, but the World Championship Teams to compete in Barcelona, June 1993.

City of Darwin Olympic Trap Championship:

There were not too many slow starters for the series, not that you could afford to be now that the events consist of 125t, scores that went into the first final were the highest of all events. The final saw the familiar faces of John Maxwell 121, Michael Diamond 121, Russell Mark 120, Glenn Hayden 118, Greg Newey 117 and that other Mark in Geoff 117. No 25s were posted, yet Michael's 24 was enough to give him victory over John (23), and Russell's 24 put him in a shoot off (miss and out) with John to decide 2nd and 3rd. John missed early giving Russell 2nd place. Glenn Hayden shot 24 in the final to take A grade with a very good score of 118 + 24. Top lady shooter Desiree Huddleston out shot the ladies to take her section, and Vince Mollica won the junior section.

City of Darwin ISU Skeet Championship:

Skeeties started a bit slower than the trap boys with only two 25s being posted on day one, David Cunningham and John Summers were to do this after both shooting 23, 24 and then 25. Ian Hale got off to a slow first round 21, but consistently shooting two rounds of 24 moved him into a more competitive position. After the last 50t David Cunningham's 120 saw him go in clear leader with fellow Victorian's Ian Hale and John Summers next in line with 118s. David shot 24 to win outright and Ian shooting a creditable 25 in the final gave him second place with John 3rd 118 + 24. Other finalists Craig Meuleman took AA grade and A graders Clem Bertini and Brian Prosser fought it out with Clem coming out on top with a 23 in comparison to Brian's 22. Brunei shooter H. J. Samid took the B grade with 112 and South Australian Ron Smith was delighted to win the C grade section. No lady shooters competed in the ISU Skeet and only one junior in Andrew Larsen was to compete in his respective section, taking it with 99.

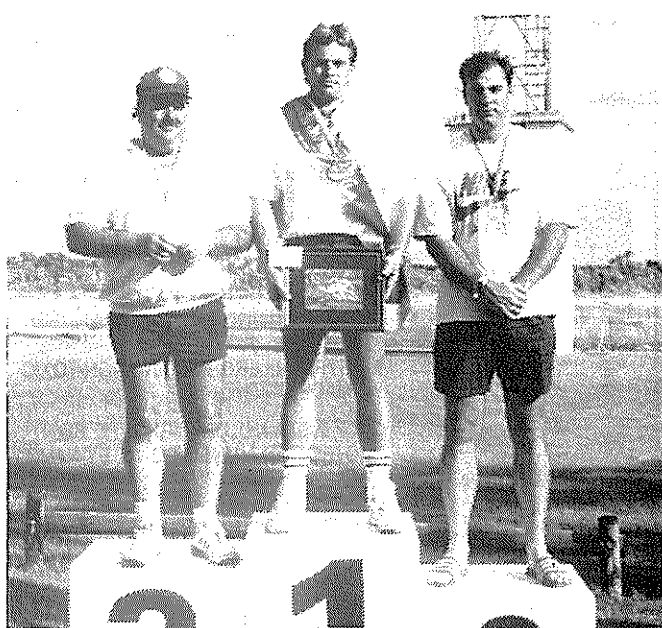
Commonwealth Olympic Trap Championship:

Scores dropped for this event with 25s being rare, Russell Mark posted two on day one to go in clear overnight leader on 73, however the following days 44 brought him into the final in 3rd position with Greg Newey on 117. Leaders going into the final on 118 were New South Welshmen Glenn Kable and John Maxwell. Making up the final squad on 116 were Michael Diamond and Victor DaCosta.

John Maxwell was to take the Commonwealth title after shooting a perfect 25 in the final, Glenn with 23 took overall 2nd and after a shoot off with Greg Newey, Michael Diamond took overall 3rd 116 + 24 + 4. Greg took A grade. Changing disciplines from skeet to trap for this event was Ron Smith, Ron impressed by taking B grade with 106/125, he was to change disciplines again in the National event and go on and win C grade — Mr Versatility. Desiree once again took the ladies section, and a popular win in the junior section went to local Brett Hall 106/125. Brett had just returned from a very successful Trap Nationals series in Adelaide, concluding with the Junior High Gun win.

