

When you read these notes I will no longer be your National President. I have decided that I will not seek re election when the Full Executive meets for the first time in our National Office at the beginning of June.



Finally, to the members of the Australian Clay Target Association, thank you for allowing me the priviledge of being your President.



ACTA NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS, 2000

The 7th National Sporting Clays were again held at the ACTA National Ground in Wagga Wagga on the 20th and 21st May. Participation at this years Nationals was increased by 62% on last year and visitors were attracted from as far away as Western Australia. Members from the ACTA, SSAA and Field & Game were all represented at these Nationals.

The format for the Sporting Clays Nationals was changed from previous years with the ACTA Sporting Clays Championship being conducted on the Saturday and the Commonwealth Sporting Clays Championship being conducted on the Sunday. The National Sporting Clays Champion was to be decided over both days, this proved to be very popular with those that attended.

Saturday saw 54 competitors contest the ACTA Sporting Clays Championship in some overcast but calm weather. The overall winner of this event was Peter Tobin with a score of 96/100. Sunday and 51 competitors braved the cool but fine weather for the Commonwealth Sporting Clays Championship. The overall winner of this event was Peter Muntz with a score of 97/100. The





The overall winner and National Sporting Clays Champion for 2000 with a score over the two days of 190/200 was Peter Muntz from the Busselton CTC in Western Australia. Peter received the Royal Blue Sash and silver belt buckle for his efforts.





Completed just a few days prior to the arrival of the shooters was the new Club house - and what a great addition it has been for Club. Having secured a \$50,000 grant under the Qld. Dept. of Sport - Minor Facilities Program - the dedicated band of workers set about building their dream - the fact that they were required to install a full commerical kitchen costing around \$15,000 did not

With the Annual General Meeting conducted the previous evening - newly elected State President, Bill Allan welcomed shooters and their families to the Carnival and Shoot Marshall Wayne Reeves got the first event underway. The first event - 25

The shoot off worked its way down to one squad and they all looked settled in for the long haul. The Overall winner - claiming the O.W.Smith Perpetual Trophy,







Special thanks to the Australian Olympic Committee and the Australian Sports Commission for their financial support of this team. Also to Graham Michell for his work in organising team travel, permits to pass through Singapore, liaison with the organisers of the World Cup in Lonato etc. The eight shooters in the team were, of course, the selected Olympic team for Clay Target.

Travel for the majority of the team was with KLM/Alitalia via Singapore and was reported by team members to be one of the best trips yet. The "Inscrutable one" (Greg Chan) had the forethought to bring a pack of Wizard cards with him which provided a lot of fun both on the trip to Italy and during the slack times

Although advised not to take ammunition, some team members did so. Two turned up at their respective airports with the ammunition packed separately from other baggage. One was advised to put it in a suitcase, while the other was not permitted to take it on the plane. In Sydney, ground staff and the pilot, specifically, asked some team members whether they were carrying any ammunition. They were able to say truthfully that they were not.

Greg Chan and Darien Roach travelled with the team; Yvonne Hill and Luca Scribani Rossi departed Australia earlier and joined the team in Italy on arrival day.

Competition organisers had arranged a bus to meet the group arriving at Milan/Malpensa on 10th May and the Manager was scheduled to arrive at the same airport at the same time from Zurich. However, the Alitalia flight from Zurich was delayed and then cancelled due to a technical fault with the aircraft. Finally, a seat was found on a Swissair flight leaving about three hours later. This arrived in Malpensa about three quarters of an hour before the airport was closed by a general strike.

Fortunately, Alitalia provided a car and driver to transport Hill to Lonáta, two hours away by road.

The weather for the duration of the team's stay was reportedly unusually warm, but we found the days to be generally pleasant and sunny with very little wind. On three occasions it rained in the late afternoon or overnight. Apart from that, the only dampener on things was the knowledge of two selection appeals hanging over the heads of three team members. This caused some anxiety throughout the competitions and, I believe, affected the performances of those who had been named in the appeals. Although a conscious effort was made to keep the worry level down until the competitions were finished the matter was on everyone's mind and was a continual topic of discussion. Messages being sent to a team member by one appellant were anything but helpful until stopped by the Head Coach. The whole thing was an unwanted and unnecessary distraction.

