WORLD CUP BRISBANE

The final planning of this prestigious event is now almost complete and we look forward to welcoming shooters from around the world to Brisbane.

The organising committee has worked hard to ensure that all aspects of this event are covered, and it is hoped our visitors will return to participate in events leading up to the Sydney Olympics.

2000 OLYMPICS VENUE

Our list of international achievements continues to grow and all sportspersons in Australia can be proud of our athletes.

U.I.T. World Cup New Delhi, India 3rd-8th March 1997

Friday 28th February

After a hectic two weeks of preparations for the World Cup in New Delhi, India, I was finally away after a 3.00am start from my home in Murray Bridge to catch the 6.00am flight to Sydney, where I was to meet up with John Maxwell, David Nielsen, Craig Meuleman and Ben Kelley at the International Airport.

We left Sydney at 11.30am and headed off on our 8 1/2 hour flight to Hong Kong with Ansett and, as is the case on long flights, we seemed to be constantly eating. The flight, however, was very good.

Arrived in Hong Kong for a three-hour stopover to change over to United Airlines. this proved to be a minor headache as my luggage was only booked on to Hong Kong as it was above the weight limit due to a rather large First Aid kit that we had made up, some cartridges, Australiana books and gifts (the usual assortment of banners, ties, badges etc.) that I had taken to present to the Indian Shooting Federation's President and Secretary.

All baggage must go through an X-ray machine in the airport and this worried me a little as I had cartridges in my suitcase and, while we were waiting in the United Airlines Club, John related a story about how he once on a trip overseas, found himself paged by the airport security and was taken by the police into a deserted hangar where his gun and baggage were sitting in the middle of the floor. After he produced all the right paperwork, a rather embarrassed senior Police Offer appeared to be out for staff's blood, leaving John in an unauthorised section of the airport.


No sooner had John finished his story than we found ourselves being called by some of the United staff and we were all taken out to a large shed to unpack the guns for inspection by the Police - and guess whose suitcase was sitting out in the roadway by itself! After an inspection of the guns and bags it was found that John's gun in a large bag was missing, but was soon traced as it had already been loaded onto the plane and, as for mine sitting out there on the roadway, they just assumed it had fallen from one of the carts and packed it on the plane.

The flight to New Delhi was uneventful, so most of the 5 1/2 hour flight was taken up with trying to get some sleep. Some shooters (who will remain anonymous) were lucky enough to find three seats to spread themselves out on.

Our arrival in New Delhi was somewhat of a culture shock to us, but we were warmly welcomed by representatives of the National Rifle Association and were taken out to the shooting range to put guns and cartridges into the armoury and, finally at 3.30am we arrived, under police escort, at the hotel to book in. Some quick housekeeping in the bathroom with cleansers brought from home, a quick spray for any "lurking insects", and at 4.30am I finally got to bed, ending a very long day.

Saturday 1st March

Woke up at 8.30am to the sound of monkeys, a dog and a

sacred cow having a fight outside my room.

This was official practice day for Trap, so we all went out to the shooting range and checked out the layouts and targets. After some practice and having made friends with Rudolf Strnad, a shooter from the Czech Republic who was there by himself, we hired two taxi cabs (for 450 rupee - about \$18 Aust. which allowed us 8 hours of time or 80kms) and we went into New Delhi shopping.

The trip was "hair-raising" to say the least - we had to hang on to our seats as there appeared to be no road rules, no traffic lights, no right or left side of the road. You just drove wherever there was a space, blowing the horn continually, dodging sacred cows, bikes, trucks and buses, and the pedestrians don't even get worried.

As I had a technical meeting to attend back at the shooting range, I left the boys shopping (they were heading for the markets) and I went on my way. The officials were all very helpful and couldn't do enough for me, and the meeting and finalising of all the paperwork was soon completed.

Back to the hotel. Most of the team were eating out of their

suitcases - Craig Meuleman's case looked like a travelling restaurant. John Maxwell had his own little cooker, and Ben Kelley appeared to be living on muesli bars. David Nielsen and I ate at the hotel's restaurant.

Sunday 2nd March

We had an 8.30am start as practice had to be finished by 11.00am so we could get ready for the Opening Ceremony which was to be held at the Army Barracks. Practice was a bit haphazard as the squads were not full all of the time, so it was a bit off-putting, but the boys still performed well.

