

What a fantastic couple of months it has been for Clay Target Shooting. We have our first Double Trap World Champion in Russell Mark. Congratulations to Russell of his fine achievement. Russell has now followed this up by winning the World Cup Final for Double Trap in Munich on September 11, 1994.

Also at the World Championships our Double Trap Team consisting of Craig Tilley, Ben Kelley and Russell Mark received a Silver Medal in the Teams event being beaten into second place on a countback. Well done guys.

Congratulations must go to all our competitors at the World Championships, they were fine ambassadors for our sport and competed in very hot and trying conditions. Full story this issue.

Ian Hale — Commonwealth Gold Medallist in Canada. Congratulations and well done Ian on bringing home Gold in the individual Skeet event. It was a fantastic achievement.

Ian's skeet shooting partner Craig Meuelman came a very close fourth to just miss out on a medal. Both shot very consistently throughout the World Championship and Commonwealth Games.

Graeme Boyd also shot consistently well at the Commonwealth Games and only just missed out on the final. Russell finished further down and was unfortunate not to carry his double trap form into the trap events.

Late Mail (fax)!!!

At the World DTL Championships held in Wales in September 9-11, 1994, our Australian Team was successful in winning Gold in the Teams event. Our team consisting of John Farrell, Dennis Lynn, Mark Crevatin, Roger Duthie and Bill Iles defeated Ireland 2,948 to 2,937 with England in third 2,928.

Les Chant won the Junior World Championship in Wales with a score of 890. Congratulations 'Chipper' on a fantastic effort.

Bill Iles was runner up in the World Championship, beaten into second place by one point by Terry Humphreys of England. This follows up on Bill winning the English Open 'Handicap by Distance' Championship. Bill was also runner-up in the Clay Target Championship event at the Grand American in Vandalia. This is a single barrel event with approx. 5,000 competitors and Bill shot 574 to take second place. Great shooting Bill.

1994 World Double Trap Championship

Saturday 30th July in Fagnano, Italy was to be recorded as a hot day of 38 degrees and extremely humid.

The Australian contingent to the 46th World Championship boarded buses for the one hour trip from Stresa to Fagnano for the Double Trap Championship. This trip, which we undertook everyday while we were in Italy, was uneventful and gave no hint of the excitement to come.

With 197 shooters registered for the event, shooting got underway at 8.30am sharp. Immediately the competitors began recording scores of 48/50 and 49/50 showing the immense amount of skills training that some countries had put into this event.

Our open team of Russell Mark, Craig Tilley and Ben Kelley were right in the thick of it showing that they could hold their own at World level.

As the third round finished the records showed that our team had acquitted themselves well, to be equal 1st, along with Great Britain and Italy on 406/450. Everybody held their breath as the count back was applied. Unfortunately for Australia it favoured Great Britain, then us, followed by Italy. Second place, although not as good as first, is certainly better than third and everybody concerned was happy.

Individually the results were fantastic with Russell carding 141/150 and equal first place into the finals. Craig 136/150 10th, and Ben 129/150 to be 37th.

Now the tension began to increase as the Finals were prepared. Starting from number 5 position (using Winchester 1300 #9s and 1350 #7½s) between Kevin Gill of Great Britain 140/150 and Albano Pera of Italy 141/150, Russell looked to be in a medal position. First pair out and the impossible happened, Russell dropped both targets. As he walked from 5 to 1 his face showed nothing, but inside he must have been giving himself a mental flogging for moving his gun before the targets appeared.

But the High Performance qualities that he possesses came to the fore and but for one well chipped target, ink blotted the next 48 on his way to recording a heart stopping 48/50. Albano Pera shot well but dropped 4 targets while Kevin Gill showed his abilities dropping only one target at the 17th pair to record a 49/50.

This put Russell and Kevin into a tie break situation and the tension went up another 10 points. Russell won the toss of the coin and elected to take the first pair. He ink blotted them as did Kevin. Second pair and another set of ink blots. Kevin stepped forward, called for his targets, moved before they appeared and paid a high price 'lost and kill'.

The incredible had happened, Russell Mark had achieved World Champion status. Jubilation broke out as Russell turned to the cheering crowd wearing the biggest smile ever seen.

It is a day and a finals that will long live in everyones memory as an event that was breathtaking and heart stopping.

Congratulations Russell you are a worthy Champion and have done yourself and the Australian Clay Target Association proud.

Congratulations must also go to Craig and Ben for their outstanding achievements during the World Double Trap Championships.

