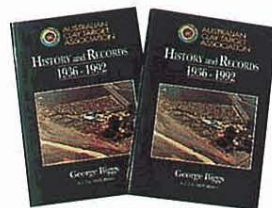

Possible ban on recreational Duck Shooting

Many members of the ACTA around Australia are very keen duck hunters and it is devastating news that the New South Wales Government looks almost certain to ban recreational duck hunting at the time this magazine goes to print. It can plainly be seen to be another cause to remove private firearm ownership. It is also worth noting that the 'accidental' release of the virus to eradicate the rabbit population may well and truly decimate that bunny to such an extent, that rabbit hunting will also be gone as a reason to own a firearm.

1997 World DTL Championship

Plans are well under way to conduct the 1997 World DTL Championships. It is proposed that the 'World' will form part of the 1997 DTL Nationals, thereby giving every shooter the opportunity to partake in this prestigious event. There is no qualifying criteria to shoot in the event, and to further encourage participation, it will be graded as well as featuring sections for juniors, ladies and veterans. Team events will be a feature, including junior, women and veteran teams. The event has been allocated to New South Wales to host and the actual dates and venue will be available shortly. It is also planned to program extensive lead up shoots featuring a major overall sponsor with very attractive prizes for shooters.

In addition to these outstanding achievements, many of our athletes won silver or bronze medals in international competition and represented Australia in a manner which has reflected well for our sport.

Our Glenn Trophy Team of Reg Clarke, Neal Dimmick, Scott Wright, Adrian Cousens and John Withers was successful in bringing back the trophy to our shores. In the Glenn Cup match our team shot 250/250 to retain the cup. They were Michael Diamond, Dino Olivero, Russell Mark, Steve Atkins and Robert Nisbet.

Even though we won both trophies against the Kiwis, our relationship with our New Zealand counterparts continues to go from strength to strength. This liaison can only strengthen the sport in both countries and we look forward to working further with New Zealand next year.

There is only four years left of the 20th Century, now is the time for ALL shooters to go out and promote OUR sport, to strengthen our membership base (if all Clubs only gained 3 new members that would be nearly a 1000 new members nation wide) and accordingly strengthen our Association. Lets not go into the 21st Century, kicking and screaming, let go into it full of running and vitality to make OUR sport bigger and better.

My thanks to members of the A.C.T.A. Executive for their work and contributions during the year.

Personal thanks, as well as those of all members, to the staff at our National Office - Graeme, Leanne, Gina, Manon and Murray for their input, support and effort during 1995.

Finally, Jan and myself wish everyone a very happy Christmas and a very healthy and prosperous New Year. Good shooting in '96.

The N.S.W.C.T.A. A.G.M. was conducted on the Friday night, with pleasing attendance and interest shown.

Saturday morning we commenced our new format programme with the State Handicap event. As we are trialing the Medals and Cash Awards programme at this year's Carnivals, we approached our very supportive past sponsors regarding the actual sponsorship of the Medals, Badges and Sashes. Young junior shooter Jason Lyons from Canberra International CTC, shooting from 11 metres (and walking miles up and down the lanes) put on an excellent display, shooting 89/91 and winning 4th place. Congratulations Jason. It was also lovely to see the Lyons contingent (Merv, Paul and Michael) proudly "carrying the cartridges" for Jason.



State Junior Team

Bill Iles was 3rd overall with 90/91, Alan Roe from Illawarra 5th with 70/71, Daryl Pasfield 6th with 61/62, and Ian Merrick 7th with 60/61.

Saturday afternoon we pushed on with the State Double Rise Championship, the first time we have included it in our Carnival. Five shooters shot 47/59 to be included in the shoot-off and, after one round, a very popular win went to Bill Jones after shooting the 10/10, giving an overall score of 57/60. Bill, being the State Treasurer and A.C.T.A. Finance Chairman, puts in an awful lot of work behind the scenes for clay target shooting, and it was very pleasing for us to see him shoot so well.

