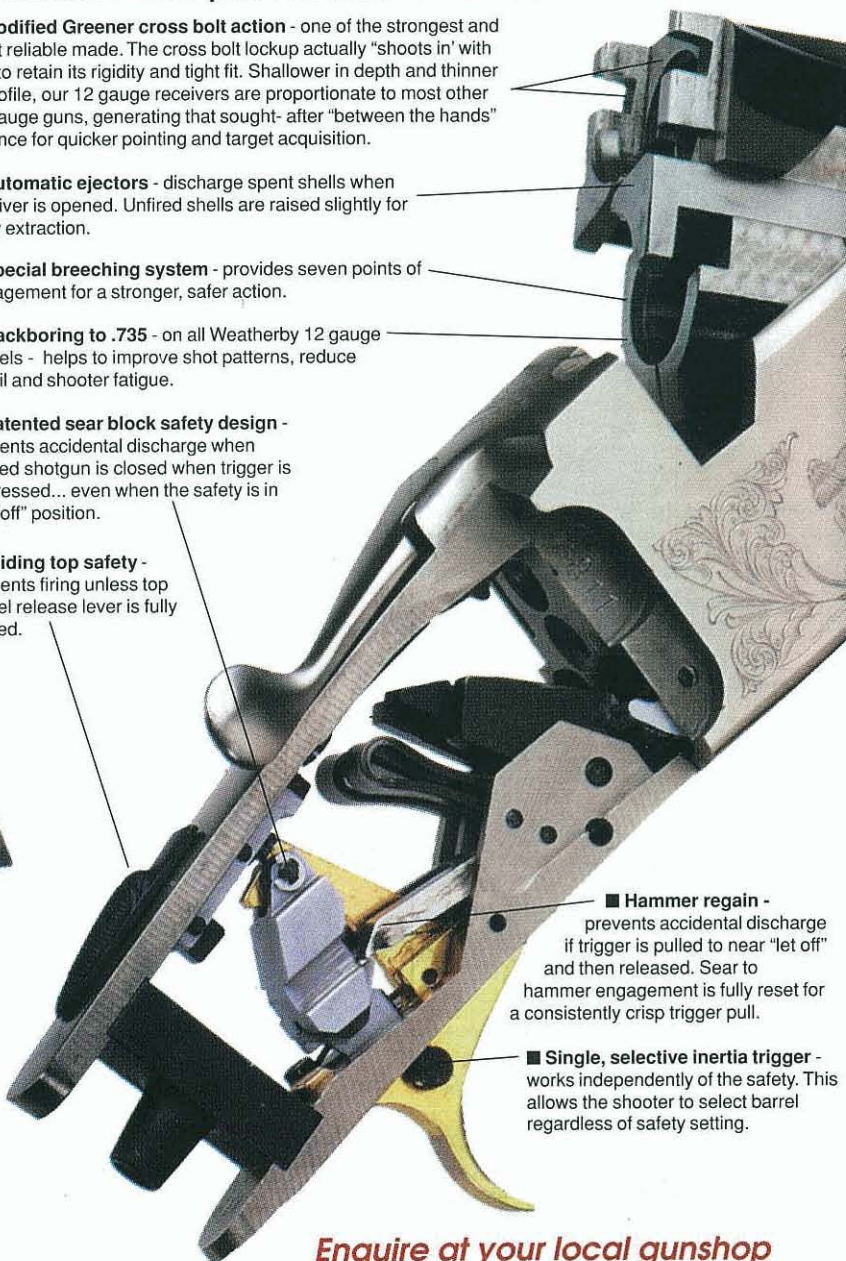

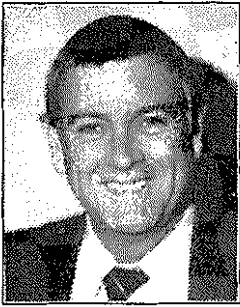

NOVICE TEAM SHOOT

Sunday February 22nd was the day circled on the calendar of many once a year Clay Target Shooters in the district. The day saw typical tropical summer weather, very hot and humid but the huge fig trees provided a sanctuary from the heat between rounds.

