His score 193/200 equals that of England's Richard Faulds established in the USA last year. Russell's outstanding consistency in shooting is such that I believe it is only a matter of time before he surpasses his mark, and once again has the record to himself. Well done Russell.

Have you renewed your membership?

Our membership for 1999 is slightly down at present on that for the same period last year. If you are reading this and have not renewed your 1999 membership. I ask that you do so. Your membership is important to us and the benefits are many.

I have on a number of occasions expressed my concern with Clubs accepting "Club" members only.

Our constitution refers specifically to members (clubs) and registered shooters. A registered shooter is someone who has paid his full ACTA and Club fees to a member club.

I do not know of any sporting body where this practice takes place or is condoned. I find it difficult that your Australian Clay Target Association fights to retain the right for members to continue firearm ownership and then some Clubs allow "shooters" to join them as "Club" members only to retain their firearms for a very minimal club membership fee. It just does not add up.

International Junior Clay Target Development Team

Report on the "International Junior Clay Target Development Team" for 1999 - their trip to the New Zealand Olympic Discipline Nationals, held at the Canterbury Gun Club, Christchurch in the South Island of New Zealand, from the 27th January to the 1st February.

Luca Scribani Rossi - Coach
Graham Michell - Team Manager

With the assistance of sponsorship from the Australian Sports Commission, the ACTA, Uniserve, the NSW Shooting Association and the NSW Firearms Awareness Council, it made this trip possible for these up and coming Olympic discipline shooters all aged between 13 to 16 years. For most of them it was their first trip away from Australia, and from their parents, to attend and international competition.

Monday, 25th January, saw the Team assemble at the Sydney International Airport, looking resplendent in their poloshirts, hats and tracksuits that were supplied by Uniserve, the NSW Shooting Association and the NSW Firearms Safety Awareness Council. The Team were not only excited and anxious about going on their trip but were equally excited at the prospect of meeting their sponsors around 5pm. We were all extremely grateful to Alex Comino and Gary Bryant of the NSW Shooting Association and the NSW Firearms Safety Awareness Council and to Peter Whelan of Uniserve who gave their time to come and wish us well for our first International Competition and we took this opportunity in presenting them with some framed Appreciation Certificates to these very valuable sponsors.

Our Air New Zealand flight in a 767 departed at 7.15 pm and having our seats all allocated together we found that as the plane was not full we were able to spread ourselves out a little and with a very funny film being shown it all made for a very enjoyable trip. One passenger in particular whose enjoyment of the film was more than apparent due to his fits of laughter, kept our small group equally amused.

We arrived at Christchurch Airport at 0005am (or 5 minutes past midnight) on Tuesday, January 26th. With all of the paperwork having previously been faxed to the New Zealand Police and Customs at the airport, within 15 minutes we were all cleared through Customs.

We were then met by Ian Swale, owner of the motel apartments where we were to stay and who happened to be a clay target shooter and Committee person from the Canterbury Gun Club, who had arranged for a mini-bus taxi and trailer to take us all back to the motel apartments which was a 20 minute drive from the airport.

The 3 "girls" were accommodated in one apartment and the 5 of us "boys" were housed in the one next door - ours having a kitchen-dinette, a lounge area and 2 bedrooms - these were in fact quite comfortable rooms.

Owing to the late hour of getting off to bed, around 1.30am, we all slept in and found, upon waking around 9.30 am, that our "hot" breakfasts had been delivered to our rooms some 1 and a half hours

earlier and were 'stone cold'. Talk about a bunch of sound sleepers! After organising our rooms and taking delivery of our mini-bus we went for a drive into Christchurch and found a supermarket where we purchased all our supplies for the coming week. We soon filled a king-sized shopping trolley hoping that we had all of the 'good, healthy food' that everyone would like. Luca and I intended to do all the cooking of the meals, breakfast and dinner, while sandwiches/rolls with suitable fillings were to be made each day for our lunches and all of this along with plenty of fresh fruit, saw both refrigerators in both apartments 'chock-a-block' full of food. We then found our way out to the Gun Club to see if there was any practice available as we had heard on the 'grape-vine' that there was none to be had. On reaching the grounds we found that Ray

Everett had opened a skeet layout and there were only a couple of shooters there. Would you believe there was 'no ammunition' - the fellow in charge of ammunition sales was not available until the following day when competition was to start, but Ray Everett and Malcolm Duff came to the rescue and loaned us 6 packets of shells. Paul and Natalia soon had their guns out and under the watchful eye of Luca, were soon out busting clays right, left and centre. I felt sorry for the rest of the Team as there was nothing open for them to have a practice at and I could see that they were busting to have a shot.

