





EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Sir,

At the recent Skeet Nationals, it occurred to me that as the rules now stand, where it is permitted to mount the gun to the shoulder before calling for the target, that some of our skeet shooters were not shotgun shooting at all, but were rifle shooting with rifles using shotgun cartridges.

Their method resembles the Olympic sport of Running Boar rather than shogun shooting.

Why don't we return to the original rules and ideas of skeet and shoot gun down.

I feel that the ISU skeet ready position is rather extreme, however, the increasingly popular sporting clays rules have arrived at a sensible gun down position that could be adopted to skeet.

I have spoken to a number of gun on shoulder shooters and all say they would support a gun down rule. I have also spoken to release trigger shooters, most would support the gun down rule.

There is the argument that in America, gun on shoulder is the norm and that if we are to compete with them, we should shoot that way here. I hear that the A.C.T.A. may not send any more teams to the U.S.A. so how many of us will shoot in the U.S.A., very few I believe. So does it matter what they do in the U.S.A.

Most people oppose change even change for the better. Look at the fuss when 28 gram loads were introduced. In hindsight has this adversely affected our sport? I think not. Nor do I think adopting the sporting clays off shoulder position in skeet would detract from this great sport. On the contrary, I think it would restore skeet to a shotgun sport as it was originally intended.

Skeet can be shot gun down with a normal gun. We have a shooter who over the last 6 months (approximately 2,500 targets) has averaged better than 98% with a side by side Purdey. Our high gun at the Nationals also shoots gun down.

Dear Sir,

Having read the January 1994 ACTAs' Editor's Mailbox I was amused/pleased at the diversity of comment by various individuals. One person even had (2) two chances to be heard by the masses. The content I am referring to, ranged from ballistics to promotion and a splendid display of statistics to promote ones cause.

My humble contribution is due to fortunate circumstances.

I was asked to press the button during (2) two rounds of trench. Some of the shooters were world class athletes, the balance had not yet reached that level, or passed it (so I thought, wrongly).

To make things more interesting there were (2) two new guns, a Perazzi MX8 and Beretta ASE90. Furthering the contrast there was one gun amongst them that exceeded my age (old).

The first round started as I expected, very few chips, most totally smashed and even the odd miss. Although the competitors were interrupted by (2) two hiccups from the No. 3 trap, everyone remained focussed and supportive of each others effort during the interruptions.

Breaking for the second round allowed the soap boxes to be brought out. This is where I started to wonder, whether I was in Canberra or Illawarra. Fortunately this was a brief pause before the serious stuff started.

What I wasn't aware of was that the first round was the prelude to the main event.

Chipped targets became smashed and smashed targets became dust with the second barrel.

All the competitors concentration level, had kicked up another level but there remained an air of ease.

This was not what I had expected but the whole squad broke target after target with consummate ease.

Then I noticed one of the competitors leave the line up, after his (25) twenty-five targets had concluded. He had shot at No. 1 for the last target.

For some reason the last (5) five shooters sped up their last shot, this I could not understand. Upon completion of the round everyone put their guns on the rack and proceeded to clap and congratulate the first finished shooters.

After listening carefully I realised why the warm good wishes and handshakes. At 65 years of age this particular shooter/sportsman had shot (25) twenty-five at trench. He shot 25 and did it in style.

Being new to this sport I expect to see and participate in many such experiences (good ones). To be able to see and learn from champion sportspeople is a bonus. More importantly I am proud to belong to the Illawarra club after witnessing true sportspeople in competition.

By the way congratulations Bill Shelton on your (25) twenty-five at trench.

The 1993 NSW Trap Carnival certainly drew 230 shooters on Saturday, but by Monday was down to 130 shooters, due to another Wagga washout. It's not the first time this has happened. Does Downside have less rainfall than Wagga? Do the shooters want to shoot in those type of conditions again?

With reference to the Wagga City Council, one would assume any Council faced with a multi million dollar sporting development on their back door step would be supportive.

Income generated from agricultural purpose in this country in recent times has generated record numbers of farmers going 'broke'.

The only real growth industry is the Tourist Industry. How many tourists go to the North Coast of NSW? How many go to Downside?

It would appear that Queensland does not even exist, even though they have nearly as many shooters in Victoria.

The fact is 80% of registered shooters reside in the three Eastern States. A centrally located area, (including Queensland) with temperate climate including winter, which is a popular destination for holiday makers, families and overseas tourists, located on a major arterial road and suitable for the National Office, is NOT Downside.

