

World Class Performances at Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix"

Brisbane Gun Club 20th - 27th February

Australia's premier Olympic Discipline shooting Competition, the Australasian-Pacific 'Grand Prix", which was conducted at Brisbane Gun Club between 20th and 27th February, attracted over 170 shooters from throughout Australia and from 10 overseas countries.

Amongst the overseas contingents was one of the strongest teams ever to come to Australia from the United States and comprised a team from the U.S. Shooting Team and also a very strong team from the U.S. Army Marksmanship Unit at Fort Benning in Georgia, who confirmed the belief that the Brisbane "Grand Prix" competition is amongst the best competitions currently available anywhere in the World.



Competitors from the U.K., Japan, Austria, Czech Republic, Lebanon, France, Spain, New Zealand and USA came to Brisbane to help make the 99 "Grand Prix" the most successful yet conducted in its 5 year history.

In addition to the 99 competition attracting so many class competitors, this year the event took on a new look with the conducting of a new format Australian Open event in Trap, Skeet and Double Trap and also the worlds first ever conducting of a 'skins' event in all three disciplines.

Added support from Kemen Australia, Rio Oceania, Olimpyc Targets, Winchester, Borhaghi Cartridges and Carlton United Breweries also ensured that the competition would be the success that everyone has come to expect of it since first being conducted in 1995. By arrangement with Rio Oceania, each Grade and Section Winner throughout the entire competition would be presented with a case of 500 Rio Cartridges in each Championship. In all 60 cases of cartridges were to be presented during the Grand Prix.

With 3 days of Double Trap, offering 450 targets, and 5 days of Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet providing 425 Targets each, the competition was considered by all in attendance, especially those visiting from overseas to be an extremely good competition and worthy of making the effort to attend.

With the attendance of the strong US teams, the class of the field included shooters who have won competitions at every possible level including Olympic Games, World Championships, World Cup Finals, World Cups, Commonwealth Games and anything thing else worth mentioning. This must surely be a record for a competition in Australia easily out doing the standard of competitors attending World Championships in 1991 and the World Cup in

Brisbane in 1997. The scene is now certainly set for Australia to be seen as amongst the Worlds best venues in the lead up to the Olympic Games in Sydney next year.

In preparation for the competition, the Brisbane Gun Club and Organising Committee for the "Grand Prix" spent many weekends preparing the grounds and presenting the facilities to a standard considered suitable for any competition anywhere in the World. The three Olympic trap and Double Trap facilities operated throughout the week long competition with only a few minor hiccups, while the two skeet layouts also performed well with minor interruptions. Full credits must go to all who made the effort to get everything prepared for the competition. Special mention must be made to the continued efforts of Club President Tom Meadows, Organising Committee Secretary Janine Kettels, Tony Houselander, Tony Kidman, Len Norman, Col Boyd, Greg Newey, Terry Morony, Craig Smith, Dot Trindall, Carol Ogden, Ross Tipler and the many others who did so much, not only before the competition, but also during the event. Without the assistance of so many individuals, the Australasian-Pacific 'Grand Prix' would not enjoy the outstanding success that it does today and to be rated as Australia's most important international Olympic Discipline clay target shooting competition.

After unofficial practice was offered for a few days, the competition got under way on Saturday 20th February with the first ever conducting of a clay target "SKINS" event. Designed by the "Grand Prix" Organising Committee to offer a lead in to all major events in conjunction with a Badge Match, the "SKINS" was extremely well received by all who competed and will no doubt eventually establish itself as a popular event in clay target shooting circles.

Around 40 shooters competed in the "SKINS" event which comprised the normal 3 rounds of 50

targets. The first round saw current World Record Holder Richard Faulds of England take the money in the Open section of the first round, while Rocky Manno of SA International took the Intermediate Section. Richard Faulds again took the honors in round two with Steven Robertson taking the intermediate. Richards prizemoney for the first two rounds -\$760. Round three went to Adam Vella of Frankston while Rocky Manno again took the money in the Intermediate giving him \$240 for the event. In all, \$1500 was paid out to shooters in the event - good money for a few hour work (or enjoyment).