Back to the motel for dinner. Tonight's menu was loin lamb chops, mashed potatoes and peas. Mothers, I take my hat off to you for putting up with such varied palates - they all 'downed their mashed spuds' but when it came to the lamb chops and peas that was a totally different matter. The chops were "too greasy" and "don't like peas" were just some of the comments, so after that the 2 minute noodles and chocolate bars got a hammering (sad to see this when they had not been on our shopping list).

Up early the next morning Wednesday, January 27th, and besides cereal and toast, I fried bacon and poached some eggs - not too many takers again. Not having teenagers at home any more I think I have lost touch with their food requirements. Oh well, at least I tried. Luca's turn for dinner tonight.

The weather conditions were very different here to what we had been experiencing in Australia. It was very cold and very, very windy.

We were set down for a 9 am start for the South Island Championships for the next 2 days but at 10.15 am the competition had still not started and every body seemed to be trying to come up with some solutions as to how to get through the program in 2 days for we had 8 squads of Trap shoot-

ers, 5 squads of Double Trap (both events to be shot over the same layout), it was near an impossible task and given the weather conditions and minor breakdowns we looked like having a 'fun day'. We ended up shooting 2 rounds of Trap and 25 pair of Double Trap with the ladies shooting 3 rounds of Trap plus their Final and the Skeeties shot 3 rounds as programmed plus the Ladies Skeet Final.

Paul came out in his first round shooting 25/25 for Skeet and given the weather conditions this gave all the New Zealanders something to talk about. Natalia shot a 22, 20 and 21 plus a 21 in the Ladies Final to win the South Island Ladies Skeet Championship and Angelique in the Ladies Trap event shot a 20, 22, 16 and then a 21 in the Final giving her first placing in the South Island Ladies Trap Championship.

The weather conditions were so bad that the competition was actually stopped around 6.30 pm so it was back to the motel where a

'Scribani Rossi' spaghetti with a vegetarian sauce was on the menu.

After the rugged weather we had throughout the day the 'young ladies' from the Aussie Beauty Parlor next door decided it was time to have a facial, complete with 'green face masks' and after much laughter and photographs Natalia, Angelique and Suzie decided we too could do with some 'help' and promptly painted our faces as well, all except a nameless male skeet shooter who hid under the bed rather than having his face done. I must say that my own face felt quite refreshed after the face pack had been removed so, 'good one girls'. 'Davey' however, succumbed to even more.

A reasonably early night as we had a 6am start for Thursday.

Thursday, 28th January - following a breakfast of cereal, toast and eggs for those who wanted them, we made our way out to the Gun Club. The weather was still overcast, windy and very cold.

Shooting got under way at 9.00 am and today we shot 50 Skeet plus Finals, 75 Targets Trap plus the Final and one round of Double Trap.

Paul won the Junior South Island ISU Skeet after shooting rounds of 25,17,21,22 and a 24 giving him a score of 109/125. He also shot off in the Open Final of this event, shooting a 23 which put him in 5th position overall.

Both David and Josh were a little disappointed with their shooting, as was Suzie in the Double Trap but given the conditions and the waiting around to shoot it made it hard to keep their concentration up.

After the Trap Final, which was won by Brett Dunstan (Aust), we all headed back to the motel for marinated steak and vegetables and/or spaghetti and Brett joined us for dinner and at last we found someone who enjoyed 'all' of the food.

Friday, 29th January, saw the completion of the South Island Double Trap Championship and this time Suzie won the Ladies event shooting at 34,26,30 and a 28 in the Final. She was in fact 17 targets in front of her nearest rival. David did not take a major place in the Junior Division of this event. Steve Baynes (Aust) in fact won the New Zealand National Double Trap Championship and he was indeed a very happy Australian after all the confusion over the last couple of days.

Another long day was completed and dinner tonight - Lucas taco's.

