ACTA OLYMPIC TRAP CHAMPIONSHIP

Continuing on from his success at the World Championships, Michael Diamond was the top qualifier for the final with a perfect score of 75/75. Nathan Cassells and Adam Vella were the next qualifiers from Lee Wung Yew, Tom Turner and Ben Kelley.

Michael shot a further 24/25 giving a final score of 99/100 to take overall from Nathan Cassells 98/100 second with Lee Wung Yew 96/100 in third place.

AA Grade winner was Adam Vella 73/75; A Grade winner was Ben Radford 79/84; B Grade winner was Frank Ruffo 67/77; and C Grade winner was Murray McAllister 64/75.

Ben Radford was successful in the Junior section with a score of 94/100 from Andrew Brady 92/100 second with Rocky Manno in third place on a score of 89/100.

The Women's section was won by visiting Japan shooter Keiko Suzu with a score of 89/100. After a brief shootoff Nessa Jenkins claimed second place with 87/101 from Diane Reeves with a score of 86/101.



AA Grade winner was Russell Mark 118/125; A Grade winner was Graham Blaskett 118/125; B Grade winner was Dustin Barry 114/125; and C Grade winner was Bill Shelton 100/125.

Nathan Cassells, Maryborough shot 25 in the final to take the 2000 National Olympic Trap Championship with a score of 148/150. The Silver medal went to Michael Diamond on a score of 147/150 with the Bronze medal being won by Glenn Hayden on a score of 145/150.

AA Grade winner was Adam Vella 120/125; A Grade winner was Daniel Power 117/125; B Grade winner was Frank Speranza 116/125; and C Grade winner was Murray McAllister 113/125.

Ben Radford also won his second Junior event with a score of 116 plus 25 from Steve Calleja 114 plus 24 and in third place was Sam Price with a score of 113 plus 24.

In the final David Cunningham shot 23/25 to win the Commonwealth title with a final score of 144/150. After the final the two brothers from Tamworth, Clive and George Barton were both tied on 143 necessitating a shootoff. After the shootoff younger brother George claimed second place with a score of 143/150 plus 9 while Clive had to settle with third place.

ACTA Rule Changes effective Jan 01, 2001

The following rule changes will apply from Jan 01, 2001. These changes have been made to: (i) align ACTA Skeet Rules with NSSA Skeet Rules, (ii) correct several typographical errors in the current Rulebook and (iii) include the necessary authorisation to allow the use of "phonopull" equipment in all ACTA shooting. All rules that have been altered or added for 2001 are listed below, with the changes shown in bold italics for easy reference. For an abbreviated summary of these changes, please refer to page 19 of the September 2000 issue of the CTSN, where the basis of these proposed changes was aired for public comment.

GUIDELINES FOR REFEREES

1. Read shooters' names from squad sheets and for Trapshooting ensure competitors are on correct tracks and marks. For Skeet shooting ensure competitors are lined up in the correct order beside station one. For safety reasons ask all shooters to check for obstructions in barrels.

2. The Referee must stand where he has a clear view of targets and competitors. For Trapshooting, preferably between lanes 2 and 3, approximately 2 metres behind the competitor's shooting mark. If there is excessive background noise the Referee may move between lanes 2 and 4 in order to hear the competitors call so as to give all competitors equity of competition. For Skeet shooting the Referee should stand in the positions indicated in the field diagram.

5. Target to be shown by Referees,

- (a) For Trapshooting, one target shot not-to-count shall be offered to each shooter, for his first target, of a day. For Skeet shooting, one target from each house shall be offered.
- (b) When the competitors are all in position the Referee must release a target for the first shooter to look at on his call.(i) At the beginning of all events
 - (ii) After any breakdown or delay
 - (iii) At the commencement of all shoot-offs
 - (iv) On each trap used for a shoot-off
 - (v) After any break for shells etc during a shoot-off
 - (vi) If a competitor receives two broken targets in a row.
- (c) *For Trapshooting*, if it is a six man squad and there is to be 1 target per shooter eye-opener, number 6 shooter must move up to take the first target, but he must still be shown a target on his call before he shoots at his eye-opener target.

6. The Referee must at all times ensure that the target is released immediately on the competitor's call. Refer Rule 4.11(a).

9. The Referee is to see that the next shooters gun remains fully open until the result of the previous shot has been called. He should ensure that the competitor does not call and the target is not released before the result has been called, refer Rule 1.01e.

SECTION 1

Rule 1.02(d)

For Trapshooting, once reaching his shooting mark a shooter must stand on the station, position himself, load his gun and call for his target within 10 seconds after the shooter preceding him has completed his firing or after the Referee has given the signal to commence firing or to resume firing. Non compliance with the above will draw a warning from the Referee, subsequent occurrences per event will be penalised one target each.

Rule 1.02(e)

For Skeet shooting, it shall be considered a time infringement if a shooter deliberately delays more than 15 seconds for each shot on a station and the referee shall warn him/her once each round without penalty. This rule should be interpreted in conjunction with rule 4.19 (f) which indicates that a squad should complete a round of Skeet in 22 minutes.

Rule 1.03(b)

For Trapshooting the competitor must stand with both feet entirely within the boundary of the shooting station, except as allowed under section 1.10(e). For Skeet the shooter must stand with any part of both feet within the boundaries of the designated shooting station.

Rule 1.03(f)

For Trapshooting, unless, in the opinion of the referee, it is contrary to the equity of the competition, a competitor taking part in the competition may shoot at pieces of his own target, if he so wishes.

Rule 1.05(a)

A normal skeet squad is composed of five shooters. Any five shooters may designate themselves as a squad. All shooters shall be formed into squads of five shooters each, as nearly as possible. Less than five shooters is permitted for expedience, but more than six should not be squadded for safety reasons, except in shoot-offs, see rule 3.23(a).

Rule 1.05(b)

The officiating Referee MUST have the trap adjusted immediately if it is not throwing legal targets. Immediately following such alteration, a target must be thrown and the competition continued. Unauthorised shooters must not interfere with or attempt to interfere with the setting of the traps. Violation of this rule may be grounds for disgualification from the event.

Rule 1.05(c)

The competitor whose turn it is to shoot may observe a legal target from a traphouse where the trap has been adjusted or repaired, or where an illegal target has been released.