His Excellency the President of India officially opened the World Cup which was done with much pomp and ceremony. Our team, led by John Maxwell carrying the flag, marched in their official Aussie blazers, ties etc. and I was very proud of them.

The Opening was quite a spectacular affair, with a band display, Indian singing and traditional dancing, a parachute display, and then they released

pigeons and balloons in front of a crowd of some 2,000 to 3,000 people - I personally felt very disappointed for the Indian Shooting Federation having presented us with such a welcome and only having the number of competitors that were there, perhaps only half of what they had expected.

The only disappointment at the Opening Ceremony was that with the very strict security at the Army Barracks with the Indian President being in attendance, all of our cameras were confiscated at the front gates and consequently we have no photographs of this grand affair.

Monday 3rd March

The first 75 targets of the Trap was shot and the boys did not shoot as well as we had hoped, but neither did the other shooters, with the exception of Giovanni Pelliello of Italy. The targets being thrown were far too fast and way too far -I questioned the distance of the targets but was shown that they were thrown to a maximum of 80 metres, but I could not make them understand that the ground was not level

from the firing point to the landing pegs and that if the ground were levelled out, the targets would have been travelling closer to 100 metres. They also did not allow for head winds and this, I believe, contributed to the low scores shot on the first day of competition.

The Italian Coach and Team Manager were of the same opinion as me and, after I voiced my concern to Tibor Gonczol that night, miraculously we all found the targets much better the next day and the scores went up considerably.

David Cunningham and Clive Barton arrived at 3.30am in the morning and they had come out with the rest of the team to the shooting range where they had some practice.

There was very little to see or do where we where staying, so late in the afternoon again we hired two taxi cabs and went sight-seeing.

Some of the boys still dined at Maxwell/Meuleman's Restaurant, and Clive Barton, Ben Kelley, David Nielsen and I opted to eat at the hotel restaurant. David Nielsen ordered yet again from the Special Menu and seemed to relish the Indian food.

So far we had not had a reason to call on the contents of our First Aid kit!

Tuesday 4th March

The weather conditions had been fine throughout our stay with the temperature around 28°C, with a wind coming up each afternoon. In the mornings the smog and pollution had been quite bad.

The actual shooting range was quite a large complex, housing all of the disciplines, rifle, pistol and shot gun. The shot gun section was of a reasonably high standard, with all Materelli equipment.


The main Clubhouse would have been of a very high standard when first built, but has deteriorated with time, and the garden area appeared to all be watered by hand, people with buckets of water doing that task.

The background at the shooting range consisted of some thicket-type bushes in the foreground and a magnificent 500-year old fortification to the old city behind this - the built-up walls seemed to run on for miles and it was very impressive.

We also had been assigned a young lady, Rashmi Nayar, who looked after our transport, accommodation, helped with official duties, and she met us on a daily basis to sort out any problems we may have had. For the last 50 targets in Trap our three shooter felt much more confident with the targets. The scores coming in were much higher, Ben posting a 23, David a 21 and then John shooting a 24.

After the last round it was found that John had to shoot off for the 6th position in the final (a couple of the officials were trying to work out the 6 on a countback system so a bit of quick talking with the Indian Officials, the Italian Coach and Manager and I and we finally sorted this matter out, and finally the shoot-off got underway with John having to shoot first - this again unconventional as they would not let John see a target on each station as moved across before he shot. But to John's credit and with his experience, after only 4 targets single barrel, he won the 6th position for the Final over Titarelli of Italy.

After a considerable break we all moved to the next ground for the Final and this proved to be a long drawn-out process as there were dozens and dozens of broken targets coming out. At the end of the Final, John once again had to shoot off, single barrel, for the 5th and 6th position. John's name was drawn out first again and by this time they had finally worked out that he was able to "see a target" on each

station as he moved across, but it was all over after only three shots and John was victorious over an Indian shooter.

Australia's placings were then 5th John, 6th to Ben and 9th to David, and we won the Bronze Medal in the Team Shoot. Presentations were held shortly after, with many dignitaries in attendance.

Our shooters did not finish as high as we would have liked, but given the hardness of the targets, I believe we should all be very proud of their performances as they were a credit to Australia.

