## National President's Notes



#### Progress?

Recently I was fortunate to be given a copy of Gun Clubs' Association of Victoria Annual Calendar, dated January 1922. It is a 66 page booklet, which one could say was the very forerunner to our current Clay Target Shooting News. It has some very interesting reading, some of which I believe is worthy of noting.

#### Registration of Competitors

This shows a falling off of 174, compared with the previous year, the totals being 893 for 1921, as against 1,067 for 1920, 990 for 1919, and 716 for 1918. Owing to the prevailing depression, many others not coming in till October have been credited to the incoming year.

Sound familiar ??? The booklet lists 'Remarkable Performances', some worthy of noting under the heading 'Clay Bird Shooting':

50 hits in succession (unfinished break) use two barrels, Allan Banfield, 18 and 20 yards, Melbourne Gun Club, December 18, 1915.

30 hits in succession, use two barrels, P.F. Miller, 18 yards, Melbourne Gun Club, October 20th, 1914.

Wonder what the unfinished break will be at Melbourne Gun Club in the National Double Barrel on March 26th. 1995?

And finally if you are wondering why your performance has not been up to scratch perhaps the following advice from the magazine may be worth noting.

#### Indulgence

There is no doubt that some of our best shots exist in such a way as to keep themselves in excellent form, and if they find such a course advisable, how much more necessary is it to a second rate performer.

Some men may possess the tron constitution which enables them to take any liberty and not suffer for it, but the ordinary individual who desires to shoot well on every occasion cannot afford to do that. He should see that he obtains the regulation amount of sleep, avoid a too free indulgence in rich food, alcoholic drinks, strong tea, and tobacco, and should never allow a shooting meeting to be an excuse for undue conviviality. This is the real cause of a good deal of bad form.

I guess we have come a long way in the last 73 years !!!

#### The future of shooting

Whilst it is interesting to look back, our most challenging time is in the immediate, and in the future.

There is no doubt that the future of shooting in its present form in international, national, state and local competition is under a serious threat. The governing bodies of Olympic and Commonwealth Games would not in the least worry if shooting was to be removed from their events.

We must continue to improve the standard of our sport to a position where we are recognised internationally as the ones to beat.

International competition is essential to the very existence of our smallest club. Our funding is governed by our performance world wide, and also by the standards and methods of coaching we adopt.

It therefore stands to reason that each state must support each other state in all disciplines of shooting, and each discipline must support other disciplines.

At the present, shotgunning is the shooting discipline in Australia that is producing the goods internationally and we must see that this continues.

Our national shooting bodies are fully aware of this current situation and should be supporting us to the fullest, but are they?

It seems each are quite content to go their own way, and that within our governing bodies are people there solely for what they can get out of it, not what is best for the competitors and shooting. I believe that if a team is travelling overseas, or for that matter competing in Australia in an international event, then either the team coach or the team manager must come from the discipline with the largest number of members, if we are to get the best from the team. This should go without saying if the team consists of only members from a particular discipline.

#### **ACTA Sporting Clays Nationals/Rules**

In reply to many inquiries, it is intended to run an ACTA Sporting Clays Nationals again, jointly with the Sporting Shooters Association of Australia, later in the year in Victoria.

We will shortly be issuing the rules governing the running of ACTA Sporting Clays and can only apologise for the delay in announcing a date for the Nationals, and in publishing the rules.

#### **New Customs Forms**

All shooters re-entering Australia are now to have in their possession a Customs Permit No. B709. These forms are issued by the relevent Police Firearms Registry and are not available from the ACTA Office.

As each states requirements vary, a comprehensive listing, detailing contact telephone numbers, waiting times, etc. has been prepared and can be found on page 15 of this issue.

It should be remembered that, if for example you are a Victorian shooter who is re-entering the country in Sydney, you will have to apply to the NSW Registry for this permit.

#### ACTA and Field & Game Team Shoot

An inaugural teams challenge shoot between the ACTA and Field & Game will be held at the Melbourne Gun Club on Saturday 8th April, 1995.

The number of shooters for each team will be decided by the association with the least number of representatives present, i.e. if the ACTA has 52 members and the Field & Game 60, the teams will consist of 52 members from each.

The event consists of 50 targets Skeet, 25 targets ACTA Sporting and 25 targets Double Barrel.

### 1995 Oceania Games

#### AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND

This was one of the largest contingents of shooters and officials to represent the A.C.T.A. at an international competition, comprising of Manager, Coaches (Col Burt and Fred Schmetzer), 2 members of the Jury (Peter Strike and Brian Prosser) and 35 shooters, 19 shooting UIT and the balance shooting DTL and Skeet.