This was the sixth time the club has run this event and we had a roll up of one hundred and five shooters in attendance. This is the largest number of shooters seen at the club in almost twenty years.

A team event over thirty targets was the main event contested on the day. The ability of shooters ranging from several AA graders to first time novices. Twenty one teams of various combinations of ability took place to the tracks at 9.30am. An address on safety, shooting etiquette and rules by club president Glen Rea had preceded the first shots of the day. Experienced members were also in charge of the various layouts during the day.

A unique handicapping system is used to attempt to even up the competition and once again it seemed to work quite well. The winning team with a score of 243/250 consisted of local pistol club members and judging by all the smiles they were ecstatic about taking the major trophies off the clay target shooters. The team called Racegunners consisted of Glen Camer, Bruce Paine, Juan Escrava, Jim Bortolozzo and Anthony Scodellaro have competed for several years.

Just two points behind were a team made up of shooters who had turned up on the day and didn't have a team. The leftovers as they decided to call themselves were Ian Becke, Alf Musumeci, Max Musumeci, Dee Colls and John Byers. A score of 233/250 was good enough to get the Groper Creek Team third place. This team consisting of Laurence Falco, Tony LaSpina, Lui Populin, Joe Scalia and Lenny Catanzaro have been regulars in all six novice shoots. A further six teams received trophies thanks to the sponsorship of prominent local business the John Dwyer Group.

Individual trophies were awarded to members and novices on their off the gun scores. The winner of the novice section was Greg Milburn 48/50 from Jason Todeshino 47/50 and Glen Camer 44/50 in third place. The members saw club president Glen Rea score a win with a score of 99/101 from Max Nicolaidis 98/101 and Bruce McBow 85/86. The ladies saw a win for new mother Helen Becke 41/50 from Annette Vassalini and M. Russell 27/50 who shared second. The Junior trophy was hotly contested with first going to Luke Milburn 41/50 from Boz Kovacich 40/50 and Steve Marino 38/50.

One complicating factor which was introduced this year was an occasional blue target which virtually disappear once they reach the horizon. The day once again seemed to go off without any major hitches. After a long day, which saw quite a few new shooters introduced to our sport, the traps were closed and quite a few hard luck/tall stories were being told in the clubhouse. Most in attendance vowing to return next year to once again try to hit those elusive targets.

Records tumble at 1998 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix"

Following several months of planning and preparation for the 1998 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" which was held at Brisbane Gun Club between the 14th - 21st February, the event has again been hailed as a great success during which many outstanding performances cemented the competition as Australia's best international competition, and Brisbane Gun Club grounds as amongst the best Olympic Discipline grounds anywhere.

Nearly 130 competitors from throughout Australia as well as Great Britain, USA, Europe and Asia took part in the eight day competition which produced performances far in excess of some world records.

Amongst the outstanding performances during the competition was the bettering of the World Record team score by the Double Trap team of Russell Mark, Steve Haberman and Craig Tilley who recorded 428 out of a possible 450, bettering the Italian team's record of 422 by 6 targets. Also in the Double Trap event, 1995 World Champion Steve Haberman and current World Junior Trap Champion Nathan Cassells both recorded 190/200 to be only one target below American Josh Lakatos's record of 191/200 following the final.

The Ladies Olympic Trap events also saw some outstanding results recorded. In the first 75 target competition, both Lisa Smith (93/100) and Deserie Wakefield-Baynes (91/100) scored far better than the current world record of 87/100 set in Lima, Peru last year. In the second women's trap event, Deserie (96/100)

and Lisa (93/100) again rattled the records by again exceeding the world record mark.

However, not to be outdone, the finalists in the men's Olympic Trap "Grand Prix" left the best until last, recording a near combined total of 149/150 in the 'final', a score which may well be the best ever result in an Olympic Trap final. This outstanding performance was a fitting finale to what has again cemented Brisbane Gun Club's position as the best shooting ground for Olympic Discipline competitions in Australia.

