




The Golden Ibis Shoot at Warren is over again for another year. This year the weather was perfect with the rain, snakes, ants and centipedes all staying in doors to allow a great shoot to go ahead.

One hundred and sixty eight shooters both days took up the challenge and again there were some excellent scores, and many personal bests. The shoot ran very smoothly under the watchful eye of shoot marshall John Coaker and Don Williamson to keep the flow going and get through the programmes in record time.

To have 168 shooters shoot at 105 targets on the Sunday, to be completed and starting the presentations by 3.30pm could only be called exceptional. A very big congratulations to all shooters in making the effort to be on time for their squads and thus allowing the long distance travellers an early get away and cover many miles before darkness set in. We sincerely hope everyone got home safely.

Saturday morning and staring right on time at 9am we saw some 48 shooters shoot the possible in the 25 target Cash Divide.

The first Championship of the weekend followed with the Lower Macquarie Point Score. Nine shooters shooting the possible verged to trap one for the shoot off. Arthur Turner of Warren Gun Club being the victor with a 104/105 from Roger Duthie from Victoria on 102/105 who took out AA Grade from Phil Headon from Hay. A Grade was won by Glen Harvey from Coonamble from Louis Chaline of Sydney. Louise Machul from Cobar won B Grade with a fine 75/75 from Rick Fitzalan of Tottenham on 74/75. C Grade went to local shooter David Rourke on 74/75 from Dean Went from Narrabri on 73/75. David Jackal took honours in the Juniors with a great 72/75, Louise Machul doubling up to take the Ladies and local Kevin Heywook taking the Veterans with a possible 75/75.

Enter event two and the 25 target Single Barrel trophy with six possibles to take to the tracks for the shoot off. Steve Caltabiano at last had his first overall win at Warren. Many a bridesmaid trophy prior to his great win with a fine 33/33 from again Roger Duthie who won AA Grade from Charlie Sherry. I might hasten to add that Charlie probably had his longest shoot off at Warren lasting at least three targets. Your turn will certainly come Charlie.

A Grade went to Warren's very hard working trap man Malcolm Stephens with a great 29/30 to put Nathan Power into second on 28/30. Louise Machul of Cobar again won B Grade with a great 25/25. Her second trophy of the day to help kick along the health programme. C Grade also stayed local with the one and only Faffy Lefebvre winning from Paul Crittenden whose name will certainly occur again.



At the completion of the Double Barrel, marking half way in the teams event, only five targets separated the top ten teams, keeping interest very high for the handicap.





2001 AUSTRALASIAN-PACIFIC "GRAND PRIX" BRISBANE GUN CLUB

Knowing that the 2000 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" would be impossible to equal, the organisers of the 2001 "Grand Prix" at Brisbane Gun Club made an extra effort this year to cater for those who did attend. In 2000, shooters from every continent of the globe were on hand during March to attend Australia's major international clay target shooting competition, the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" at Brisbane Gun Club.

Australasian-Pacific Grand Prix committee members Tony Kidman, Tony Houselander, John and Carol Tipler, Dot Trindall, Greg Newey and Ross Tipler.

That competition was held the week prior to the Sydney World Cup, and was used by many of the world's best shooters from overseas countries, to fine tune their skills prior to entering the Olympic test event at the Sydney International Shooting complex Cecil Park.

This year was always going to be quieter but it was pleasing to have over 120 shooters from almost every state and territory of Australia along with competitors from United States, Malaysia, Singapore and Japan in attendance for the week long competition.

As has been the competition's format in recent times, the first discipline to get under way was the double trap starting with the 'skins' badge match which is three rounds of 50 targets. Like 'skins' in golf, shooters have the chance to record the best score in each round with the winner (or top three winners) sharing the pool in each round. In the case of the double trap skins event, each round was worth \$400, which was divided \$300 to the AA/A grade section, and \$100 to the B/C section.

Winners of the 'skins' prize money were Steven Baynes (\$300), Russel Mark (\$300), Adam Vella (\$300) and Robin Loy (\$300).


The team event in the Olympic Trap "Grand Prix" competition was well contested with 13 teams entered for the event.