Prior to the start of competition, a day was spent at the Beretta factory where everyone using this brand of gun had his or her gun serviced. Beretta sent cars to take the whole team on the two-hour trip to Brescia where the factory, which has been in the same family for more than 450 years, is located. Many spares were given to the team, as well as specially fitted and matched spare stocks. This was a very useful day for all involved and was much appreciated as was the lunch provided by Beretta.

Another half day was spent visiting the RC factory followed by half a day's training on a beautiful Range in Bologna before the start of the Grand Prix in Trap at Lonato.

The team stayed at the Hotel Vittorio in Desenzano on the shores of Lake Garda, a very pretty location south of the Swiss Alps. Meals were not available at the hotel apart from breakfast but there were many restaurants nearby making it easy to eat at a different place each night. Food was relatively expensive, even though the main fare was pizza or pasta. Those of us who liked fruit could easily spend A\$10 on only a few pieces at a nearby fruit and veg. store. Rooms were very clean and comfortable although we had to ask repeatedly for the air conditioning to be turned on because of the heat. Eventually, this was done about four days before our departure.

The Range complex was very good and the Australian team, as usual, made their home under the trees near the small café and restaurant at one end of the layouts. There were nine very good layouts, allowing four events to be conducted simultaneously on the second to last day. Range 1 was not popular because of the way the left-hand side curved around, giving a different background, which was disconcerting for some. Women drew this range for the Trap event and, in spite of Deserie's complaints about it, she still managed to win the event!

The machines were faster than Mattarellis, making them more difficult than usual, but still threw the clays the required dis-

The Opening Ceremony held at the range was short and informal. The President of the Italian Shooting Federation, who is also the Vice President of the IOC, made complimentary remarks about Australia's excellent level of preparation for the Olympic Games. The closing ceremony was even shorter and both were followed by buffet style food outside the range

The outstanding result at this World Cup was the gold medal won by Deserie Wakefield Baynes in Women's Trap. This medal broke the drought for Deserie who, up until then, had won five bronze medals in international competition. Other performances of note included Michael Diamond's Grand Prix win followed by a silver medal in the first event - Men's Double Trap, something of a disappointment for Michael who went into the Final in first place. In Women's Double Trap, Deserie Wakefield Baynes was 7th just one target away from the Final. Lisa Smith and Russell Mark both made their respective Finals in Trap in 6th place and remained in that place at the end.

In general, the team was co-operative and cohesive and a pleasure to be with at all times. On the day before departure for Australia, Deserie twisted her ankle quite badly and spent four hours at the Day Hospital in Verona awaiting X-ray and subsequent strapping suitable for the journey home. Luckily for all concerned, the flights were not full and most team members were able to stretch out and sleep.

As always, officials were excellent. Greg Chan gave 100% to the team and it is clear that all team members respect him and listen to his advice. Luca likewise was working for the team continually and, through his excellent contacts with the Beretta and RC factories, was able to gain great support for the team. His ability to speak Italian was of great value. His efforts were greatly appreciated by all. Darien Roach was in constant demand and gave unstintingly of his time also.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS JULY 2000

Last month I wrote about a number of issues from the Trap Nationals. Before I started, I drew up a heap of notes to work from. By the time I had used up my word quota, I was only half way through the pile. This month I intend to continue on where I left off and address a number of other issues that I believe could use an airing.