The competition, which has taken on a slightly new format this year to cater for the changes to the competition for lady shooters, commenced on time following practice on Saturday 14th February, with the first event for the Double Trap shooters - the Badge Match, which is acknowledged by all as a good competitive lead in to the competition's major championships. The Badge Match, which consisted of 30 pairs of Double Trap targets (10 pairs on each of the three trap ranges) started the competition well with Olympic Gold Medallist and current World Champion, Russell Mark, showing his intentions for the Double Trap competition by taking the overall badge.

the Southern Cross Classic event which was conducted over the international format of 150 target (75 pairs) for men and 120 targets (60 pairs) for women. Finals of 25 pair were conducted for men and juniors and 20 pairs for women.

Following the completion of the qualifying competition prior to the final, Guyra shooter Geoff Lancaster lead the competition on 140/150, only one target ahead of Michael Diamond with Craig Tilley and Russell Mark one further back on 138s. The other two positions in the final were determined following a shoot off for positions between Adam Vella, Yoshiko Kira (Japan) and Deserie Wakefield-Baynes, the ladies being successful and taking positions five and six in the final. Although the ladies and juniors have their own 'finals' in all competitions, the philosophy of the "Grand Prix" has always been that all competitors are entitled to compete for the open spoils as well as their own sectional awards.

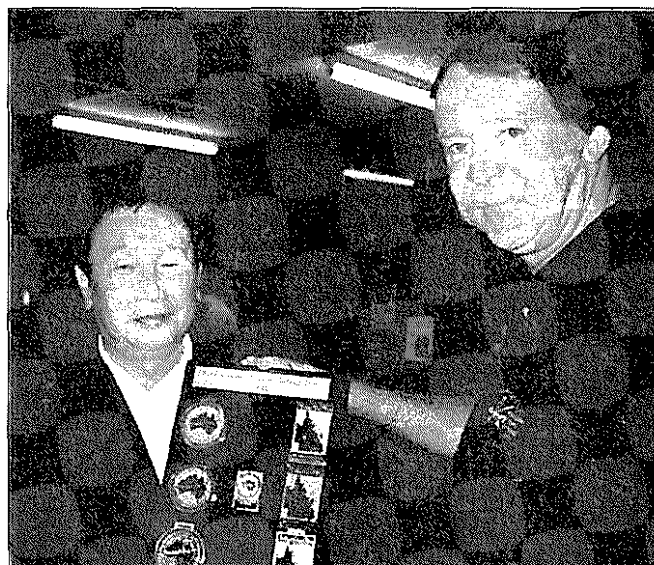

The last of three Double Trap competitions got under way on time on Monday morning with around 40 competitors entering the pairs competition. Recent times have indicated a trend for many shooters to become specialists, and again there were many shooters entered in the Double Trap who would not be staying on for the Olympic Trap program and vice-versa.

The established 'doubles specialists' Craig Tilley, Deserie Wakefield Baynes, Steve Haberman, Russell Mark, Nathan Cassells along with Geoff Mark, Daniel Di Pietro and Jar Smaniotto all started well in the 45-48 bracket, as did Yoshiko Kira of Japan who carded an early 46/50. Yoshiko is highly regarded on

the world scene and carries high hopes for Japan in the near future.

With rounds two and three completed, many 'specialists' of both the single and double events had recorded good scores. Craig Tilley of Sydney was leading qualifier into the final with an excellent score of 144/150, one target below Russell Mark's world record 145/150. Steve Haberman 143, Nathan Cassells 141, Russell Mark 141, Adam Vella 138 and Czech visitor Rudolf Strnad 136 made up the final six.

The Overall High Gun winner for the Double Trap competition for the second year in succession with a fine overall score of 337/360 was Russell Mark, Russell received the coveted President's Trophy and replica donated by Brisbane Gun Club stalwart, Dan Moffitt.