Day two saw the conducting of the first major competition, the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" in Double Trap. The scene was now set for two days of extremely tough competition with this event and the inaugural Kemen Australian Open in Double Trap, also over 150 targets.


After the first round, Atlanta Olympic Gold Medallist Russell Mark had made his intention clear. Russell carded a good 47/50 to set the pace with current World Champion Michael Diamond and Kevin Gill of England both on 44/50 along with Steve Haberman the 1995 World Champion. Richard Faulds of England started badly on 39/50 and would always find it hard to recover from there, however a 46/50 in round two saw him make up two targets on Russell. Michael Diamond added a handy 45/50 while Adam Vella shot 44 to add to his first round 43 and put him amongst the leaders.

After the completion of round 3, Russell Mark went in to the final first on 138/150 followed by Diamond 135, Faulds 133,

Vella 132 and Craig Tilley and Deserie Baynes both on 126. Deserie was again proving her qualities as a Double Trap competitor by making the Open final and by being the top qualifier in the women's section.



The three teams:- Beretta: R Mark, and N Cassels, Perazzi: M Diamond and S Haberman, Kemen: R Faulds and A Vella.

After the completion of a very entertaining round of Double Trap, the Kemen Team of R Faulds and A Vella emerged victorious from what was undoubtedly one of the best squads of double trap shooters ever to assemble together anywhere in the world. On behalf of the shooters and those present, John Gilopidis representing Kemen Australia presented Elizabeth Ainsworth-Virtue of St Andrews Hospital with a cheque of \$1500 the proceeds of the afternoons proceedings.

The final Double Trap event would see the first ever conducting of the Kemen Australian Open Event, again over 150 targets. Kemen, through its Australian Distributor, generously offered to award a high quality Kemen Shotgun to any competitor breaking

the World Record of 193/200 in this event. Chances were, that this may be achieved with the field including the current World Record holders, Richard Faulds 193/200 and Michael Diamond 147/150, Russell Mark the current Olympic Champion, Steve Haberman 1995 World Champion, Junior World Champion Nathan Cassells plus World Cup winners Dominic Grazioli, Kevin Gill, Adam Vella and many other highly credentialled members of the American and Australian Teams.

As with the previous event, finals would be conducted in this event for open, women and junior competitors.

Again, Russell Mark started brilliantly shooting 48/50 to take the early lead over Richard Faulds and David Alcoriza (US) both on 47/50 with Rudolf Strnad (Czech Republic) and Ann Marie Roberts both recording 46/50. In the Junior ranks, Suzie Trindall of Showman's was setting the pace from Craig Livingstone of New Zealand and Rocky Manno of International SA, both on 40/50, while Heinrich Strauss from Austria, Brian Mark of Werribee, our old 'mate' Art Goodman from New Jersey and locals Cam McClymont and Col Boyd were doing battle in the Veteran section. The Women's section was also seeing a great battle with Theressa Dewitt and Loetta Dement of the US Army Marksmanship Unit both shooting well enough to have the early break on the Olympic Bronze Medallist Deserie Baynes.

Russells form didn't falter - he recorded 48 and 49 in his 2nd and 3rd rounds to go into the final in first spot on 145/150. Englishman Kevin Gill (136/150) and Richard Faulds (135) along with David Alcoriza (US) on 135, Adam Vella (134) and Tom Turner of Cessnock (131) made up the top 6.

50 targets later, after the final, Russell had equaled the world record 193/200 and failed by one target to take home a new Kemen Shotgun. Richard Faulds made a late run with 49/50 to take 2nd

placing while David Alcorzia's 45 in the final saw him get bronze. 150 Target Double Trap Kemen Australian Open.

After 3 heavy days of Double Trap, the scene was now set for the Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet specialists to do their stuff. Nearly 100 shooters would do battle in the trap and around 40 shooters in the Skeet. Both disciplines were set to produce some great competition with the likes of Mark, Diamond, Kelley, Vella and others set to be pushed hard by the international visitors such as Kevin Gill (UK), Dominic Grazioli, Michael Herman, David Alcoriza (US) and Des Coe (NZ). The skeeties were also sure to find it 'tough-going', but whatever the outcome, the competition was sure to be of great benefit to the likes of David Cunningham, Clive and George Barton, Craig Meulman and others. The US Team of James (Todd) Graves, Shawn Dulohery, Joe Buffa and Scott Schroeder have recorded wins in many of the Worlds major competitions. Todd Graves is probably the only shooter to have ever won World Cups in all three disciplines - Trap, Skeet and Double Trap.