Rule 1.05(e)

At the beginning of each round the squad *may* observe *two legal* targets from each house.

Rule 1.05(g)

The referee shall ensure that the target is released "instantly" (see rule 4.11a) in response to the competitor's acceptable call. If a shooter fires at what is considered to be an illegal target, due to the timing of the release, he must abide by the result.

Rule 1.08(e)

For Trapshooting, in single target shooting, two targets are released at the same time. However, for Skeet shooting, in singles, if by error or for mechanical reasons doubles are thrown and the shooter shoots and breaks or misses the correct target, it shall be scored as in singles. It shall be the shooter's prerogative to elect to shoot or withhold his shot when doubles are thrown in the calling of singles.

Rule 1.08(f)

When a competitor shoots out of turn or from the wrong lane. However, in Skeet shooting, the referee may grant a shooter permission to shoot out of his turn where it is justified in the interests of saving time.

Rule 1.09 NO TARGET - DOUBLES / PROOF DOUBLES - SKEET

(a) If the first target emerges broken, the doubles shall, in all cases, be declared no targets (both) and a proof double shall be

thrown to determine the result of both shots.

(b) If a double is thrown but the targets collide, before the result of the first target is determined, they shall be declared no targets (both) and the result of a proof double shall determine the score of both shots.

(c) If the first target of a double is thrown irregular as to deviate from the prescribed line of flight and is not shot at, a proof double shall determine the score for both shots, whether the second target is fired upon or not. The referee shall be the sole judge of irregularity.

(d) If the first target of a double is thrown irregular as to deviation from the prescribed line of flight, and is shot at, the result shall be scored for the first shot, and if the shooter is deprived of a normal second shot for any of the reasons in 1.09(e), the second target only shall be declared no target and a proof double shall be thrown to determine the result of the second shot.

(e) If the shooter is deprived of a normal second shot for any of the following reasons, the result of the first shot shall be scored, and the second target only shall be declared no target and a proof double shall be fired to determine the result of the second shot. (i) The second target is thrown broken

i) The second target is thrown broken.

- (ii) The second target is thrown irregular as to deviate from the prescribed line of flight and is not shot at.
- (iii) The second target is not thrown at all.
- (iv) The second target is not thrown simultaneously.
- (v) Both targets are broken with the first shot.
- (vi) The wrong target is broken with the first shot.
- (vii) The first shot is lost and a collision occurs before the result of the second shot is determined.
- (viii) The second target collides with fragments of the first target properly broken, before the result of the second shot is determined.
- (ix) The result of the first shot is determined, and interfer ence occurs before the second shot is fired.

(f) There shall be no penalty for withholding the first shot when either target of a double is irregular. A proof double shall determine the score of both shots thereafter.

(g) If a double is thrown and an allowable malfunction occurs on the first shot, it shall be declared no target, and the result of a proof double shall determine the score of both shots. If such malfunction is excessive (not allowable) the proof double shall be thrown to determine the result of the second shot only.

(h) In shooting a proof double after the first target (of a double) is lost, if the shooter fires at or breaks the wrong target first, said proof double shall be scored as both targets lost. If in such a proof double after the first target (of a double) is dead, the shooter fires at, or breaks, the wrong target first, it shall be scored as first target dead and second target lost.

Rule 1.09A NO TARGETS - DOUBLES - TRAP

Rule 1.10(c)

The competitor has an apparent malfunction and attempts to open the gun before the referee examines it. The competitor must not turn around and must keep his gun pointed in the direction of the traphouse until the Referee has given his decision. If a competitor's gun breaks down and it is necessary to seek a replacement the competitor is allowed five (5) minutes to do so. If this is not possible the competitor may leave the squad and finish the remaining targets of the round at a time decided by the Management.

Should a gun malfunction occur during a shoot-off, the competitor has *10* minutes to repair or replace the gun. Failure to comply "Lost target".

Rule 1.10(e)

A foot position violation occurs. For Trapshooting, the competitor's feet must be behind any line indicating the firing mark assigned to him. He must stand with both feet completely within 1 square metre; this square shall extend 50 centimetres either side of the centre of the shooting lane and shall extend backwards 1 metre from the assigned handicap mark. However, provided his front foot is as close as possible to the firing mark, a shooter with a wide stance will not be penalised if his back foot extends beyond the rear edge of the shooting square. For Skeet shooting the shooter must stand with any part of both feet within the boundaries of the designated shooting station.

Rule 1.24 SKEET ROUND PROCEDURE

- (a) A squad shall start shooting at Station 1 in the order in which the names appear on the score sheet. The first shot scored lost in the round shall be repeated immediately as the optional shot and recorded in the 25th column on the score sheet. Should the first target lost occur in a double, the lost target shall be repeated as a single
- (b) The first shooter shall start shooting singles at Station 1, shooting the high house target first and the low house target second. Then, loading two shells, he/she shall proceed to shoot doubles, (shooting the first shot at the target from the nearest skeet house and the second shot at the target from the far thest skeet house), before leaving the station. The second shooter shall then proceed likewise, followed by the other members of the squad in their turn.
- (c) Then the squad shall proceed to Station 2 and repeat the same sequence as on Station 1.
- (d) The squad shall then proceed to Station 3 where each shooter will shoot at a high house single target first and a low house single target second before leaving the shooting station.
- (e) The same procedure shall be followed at Station 4 and 5.
- (f) Upon advancing to Station 6 the leadoff shooter will shoot singles in the same sequence as at the previous stations. Then, loading two shells, he shall shoot doubles by shooting the low house target first and the high house target second before leaving the station. The other shooters will follow in their turn.
- (g) The same procedure will be followed at Station 7. However, when shooting the single targets, only one shell at a time should be loaded. It is recommended that a sign to this effect be erected on the side of the low house.
- (h) The squad will advance to Station 8 where each shooter shall shoot at a target from the high house before any member of the squad shoots at a target from the low house.
- (i) The squad shall then turn to Station 8 low house and the leadoff shooter will shoot at the low house target
- (j) The shooter shall repeat the low house target for his optional shot before leaving the station, provided he is still straight (no lost targets in the round). The other shooters will follow in turn.
- (h) At this time the shooter should verify his own score.
- On Station 1 to 6, two cartridges may be loaded to shoot single targets, but on Stations 7 and 8 only one shell may be loaded or singles.
- (m) When a shooter intentionally fires a second time at the same target, he shall be warned by the referee. The second time the shooter intentionally fires a second shot at the same target in any event, the penalty shall be automatic disqualification from the event.