John, David and Ben were flying out that night at 9.30pm, so it was back to the hotel for packing and showers before they were driven back to the airport, once more under Police escort.

Wednesday 5th March

Skeet shooting commenced at 10.00am and David shot in squad 1, and came in happily with a 25, hitting all of his targets really well. Craig in squad 2 also posted a score of 25 and Clive, who was shooting in squad 4, dropped four targets and really put the pressure on himself.

When the first day's rounds had been completed, Craig had a score of 73, David was on 70 and Clive on 67. Both David and Craig were feeling pretty confident and Clive wondered just what he had done wrong.

As it was still reasonably early when we had finished at the shooting range we decided to get a taxi cab once more to get some last-minute photographs of New Delhi, and we ordered a taxi with a driver who could speak English so we could get him to stop if we found something interesting.

Driving in the city just on dusk we passed a chap riding on an elephant down the main street, so we got the taxi driver to stop so we could take some photographs. To our surprise he also got the elephant rider to stop, the rider then instructed his elephant to kneel down and he motioned for one of us to get up on the elephant's back (for a small fee of course), so we hurriedly elected David to be IT and up he went, thinking that the elephant's owner would be getting up with him, but when the handler then got the elephant to stand up, poor David atop of the elephant looked less than impressed and the elephant made a few disapproving noises as well! The rest of us madly snapped photographs while killing ourselves with laughter, for we could just visualise David and the elephant stampeding through the traffic on the main street of New Delhi. After a good laugh and scenic drive of the town by night, we headed back for an early night, all feeling confident for the next day's competition.

Thursday 6th March

The final day. Clive shot in the 1st squad and came in with a 23, a much happier person. David in squad 3 shot another 25, and Craig in squad 4 came in with a 24.

By this time I don't know who was more excited, the boys or me, with me rushing from one ground to another trying to give them all moral support.


The 2nd round saw Clive shoot another 23, David a 24 and Craig a 23.

This put Craig equal 2nd and David had to shoot off with three others for the last three positions.

This was a breathtaking shoot-off as all shooters dropped a target and they had to start all over again, and when shooting doubles from stations 3, 4 and 5, this is really high pressure shooting. The final three were decided, with David making the final 6, and I was really happy to see two Australians in there, along with three from Kuwait and one from Qatar.

The final was a real nail-biting affair, with all shooters dropping a target except for Craig, who seemed to be as confident as I have ever seen, just smoking his targets as he went. At the end of the final, Gold went to Craig with a magnificent 25 over the World Champion from Kuwait, with Qatar coming in 3rd place. Our Team also won Silver, and I didn't know whether to laugh or cry on seeing the joy in Craig's face when he realised that he had just won the Gold medal. The media immediately mobbed him and some 3/4 of an hour later David hoisted Craig above his shoulders (a role he initiated in last year's Olympics) for a photograph. We then packed up the guns and then Craig and I set off for the drug testing room (Craig won in here as well - the only one to achieve his goal at the first try).

Presentation was again a spectacular affair, but more so with Green and Gold winning the individual and Green and Gold taking out the Silver medal in the Team event. A really great achievement by our Skeet shooters, the scores

were world class and so were the shooters.

After saying goodbye to our hostess Rashmi and exchanging gifts, we all went back to my room where we finished packing, showered and changed as we were leaving at 9.00pm to get to the airport for our 12.30am flight out.

We needed every bit of this time as the airport was packed with people who were flying out, and we were extremely lucky that we received VIP treatment with ticketing, Customs and Immigration, thanks to the first-class organisation by Ansett and the Indian Shooting Federation.

Friday 7th March

The plane was delayed in taking off and was full when it did, making for an uncomfortable 5 1/2 hour flight back to Hong Kong where we had a 12 hour stopover. After what seemed to be a dozen times of packing and unpacking guns at the Hong Kong airport, we finally headed downtown to a hotel room that we had booked for the day.

The room, including the bathroom, would not have been any bigger than 12' by 8', with two beds, and by the time the four of us got in there, there was not much room for anything else, so off shopping we went, with David and Craig leading the way to all of the expensive watch and jewellery shops.

After a couple of hours of this I left the boys and went back to the hotel for a short nap before they returned.