The first two days of the Trap and Skeet would see the conducting of the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" over 125 targets + final. The Trap competition which was sure to be keenly contested started well with Russell Mark continuing on where he had left off in the Double Trap carding a perfect 25/25 along with Ben Kelley (NSWGC), Craig Henwood (Melbourne), Kevin Gill (England) and Wayne Pilkington (Werribee). No less than 15 other shooters were one target behind on 24/25. Diane Reeves (Normanton) and Deserie Baynes (Pt Augusta) lead the women's section with 23's, while Rocky Manno had the early lead in the Junior division and Art Goodman (USA) on 21/25 was one ahead of Brian Mark in the Veterans Section.

At the end of the first day, Tom Turner of Cessnock had grabbed the lead with a near perfect 74/75, followed by Russell Mark, Ben Kelley and Glen Kable all on 73. Deserie Baynes was on 68/75 to be one ahead of Lisa Smith, with Suzanne Balogh on 65 and Dianne Reeves on 64/75 in the women's section, while Joseph Ruffo of Werribee lead the Juniors on 67/75 ahead of Rocky Manno on 66/75. Brian Mark had an early 3 target break on Art Goodman in the Veterans division.

The final two rounds of the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" in Olympic Trap and Tom Turner added another 25/25 to go through the 100 mark on 99/100, but unfortunately faulted in the last round with a 21 and just made the final in last spot on 120/125. Russell Mark scored 50/50 for the day to finish on 123/125, Ben Kelley finished with 49/50 for 122, while Michael Herman (49/50), Adam Vella (49/50) and Glenn Kable (47/50) along with Tom Turner made up the six. Other great scores for the day included 50/50 for Kevin Perkins (Illawarra), while Michael Diamond, Jeff May 1999 Australian Clay Tonna, Deserie Baynes all had 49s.

The ISSF Skeet competition of the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" was also the scene for some great performances. Americans Todd Graves, Joe Buffa, Shawn Dulohery and Scott Schroeder along with Ken Okuzumi of Japan all recorded 24/25 in the first round to share the early lead, Grave going on with it to finish day one in the lead on 73/75, ahead of Buffa and Dulohery both on 71/75. Australian hopefuls Clive Barton (68), David Cunningham (65) and George Barton (64) all had plenty of work to do on day two. Natasha

Lonsdale was continuing to shoot well, leading the women on 68/75, to be well ahead of Natalia Rahman of Frankston on 64 and Lauryn Ogilvie of the US on 61. Top juniors for the day were Robbie Marino (Melbourne) on 65 and Jason Maxwell (Illawarra) on 64.

After a further 50 targets on day two, Todd Graves had first spot into the final on 122/125, one target ahead of team member Joe Buffa with Shawn Dulohery and Clive Barton one further back on 118/125. Clive had to get there the hard way shooting a perfect 50/50 on day two. Scott Schroeder (US) and Goran Rahman (Frankston) made up six for the final, which saw Graves, Buffa and Dulohery all record perfect 25s while Clive Barton carded 24 for a daily score of 74/75, Schroeder and Rahman both had 23s.

With the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competitions all completed, it was now time for the conducting of the inaugural 200 Target Kemen Australian Open competitions in both Olympic Trap and Skeet. Kemen (Spain) was represented by Mr Arcadio Sarriugarte who was on hand to present the magnificent cups donated by Kemen to the winners in all three disciplines. Mr Bruce Burns of Rio Oceania was also on hand for the presentation of Rio Cartridges, while Bob Dupuy and Wayne Pilkington represented Win-

chester, Kevin Tunny was there for Olimpyc Targets and George Sckaf of Bornaghi Cartridges was also in attendance. The Organising Committee are truly appreciative of the support by all sponsors and look forward to their assistance at next years "Grand Prix".