The first Badge Match of the Olympic Trap competition saw the commencement of some of the finest shooting ever witnessed in Australia. Olympic Gold Medallist and 1997 World Cup Final winner, Michael Diamond was determined to repeat his performance of winning all three events at the recent National Championships which were conducted over the same layouts late last year. Many others were in contention with Tom Turner keen to defend his 1997 'Grand Prix' win, while Russell Mark, Adam Vella, John Maxwell, John Gilopidis, Geoff Mark, Rudi Strnad (Czech Republic) and Greg Newey were all eager to be amongst the medal winners at the end of the competitions.

The Badge Match saw few surprises, Michael Diamond continued on where he left off at the Nationals to further stake his claim as the undisputed world's best Olympic Trap shooter. Michael finished with a good 73/75 to take the Overall Badge on a count back from Russell Mark and Adam Vella who finished on the same score.

The ISU Skeet Badge Match also saw few surprises with the 'in form' shooters Clive and George Barton, David Cunningham, Craig Meuleman and others showing early signs of form. The lady 'skeeties' were also going to find the battling tough. Wendy Huehn, Janine Kettels, Natasha Lonsdale and Cherie Reeves all had the ability to win during the week and who the victor would be at the end was yet to be determined.

The winners in all badge matches are determined by count back, there are no shoot offs.

And so, on to the first of the major competitions in Olympic Trap and ISU Skeet, the Southern Cross Classic events. As with all competitions, the organising committee continued their philosophy of awarding newly struck medals and badges for all of the events each year. This year's 'Grand Prix' medal featured different colouring with the emphasis on a maroon border representing the principal colour of Queensland, while the Southern Cross Classic medals took on a new green colour change. As with the earlier events, the early indication was that the big names would again dominate the Championship events in both Olympic Trap and ISU Skeet and the manner in which

some of them started the first championship proved the early thoughts to be true. After the first 75 targets of the Olympic Trap event, 1997 'Grand Prix' winner Tom Turner of Cessnock had a break on the field having shot day 1 clean to finish on 75/75. Russell Mark and Phil Grove of Darwin were two down on 73/75, while John Gilopidis, Michael Diamond, Jeff Tonna and Adam Vella were all on 72/75. The Olympic Trap was surely set for a great finish in the first championship. In both the trap and skeet events, the Southern Cross Classic event for women was conducted over the new format of 75 targets in one day for the first time. South Australia's Deserie Wakefield-Baynes and Lisa Smith were the outstanding competitors of the competition with Lisa taking the overall position following an exciting 'final'.

At the end of day one, the four target overnight lead had proved too big for the field to narrow down although George Barton recorded a mediocre 44/50 for the day to leave brother Clive (46/50) first into the 'final', with David Cunningham, Michael Wenzel, Neil Rundle and Craig Meuleman making up the six.

While the skeet event was concluding, the second day of the Olympic Trap competition was also proving to be quite a spectacle. Tom Turner couldn't add to his 25s of the first day carding 23 and 24 to go into the final in first place with a very creditable 122/125, good in any competition anywhere in the world. Russell Mark was the second qualifier with 121/125 followed by John Gilopidis 120, N. Pedula 120, M. Diamond 120 and J. Maxwell 119 making up the final six. Rudi Strnad made a late dash for the final six, shooting the last 50 straight, but missed out on a final berth by one target finishing on 118/125, not bad for someone who hasn't shot since last October because of the extreme cold weather conditions of the European winter.

After a great final, in which Russell Mark shot 25/25 and Tom Turner 24/25, the pair continued into a miss and out shoot off to determine the overall victor with Russell eventually emerging the victor. Michael Diamond recorded his customary 25/25 in the final to take overall third place.

The final events in trap and skeet, the Australasian Pacific 'Grand Prix' Championships, saw a healthy increase in numbers for the competition. The "Winchester Top Gun Club" from Japan arrived to provide for further competition amongst international visitors, while many local shooters lined up to take part in the final events.