Commonwealth ISU Skeet Championship:

ISU Skeet shooters really fired up for this event with scores being exceptionally high. Day one saw Craig Meuleman overnight leader with a well earned 75/75, David Cunningham and John Summers were well within reach after both shooting two rounds of 25 + 24 (74). Day two Craig let a couple go in the first round

to shoot a 22, but fought back with a 25 to follow. David was to shoot a fine 49 as did Ian Hale with John shooting a 47.

Scores going into the final were nothing short of brilliant. David lead the field on 123, right behind were Craig Meuleman and Ian Hale on 122. John was close by on 121 and making up the final squad on 111 were Brian Prosser and Malcolm Duff. The final saw David shoot 23 and Ian 24 to tie on 146, also tying, but for third place were Craig Meuleman and John Summers on 144. Shoot offs were definitely the order of the day as after the final Malcolm and Brian had also tied on 133 and A grade was not yet decided. The tension was so immense as all commenced another round. 3rd place was decided early with John missing, only a couple of stations later Malcolm was to miss giving Brian A grade, David and Ian were still going, however Ian's 20th target was to elude him giving David his second win of the series with 123 + 23 + 21.

National Olympic Trap Championship:

Jim Ellis who had not been his prominent self started the day off with a 25 and was to shoot well enough in this event (115) to make his first final of the series. Another new finalist was Mick Burling (113) from Tasmania. Michael started off slowly but improved on the second day with a well shot 49 and entered the final in second position on 118, one behind John Maxwell on 119. Accompanying these finalists were the Marx Bros. After the final John and Michael were tied on 144 apiece, the shoot off did not last long with John dropping his 2nd target giving Michael the National Olympic Trap Champion title. Russell took overall third. Mick Burling after shooting a 23 in his final, then had to go out and shoot another round to decide his placing in A grade. Joining Mick was Eric Bullmore, both shooting for first and second, and Dexter Barnes and Craig Tilley vying for third place. Dexter topped the squad with a 22 giving him third place with 1st in A grade going to Mick after posting a 21. Desiree shooting consistently once again took the Ladies section and Vince Mollica nudged out Brett Hall by a couple of targets to take the Junior section with a 105.

National ISU Skeet Championship:

David Cunningham was three targets ahead (243) of the field and leading the High Gun going into the National Championship, pretty much assuring him a place in the team to compete in Barcelona. Competition between Ian Hale (240), John Summers (239) and Craig Meuleman (237) was tight and added excitement to the outcome of this event. After day one Ian was on 73, David and Craig 72 and John 70. H. J. Samid started his day brilliantly with a pair of consecutive 25s, a third round 20 dropped him back in the field a tad. Day two saw Samid once again begin with a 25, as did Len Norman who always had a score board in his hand (thanks Len). Craig finished with a 25 to take him to 119, equal leader with David. Ian and John were disappointed after shooting 44 & 45, placing them 4th & 5th respectively in the final. Making up the squad was Brian Prosser who was improving his score each event. David was right on target and posted the only possible of the squad giving him the National ISU Skeet Champion title to add to his previous two titles. Craig took overall 2nd after shooting a 24, H. J. Samid and Ian shot 23s and were to continue shooting to decide third place, eventually won by the man that never gives in, Ian. John's 24 saw him take AA grade and Brian's 22 gave him A grade, with shoot offs being necessary to decide the other placings in both A & B grades.

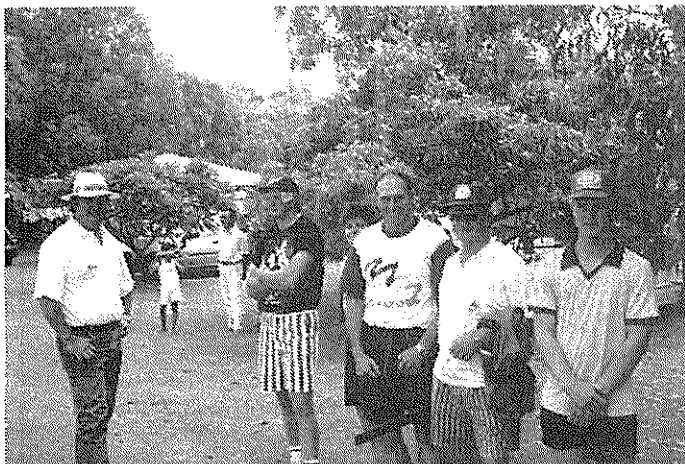
National Double Trap Championship:

These three shooters all shot 42s in the final for the placings to remain the same. They were accompanied in the final by Greg Newey, Craig Tilley and last years placegetter Graham Blaskett. Scott Voak from Northam shot 99 to take B grade with local Rodney King (76) taking C grade.

