The team were successful in retaining the Cup shooting a perfect 250/250. Of the 8 National Championships on offer, Australia won 5. A great effort. 2002 WORLD DTL CHAMPIONSHIPS:

Christchurch will be hosting the 2002 World DTL Championships immediately following their Nationals. The dates of the World Titles are the 17th to the 19th March 2002 inclusive. The Nationals will commence on the 9th March.

OLYMPIC GAMES:

The Olympic Games are almost upon us and our clay target team has been selected and if you wish to attend in person and support them, we still have tickets available. The Men's Trap Final has been sold out and I have no doubt that by the time time you read this, all other finals may be sold out. This is a unique opportunity to be able to attend an Olympic Games and to support our shooters and to also see the World's best in action.



- BRISBANE GUN CLUB

Shooters from every continent of the globe were on hand during March to attend Australia's major international clay target shooting competition, the Australasian - Pacific "Grand Prix" at Brisbane Gun Club.

The competition which was held the week prior to the Sydney World Cup, was used by many of the world's best shooters from overseas, to fine tune their skills prior to entering the Olympic test event at the Sydney international Shooting Complex at Cecil Park.

Despite the fact many of Australia's representative shooters chose not to attend to take advantage of the opportunity to compete against shooters from so many overseas countries, the 2000 "Grand Prix" competition was again amongst the most successful held during the six years it has been conducted.

Included amongst this year's competitors were international visitors from Japan, Singapore, Great Britain, USA, Canada, Argentina, Barbados, Śweden, Poland, Latvia, Estonia, Slovenia, New Zealand and Namibia.

With such an impressive field of international representatives, it is disappointing that the decision makers in our sport in Australia do not encourage more of our own shooters, particularly juniors, to use the Brisbane "Grand prix" event to gain much needed valuable international experience, rather than requiring them to attend so many overseas competitions which are very expensive. The objective of the Australaisian - Pacific "Grand Prix" competition has always been to offer our Australian shooters the opportunity to compete with the world's best from both overseas and Australia and this objective will continue along with the success of the competition.

As has been the competition's format in recent times, the first disci-

pline to get under way was the double trap starting with the 'skins' badge match, which is three rounds of 50 targets. Like 'skins' in golf, shooters have the chance to record the best score in




Olympic Trap Team winners with the Angelo Zappala Memorial Teams Trophy --- Gweeden, USA, England,

The start of the Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet event saw a very quick increase in numbers with nearly 100 trap shooters and 30 skeet shoot-

ers lined up to contest the spoils.

The 'skins' badge match in both events proved very popular with plenty of money up for grabs especially in the trap competition where each round of 25 targets would be worth \$720 to the winner. In the first round, five shooters recorded clean 25s ensuring that the prize money for the round would remain in tact and jackpot to \$1,440 for round two. The intermediate section (B & C grades) was won outright by Robin Loy of Warwick with 23/25.

After another two rounds, the Open section of the 'skins' trap event was still intact, guaranteeing a total of \$2,880 for the forth round. No doubt the most money ever on offer for one round of Olympic Trap in Australia

Finally, four shooters shared the jackpot each receiving \$720 - Russell Mark, New Zealander Des Coe, Suzanne Balogh and Brett Dunstan. The intermediate section prize money was won by Robin Loy (\$480), Theresa Borrell of New Zealand (\$480), Steve Calleja (\$400), Taskeshi Okamoto of Japan (\$240), Rod McGregor (\$160) and Graeme MacKenzie of New Zealand (\$160).

In all a total of nearly \$5,000 cash was presented to the winners in the event - not bad for 100 targets of Olympic trap.

Day 5 of the competition and the Australasian - Pacific "Grand Prix" events in Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet were underway with nearly 100 trap shooters and 30 skeet shooters.

Round 1 saw plenty of good scores. Nidal Asmar and Greg Newey both recorded clean 25s, while Russell Mark, Des Coe of New Zealand, Mike Herman of the US Air Force, Conny Persson of Sweden, Brett Dunstan, Lee Wung Yew of Singapore and Steve Baynes all had 24s against their name.