How many times have shooters whinged to you about what should be done 'for the good of the sport'. There has been plenty of talk for many years, but no action.

This proposal has been put together 'for the development of Clay Target Shooting in Australia', not the development of a particular area or zone.

CUNNINGHAM & HAYDEN SHARE 'TOP GUN' OF THE YEAR

David Cunningham from the Frankston-Australian Clay Target Club and Glen Hayden from the Noorat Clay Target Club, both in Victoria, have been declared joint winners of Winchesters' annual Top Gun' award. The Executive members of the National Shooting Committee in conjunction with Mr Bruce Burns, the Marketing Manager for Winchester-Olin, Australia voted on the twelve finalists in December with a tie being the result. Craig Bentley from South Australia finished one vote behind David and Glen, followed by Jason Jolly and Neil Berry.

David, 31, the General Manager of Gathercole Abattoirs in Carrum, had an outstanding year in both U.I.T. and American Skeet. At the Australian U.I.T. National Championships in Darwin he won the whole program, three championships plus the Overall High Gun as well as establishing an Australian record, which is still yet to be broken, of 146/150. (U.I.T. rules changed in January 1993). In September at the American Skeet Nationals in Wagga he went very close to simulating his efforts in Darwin by being placed second in three of the four events (he shot 100/100 in all three singles events) and was placed third overall in the doubles. He easily won the Overall High Gun as well as a second trip to the World Skeet Titles in Texas which he once again passed on to a lower placed competitor due to work commitments. He handles a trap gun with some distinction also, as he shot a 400 break at the New Zealand Nationals in March as well as shooting off for second in their Double Rise Championship and finishing runner up in their mini target title. Also overseas this year in Italy he finished seventh in the World U.I.T. Cup thus becoming only the third Australian Skeet shooter ever to gain a top 10 ranking in a world event.

1993 proved that David has become undoubtedly Australia's best all round shooter, as well as our current number one dual-discipline skeet shooter. He uses AA 1250 9s for skeet and $7\frac{1}{2}$ s for trap. Over the two years that the Winchester 'Top Gun' awards have been operating David Cunningham has now accumulated a massive 25,500 shotshells in awards. This is in addition to the advertised trophies on offer.

Glen Hayden, 20, from Terang in south western Victoria, who works as a carpenter with his father, had an outstanding year which has seen him blossom as a promising junior into one of the countries best U.I.T. shooters. He easily won the Junior U.I.T. High Gun at the Nationals in Darwin thus making the Australian Junior Team for the Barcelona World U.I.T. Championships where he had a top 10 finish in Olympic Trap and won the silver in Double Trap with a world class score of 137 out of 150. This year he went to the State Olympic Trap Championships in Tasmania, New South Wales, South Australia and Victoria where he finished second overall in all four. In the South Australian title he ran the first 104 straight. To prove his ability isn't only in the U.I.T. disciplines, Glen won the Overall High Gun against two hundred competitors at the Victorian State Trap Carnival held at the Melbourne Gun Club in November. At this carnival he also won the State Handicap from the 21 metre mark. To cap off the year in Christchurch he won the New Zealand Olympic Trap Championship as well as the High Gun honours for the week. Glen's father, Gary, has shown great support for his son travelling to many competitions around Australia simply to watch or help run the event. Gary himself is a very fine shot, but has taken a back seat in recent times to help Glen reach his ultimate goal, which will no doubt be in the very near future.

David and Glen will both receive the target load of their choice for winning, Glen preferring AA 1350 HA's for the U.I.T. disciplines and AA 1250 HA's for DTL. In 1994 the overall prize has been increased from 15 to 20 cases of target loads for the winner with final registrations being accepted up until March 31st.

1994 Year of the Coach

The Australian Coaching Council has designated this year as 'The Year of the Coach'.

Throughout this year, there will be an ongoing campaign to develop and raise the profile of all coaches.

The Australian Clay Target Association will be involved and over the year several programs and innovative projects will be announced.

By this campaign, we are aiming to have a positive impact on the status of coaching, the preparation of our athletes and the development of our sport in the community.

Coaches stay tuned.

While on the subject of 1994, I would like to remind coaches of all levels, of the Accreditation Update program. Many of you will be in the group that comes due for updating from the 1st January 1995. Therefore as 1994 is your last year to obtain updating points, may I recommend that you contact your state coach and check your status.

The A.C.T.A. and the National Coaching Council values all accredited coaches and wishes to assist you in the retention of your hard earned credentials. Please assist us to assist you to maintain the momentum and higher profile that coaches and coaching is gaining within the shooting ranks.