For the first time in many years, Australia was set for the conducting of a major competition in Olympic Trap and Skeet over 200 targets. The Kemen Australian Open events in both trap and skeet would be conducted over 2 days with 100 targets each day and finals to be conducted for the top six competitors in the open, women and junior sections.

In the Trap event, the competition was expected to be very fierce with many shooters out to impress. The ACTA National Training Squads in all disciplines were in attendance for the entire competition and all were keen to record good performances to enhance their prospects for National Team selection for the forthcoming World Cups and World Championships.

After 100 targets on the first day, Ben Kelley was out in front on 98/100, followed closely by Theresa Dewitt of the US Army on 97, Dominic Grazioli 96, Michael Diamond, Russell Mark, David Alcoriza and Brett Dunstan all on 95. Following up in the women's section, Deserie Baynes was on 90 while Suzie Balogh was in third spot on 87/100. Craig Livingston of New Zealand was the overnight leader in the Junior division while Brian Mark was again the early leader in the section for the mature aged gentleman.

With plenty to be done with 100 targets to go, many of the top competitors had their work cut-out. Following the completion of the presentations and awards on Friday afternoon, the Organising Committee hosted a complimentary function at the club for all shooters and friends. Saturday - 27th February, the last day of the 1999 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competition and the day many were waiting for - the conducting of the first ever "SKINS" competition in Olympic trap and Skeet. Kevin Gill of England, the last shooter of the round recorded the only 25/25 to take the first round skin in the Open section, pocketing almost \$500. The Intermediate skin of \$300 was shared 21/25 by Katz Futakami (Japan), Masami Kawai (Japan) and Joseph Ruffo (Werribee).







Clay target shooting irrespective of the particular discipline is a sport involving the detection of a target the alignment of the gun on the target, then pulling the trigger.

This process involves binocular vision and depth perception task to locate the target in space, then monocular alignment and aiming, followed by a visual message to physically pull the trigger.

The visual process involved in clay target shooting.

- Sharpness of Vision in right and left eye at a distance, this needs to be the maximum sharpness that you can attain, often better than 20/20 vision.

- Peripheral vision to detect the location of the target, the speed of peripheral awareness can also be measured to determine how quickly you locate a target.

- Binocular alignment of the two eyes and the two retinal images, this is used to judge depth, and to determine the exact location of the target.

- Accommodative functions of both eyes to move the focus to the correct distance of the target.

- Contrast sensitivity to determine the target image against confusing backgrounds, or when overcast and dull.

- Monocular acuity of the dominant eye when aiming at the target. The aiming process is actually a pointing process.

- Because shooting requires fast responses many times over, both the speed of recognition and the speed of the response are very important. The task is also endurance as these processes need to be completed many times for a whole event.

What do you and your eyes do when you shoot.

You stand in position, with eyes relaxed. You then mount the gun and hold still. You visualise the target, focus both eyes ahead of the trap house. You then widen your focus and "soft focus" so that you take in all peripheral locations that the target may appear in. You hold your blink and stand visually alert.

You are then prepared to call for the target, quickly you call "pull" with your eyes wide open, and your vision out wide to "spot" the target in tour peripheral vision.

This task requires many visual skills sharp vision, wide and fast peripheral vision, good binocular alignment, fast focus control, accurate eye movement skills, good depth perception, good contrast sensitivity.


The next task is to move the gun in relation to the target and to draw your focus in, so as to "hard focus" right on the position of the target.

This task requires very sharp central vision right and left eye, good visual concentration, good depth perception, fast focus

changes, good visual memory and good binocular control. You then have decided that the target is directly aligned with you eye and barrel and you pull the trigger.

This is a monocular task and the dominant eye is the one you should be aligning with on the shooting side of the body. The sharpness of this eye is very important, and your ability to point with this eye with the gun in position determines your ability to then break the target. This also requires hand eye coordination and spatial localisation to know where the barrel is in reference to your eye and the target.

You then follow through and dismount the gun.