46th World Championships Fagnano, Italy

After some 23 hours in the air not including a walking tour of the rabbit warren called Heathrow, the Australian clay target contingent to the 46th World Championships arrived in Milan. Having left Australia at some 10°C it was a shock to walk into the Italian summer of 40°C, 'but what a way to go'.

The Hotel Regina, our base for the shoot, was located in Stresa, and not knowing its whereabouts, we boarded a bus (that would become part of our daily lives) and tried to enjoy another two hours of travel.

On arriving in Stresa we found a magnificent old hotel conveniently placed by a huge inland sea called Lake Maggiore. Stresa turned out to be the north Italian holiday centre. Gritting our collective teeth we decided to force ourselves to enjoy the surroundings.

After a days rest it was back on a bus and down to Milan for the Opening Ceremony which was being held in the National Stadium. After the usual standing around we marched together with the Australian Pistol Team into the stadium to become part of the ceremonies. Although not part of the ceremony but enjoyed by all was the picnic goodies that appeared as if by magic. Where Ian 'Houdini' Hale found the table cloth and cutlery will remain one of the great unsolved mysteries.

The evening prior to competition we were joined by a diminutive figure supporting a giant backpack and an oversize front pack. Gina Dillulo (world traveller and Top Gun water fighter) on leave from the National Office struggled into our primitive surroundings from Switzerland. It was later found that the oversized front pack carried Gina's emergency rations of Chianti and pasta.

Competition started on Wednesday 27th, and after several days of practice and the now normal 1 hour bus ride (each way) most were ready to begin. Unfortunately a virus had struck and several of the team were not well. A record of 229 and 60 teams were registered and at the end of day 1 Michael Diamond was placed well in 9th, and Deserie Huddleston in 5th. Ben Kelley and Nanette McCallum in their first international were shooting well as was Graeme Boyd and Faye Burton, back to international competition after several years off.

The second day was to be hot and humid as had been the day before and the competition just as hot. At the 100 target mark Russell was seen standing looking at the top barrel of his S05 muttering something about 93 first barrels and the 'B' second barrel being off on holidays. Another pleasant surprise was the arrival of Sergio Zuffo for the day. Final score placed Michael 14th, on 120, Russell 20th, on 118, Ben 113, Deserie 109, Graeme 108, Nanette 100 and Faye 97/125.

With the illness that had struck now virtually gone, training started for the Double Trap and the performance of our six shooters looked good.

Saturday the 30th, and with the temperature a cooler 38°C another record of 197 and 50 teams lined up. The final results were fabulous with Russell Mark, Ben Kelley and Craig Tilley combining to achieve a 2nd place in the teams following a count back with Great Britain and Italy 406/450. Russell made the finals and after a brilliant display went on to be Australia's first Clay Target World Champion. Craig Tilley finished a creditable 10th.

Our ladies were in there fighting and acquitted themselves extremely well. Deserie shooting 88 followed by a fast finishing Nanette 87 and Faye on 76 from 120.

Now it was the time for our Skeet Team to get some range time. Practice day came and went and although confidence was high, 3 rounds after 6 days didn't seem enough. With Russell's effort as an example the 3 skeeties were championing at the bit. Monday 1st August an overcast and humid day greeted the 187 competitors and 44 teams. Ian, Craig and John started well but even with Ian's second round of 25, all dropped off, the pace being set by the Italians.

Day 2 and back to hot and humid. Our results for this day were great and as they say, "if only we could have started today." But this was not the case and apart from Ian breaking the stock on old faithful 'Frank' (very tight grip) Craig, Ian and John ended on the same score of 111/125. At least no one was high or low gun.

So ended the Australian challenge at the 46th World Championships and apart from forcing ourselves to endure another day on the banks of Lake Maggiore, all looked forward to heading home.

What has not been mentioned in the above report is the debacle that took place with the World Championship organisers (not ACTA) and our ammunition.

A special thanks must go to Winchester and personally to Mr Bruce Burns. After donating ammunition to all Top Gun competitors in the team, saved our bacon by arranging for Winchester Italy to replace our stranded ammunition at the 11th hour.

Our appreciation also goes to Mr Sergio Zuffo who supported members of the team with Scorpio cartridges.

Well, I've just completed a most exciting trip to Italy, to compete in the World Shotgun Championships. It was my first trip overseas, and to represent your country to boot, would have to be one of the biggest thrills of my life.