Rule 1.25(b)

Uneven numbered rounds ie Rounds 1 and 3. Commencing on Station 1 and proceeding through Station 4, a double is to be shot from each station, taking the high house first. On Stations 5, 6 and 7 a double is to be shot taking the low house first. Reversing back through Stations 6, 5 and 4 a double is to be shot taking the low house first. On Stations 3 and 2, a double is to shot taking the high house first. Total number of targets = 24. Even numbered rounds ie Rounds 2 and 4. To be shot as in uneven numbered rounds but finishing on Station 1. Total number of targets = 26.

Rule 1.25 (c)

The rules for doubles in a Doubles event are the same as the rules for doubles in a regular round of skeet.

Rule 1.25 (d)

Clubs have the option of conducting a 25 target event. This event will be the same as an uneven numbered round with the addition of a single high house target immediately following the concluding double from Station 2.

SECTION 2

Rule 2.08(c)

For his *third* round his handicap allowance shall be the difference between the average of his first two rounds and 25.

Rule 2.08 (d)

For his *fourth* round his handicap allowance shall be the difference between the average of his first three rounds and 25.

SECTION 3

Rule 3.23(a)

All ties shot in championships must be shot off to determine the placings. Regular Skeet shoot-offs shall be miss and out by target. Doubles shoot-offs shall be miss and out by station. Any number of shooters that management deems practical may be squadded together for a shoot-off. However when more than one squad participates in a shoot-off, they may commence shooting together on different fields providing management deems that situation equitable. Pacer for lone participant on a field in a shoot-off shall not be permitted.

Rule 3.23(b)

At the discretion of club management, skeet shoot-offs may be conducted in conjunction with following events or as doubles from Stations 1 to 7, or as doubles from Stations 3,4 & 5, or any other format that is mutually agreed between shoot management and all the shooters involved.

Rule 3.23(c)

Shoot-off competitors shall carry enough shells for a complete round of Skeet. Failure to comply *may be grounds for disqualification*.

Rule 3.23(d)

Competitors are allowed five (5) minutes to replenish ammunition between rounds of shoot-off. Failure to comply *may be grounds for disgualification*.

Rule 3.23(f)

Should a gun malfunction occur during a shoot-off, the competitor has ten (10) *minutes* to repair or replace the gun. Failure to comply "lost target".

Rule 3.23(g)

If shooters involved in a shoot-off offer management a mutually agreed upon method of determining the places, management may accept. If management does not accept, shoot-offs must continue and any shooter who refuses to continue forfeits.

Rule 3.25(a)

High Gun Shoot-offs at Nationals shall comprise of skeet targets from 2, 4 & 6 (normal skeet, consisting of 10 targets in all), and one pair of doubles from stations 3 & 5, totalling 14 targets in all. The targets shall be shot on the stations in normal numerical sequence and the result shall be determined by total score to count, continuing until a result is achieved.

Rule 3.25(b)

When Skeet or ISSF Skeet is included in a high gun over a *trap* shooting program, the High Gun Shoot-Off shall include a high and low target from station four. When Skeet Doubles are included over a program, the High Gun Shoot-off shall include a double from station four with shooting continuing in brackets of two targets from each type of event until a result is achieved.

SECTION 4

Rule 4.09(b)

Station 1 is located at the left end of the base chord, and station 7 at the right end when facing the centre while standing on the periphery of the segment. Stations 2 to 6 inclusive, are located on

the periphery at points equal distant from each other (the exact distance between stations 1 and 2, 2 and 3, etc. is 8.14metres). Station 8 is located at the centre of the base chord.

Rule 4.09(c)

Shooting Stations one and seven are a square area 900 mm on a side with two sides parallel to the base chord. Shooting Stations two to six inclusive, are a square area 900 mm on a side, with two sides parallel to a radius of the circle drawn through the station marker. Shooting station eight is a rectangular area 900 mm wide by 1800 mm long, with the long sides parallel to the base chord. The location of each shooting station shall be accurately designated. For Shooting Stations one to seven it is in the centre of the nearest side to the target crossing point, of a suitable pad 900 mm square with the front edge on the periphery of the circle. However, the pad for shooting station eight is placed lengthwise on the centre point of the base chord and is 900mm by 1800mm. The centre of Station eight is on a line drawn between the centres of stations one and seven. The designated shooting station for each house, is the half of the rectangular pad, most distant from the respective house.

Rule 4.09(e)

One target should emerge from a traphouse (called high house) at a point 90 centimetres beyond the front of pad one (measured along the base chord extended) and 3.05 metres above ground level. The other should emerge from a traphouse (called low house) at a point 90 centimetres beyond the front of pad seven (measured along the base chord extended) and 75 centimetres from the base chord extended (measured on side of target crossing point) and 1.07 metres above the ground.

Rule 4.09(f)

Suitable markers shall be placed at points 40.23 metres and 55 *metres* from both the high and low house measured along the flight of a regular target. The first marker shall indicate the shooting boundary limit and the second marker shall indicated the distance a target shall travel in still air.

Rule 4.09(g)

The target crossing point must be marked in a visible manner where geographically possible.

Rule 4.09(h)

It is recommended and desirable that the side of the skeet house, from the bottom of the chute to the top of the house, be a very light colour or painted white where feasible.

Rule 4.11(a)

Is released "instantly" in response to the competitor's acceptable call. It may be released by the puller, who must be either the referee or an authorised target release operator appointed by shoot management. Or it may be released by voice activated electronic equipment, provided that equipment incorporates a delay mechanism that is timed to imitate the biological reaction time of a human puller. This delay time is necessary to allow equitable integration between events using pullers, and events using phono-pulls.

Rule 4.11(b)

Passes within 45 centimetres horizontally or vertically of a point 4.57 metres above the target crossing point. For this purpose a target setting hoop should be used. Such hoop is 90 cm in diameter and mounted on a 4.02 meter long pole.

Rule 4.11(c)

In still air, when passing through the centre of the target setting hoop, must carry to a distance equivalent on level ground to 55 metres with an allowable tolerance of plus or minus two metres.