Members of our group started departing from Australia on February 1st, with the last group flying out on February 7th. The actual games beginning on the 4th February and finishing on the 10th February.

#### Thursday 2nd February

A 4.00am departure from my home in Murray Bridge to the Adelaide airport saw me flying off to Sydney where I met up with Col Burt and Fred Schmetzer. Our flight to Auckland was delayed by 1 hour and we finally arrived in New Zealand at 5.30pm. Picked up one of our 2 mini buses (8 seater Toyota) and with Fred navigating, we headed for O'Rourke Hall at the University Campus. A few wrong turns saw us finally arrive at 6.45pm.

Our accommodation at O'Rourke Hall consisted of rooms of varying sizes with 1 bed per room. There was no airconditioning which left some rooms quite stuffy. Some rooms had balconies with sliding doors overlooking one of the main streets. The area was very noisey, especially in the early hours from garbage trucks and night clubs that were in the vicinity. There were 5 rooms to a block, with communal toilet and shower. The majority of the Australian Team were on the 5th floor, each floor containing a large 'common' room, a kitchen with tea/coffee making facilities, etc. and a laundry. The dining room proved to be a 'typical canteen' with pretty ordinary food.

Thursday evening, after booking in, Col, Fred and I had a rushed dinner as Col and I had to attend a technical meeting at 7.30pm. While Fred had to go back to the airport with one of the 'Officials' to pick up 7 in-coming shooters, and to assist with them getting their guns through customs, with the 'Official' then having to transport their guns to the armoury, leaving Fred to come back with the shooters and the 2nd mini bus.


A few surprise rule changes at the technical meeting, and rule clarifications, seemed to sort themselves out to our satisfaction over the next 2 days. Following the meeting, I had one last trip to the airport for another 5 shooters who were flying in at 11.15pm, another hour getting their guns through customs and we finally fell into bed around 1.00am.

#### Friday 3rd February


Col Burt on the previous evening had been elected as official 'waker-upper' and promptly at 6.00am began his thumping on people's doors giving them a call.

This was practice day for olympic trap and skeet, starting at 9.00am and as the gun club was some 45 minutes drive away, saw us on the road at 8.00am. Adam Vella offered to do the navigating as he had been there before. We didn't actually get lost but we did see a lot of the countryside on the way to the gun club.

The Waitemata Gun Club is situated in a wooded area, atop a hillside, with shooting being done looking out over a valley, it

We beat 'em! Junior Single Rise winning team.


is very picture sque. We used  $1\,$  trench layout and  $1\,$  skeet layout for practice.

The club rooms were very comfortable with a balcony overlooking the shooting grounds. We were made most welcome.

Our first task was that of sorting out the cartridges, a job made easier with Winchester making sure all of the shells that had been ordered were labelled with the person's name.

The shells were in a shipping container which was used as the 'armoury' for the week, as all guns and ammo had to be stored in the one place.

One hiccup -a 'big' hiccup -3 of our shooters (using one brand of cartridges) found that their ordered shells were not there and only I case and a few packets was all that could be found.

Weather overcast, with drizzly rain made conditions quite miserable but most of the shooters completed 4 rounds of practice before we left to go back to the University at 2.30pm.

A free afternoon and evening for the shooters while I spent the afternoon paying their nominations for the games.

Following dinner at 6.00pm the Australian Team Section Managers had a meeting with Ray Andrews, the Australian Team Manager, to sort out any problems we may have encountered. Most Managers complained about the food, and each section had a few minor problems that were easily sorted out with the organising body, and I am happy to report that the food greatly improved as from the next morning, still not good, but it had improved.

Off to bed around midnight.

#### Saturday 4th February

Up at 6.00am to leave by 7.30am for the first day of competition with team events for both Trap and Skeet. Weather conditions much improved and all shooters were eager to start.

Both 'A' Trap Team and the 'A' Skeet Team won their team shoots. The 'A' Trap Team with Russell Mark, Michael Diamond and Adam Vella shot 209/225. Our 'B' Team came in second place with 201/225, team members being Ben Kelley, Craig Tilley and Tom Turner.

The 'A' Skeet Team also won, shooting a 209/225 with Clive Barton, John Summers and Craig Meuleman. The 'B' Skeet Team took 3rd place with 195/225, shot by Barty Brighenti, Guy Yoannidis and Michael Inguanti.

At the end of the day's competition we all had huge grins on our faces, we could not have asked for better results for our teams.

Back to the University, first to drop off my passengers, then on to the airport to pick up another incoming shooter.