Sitting upstairs in the Ansett Jumbo on the way home, we received a royal treatment and it was like being in a Five-Star hotel. The service supplied by Ansett to Hong Kong and return is great.

Upon our arrival back in Sydney, and after going through Immigration and collecting our luggage, we found David's suitcase had gone missing, as was the esky full of drug samples that I was carrying back for the Indian Shooting Federation for testing in Australia. Finally the samples turned up but by this time we had all to go our separate ways to catch connecting flights to Melbourne and Adelaide.

This ended for me a most rewarding and memorable trip to the Indian continent, and our shooters representing the A.S.A. and the A.C.T.A., I feel, did us proud!

Never Too Old to Shoot


This is the story of Alan Brown, a most remarkable member of the West Australian Gun Club.

Alan joined the West Australian Gun Club in 1986 when he was 74 years old, an age when few people would venture into a new sport. Alan took up his new sport with the enthusiasm of a youngster. Four days every week that the Club was open, you would find Alan at the traps trying desperately to develop the skills to succeed. People who helped him found that he was eager and very quick to learn.

Alan recalls that people in the Club were very helpful. He is particularly grateful to Lex Shipp, State Manager of Winchester Australia, for helping him in his early days with trap shooting, and to Clive Shepherd who helped him with skeet.

Alan practiced diligently at both trap and skeet and his shooting improved rapidly. He won his first trophy, the Captain's trophy for the most improved shooter, in September 1986, only a few weeks after he started shooting.

By early next year Alan was shooting very creditable scores, and he started travelling to open shoots as far away as Kalgoorlie and Esperance. In May 1987 Alan



went to Kalgoorlie Eastern Goldfields Annual Shoot and shot 94 in a 100 target double barrel event. He won the C Grade and was promoted to A Grade.

He shot his first 50 straight in trap, and has since repeated this many times. Alan was also progressing in skeet, and was shooting good scores. He won many club events in both trap and skeet. Here are some of the highlights of his shooting career:

Qualified for the 1992 Australian Veterans Team

*Shot 50 straight in skeet in the World Firefighters Games at Perth in 1994 at the age of 82

*Won four gold, two silver and one bronze medal in the World Firefighters Games at Perth

Alan Brown's greatest achievement came in 1995, when at the grand old age of 83 he shot 100 straight in trap. And what a beautiful 100 it was! Every target shot with precision and near perfect timing.

Alan has been an excellent club man, and has been a generous financial supporter of the Club. A nurseryman by profession, he arranged the planting of a bed of annuals over the 50-metre length of the club house. Several times each year the plants would be replaced so that they provided a year-round feast of colour. He continued this service for several years. In recognition of his services to the Club, Alan was presented with the Club Man of the Year Award in 1994.

In the short time that Alan has been shooting, he has used many fine guns and is presently shooting a Perazzi trap gun fitted with special Kemen barrels, and a Perazzi SO3 for skeet. He passed on some of his guns, including a Beretta SO5 and a high-grade Perazzi, to his grandson Mark McDonald, who started shooting at the same time as Alan, and is now making his own mark in trap shooting.

Alan really enjoys shooting and the company of people in the sport. He has made many friends and is very popular at the West Australian Gun Club. He often says that he regrets not taking up shooting as a young man. One can only wonder what he could have achieved if he had started shooting in his twenties.

He is now almost 85 years of age and still shooing regularly. He is slightly apologetic that he now shoots only three times a week! A typical outing would be 25 skeet and 50 trap. He frequently shoots 24 or 25 in skeet and 48 or 49 in trap.

Alan believes that his ability to shoot successfully at his age is due to a fitness routine that he has followed for most of his life. His present routine consists of swimming every day in an indoor heated pool.

Alan Brown has made an important contribution to clay target shooting by demonstrating that you can successfully start shooting late in life, and can shoot good scores well into your eighties. His performance should be an inspiration to older shooters throughout Australia.

Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" Brisbane Gun Club, 17th-23rd March 1997

Visitors from America, Japan, New Zealand and throughout Australia were amongst the field of in excess of 100 I.S.U. shooters who contested the badge matches in Double Trap, Olympic Trap and I.S.U. Skeet, the "Southern Cross Classic" competitions in trap and skeet, and the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" events in all three disciplines.