Saturday, 30th January - the sun was out and the weather was just beautiful so a happy band of Aussies headed off to the Gun Club.

The day started with presentations to the place getters in the South Island Championships and to those in the New Zealand National Double Trap Championship, what a proud moment it was for both Luca and I to see the whole of our little Team, all decked out in their uniforms, receiving their trophies - they really did Australia proud. Brett Dunstan also received his sash and medal as the South Island National Trap Champion and Steven Baynes his, as New Zealand National Double Trap Champion.

The New Zealand National Trap and Skeet Championships then

got underway with everyone shooting better because of the weather.

The Ladies section of the New Zealand National Trap Championship was completed with Angelique going into the Final 2 targets behind Zelda McClure of New Zealand but after one of the gutsiest exhibitions I have ever seen, Angelique shot 24 and ended up winning the event by 2 targets. Her score was 84/100. She had been concentrating so hard on her shooting she didn't even know that she had won the event until we all gathered about to congratulate her. "Did I win, did I win?" was all that she could say.

The Ladies Skeet Title was also shot off today and Natalia after having shot 3 rounds of 20,20,20, went into the Final a clear leader and with a bad case of nerves shot a round of 18 in the Final but she still managed to take out the title of Ladies Champion. What a great day for our 2 little Lady Champions.

An early night after dinner which consisted of a huge pot of fried tomatoes on toast - eaten by 'most of us'.

The rain has begun to fall.....

Sunday, 31st January - up early to find a very grey day outside, pouring rain and a wind that is gusting straight off the Antarctic.

Angelique and Suzie were glad to have the day off as their particular competitions have now finished. The rest however, braved the elements.

David finished with 109/125 in the Junior section of the New Zealand National Trap Championship coming in 3rd place. Josh was getting better as he went along, trying different tips he had obtained from Luca and both Josh and Glen Cable (Aust) actually tied in their scores as the highest in their particular squad for the day's competition.

Natalia finished with 2 rounds of 20 and 22 giving her 2nd place overall in B Grade, her score being 102/125.

Paul also finished with 2 rounds of 24 and 23 putting him in 5th position overall and going into the Final with a 114/125. He then shot a 22/25 in the Final leaving him 4th overall in the competition and 4th in A Grade - his score of 136/150 was a tremendous effort for this little 13 year old, shooting in the pouring rain in gale force winds. Look out all of you older Skeeties.

Brett Dunstan again won the New Zealand National Trap Championship, making a clean sweep of both of the Trap events.

Presentations were once again a very proud time for our little Aussie Troop and after making our farewells to everyone we headed for the Antarctic Exhibition at the Antarctic Base at the Airport. This was quite a lovely exhibition of the Antarctic region complete with a large room full of snow and ice, igloos and air machines simulating conditions at the South Pole. Thank goodness they supplied warm clothing for those who entered to see this exhibit. A great time was had by all and it included a snow ball fight. Souvenirs were purchased for those back at home and then it was off to Christchurch to have our first meal out and a meal that every one ate - burgers at HUNGRY JACKS!

Monday, 1st February - our last day so we all slept in but once up I took them down to the shopping mall where I left them to wander for about an hour while I tried to have some films developed.

Then it was time to go back to the motel to pack up.

Once everything was packed up, the bills paid and the mini-bus returned, we caught a mini-bus taxi out to the airport where we did some last minute duty free shopping before we were to board our plane at 4.20 pm.

We had a good flight back home arriving in Sydney where we were met by some happy parents and relatives of our NSW Juniors and the rest of us then went on to the domestic airport where we made our separate ways home.

In conclusion I wish to thank these young shooters for the manner in which they presented themselves at all times and to Luca, for what was a wonderful, happy and successful trip and with the continued support of our sponsors, I hope there will be many more such trips in the future. If continued support is given to these young men and women, our sport will be in great shape in the future.