SYDNEY 2000 - YOUR INVITATION TO OLYMPIC SHOOTING

One of the proudest moments of any sports person's career is winning an Olympic gold medal. At the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, two Australian clay target shooters, Michael Diamond and Russell Mark, experienced this moment. Both regard their experience as unforgettable.

Dual Olympian Michael Diamond remembers the thrill of winning Australia's first gold medal at Atlanta, in the Trap event.

"I always regard competing at the Olympic Games as an honour and a privilege" said Diamond. "Being part of the team at Barcelona and Atlanta, winning gold at the latter, showed me that all those long hours of practice are really worth it. I wouldn't trade the thrill of competing and winning at such an elite level for anything."

Triple Olympian Russell Mark, who won Australia's second gold medal of the Games in Double Trap, recalls how he felt just as the gold medal was placed around his neck after his triumph at Atlanta.

"I looked back into the crowd and saw an Australian flag waving defiantly in the breeze. It made me proud to be an Aussie and proud to have achieved so much for our country. I'd love to do the same again in Sydney in front of a home crowd. That would be the best result ever for me."

If you agree that the thought of seeing more Australians achieve medal success at the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games is something to get excited about, here's your chance to turn thought into deed. Tickets for all Olympic sporting events go on sale to the public on 30 May this year. Two events are held on each of seven days with three events on the other day. The one ticketed session each day will allow you to wander between the different events at will.

Sydney International Shooting Centre, a truly magnificent shooting venue, will host the first medal event of the Sydney Games. Women's Air Rifle, the first event on the Olympic shooting program, provides the first gold medal opportunity on 16 September.

William Robert McEntyre 8/5/1869 to 6/2/1934

My Grandfather was born in Adelong, NSW in 1872 and later moved to "Oura House", Oura NSW where he farmed.

In 1894 at the age of 22 he married Alice Maud Wilson, also from Adelong. They had nine children and after being burnt out at Oura they moved to Eurongilly in 1914.

W.R.McEntyre shot at the Wagga Wagga Gun Club from 1899 and was the winner of the first Sparrow Shoot that was held at the Club in that year. He was also the winner of another major Sparrow Match on 3rd July, 1901 and was presented with a silver cup by Harry Robinson Esq.

His four boys also shot at the Club, each being given a gun at 21 years of age.

The guns included Hollis and Cashmores.

Many nights were spent trapping sparrows and starlings out of the hedges for the practice days with a hand made bird release trap.

I still have this trap and two of the guns.

Australian Clay Target Shooting News

SHOOTING SKEET DOUBLES

by Robyn Faber (Level 3 Coach, NSW)

Are you a skeet shooter who doesn't like shooting doubles? Do you avoid the event, treat it as only for top shooters? Don't like to attending shoots where it is part of the Over High Gun?

Maybe it's because you've never learnt to shoot it. Well, start now!

Skeet doubles is ideally a 50 target event consisting of a pair of targets thrown from Stations 1 to 7 then 6 to 2 in reverse for the first half (making 24 targets total) then in the second half stations 1 to 7 and 6 to 1 in reverse (making 26 targets total).

If your Club wishes to shoot 25 targets instead of 50, then you shoot a single high bird off Station 2 at the end of the first half to make 25 targets.

If you are a regular skeet shooter then you should be reasonably confident with paris on Stations 1 and 2 and 6 and 7.

So only 3, 4 and 5 will present a new challenge.

The basic principle for all stations is to stand on the station so that you are ideally placed to shoot the second target comfortably.

This will mean that on Station 3 you may stand so that your stomach roughly faces the crossing point rather than the low house opening (for a right handed shooter) or halfway between the high house and the crossing point for a left handed shooter. On this station you always shoot the high bird first.

On Station 4 on the first occasion of each round you shoot the high bird first, so stand with your stomach facing roughly halfway between the crossing point and the low house for a right handed shooter and about two thirds the way from the high house to the crossing point for a left handed shooter. On your return visit to this station you will be required to shoot the low bird first so for a right handed shooter stand facing to the fight hand side of the low house or slightly to the right hand side of the crossing point for a left handed shooter.