Dear Shooters

We have a good program planned for the shoot on Sunday, which will be in the June Clay Target Shooting News. If there is enough interest shown by former and present members, we will organise a re-union dinner and 40th Anniversary event on the Saturday evening as well.

We would love to hear from anyone who has information or memorabilia of the early days, and cordially invite all shooters who have ever been connected with the club to return for the weekend and celebrate with us.

Several people who have read my Safety Article have suggested that I should publish it in the CTSN, and this month I plan to do just that. My intention is for the substance of the article to be printed on a single separate page, so that it can be photocopied and most conveniently put to the best use. In order to achieve this, I will address a couple of other issues briefly and follow those with this month's Trivia Question, leaving my safety advice until last.

A couple of years ago, I printed a request at the bottom of one of my columns, asking for a number of particular back issues of the Clay Target News. I did this to fill in some gaps in my CTSN library, caused by somehow losing the odd issue here and there, and missing a couple of years in the early nineties when I resided permanently in the United States. I would like to thank the many people who responded to that inquiry with phone calls and letters of offers, and to several people who didn't even contact me, but just bundled up and sent me what they had.

Because of those people I was able to complete my CTSN archives back almost 25 years to late 1976. Prior to that date, I only have a few scattered copies. In order to be able to research a number of matters that predate this, I would now like to ask if anyone has any issues of the CTSN dated 1976 or earlier that they can spare, I would be most grateful for them. Rest assured I will take good care of any old issues I receive, and my intention is to donate them to the ACTA when I am done with them.

Another matter that I am researching, and could use some assistance with, is a complete list of previous ISSF National High Gun winners. I have a list of the National Champions, but if anyone can help me with the names of all the Overall High Gun winners in each of the three disciplines (Trench, Double Trap and Skeet) since 1973, I would also be most appreciative.

This month's Shooting Trivia Question: Shooters from how many countries, other than Australia, have won Silver Australia Badges at the Trap Nationals? Mail your answer to Shooting Trivia, P.O. Box 265, Bairnsdale 3875, to arrive by 20-05-2001. The first correct answer drawn shall receive a free entry to next year's National Single Barrel Championship. Now, bitter experience has taught me that I had better be careful with the correct answer to March's STQ (Remember the last left handed shooter to win the National Double Barrel). So here we go again: After extensive research I now believe that only two left handed shooters have ever received Silver Australia Badges at the Skeet Nationals. Reg Clarke won the National Skeet in 1972, 1990 and 1995, and the Skeet Doubles in 1993. And David Dundon won the High Gun in 1989, the Skeet Doubles in 1990 and the National Skeet in 1992. Peter Vella from Blacktown in NSW submitted the first correct answer drawn, which wins him a free entry to this year's National Skeet Championship. If there are any other correct answers, the first person to notify me of each one will also receive a clone of this month's prize.

Safety Issues at a Gun Club By Adrian Cousens

1.Treat every gun as if it were loaded until you personally ascertain that it isn't. This includes when you are handed a gun, or when you take one from storage or from your car. Never assume that it's empty, no matter how safe that assumption may seem. Always check to be sure.

2. Always keep your gun pointed in a safe direction. This includes even when it is unloaded and/or the action is open. A safe direction is one where, even if it were to go off, it would not cause injury or damage. Common sense dictates what is the safest direction depending on different circumstances.

3. Keep the action of your gun open at all times except when standing on the shooting station ready to shoot. The only allowable exception to this rule is for under and overs when they are about to be temporarily stored in your car - but close it only as you place it in the car and re-open it immediately as you lift it out again.

4. Never load your gun except when standing on the shooting station ready to shoot. Always unload your gun completely of both live and fired shells before turning around and walking off the shooting station. A gun is deemed to be loaded when it contains one or more shells in any part of the mechanism, including the breech and/or the magazine.

5. Never fire your gun anywhere other than down the shooting range, or at a pattern plate, if the club provides one. When firing at a pattern plate, exercise great caution and remember that shotgun pellets are among the most prone to ricocheting of any firearm projectile.

