### National President's Notes

#### FIREARMS LAWS

Unfortunately there are still many differences between States as far as the so called National Firearms Laws are concerned.

One rumour that is circulating many areas is the story of a shooter (clay target) travelling from a shoot in New South Wales and being intercepted by Police and asked to open the boot of his car. On opening the boot, the Police Officers find that he is carrying both ammunition and a shotgun together. The story further alleges that the shooter is charged with transporting ammunition and firearms together, which is an offence under the new laws in New South Wales.

The most popular area in which this alleged incident took place is either Hay or Deniliquin, and that it involved a Victorian shooter, who was either a member of the ACTA or Field and Game.

A check of the New South Wales Act, and inquiries with New South Wales Police indicated that there is an offence for, "Any person who is engaged in the business of transporting goods carrying cargo that contains both a firearm and ammunition."

There is a similar provision in the Tasmanian, Australian Capital Territory and South Australian Firearms Acts. I have not as yet seen either Western Australia or Northern Territory Acts.

It does not apply to people travelling to and from shoots.

When I have copies all States new Firearms Acts I will endeavour to highlight any requirements impacting on us as clay target shooters.

#### NATHAN SUPERB. RUSSELL SUPER!

Nathan Cassells shot superbly in Peru to win the World Junior Trap title, shooting a score that would have won him the Gold in the Open section.

Russell also shot brilliantly to equal the World Record in Double Trap and also to win Gold.

Deserie Wakefield-Baynes, again proved she is one of the best in the World by taking out the Bronze medal in the Womens Trap.

To add to our medal haul we won Gold in the Junior Trap team. Silver in the Junior Double Trap team and also in the Open Double Trap team.

Our Open Trap team picked up the bronze. Our final medal tally was three Gold, two Silver and two Bronze medals.

An outstanding effort by all our shooters despite a number being affected by a virus.

All our representatives in skeet, trap and double trap are to be congratulated on their achievements which have placed Australia right at the top.

With Sydney now less than three years away, everything points to a great Olympics for us.

#### WE ARE ON THE MOVE

After discussion with the Wagga Wagga City Council the National Executive have moved to relocate the National Office to that City and establish a National Ground there. The move will take place hopefully over the next two years.

The Council has generously donated a block of land on which the Office will be constructed. It is planned that the office will include a conference room and a memorabilia/hall of fame room. In addition to it becoming the National Ground, it will be established as the National Training facility catering for all our disciplines.

Even though it is to be our National Ground and Headquarters, it

is envisaged that some National Carnivals from time to time will be allocated to other venues to benefit all our States and shooters. An example of this policy would be West Australia being allocated the Nationals on a reasonable basis.

The establishment of OUR National facility is exciting and everyone will benefit greatly.

#### SHOT SIZE

There still seems to be a misunderstanding as to when 32g (1 1/8oz) cartridges may be used. The only events 32g cartridges may be used are handicaps and sporting clays. A handicap event is where shooters shoot from their official handicap marks only. It does not include grouped meterage events and events commonly known as 'off the box' or 'off the fence' and 'Annie Oakley's'.

#### 1999 WORLD DTL CHAMPIONSHIP AND GRAND AMERICAN

As I have mentioned previously in this column, it is our intention to arrange a group tour to the 1999 Centenary Grand American. It has been suggested that perhaps the tour could also include the 1999 World DTL to be held in either Wales or Ireland. The added expense of such a tour would be minimal. As soon as we have the dates of the World DTL, we will explore the possibility of such a tour.

#### WELCOME AND THANK YOU

As at the end of 1997 the ACTA recorded a massive increase in Membership of 45% finishing the year with 12,882 members. Queensland had the biggest increase by doubling their numbers to 3258.

I would like to welcome all new shooters to the ACTA and trust they will enjoy the camaraderie of clay target shooting. My thanks also to all the older members and we look forward to your continued support as we strive to the new millennium.


## 1997 World Shotgun Championskips

Lima, Peru November Stir-Joti

The plan for this trip was to split the team into three groups, with staggered departure dates to minimise the time before each discipline had to compete. With the experience of the '95 & '96 World Cup teams to Peru and their food poisoning problems, it was decided that the less time in the country would also minimise the risk of upset stomachs ruining the preparation. To enable everyone to recover from jet lag etc., each group was to spend a couple of days in Miami, which has the same time zone as Peru, then take the relatively short trip (five hours) straight down to Lima.

The seven trap shooters departed on the 4th of November accompanied by Bill Murray and Greg Chan. After a twelve & a half hour flight to Los Angeles, a seven hour stop over and another five and a half hour flight, we finally landed in Miami, totally exhausted.

A couple of days of catching up on sleep, visiting the shops and a trip to the Everglades had everyone primed for Peru. The Double Trap Team had arrived the day we left Miami.

We arrived in Lima at 5.30am, and after clearing customs had a thirty minute ride to the Sheraton Hotel. On the trip we noticed that most of the houses didn't have roofs, and we were told that they

weren't really needed as it hasn't rained in Lima for 60 years.