Apologies to all ASSA members out there for not having a newsletter out earlier. The ASSA committee worked very hard last year and decided to take a few months holiday. As you can see the ACTA have been kind enough to let us print our newsletter in the CTSN. We extend our gratitude to Leanne and all of the gang at the ACTA Office for this wonderful opportunity. Hopefully for the ASSA this newsletter will be read by thousands of shooters around the country and they will be able to make an informed decision on what the ASSA is all about.

I am sure that all of you would know that the ASSA Skeet Open held at Wagga Gun Club was a complete success. What some of you probably don't know is that the ASSA picked a skeet team to travel to New Zealand to compete in the NZ Skeet Carnival at Waitemaitia and the Nationals at Hamilton. The team comprised of the first shooter in each grade past the post at the ASSA open. In other words we had a shooter from AA grade, A grade, B grade and C grade plus a junior shooter. The junior that made the team was Richard Sammon from Griffith and young Richard ran a 200 x 200 in the Pre Nationals held at Hamilton. Richard was on top of the world with a 200 straight shot on his 17th birthday. I am sure he will not ever forget the feat and the after shoot birthday cake and presents. Richard in fact was one of the best performing Aussies and his other wins included the NZ Junior National Title and Junior High Gun. Veteran shooter Reg Clarke from Hawkesbury Gun Club also shot extremely well with wins in the Veteran National Championship and the Veteran High Gun. Brian Thomson was the best Australian performer for the actual National Championship and his 99/100 got him in the shoot-off with six others. Unfortunately it was not a good day for Brian and he let a low six get the better of him.

The Australian team also shot very well to beat the New Zealand Team in the Teams Match on their own turf by over 20 targets. It was fine shooting considering that the match took place in semi darkness. Both Laurie Chelepy and Glenn Clarke posted perfect scores for the Australian team and Merv Pratt posted a 50/50 on the New Zealand side. The ASSA and all of the Australian's that travelled to New Zealand would I'm sure like to extend their thanks to all of the Kiwi's that made us feel so welcome. Extra special thanks should go to Graeme Webber and Alec Corban for their hospitality. Also congratulations must go to the NZCTA for all of their hard work and preparations for the tournaments. Considering that there were 49 skeet squads (yes 49 squads) for the New Zealand Skeet Championship and the dedication and planning of the NZCTA really paid off and was evident in a well run shoot.

The trip to New Zealand was a resounding success for the 49 or so shooters that travelled. In fact the ASSA also helped organise the ACTA Teams (trap and skeet) to use Air New Zealand so as to take advantage of special prices negotiated by the ASSA. If at all possible when making any travel arrangements please consider using Air New Zealand and make mention of the ASSA. We all should endeavour to choose companies who sponsor clay target shooting first.

A new ASSA Committee was elected at the Skeet Open with Brian Thomson the new President and Chris Hughes as Vice President with the Secretary position going to Glenn Clarke. Leonie Robinson accepted the position of Treasurer but has since resigned due to work and family commitments. For this reason we have appointed John Gillman chartered accountants to do the necessary bookwork but not as an elected official. The committee decided it was time to have ASSA representation at the state level and so state reps were elected. Tony Long is the Qld rep, Scott Wright the NSW rep, Les Charles in South Australia and Max Weston in WA. Representation in New Zealand is handled by well known and respected shooter Merv Pratt. Please give these people your full support as they are working very hard to ensure that the sport of skeet shooting prospers.

Already Brian and Chris have affiliated the ASSA with the NSSA in America. This means that the ASSA is capable of running

NSSA registered shoots. This is important because when Australian skeet teams are selected to attend the World Championships they inevitably turn up in the US without a NSSA classification (grading). The poor shooters then have to shoot at 200 targets per gauge to obtain a classification that means 800 targets plus Doubles. By having our Association affiliated we can hopefully alleviate this problem and at the same time organise skeet shoots where shooters can try using the small gauges.

