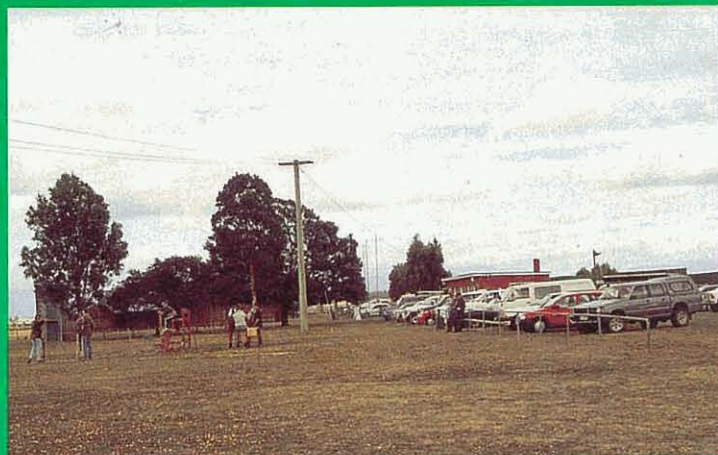

As for the low target, compared to the centre of the shooting station, it gets out rather to the right in the former case, much to the left in the latter one.

National Uniformity in Firearms Legislation

In the last edition of the C.T.S.N. I mentioned the move for the introduction of a Federal Gun Law. Recently in Melbourne a meeting took place involving members of Government in Victoria and various persons representing shooting organisations. The purpose of this meeting is borne out in the title of papers emanating from it ... National Uniformity in Firearms Legislation ... Consultation with Firearm Interest Groups.

A remarkable side of this meeting was that the A.C.T.A. and no State Clay Target Association was informed of it.

It was attended by the Victorian Minister for Police and Emergency Service, the Secretary to the Victorian Depart-

ment of Justice, and some 33 persons representing firearm interest groups/associations. We have now been told we were inadvertently overlooked and will be invited to future meetings. I certainly hope so.

Some of the rubbish I have read being put forward leaves me speechless, and to illustrate my point I put forward the following little gem, put forward no doubt by an "expert" in firearms. It comes from a paper headed "Graded Licence Categories":

Category B: Shotguns

Category	Training & Storage Standard	
B1	1	Single Barrel Shotguns
B2	1	Double Barrel Shotguns
B3	2	Pump action Shotguns
B4	2	Self-loading Shotguns with an integral magazine capacity of up to seven (7) rounds.
B5	2	Self-loading Shotguns with a detachable magazine capacity of up to seven rounds.
B6	3	Self-loading Shotguns with a magazine capacity of more than seven rounds.
B7	3	Military-style self-loading Shotguns.

Sort of leaves you searching for the reasoning and sanity of the proposer.

Next time they meet we will be represented and, hopefully, be able to cut the stupidity of such proposals.

Dear Sir,

The Shoalhaven Clay Target Club was the proud holder of the inaugural Sporting Clays S. Zone Championships during April last year. We had built a rather different Simulated Field Range, we are led to believe from the A.C.T.A. journal and the minutes from the Southern Zone (N.S.W.) that we are no longer covered by A.C.T.A. held Public Liability insurance for "field type" clay target shooting events.

We are very disappointed with this news as we believe this will mean other "A.C.T.A." clubs will be forced to look elsewhere, obviously we and they will not drop the "field" shoots.

The aspect of the article that our members take umbrage with is not the technical aspect of insurance, it is the "field of interest" comment.

For us, "the field of interest" is simply a clay target, thrown through the air, is placed into a shot pattern fired from a shotgun, by an enthusiastic shooter, who pays, enjoys and comes to the club again Our Club is building a growing membership on this philosophy, we shoot D.T.L. Simulated Field and are building a Skeet Layout. Some of our members

have a preference for D.T.L., some Simulated Field, all have a passion for clay target shooting and will compete at whatever discipline is available, some (nutters) even participate in single barrel black powder events!

A cynic may consider the following reasons for this apparent jaundiced view regarding shotgun sports:

- * D.T.L. shooters have a narrow field of vision;
- * Skeet shooters can only find 8 stations to shoot from;
- * 5 Stand Sporting shooter can't find 8 stations;
- * I.S.U. shooters want to get it over with in a hurry;
- * Or is it not the view of the average shooter, just another minority group doing a bit of chest thumping.