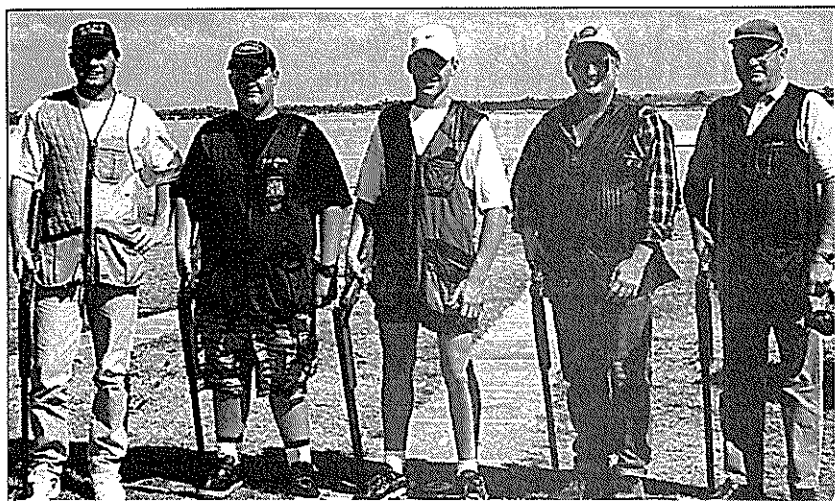

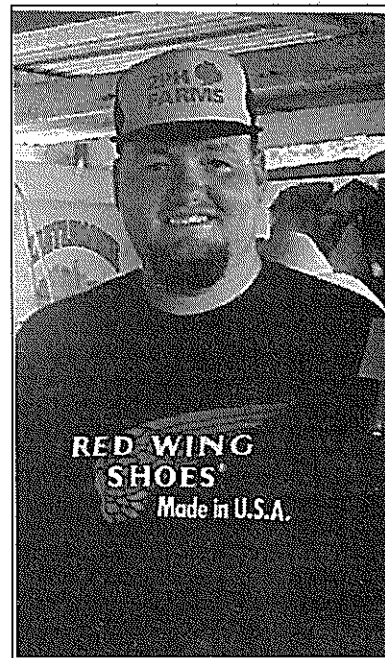

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS APRIL 1999

Karen and I have just returned from an absolutely super shooting trip to Tamworth for their Annual Two-Day Skeet Carnival, which is held on the third weekend in February every year. (It's really a three-day shoot if you count the practice and doubles on Friday, but they run the High Gun over two days in order not to eliminate those people who can't get Friday off). Unfortunately, Tamworth is a very long way from us - about 15 hours driving time each way. And having to go via Sydney, which means negotiating peak hour traffic for an hour and a half from Liverpool to Hornsby, really takes the shine off the trip. Otherwise we would be much more regular visitors to this wonderful shooting establishment.

I have been several times before, and Karen and I both went the year before last, and we always have a great time, so for several months we had been agonizing over whether or not to make the effort to go this year, particularly as it is a special occasion. It's the twenty-first anniversary of the shoot and the trophies and festivities this year were planned to be more spectacular than their usual high standard. A phone call from the organizing committee, early in the new year, honoring me with an offer to run the shoot for them was the deciding factor. After that it was all planning and anticipation.

For a country club Tamworth have excellent facilities. Five DTL layouts superimposed over four Skeet fields all face the right way and have an excellent background. These are probably two of the reasons that the National Trap Long Run Record resides at their club. It stands at 1177 and was set by Russell Mark back in 1992 at their Annual Two-Day Trap Shoot held every year on the first week-end in September. Their clubhouse is very cozy, yet has room enough to hold the presentations for a large open shoot. They have a great kitchen, a well-stocked hotel-style bar, an undercover scoreboard area and a separate office at the far end of the building. The volunteer staff in all these areas are always friendly pleasant and helpful, which I guess is what country hospitality is all about.

And speaking of country hospitality! Karen and I stayed with the Burts, as is our usual practice. I have been fortunate enough to be very close friends with Col and Jenny Burt for more years than I care to remember. Their beautiful home, set on just over an acre of land on the outskirts of Tamworth (built by Colin), has become one of my homes away from home. Although I can't get up there to shoot as often as I would like, my truck driving activities occasionally take me up the New England Highway. I know that half an hours warning will have my bed turned back, my place set at the table and a glass of my favorite fruit-juice sitting on the bench waiting for me. I guess my association with Col and Jenny goes back to the late 70s, but my most vivid memory of the Burts is a Sunday night in November in 1986. It was the last day of the Skeet Nationals. Jenny was running the office (as usual) and Col had been shooting great all week. After the last event was finalized on Sunday night, Col was locked in a two-way tie for the Overall National High Gun and had to shoot off.