Following dinner and presentations which concluded about 9.30pm we had a discussion with the members of the Jury and Ray Andrews, the problem we had with quota positions was finally resolved much to our satisfaction.

Back out to the airport to pick up 2 of our lady shooters who flew in at 11.30pm.

Getting to know all our tour operators at the airport and found yet another way back to the University.

In bed at 1.00am.

#### Sunday 5th February

Up early for a 7.30pm departure, the start of the individual events in Trap and Skeet, 75 targets.

The brand of clays had been changed due to a technical problem and we were not satisfied with the uniformity of colour, but due to the excellent work of the Jury members this problem was overcome immediately.

Competition then commenced with the weather conditions fine but overcast.

All shooters putting good scores on the board in both Trap and Skeet. Four of the ladies in the Double Trap team practiced in the afternoon.

Back to the University at 3.45pm with the shooters relaxing for the rest of the afternoon and evening, preparing themselves for the next day of competition.

10.00pm saw me back to the airport picking up yet another shooter.

#### Monday 6th February

Final day of the individual trap and skeet. Everyone in good spirits.

At the end of the competition of 125 targets, Australia had 5 shooters going into the final. At the end of the final 25 targets, Ben Kelley was triumphant with 139/150, Russell Mark 138/150 and Michael Diamond on 137/150 came in 3rd. Adam Vella shot 136/150 and Tom Turner 134/150.

We had in fact just won 2 Olympic quota spots.

In the Skeet, Australia again, at the end of 125 targets, had 3 shooters in the final, the overall result being Craig Meuleman shooting 140/150, John Summers 137/150 and Clive Barton 135/150.

Another 2 Olympic quota spots going to Australia.

Drug testing then took place and Double Trap practice for all concerned.

Back to the University at 5.00pm for team photos, presentation time, at which I was a very proud onlooker, and following dinner I had an informal meeting with the Jury members while some of the shooters celebrated.

#### Tuesday 7th February

Start of Double Trap competition with all competitors keen to start. Weather conditions fine and sunny.

At the end of 150 targets for the Open Double Trap, we had 5 shooters in the final. The final placings went to Michael Diamond 172/200, Craig Tilley 166/200, and Ben Kelley with 167/202. Steve Haberman shot 166/202 and Tom Turner 156/200.

Another Olympic quota spot to Australia.

With the Ladies Double Trap, at the end of 120 targets we had 4 ladies in the final. The end result being Deserie Huddleston 116/160, Ann Maree Roberts on 115/160, Loz Lloyd on 102/160 and Gleniss Lawrence on 93/160. Ann Maree had a bad call on 1 target leaving her in 2nd place.

Descrie winning yet another Olympic quota spot for us.

1st and 2nd place getters in all Double Trap then had to go to drug testing.

Back to the University with the troops and then off to the airport to pick up another 7 shooters just flying in.

Following dinner, I was once more back to the airport collecting another 7 shooters who had just arrived.

Now on 'first name' basis with the tour operators and police at the airport.

In bed at 1.00am.

#### Wednesday 8th February

Early start - 5.00am taking a bus load of the ISU shooters who were leaving on an early flight home.

Back to the University to pick up the DTL and American Skeet shooters to go to the gun club for practice, weather conditions fine and warm.

Back early in the afternoon to take 2 more bus loads of ISU shooters catching flights at 4.30pm.

That night following dinner, Col and I had a few quiet drinks with Ewan Pirie, New Zealand Team Manager, and a few of the shooters before retiring.

#### Thursday 9th February


Up at 6.00am us usual. No action in the camp, the official waker upper had slept in! We still, however managed a 7.30am start for the gun club to begin competition at 9.00am. Weather fine and warm.

The first 100 targets for the team shoots for single rise and skeet and the first 100 targets of the individual were being shot.

At the end of the day, the Open Single Rise Team of John Farrell, Dennis Lymn and Col Burt (Col had to step into this position as the governing body would not allow Nathan Cassells to shoot in the Open as well as the Junior Team), won the team event. The score was 888/900 (point score).

American Skeet Open Team saw Australia coming in 3rd position with Chris Langley, Bob Dower and Garry Dennison posting a score of 290/300.

The Ladies Skeet came in 2nd place with Carol Ogden, Katie Light and Frances Scott shooting 279/300.

Our Junior Team also came in second place with George Barton, Derek Bruce and Kris Jones shooting 269/300.

As you can see by the scores, the competition was of a very high standard and all shooters shot extremely well.

Back to the University for dinner and presentation and then off to bed.