Revised ACTA/ACC Level 2 Accreditation Course

Following on from the successful revision of our Level 1 Accreditation Course, a rewrite of the Level 2 course was undertaken. On the 9th November 1993, the Australian Coaching Council's Technical Committee advised that the revised Level 2 course was approved.

The theme of the original course has been retained, but reworded to be able to improve its content. This new course now has improved Course Delivery and Reference Material, along with small changes to Course Prerequisites.

Several of the course prerequisites are:

- Be a practising Level 1 Accredited Coach with a minimum of 24 months experience.
- (ii) A qualified Trap or Skeet Referee.
- (iii) Application supported by a Zone or State Coach.

Video tapes for reference material and use in some of the 12 Syllabuses has been introduced. The correspondence component has been retained, with those modules being rewritten and reduced from nine (9) to seven (7).

For the coaches that undertake higher accreditation, I'm sure they will find this revised Level 2 Accreditation a more indepth program suited to todays needs.

GUN REVIEW: THE BERETTA 390 SEMI-AUTO

Beretta continue to play an increasingly large role in the shotgun market in Australia. These last few years have seen a surge in buyer interest in the guns from this large and highly diverse Italian maker.

The A390 ST, to give it its full title, is the latest addition to the Beretta line up, and as a replacement for the well known A303 it is a gun which may well quickly grab a big piece of the market for gas operated semi-autos.

Over the last three decades, gas operation has quite rightly become the accepted means of cycling auto-loading shotgun actions. The high gas volume produced at relatively low pressure by the shotgun cartridge makes it an ideal vehicle for this kind of operation.

Shooters who favour magazine repeaters will be well aware of the lightness of recoil that usually attends the gas operated action. This is one of its major advantages.

With an eye for the huge American market, Beretta has offered this gun with three inch chambers and choke tubes, all proved as suitable for the use of steel shot.

The aim of the game has been to design a semi-auto with a genuine all round capacity, and this is a problem which has been complicated very considerably by recent developments. We could well ask the question of whether all round usage could be changing.

Fifteen years ago, there would have been many shotgunners who had never fired anything other than 32 gram loads out of their guns. This was the standard trap load, the standard skeet load, the standard field load, and needless to say it was picked up by sporting clays shooting and became the standard there, too.

But today, anyone tackling trap or skeet is going to have to shoot 28 gram loads. Many a shooter starts his kids on clays, and of course a gas operated gun is a great start for a junior, because of its mild recoil. But would the usual semi-auto of this type handle the mild 28 gram trap ammunition which DTL trap and skeet now require?

To complicate this even further, there is the release of the 24 gram loads for all UIT competition. This is seven eights of an ounce, a load which once used to be thought of as a 20 gauge shotload only, and suddenly it springs into life as a competition load for two very demanding shotgun disciplines.

Times are indeed changing at the lighter end of the shot charge spectrum. But don't forget, this is a three inch gun, with 76mm chambers, designed to handle up to an ounce and seven eights of shot. Fox shooters do require heavy shot weights, and just at the moment Australia, with all thanks due to the rabid green movement, is under perhaps the biggest plague of foxes that we've ever had. I know fox shooting folk buying the buffered XX Winchester Magnum with the coppered load of an ounce and a half of BB, and I have to say it does tend to unsettle a fox a bit, too. And this is what's available at the upper end of the shot charge spectrum.

It's plain to see that any semi-auto gun setting out to do an all round job could easily have its work cut out for it, particularly if it boasts that you don't have to make adjustments as you switch from the lightest to the heaviest loads.


The problem when reduced to its basics has always revolved around properly managing the gas that escapes from the cartridge. The gun discharges, the pressure mounts, and things start happening to the moving parts. It is erroneous to think that light shotgun loads must have low pressures, because the burning speed of the propellant is all important in this regard, and a load with a very light shot charge can still use a fast burning powder which will generate more pressure than a magnum. The problem has other dimensions, including the barrel time, which means how long it takes the shot and all this gas to clear the barrel, and also the volume of gas which is produced. Magnum cartridges have slow burning powders, so their pressures may be lower, but they may have large charge weights which give a lot of bulk to the gas they give off.

By whatever means is used, and in whatever the load, just enough of the available gas has to be bled off to cycle the action, but it has to be not too much or else it will pound the metal parts with too much force. If not enough gas can be found, then indigestion results and the action will fail to cycle. Neither of these unhappy endings contributes much to good all round shotgun use, and the possibility that they'll occur sets a hard task for the maker of a gas operated gun seeking to give it all round capacity.