The next two rounds also saw plenty of good shooting recorded and at the end of the day, Russell Mark was leading the field on 74/75, followed by Des Coe of New Zealand on 73, Nidal Asmar on 72, with Dominic Grazioli of US Air Force, Greg Newey and Ian Peel of Great Britain all on 70/75. The top junior after 75 targets was Joseph Ruffo on 69 while Dianne Reeves was leading the women's section on 66/75.

At the end of day 2, Des Coe of New Zealand had taken over the lead with 121/125, followed by Russell Mark on 120, Dominic Grazioli and Nidal Asmar on 118, with Mike Herman on 117 and Greg Newey on 116/125 making up the final six.

At the conclusion of the final - Russell mark again showed his class by finishing on 144/150, two targets ahead of Des Coe and Dominic Grazioli who had to go through the shoot off procedure to determine 2nd and 3rd.

The "Grand Prix" ISSF Skeet event also saw some great competition with Clive Barton from Tamworth turning up to add to the field of top class competitors. At the conclusion of day 1, Clive was in the lead with US junior Lauryn Ogilvie both on 73/75. Michael Maskell of Barbados, Cherie Reeves of Normanton and Adrei Ineshin, Estonia were all still in contention on 71/75.

After the 'Final', Clive Barton showed he was well on track for the Sydney World Cup by winning the event with a very creditable 121/125 + 24.

Tips on Breaking Targets By: Joe Ljutic Canterbury Voice Releases & Your Call.

The Canterbury voice release systems are becoming very popular around the Country and I for one am glad to see the step in the right direction for trap shooting sports - The Puller. We all know the problems and controversy this particular individual can generate at a shooting tournament. I personally feel the implementation of voice release



systems across the country will improve the average scores shot by the vast majority of shooters at least one or two targets per event, as they become the standard at gun clubs across the country.

Having shot over the Canterbury voice release systems a few thousand targets I find that they work very well. The problems I have witnessed with shooters not receiving on time release of the targets using this release system involve shooters that have low volume or softer voice calls with higher tome in their voice. A deeper lower tone - slightly longer duration call with as much volume as you can comfortably produce will provide the best results. For shooters that do not have a lot of natural deep tone in their voice remember that volume (how loud your call is) is your ally with a voice release system.

The only reason that I stress the value in the type of call you produce to release a target using a voice release system is that at most gun clubs referee's are usually assigned to each field to monitor the proper release of the targets being called for and shot. Occasionally you will encounter a trigger happy referee that considers it impossible to receive an improper pull using a voice release system and he or she will be more than happy to exercise their authority and take a target away from you stating the target you refused was legal. In this situation remember the failure to fire rules in the rule book. Additional items to remember in this situation . Back ground noise, PA Systems - airplanes flying overhead etc - combined with your call for the target you can get an occasional fast or slow pull using a voice release system. Event without background noise and occasional improper pull can occur. Personally, I prefer the voice release systems 1000 to 1 to their human counterparts and enjoy shooting targets with the systems in place. Adjusting your call for 95% of shooters will not be required but if you do encounter any problems - Volume and Slightly longer duration will help a great deal. When you think about it - a slight adjustment in your call for the target is an easy adjustment to make. Considering the overall quality of the pulling using a voice release system will be the same for every competitor up and down the entire firing line in every event. That in my opinion levels the playing field and scores will only improve. Remember, breaking targets is the name of the game.



Neilson again won the Ladies section with a great 24/25.



Guess what? At the finish the sun was out, bright and bushy tailed. Oh well.



CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS APRIL 2000

A couple of months ago, I elaborated at length on what I thought was the optimum content and structure of a "club" Two-Day Skeet Shoot program. This month I intend to follow that issue through to its natural conclusion and examine some ideas for National and State Skeet Carnival programs. Let's start with a State program. Over the last few years I have attended the State Skeet Shoot in most of the states, and at some time or other in the past, I have shot at the State Skeet Shoot in every state and territory of Australia. I even have a Red Ribbon from the ACT "State" Skeet Shoot, which unfortunately is no longer contested.

It used to be held at the old Canberra-Queanbeyan Gun Club, which overlooked the Queanbeyan Horse Racing Track. That Club and that Shoot have some great memories for me. It was there in 1980 that I had the pleasure of watching the great Jimmy Ellis bump the National Skeet Long Run Record up from 215 to 223. What made it so special was the fact that his achievement spanned two days, and included a night shooting event, where he shot the only possible under very adverse conditions of bad weather and poor lighting.