Station 5 requires you to shoot the low bird first so for a right handed shooter, face the low house opening and for a left handed shooter face slightly to the left of the crossing point.


Experiment with these positions until you can comfortably shoot your second target of each pair. Refer Figure 2.

Your gun hold positions should be exactly the same as you would hold for the single target corresponding to the first target of each pair. That is, on Station 3 choose your normal High 3 hold point; first visit to Station 4 choose your normal High 4 hold point; Station 4 second visit choose your normal Low 4 hold point, and Station 5 choose your normal Low 5 hold point.

If you shoot 'sustained lead', hold as you would for 'sustained lead', if you shoot 'swing through', hold as you would for 'swing through'. The second target *only* will be shot by the 'swing through' method.

When you shoot these pairs, DO NOT THINK ABOUT THE SECOND TARGET: shoot your first target, swinging fast enough to shoot it just before the crossing point (Refer Figure 1). SEE THE TARGET BREAK, then look over your gun for the second target, swing through the target and shoot the bottom leading edge of the target, REMEMBERING TO KEEP YOUR GUN MOVING.

On Station 4, you will need to see some daylight between



your barrel and the target when you pull the trigger. Experiment with your own sight picture.

MOST SHOOTERS OVERLEAD THE SECOND TARGET, forgetting that their gun is travelling much faster than the target because they are coming from behind it. It is also easy to shoot over the target by stabbing instead of swinging smoothly.

You have plenty of time to shoot the second target. See it clearly before you swing to shoot it. With practice you will find your own rhythm and the feet positions and break points that work for YOU. Don't give it up as too difficult ... it has an added bonus when used as a training tool:

Because you should always shoot the first bird normally, and it is therefore important to concentrate on always breaking your first bird in any pair, skeet doubles will improve your individual skeet shots.

If you are having a problem with a particular target in your normal skeet rounds, have a round of doubles: you will be surprised how your swing and rhythm will improve.

The only individual targets you do NOT get to shoot as a first target in doubles are Low 2 and Low 3 and High 5 and High 6 (and of course both High and Low 8).

Skeet doubles are fun because you move from Station to Station much faster in a squad. You also get a second chance a the same pair in each round and you will find that most shooters improve their score on the return half of each round because of this. And you don't get time to think about how to shoot the second bird because it all happens in one sequence. And because it does take a little more skill, a good round will do wonders for your confidence.

So next time your club shoots skeet, try some doubles. It's easier than you think!

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS MAY 1999

It was supposed to have been the worst Trap Nationals ever! Held in a sleepy little outback town in the middle of nowhere, with insufficient accommodation, inadequate infrastructure, nothing to do and nowhere to go. Well, about the only thing that Roma's detractors actually got right was the fact that the Trap Nationals were held there. The township of Roma and the Roma Gun Club pretty much decimated the rest of the story from whoa to go.

If you had rushed in and out very quickly in the middle of the day and only given it a cursory glance, you could have been forgiven for mistaking it for just another Nationals. But if you hesitated, even for a moment, it was obvious that this was something different - something special. Most of the usual problems encountered at Nationals were conspicuous by their absence and most of the wish-list items were blatant realities.

Like the absence of either mud or dust. Just a nice sealed road leading into an enormous sealed, marked out parking lot that looked like it had been stolen from a Westfield Shopping Center. Like the absence of flies. I don't know where they hang out in Queensland in March, but theyire not at Roma. Like the wonderful kitchen area at the eastern end of the clubhouse, which you later find out is only for morning and afternoon teas, lunch and snacks. The real dining area is out the back of the clubhouse, under an enormous awning with a concrete floor, which is fitted out with proper tables (that didn't rock) and comfortable chairs, and where they serve both breakfast and dinner that would shame many restaurants.

Like the thirteen traps in a straight line on level ground with identical perfect backgrounds and identical machines throwing identical targets. Twelve of these were for competition and one was a spare to be used for breakdowns - it never got used. Like the three extra traps at the self-contained practice ground, which adjoined the main thirteen and which ran from daylight until dark and you rarely ever had to wait to shoot. Like the separate registration building for nominations and squadding which had so many windows that you rarely ever had to stand in line. Like the efficient office staff whose boss had put a sign up on the wall reminding them that shooters are 'paying customers'.