As now was customary, the ladies competitions in both trap and skeet would be conducted over the new 75 target format with a further 50 target Badge Match planned for the last day of the competition. Again, the scores by the ladies in the Olympic Trap events were outstanding and must surely auger well for our prospects for medals in the 2000 Olympic Games. Deserie Wakefield Baynes and Lisa Smith continued their battle for female supremacy, with Deserie's form and experience helping her towards victory in the final events. In the skeet, which is still in its early days of re-establishment for women, Wendy Huehn showed the qualities which made her a member of the Australian team to the 1991 World Championships by also proving too strong in the final two competitions.

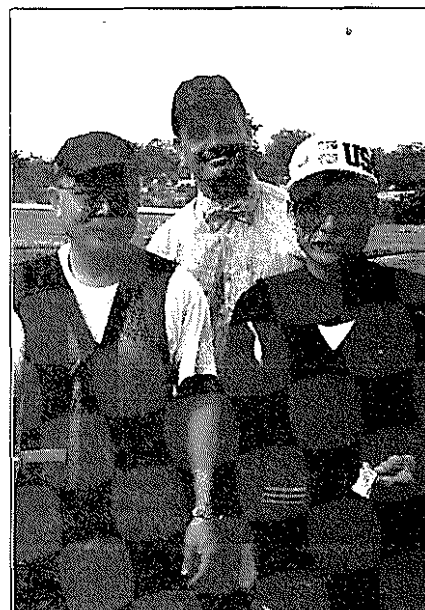

On the first day of the men's competition, the 'big guns' were set for a tough event with scores to determine the make up of the teams for the World Cups and World Championships later in the year. 25s and 24s were everywhere in the first round of both the trap and the skeet, again proving the quality of the targets thrown in Brisbane.

After the first day of the 'Grand Prix' in the Olympic Trap, Michael Diamond, Greg Newey, Adam Vella and Russell Mark were all in on 74/75, one target down for the day. Tom Turner, John Maxwell and Kevin Perkins were all finished for the day one target further behind on 73/75, ensuring a great last day of the competition.

In the skeet 'Grand Prix', the battle was continuing with only two targets separating the top six shooters after day 1. The Barton boys, Clive and George, David Cunningham, Craig Meuleman and juniors Michael Wenzel and Neil

Rundle all shot well for the day. Cunningham and George Barton shared the overnight lead on 72/75, with Cunningham adding a near perfect 49/50 on the second morning to take the pole position going into the 'final' on 121/125. Clive Barton 120, George Barton 117, Craig Meuleman 116 and junior Michael Wenzel 114 all made up the final with Bob Dower, John Summers and Neil Rundle all having to shoot off to determine the last man in to the final six.

David Cunningham was the form shooter of the day, 24 in the final and he had won his first Australasian Pacific 'Grand Prix' title on 145/150, four targets ahead of Clive Barton with George Barton one target further back finishing on 140/150.

The final day of the eight day competition proved to be the best yet and must rank as amongst the best day's of competition ever seen in Australia. As it turned out, every single target proved crucial, miss one and your position in the final may be in doubt. Michael Diamond finished in his normal strong manner carding 50/50 for the day as did Jeff Tonna. 49/50s were recorded by Greg Newey, Adam Vella, Tom Turner, John Maxwell, Kevin Perkins, Phil Grove, John Gilopidis, Nino Pedula and Jar Smaniotto.

The juniors were also performing well and as has always been the custom, 'finals' would be conducted for juniors in all the Olympic Trap and Skeet Championships. Although to conduct finals is an added expense, the 'Grand Prix' Organising Committee has always believed that the best possible competition is the primary objective of the 'Grand Prix' and the conducting of 'finals' is very good practice for the international competitions throughout the year, especially for our juniors.

So, with the event soon to be decided, the 'final' six were clear cut, Diamond in first 124/125, followed by Newey 123, Vella 123, Turner 122, Maxwell 122 and Mark 122. Kevin Perkins, who has just finished a year of ISU Skeet, and Jeff Tonna were the 'bridesmaids' finishing on 121/125 and not being able to make the final six, again confirming the quality of the competition and targets thrown at the Brisbane Gun Club.