Rule 4.16(a)

For all *12 gauge* events (Commonwealth, State, Zone, District, Club) other than *Trap* Handicap, Sporting Clays or ISU, the load is limited to 28 gram struck measure or equivalent shot size not larger than No. 6. (Trap), No. 7. (Skeet). Reloads are permitted in all events including National Championships.

Rule 4.16(b)

Twenty gauge events shall be open to all guns of 20 gauge or smaller using shot loads limited to 24 gram struck measure of shot size not larger than no 7.

Rule 4.16(c)

Twenty eight gauge events shall be open to all guns of 28 gauge or smaller using shot loads limited to 21 gram struck measure of shot size not larger than no 7.

Rule 4.16(d)

410 bore events shall be open to all guns of 410 bore or smaller using shot loads limited to 14 gram struck measure of shot size not larger than no 7.

Rule 4.16(e)

A gun of larger gauge, which has been converted to take a smaller gauge shell, may be used in an event for which it has been converted provided that the shell itself complies with the rule requirements for that event.

Rule 4.16 (f)

For *Trap* handicap and sporting clay events, load is limited to 32 grams struck measure or equivalent, shot size not larger than No.6.

Rule 4.19 (a)

For Trapshooting, no shooter may be allowed to enter an event after the commencement of the second round of that event.

Rule 4.19 (b)

For Trapshooting, any shooter who after completing his event, shoots for targets only, is deemed ineligible for any recognition in the event or High Gun program.

Rule 4.19(d)

For Trapshooting, there shall be no practice permitted between qualification and shoot-off.

Rule 4.19(e)

Where a shooter has registered in a Skeet event, but does not show up to start the event with his squad, he will not be permitted to shoot up after the first man in the squad has fired a shot at Station 2. He may join the squad for all later rounds, but the round missed because of lateness must be shot on the proper field in the first vacancy, or after all other contestants have finished. In the interest of conserving time the shoot management may modify this rule to meet special conditions, if it so desires.

Rule 4.19(f)

Under normal conditions, a squad should complete a round of skeet in 22 minutes. Unusually slow shooting squads who are disrupting the normal sequence cannot object to being transferred to a substitute or practice field.

Rule 4.27(f)

The officiating Referee MUST have the trap adjusted immediately if it is not throwing legal targets. Immediately following such alteration, a target must be thrown and the competition continued. Unauthorised shooters are not to interfere with or attempt to interfere with the setting of the trap. Violation of this rule may be grounds for disgualification from the event.

Rule 4.32(g)

Break recognition and badges for Skeet shall conform to the Trap break rules above, except that separate breaks will be recognised for regular Skeet in all four gauges, and for Skeet Doubles. Any deviation from a break in progress, such as shooting a different event or changing the format of a shoot-off make it different from the normal shoot-off format for that event, will neither add to nor terminate a break in progress. Shoot-off targets will only be recognized if they conform to the format of the event except in Skeet Doubles Shoot-offs, where doubles at 3,4&5 is the normal shoot-off format, and thus shall be counted in the Skeet Doubles break.

Rule 4.33 LONG BREAK RECORDS - TRAP

Rule 4.34 LONG BREAK RECORDS - SKEET

Australian Long Break Records in Skeet and Skeet Doubles shall conform to the Trap Long Break Record rules except that "allcomers records" will not be recognised separately and Australian Skeet Records may be established by any person legally competing in an ACTA event in Australia. Any records established outside Australia will not be recognised for this purpose.

Rule 4.35 SKEET RULES - OTHER

Any Skeet rules not specifically covered in these rules should be determined by reference to the current NSSA rulebook.

Mount Isa CLUB SHOOT Saturday 11 November 2000

November being one of our three night shoots each year, saw a change in starting time to 3.30 pm on Saturday 11th. Competition kicked off with 25 targets Skeet off handicap which was won by David Stitt with 22/25. Paul Whatmore (who is making a return to clay shooting after eye surgery) held on to second place with 18/25 just one point ahead of Ross Ohlsen who had to be content with third.

The next discipline to be contested was Ball Trap, which soon sorts out the pecking order. Ross Walsh made his presence felt by winning A grade with 24/25. David Stitt and Peter Rose shot 21/25 to win B and C grades respectively.

With rain falling and a thunder storm in the offering the decision was made to call a halt and await further developments. Rule (2D) member from other C.T association. He might want to be new member; coming from other association would have no grading or handicap so treat him like a new member rule (2Q). After shooting 50 targets be graded etc. In rule (2e) high scores rule, does a shooter get 1/2 metre every time he shoot 15-24 and shooting 25+ gets 1 1/2 rule (3b) 15 metre percentages to include "all" 15 metre events. Would these be all double barrel, all single barrel and double rise or DR would be with the next. Proposal only. Why leave out continental there is more possibles shot in continental than single barrel, and will be the single barrel that brings the shooters down in their grades Rule (4). If double rise gives another grade you could be a common mark A grade and double rise B grade and your program 50t DB and 50t DR. How do you work out high gun if you shoot part A grade and part B grade (I must add this is my view not Maryborough club). And I forgot, is grading and regrading still done at 200 targets also if double rise grading is coming in, it would pay to keep scores 12 months ahead for grading when it starts.

This event is by invitation only to those competitors and their countries. As you can see, when you win an event at this competition, as both Michael and Russell have done in the past, you know that you are 'the best in the world'.

Airlines via Singapore, for Dubai and Larnaca. We had a one hour stopover in Singapore and a ten hour stopover in Dubai where the airline put us up in one of their 5* hotels to rest and freshen up. This was a 'free of charge' service and helped break up the 25 hour flight. Emirates has always gone out of their way to make the Australian Clay Target Team feel welcome each time we have used their services, allowing us excess baggage and if possible leaving seats along side each person, issuing lounge vouchers and as already mentioned, the free accommodation in Dubai and then again in Melbourne on the return trip. This is indeed a 'Great Airline' with good prices to most countries. Our trip was organised by AIS Travel (Ansett) in Canberra by Rachel - a very helpful lady who went out of her way to help, many thanks from all of the Team members.

All the shells used were RC4, seven and a half, 24 gram loads - a great shell. Thanks a million Luca from all of the Team and many thanks to RC Cartridges.

