

National President's Notes



Representing your country — the hidden cost

Sending any sporting team overseas involves considerable expense for their association. With the current policy of the ACTA, to afford up-and-coming shooters, plus our established international competitors, the necessary grounding in international competition, events such as the Oceania Championships in New Zealand in February, are opportunities not to be missed.

Well laid plans often go astray, and the proposal to send a large team to New Zealand of both funded and unfunded shooters, appears to be one such plan.

The requirement of the Australian Shooting Association, that all competitors competing in the Oceania event be completely outfitted in their clothing. Item 13 of the ASA competitors agreement states "To conform with the Association's team clothing requirement which as a minimum is: one pair of slacks or one skirt, one blazer, two shirts or two blouses (colour beige), one team belt and buckle for slacks, one team tie, one team bag, one team sportshirt, one team tracksuit, one pair shoes, of an approved design." This is an individual cost of some \$550 per competitor, which now makes the trip an unviable proposition for the individual self-funded shooter, and the Australian Clay Target Association.

Sure, I agree that our international competitors must be well dressed, and, should they win, be well presented on the winners dais.

If we had a high quality, Australian Shooting Association tracksuit for all as the only requirement in ASA clothing, I could see no problem.

The tracksuit would have to be suitable for the climate in which we were shooting. Recently one of our international teams was supplied with winter weight tracksuits, when they were shooting in summer conditions. Makes one wonder!

At all Olympic Games, Commonwealth Games, World Cups, etc., all athletes receive their medals wearing tracksuits, and this should be so, as it is in keeping with the sporting image. Collar, tie, jackets, etc. look nice, but are they really necessary for all.

1995 Vic Health Australian Masters Games

These games are to be held in Melbourne from October 5 to 14th. The clay target events are to be held on the 6th, 7th, 8th October at the Frankston Australian Clay Target Club Inc. and consist of:

- 50 Tgt Skeet Championship
- 50 Tgt Double Barrel Championship
- 50 Tgt Single Barrel Championship
- 50 Tgt Points Score Championship
- 75 Tgt Champion of Champions

plus a four person team event.

The competition is divided into four age groups, these being: 35-39, 40-50, 51-60 and 61+ years.

1994 NSW State Trap Carnival

The NSW State Trap Carnival was conducted at Wagga Gun Club on the 5th-7th November, on a trial change of date away from the normal October long weekend. For those collecting the statistics regarding this change, it proved to be confusing. On one hand we had the majority of shooters prefer the October long weekend for date, but on the other we had another record breaking attendance with 255 shooters shooting the Double Barrel Championship.

One could say much about the weather, but I think those who attended will remember, (especially our State Teams) so I'll just leave it at that.

The NSW State Executive had included a number of changes at this carnival, to assist our carnival to remain as the most attended in Australia. One of the major changes is the allocation of 1st, 2nd and 3rd Overall trophies, as well as the 1st and 2nd in the 4 grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans. This step was taken to acknowledge those who shoot off in events, very often for several hundred targets, to come second or third but only receive their grade prize. Hopefully it will be well received.


Another change for this carnival was a change in program format, with the State Double Barrel Championship now being the first on the agenda. After a brief shoot off (you had to be there to understand), Tony Wright of the local Junee Gun Club won the event with 67/67, from Illawarra Gun Club's up-and-coming young shooter Brad Webb 66/67.

The Womens Double Barrel Championship is conducted in conjunction with the State Double Barrel, and this year was the first presentation of a newly named Perpetual Trophy, to be known as the 'Lola Charles Memorial State Womens DB Championship', in memory of well known and respected State Executive Member, the late Lola Charles.

This year we are very pleased to have the NSW FIREARMS SAFETY AWARENESS COUNCIL as a SPONSOR for both the Womens and Juniors DB Championships, and were also pleased to be able to welcome Mr Paul Andrews, the Executive Director of the NSWFSAC, and his wife Sue, to Wagga for the presentation. Many thanks Paul. The event was won by Janenne Kidd from the Sydney CTC with a great score of 49/50. Karen Kennerson, also from Sydney and Lyn Blake from Downside shot off for second and third, with Karen being the winner of the shoot off.