Like the neatly laid out vendor's sites directly behind the layouts, where you could sit around and drink and talk and watch the shooting. Like the large well-equipped workshop for the trap mechanics and the gunsmith. Like the fact that most of the ladies tours got cancelled due to lack of interest. You couldn't have levered them away from the club with a crowbar. They just seemed happy to sit around on the veranda eating and drinking and chatting and playing games (jigsaw puzzles seemed to be the favorite) and watching the shooting and generally just soaking up the wonderful atmosphere.

Like the fact that if you weren't out shooting and you had become blasé with the practice traps, but you still had the urge to burn gunpowder, you simply walked across the road and shot ZZs or five stand sporting to your heart's content. And all of this was within about 70 or 80 yards of the main clubhouse. And the list just goes on and on and on! But this was only in the middle of the days. In the mornings and the evenings, you would have wondered where the hell you really were! The whole place could have easily been mistaken for a country fair, or a carnival or even a music festival. Anything but a gun club!

I knew something was way out of whack the very first morning. Whenever I run a Major Shoot, I like to get out to the Club each morning very early. Maybe an hour before anyone else. This gives me time to fuel up the golf cart, and look around the traps, and check things over, and generally plan out my day before anything else starts to happen. The shooting was programmed to start at 8.30am, so the night before I arranged with the trap mechanic to meet me there at 7 o'clock. This would give us an hour to set the traps before about 8.00am when I usually start to get busy. So I set the alarm in time to arrive at the club by 6.00am. As I drove in the gate expecting to be greeted by the usual blissful solitude, my first thought was ilive got confused by the daylight saving time conversion, I've wound my watch the wrong way, it's 8.00am not 6.00am and I'm in more do-dos than a Werribee duck.'

What made me think this? Lots of cars already in the parking lot, numerous people wandering around going about their business, the smell of bacon and eggs cooking and the sight of twenty or so people sitting around under the awning eating breakfast. I recognized one of the diners as my boss, the Tournament Director. So, on the way over from the car park to the dining area, my mind was racing to try to come up with some sort of plausible story to cover this major faux pas. However when he greeted me with a smile and suggested I join him for breakfast and made no mention of the time, I figured I would stay calm and just ad lib for a while on the assumption that maybe Shoot Marshalls clock on later up here. It was only when I noticed that his watch and mine were synchronized that the penny finally dropped. Cuzzo, you're in outback Queensland now and things are done differently here! I later learnt that the cleaners start at 4.00am, the cooks clock on at 5.00am and the workers start rocking in around 5.30. So much for my idea of an early start!

And if I thought the mornings were different, I was just as unprepared for the evenings. After the shooting is over, nobody goes home! Or if they do, it is only to shower and change and come back, because this is when the real fun starts. Every evening there was some sort of new and different entertainment. Some of it sounded almost as good as it was. Like the Pro-am Tournament and the pop-rock band and the country and western singers. But some of it I wasn't too sure about. Like how much fun can a dog jumping calcutta, or a sheep shearing competition be? Wrong!! These country people really know how to have fun. I was fascinated to see the winning dog jump nearly eight feet to get into the back of the ute, and they tell me he was still well within his limits. And as for the sheep shearing competition, which incidentally was won by a friend of mine from W.A. by the name of Brent Humphries, I have never laughed so much in all my life as when the great 'Rat' Atkins and his mate Brian Wallden, were trying to shear in the douville doubles match.

The local band 'Vision' was great, as were the C&W singers, the Walmsley Brothers and it's no wonder they won awards at Tamworth recently. But my favorite was 'Mr Buckshott', Neil Duddy. He was billed as a C&W singer but actually was extremely versatile and sang just about every great song ever recorded. Greg Hipwell and Lynne Curtis obviously enjoyed him too, as I saw them dancing together at one stage of the evening. Neil must have had nearly as much fun as the shooters because he came back for free on the last afternoon to entertain us some more and participate in the closing ceremonies. The Art Union (raffle) was a great financial success for the club, which helped them offset their enormous investment, and when the car was drawn on Tuesday night, it fittingly went to one of the local ladies.