Thursday 19th October - official Double Trap practice, the Technical Meeting and the

Official Opening Ceremony at the range followed by a reception at the Presidential Palace where we all dressed in our official uniforms. I must say that our three competitors who all wore their Olympic suits were, I believe and I am not being biased, the best dressed Team amongst the guests - (you can see by the photograph). I was very proud of my Team - well done! The reception was quiet and we were all back at the hotel around 210 hours for an early start of competition the following day - the bus was to leave at 0730 hours.

Friday 20th October - Competition for Men and Women in Double Trap. I had high expectations of our three competitors as they had all practiced reasonably well. In the men's competition Michael shot a score of 46-48-46=140. Russel shot 48-46-42=136 and was extremely disappointed with his last round but given the work load since the Olympics I was still proud of his achievement as should all other Australians. the finalists were China 142, Kuwait 142, Italy 142, USA 142, Australia 140 and Hungary 140. Italy's' second shooter missed out in the shoot off for the last two positions on 140. After one of the best finals in Double Trap that I have seen especially Michael's 49 that brought him into = first place on 189 with LI Bo from China, after four pairs in the shoot off, LI Bo won the Gold medal with 8 over Michael on 7. What a great effort for Michael's Silver medal in the World Cup Final in Double Trap.

In the Women's Double Trap Deserie started well shooting a 35-34-33=102 but was not quite the champion we all know that she is. Again the work load before and after the Olympics for our shooters was telling its tale. Deserie finished in 7th position - well done. The Final was won by Zhang Yafei from China setting two new World Records with a 150/160.

Saturday 21st October - Competition for Trap and Skeet - Men and Women. In the Men's 75 targets Michael was shooting very well given the conditions that the wind had started coming in and brought with it occasional showers and the temperature had dropped by about 8 degrees C. Michael ended up with a 24-22-25=71. Other countries shooters shot: Russia 71, United Arab Emirates 67, Portugal 69, Italy 67, USA 72, England 70, USA 69, Romania 68 and the second Portuguese shooter finished on 61.

Women's Trap and Skeet - 75 targets + Final. The day did not start well for Deserie who twisted her 'good ankle' leaving her in great pain. Her other leg and ankle had been damaged earlier in the year when she fell in Lonato, Italy resulting in her having her leg splinted for quite some time prior to the Olympics. However, being the true champion that she is, she on this occasion went out and shot a 24-22-21. Her ankle was giving her a lot of trouble after the first round but she still had a one target lead on Susan Natrass (Canada) going into the Final. The weather deteriorated as the Final started.

The scores ended up as follows: Deserie BAYNES USA 67+19=86+1 Susan NATRASS CAN 66+18=84+3 Ann FOCAN BEL 65+20=85 E. GAO CHN 64+22=86+2 Irina LARITCHEVA RUS 62+22=84+2 Delphine RACINET FRA 63+17=80

What a final this was - the leaders se-sawing in every direction making it one of the most stressful times in my life. It got down to the last target being shot by the last shooter. Deserie, and yes, she missed it which created a shoot off for the Gold and Silver medals. Deserie was very unlucky to lose this as she was undoubtedly the better shooter in the Final but I believe her ankle was much more painful than she was prepared to show. Congratulations Deserie on your Silver and there is always next year for a Gold and the crystal.

I was very proud to hear Horst Schreiber, Secretary General of ISSF express accolades on the Australian shooters and he suggested that Michael is probably the greatest shooters for his age ever to compete at this level of competition. What an honour being bestowed upon one of our ACTA members.

Another incident arouse from the Trap competition - Ahmed Almaktum from the United Arab Emirates won the bronze medal. Ahmed and his lovely partner Jackie come from Dubai and have been good friends with the Australian team for some time and he has been a great help to me. Ahmed usually uses RC cartridges but either RC1 or RC2. He was invited to compete in Cyprus at the very last minute and he had no chance to organise his own ammunition. After shooting a 20 in the first round of trap he made the comment that he wished he had his RC cartridges with him. As we had a few hundred cartridges to spare, I mentioned that I would 're-load' some for him as a joke, provided that he would not beat Michael and that if he did the 're-loader' would stop work. Before each round I would give him one or two packets of cartridges and his scores went up to 22, 25, 24 and then a 25. His grin just got bigger and bigger. He ended up in the Final and then went on to win the bronze medal, a nice ending for both Ahmed and Jackie. Ahmed must have told the woman representative from RC cartridges about what we had done and she was most appreciative that a Team from another country had helped in such an emergency.

Monday 23rd October - Later this day we would be making our way back home to Australia by virtually a direct flight. However during this week I had arranged through the Australian Ambassador to Cyprus, to have a tour through the United Nations demarcations zone between the Turkish and Greek sides of Nicosia. We were picked up at the hotel at 1300 hours by the Australian United Nations Police in three 4-wheel drive vehicles. The tour lasted for two and a half-hours. What we saw was virtually unbelievable - this area was brought about in 1974 and still exists today, in the modern city. There are virtually thousands of troops on both sides of the zone, all heavily armed, in trenches, with numerous turret-like structures housing guns all of which was surrounded by land mines, cutting the city in halves. The United Nations 'No go zone' are is some 4 metres wide at it's narrowest point and up to 7 kilometres at it's widest point, United Nations Police from all over the world are stationed there for up to 9 months at a time. People still get killed there and the hatred shown is just terrible - we really do not know just how luck we are to be living in Australia.

We left the hotel around 1800 hours to go on the 40 minute drive back to the airport. We had two taxicabs pre-arranged by the Organising Committee - Deserie and I were in an old Volvo, driven by an elderly gentleman. It was raining but that did not stop him sitting on 160 kilometres per hour and I cannot say how relieved we were to arrive safely at the airport.

We were greeted by Emirates airline official who quickly arranged our baggage and ticketing. Ahmed Almaktum and Jackie had organised that we should be upgraded to First and Business Class all the way home to Australia. This was much appreciated by our tired and worn out bodies and the airline crew thought it was wonderful having Michael's crystal trophy buckled in with a seat belt, into a First Class seat. The trip home was very pleasant and we landed in Melbourne at 0145 hours on Wednesday 25th October.