The ASSA Committee has been negotiating with several gun clubs and it looks as though the 1994 ASSA Skeet Open will be held at the Griffith Gun Club from the 5th to 8th in of May in 1994. Please put these dates into your shooting diaries for '94. We promise it will be a shoot not to miss. At this early stage it looks as though there will be a team of 9 shooters picked to travel to New Zealand: two from each grade plus a junior. These are only early discussions but we can assure you that if possible the ASSA can do it.

Griffith have also extended a welcome to the ASSA and they will be running a fundraising two day shoot the weekend before the Nationals this year. All profits will go to the ASSA and will then be put right back into skeet shooting. Shooters can use this two day as a warm up for the Wagga Nationals and also to see how great it is to shoot at the Griffith Gun Club. Peter Rosenboom the current President will ensure that all runs smoothly. This will mean that there will be a week of shooting in November. Just think Sunday and Monday at Griffith then travel to Wagga on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday the Pre Nationals at Wagga and then Thursday through Sunday the Nationals. 800 targets in 9 days, what a week of skeet!

We are also trying to work out a skeet circuit for '94. At this stage details are sketchy but we have been talking with our friends at Winchester and we know that it will take advantage of several of the two day shoots around the eastern part of Australia. Once again if people have some idea then please let us know.

There has been quite a lot of skeet shooting happening lately. Jenny Burt from the Tamworth Gun Club reported that their annual two day carnival was a great success. That great Queensland shooter Neil Dimmick won the High Overall for the weekend and the Tamworth Gun Club were able to donate over \$2,000 to charity.

The Victorian skeet carnival also saw Neil Dimmick take the Victorian Skeet title back up to Queensland. Much to the chagrin of the 5 other Victorian's that Neil shot-off with. Accolades to the VCTA and especially John McVitty who made the ASSA very welcome at the shoot. In fact John assisted the ASSA with organising the shooters meeting and to elect a new skeet representative for Victoria, Mr Bob Old. I'm sure that Bob means business and will ensure that Victoria will be well represented on a National level. Bob also shot very well over the Victorian carnival with a runner-up position in both the State Doubles event and also the State Skeet event, great shooting. The State Doubles was won by Glenn Clarke who also won the High Gun for the weekend. This high gun win made it two years running for Glenn, hopefully we may see a hat trick.

Brian Thomson had a good weekend at the South Australian Gun Club two day cash shoot. His 199/200 put him right in the money and Brian has been full of praise for the skeeties in the south. Great club, great shoot, have been Brian's comments so all should try to attend for next year.

The ASSA are still in the merchandising game as a way to raise money and promote skeet without increasing membership costs. I am positive that many shooters have seen the wonderful ASSA t-shirts and hats around the clubs. Until our next ASSA News please try and introduce a new shooter to the joys of skeet shooting. If that is not possible then at least consider going to your gun club more often or try and assist the club you belong to by volunteering to ref or score or to lend a helping hand.

The ASSA Committee have just met with the full ACTA Executive at their annual conference in Melbourne. Many important issues were discussed that will be of benefit to all skeet shooters.

Perhaps the most important issue is that the '93 Skeet Nationals have had a date change. The date for this years Skeet Nationals will be September 16th-19th at the Wagga Gun Club. The reason for this change is so that a 3 man Skeet team can be selected to go to the World Skeet Championships in San Antonio Texas. This is great news and we applaud the ACTA for their hard work and planning.

Other changes that are in the pipeline are that the '94 Skeet Nationals will be held in Victoria in May. This change obviously affects the ASSA's plans to hold the 1994 ASSA Skeet Open in Griffith in May 1994. Mothers Day, Sunday May 9, was the date for the Mount Isa Gun Club's monthly shoot, and only three competition events were programmed, but what a contest it was to be.

Many fine scores were shot during the course of the day with the 50 target Skeet event starting the ball rolling. Jim Edmonds claimed A grade with 49/50, Trevor Bennett showed that the B graders weren't to be dismissed either with a well shot 48/50, and Bill Koitka's score of 46/50 was the best in C grade.