In the case of the 390, we find a method of gas compensation which involves the use of a small valve that sits at the front of the gas assembly. When the large quantity of gas is present, the valve opens further to allow it to be harmlessly vented. When it's a small volume, then it stays more firmly closed, to conserve enough of it for proper action cycling.

There is a cleverly designed venting system at the front of the fore-end, which picks up this existing gas and allows it to discharge without burning the hide off the operator. In the meantime, regardless of the heaviness of lightness of the shot load, the gun has fired and recycled. The accompanying booklet says the gun has been set up for shotloads from 28 gram to 56 gram, but in testing I used every combination I could think of from the fastest heavy field loads, in the upper range, going all the way down to below this 28 gram recommendation to the lightest 24 gram trench cartridges, and it worked without a pause.

I must also add that the 390's operation did not appear to differentiate between the lighter and heavier loads with a preference for one a grudging acceptance of the other. You know how it is with semi-autos; you hear what's going on and become accustomed to that busy instant of shuffling after the shot is fired while cycling is taking place. It's generally possible to pick up any reluctance by a change of the recycling sounds. But the 390 just ate up whatever load was put into it and tossed out the empties to about the same spot on the ground, without any hesitation.






The New 1201F Berettas are suitable for STEEL SHOT

In terms of its specifications, the gun is pleasant in outline, not too bulky in profile. The slightly hump backed appearance is evident from the photography. The gun handles nicely, without too much forward heaviness to impede the swing, or too much mass which would deaden the feel.

The magazine cutoff is located on the left side of the receiver, and is easily accessible. This is important on a semi-auto, I believe, because in two movements, one to depress the cutoff and the next to pull back on the breechblock, the chamber is cleared and the gun is made obviously and immediately safe. This allows negotiation of fences or other difficult terrain without all the rigmarole of emptying the magazine.

When a dog bolts in front, or someone approaches in the field, or whatever it may be, it is important to have access to a procedure of making safe the firearm, and that procedure should be both immediate and obvious, because for it to fulfil its purpose others may have to see it happen. (Just try getting into a vehicle of mine without doing it to your gun and you'll see what I mean).

The 390 has an alloy receiver with a non-glare surface. It is set off in appearance by a contrasting gold coloured trigger, and the crossbolt safety catch lies in the forward section of the trigger guard.

As an interesting feature, the safety, which comes set up for the righthanded shooter, can readily be reversed in action, so that it suits the lefthander. To do this, all that is required is to push the safety out of its housing, reassemble it upside down, and then to put it back in place.

The test gun, which came in at seven and a half pounds, as advertised, had the shorter of the two barrel lengths, which are listed at twenty-eight and thirty inch. Both options, incidentally, come with choke tubes.

The barrel did in fact measure twenty-eight inches, but when in place, it only measures twenty-seven inches from the front of the receiver to the muzzle. The top chamber-most inch of the barrel slides into the housing, out of sight. American magazine repeaters which give barrel length usually do so not in terms of actual overall length, but from where they emerge from the receiver.

If this barrel is measured this way, it means the gun comes with two options of not twenty-eight and thirty inch, but twenty-seven and twenty-nine. It is important to remember that any semi-auto has a receiver length which in effect adds to the length of the barrel, usually by about four inches or ten centimetre. This makes a thirty inch barrelled under and over roughly equal in

length to a twenty-six inch semi-auto, so it is not hard to end up with an overlong magazine repeater.

The 390 with its 0.94 kg tube of twenty-seven inches of effective length was pleasant to swing, and its five mm rib was easily picked up by the eye. The rib is relatively light, and stands up reasonably high as well.

Point of impact was right on the line of aim, which is good. The barrel, being not a heavy one, could be sensitive to changes of point of impact with varied shot weights. This is normal, and in fact unavoidable. Anyone buying the 390 for its versatility in handling different shot weights would be well advised to run a rough point of impact check before entering a shooting match at Monte Carlo for a helicopter pad. As a rule of thumb, the longer and lighter a barrel is, the more it may react to changes of shot weight.

This brings me to a pleasing feature of this gun.

The 390, carrying on the tradition of its predecessor the 303, comes with a readily adjustable stock. It has an ingenious system of spacers which means that the drop at heel can be changed. Not only that, but so can the cast-off.

This is an excellent principle, and it is something which in time will grow to be more sought after by Australian shooters.