I would personally like to thank Michael, Russell and Deserie for making this trip one of the most memorable and enjoyable trips that I have had the privilege of being on. I would also like to express on behalf of the Team my thanks, to the Australian Sports Commission and the ACTA for making this trip possible with funding.

Fellow ACTA members and shooters, I believe that we all owe Michael, Russell and Deserie a huge vote of thanks for competing in Cyprus for us and for Australia. I personally do not believe many people knew just how much of a toll the Olympics had taken out of your bodies, both mentally and physically. To me you are all true Champions.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS — JANUARY 2001

Well, the Skeet Nationals are over for another year. And if you are a keen Skeet shooter and you are sitting at home reading this, and you were not there, let me tell you something. You missed a fabulous week. And don't say I didn't warn you. Back in the November issue, I exercised my powers of clairvoyancy and predicted that on the Sunday night, there would be a bunch of worn out, shot out, skeet shooters travelling home from Wagga with a pile of empty hulls and a heap of great memories. So if you're looking for someone to blame for you missing it, go and take a good look in the mirror.

Why do I think it was such a great shoot? Well, a number of reasons actually. Every day the shoot ran smoothly and on time, to the point where you could almost set your watch by the presentations starting at six o'clock. For that I need to thank all the people who came out early and squadded up in the first flight, as well as all the people who volunteered to referee the first flight. Special thanks to Phil Crute and Barry Munt, who were always the first ones to volunteer every morning. And to all the other people, who backed up all day, and were ready to shoot on time, and returned promptly to work after shooting. Everyone seemed to be in a friendly co-operative mood and I probably spent less time chasing people up, than at any previous Nationals.

On four of the seven nights we ran a lucky number shoot-off and these proved to be very popular. As each day's qualifying started to wind down, people would congregate around the front of the clubhouse and wait for the number to be drawn. The encouraging part was that nearly all of the people, whose number wasn't drawn, stayed around to watch the shoot-off and be a part of the fun by cheering or jeering the various competitors. One morning I was chatting with Bob Thorne and he was telling me how his shooting was in a bit of a hole at the moment, but you should have seen the grin on him that night after winning the lucky number shoot-off.

On another evening, when all the competitors on the favoured score assembled on field five to do battle in front of a noisy and spirited crowd, the combatants turned out to be two "recognised shooters", three ladies and two old stiffs. (For those of you, who are not au fait with the Billy Iles dictionary of useful slang terminology for shooting, an "old stiff" is anyone older than Bill). Anyway, the two recognised shooters then proceeded to both miss on the first station, much to the enormous enjoyment of the crowd, and leave the other five to proceed to Station four, whereupon the two mature gentlemen decided it was time for them to retire to the bar and leave the fairer sex to continue. And continue they did, putting on a great display of doubles shooting and proving that the opposite sex is never to be underestimated.

I had never met Nicole Hyland from Queensland before, but I will certainly never forget her after that great performance, as she proceeded to direct the other two ladies back to the parking-lot, and go on to collect her case of Rio shells from Pedro DaSilva. Pedro's company had been kind enough to provide us with several cases of shells at the start of the week, without any directives attached, other than to use them as we saw fit. And they certainly turned out to be very popular prizes with all the lucky number recipients, Thank you Rio Australia.

On Monday night, after the completion of the National 20 Gauge, we conducted the second (unofficial) National Skeet Deauville Doubles Championship, at the completion of which, my wife was none too happy with me. Last year we ran two Skeet Deauville Doubles events. The first was a sort of try-out event to make sure the format would work and fine-tune the rules, and the second was billed as the First (unofficial) National Skeet Deauville Doubles Championship. To cut a long story short, Karen and 1 won both matches last year, much to the disdain of all the other competitors, who cried foul and alleged that we had been home practicing for months on the quiet and creating an unfair advantage.

Now although there was no truth in that at all, as I had only dreamed up the game during the week before the Nationals, I saw

no point in defusing a perfectly good rumour. So without actually lying, I did everything I could to propagate that story and infer that they had all been scammed and defrauded out of their entry money. The nett result of which was that most of them went home determined to come back and get even next year. Then I totally failed to shoot at a pair due to some perfectly legal sledging from the crowd and she had had to shoot another pair to keep us in. Then, on the first occasion she missed her target. I managed to dutch a pair. So although she broke my target, I failed to keep my end up when she actually needed me. That night at the restaurant, as she was paying the bill, she was giving me one of those looks that a grazier gives an errant cattledog, whilst contemplating whether he's worth feeding or not.

The Skeet Doubles Handicap Shoot-out turned out to be a success and was very popular with the participants. More than half the field entered it, and at the end of the first round over a third of those remained, however nearly everyone was down to scratch, so I think the handicapping formula was close to the mark. I'm sure we'll do that one again next year. Three different events involving New Zealand were decided during the week. One was the Glenn Trophy Shoulder to Shoulder Team Shoot, as it was our turn to contest the match in Australia this year. I shot poorly that day and missed the team by a country mile. But I congratulate the five guys who made the team and so ably defended our National honour against a very strong Kiwi contingent. Particularly my close friend and training partner, Gerry Petruska, who not only got to shoot for his country, but also finished the day as AA-first in the National Skeet Championship. Upwards and onwards next year, Gerry.

The Glenn Trophy Team to shoot for Australia in New Zealand next March was also selected during the week. I got a bit closer to that one, but still missed the boat. Four people qualified outright, and left myself and four others to shoot off for the last place. After several rounds it got down to myself, Billy, and a guy from South Australia by the name of Kim Retsas. Now Billy and I were both shooting well, and I thought we might have worn him down, but it was not to be. He gave us both a shooting lesson and sent us back to the carpark. Congratulations Kim. I hope you all shoot well in Hamilton and keep our name on the jug.

Several years ago Skeet shooting was incorporated into the Macintosh International Postal Teamshoot between the various countries of the former British Commonwealth. Unfortunately, soon afterwards, the whole Macintosh competition folded up due to a lack of interest from the Northern Hemisphere. However, support for the concept remained strong in the South Pacific area, and so Australia and New Zealand decided to go it alone and continue on with what has become a major part of both our Nationals. Our International Postal Skeet Team was selected over the first three days of competition and shot on Friday evening.