In all cases, the scores recorded to win the "Grand Prix" events were in excess of those recorded to win the National titles in Adelaide in 1996, a good indication that Brisbane's facilities and ideal weather conditions bring out the best in competitors to ensure a good competition.



Double Trap Badge Match





Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" Double Trap







Southern Cross Classic Olympic Trap

The commencement of the first major Olympic Trap competition saw a doubling in competitor numbers with the event wide open and sure to be hotly contested.

Round 1 and clean 25s were hard to come by. Dexter Barnes of Melbourne and Craig Bentley of South Australia were the first two to appear, followed closely by Dick Bennett (Majura Park ACT) and Jar Smaniotto (Cairns) who was shooting very consistently. The "Blue Ribbon" event of the competition and, as with the skeet, the field had swelled with the inclusion of 11 Japanese shooters and quite a few locals and others who had not been able to make it for the entire competition.

125 targets and final to go and the scene was set for another tight two days shooting. The previous event's top performers started where they left off the day before, with Brant Woodward, Jar Smaniotto, Derek Bruce, Bob Simpson, Dexter Barnes and Deserie Wakefield all recording 25/25, as did Robin Loy of Warwick and Brisbane member Jim Kennedy who must have thought he had finally found the answer with his new Beretta.




Bevan donated back to the Club his winnings of the day, a very fine gesture.



Another well thought-out measure is the construction of the target storage shed - incorporating the dividing skeet wall on one layout.

A very good safety measure has been put in place with the trap houses - the lid lifts up from the back, allowing entry from the back, rather than into the front of the trap. Each trap layout has the power source from behind the 25 metre mark, so leads are not dragged from the trap house backwards.

The Club Rooms are very spacious - glass sliding doors across the front open completely to access the verandah that runs the full length of the building. The beautifully polished timber floors and exposed timber ceilings add to the presentation of the building. Internal toilet facilities are easily accessed from outside the building via the rear landing.

The Committee have managed to obtain a photograph of every President, and these are positioned, along with the Presidents' Honour Board, along one wall. There is a very attractive locked glass front trophy cabinet holding some very old and precious memorabilia in the form of Cups, Shields, photographs and items dating back to when the Club reformed after the war. Saturday morning commenced with 25 target double barrel sweepstakes and 210 shooters were on hand - and 69 possibles was the end result!

Event 2 was the 50 target double barrel Miroku Challenge - the winner to have the gun fitted and worked free of charge by Kevin Wright and Ian McGeoch. What a shoot-off with 51 possibles, there were plenty of eyes on the overall winner's trophy. When the shoot-off got down to two squads - off they went to trap 6 to stay until they had a result. 


The final event and Championship, and again to date no shooter has won back to back championships. The Double Rise to sort out the high guns and the two Target Championship.

Rod Middleton

On New Year's Day the members of Ballandean, Warwick, Texas Clay Target Clubs and also throughout South-east Queensland and northern New South Wales were saddened to hear of the passing of Rod Middleton.

Here is a tribute compiled by long-time friend and fellow clay target shooter Kevin Lee on behalf of the above-mentioned Clubs.

I first met Rod as a clay target shooter in about 1951-1952. We have been very good friends ever since.

Rod was one of the most consistent shots I have known. He was a very deliberate shot, with a natural and easy style. E won many, many championships including Commonwealth, State, Zone and Club Championships. He also won many cash handicaps. I can remember Rod shooting off 25 yards. He made the Australian Team twice (Macintosh Shield), he also had a break of over 300 straight.

I think the highlight of Rod's shooting career was winning the Commonwealth Single Barrel Championship with a score of 156/156. To shoot 156 targets with a single barrel in the late 50's or early 60's was unheard of. It may not seem such a big break compared to some of the scores nowadays, but in the 50's and 60's targets were harder to break, traps were irregular and threw wider angles and cartridges were not as good, so it was a fantastic effort to shoot 156 single barrel.

Rod always said clay target shooting was a gentleman's sport, and that was the way he treated the sport of clay target shooting. Rod Middleton never challenged a referee's decision, nor did he ever come to a shooting ground unless he was wearing a tie.

So in closing I would like to say to the Middleton family, you can be very proud of Rod's achievements as a clay target shooter, and you can also be proud of Rod because he was a Gentleman's Gentleman. Rod also served and fought for his country during World War II.