Mark McInnes, another State Executive Member and the State Handicapper, was the runner-up in this event with another great score of 56/60. Janenne Kidd from Sydney CTC won the Womens division with an impressive score of 45/50, with Loz Lloyd second and Wendy Barton third. Shane Pinner won the Juniors section, Adam Healy the Sub-Juniors section, and Merv Lyons the Veterans.



State Women's Team

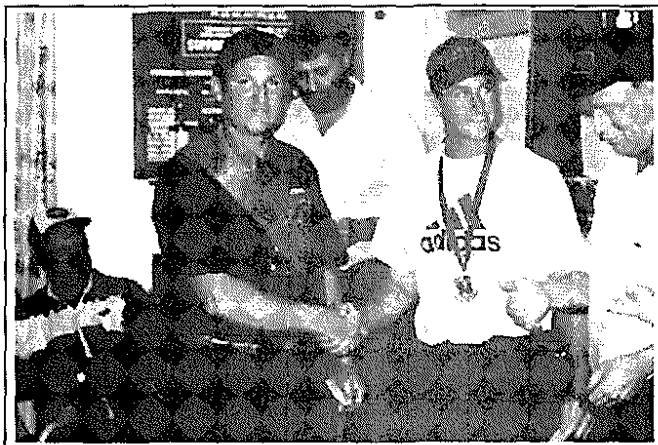
The Double Barrel Championship was this year sponsored by Winchester after a change from their High Gun sponsorship for many years. Many thanks to Winchester and to Frank Smith. The event commenced on Sunday (and finished on Monday) and turned out to be a real "record breaker" with 43 possibles shot and a new State record being established by Arthur Turner shooting 562/562, the eventual winner from Brad Webb 561/562. Both these shooters put on a fine display for the very interested "gallery". Many also remember the conditions in which Arthur Turner shot off with Michael Diamond in Wagga in 1993 to be the runner-up with 543/544. Congratulations to both Arthur and Brad for such terrific shooting.

The long list of personal best scores went on and on with the office flat out keeping up with the break badge requests. Bill Iles shot 394, Jeff Webster 341, John Sleightholme 279, and Col Burt 258. Adam Healy again won the Sub-Juniors and Merv Lyons the Veterans (61/61).

The Womens Double Barrel Championship and Juniors Double Barrel Championship, generously sponsored again by the N.S.W.F.S.A.C., are both shot in conjunction with the overall event. The N.S.W.F.S.A.C. is very supportive of

all areas of shooting, and we thank the Executive Director, Paul Andrew and the Council for their assistance. This year saw Karen Kennerson from Sydney CTC shoot the possible 50/50 to take the Womens event outright, with Leonie Peters 2nd 49/50 and Loz Lloyd 3rd 64/66. Shane Pinner won the Juniors 68/69 from Eddie Boulos 67/69, and Justin Dale was 3rd with 50/52.

The State Single Barrel Championship finally got underway on Sunday afternoon after we had reduced the Double Barrel shoot-off to one squad. Six shooters shot the Single Barrel possible with Ian Merrick finishing on top with a score of 68/68 from John Farrell 67/68. Brian Samuels won A Grade, Bruce Cosgrove won B Grade and George Barton won C Grade. Loz Lloyd, Justin Dale, Adam Healy and Merv Lyons won Womens, Juniors, Sub-Juniors and Veterans respectively.

Both Kim Nealon and John Farrell shot the 250/250, with other State Team Members being Steve Guest, John Lawrence, Arthur Turner, Ian Merrick, Ludwig Kohler, Paul Lyons, John Sleightholme, Brad Webb, Michael Lyons, Peter Holmes, Mark McInnes, Bob Rose, and Jeff Webster. The proof of the great targets set for the weekend must surely be that 4 points down shoot-off for the Team!!

Kim Nealon, John Farrell, Steve Guest and Ian Merrick qualified for the Shoulder to Shoulder Team with Arthur Turner, Paul Lyons and Michael Lyons shooting off for the 5th position, with Arthur gaining the spot and Paul becoming the first reserve.

The State Team High Gun was won very impressively by Kim Nealon with 400/400. The Womens Team High Gun winner was Leonie Peters, and the Junior Team High Gun was won by Shane Pinner.