After settling in at the hotel and about inquiring shooter registrations we were told that the double trap practice day had cancelled and that the skeet would be that contested day earlier. Great when your skeet shooters aren't arriving until official practice day! We found out that some of the teams had been notified and some had not. A technical meeting was called where we formally protested and after negotiating, reasonable settlement was reached. It still change back ised.







## 1997 OD NATIONALS

1997 saw the Nationals for the Olympic Disciplines held at Brisbane Gun Club from October 11 to October 19 1997. With the inclusion of Women in the Olympics in Trap and Skeet we saw renewed interest amongst our female competitors who now have a chance to compete at three events at the Olympics in Sydney 2000.

As the UIT had not advised us of the conditions of conducting these new events until the week before the event, the women participating at the nationals shot 125 targets plus final in both trap and skeet as against the UIT advice of 75t plus 25t final.

With competitors from New Zealand in attendance, this strong field saw three Olympians take the first three places in Trap event. Michael Diamond 123 plus 25, Russell Mark 121 plus 25 and John Maxwell 120 plus 24 were overall first second and third respectively. Dianne Reeves from Normanton, venue for the 1998 Queensland State UIT titles, won the Womens event with 109 plus 24 from Deserie Wakefield-Deserie Baynes 112 plus 21


George Barton was also successful in winning the Juniors section 117 plus 22 with Kris Jones from Wakehurst taking second 105 plus 24



Ladies Trap Champion and High Gun winner Deserie Wakefield-Baynes with John Maxwell representing Peter and Barabara Quire.





## Twenty years at Singleton 1977-1997

It was a hot Christmas shoot in 1977. "It doesn't rain here" stated club founder, Kevin 'Ringo' Ringland.

Suddenly an inch of rain fell in half an hour and Ringo, the other club founders and families, along with visitors, were all huddled under a sheet of brattice.

"We can't have this," Ringo said "We'll build a clubhouse!"

Like many clubs, Singleton was one of humble beginnings. Shooting started when 1000 clays and a hand trap were detonated by respected founder Kevin Ringland.



The club now boasts a functional kitchen, showers, septic toilets and powered campsites.


The little hand trap soon became overworked and unable to throw the number of targets required. Two Damo Traps were purchased followed by a third as backup where Morriset Club closed. It seemed that three traps were essential, one was in town being repaired all the time while the other two were in use at the club. The Damo traps have worn out and the club now uses two Kerang Ibis hopper fed traps.

Some fifteen years ago, Singleton ventured into Simulated Field Shooting. Prominent club member at that time, Jack Barker, initiated field shooting. Jack built the required number of hand traps, at his own expense. Jack later produced a set of traps which the club purchased.

Most recently, with the generous help of current club members, the field layout has been extended to a fifty target course.

The field shoots are now some of the most popular of weekends, amongst local and visiting shooters.

## Eulogy

#### Angello Zappala 1/3/1948 - 19/11/1997

Angello Zappala was born 1st March 1948 the only son of Giuseppe & Sarina Zappala. His dad on seeing him for the first time said he looked like an angel, hence he was named Angello.

As a child he was raised in Giru on a sugar farm near the Haughton River.

His primary school days were at St. Josephs School, Giru. When his parents bought their first farm McDesme Ayre, Angello then attended the McDesme State School.

Angello was his dads right hand man helping him on the property. At the age of 21 Angello bought his first car, the green Monaro, which was his pride and joy until the day he took ill.

As a teenager Angello in his spare time took to filing guns as a hobby, the hobby became an obsession, he then did an American correspondence course, and received a diploma in gunsmithing. Many of you here would know that if he could not get parts, he would make them, in order to fix your firearm.

He had a great passion for sport achieving high levels in squash and tennis. An excellent pistol shot, he then took up clay target shooting and soon attained the maximum handicap of 25 metres. He represented his club, zone and state at DTL. He was a natural skeet and tower shot also, along with being a tireless worker for the Burdekin Gun Club and a Past President.

His real love was for the discipline of Olympic Trap and he was a member of the Queensland Open Team for eleven years straight. We travelled to National titles in Melbourne, Adelaide, Perth, Darwin and Brisbane to compete.

He was a member of the Arafura team on all four occasions 1991, 1993, 1995 & 1997, representing Australia above the Tropic of Capricorn against the Asia Pacific Nations and in that team won three out of four gold.

More recently he went to the New Zealand Nationals at Auckland; he has many friends in N.Z. He then went on to Tokyo, Japan for the Pan Pacific Friendship Shooting Games. He took great pleasure in making friends with new people from all parts of the world. His friendship with Ray Shryn Chan of Hong Kong began through the Pan Pacific Friendship shoot, who then commissioned him to coach them in Hong Kong, to which he accomplished himself well and was to go again in January 1998.