Anyway, back to business. Most of the States now shoot a three-day program for their Skeet Carnival, but the content and format varies considerably. Years ago, the only "Red Ribbon" events at most of the State Skeet Carnivals were the Singles and the High Gun, and the rest of the program was made up of "support events". However, in recent times, both Doubles and Handicap have entered the arena. Although most States are adding these events, some still shoot Doubles but not Handicap or vice versa. Once again the QCTA have shown the greatest foresight and customer response. For several years now they have included Singles, Doubles and Handicap in their State program. And last year, to their credit, South Australia also followed suit.

The whole idea of State Carnivals is to conduct State Title events. At the State Trap Carnivals, there are enough variations of Trapshooting, that only State Title events are held. Therefore I believe Skeet Carnivals should capitalise on the opportunity to shoot as many Title events as possible. However, because support events have been around for so long, some of them have accumulated a fair amount of tradition in their own right, even to the point of having their own perpetual trophy. Some examples of this are the NSWCTA Championship in NSW, the Don Taylor Memorial in Tasmania and the City of Melbourne in Victoria. Thus a standardised program format would need to accommodate at least one support event.

Individual event size also needs consideration. For much the same reasoning as with club shoots, as well as the limited programming time available, I believe the Doubles and the Handicap should be run over 50 targets. Additionally, the difficulty of Doubles can make longer events a bit awesome for the lower grade shooters. And experience has shown me that 50 targets is the perfect compromise for a Skeet Handicap. One round does not allow the handicap shooters to build up enough start on the scratch shooters to have a reasonable chance of being able to wear them down, whereas 100 targets will usually allow some of the more liberally handicapped competitors to gain a lead over the scratch shooters that is virtually unassailable. Two rounds is definitely the balance point where everyone has a fairly equal chance.

However, the State Singles is probably best conducted over 100 targets due to its easier format, its greater prestige and as a stamina training exercise for the National Skeet Championship. Although I think a State 20 Gauge Event is a great idea, and the VCTA are to be commended for being the first to introduce one this year, I'm sure its much too early to include it in the High Gun. For that reason it probably needs to be either the very first event or perhaps even conducted the day before the Carnival starts, depending upon the length and make-up of the program.

So now that we have the substance pretty much established, lets look at formatting. For club shoots and the National Carnival, I believe that shooting the Doubles last has so many advantages that no other option is really worth considering. However, State Carnivals introduce their own unique problem that often causes this to be revised: qualifying and conducting the State Postal Team Shoot. The need to conduct qualifying over as many targets as possible causes the Postal team to usually be the last event. This has the advantage of allowing interstate visitors to leave while its being conducted, but the disadvantage of causing them to miss the final presentations. And the desire to keep all the qualifying targets together, whilst keeping the doubles out of it, usually relegates the Doubles to the being the first event, which sacrifices all the advantages of shooting them last.

Shooting the Postal team last also causes other problems. If you retain a full days shooting on the last day ie 2×50 target events, then the Postal Team invariably ends up shooting in the dark and thereby defeating its purpose. Remember that this effect is worsened by the fact that the Skeet Shooting Season runs through the late autumn and winter into early spring and thus daylight saving is not available. To circumvent this, several variations have been tried. Before Victoria reverted from a three-

Day Program back to two days, they reduced the support event on the last day from 100 targets back to 75. Although not perfect, this worked OK. South Australia used a different plan. They shot their Postal Team in conjunction with the second event on Sunday. Of all the variations, this one probably worked the best. But maybe there's a better way!

In fact, once you make the decision to shoot the doubles last, the rest pretty much just falls into place. Saturday is the obvious choice for the 100 target Singles as it is the premier event and Saturday is the easiest day for most people to attend. One large event also limits the numbers in shoot-offs and gets them started earlier, thus increasing the chances of finalising the event on Saturday, without any thought of having to go to doubles, which would be sacrilegious for an event of this calibre.

Anyway, even if the shoot-off did become drawn out, by scheduling it for Saturday, you always have the option of calling a halt when the light fails, and coming back early on Sunday morning to finish it off. The only other event that could involve a long shoot-off and where you would not want to have to go to Doubles at any cost, would be the State Handicap, and so the obvious timeslot for it would be Friday afternoon. Here again you could shoot until dark with the option of coming back early on Saturday morning to finish up if necessary.