Kathy Gault (nice to see you back Kathy), Leonie Peters, Suzy Balogh (you too Suzy), Karen Kennerson, Christine Geppert and Janenne Kidd made up the State Womens Team, with Leonie, Suzy and Janenne qualifying for the Shoulder to Shoulder Team.

Justin Pinner, Justin Dale, Eddie Boulos, Chad Vernon, Andrew Webster and Johnny Cunningham made the State Junior Team, with Shane, Justin and Eddie packing their bags for Launceston and the Shoulder to Shoulder Team event.

The State Association was trialing a new programme which was developed over the past 12 months. This included a varied programme as well as Medals for trophies and lower nominations. Then there were optional cash prizes which you could enter into if you so desired. Percentages of money were also set aside for the cash High Gun prizes, with the Overall High Gun winner collecting more than \$750. Not bad for a shoot with fewer numbers in attendance.

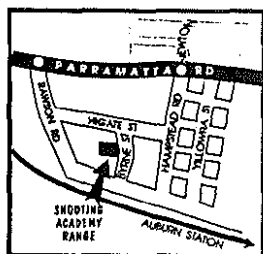
Finally, thank you to the Tamworth Clay Target Club for providing the grounds once again in beautiful condition, and for your hospitality.

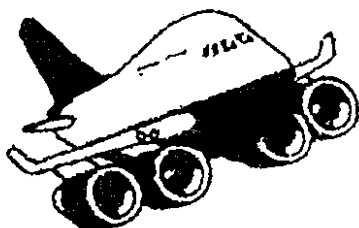

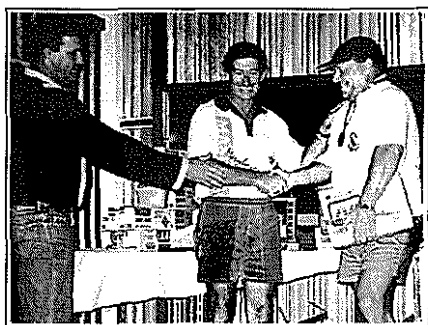
Clermont Gun Club

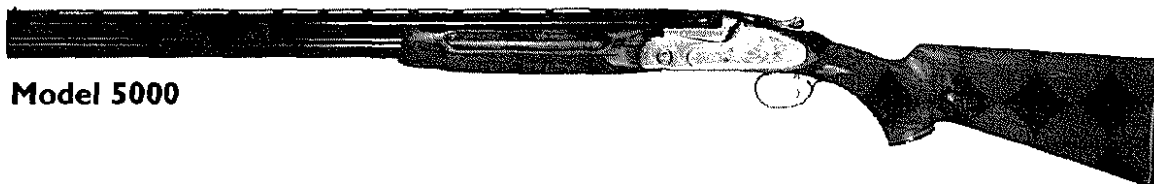

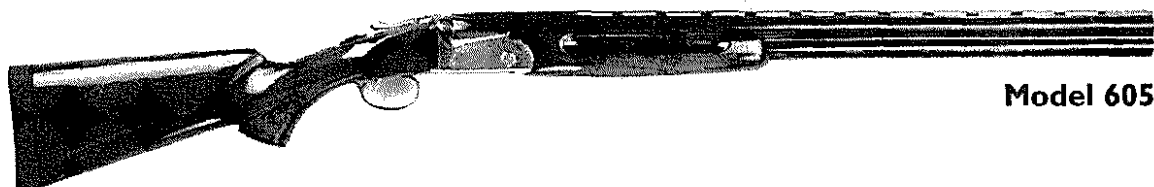

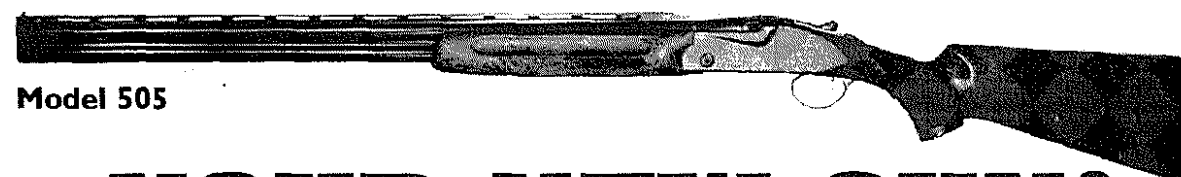

Beretta's 686 'Silver Perdiz' Sporter

Certainly, after the World Sporting Clay Championships at Mount Gambier last year, there is little doubt in my mind that Beretta shotguns are very popular with shooters from all countries. Although I spotted some magnificent sidelock SO5 Berettas about the grounds at Mt. Gambier the 683 and 687 boxlocks were plentiful. In fact World Champion, George Digweed, used two Beretta 682 shotguns to retain his third world crown.

Whilst the Beretta SO5 sidelocks, ASE90 detachable trigger locks and 682 boxlocks are favourites amongst those who can afford them, the 687 and 686 are fast becoming popular for they are not as expensive as other models, in their basic form. Recent model 686 guns are almost identical to the 687 models apart from the 686 carrying scroll engraving instead of game scenes and a plain, instead of schnabel forend found on the 687.

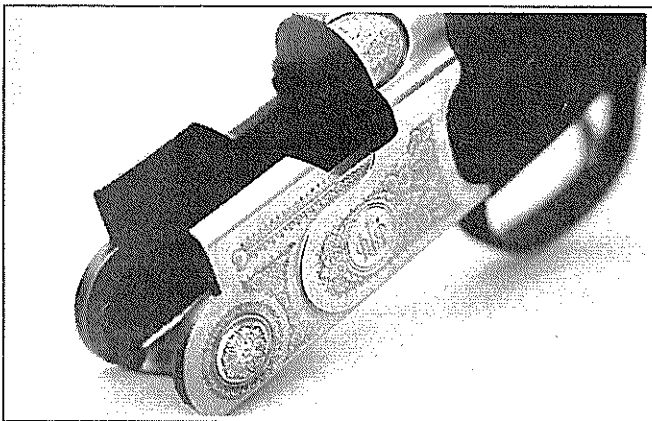