Now Jenny is usually one of the calmest characters you will ever meet, but on this occasion she was beside herself and could not bring herself to come and watch the shoot-off. I can relate to this because although I cope alright when I'm shooting off myself, I'm a bundle of nerves when I'm behind the fence watching a close friend, so I promised to convey the result to her, immediately it was decided. Colin continued his great form throughout the shoot-off and in my opinion probably should have won. But fate took a hand and at the end, in badly failing light, he drew a very uneven pair in a gust of wind. He went up with the first one and made a great shot to break it, but by the time he got back for the second it was just a black blur streaking into the dark background. I doubt if even Wayne Mayes himself could have made the shot.

After commiserating with Colin, I left him to accept the acclaim of the multitude of shooters who crowded onto the field. He accepted it all with that air of composure and stiff upper lip that is the mark of great champions in defeat. I was not bearing up anywhere near as well and when I entered the office and met Jenny the words choked up in my throat and the tears welled up in my eyes and I guess the look on my face was enough. Without a word we both broke down and cried inconsolably and unashamedly for several minutes. The fact that it was I who had beaten Colin in the shoot-off did nothing to lessen my grief and to this day, strangely enough, it remains one of the saddest and

yet most cherished memories in my entire shooting career

Anyway, back to the shoot. When I said it was being organized as a special occasion I may have understated the case somewhat. I don't remember the last time that any Skeet Shoot short of the Nationals had an under and over shotgun as a High Gun trophy. I would like to thank Fosters Firearms of Tamworth (Athol and Cheryl Page) and Gold Coast Shooters Supplies (George Scaf) for their joint effort in making such a great trophy possible. To cap it off, Tamworth's foremost furniture maker, the talented and multi-skilled Rodney Prior, built a beautiful hand carved custom case for it. And while I'm on Rodney's case (pun intended), I'd like to thank both him and Kevin Weatherall who were the main movers and shakers of the shoot, along with all their other dedicated helpers.

The weather was very kind to us. We had three very pleasant days, which made for three days of great shooting. The five events provided five different overall winners (three shooting release triggers) as well as a constantly changing list of names in the lower grades and various divisions, which is great to see. (Karen won her first A grade shoot-off, which put a grin on her that a bag of lemons couldn't remove). Attendance was up on previous years with a lot of old faces coming out of the woodwork for the anniversary celebrations. The whole shoot went off without a hitch. Shoot-offs finished each day in good time. The free dinner on Saturday night was enjoyed by all and sundry and I doubt if there is anyone who is not looking forward to next year's shoot already.

Now, to change the subject. For several months I have been discussing the formal entry of Small Gauge Skeet Shooting into Australia with many of the people who share my interest in this exciting and challenging variation of our discipline. A fairly clear consensus of opinion is starting to emerge on most of the issues and options.

First and foremost, everyone is agreed that to get it off the ground we need to start at the top and work down rather than try to work from the bottom up. That is to say, the best way to get the thing started is to get something going at the Nationals first. Although we already have a significant number of people interested in Small Gauge shooting, and the number continues to increase steadily each year, unfortunately they are distributed far and wide throughout our enormous continent. The only time you get most of them together in the same place at the same time is for the Skeet Nationals. Trying to get them all together again at some other time is a very big ask, and thereby probably doomed to failure. Thus the Nationals is the only practical place to start.

How to get started has been the subject creating the most lively and divided debate. Although I can empathize with the majority of people who want to start out with a full blown four-gun shoot, I firmly believe that a much more cautious and restrained approach would be wiser at this time. I'm a firm believer in the old adage "walk before you run". If we just shoot a single Small Gauge event this year, we get a chance to test the water and see how much interest really exists without rushing in and committing an enormous amount of time money and effort that hindsight might show was premature. In this way, if the event does not meet expectations, we can just bow out gracefully and bide our time until we believe that sufficient support does exist and try again. If it is a moderate success, then we can simply have a repeat next year and continue to monitor support. However, if it is a great success, and there is a big demand for the other gauges, then we will know that the effort involved in providing a four-gun shoot next year will be worthwhile.