Let's start with the two new structures that have been erected at the National Ground, since we've taken it over from the Wagga Gun Club. The new administration building, commonly referred to as the National Office, and the new nominations building, technically titled the Events Office. I personally think they are both magnificent facilities that add an air of professionalism to our organization, and are well worth whatever they cost to build. I'm glad to see the end of running our organization from a converted shop that reminded me of a sardine can, and trying to run the Nationals out of offices designed for club shoots

However the official opening ceremony for the National Office was another matter entirely. When I first heard about it, I was a bit apprehensive and thought that it would more than likely be a pompous boring drawn-out affair that would probably be best avoided by the uncultured likes of myself. However my wife intervened at this point and administered an attitude adjustment. She reminded me that I am usually too quick to prejudge things and to jump to conclusions, which hindsight often showed to have been erroneous. With this in mind she suggested that we keep an open mind and go along.

I just hate it when she turns out to be right at times like that, as she was on this occasion. The opening ceremony itself was short and sweet, and actually quite appropriate and well done. Glenn and Andy both made relatively short concise speeches and then the guest speaker, Mr Michael Georgiou, the deputy major of Wagga, gave an interesting overview of the events that led up to the National Office becoming a reality. After which he cut the ribbon and the job was done. However, the best was yet to come.

The pre-advertising blurb had suggested that this momentous occasion would be followed by "light refreshments and entertainment". This turned out to be the understatement of the week. What followed was a full-blown party, complete with a band and dancing, much to the enjoyment of all those present, especially my wife. The entertainment that followed turned out to be a mixture of the prearranged and the spontaneous. The latter consisting of several guest singers and a poetry rendition by the Grand Australian Handicap winner, Mr Bill Forest, which nearly brought the house down.

The light refreshments turned out to be a full bar that never looked like running dry and the food went from strength to strength. It started out with the usual plates of "toothpick-spearable" goodies, along with biscuits and dip. But while everyone else was otherwise occupied, half the Roma Gun Club appeared, and with the able assistance of a contingent from Illawarra, they set up a BBQ facility as only they can do. Under the direction of their "spiritual" leader, the indomitable "Nugget" Nugent, they proceeded to feed all and sundry on a continuous basis right up until stumps. And all of this in an enormous marquee that was set up for the show in case of inclement weather, which fortunately never eventuated.

Halfway through the night, it suddenly occurred to me that this was what the Nationals had always been missing, a shooters party. Roma Gun Club and the QCTA had been smart enough to realize this last year, and to take that concept to the limit by putting on either a party or some sort of entertainment almost every night of the shoot. That's a lot of the reason why their shoot was such a success and why it is so fondly remembered by all those who attended. Upon further reflection I remembered that a shooters party is an integral part of the World Skeet Shoot program and then remembered that, in the US, a free dinner and entertainment is always provided on the Saturday night of all the Major Circuit Shoots around the country during the year.

With this in mind, I believe that a "Shooters Party", exactly like the one that followed the Opening Ceremony this year, should become an ongoing scheduled event at the Nationals every year. Provided that the National Executive can see the merit in such a concept and provide the necessary funding, the only thing left to establish is when it could best be held. After careful consideration it seems to me that the obvious time would be the evening of the Single Barrel day. This is the only day that gets started early, has no other complications scheduled and usually has its shoot-offs tidied up fairly quickly.

Now, onto another point. The Family Deauville Doubles event celebrated its twentieth birthday this year. The event is a lot of fun and all

the people who are eligible to shoot in it, enjoy it immensely. However, the people who aren't eligible have been able to see how much fun it was, and have been asking for an Open Deauville Doubles event to also be conducted at the Nationals for a long time. Unfortunately, due to the saturation of the program, this has never been possible. However, this year, due to the opening ceremony of the new National Office adding an extra day to the program, it was decided that sufficient time would be available for such an event. Thus the Commonwealth Deauville Doubles was allocated to be held at the Nationals this year, in the timeslot usually occupied by the Macintosh team Shoot.

The event was a great success with 176 people participating in it, and there could have been more. On the day of the event itself, there were people who hadn't realized it was on, running around organizing last minute partners, and still others trying to enter after nominations had closed. During and after the event, I heard a lot of talk about being better prepared next year and getting in some training before the event. Unfortunately, therein lies a problem. As I said, the event was inserted in the program this year to fill in the gap provided by the opening ceremony. As such, it was a one-off occurrence.