Although New Zealand had already posted their scores in March. I am not aware, at this time, of any of the results in the various sections. However, I will be very surprised if the Open Team loses, as our shooters missed only five targets out of six hundred. In fact,



the first squad did something that I have never seen done before in this country. All six shooters broke every target and posted a total squad score of 300x300. See the accompanying photo of six very happy shooters. I am very proud of that team achievement and can assure you that, as the last shooter, when I walked out to shoot the final three targets, the adrenaline rush I was experiencing was generated as much by fear, as it was by excitement.

Based on results for NSW Clubs in the November 2000 issue of Clay Target Shooting News, 55% of clubs, (at least of those 60 clubs who quoted attendance figures), had attendance's of less than 25 shooters, in 3 cases the attendance was less than 15, are we to assume that there would then be three handicap winners incurring no penalty whatsoever for their win, and another 30 handicap winners who happily go on shooting until they win another handicap before incurring any backwards movement? Hey that's wonderful - win two handicaps and only do one metre. Somehow that does not seem quite right or fair to me.

May I say that the personal opinion of someone who doesn't know what the inside the inside of an ivory tower looks like, is that the idea of half metre handicap penalties is ridiculous, not to mention impractical, and to then base this penalty on the number of shooters is even more ludicrous, especially when a careful check of the results pages in the CTSN will show that a large number of country gun clubs around Australia rarely achieve 25 shooters in attendance. We do not have the shooting population that many overseas countries have.

Further could someone please explain to those of us out here in the real world, who incidentally already have more than enough work to do in the "office" how it is proposed to keep track of all the half metre penalties, when a large number of shooters will shoot at several different clubs each month.

Further food for thought, it is difficult enough now to find people who are willing to take on the positions of secretary, handicapper, etc, do you really wish to make the job so complicated that no one will take the jobs on. Think about it - no secretaries, etc, club folds - no club? Oh well we no longer have any reason to keep those nasty guns, so hand 'em over

I feel that it would be very hard to find a fairer or simpler method than that which is already in place, i.e.: Win the handicap do a metre, regardless of how many shooters there are, secretary / handicapper alters handicap on front of card and sends handicap report to ACTA - job done!

Dear Sir,

I take this opportunity, my first as a member of the ACTA, to write in response to our President's notes on page 2 of the November addition of the Clay Target News.

Our President stated in his report of the NSW State Carnival that, "..... The carnival appeared to be well organised and ran smoothly over the three days." I have a great deal of trouble agreeing with those comments. I say this because of the following events that befell not only my own two children, but also four other juniors that attended this carnival from my home club.

We arrived at Wagga Wagga and attended the National Shooting Ground to register our juniors for the competition. They (3 females and 3 males) registered in accordance with the provided registration form, paid the full nominations (as there were no reduced nominations for any competitor), my daughter Simone, and our club's secretary's daughter Emily, both nominated in the provided square to be eligible for the "Ladies" section, as opposed to the "Junior" section, an option provided on the form. This was not uncommon, as they had followed the same practice at our State Carnival and at the Nationals earlier in the year.

Unfortunately, at the end of the first day's competition, with Simone having placed very well in her chosen category, we were advised, as were several other parents of Junior shooters, that the young female shooters were only eligible for "grade prizes and the Junior section", they were excluded from the Ladies as nominated. To say that this ruling caused some controversy would be an understatement.

Parents and junior shooters protested and held several discussions with Mr Mark McInnes, the spokesperson and elected official of the New South Wales Clay Target Association. We were advised of the following (abbreviated form by reflecting as best I can the tenure of the conversation): -

1. The NSWCTA at it's meeting in June had reviewed the program and had decided to amend the classification of shooters and did not have an "OPEN" Team, therefore Junior shooters would be restricted to their own category. 2. That provision had made for the better recognition of the Junior Shooters achievements at this carnival with increased allocation of prize money for them.

When questioned regarding the nomination forms and lack of notification of such dramatic changes, he (McInnes) stated that they had advised the ACTA (who had been contracted to run the carnival on behalf of the NSWCTA) of these matters. That he had only been made aware of the nomination notice the day prior to the event and had issued instructions to the ACTA office to advise all Junior shooters of the change. This explanation was somewhat different than what we were advised by the ACTA Office Staff. We were then offered a refund if we felt so aggrieved by the changes. When questioned as to the rationale for these changes, as one of the first reasons and examples that he quoted Mr McInnes related to an experience that his association had a few years back where two junior shooters had qualified for both the Open Men's Team and the Junior Team. Both had elected to take their position in the Open Team. At the subsequent National Titles, both had not performed to their previous winning standard, and as a result the Open Team had not been successful. The decision of the two junior shooters to take their rightful place in the Open Team had deprived the Junior Team of the State's two best junior shooters and they had also failed to win their event. This event had caused discussion at their meeting, which resulted in the change of the status of shooters and eligibility standards for teams representing NSW.

Several of those present when this discussion was taking place were appalled that the NSWCTA had made a decision to exclude junior shooters from taking a place in an Open Team, no matter how good their ability or scores were. We gained the impression that winning appeared to have greater importance that the right of any individual who has achieved the required position to represent their State. Mr McInnes made several references to "nurturing" their juniors and not exposing them to unnecessary pressures. I question his true motive and patronizing attitude to our young shooters.

I also question his response that the junior lady shooters were now "recognised" in their own right. I wish to point our to the NSWCTA, that until our intervention, there had been no provision of prizes to be allocated to junior female shooters. This was reinforced at the closing presentation where there were insufficient sashes and medals for all the junior female winners, after the new class had been introduced. And in fact, to this very day Simone has not received her sash or medal.

This injustice did not end with the above events, as a result of this rule change our young female shooters were deprived of the following: -

1. Open Ladies High Gun - my daughter was 8 points ahead of the declared winner.

2. Emily Signorotto being deprived of shooting - off for the Ladies Point Score Championship having attained the same score as those that did shoot - off.

3. Elizabeth Barton was deprived of the opportunity to gain selection to the NSW Ladies Team and possibly represent the State alongside her mother.

I beg to then ask the following questions: -

1. If the decision was made in June, why was it not communicated on the advertisements placed in the Clay Target News - there would have been at least 2 editions that it could have been communicated in.