As already reported, the 'final' in the 'Grand Prix' Olympic Trap must go down as one of the best 'finals' ever witnessed anywhere in the world and perhaps may even be an unofficial world record, six shooters shooting under extreme pressure and only one target missed, a total of 149/150 in the final.

The 1998 Australasian Pacific 'Grand Prix' Champion with a brilliant score of 149/150 was Michael Diamond, Michael was repeating his score which won him the Gold Medal at the 1996 Atlanta Olympic Games. Second and third places were still to be decided with Greg Newey and Adam Vella both finishing on 148/150, Adam finally taking the silver medal after a single barrel miss and out shoot off.

We hope to see you at the 'Grand Prix' in 1999, the year before the 2000 Olympic Games.

The AIS Sports Travel Home Page is a partnership between the Australian Sports Commission, the Australian Institute of Sport and Ansett Travel.

Designed as a "one stop shop", the new Internet address includes a Chat Page for sports fans to send personalised messages to athletes all over the world.

"With Australian Sports Teams spending more time overseas in the lead-up to the Sydney Olympics, this is a great way for fellow athletes, family and friends to stay in touch with our champions and know the message is getting through," Mr Thomson said.

Mr Thomson, a keen websurfer, sent a Herofax to the Australian Winter Olympics team in Nagano to officially launch the page and received an immediate response.

The site also features:

- *An online travel service giving access to full travel services including airline booking, transfers, accommodation, equipment transfers;

- *A sports directory with details of Australian sporting contacts;

- *A full calendar of sporting events in Australia and around the world.

In his capacity as Tourism Minister, Mr Thomson said he was

delighted to see a neat fit between tourism and a sports site providing an online travel booking service.

"The areas are becoming increasingly entwined as Australian tourism seeks to offer more diverse attractions like sport and recreation," Mr Thomson said.

The Howard Government is working through Austrade initiatives like Australia Sport International linking Australian sporting products and service to clients all around the world.

Mr Stefaniak said the Carnell ACT Government was committed to helping make Canberra a centre of excellence for sport and technology so the launch of the web page in the National Capital was fitting.

"Technology has the capacity to bring together athletes, their families and coaches, enable sports people over the world all to communicate and make international travel far more accessible," Mr Stefaniak said.

"The AIS Travel Web Site does all this."

AIS Director John Boulton said the web site complemented the AIS' commitment to providing athletes with international experience.

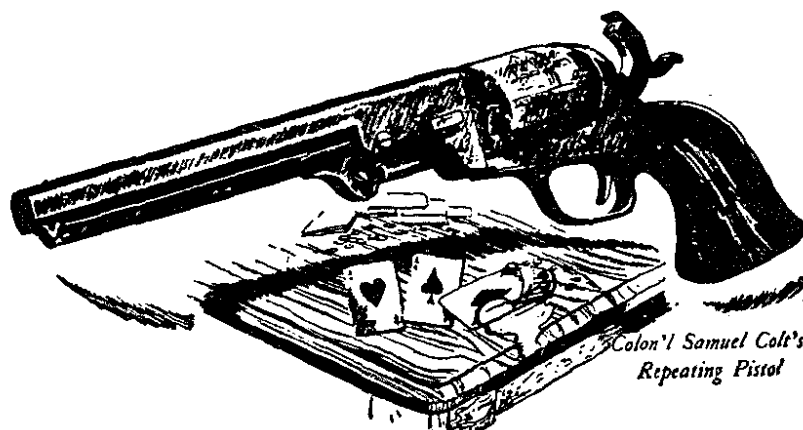
"The Institute's role is to develop Australian talent to compete with the best in the world, and that requires our athletes and teams to go out onto the world stage," Mr Boulton said.

Famous Clubs Amalgamate

The Blackburn Club held its eighth Annual Meeting at Scott's Hotel, Melbourne on Tuesday, August 24. The meeting was well attended and several important matters were finalised. Chief among these was the approval of amalgamation with the Nobel Clay Target Club. The latter Club—the mother of all clay pigeon shooting clubs in Australia—has been in recess since the early months of the recent war period.