On a serious note, we Shoalhaven shooters must, and have joined another fraternity "The N.S.W. Field and Game Association", apart from the insurance issue we anticipate a gain in Club membership, which will benefit both the A.C.T.A. and the N.S.W. Field and Game Association.

We would like to believe that our Southern Zone (N.S.W.) is not in someway leading the push for division by regulation, but the writings in the S.Z. minutes lead us to believe otherwise.

We need to have a very open mind about the unity of shooters, sure, ban AK47's from A.C.T.A. clay shooting, but not disciplines - let us not, EVER AGAIN, see our journals or affiliated groups use those divisive words - "not in our field of interest" not in who's field of interest, clay target shooters?

1996 A.C.T.A. Junior Development Squad

D.T.L. - Skeet - I.S.U. Trap - I.S.U. Skeet - Double Trap - Female Double Trap

Selections for participation in the 1996 Junior Development Squad shall be in accordance with guidelines as set down by the A.C.T.A. Coaching Council.

The Squad members shall only be selected for each discipline from the respective National Championships:

- * D.T.L. 3 Events - DB; SB; DB Points
- * Skeet 3 Events as shot,
not including Skeet Doubles
- * I.S.U. Trap 3 Events as shot
- * I.S.U. Skeet 3 Events as shot
- * Double Trap 2 Events as shot

Once selected, the following criteria will be:

(a) Will enter into his/her State Coaching Scheme under the guidance of their respective State Coaches;

(b) Maximum age of the Junior for the Development Squad will be such that they can attend the next Nationals of that Discipline as a Junior Shooter.

Tasmanian Gun Club

Tasmanian Gun Club, situated on the outskirts of the historic township of Evandale, was founded in 1923. Shooting grounds were first located adjacent to the Newstead Hotel (now a suburb of Launceston).

In the late 1930's it was moved to the suburb of Kings Meadows, and from there to St. Leonards, and later to Perth. Finally, in 1968, the Club was able to purchase its own property at our present location, Nile Road, Evandale, and is approximately 22km from Launceston (roughly 20 minutes travelling time).

It now has what is recognised as the best Clay Target facilities in Tasmania, with 8 Down-The-Line layouts (7 for competition and 1 for practice), 2 Skeet Layouts, 1 Olympic Trap, 1 I.S.U. Skeet, and 3 Continental Traps.

The Club conducts shoots every second Sunday of the month, with a few additional Saturday shoots throughout the year, as well as night shooting for both Trap and Skeet on a regular basis. It has a good background, and there are no problems with the sun, as you shoot into the south.

Practice is held every Wednesday afternoon till early evening.

Coaching Clinics for members, schools and community groups etc. are held with emphasis on firearm safety on a regular basis.

An annual Charity Shoot is conducted every year in conjunction with the Kings Meadow Rotary Club. This has been a continual event for the past 22 years, with more than \$30,000 having been raised for various charities.

The Tasmanian Clay Target Association use the facilities regularly for their State Trap Championships and the State Skeet Championships, Masters Games, etc., with the State I.S.U. Sub-Committee also making use of the Club's facilities on a regular basis.

The First Australian Masters Games were held at this venue in December 1987 with what we think is a record for the most competitors for a 50 target I.S.U. Skeet event of 95 shooters.

The Club has also hosted the National Trap Championships - in 1975 and 1990, and will again host the Championships in 1996.

President of the Tasmanian Gun Club is Dr. David Galloway, with Vice President being Geoff Clarke, and Molly Bryan the Secretary/Treasurer.

Tasmanian Gun Club extends a warm welcome to all shooters participating in the 1996 National Trap Championships.

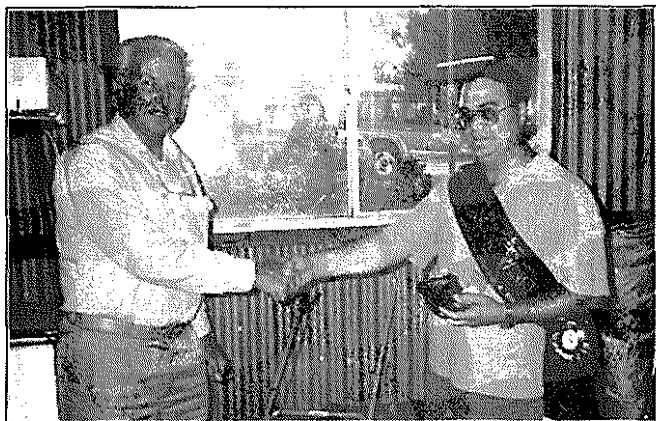

At the half-way mark six shooters were clean, but as the day progressed it boiled down to two shooters clean at the 100 target mark.