2. In who's interest was this decision made. Particularly when we know from our own junior training squad that all they desire to do is compete against the best in the sport and where possible achieve recognition for having beaten their peers.

3. What right has the NSWCTA have to discriminate against junior shooters, in particular our female shooters? They had made no provision to offer any prize to young female shooters until our intervention.

4. Finally, does the ACTA and other State Association intend to follow the same agenda as initiated by the NSWCTA and discriminate against the very competitors that our sport needs in order to grow and survive.

When parents make such efforts to take their children to such prestigious events, in support of other State Associations and at considerable cost, it has caused us to question weather we will ever support another State's carnival again or expose our young shooters to such inflammatory and in our opinion discriminatory practices. I look forward to our President's response.

You are not the first to question my comments about the NSW Trap Carnival. At the carnival I was unaware of this controversy and had left to drive to SA on Monday before the conclusion of the event and the High Gun and Points situation arose. The next day I submitted the Presidents Notes to meet the publication deadline. It was two or three days later that I received the first of several letters expressing concern about how the juniors had been treated at the Carnival. Had I been aware of these situations my comments about the Carnival may have been different.

The ACTA has not proposed any such similar changes for National Championships and I would personally vehemently oppose any such recommendations. Most State Associations I believe are also trying to encourage junior participation in their State Carnivals. I would encourage you to try these and not give up because of this experience.

Dear Editor,

Following recent events at the ISSF National Championships in Brisbane, I wish to comment on the feelings which were expressed during said championships.

The number of shooters appears to be dropping at every level of competition in these disciplines. Obviously, if there is not as many shooters, it is not economical to continue to pay out the same amount of prize money. Increased prize money will not attract new shooters, but, increased nominations will increase prize money. Hopefully, the distribution of this increased prize money will be wider, and the shooters who are new to the discipline may feel encouraged to continue on with it, if more people benefit from the increase.

The ISSF Skeet shooters are continually segregated from the Trap and Double Trap shooters at ISSF Carnivals. Geographically, it is not possible to have the Skeet shooters shoot anywhere else except far away from the Clubhouse, because at many clubs, there are no Skeet layouts near the Clubhouse. The ISSF Skeet shooters feel that they are lacking the attention that the Trap and Double Trap shooters receive from spectators because their layouts are generally so far away from the clubhouse. I put this forward as a solution: Incite interest by increasing the number of competitors, and giving the spectators something exciting to watch.

To neutralize these problems, the solution amounts to simply encouraging more people to shoot the ISSF disciplines. To do this, takes time, and requires a lot encouragement at the grass roots level, the clubs. I challenge every shooter who attends the ISSF National Championships to go out to their home club, and encourage one person to take up the discipline. If every person who shoots these disciplines took the time to assist and encourage one person to at least give it a go, the future will look a whole lot brighter for these disciplines.

If the clubs who have the facilities added one event in each of these disciplines to their monthly programme, a few more people may be persuaded to shoot it at club level. If these people then continue to shoot it every month, and their scores improve, they may feel that they would like to attend their State Championships, and from there, they may move on to the National Championships.

In theory, this may be a step forward, but it will amount to nothing if no-one will offer to put in the time required. If we want these disciplines to move forward, we must all pull in the same direction, and expend the energy with which we complain, in a positive manner.

The incentive of \$5900 in cash and prizes proved a big drawcard, along with the Queensland Clay Target Association allocation of the State Mixed Target event, the Single Barrel event in honour of founding member and past president Chub Smith, and the 50 target Double Barrel Ballandean Clay Target Club 40th Anniversary Graded Calcutta.

The Anniversary Dinner was held on the Saturday evening, a tribute to founding and past members, and the formation of Ballandean Clay Target Club.

From humble beginnings in 1957, when a group of local shotgun enthusiasts got together and trialed a few locations about the district, to a public meeting being called at Ballandean in 1960. Elections were held and office bearers installed. AJ (Chub) Smith, the first president held the position for 23 years. His brother Noel Smith was voted in as the first Secretary, a position he held for 20 years, and Jack Lynam as Treasurer also 23 years of loyal service. Jack Lynam can still be seen on the lanes at Ballandean at the age of 80, and honoured the club with shooting a creditable 20/25 in the Chub Smith Memorial Single Barrel event this weekend.

The late Les Day agreed to lease land at Lyra for the formation of the Gun Club on the agreement that 1 pound per year be paid toward the lease.

Ballandean Gun Club, as it was then known, held its first shoot in September 1960. Monthly shoots were conducted, and an Annual 2 Day shoot held in May of each year. This tradition was continued until 1978, when the 2 day shoot was dropped in favour of a 1 day event. This weekend had Ballandean host it's first 2 day program in 22 years.

Ballandean hosted the 1st and only ever shoot for a Motor Vehicle in Queensland in 1964. 140 shooters lined up for the program with only 2 hand release traps. Local shooter David Odling of Inverary won the black Minnie, it was auctioned later in the day, the highest bidder was a young Bernie Day.

In 1964 Ballandean hosted the Commonwealth Walkup Championship, a title sought be shooters from all over the country. 1971 saw local Les Day win the Queensland Double Barrel event. A highlight on the shoot calendar in the early days was a trap shoot held at Storm King Dam in conjunction with Apple Blossom Week, now known to us as the Apple and Grape Harvest Festival.

The club relocated to its present location on the Ballandean Sports Grounds in 1975.

Some 29 years after the success of Les Day in 1971, saw another local with a State Championship, the State Mixed Targets.

Certainly a highlight of the weekend was this event being won by local hotshot Ray Mascadri. Locals performed very well in the event, George Costanzo picked up 3rd in AA, Michael Bertinazzi 1st in A, Milco Volpato 1st B, SJ Puglisi 2nd B, Angel Musumeci 3rd B, and Michael Dahl 2nd C and Tim Bonner 3rd. Considering the horrendous conditions shooting was of a very high standard. Ben McBean shot off against Warwick favourite, Greg Newey for AA in the 50t Graded Calcutta, unfortunately he dropped his 80th target allowing Newey to take the event. Ken McBean also took a 2nd in AA 25t Pointscore.

Graham Smith of Warwick won the A High Gun. He collected 2nd in 50t D/B Day 1, 3rd in the State Mixed Targets, and 1st in the 50t Graded Calcutta. The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