The Junior Double Barrel Championship is also shot in conjunction, with the winner for 1994 being Andrew Webster from Crookwell Gun Club, with a score of 50/51. Andrew will now have his name engraved on the Perpetual Trophy for the event, a couple of years after his brother, Damien Webster, who has also won the event. Tim Nealon from Grenfell was second in the Junior Championships, with Shane Pinner from Albury third.

This was the second year of the newly introduced 3 Person Club Team event, which is shot on the Double Barrel event. We were pleased to see the winning team was from our home state this year, being the Junee Team of Chris Brandon, Tony Wright and Rodney Wright, whose combined total was 148/150. Great shooting guys!

The State Single Barrel followed on Saturday with some more great shooting given the conditions. One of the Lyons brothers

The winning Zone Team for this year was the Riverina Zone. The Mark McInnes Trophy for the best combined scores of the first 5 zone team qualifiers, was also won by the Riverina Zone, being Fred Schmetzer, Alf Guigliemo, Craig Weaver, Garry Tabain, Steve Guest. Many thanks to Mark for the case of cartridges he presents each year.

The NSW State Teams were then selected and shot their State Teams events in dreadful conditions. The Open Team was Glenn Kable, Mark McInnes, Les Chant, Grant Thatcher, Roger Vidal, John Farrell, Peter Whitlock, Brad Webb, Steve Forster, Rodney Wright, Ian Merrick, Clint Hawke, Craig Weaver, Douglas Forster and Adam Boyd. The State Team High Gun, which has now been changed to be presented to the first qualifier for the shoulder to shoulder team, was won by Grant Thatcher.

The Womens Team was Janenne Kidd, Leonie Young Peters, Loz Lloyd, Lyn Blake, Glennis Lawrence and Karen Kennerson.

The Junior State Team consisted of Les Chant, Shane Pinner, Scott Schmetzer, Ben Fairman, George Andonarus and Nathan McDonnell.

By Sunday mid-afternoon the windy weather conditions had deteriorated to almost gale force winds, and after a NSW State Executive meeting, it was decided that, for safety reasons, it was necessary to call off our next event, the NSW State Handicap. This was a great disappointment, especially as we have the event sponsored by RJF GUNSMITHING of Canberra. 

The New Mount Isa Nissan Shoot

The Mount Isa Gun Club was the venue for the New Mount Isa Nissan Trophy Shoot which was held last Saturday. With shooters coming from as far away as Tennant Creek to compete, the competition was fierce and the locals didn't get it all their own way. The first shots were fired at a little after 3pm to commence competition in the Nissan Bluebird Skeet event, and at the end, Jim Edmond's score of 23/25 earned him the A grade trophy. Bill Koitka won B grade comfortably with 24/25 and Tennant Creek visitor Stretch Handcock survived the C grade shoot off to take home that trophy.

Shooting targets thrown from the Tower is often regarded as a fun exercise, but Mick McGill, Rod Maxwell and Gary Quan Sing were in deadly earnest as they posted scores of 25/25 to win A, B & C grades in the Nissan Pulsar Tower event. Well shot!

The sound most feared by Ball Trap shooters is the blast of the horn to signal a miss, and that sound was heard all too often in the Nissan 200SX Ball Trap. However Rod Maxwell wasn't taking too much notice of the horn as he posted 23/25 and then survived the shoot off to win A grade with a final score of 26/28. Myrtle Anderson held on to B grade with 20/25 and Greg Moncrieff claimed C grade with his score of 16/25.