Luncheon was served following the skeet and discussion among the shooters centred on the forthcoming 25th Anniversary Shoot to be held on the Queen's Birthday long weekend, with speculation running rife as to the chances of the locals cleaning up against visitors from all over Australia.

We didn't have to wait long to see what the locals could do either. Rod Maxwell set the early pace in the 100 target Trap with a very well shot 100/100 to finish with a pointscore of 295/300. Greg Matthews, who represented Queensland at the recent National Titles, didn't waste much time in making his presence felt with 100/100 also. However Greg missed out on the vital first barrel points which left Rod Maxwell as the A grade winner. B graders Geoff Ladbrook and Bill Koitka both shot 99/100 and 285/300 points but Bill Koitka won the grade on a count back. Gary Quan Sing won C grade with a convincing 97/100 for 272/300 points, and newcomer Myrtle Anderson proved her worth with 91/100 and 263/300 to win D grade. Lee Matthews was the best in the junior ranks and won that division with 83/100 and a pointscore of 236/300.

With the serious trap event out of the way it was time for some fun with a field event. Mick McGill won A grade with a well shot 53/60 with Bruce Murphy, who was just one point behind, claiming second place in the grade. First place in B grade went to Doug Stone on 42/60, and Lee Matthews took out second on 41/60. C grade saw another shooter Neville Anderson make his way to the winners circle with 44/60 leaving Tanya Maxwell in second place with 35/60. In D grade two newcomers, Greg Moncrieff and Myrtle Anderson won first and second with scores of 33/60 and 30/60 respectively.

With the competition over it was time to move back into the clubhouse to quench a few thirsts and present the trophies. The first presentation made by President Rod Maxwell was to the winners of the Northern Zone Day Single Barrel Championship which was held at the Mount Isa Gun Club last month. Ron Power, Ted Matthews and Gary Quan Sing were called upon to step forward and receive their respective badges for A B & C grades. The winners at the Mothers Day shoot were then presented with their trophies and as a special Mothers Day gift, all the ladies who do so much behind the scene were presented with a box of chocolates each as a token of the appreciation we all feel for their tireless efforts.

All told an excellent display of clay target shooting with Rod Maxwell and Greg Matthews both posting 100 breaks. Also fifteen shooters shot trap scores in excess of 90/100 which is a pretty good showing for a country club like Mount Isa.

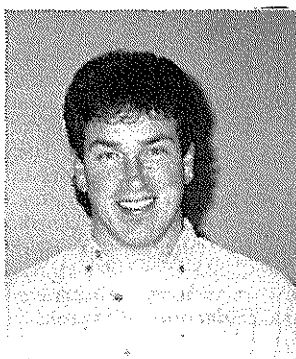

HABERMAN & HAYDEN CLAIM MAY 'TOP GUN' AWARDS

Steve Haberman from Geelong and Glenn Hayden from the Noorat Gun Club in Victoria each laid claim to their first major successes in the 1993 Winchester 'Top Gun' awards.

Steve, the Vice President of the Geelong Clay Target Club shot an enormous break of 442 at Broken Hill Gun Club's annual West Darling Championships on May 9th. The 1990 National Double Barrel Champion shot a combination of regular and high antimony AA 1250 loads for his break. Steve uses his original 680 Beretta which he started shooting with in the late 70s. This was his first win in the 'Top Gun' awards, however it is unlikely to be his last. Steve received 500 rounds of target loads for his break.

No surprise in the Junior High Gun section at the Darwin UIT Nationals was Glenn Hayden. Glenn has proved his strength at Olympic Trap over the past two years where he has virtually been unbeatable in the junior ranks and quite often in the open categories as well. Surprisingly the turning point in Glenn's shooting career so far was at the 1991 UIT Nationals in Adelaide when he missed out on the selection for the Junior Team for the World Championships later that same year in Perth. Instead of conceding, he has used that defeat to inspire him for selection as Australia's Junior for the 1993 World Championships in Barcelona. Glenn uses International 1350 H.A. 7½s in both barrels of his ASE 90 Beretta. He receives 1,000 target loads for his win in Darwin.