We stayed at a little town called Stresa, which overlooked the beautiful Lake Maggiore. Our hotel was a lovely old fashioned palace, the 'Regina Palace' to be exact, the sort of building you only see in the movies. The scenery was breathtaking. We had the mountains in the background, although we only got to see them on 2 occasions. On all the other days, they were covered with smog or haze. I don't know what I expected the country to look like, but it wasn't how I imagined it to be. Coming from a farm myself, I was curious to see their farming areas, and as we travelled through them every day, I soon discovered they didn't waste a single inch of ground. I even discovered that although we were on the other side of the world, their trees and grass are as green as ours.

The rest of the team that we travelled with were a great bunch, and fun to be with. We were never short of entertainment. The opening ceremony, although being a bit of a lengthy procedure, was a real buzz. It was just like a mini Olympics, with all the different nations, and all the different disciplines of shooting, assembling for the march. The Italians really did themselves proud. We were entertained by ballet dancers, opera singers, musicians that ran and played at the same time, folk dancers, gymnasts, fireworks, sky divers and of course, the shooters.

As we marched into the stadium, we were all given coloured squares of material to wave to the crowd as we marched around the arena. I felt so proud to be Australian, so I know now, how all competitors feel, when they compete in the Olympics or Commonwealth Games, etc. It was so hot, we all carried our water with us. The boys made our night. During the opera singing and after we had stood in the heat for some 2 hours, they proceeded to have a typical Aussie picnic. Out of their grocery bag, that seemed to have been lost for most of the night, came the bread rolls, cheese and meat, and drinks. They used their coloured squares of material as serviettes tucked into their collars, and an extra one as a tablecloth layed out on the lawn. It was a sight to behold as the sun sank slowly over the enormous crowd.

All the other teams broke ranks to come and have a look, as Russell, Ian, Mick, Craig, Ben, John and Phillip Adams (pistol shooter) proceeded with their picnic. My cheeks were aching from laughter, they were the highlight of the night. Everyone took photos, while they all blissfully ate on. You had to see it to believe it.

Speaking of photos, what a lovely gesture from Kodak, who donated 3 rolls of film to every shooter. Well done, Kodak, and many thanks from all of us. We've all been able to bring home some wonderful memories of Italy, owing to Kodak's generosity.

While I'm on that train of thought, I'd also like to thank Winchester Australia for their help and support with ammunition for the team. The costs involved with freighting ammo over to Italy was ridiculous, so Winchester stepped in and all our ammo was provided for us in Italy by Winchester. We used a great cartridge, called Winchester Silver. I even smuggled a few home with me to keep as a souvenir. To all at Winchester, thank you, especially from Nanette and myself who were on a self funded basis, your generosity helped us enormously.

I roomed with Nanette McCallum from Tasmania and we were fortunate enough to get on real well together, so we went most places together, like eating out and travelling the long 1 hour drive each day to and from the gun club. We had a fabulous view from our room on the 3rd floor. Didn't realise till a bit later on that the bloke in the building behind us had a pretty

good view too, right into our room. We waved to him every morning after that.

After 2 days of practice, we got down to the serious part of the trip, and competition began in earnest. We couldn't have wished for better weather. It was hot, there's no other way to explain it, but very enjoyable. The background at Fagnano Olano, where we shot, was all green trees. Very different but very shootable. The scoreboards were daunting, huge big screens and all computerised. 6 layouts of trench, it was a real eye opener. The Italians take their shooting very seriously.

I think the most memorable thing of my whole trip was being able to watch Russell win his gold medal in the Double Trap. There was a big crowd of spectators. They had even erected a grandstand for all to sit or stand on. This filled in no time. The banks surrounding the shooting layout, were full. There was standing room only and everyone was squashed together. Even the pistol shooters came out to have a look.

I felt sorry for all those in the final, as well as envying them and wishing it was me. As I said before, the Italians take their shooting seriously, and the whole final was televised on their national station, direct. Could you imagine the feeling, knowing you were shooting off for a gold medal, in a World Championship, with a camera stuck up your nose? Well the 6 finalists did just that.

As Russell Mark and Kevin Gill, from England, top scored in the event, they were the last 2 shooters. 4 shooters shot at their targets, then Kevin Gill shot his first pair of the shoot off and Russell stepped up, and went lost, lost. I don't know how he felt, but I felt sick. It proves what a true champion Russell really is. He never flinched, just shot the next 24 pair straight, the scores were level again, between him and Kevin. Then it became cut-throat, miss and out. After 2 more pairs Kevin missed one, the cameras closed in on Russell, right next to his face, he didn't miss, the gold medal was his. The look on his face told a thousand stories and I felt so honoured to have been given to opportunity to be there and be part of the Australian team that watched him do it.