#### Friday 10th February

At the conclusion if the day, John Farrell and Dennis Lymn had to shoot off for 2nd and 3rd placings. Both had shot 595/600 and neither had dropped a target and at the end of the shoot off, John took 2nd place as Dennis pulled a 2nd barrel on his 5th target.

The Ladies individual saw Karen Kennerson winning with a 585/600 and Deserie taking 2nd place with 580/600. Carmel Carlon came in 5th place with 559/600.

The Junior placings also saw a shoot off for 1st and 2nd between Nathan McDonnell and Justin Waldron, who had both shot 594/600. Nathan ended up winning the shoot off, Justin taking 2nd place and Nathan Cassells came in 3rd position with a score of 588/600.

Another good result for Australia.

American Skeet individual saw Bob Dower coming in 3rd place in the Open division shooting 197/200, Chris Langley taking 9th place with 194/200 and Gary Dennison coming in 13th position with 192/200.

The Ladies Skeet individual placings saw Carol Ogden taking 3rd place with 193/200, Katie Light taking 4th place 186/200 and Frances Scott in 5th place with 181/200.

George Barton won the Junior individual, shooting a 192/200, Kris Jones taking 2nd with 181/200 and Derek Bruce 5th position with 172/200.

Once again all shooters shot extremely well as their scores indicate.

Dinner and presentation time saw an end to the games and it was a proud moment for me to pick up 5 of the 6 quota spot certificates for the shooters who had already gone home.

#### Saturday 11th February

Up at 6.00am for the flight home.

## S.A.C.T.A. State DTL Carnival

10, 11 & 12 February, 1995

nament at Gordonvale, Nth Qld, bringing home gold in his category in ISU Trench and bronze in the Open Double Trap.


To end the year our Christmas shoot was held on the 18th December. Twenty shooters attended the days events. Santa visited and presented gifts to all.





## Big breaks by Smith and Rohrlach in February 'Top Gun'

Queensland's Doug Smith shot a massive 602 break at Kingaroy's annual two day carnival to earn himself 1,000 bonus shotshells in Winchester's February 'Top Gun' awards. Doug uses the low recoil AA 1200 in shot size 7.5. Paul Clarkson also broke 415 consecutive targets in the same events to win himself a case of target loads.

At the South Australian State Trap Carnival, Tony Rohrlach won the State Single Barrel and 1,000 shotshells and then continued his single barrel form into the first half of the State Point Score title to reach 100 straight first barrels and a further 500 target loads. At the same carnival Bert Boschetti from Western Australia edged out Roger Duthie to win 2 cases of shotshells. Roger picks up a half case for second as he did in the single barrel event.

A pleasing aspect throughout February was the fine form displayed by some of our best juniors. Ben Kelley from NSW won a case of shotshells for his win at the Oceania Olympic Trap event in Auckland and a further half case for the Olympic Trap High Gun conducted at Newcastle. Drew Freeman from Tasmania won the Junior High Gun at their State Trap Carnival and Nik Marinis did the same at the South Australian Titles, both win 500 target loads for their efforts.

Bill Eagle from Shepparton in Victoria finally cracked the big time at the South Australian State Championships by winning the Double Barrel Title and 1,000 shotshells. Runner up David Flavel picked up 500 shells as well as a further 500 from an earlier high gun win at Wilkawatt. Interestingly both Bill and David won State Double Rise Championships recently. Bill in Tasmania and David at the South Australian Carnival.

The answer to the many queries we receive as to why the State Double Rise, Handicap and Champion of Champions events are not included in our State 'Top Gun' awards is simply that not all states conduct these events at their annual State Championships, therefore so as not to discriminate we only support the events which are at all championships which are the Double Barrel, Single Barrel, Point Score and High Gun events. If all states could come to an agreement to a set format we could then look at expanding our awards.

## Australian Sports Drug Agency

Athletes have say on drugs in sport as athlete advisory group meetings begin Australia wide

A selection of elite athletes from a variety of sports will meet with Australian Sports Drug Agency (ASDA) officials over the next few months as part of the Athlete Advisory Group (AAG) meetings.

The series of informal discussions, which began in Canberra on the 10th February will ultimately include talks in each state with up to 70 competitors from more than 20 sports, has been organised by ASDA to determine the concerns of athletes regarding drugs in sport.

Now in its third year, the AAG meetings give elite athletes the opportunity to ask questions about the drugs in sport issue and for ASDA to receive feedback on its programs.

The agency held meetings with athletes in 1992 and 1993, with the consensus being that while Australia had its act together, there were concerns regarding the rest of the world. Previous meetings have raised issues such as:

- A lack of information for athletes regarding drugs in sport, which has been addressed.
- The media's concentration on positive, rather than reflecting the fact that most tests are negative.
- The need to tighten procedures to prevent people fudging the system.
- A concern about the possibilities of blood testing and uncertainty about its ramifications.