However, due to its popularity and the fact that it has been on the wish list of so many for so long, I believe we should look at ways of keeping it in the program. Under the current format, that would simply not be possible. Every day is already filled to capacity, especially the double rise day, which is the obvious slot for it. That day already bulges at the seams by having the Macintosh Team Shoot in the Morning and the National Double Rise and the Family Deauville Doubles in the afternoon. Such a full agenda often causes the end of the Deauville Doubles qualifying to be done in the half dark, thereby compromising it's equity, and then the shoot off is usually done under lights, when nearly everyone else has gone home. Maybe there's a better way!

Perhaps a rearrangement of the program is warranted. Maybe, on the day after the Pointscore, we could shoot the Macintosh in the morning, then reset the traps and shoot the Open Deauville Doubles in the afternoon. Then the following day we could shoot the Double Rise in the morning and the Family Deauville Doubles in the afternoon. That would allow sufficient time for all events and provide at least one event each day that everyone was eligible to shoot. And while we're contemplating a reshuffle, why can't we eliminate resetting the traps twice, from singles to doubles and back again. Years ago we shot the Double Rise last, and I think that was a much better format for a number of reasons. So where would we put the Champion of Champions, which is currently last? What about before or after the Handicap and before the Double Barrel. That would then tidy up both the "non 15 meter" Titles before we started on the "big three"- the Macintosh qualifying events. Chew it over for a while and then pass your thoughts on to the Executive.

National High Guns are usually a pretty simple affair. First only in the Overall and the three divisions, with shoot-offs usually not being required. However this year a sponsor materialized for three places in all four grades and so graded High Guns eventuated for the first time. The unforeseen offshoot of this was that numerous graded High Gun shoot-offs became necessary on a rainy Thursday afternoon when everyone was trying to get away early. Technically this would have required a long and complicated shoot-off format to be initiated and another trap to be set up for Double Rise. Instead I suggested to the Tournament Director and all the participants involved, that with their blessing and a little poetic license, maybe invoking an NSSA shoot-off rule might be prudent under the circumstances.

That rule dictates that if all the participants involved in a shoot off offer management a mutually agreed upon method of determining the places, management may accept. With that in mind I suggested that instead of running the normal 45 target sequence in the shoot-off, maybe the much simpler 15 target sequence of the Champion of Champions might provide an equally equitable but much more expedient result. To say that they were all enthusiastic about this option would be an understatement, and thus we got the shoot-offs over, the presentations done and everyone off home much sooner than would have otherwise been the case. The point here is that we could probably do with a similar rule written into our book as soon as possible. Think about it and then let the rules committee know what you think.

Now, to change the subject. At the AGM of the Skeet Shooters Association last November, three main objectives were set for the year. Establishing a web site, aligning ACTA Skeet Rules with NSSA Skeet Rules and running a Demonstration Shoot along NSSA guidelines. The web

site is now up and running thanks to Max Weston and Peter Vosper. The ACTA Management Committee have agreed, at least in principal, to a rules alignment and now, thanks to George Petrou, an NSSA style shoot is being held in Sydney at the end of the month where registered targets can be shot. See the full advertisement in June's CTSN.



An enjoyable time was had by all and of significant benefit to the shooting movement in that four of the guests desire to return to the club for further participation in the sport. Thanks to Uniserve.


Cohuna - Easter 2000



Psychological Charactertistics of Peak Performance

Michael Kruger-Davis

Psychological skills training for shooting involves those topics that have been the subject of previous articles; goal setting, concentration, attention, visualisation, relaxation and competition preparedness, however before we can incorporate these into a training program it is necessary to know if there is an optimal psychological state for peak performance.

Williams (1993) believes that if such a state can be identified for programs or for a given individual, then there is a foundation for developing a mental skills program, provided these skills can be trained. She examined three sources for helping her identify the psychological characteristics underlying successful athletic performance. These are; firstly, the data generated from researchers who have asked athletes to recall their subjective perceptions during their greatest moments they ever had whilst participating in sport. Secondly, the data from studies that compared successful athletes with less successful athletes, and thirdly, information from what top athletes, coaches, scouts and sport psychologists think about what it takes to be successful in sport.