So now your format would be the 20 Gauge on Friday morning (or another support event if you don't wish to include Small Gauge Shooting in your program yet). This would be followed by the Handicap in the afternoon and the Singles on Saturday, both with guaranteed shoot-off plans. The feature support event would be Sunday morning and the Doubles would finalise the program on Sunday afternoon, giving you a 250 target High Gun.

This also gives you several good options for the Postal Team and a degree of flexibility. You could qualify them over the 150 of the Handicap and Singles, which is all you get with a two-day program anyway. Then you would program the Postal Shoot for Saturday evening, but add that this was dependent upon time and weather. Thus if the Singles finishes upearly and the weather is nice, you shoot on Saturday evening. However, if you run late or the weather is nasty, you reschedule for 8.00am Sunday morning, or possibly even shoot it in conjunction with Sunday's support event, as South Australia do.

Another advantage of this system is that it suits the occasional shooters better. They usually just come out for the Red Ribbon event on Saturday and generally can't make the time, or simply aren't interested in Doubles or 20 Gauge or support events. Now maybe they will also come out on Friday afternoon to make both the regular Title events. However, if they shoot well and qualify for the Postal Team, they are able to shoot in it, and still take mum and the kids to grandmas on Sunday. And that could be the impetus they need to attend the whole program next year.

Now to the National Program. There's not much wrong with it except for the Opening Ceremony and Shoulder to Shoulder Team Shoot causing us to get a late start on Thursday. This invariably means shooting into the sun at the end of qualifying and finishing in the dark. Several months ago, I invited suggestions as to how we might overcome this. Several good ideas were forthcoming. The best and most workable was to cut the All States support event on Thursday back to 50 targets, but reducing the program and cutting the High Gun back to 350 was a very bitter pill to swallow.

However, a recent suggestion to add a National Skeet Handicap to the program would avoid a program reduction while automatically providing the much-needed solution. For the reasons explained above, a skeet handicap works best at 50 targets. So if such an event was conducted a day earlier on Wednesday, after the Opening Ceremony and the Shoulder to Shoulder Team Shoot, all our problems would be solved and the program

A recent Committee Meeting of the ASSA voted unanimously to forward a submission to the ACTA along those lines. I'm sure the Championships Committee will not only view it favourably, but will also ratify our suggestion for a perpetual trophy. Jenny Burt has already been approached and has given her blessing, and I'm sure that between the Tamworth Gun Club, the ASSA and the many friends of the Burt family, a suitable memento will not be hard to arrange. So no matter what grade you shoot in, your ambition at this year's Skeet Nationals should be to make your name the first one engraved on the Col Burt Memorial National Skeet Handicap trophy.

Dear Editor,

I am writing in regards to a few articles which have been published in some of the previous editions of the CTSN, in which there have been letters sent in discussing some of the views of certain people regarding some of the newer style DTL clay target throwing machines. I feel that seeing how many people have aired their views, I would like to air mine.

I believe that there is one trap in particular in which the mechanics of the trap and the general operation of is nothing short of brilliant, with a few breakdowns and even fewer targets broken by the traps. However in saying this I must also say that at the present, what comes out of the trap houses which have these machines is not up to par with the more simplistic traps which are used. Whilst these more conventional traps are not as high-tech, and some may say durable as the new ones, they are however much more simplistic in their mechanics therefore easier to fix and probably less temperamental.

I do not imply that these newer traps are not shootable, but I believe

that they are less shootable (harder to shoot), though on a real good sunny and calm day any trap can produce good scores. The main thing that I believe which causes the shooters trouble is the fact that the targets thrown off the newer machine show less of a face than what we shooters are used to shooting at (razor edge targets). These targets thrown are then more susceptible to the wind, which means there will be less consistency in the targets.

One must however remember that no trap to date can cope with really strong wind but the older style traps seam to throw better in the wind because there is more face and more spin. The targets thrown out of an older style trap will generally take a higher or lower path (usually a higher path) depending on wind direction, but will dance less and will still show face. Targets thrown out of the newer traps will dance and do basically everything and anything, so the shooter has less chance to adjust to the conditions. I must also agree with what Adrian Cousens said about how targets should not vary in normal wind or at least not noticeably much, but the fact is that a razor edge target will and nobody can argue with that.