The choice of which gun to shoot first is obvious. Of the three possibilities, the 20 gauge is undoubtedly the gun that the greatest number of people would either possess or have access to. Additionally, factory ammunition is readily available for it at a reasonable price and it is the easiest to reload. And last but not least, for obvious reasons, it is the easiest to shoot and thus the best way for prospective new gauge shooters to kick off.

When to program the event, if it is to be held at the Nationals, provides a number of different options. Each one solves some problems but provides others. The day before the Nationals would keep all the National events blocked together and permit the Nationals staff to run it. In time to come, if and when Gauge shooting becomes universally accepted, this may be the way to go. But at the moment it would be unfair to the "12 gauge only" shooters and could cause a drop in the attendance of the Pre-nationals. The day after the Nationals would also keep the events blocked and simplify staffing, but this would require either moving the National program back a day or spilling over into the Monday of another working week. Neither of these options is thought to be either fair or viable.

Thus, after careful consideration, the best option is fairly clear cut - the day before the Pre-nationals. The only problem with this would be staffing. Requiring the Nationals staff to work one day, have two off, and then work for four more would be totally unacceptable. Therefore we propose to put a submission to the ACTA whereby they officially approve and sanction the event, but empower the Wagga Gun Club, in conjunction with the Small Gauge Organizing Committee, to conduct the event on their behalf. Official presentations would probably be best carried over to the main program, and we intend to propose a minimum guaranteed return of \$500 or \$10 per shooter (whichever is the greater) to the ACTA in return for sanctioning the event and providing the necessary badge and sashes.

From time to time I am approached by various people suggesting that the Skeet Shooters Association should be revived for some particular reason or other. The introduction of Small Gauge Shooting is no exception to this. I have continued to advise against such a move if possible, because although the ASSA had a lot of good people, who did a lot of good work, and eventually achieved most of their objectives (which is part of the reason the organization went into recess), the political repercussions inherent with being an external entity caused a lot of problems. With the benefit of hindsight, I believe that a different approach this time would be more beneficial and acceptable to all concerned. With that in mind, several of us have got together and formed the Small Gauge Skeet Club. Like all other "gun clubs" it is affiliated with the ACTA and is subject to its rules and decisions.

This way, all the people interested in Small Gauge Shooting have an avenue where they can pool their experience, share ideas, form opinions, and advise and assist the ACTA through a common unified source. Only this time the approach shall be from within the ACTA rather than from a detached entity. In this way it is hoped that this time co-operation and mutual respect shall prevail from the outset. The Small Gauge Organizing Committee shall be elected from this club and their services offered to the ACTA and the Wagga Gun Club for the purpose of assisting and promoting Small Gauge Shooting. 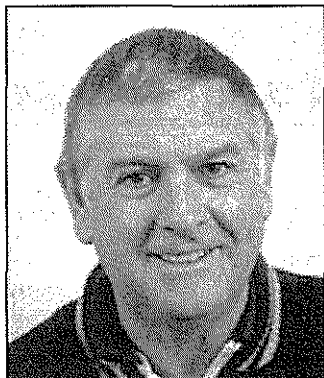
Discussions regarding the provision of a perpetual trophy for the National 20 Gauge Skeet Championship were pretty much an open and shut case. As this is the first time that a National Skeet Champion will not be able to defend his title, and as John Withers was a great exponent and promoter of Small Gauge Shooting, it was unanimously decided to approach the ACTA with an offer from members of the SGSC to donate a suitable trophy inscribed "The John Withers Memorial National 20 Gauge Skeet Trophy". A full submission containing and outlining all the above points will be presented to the ACTA in the near future and I am very hopeful that a National 20 gauge event will become a reality this year in Wagga.

Now for a couple more items of good news. Although the Victorian Skeet Carnival program has been cut back to two days, the host club, Frankston-Australia, have decided to conduct 2 x 50 target events on the Friday with a sausage sizzle lunch. Additionally they will be open for practice on the Wednesday and Thursday. Please plan to come early and support these efforts. And during my discussions with Vince Mollica (president of the VCTA), he advised me that he will be convening an informal meeting with the shooters at the State Skeet Carnival this year on the Saturday night immediately after the presentations. So I implore all Victorian skeet shooters to make the time to stay back for this meeting, express your views and support our president in his efforts to assist us.