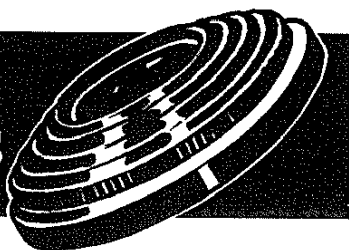

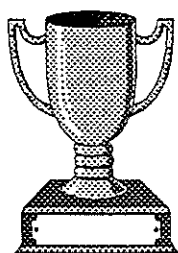

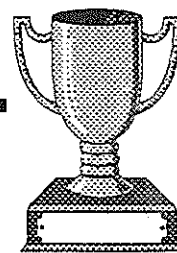

1993 CRAYFISH POKER

Introduction:

The concept is based on the number of 25s a shooter can get in five allocated events and take the form of a poker hand, but these hands do not necessarily conform to normal card conventions as these 'Crayfish' have made up their own rules!

The competitors this year will be able to play for higher stakes as some of the categories did jackpot from the 1992 carnival.

The categories to jackpot were:

3 straight: Three consecutive 25s worth \$200.00
4 of a kind: Four 25s worth \$200.00
A full house: All five 25s worth \$200.00

Competitors obtaining these categories share the money with other shooters in that category — please see the rules below.

How to play:

To be eligible a competitor must shoot at least one 25/25 or as commonly referred to a 'possible' in any one of the five allocated events which are:

Event 1. 25 DB Trap Cash Divide
 Event 2. 25 DB Inshore Electronics District Championship
 Event 3. 25 DB PS Zone Championship
 Event 4. 25 DB Crayfish Carnival Graded
 Event 6. State Champion of Champions *

* Note that only the 25 DB will be included and not the PS or SB.

The winning hands are split into 8 categories ranging from shooting only one 25 or 'possible' out of five allocated events to shooting all five possibles known as a 'full house' as shown in the table below.

Each category has combinations attached to it, so if a shooter wanted to achieve category four they could do so in a number of ways by shooting 25s in events 1-2-4 or 1-2-6 or 1-3-4 or 1-3-6 or 1-4-6 or 2-3-6 or 2-4-6.

Each category has cash prizes and these will be divided amongst shooters in each category.

We believe that as shooters move into higher categories more cash will be won by them as there would be less shooters in these categories, but the club can not guarantee this will be the case.

Rules

1. A shoot off will not count in this concept.
2. A shooter can not claim more than one category ie if a shooter scores all five possibles they cannot then claim to be part of the lower categories as well.
3. A shooter cannot elect a lower category having achieved a higher category.
4. The pointscore will be converted back into a double barrel score, so 75/75 does not have to be necessarily attained to qualify as a possible, in effect it will be the number of targets hit.
5. If a category is not attained then the money allocated will jackpot to the following year.
6. The Committee reserves the right to change the rules and definitions and in the case of a dispute the Committee's decision is final.

A bonus of \$50 will be divided amongst shooters achieving their first 25 trap break in addition to what final categories they may achieve.

Shooters who do not wish to nominate for all of the five allocated events simply reduce the highest category they may have achieved if they nominated for all five.

Once shooters pay their nominations for the events they are automatically enrolled in the Crayfish Poker School.

Benefits to the shooter

Shooters would now focus primarily on achieving a 25 first then think of the money to be won (the reverse of sweeps). This opens up the shooter to the likelihood of a place in their grade, if not an overall, in the event(s) and at worst a dividend at the end of the carnival depending upon what final category is achieved at no additional cost other than normal nominations.

It is important to note that even if a shooter does not get a 25/25 in an event, they could still be eligible for places and prizes in their respective grades.

Not everything is possible but a 25/25 is . . .

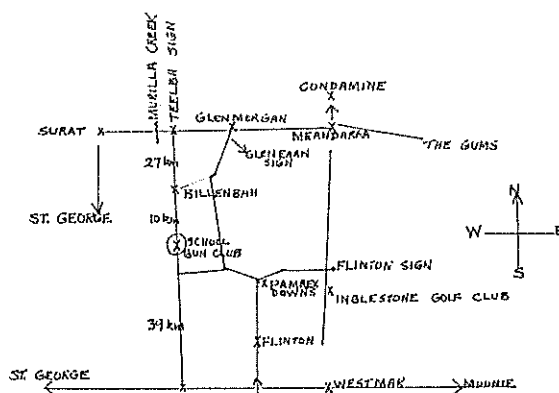