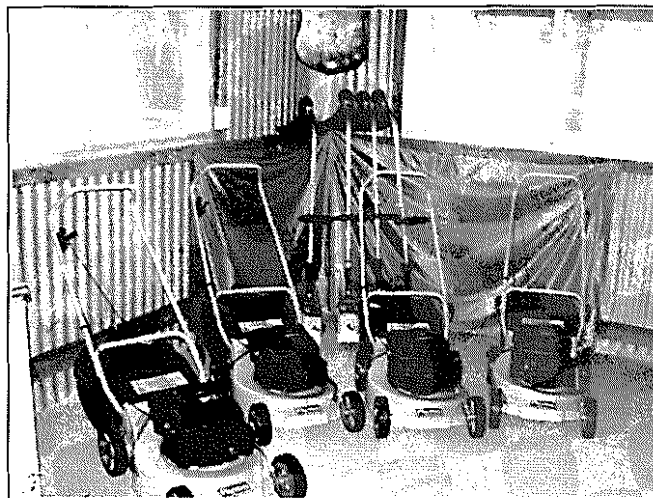
Paul Farrugia (AA and OA winner) receives his trophy from Warren Eggers

Shoot Stars at Kerang New Year's Day Shoot

As is normal, New Year's Day for clay target shooters means Kerang. This year, some 88 contestants fronted up to shoot a program of 120 targets, made up of 50 pointscore, a 40 target medley, and a 30 target double barrel.

Rather ironic in a society that's hell bent on banning firearms, that some 8,200 targets were used with an estimated 12,000 cartridges fired - breaking targets or shooting chips or just plain missing.

Not one person was injured or threatened and no gun jumped up and went off unattended - just what sports shooters have been saying all along - "It's not the gun, it's the person behind it".

Now to the shoot. The Club was very pleased with the crowd and with the number of both State and Australian representatives present from as far away as Mt. Isa, Broken Hill, Griffiths, Mildura, Nhill, Melbourne, Wellington (N.Z.), Albury, and many places in between.

Echuca President Ron Traill started the day well with 205/207 for A Grade and Overall in the 50 target points event from Mildura's Jim Finis AA Grade 204/207, with Cohuna's Gordon Fletcher and Alan (Sam) Street first in B and C Grades. This event was sponsored by the newly formed Shire of Gannawarra.

Event 2, North West Zone Medley C'ship - 10 D/B, 10 S/B, 10 P/S and 10 H/cap - and who said Bill Iles can't shoot? Easy as you like 60/60 - the only possible, no shoot-off. AA and Overall simple as that. Alan Edwards - A, Ron Felmington - B, and Jarrod Fletcher - C best of the rest.

Conditions of Competition - Entry

Entry into the 1996 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 1996 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors must produce their 1995 and 1996 registered shooter record books before nominating, to the 1996 Nationals Office Handicapper. Where a competitor was not registered for 1995 he/she must produce his 1996 score book.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate Championship Titles for Open (with a Veterans division), Ladies and Juniors, excepting the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

The payment of a reduced nomination by Women, Junior or Veteran competitors entitles those shooters to only be considered for awards in the Womens, Junior & Veteran sections.

Any competitor paying full nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open, Ladies, Junior & Veterans section.

ie: A woman paying full nominations (OL) shoots 50/50 to win the Ladies Championship is entitled to contest the Open Overall/Grade placings.

Note: A junior female must decide which section she is to enter, either Ladies or Juniors, she is not eligible for both.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before sashes/medals/cash/trophies are awarded.

When team selection is involved shooters shall be eligible for the Open team irrespective of the section nominated for.

To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors over the age of 65 years on April 6, 1996.

Juniors - are those competitors who, on April 6, 1996 will be under the age of 18 years.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination, shooters will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.

Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure or equivalent shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be black. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers.

All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - and indication can be obtained for the daily scoreboard. This applies to trap grades, Open, Ladies, Juniors and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps.

3. While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office whose decision shall be final.

4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET shall be incurred.

5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.

6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.

8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.

9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility shall be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scores are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.

10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.

11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location of the area accepting shooting event nominations.