Earlier 687 models had replaceable shoulders on the barrels but to provide a more affordable gun, of high quality, Beretta have launched the 686 Silver Perdiz as its lower priced model, without such costly additions. As with any less expensive model there is a certain amount of compromise, such as an adjustable trigger, a mid-sight and differing forend/stock designs. The quality of the wood used for the stock and forend can incur a cost difference of several hundred dollars. Thankfully, with the 686 'Silver Perdiz', Beretta have provided a well made and presented gun with a case for a very reasonable price, around \$2,300, by cost-cutting cosmetics features. Inside, the gun's mechanism is every bit the same as Beretta's more expensive boxlock models.

At a glance

The test gun arrived by courier and upon unpacking it was supplied with a sturdy, lockable hard case that has become standard with up-market Beretta models. The gun looked well presented, with its walnut stock and bruniton-finished barrels. The fluro front sight was similar to the type found on the 682 Gold Sporting - Berettas top line boxlock under and over. The Silver Perdiz is also fitted with Beretta *Mobil chokes and supplied with 5 interchangeable tubes, although the choke spanner was quite a deal less than the more expensive 'propeller' model offered with other higher grade models. Cost cuts have to come from somewhere, this was obviously one of them. The engraving on the receiver was clean and smart and gave the gun an expensive appearance. It was pleasing to find the test sample fitted with a decent recoil pad. Generally, lower grade guns are relegated to plastic butt pads, thankfully Beretta have been more than generous with this 686 Sporter - I abhor plastic butt pads on sporters for they tend to slip from the shoulder during discharge at overhead shots, one of my 'pet' hates.

The barrels

Finished with Bruniton, a teflon like coating, at 1.54kg. and 29"

in length the barrels were about right for the serious sporting clay shooter. As a dual purpose sporter and field shotgun, Beretta have chambered the Silver Perdiz for 3" cartridges, providing greater versatility for the user. The parallel, 'strada' rib is anti glare finished with a longitudinal groove down its centre finishing with a fluro trap-type front bead sight. There is no mid-bead nor step in the rib. The outside chamber finish on the barrels was nicely jewel polished, to retain lubricants, whilst the ejectors were selective and positive in operation. Beretta continue with their bifurcated, low profile pivot pins, the feature of all Beretta shotguns that provides them with the 'Beretta feel', a great hands-in-line feeling that affords quick mounting for positive and smooth pointing at targets.