I will agree that the traps do not seem to show bias in angles thrown (although I would like to see these tests carried out) and that the fact that these traps do not continuously oscillate means that shooters cannot read the traps and gain an advantage, but really is it not fairer that a shooter's call decide where he is to receive his target or is it fairer that a machine decides? I would be very surprised if it is any more than a tiny percentage of shooters who do not try to read the traps and these shooters will bring themselves undone, so I believe that a trap that does not oscillate is not a good selling point.

May I add to this whole equation that the newer style traps do not have any room for adjustments when it comes to the throwing of Continental targets. I would really be interested to see just what height these traps throw the low birds, I think the outcome of a test would prove very interesting.

Before I conclude this letter, some of the previous letters published in the April edition critisised earlier letters written for having any proof of things that they had stated. Whilst these same people did not show any proof of the things they had stated. All I can say is that the proof is in the pudding as I found out when I recently attended a State Trap shoot at Wagga where Officials were scratching their heads as to why the scores were so low, (and they were low), just compare them to previous shoots like Guyra and especially Cecil Park (or shoots from the last 5 years for that matter) where these were less shooters but much higher scores shot. We cannot blame the weather either because whilst it was very boggy and wet, it only rained lightly on one of the events which was the single barrel, and for the three days it was not windy, a light wind at most. With more than 250 of the finest shooters in NSW and Victoria, the Shoulder to Shoulder Zone Teams Event was a disaster with shooters missing targets left, right and centre in perfect conditions, only 2 possibles in the handicap, 1 in the Single Barrel, a measly 20 in the Double Barrel, and 4 in the Points, which isn't too bad I guess (Perfect weather conditions). Victoria equaled and bettered these scores in very windy conditions. All I can say is that the Nationals will be very interesting.

In conclusion I would just like to say that I believe that if the manufacturers of these machines should swallow their pride and make a few minor adjustments to the machines, these machines then could become the best innovation to happen in trap shooting for along time. But if they don't do something and if this is the way of the future we just have made a difficult sport, more difficult and that it will take some time before shooters get used to shooting these types of targets (if ever). I believe that more than ever the weather will govern the quality of scores now shot. Who was it that said the simple things in life are often the best?

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 $^{\circ}$ A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."


The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts and maximum fine of \$5,500.

The Junior ISSF Training squad, on the 20th February, travelled to New Zealand to compete in the North Island ISSF Championship and the New Zealand ISSF National Championships that were held at the Waikato Gun Club at Hamilton. The team consisted of Angelique Psarakis, Sophia Psarakis, Robert Cameron, Michael Faber, Murray McAllister, Josh Lawrence (all of New South Wales) and Jarrod Fletcher, Dustin Barry, Daniel White, Sam Price (of Victoria) with Bill

smooth and enjoyable flight over and met at the Auckland airport where all guns, licenses and documentation (which had been preorganised with the New Zealand Police) was quickly cleared through customs, having being arranged on one licence, the Team Managers, saving some \$225.00.

We were meet at the airport by the hire company that was supplying us with a 12 seater bus and it was then off to Hamilton, an hour and a half drive. For many of these Juniors it was their first time away

and all were excited about the week that lay ahead of them. Our accommodation in Hamilton was at the Alcomo Motel where we have stayed on previous trips, the apartments housing lounges, kitchens, dinettes, bathrooms, spas and bedrooms that were upstairs. By the time I got back from Auckland and out to the Gun Club the final stages of the competition were under way and there was again great excitement amongst our Juniors for so many of them were shooting so well, with Robert Cameron in the Open Final in 2nd place. Robert eventually took 1st place in B Grade with a score of 127 + 43 in the Final, Dustin Barry took 2nd place in the Junior Section a 121 + 34. Robert Cameron taking 3rd in the Juniors with his score of 127 +34 and Sophia Psarakis taking 2nd in the Women's section after shooting a Personal Best of 93 + 31. All of our Juniors shot Personal Best scores and we couldn't have asked more of them. It was then off back to the Motel, the Juniors choosing 'take away' while we had a look around Hamilton.







Bill must be commended for his efforts, for he gave of his time and knowledge, free of charge, to the Junior programme. Many thanks Bill!