14. Options sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

15. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

16. The payment of a reduced nomination by Women, Junior or Veteran competitors entitles those shooters to only be considered for awards in the Womens, Juniors & Veterans sections.

Any competitor paying full nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Ladies, Junior or Veterans section. ie: A woman paying full nominations (OL) shoots 50/50 to win the

Ladies Championship, is entitled to contest the Open Overall/Grade placings.

Note: A junior female must decide which section she is to enter, (junior or ladies), she is not eligible for both.

17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies/and or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.

18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am.

19. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.

20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.

21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

22. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.

The 1996 South Australian Eastern Zone Championships were staged at the Bordertown Gun Club on Sunday 21 January. A good field of zone shooters as well as visitors from other parts of the nation were in attendance and enjoyed the weekend's carnival provided, as the Bordertown monthly shoot was held on the Saturday and the South Australian State Night Single Barrel Championship held that evening.

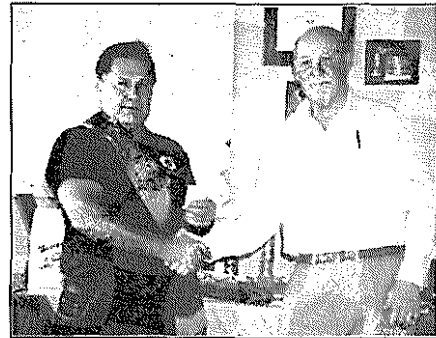

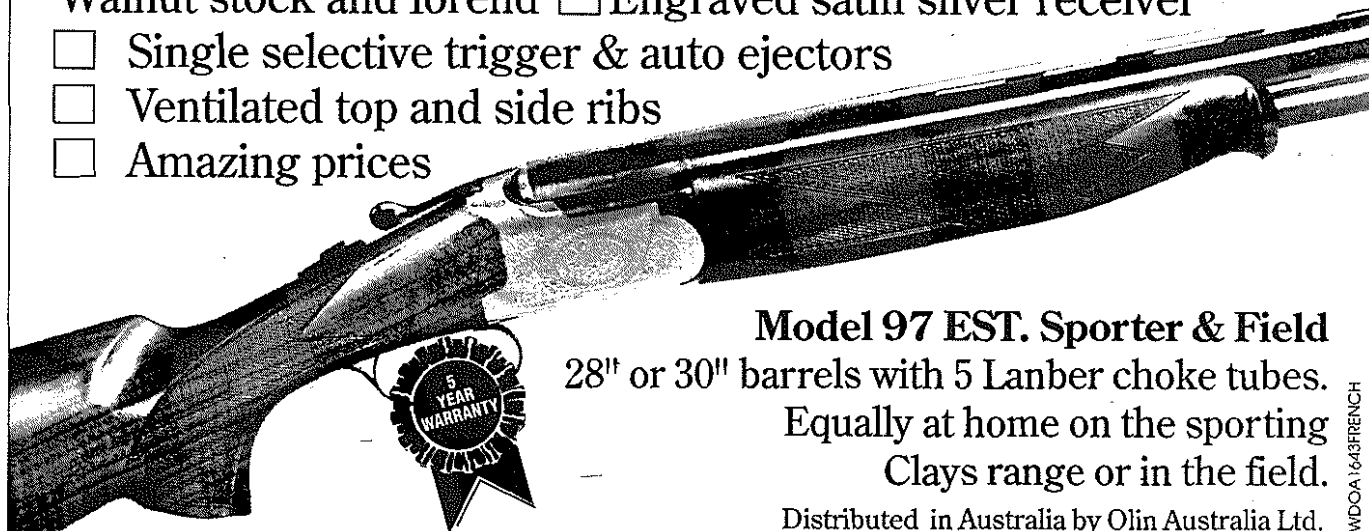

Tasmanian Trap Nationals

Interstate Competitors to the 1996 National Trap Championships will not require to obtain a Tasmanian Gun Licence if:

- they possess a valid Gun Licence in their home State or Territory; and
- their stay in Tasmania does not exceed 45 days.

Interstate Competitors will be required to have with them their interstate Gun Licences.

International Competitors are required to:

- apply for a temporary Gun Permit at a cost of \$20.
- complete and have approved a 'Weapons Import - Application for Police Endorsement' Customs Form B709A. No fee is charged for this approval. The form is to be completed and approved by the Commissioner of Police, Hobart prior to the importation of any firearms.