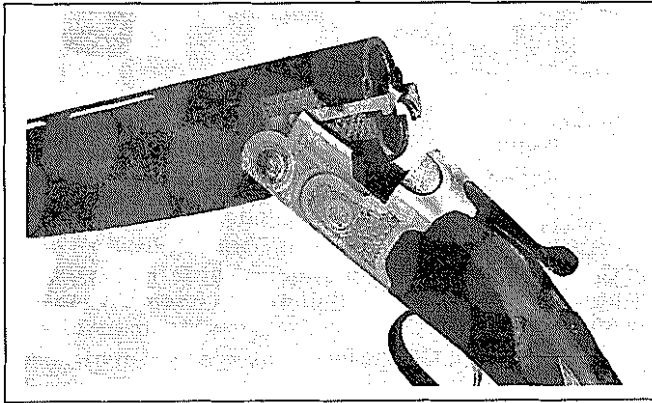
The stock and forend

Although finished in walnut and provided with clean checkering, the colour of the wood match between the stock and forend was not one of the gun's virtues. This could be overcome by hand selecting a gun from a dealer. The standard 'trap' forend perpetuated the grip found with similar forends of its design, being neither shallower or wider than required for the gun's reduced price. The stock wood was quite plain to the point of practical, there was nothing elaborate or ornate about the stock wood, if anything, it was a little light in weight. This in turn placed the gun's weight 20mm forward of the hinge pin. For mine, I prefer the gun to be evenly weighted between my hands, around 5mm forward of the hinge pin. This could be overcome by adding a lead plug to the stock to balance the gun a little better. The stock configuration was a little higher than I would suggest for a 'sporter'. A solid, comfortable recoil pad was a pleasing addition to the Silver Perdiz, especially since users might be tempted to use 3" cartridges for field shooting.

The action

The action of the 686 Silver Perdiz is identical to the more expensive 682 model, with the exception of an adjustable trigger foot. The silver, curved trigger used on the 686 is quite adequate for the task and once again, is largely a personal preference. The trigger pulls were a little heavy for my liking, around 5 pounds for each barrel. A competent gunsmith could easily rectify this, again for a minimal cost. I ideally prefer around 3 pound for the first barrel and 4 pound for the second. Beretta, as with other gun manufacturers, do the best they can to provide a universal configuration for their guns. Despite their efforts many shooters will still need to have their new guns adjusted to suit, for it is uncommon for any shotgun to be an absolutely perfect fit 'straight out of its box'.

I have long been a fan of Beretta shotguns, purely due to their lower action frame obtained by using a bifurcated method of hinging the barrels. A combined trigger selector/safety catch is located on the rear tang and provides positive selection of either

barrel or the 'safe' position. The trigger guard is generous and complimentary with its line, able to accommodate the largest of fingers.

Conclusion

I found the Beretta 686 'Silver Perdiz' to be a well made shotgun that offers unlimited potential as either, a competition sporting clays or field gun. There were several modifications I would employ if I was to use the gun for competition but generally the gun is very well made and represents excellent value. At 7 pound in weight I would prefer a heavier gun for my faster sporting loads but for those accustomed to 28 gram (1oz), and moderate 32 gram (1oz) loads the Silver Perdiz would be ideal. There is no doubt that interchangeable choke tubes are also mandatory for a sporter. The five supplied with the Beretta provide the shooter with an option for every shooting situation, especially when coupled with the barrel selector. Beretta choke tubes are not only well regulated for their patterns, they, along with the barrels, are suited for use with steel shot, quite a bonus as steel shot is currently being considered mandatory for duck hunting in many states of Australia. At around \$2,300, including the magnificent Beretta case, the 686 Silver Perdiz Sporting is almost \$1,000 less than a Beretta 682 sporter. Quite a good proposition for a shooter who seeks a new Beretta sporter and can't quite afford the price tag of a 682.