After the shooting for us was over, Nanette and I decided we'd spend a day sightseeing, so we hopped on a tour bus, and in 1 hour we were in Switzerland. We had a great time and came back exhausted from all the walking and travelling, with only 1 hour to spare, before the closing and the farewell dinner. We didn't have far to go this time though. The dinner was held in our palace. We only had to stagger upstairs after it.

Again the Italians did themselves proud. The meal was excellent, except every time I tried to cut my piece of meat, it moved at me. Never mind I drowned it with red wine, or was it white

wine? There was so much of it (wine that is), you passed caring what colour it was. Actually, I think I was drinking water.

Well I could bore you to tears and go on for another couple of hours, but I think Nan's going to put her side of the story over too, so I'll leave room for her, and sign off by just saying this: if I never get the chance to represent Australia again, I'll at least have all the wonderful memories of that trip to Italy. Thanks Murray for putting up with all our little idiosyncrasies, and for consoling us when our best wasn't good enough. Shooting is now over and we have a few days to relax and have a look around before we head home. Our first day was laundry day as it was too expensive to get it done at the hotel. It cost \$5.00 to wash a shirt. The open-air cateries were beautiful and

very relaxing. The scenery around the hotel was lovely with the lake over the road and the mountains in the background. The area all around where we stayed was very clean and tidy. We went on the cable car to the mountains and walked up to the top. It was breathtaking scenery. Faye wasn't real crash hot on the cable car, she was holding on pretty tight.

We went on a guided tour of the Three Lakes to Switzerland. It was most enjoyable. You do not take pictures at the border or you could have your film destroyed. Switzerland was very clean and fresh. We had our best pasta in Switzerland. That night was the closing dinner. Everyone got together and had a good night. You must remember we still had a language barrier with some. We did a tour of the three Islands which were on the lake in front of the hotel. You have to make sure you get the right boat to go to the right island or you can back-track or end up in Switzerland. Nights were for relaxing outside as the weather was perfect. The shopping was fantastic, as Faye knows. Last night it was to bed early for a 4.30am start to the airport. 
Queen's Birthday Weekend 1994 Anniversary Shoot


Some shooters took advantage of the free feed and lodgings on Saturday night and reports of plenty of tucker and good times were rife.

Overall everything went beautifully (there was a little problem with one trap) but the clubs ever efficient trap fixer was on the spot and the shoot continued.





Steffi has **Landau Kiefner Syndrome** - an extremely rare medical condition which is actually the rarest form of epilepsy. There are only about 100 children diagnosed with this syndrome in the world.

Steffi was a perfectly normal child until 2 years of age, when virtually overnight she began to regress and now cannot speak, only sometimes hears and cannot understand. There is no treatment available in Australia.

The USA leads the world with knowledge and surgical treatment of the disease, but as you can imagine, this comes at a very high price. Medical and surgical treatment alone, without the cost of airfares and accommodation, will be in the vicinity of \$100,000. Dick and Anne have mortgaged their home in an attempt to raise the money, and left for Chicago with Steffi on the 20th August.

Sydney CTC and Marconi GC have joined forces and organised a monster raffle with \$1,000 worth of prizes being donated. The joint clubs have also donated the costs involved to print \$5,000 raffle tickets to be sold at \$2 each.

They will be sending a booklet of tickets to every club in NSW, in the hope that those who can, will assist. 'Nugget' Burton

As told by Faye Burton

Kenneth Sydney (Nugget) Burton, was born in Boort, Victoria on the 23rd September 1939, the second child, but only son of Sydney & Amy Burton.

At the tender age of 14, Ken's dad Syd, was offered the chance to buy the property he had share farmed for many years. Syd's offer then to Ken, was, "If we buy the property, are you willing to give up your schooling and spare time to be a farmer, and work all the hours needed to pay the farm off?" Ken jumped at the chance, and so only 14, he gave up school to become a land owner. His farm was his first love, and all his spare time was spent on ways he could find to make farming easier. Thus his inventors mind started to show out.

His father gave him a Browning .22 rifle for his 14th birthday, and he spent many hours shooting rabbits, to earn his pocket money. He joined the Wandella Football Club at the age of 20, and although no World beater, he got a few kicks each week. For the end of season trip in 1970, the footy club went to the Quambatook Gun Club, and Ken's talents as a shooter showed out. He won the trophy for the best footballer. The next year the footy club again went to the gun club and again Ken won. Frank James from the Kerang Gun Club, convinced Ken to join up, so his love for shooting began.