Its former ground was taken over for housing and efforts to secure another venue proved abortive. The committees of the two clubs, through appointed delegates, then entered into negotiations with the view to joining forces. The committees of both clubs approached the subject in true sporting spirit, hence any minor details or slight differences of opinion, ironed out with the minimum of delay. The culmination of negotiations was arrived at during the annual meeting when (Nobel members had already approved) the Blackburn members unanimously agreed to the proposition.

The new name of the club caused a fair amount of discussion. The ultimate decision was to name the new organisation "The Australian Clay Target Club" (Incorporating Blackburn and Nobel Clay Target Clubs).

The club will continue to shoot as one entity on the East Burwood three trap shooting ground. Dave Watson did such a good job in his first year as President of the Blackburn Club that the combined members would not hear of his retirement from the chair in the new club's first season. He was deeply appreciative of the confidence shown in him.

Lead and why it's Necessary

By E. G. BIGGS

First all we must realise the pattern of the shot-gun or rather the effective pattern is not as great as many imagine. Some think that all that is necessary is to point the gun at a target and half the paddock is sprayed with shot. This, of course, is not correct—as we clay busters know only too well. The pattern of the modern shot-gun at 40 yards range is approximately 30" (that is effective pattern) so this circle of shot is not enough to compensate for the speed of fast moving birds, therefore we have to work out ways and means of overcoming the speed of the bird. So we introduce the important word lead and must always remember to put it into practice whenever we shoot at fast moving targets. In fact, in my opinion the two most important things to remember are "lead and timing."

Before proceeding further I would like to mention a word of advice to all new shooters. That is never hesitate to ask the advice of an expert on anything you cannot quite understand. In fact, I feel that all gun clubs should appoint two or three of the best shots as coaches. The new shooter is anxious to break a few clays and if he cannot progress his interest lapses. There are in practice three methods of shooting fast moving targets. One is the snap shot (not a good one). The pointing and lead and the swing past lead. The latter is the one I favour. This method I consider the best and fastest shooting. My effort to explain how I figure the set up may seem a little complicated.

First of all let the shooter get some idea of speed and distance. Take as example, a black duck flying at 70 miles per hour or 100 feet per second. Common sense tells us that if we shoot straight at this target the shot will fall well behind the bird. So we have to find a way to overcome the time lag that crops up—that is the time it takes to catch the target with the gun after having first seen

it. Tests carried out with an electric timer indicate that the time elapsing between the deciding of a shot and the pull of the trigger is about one fifth of a second. This lapse between the eye seeing the bird, the message from the brain to finger is common to all and cannot be assisted. So we see that a bird travelling at 100 feet per second and the reaction time is one fifth of a second which means that the bird has travelled 20 feet while the finger was waiting for the order from the brain to pull the trigger and the actual accomplishment of doing so. Further to this we have to figure out the distance the bird has travelled while the shot has been travelling from gun to bird. This takes approximately one fifteenth of a second to 20 yards range—during this fraction of the second the target has moved another 6 or 7 feet. Therefore, if we point the gun straight at the bird travelling 100 feet per second and pull the trigger the shot would be 27 feet behind the target. We see plainly why the shooter must lead every object that is shot at, if it moves at all.

The Association

Affiliated clubs are reminded again that the 12th Annual Meeting of affiliated club delegates will be held at Scott's Hotel, Melbourne, on Wednesday, November 3. In accordance with the Association's Constitutional Rules every affiliated member club is entitled to one delegate to represent its interests at this meeting. The name of the delegate is required in writing and must be in the hands of the Association Secretary seven days prior to the meeting.

Clubs far distant from the Association headquarters unable to make a direct delegate appointment may apply to the Association Secretary with a request that a delegate be appointed. Any such appointee made under this latter arrangement must have his appointment confirmed by the member club he is to represent at least seven days prior to the annual meeting.

Clubs desirous of holding 1949 Championships, should make written application to the Association Secretary on or before November 1. It is particularly desirable that tentative dates be mentioned for the holding of such events. This concerns all Commonwealth, State and District Championships.