The system involves removing the rubber recoil pad with a Phillips screwdriver and looking down into the hollow butt. The eye will fall on a 13mm nut in place over a small metal spacer. A hole is drilled off centre in this spacer, and when it is put into place, the stock moves away in accordance with the pressure cast onto it by the eccentrically drilled hole.

At the head of the stock, the other end, there is a matching polymer spacer, which is also coded. These two parts are fitted at the factory, and a small table comes in the gun's instruction handbook which decodes them.

For instance, a 55-DX spacer married with another 55-DX will give a drop of 55mm and cast-off, whereas two spacers marked 60-SX will give 60mm of drop, but cast-on, for the lefthanded shooter. Other combinations are available.

This is thinking that ought to be endorsed. So often, people buy guns, find they can't shoot with them, and then sell them off as being no good, when all that has happened is that the stock doesn't fit them. Never actively setting out to find out what their stock measurements really are, they go from one gun to the next, very expensively, till they come on one that more or less fits, and find that they can hit things with it.

It makes a lot more sense to buy a gun with some degree of adjustability in the stock, and thus do the experimenting a lot more cheaply.

Further to which, cast-off is the forgotten measurement of shotgunning, and in time it will be rediscovered. It is the kind of statistic in a gun that may not matter much until you really need it, such as on a sporting clay straightaway, which needs a very fast mount on account of its speed. If the stock fits, and this includes cast-off, then the pattern is a lot more likely to hit where you're looking. If it doesn't fit, then lack of sufficient cast-off is going to cause the shot to go up the side of the target.

Having a built in system to supply a change of the major stock dimensions is more than useful. It also adds to the versatility of usefulness that Beretta are aiming for with this gun. It could be brought up at the back, for instance, to give less drop at the heel and thereby lift the point of impact if heavy field ammunition lowers it. Or it could be brought up to shoot trap with. It could also be readily altered if it is to be shared by, say, two different shooters in the one family.

The buyer of a new shotgun really has little choice but to regard all the dimensions of the wood as being variables open to adjustment. I have never once picked up a gun off a rack and found that it fitted me perfectly. This explains the growing tendency in factory guns for stocks, particularly combs, to be made thick. The wood is thus available for the new owner to alter to suit, by having some taken off where necessary.

It stands to reason that if the stock has some adjustability built into it, then far less if any work is going to be required on the surface of the wood itself. This is a major advantage. It not only preserves the original finish, but it minimises time loss through having the work done, and it does away with the cost of having someone customise the dimensions.

The finish of the 390 is very good, in typical Beretta style. The parts all fit together well, and the polish of the chromed bore made cleaning it a breeze. The bluing was lustrous, and there were no obtrusive signs of metal tooling on the moving parts.

The wood also was very tidy. The finish on the test gun was synthetic. Chequering was neat, with a heavy border, at about twenty lines per inch. It was suitably functional.

The tubes supplied with the gun were standard Beretta pattern, and the configurations were improved cylinder at .007", and modified at .017", improved modified at .027", and full at .034". This is a good span of measurements, and it gives the shooter enough room to manoeuvre in finding suitable patterns for any task.

Over the years, some changes have taken place in the degree of constriction built into Beretta tubes, and so there is not a lot of point in giving specific detail of how the patterns of the test gun ran. It is normal to have a thou. or two of variation between tubes, and there may be a little more than that between barrels, and so by the time the various combinations are put together all sorts of pattern graduations are possible.

This is as it should be. The important thing is not so much the absolute constriction, but instead it is the graduation between the tubes, so if an improved cylinder tube is a little open for a particular cartridge or job, the next step up to the modified will not be so great as to over-tighten the pattern, or so small as not to tighten it at all.

I have tested systems which are so open that the skeet, improved cylinder and modified tubes have all thrown patterns near enough to cylinder. Suffice it to say that these have not been Beretta systems. This one is time honoured and works well.

There is only one trick with this gun which should be mentioned to intending buyers.


When it is being assembled, the gas exhaust valve can be incorrectly placed inside the piston. When the gun is shipped, it comes taken down in its cardboard packing, and to avoid loss, this valve is deliberately fitted out of position. This is done because it cannot be put into the place it actually belongs in while the gun is broken down.

There is a comprehensive instruction manual that comes with the gun, and close scrutiny of this will show that the bits and pieces that have to go together in the 390 are assembled in an entirely different order from the way they go into a 303. It is not a large diagram to work from, and if the gun is put together the wrong way, it will fire single rounds but will fail to feed.