Psychological Characteristics During Peak Performances

Eight mental and physical conditions have been identified by athletes as being characteristics of the feelings they have at those moments when they are doing something extraordinarily well;

- 1. Being mentally relaxed or in a state of inner calm. Sometimes this can be described as the sense of time being slowed down and having a high degree of concentration.
- 2. Being physically relaxed so that muscles feel loose and fluid.
- 3. Confident /optimistic; feelings of self-confidence, being optimistic and positive about our own performance. This is very important during challenging times within the competition.
- 4. Focused on the present. Shooting is a here and now sport and we feel a sense of harmony when the body and mind is able to work as one unit. So in order for the body to perform here and now, our minds must also be in the here and now. This means shooting this target and not the one missed (in the past) or not the ones in the shoot off (in the future). By controlling the thoughts about the future and the past the body can perform automatically without conscious or deliberate mental effort.
- 5. Highly energised. A high energy state is frequently described as feelings of joy, ecstacy, intensity or being 'hot'.
- 6. Extraordinary awareness. A state of mind that allows the athlete to be acutely aware of their own bodies and of those around them.
- 7. In control. The body and mind seem to do automatically what is right without the need to exert or impose control.
- 8. In the coccoon, This involves feelings of detachment from the external environment, and any potential distractions, where the athlete has complete access to one's powers and skills.

The eight qualities listed above are those that are evident when athletes reach peak performance. But there is a difference between being a very good club competitor and being a national champion. Williams (1993) continues and describes a psychological construct referred to as flow. Flow was is defined by Csikszentmilhalyi when the challenge equals skill level, when one knows what to do, one has clear goals, deep concentration, a sense of being in control, and a sense of loss of time; and the activity becomes autotelic. For a competitor to be a good club competitor then they need to be in flow whereas to be a state or national champion the flow has to be combined with the other qualities of peak performance.

Psychological Differences Between Successful and Unsuccessful Athletes.

Research involving Olympic qualifiers and non-qualifiers found that finalists coped more easily with competitive mistakes, were better able to control and utilise anxiety, had higher self confidence and more positive self talk, had more gymnastics related dreams, and had more frequent imagery of internal versus external nature.

External imagery occurs when the person himself/herself from the position of the external observer, for the shooter this would mean watching yourself as if on video. Whereas internal imagery involves an approximation much more like the actual perspective when the skill is being performed. For the shooter this means imagining being inside the body of the person shooting and experiencing the same sensation that one would expect to experience if one was actually shooting.

From the research that studied successful and unsuccessful athletes certain commonalities appeared in the psychological characteristics of the successful competitors. Firstly, the researchers reported that the athletes believed in themselves more and were more self-confident. Secondly, successful athletes concentrated more and were less likely to be distracted and were more task orientated in their concentration rather than being preoccupied with outcome thoughts. Thirdly, successful athletes were preoccupied with their sport in a positive way. Next, successful athletes were found to have less anxiety before and after the competition and were more able to control anxiety levels during competitions. Finally, most of the better athletes have a higher ability to rebound from mistakes.

What Top Sport People Think it takes to "Make it".

When interviewed regarding what it takes to be a top sportsperson, there was considerable disagreement about the physical attributes necessary for excellence. However, when asked about psychological attributes there was total agreement that commitment and self control were identified as the two key ingredients for excellence.

Commitment means having the drive, determination, heart and attitude. Setting appropriate goals and being hungry helps. Self control means being able to perform well big games and tight situations as well as in normal games and situations.

Williams (1993) believe training for competitions such as the Nationals or state championships is a product of both body and mind. Just improving physical skills, strategies, and conditioning increases the likelihood of peak performance, learning to control psychological readiness and the ideal mental climate for peak performance also enhances performances.