Now that the Trap Nationals are behind us, I will be concentrating on Skeet questions and prizes in the STQ competition for the next few months, and so this month's Shooting Trivia Question is: Where and when was the first Skeet Nationals held? Mail your answer to: Shooting Trivia, P.O. Box 265, Bairnsdale 3875 to arrive by 25-04-99. A winner will be drawn from the correct answers, whose name shall be published in the June CTSN and who shall receive a free entry to the 1999 National Skeet Championship in Wagga in November. Not only did we reach the highest number of members ever (13,658), but the relocation of our National Office to Wagga Wagga NSW and the beginnings of a home we can truly call our own stands out in the development and future of our Association. With the sale of our Melbourne office, work will commence almost immediately on our new building.

Unfortunately, with our relocation Leanne Harrington (Day) and Manon Breithecker elected not to move to the country, however we gained the services of Andrew Sanders as Administration Manager, Deborah Brown as Accounts Clerk and Karen Bryce as receptionist/typist (CTSN).

During the year Gina Di Lullo left to take up a position as Administration Manager - Shooting with SOCOG and Carol Ogden also left us and is now a Queensland resident. Graeme Brown has made the transition from city slicker to country cousin.

I find it difficult to believe that some two years has elapsed since the Prime Minister stated unequivocally that Australia was to have uniform gun laws. We are no closer to this now than we were then, and we, as travelling shooters, are still finding the red tape and endless permits and authorities no different in 1999 than 1997. On a brighter note, our shooters continued to excel in all areas of competition.

The outstanding shooter for 1998 was Michael Diamond. His achievements included:

- World Cup - Gold - Trap Lonato Italy
- World Cup - Gold - Double Trap Cairo Egypt
- Commonwealth Games - Gold Medal - Trap Kuala Lumpur
- Commonwealth Games - Games Record - Trap Kuala Lumpur
- Commonwealth Games - Trap Kuala Lumpur
- Silver medal - Team Pairs event (with Benjamin Kelley)
- National Trap Championship - Gold Medal - Trap Adelaide SA
- He also won two team gold medals in double trap (with Adam Vella and Brett Hall - Cairo) and trap (with Russell Mark and

Adam Vella in Barcelona). I have no doubt had it been any other sport, Michael would be Australia's best known and most publicised athlete.

Other International gold medal winners for the year were Clive Barton in skeet in the Atlanta Grand Prix and Natasha Lonsdale also in skeet in Brunei's World Cup. Our shooters also won a number of silver and bronze medals in both team and individual events. This included David Cunningham's bronze medal at the Commonwealth Games. Their efforts have won us the title of number one in the World. Our congratulations to them all.

During 1998 the National Executive continued to work hard for our members and our sport. Tasmanian delegate and King Island resident, Mr John Murphy retired after ten years on the Executive. In fact John was our longest serving committee member. In recognition of his service to our sport the Executive Committee granted Life Membership of our association. Congratulations John. Andrew Sanders also resigned during the year on taking up his administration position with us.

We thank both John and Andrew for their valuable contribution to our Association. In their place we welcome Nanette McCallum and Mark McInnes and we look forward to their time with us.

I would also like to thank the sub committee chairpersons and their committees for their input during the year. I would especially like to thank my Vice President and Chairman of Finance Committee, Bill Jones for his support and strong financial skills to get our association in the strong financial position that it is currently.

Murray Alexander, our National Director of Coaching sought not to seek reappointment and retired on the expiration of his contract. Murray had been with us since 1992 and during this time with us, he gave 100 per cent and we wish him well in the future. We also must thank each of Murray's State counterparts who also contributed much, as did each of our coaches individually.

Sadly, during the year some of our fellow members "completed their careers". We pass on our deepest sympathy to all their family and friends. Unfortunately our Historian Mr George Biggs was among those who passed on. George dedicated his latter years to obtaining material on the history of the ACTA and in 1994 wrote our first history book.

Again, the Association gratefully thanks the Australian Sports Commission for its support and contributions to us. In addition, to the Australian Institute of Sport for looking after our AIS Scholarship shooters, this being the first year we have had a residence program.

I also pass on our special thanks to all who have sponsored us in so many ways. Our sport could not have achieved its success without their help. Thank You.

We can now look forward to 1999 with the utmost confidence. My personal thankyou to all who have contributed to make it this way. Thankyou