On no account should the small valve be placed inside the silver piston. It is necessary to remember that this valve and the spring it fits into are the pieces last added before the fore-end cap is screwed on.

Overall, this was an enjoyable gun to test, and it is certainly a worthy successor to the 303, with its pointability and light recoil. It gave very good service in the field over a fair bit of shooting, and it is built with the attention to detail which Berettas are famous for. It is a well thought out design which lives up to the claims its manufacturer makes for it. As far as I can see it is certain to be well accepted, and it has every likelihood of popularity.

A visit to America as part of the 1995 World Police and Fire Games Management Team afforded Jan and myself the opportunity to visit Vandalia, Ohio for the 1993 Grand American Trapshooting Tournament. To say that this competition is huge is a vast understatement, which will be supported by anyone who has been fortunate enough to have attended this event. I certainly want to go back, and I firmly believe every trapshooters aim should be to visit it at least once in their life.


The governing body of the event is the Amateur Trapshooting Association with its offices located on the grounds. I found it difficult to believe the grounds are used only twice a year, once for the Ohio State Championships and once for the Grand American. The grounds are vast, with one hundred (100) trap layouts and one mile (1.6 kilometres) of exhibitors. The background for the layout is the Dayton Airport which closes the north south runways during the shoot.

The shoot runs for ten (10) days with the principal day being the Grand American Handicap with some four thousand nine hundred and fifty (4,950) shooters nominating. The ground is divided into twenty-five (25) banks of four (4) traps and the shooter is allocated to a bank. The shooter then proceeds to the bank allocated and shoots his first twenty-five (25) targets (five per lane) on the first layout of the bank, he then moves immediately to the second layout, then to the third and the fourth and approximately fifty-five (55) minutes after firing his first shot, he has completed his one hundred (100) targets and the event, if he has not shot a possible.


Each layout is controlled by a High School/College student who acts as referee, puller and scorer and this works exceptionally well. Who can argue with a very attractive eighteen (18) year old female dressed in minimal summer attire? In control of each bank is a supervising referee who attends to disputes, complaints etc. which are very few. The score is called after each five (5) targets and if not disputed each score then becomes fixed. The score is entered on a computer at the Administration Office after the completion of the event and it becomes a simple matter to find event winners and sweeps winners. They have a number of sweep divisions/purses which the shooter may choose to enter in each event and the payouts in some are quite worthwhile with some shooters winning in excess of twenty thousand (\$20,000) dollars.

It was interesting to find that it is still permissible to use thirty-two (32) gram shells in the events, but shooters by choice were electing to use twenty-eight (28) gram shells. Speaking with the administration, it appears it will not be too far into the future that the twenty-eight (28) gram loads will become compulsory. On payment of the entry fee the shooter also pays for the shells he will use in the event and he collects these (he selects brand/load/shot size) from the shellhouse. During the tournament some four and a half (4.5) million shells are dispensed.

Another very pleasing aspect of the tournament is the number of disabled shooters taking part. Of particular interest was a wheelchair shooter, Bat Thomas, who used a fifty-one (51) inch pump action shotgun. Bat is unable to move his head left or right, or to mount the gun to his shoulder. His scores were well into 'A' grade classification, including double rise. We spent some time in the company of Bat (who visited Pat and Ray Macks stand frequently) and was disappointed to learn his injuries were the result of a visit to Australia and a motor vehicle accident, but to see him shoot and experience his zest for life was a pleasing circumstance of our visit. Parking for disabled competitors is permitted as near to the layouts as possible. All other parking is

strictly supervised and it was a very common sight to see incorrectly parked vehicles being towed away to a compound, from which the recovery of a vehicle was only on payment of a substantial fee.

Movement around the ground is by a large trailer towed by a tractor. These tractors in turn are manned by members of local service clubs. They run continually during the shoot and shooters have priority.

One could visit the Grand just to browse through the displays and stands alone. All major firearm manufacturers are represented and all carry virtually their full range of products. Manufacturers of all shooting related articles are represented, as are jewellery, clothing, leathercraft, embroidery and art/printing traders. It is possible to have clothing manufactured and embroidered on the grounds within the hour. There is something for everyone, including Australiana, courtesy of Pat and Ray Mack.

Our visit to the Grand was an experience we will never forget, and is something we would love to repeat.

HISTORY OF ACTA GUN CLUBS

By George Biggs, ACTA Historian

To the best of my knowledge clay target shooting in Australia began around 1920 and was very low key for quite a few years between the two world wars . . . 1914-1918 and 1939-1944.