I don't know who eventually won the Indian Arm Wrestling Competition but I did see two junior shooters put on a great show, which finished in a tie. I wonder how heavy their guns felt the next day? I did see the completion of the greasy pig run and the final result was definitely Pig - 1, Kids - 0. The closest anyone came was the biggest kid of all - the president's wife Donna, who was running a distant second when the pig finally disappeared over the horizon. At another time I saw nearly \$6000 raised for the Royal Flying Doctor Service, which was a great effort and a truly worthwhile cause.

And speaking of the RFDS, I got to shoot in the Pro-Am with the lovely lady from that organization. And although we were presented with the wooden spoon prize, I thought she shot well and if she could have only picked me up a couple more times, I reckon we could have been a big threat. The eventual winners of the event were Kevin Jarrick and George Sckaf who outlasted several other possibles in the shoot-off. However, my most vivid memory of the Pro-am was when we finished shooting and turned to leave the field. By this stage it was getting fairly late as the event had been conducted under lights and we were the last squad. The sight that greeted us was literally hundreds of people clapping and whistling and cheering and having a great time. The clubhouse was full, the verandah was full and the entire lawn area in front of the clubhouse was covered with families and people on picnic blankets and the like. It looked like a scene from a night AFL grand final.

Accommodation? Turned out to be another non-event. No one that rang Robert Nugent failed to gain their preferred lodgings. Lots of people camped on the grounds where adequate facilities were provided at a minimal cost. Of the people who stayed at caravan parks, hotels and motels, I never heard a single complaint. I stayed at the Starlight Motel on the main drag and was treated like royalty, which from what I heard was about par for the course. So much for the town being unable to cater for the increased demand during the shoot. Targets? First Nationals I've ever been to where the targets were so good that they also just became another non-event. My congratulations to the ACTA for their wisdom in target determination and to Mr Kevin Tunney of Olimpyc for both a magnificent batch of targets and his continuous co-operation and assistance to the gun club. Shoot-offs? I was preparing for ten or a dozen people in the Double Barrel. There were 49!! I still cannot believe that almost one person in every eight shot the whole 100 that day. The weather? God must have been watching the three years of blood, sweat and toil that went into getting the place ready. He gave them eight beautiful days in a row.


I've been going to the Nationals now for some twenty odd years and I can honestly say that I have never seen anything like the spectacle and the entire package that the Roma Gun Club presented over the eight days of competition. I have always been one of the staunchest advocators of a National Shooting Ground and I will always continue to be. One month soon I will devote this column to my reasons behind that conviction. However, the show that Roma put on has caused me to review and revamp an idea that I had recently been chewing over. I don't think there is any other solution to the Western Australian situation than to still hold the Trap Nationals there every six years. In conjunction with that I now think that the ideal rotation would be to hold the Shoot at the NSG four years out of every six and to make every third year an away year, going alternately to Perth and Roma once every six years. This would still afford us the main advantages of the NSG without unduly disadvantaging the only two groups of people who are truly remote from Wagga's central location. Additionally it would allow the injection of a fresh perspective occasionally.

The only other area of major significance, in my opinion, to emerge from these Nationals was the Phono-pulls used during them. I consider this subject to be of such great importance, that rather than give them a passing mention this month, I intend to devote most if not all of next month's article to this important subject and it's obviously far reaching implications.

Now to change the subject. Further to my article last month, and following long discussions with both the National President and Vice-President, as well as most of the other National Executive members who were in attendance at Roma, the Wagga Gun Club has been invited to run this year's Skeet Pre-Nationals. They have also been authorized to conduct the first National 20 Gauge Skeet Championship in conjunction with their program. To say that I am pleased with this outcome would be a mastery of understatement, and I implore all those people interested in Small Gauge shooting to get behind this event and support it. The 20 Gauge Championship will be a 100-target event conducted on the Monday preceding the Pre-nationals. This now offers the dedicated skeet shooters seven consecutive full days of competition, and I offer this information as early as possible, so that the maximum amount of time is available to incorporate it in the travel arrangements of those interested people.