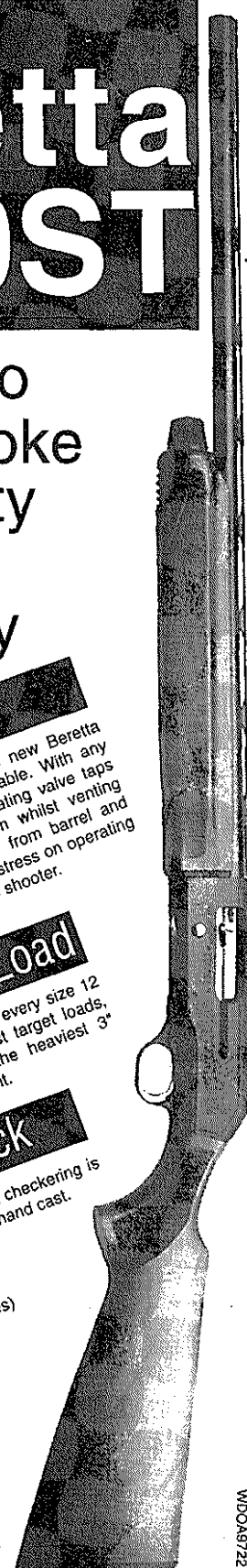

Two Man Team - 400T

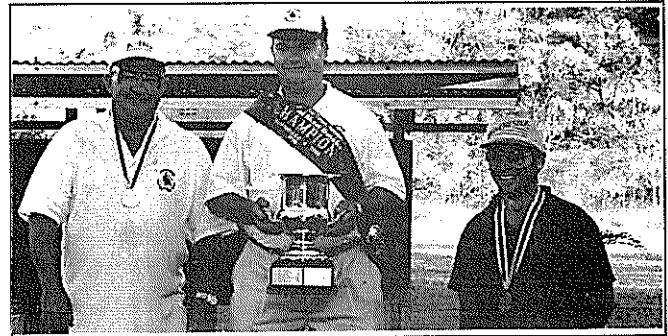

Colac Gun Club

1896 — 1996

— Centenary Shoot 11 February 1996 —

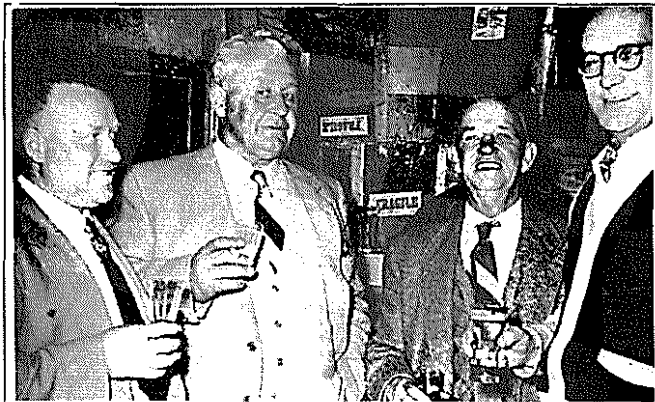
It is quite rare these days for any club and more especially a gun club to be still in existence and functioning very strongly after 100 years, but this is the case in regard to the Colac Gun Club, in fact the only other clubs in Colac that have made it to the century are Colac Turf Club, Colac Rifle Club and the Colac Golf Club (1996 also).

The very early history of the Gun Club unfortunately was not well documented or has been lost or destroyed, but it is a known fact that it was formed in 1896 and the very first club house was shared by the Gun Club and the Golf Club with the club house being situated approximately where the Golf Club Bowling Green is situated today.

In these very early days all shooting was live bird; pigeons; starlings and sparrows and only those that could afford it such as business men and squatter (gentlemen land owners) were able to shoot.

The earliest recorded minutes of the Gun Club goes back to 1917 with Mr W.H. Clements as President and Mr H.D. Thomas as Secretary, with the first meetings being held at the Victoria Hotel, later on meetings were held at the Union Hotel which Mr Clements owned.