His first gun, was a Miroku 800w. He said he paid \$350 for it and thought that was very expensive. He became a pretty good shot, and it wasn't long before his reputation for Double Rise and Handicap became common knowledge. He used to tell a pretty good yarn, about the time Fred Heinze asked him to partner him for a Deauville Doubles Championship. He was fairly green to the sport, and didn't know what Deauville was. Frank James explained to him, "You just worry about shooting your own target, Fred's a real good shot, he'll get his own." You guessed it, 18 pairs shot, Fred missed his 19th, Ken opened his gun with 1 shell still not fired. He always finished his yarn by saying, "I don't know why he never asked me to shoot with him again."

In 1972, Ken built his first clay target thrower, for the Kerang Gun Club. It was made out of mostly second hand materials. Being a farmer had taught him to improvise. He used the ring gears and flywheel from the old grey model motor out of a Holden. The motor was from a disused washing machine. The oscillating springs were off a Massey Ferguson Combine, and the latch was operated with a Fowlers preserving clip. Although fairly cumbersome, it served its purpose well, and I believe it is still being used at the gun club. News of his trap travelled quickly, and soon he had orders from all over Victoria.

Ken spent many hours at the Kerang club, with working bees, laying new tracks to put in another layout, shifting a toilet block, building a Tower, moving soil and gravel and helping in the construction of the new club house. He held a position on the committee as either Vice President or Junior Vice President, for about 10 years. The club honoured him, by making him a Life Member in 1987.

1982 was a drought year for the farmers in Victoria, so Ken spent his idle time, designing a new model trap. He loved working with steel, and when he wasn't making traps, he was making augers, mending neighbours machinery and thinking of what else he could make, so he decided to try making shot. Although not truly professional, it certainly worked well, and he supplied shooters all over the district with shot.

He loved getting around to all the different gun clubs in Australia. If you bought one of his traps, you could be sure it

wouldn't be long before we would turn up there for a shot, and he always had his toolbox with him just in case. He said and I quote, "I never stop getting a good feeling from servicing traps and knowing I have helped someone out. I just enjoy working on them." It didn't matter what make they were, if he could help he would. No charge.

His other love was his music. When he met a person for the first time, he always asked them if they could play music, or did they shoot. He played the drums in an old time dance band for 20 odd years. He also played the button accordion, and during the last seven years of his life, he taught himself the saxophone. He loved jazz music and also played in a jazz band called the Murray Valley Jazz Band for about the same amount of time as the old time band, just playing on different nights. He never had a music lesson, and couldn't read music, he was just gifted. He used to say, "Anyone who plays music can't be all that bad."

Ken had a history of heart problems since the age of 36. When 49 years old he underwent a quadruple bypass operation. He was told the operation was only good for 5 to 10 years, so he made the most of every day. He had so much energy, he worked till all hours, developing new model traps, and spent most weekends delivering them all over Australia, and shooting at all the clubs we could fit in. There was so much he wanted to do and so little time to do it in. Exactly four years after his operation, he started to have problems again, and we knew his time was short, but he wouldn't slow down.

In the weeks preceding his death, he wanted to do a service trip up into Queensland and New South Wales and coincide it with the shoot at Scrubby Creek. He wasn't well, a stress test said so, but he still went. He thoroughly enjoyed his shoot at Scrubby Creek, and told everyone on the way back at all the clubs that we called into to service their traps, about shooting over a traphouse with a tree stuck straight in front of it.

Ken never made it home. He died of a massive heart attack at Goulburn on the 10th October 1993, just one day short of servicing his last call at Canberra. His last two weeks of life were spent doing everything he loved best. Working on his traps, shooting somewhere out in the bush, dancing at Goulburn, and playing his beloved saxophone while I drove. The last week he drove, while teaching me to play the sax. It was something he just had to do.

To all of his friends that he made during his life, I thank you. Especially those, that he spent his last days with. It's of great comfort to me and his children, to know that his last few days, were some of the happiest of his life. He left us with a lot of happy memories, and I hope that those of you who read this will have some too.

The Boort Gun Club have seen fit to put on a Memorial Shoot for Ken on the 22nd October. I hope that as many of his friends as possible will turn up to contest the event that he would have chosen for himself, if he had been able to. A 60pr Double Rise Championship.