It was 1945 before we began to organise nationally.

Over the next several months we will run a series of articles that will give our readers an insight into how the average club came into being and the people involved in the development.

Northam and Districts Gun Club (Inc) - WA


Northam and Districts Gun Club (Inc) was established in 1954. The foundation office bearers were: President, Jack Moore; Secretary/Treasurer, Roy Holtfreter. The initial club location was Grass Valley, W.A., and the present club location is 'Island Farm', Northam, W.A., with field layout on 'Bailee Farm', Northam.

This club has never shot live birds and commenced shooting clay targets in 1953.

The club was formed followin a meeting convened by Roy Holtfreter after discussion with Perth members at a Narrogin duck shoot. The original location was on Peter Dempster's farm at Grass Valley. Moving onto an old football field at Grass Valley, which was public land, was considered, but it was discovered that the route for a new standard gauge railway was pegged over this after the lease was drawn up and some work done. Purchased 'Island Farm' in 1963, 56 acres of prime land one and a half miles from the centre of town, and have cropped 29 acres of this every year. Fenced 13 acres on creek side to form fauna reserve in 1972, with 7ft link mesh, fully maintained and supported by the club. Constructed 7 station field complex in 1975 and conducted 100 target event each year over two days, as well as DTL Championships. Have 3 DTL and 2 skeet layouts. The present project is the building of a house for a caretaker.

Charleville Diggers Gun Club - Qld


Charleville Diggers Gun Club was established in 1935. The foundation office bearers were: President/Secretary/Treasurer, Malcolm McGregor. The initial club location was McGregor Park, Quilpie Road, Charleville, and the present club location is Adavale Road, Charleville.

This club has never shot live birds and commenced shooting clay targets in 1935 to the best of our knowledge.


The club commenced skeet shooting on the site of the Diggers racecourse, known as McGregor Park and was called the Charleville Diggers Gun Club. The club was inactive during World War II.

In 1947 the Charleville Diggers Gun Club got under way again after many difficulties in procuring ammunition and targets. Lal Armstrong was President and Jack Harland as Secretary/ Treasurer, both of whom were 'Diggers'. As the old grounds where the club had first started shooting had been sold, with the main racecourse on the sandy soil east of Charleville, the gun club moved to this new site in the centre of the course, where an Eley Minor trap was put in operation.

It was not long before there was another shift of the club grounds from out of the racecourse area to an area on the southern side of the showgrounds which adjoined the racecourse, and under the leadership of Ossie Smith as President and Reg Akers as Secretary/Treasurer, two auto traps were installed and then the club really got under way. The club had a membership of around 100 local shooters, and in the early Fifties was rated as the best club in Queensland, and as Jock Wilson, a Past President of the Australian Association said when he attended one of the open three days shoots, the club was capable of holding the National Championships. The Down the Line layout was increased to three auto traps to be able to handle the large number of shooters. The late Fifties saw a decline in the shooting due mainly to the economy and drought in the area, and as the club was becoming more hemmed in at its site on the showgrounds, there was another move to its present site just off the Adavale Road, about two miles from Charleville.

The club's name was changed to the Charleville Gun Club, as most of the old 'Diggers' had passed on. In this period the club lost all previous records when the then Secretary, Brian Allen, had the misfortune to have the homestead on 'Allendale' Station destroyed by fire.

There followed a slow build-up of the new grounds until the reins were taken up by President, Jim Mahoney, with Noel Gadsby as Vice President and Don Turnbull as Captain/Secretary. The club now has lovely grounds. There are two Down the Line and one Skeet layout, with beautiful trees, lawns, a very good club house, grounds fully lit and modern shower and septic toilet facilities.

In the past such greats as Newton Thomas, Clive Evans and Joe Raleigh were members of the Charleville Diggers Gun Club and attended shoots regularly. Also Doug Smith began his shooting with the Charleville club, and any shooter in Australia knows his class.

OUT OF THE PAST

The following item has been reprinted from the Australian Shooters and Anglers News dated 15th October 1950. Thanks to Les Eastoe (Frankston Australian CTC) for supplying same.