While everyone else had been enjoying their shooting, Brian and Glenys Palethorpe, our new catering officers, had been busy cooking up supper and no one could fault the barbecue supper they provided. Thanks must also go to Myrtle Anderson for her efforts in the kitchen over the last year. With all bellies full once again it was out on to the tracks to fire more lead at those elusive clay targets. Shooting single barrel at night is often an exercise in frustration for some shooters and the Nissan Patrol Single Barrel was no different.

With every call of lost from the referee, the target, which definitely looked as big as a dinner plate, sailed off into the shadows and the look on the shooters face plainly said "How the hell did I miss that". Well Brian Palethorpe and Rod Maxwell didn't miss too many as they both carded 23/25. However it was Brian who kept it together in the shoot off to emerge with a final score of 37/39 and the A grade trophy. Derek Dupuy proved he was no slouch with 21/25 which earned him the B grade trophy. The 'Happy Chappie' of the night however was young Sam Edmonds as the realisation dawned that 18/25 definitely was good enough to win C grade. It is good to see juniors not just competing but being in the trophy count as juniors are the future of any sport.



ASDA to visit Chinese anti-doping counterparts

Australian Sports Drug Agency (ASDA) Chief Executive, Steve Haynes, and International Adviser, Nicki Vance, visited their Chinese anti-doping counterparts from October 22-29 as part of reciprocal visits between the two countries.

It is anticipated that during the visit an anti-doping agreement will be signed between Australian and China which would lead to 'a sharing of expertise' between both countries.

In July, ASDA hosted a visit by members of the Chinese Olympic Committee Anti-Doping Commission who came to Canberra to learn from the achievements of ASDA which have placed it at the forefront of the world in the fight against drugs in sport.

Both members of the delegation, Professors Tianle Yang and Wu Fuquan, left Australia highly impressed with the ASDA anti-doping program and expressed a genuine desire to have a similar program implemented in China.

Chief Executive, Steve Haynes, said ASDA welcomed the opportunity to work with China, stating if ASDA could extend its anti-doping program internationally, then hopefully it would lead to fairer competition for everyone.

'ASDA's anti-doping agreement between Australia and China is a far more positive step towards fighting drugs in sport than the finger pointing and innuendo which surrounded the recent World Swimming Championships in Rome.'

'In the end we must all strive to achieve the level playing field.'

Minimum age for the competition is 35 and readers can ask Tup Pedersen about the maximum age.




Scores have not been put into this report because they somehow seem inconsequential to the whole idea of this three day shoot, and I'm sure all shooters who attended will understand this statement.

This was the last trap competition shoot for the year with only a full skeet day on Sunday and our Christmas break up on the 4th December, along with our Annual General Meeting.




Thanks to everyone who attended, hope you all enjoyed yourselves and we look forward to seeing you again next year.


Ken Burton Memorial Shoot



Crowd at Ken Burton Memorial Shoot. Kerang Ibis Traps at front were for grade winners.









Many thanks to the referee on the day, Mr Alan Chandler and his good wife, who was the official scorer.





Australia's Olympic involvement

By George Biggs, ACTA Historian

Australia is one of only five nations that have competed in all the 24 modern Olympic Games since the year 1896.

In the year 1900, at the Paris Olympic Games, Australia's Donald Mackintosh was the first Australian shooter to take out Olympic Gold with a score of 18 points.

The 1956 Melbourne Olympics was Australia's first serious attempt when we fielded a two man team at Olympic Trap shooting.

Australia at the Olympic Games 1896-1948

Australia is one of only five nations, along with France, Great Britain, Switzerland and Greece, to have participated in all 24 Modern Olympics. Australia entered into the Winter Olympic Games in 1936 (in Germany) and has attended 13 in total. As a nation, Australia has won 71 Gold Medals, 67 Silver and 87 Bronze prior to Barcelona. Australia is ranked 12th out of the 92 Nations that have attended the Olympics (Summer and Winter) on medal success. Detailed below are the individual and team medal winners for Australia.

The asterisk indicates that the performance was a world record achievement.