A Perpetual Trophy will be shot for on Ken's event, the Double Rise. It will run for 5 years only. The winner each year will have their name engraved on the cup. For the fifth and final year, the fifth winner will then join the other four winners in a Grand Final shoot off, and the eventual winner of the shoot off will retain the cup as his/her own.

The whole Burton family, would like to sincerely thank all who have given of their time and energy, or sponsored Ken's shoot. This Memorial Shoot will be a fitting tribute to a special man, who gave his all to the betterment of clay target shooting all over Australia.



Event 6 on Sunday was a 10 target Double Barrel Handicap Sweepstakes where 13 possibles were scored.




A field of 106 shooters faced the traps at Cowra Gun Club on Sunday 7th August for the Annual Gold Cup event.







Bill Delaney

Shooters throughout Australia, especially skeet shooters will no doubt be very sorry to learn of the passing of Bill Delaney.

In late August, Bill died at his home in Brighton, a Melbourne suburb. He leaves a wife and three sons.

Bill Delaney first took up shooting clay targets in 1930 at the age of 10 years, at the old Bentleigh club grounds, which later merged with Nobel club at Tottenham. Today, some 60 years later, he has been a member of both the Melbourne Gun Club and the Frankston Australian Gun Club. As a life member and still shooting clay targets, he must surely have qualified as one of Australia's longest shooting shooters.

He began shooting skeet in 1966 and was the first shooter to shoot a 100 straight skeet break, at the Australian Gun Club grounds in 1967.

In 1971 and 1976 Bill organised the first teams of Australian trench and skeet shooters to visit Singapore to the Pesta Sukan Games. On each occasion Bill captained the teams who were successful in winning gold, silver and bronze medals.

Bill Delaney was one of a small group of shooters responsible for American Style Skeet being accepted for competition. Prior to this point, we shot an English version of 21 targets per round. This change took place during early 1950s.

Bill was an architect by profession and as such, he was responsible for the designing and restructuring of the Melbourne Gun Club ground in preparation for the 1973 World Clay Target Championships. Prior to this point the Melbourne Gun Club as we know it today was only a two trap and one skeet field club.

Bill was always available to his skeet shooting friends when they needed help with a problem target. He will be sadly missed. Deepest sympathy goes to his wife Babs, and three sons Nigel, Randal and Julian.

Cecil Vaughn Herbert

10-6-1916 to 24-8-1994

It is with great sadness that I advise of the passing of a great man and character, Cec Herbert.

Having recently returned from D-Day celebrations in France and England (see August CTSN), Cec was hospitalised in Tamworth, with minor ailments, not considered to be life threatening, and news of his unexpected death was a great shock to all who knew him.

To everyone who signed a get well card during the recent N.S.W. State Skeet Carnival, I can assure each of you, Cec's pleasure from that card was overwhelming, his comment, 'The friends you make within clay target shooting are friends for life'.

Cec was a man who gave generously of his time, no matter what cause it was for. This was made very evident during his Funeral Mass, his time spent on the Liverpool Plains Shire Council, his effort in fund raising for the Nursing Home at Gunnedah, the heated pool project at Gunnedah, and also his public speaking ability and consistent letter writing to local papers. The latter had one local comment when Cec left for England, "At least we will have a rest from his letters in the paper." No such luck, he turned on the television, and there was Cec, being interviewed on the ABC! That was Cec!

Cec's love for the sport of clay target shooting, came after his retirement from his property, this also, was not overlooked during the eulogy. Along with Arch Rowe and Terry Rumble, Cec made up the original delegates on the Northern Zone Clay Target Association, but was forced to retire after a short time, due to ill health.


However, he continued to support at all levels, donated perpetual trophies and when the ACTA called for debentures, Cec was there with his support again.

A poem written by his youngest son, Mark was read during his service and it certainly covers everything:

*Born the first son of Tom and Grace,
Not knowing what successes he would embrace,
School wasn't to be where he would learn,
But his hunger for knowledge would constantly yearn,
He served in the war with courage and purpose,
They gave him a badge 'Returned from Active Service',
He gave it his all for country and mate,
And all this life he would show his trait,
He hardened his hands with sweat and toil,
Providing for his family by tilling soil,
For the rest of my life to his man I will owe,
He was good and kind with barely a foe,
Strong and sturdy like an old gum tree,
This was the man we call C.V.*

To his widow, Esme, daughter Marlene and sons Warwick and Mark, we extend our sympathy and for all who knew Cec, our lives were certainly the better for that meeting. Our sport has lost a great man.