While the course of discussions will largely be determined by the athletes, the situation in China is expected to be high on the agenda.

ASDA's Tony Wynd, organiser of the AAG meetings, says that while ASDA can't guarantee that the Chinese situation will be resolved immediately because it is largely beyond ASDA's control, it could give athletes information it has and reassure them that it is doing all it can on their behalf.

I am pleased to announce that the 1994 Presidential Medal has been awarded to ACTA Past President, Mr Jim Scott.

Dubbo Gun Club went into recess for a short time owing to the loss of the club site at Terramungermine. Jim then joined the Warren Gun Club and was elected to the Committee where he was most active in club affairs. He continued to seek a suitable ground for Dubbo Gun Club and when this was found he assisted in the Dubbo Gun Club with the complete establishment of the new club facilities. Jim accepted the position of Trustee of the club for a number of years until the club was on a sound footing, both socially and financially.

When the Western Zone of NSW was formed he was a foundation member. In 1973 he was elected Vice President and approximately three years later he was elected President – a position which he held for some years and under his guidance the Western Zone became firmly established.

With the formation of the New South Wales Clay Target Association he was elected as Delegate to the Association in 1973 and held this position until he resigned in 1992. During the 19 years he was on the New South Wales Executive Committee, he held the position of Treasurer and Vice President for approximately 11 years.

Jim was elected to the A.C.T.A. as delegate for NSW in 1981. Whilst on the Executive of the ACTA he served 7 years on the Management Committee, 2 years as Vice President, President for 3½ years (elected un-opposed on 3 occasions). He served 10 years on the ACTA Executive Committee and during his term of office he was very instrumental in the purchase of our building in Mount Waverley, which has saved us the burden of paying large rentals.

As well as the above service at Club, Zone, State and National level he has worked for the clay target shooting fraternity as follows:

- Jim was on the organising committee to run the first Nationals to be held at Wagga Gun Club in 1984, he followed this up by being on the organising committee and Tournament Director for the Nationals in 1988.
- During the 1980s he worked with the Melbourne Gun Club to run the first Skeet National Championships in 1983; again in 1984 and 1985.
- During 1984 and 1985 he assisted with the ISU National Championships.
- Became a registered referee in 1960, he later became a referee examiner, and then followed a period of years as Rules Supervisor.
  - He has always made himself available to referee at any shoot and was selected on three occasions to referee the National Double Barrel Championship.
- During his 10 years on the National Executive he travelled to every capital city in Australia and the Institute of Sport in Canberra, not only to shoot, but to promote clay target shooting.

Coaching: Jim is particularly interested in this phase of the sport and in 1982 he organised a big weekend at Dubbo with the attendance of the State Coach, all Zone Coaches and many Club Coaches. In 1982 he also combined with Len Bird and organised the first Coaching Seminar in NSW which was held at Cowra Gun Club. It was attended by Newton Thomas (National Coach), George Biggs (Victorian State Coach), Pud Burgess (NSW State Coach), all Zone Coaches and a large number of Club Coaches, and approximately 150 shooters.

The following are some awards known that Jim Scott has been granted in appreciation of his services to shooting.

- Honorary Life Membership of the Dubbo Gun Club
- Honorary Life Membership of the Melbourne Gun Club
- Honorary Life Membership of the New South Wales Clay Target Association
- Honorary Life Membership of the Australian Clay Target Association

In 1990 Jim Scott was invited as a Foundation Member of the NSW Firearms Safety Awareness Council. One of the main objects of this council is to organise and administer the testing of all persons (rifle, pistol, gun and general public) to qualify for a shooting licence in NSW.

Jim has been a continuous member of the ACTA for 34 years (1960-1994) and during this time has been on a Committee at Club, Zone, State and National level for 32 years (1960-1992). He served his Zone for 19 years, the State for 19 years and the National Committee of the ACTA for 10 years.

Jim resigned all positions in 1991 and 1992 as he wished to spend more time with his children and grand children and for personal reasons.

It is only fitting that the 1994 Presidential Medal be awarded to a man who has contributed to the sport of Clay Target Shooting over so many years and has done so much in the development of the sport.

One of the most successful Phil Becker Memorial shoots was held on Sunday 19th February.




The winner of the 25 Double Barrel Points was Neil Dowey of Collie with the perfect 75/75.

J. Bates receiving 'B' grade trophy in Phil Becker Memorial Cup from President T. Booth.