It was common place to hear at club, state, national or international meets, to hear the cry "Where's Angello?", whenever someone had a gun malfunction and he fixed hundreds of guns, with his funny little port full of parts & tools that used to get us in trouble at most airports. He would take it as hand luggage through the X-ray machines, saying it was his lunch box, because he didn't want it pinched like his Perazzi when at Adelaide Airport.

He would take no payment for this work. If Angello had a fault, it was that he was too generous to his friends.

He was looking forward to receiving his Level 3 Coaching Diploma to be awarded at the AIS this week, and to see his many friends from Hong Kong, NZ, Taiwan, Japan, Singapore and Korea at Illawarra for the Pan Pacifics this weekend.

Well known locally, he will be sadly missed, it will not be the same at the shoots, not hearing the last minute arrival of the old V8 Monaro Green Machine come rumbling in and someone making the comment "Zappa's here".

Good bye my friend.

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1.In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

 $2. \mbox{Squads}$  of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps.

3. While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office whose decision shall be final.

4.Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET shall be incurred.

 $5. Shooters \ who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be resquadded towards the end of the event.$ 

6.Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

7.All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.

8.Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Fâilure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.

9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility shall be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scores are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.

10.Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.

11.All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

12.All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

13.Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location of the area accepting shooting event nominations.

14.Options sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

15. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

16.Any competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Ladies, Junior or Veterans section. ie: A woman paying nominations (OL) shoots 50/50 to win the Ladies Championship, is entitled to contest the Open Overall/Grade placings.

Note: A junior female must decide which section she is to enter, (junior or ladies), she is not eligible for both.

17.A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies/and or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.

18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am.

19. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.

20.Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.

21.An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

22.All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.


#### Boggabri Gunnedah Gun Club Gum Tree 97







The Executive Committee of the Australian Clay Target Association are pleased to announce the awarding of Life Membership of our Association to Mr Robert Buchan of the Melbourne Gun Club.

The following is an extract of his nomination by Melbourne Gun Club.

"The Committee of the Melbourne Gun Club hereby nominate Mr Robert Buchan for honorary Life Membership of the Australian Clay Target Association.

The reasons behind this nomination result from the outstanding contribution he has made to the sport and the tireless effort he has put into the everyday administration.

Bob first became involved in shooting both as a competitor and administrator more than 40 years ago with involvement at the Croydon Clay Target Club of which he was President for 3 years.



He always had visions of making a gun club where all forms of Clay Target Shooting could be in the one area.

A building development of the ground at Lilydale soon eventuated into one of the biggest shooting complexes within the A.C.T.A. It became apparent that the amalgamation was going to be a great success and they adopted the name of the Melbourne Gun Club.

When Australia made a successful application to conduct the 1973 World I.S.U. Championships,

Western Australia and Tasmania to a lesser extent could not fulfil the requirements an the financial burden of this event.

When it was first taken to Bob (who was President of the M.G.C.) he approached his committee for their support in meeting the challenge that was before them. It was his doginess and loyalty for shooting to progress that they accepted his request. The financial burden was enormous despite a small grant made by the State and Federal Governments for administration of the World Moving Championships.

At first the cost seemed beyond the M.G.C. but Bob, along with Rupert Henwood and Dr Graham Carroll went guarantors to the sum of \$60,000 (a fortune in those times). It was a credit to the M.G.C. and its members that they got behind Bob and the program. The end result was an outstanding success for Australia.

Without the drive and dedication of Bob Buchan this event would not have been achieved (a fact forgotten recently by the A.C.T.A. in its celebration of success in Atlanta).

Bob was the foundation President of the Victorian State Association which had many knockers when being formed but his determination drove him to make it succeed.

The U.I.T. had bestowed to him one of its highest awards ever given to an individual for his efforts.

He has also been the recipient of the Presidential Medal of the A.C.T.A.

He has served on the State Council since its inauguration and is in fact the only foundation member still on the State Council.

Bob has also served as National Executive member for many years. He has managed teams to Thailand and was also Chairman of the ISU Committee.

The Commonwealth Games in Brisbane had the benefit of his knowledge in the organisation of the Trench competition in 1982.

On leaving the Executive of the ACTA it did not deter him from being an active if not outspoken member of the Association.

Those who know him may admire or dislike him, but there is no issue that he will back away from.

Any State or National Championships that are held in Victoria are fortunate to have him at the forefront in work and donation of trophies. He has been responsible for the largest Nationals ever conducted at the M.C.G. There would be no other grounds prepared and presented to the Association both State and National as the Melbourne Gun Club.

As we know he is not frightened to praise or air his disapproval of actions taken by either Association if he thinks it is to the benefit of shooting.

He is a credited referee, rules supervisor and has served on the Firearms Consulting Committee attached to the Victoria Police.

He has been President of the Melbourne Gun Club since the amalgamation some 30 years ago and to this day runs a club that is a credit to the A.C.T.A and all as the result of the effort put in under his presidency.



I believe that combining the Trap and Skeet Nationals would be a mistake and the proof can be seen just by looking at the New Zealand model. Once again I subscribe to a simple business regime. Give your customers what they want, not what you think they want.