Horrie James (Duxbac) Father of Clay Bird Shooting

In the third event the old war horse (Duxbac) H. James, known as the Father of Clay Bird Shooting, and whom I have not seen shooting for some time, proved that he is still capable of wielding a good gun, by scoring the only possible in the 10 bird points decision, no mean feat off the limit mark with bad weather conditions. Horrie, as he is familiarly known, still holding the number 1 registration number, started the clay bird movement in 1921 with a membership of 10 souls. Included were: Les Schilling, Jeff Rutledge, Bill Bloomfield, J. O'Shannesy, Clarrie Hall, Mac Evans, Bert Anguitel and Dave Evans as president, with Horrie treasurer. In the following years presidents were Mr Anguitel, Lew Bloom, Jack Schutt, Jeff Rutledge and Jock Wilson, with Keith Rice as secretary. Then last but not least, president H. James with Fred Beyers as secretary.

On a fine Saturday afternoon back in 1921, Horrie led this small band of bunny hunters out to Footscray and down into the bowels of mother earth. The scene of operations was the Footscray quarry, where these amateurs could do no harm, only to themselves. There he instructed them in the art of clay busting, and held the first competitive clay bird shoot, and so in that quarry was born the great clay bird sport as we know it today.

I.C.I., whose buildings were on the same land, took pity on this small band of enthusiasts and granted them the use of an area above the quarry where an automatic trap was installed. The ground was laid out in five tracks and a fine club house built. The club was known as the Nobel Clay Target Club, and gradually made headway until today it is firmly established as part of the Australian Clay Target Club, in the spacious grounds at Burwood Road, Burwood East.

The original Nobel Club, under its new name still lives and thrives, and today is bigger and better than ever. Its members, club house, traps and fine presentation trophies are part and parcel of the organisation now known as the Australian Clay Target Club, with five of its original ten musketeers still active competitors.

From this brain wave of 'Duxbac' has grown a sport enjoyed by thousands. No less than 110 clubs are scattered over the Commonwealth with a membership soaring toward the 5,000 mark. At the annual Champion of Champions and International Match held on this ground competitors trek from all parts of the Commonwealth; from Tasmania, King Island, Queensland, and as far away as the Gulf Country.

This clay bird sport is as great an asset to the defence of the country as are the rifle clubs. At the outbreak of war, many club traps were called in, and air gunners of the R.A.A.F., with the aid of rocket shells, were thus given musketry instruction, the clay bird, travelling at 100 miles per hour, being the nearest approach to the lead required to bring down an enemy plane. So many air gunners went through these schools that quite a number got this clay birding into their blood, which, no doubt, accounts for the greatly increased membership of many clubs.

It must be very gratifying to 'Duxbac' to see his baby grow to such huge proportions, also the knowledge that his innovation has been a great help in the defence of our country. Through the years he has been, and still is, a wonderful asset. Ever ready with advice, he welcomes inquiries. No question is too small or too big for him to answer. He knows the whole business backwards. His lectures on refereeing, gunnery and clay birding generally are something that should not be missed. Ex-councillor, marathon runner, boxer, wrestler, golfer, firearms expert and champion trap shot, Horrie has had a varied sports career, and from good authority in each of these pastimes has been a hard man to toss.

As a trap shot he ranks among the top notches, having to his credit no less than 93 championships, his most recent one being the N.S.W. double barrel.

Although getting on in years, the reference in song [The Old Grey Mare] has not yet caught up with him. He is an evergreen. I think that a more appropriate number would be the cork ballad, "Ye Can't K' a Guid Mon Doon". Having taken over the business of Donald Mackintosh, and housed it in the sports store of Charlie Mues in Latrobe Street, these two businesses absorb much of his time, which, no doubt, accounts for him not being seen at the club so often.

NZ NATIONALS FIREARMS LICENCE PROCEDURE

After discussions with the NZ Police the following information is required by them for anyone wishing to bring a firearm into NZ. All firearms holders must have a NZ Tourist Licence which is valid for 12 months and costs NZ\$25. Once you have a NZ Tourist Licence, an Import Permit must be obtained. These can only be obtained in New Zealand.

To obtain a NZ Tourist Licence write to Bill Davidson, Firearms Licensing Task Force, National Police Headquarters, PO Box 3017, Wellington with the following details:

- Photocopy of your passport (showing DOB, nationality, where born) and photocopy of passport photo.
- Photocopy of your local firearm licence
- · Make, model, calibre and serial number of firearm
- Flight number and date of arrival, name of club in NZ you will be shooting at and departure details.

If you supply these details at least one month before entering into NZ the Tourist Licence and Import Permit can be waiting at your arrival destination.



Keith has had to retire from shooting clays, but you won't keep Geof down, and he hopes to shoot forever.


CUNNAMULLA GUN CLUB