The earliest recorded shoot that the club has was in 1914 with about 25 members. It is very interesting to read the minutes of that era up until the late 20's and early 30's with many of the shoots offering 100 pounds (\$200) or more, in some cases, as prize money. For those that were very good shots there was quite good money to be won with some shooters making a living from live bird shooting during those years.

In about 1925 the club house was moved across the road to its present location. About 1970 a new club house was built because the old one was falling into disrepair.

After the Second World War gun clubs and shooting in general started to boom. In the Colac district alone I can recall five gun clubs, they being Colac, Cressy (which was run by Ray Bath, world rabbit skinning champion), Yeo (by the Shelton family), Pirron Yallock (by George Simpson), and Irrewillipe (by Les Black). It was mainly a combination of live birds and clays on shoot days.

In 1948 the club installed its first automatic angling trap operated from behind the competitor by a person called a puller who would cock the trap and release the target on the shooters call.

Another reason that shooting boomed after the war was the

enormous amount of game that abounded in that period. There were literally millions of rabbits and ducks by the thousands, plus quail and hares. Practically every household in the country had a shotgun or a .22 rifle. How many readers learned to shoot rabbits on the run with a .22 and get a shilling a pair for them.

An interesting true story was related to me recently by Malcolm Quick who worked for Swayne & Neilson Sports Store in Colac.

On one Saturday morning in the early 50's the store sold no less than 26 shotguns and rifles in about 3 hours; no registration or permits to purchase in those days; yes, it was a better world then.

Names that come to mind readily that got the club up and running after the Second World War were Hal Sears and President and Don Costorphan as Secretary. They were elected on 23rd October 1946. After that Theo Norman, Vin O'Shannessy, Eric 'Pop' Ball and Ernie Osborne, the latter holding the President's position for over 25 years. Also Arthur Neale who was Secretary for about 10 years.

In that period 2 very young shooters from the Colac Club started to show great promise - they being Harvey Eldridge and Ray Parker. At the age of 16 Harvey won the Grand Australian Handicap in about 1948. Ray has also over 400 sashes in his collection with many Commonwealth, State and District titles to his credit.

In 1975 both Harvey and Ray represented Australia at the World Titles in Munich, other top shooters to emerge from the club were 'Pop' Ball, George Crosse, Bill Arnold, Don Costorphan, Ian Holt and Don Milojevic and many more.

The Colac Gun Club extends a cordial invitation to all those shooters who over the years visited our club to be part of our Centenary Shoot on the 11th February 1996, program to be advertised in January journal.

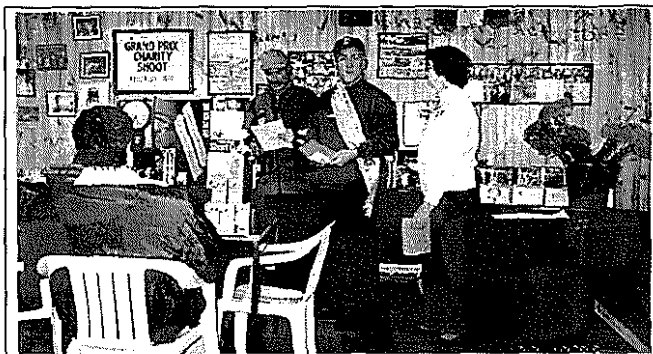

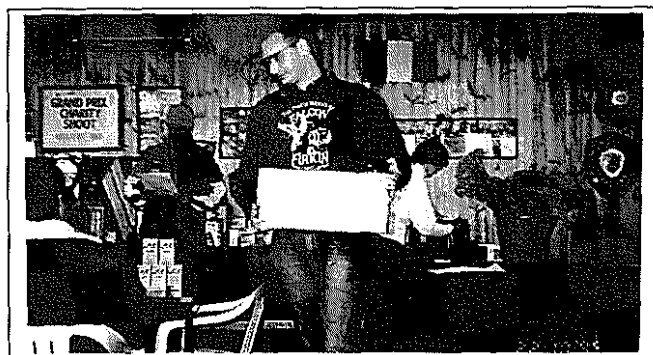