6. Never load more than two shells in your gun at any one time. Two shells may be loaded for shooting singles in most Trap events and on most Skeet stations, however more than two is never allowable under any circumstances. With magazine type guns, such as pump-actions and semi-automatics, some method of restricting the magazine capacity to one shell, such as a magazine plug, is a wise precaution.

7. Never load or fire a gun if there is any doubt about its ability to operate safely and/or reliably. A gun, like any other tool, requires regular cleaning and maintenance and occasional repair or readjustment. Always ensure that it receives maintenance or repairs immediately if there is any question concerning its ability to function correctly.

8. Never attempt to load or fire any gun unless you are familiar with its operation. With any new or strange gun you should acquaint yourself with how it works and how to load and unload it safely before proceeding to use it on the shooting range with live ammo.

9. Never use a shot size larger than that specified in the rulebook or restricted by local club rules. This generally means no shot with a pellet diameter larger than (or with a numerical value smaller than) #7 for Skeet and #6 for Trap. Safe shot fall zones are calculated by this criteria, and non-observance could cause injury to people or property that theoretically should not be in danger.

10. Never mix the gauges of your ammunition. As the Rules prohibit configuring your gun to use two different gauges of shells at the same time, there is no reason to ever carry more than one gauge of shells. Both 20ga and 28ga shells will lodge into a chamber that is one size bigger, in such a way as to obstruct it and yet allow the correct size shell to be loaded after it. This will effectively convert your gun into a hand grenade.

11. Never rely on a safety catch. Safety catches are designed for hunting and defence weapons and have no practical use on a target gun. If the gun is loaded and closed it should be considered ready to use and inherently dangerous if misused. Many target shooters have the safety catches removed or locked off to prevent misuse. 12. Never use alcohol or drugs before or while shooting. This applies equally to medicinal drugs, which may also impair your reflexes or judgment. If in doubt seek medical advice. If you have consumed alcohol or drugs, as with driving your car, do not handle your gun until the effects of these substances have diminished to an acceptable level.

13. Always check your bore for obstructions. This mainly applies after you fire a shell with an abnormal report, or after you trip or fall while carrying your gun, or after your gun may have fallen. It is also a good idea to get into the habit of doing it every time you load your gun, if you haven't just fired it. This includes after you have just taken it from the car and after you have just assembled it, or taken it from its case.

14. Always keep your muzzle pointed towards the center stake if you have a misfire or malfunction. This allows the referee to examine and adjudicate safely, and then allows you to rectify the problem while the gun is still pointed in a safe direction. Never turn around until the gun has been opened and unloaded.

15. Always unload your gun immediately if there is any hold-up while shooting. If the interruption is going to be a long one, it is best to unload your gun and step off the station until the referee indicates that shooting can be resumed. Even if the hold-up appears to be a short one, and you do not intend to step off the station, always unload your gun until either common sense or the referee indicates that it is safe to continue.

16. Always store guns and ammunition separately, even when they are only left unattended for short periods. At a Gun Club, between events, always lock your gun in your car and lock your ammunition in the boot.

17. Be careful with release trigger guns. They should be looked upon as a necessary evil and an inherently unsafe proposition in unfamiliar hands. If you use one, do not leave it where anyone could inadvertently pick it up by mistake. Always lock it away in your car immediately after you finish using it. When shooting one on the fields, always notify the referee and the other squad members. If you do not use one, try to resist the temptation of playing around with someone else's.

18. Never enter a traphouse unless officially authorized. A target-throwing machine, like many other mechanical devices, is an inherently dangerous piece of machinery, which could cause grievous bodily harm to an inexperienced operator. Trap mechanics and loaders are trained in the safe operation of these machines, and are the only people allowed in the traphouses.

19. Never absent-mindedly walk in front of a Clay Target Throwing Machine. This includes the area in front of a DTL Traphouse, as well as the area in front of the low house window on a Skeet Field. If the machine happened to be cocked and loaded, and someone were to inadvertently push, bump or drop the release button, a severe injury could result. Even if the button is visibly safe, someone in the house could manually trip the machine in the process of loading or finalising it. With the widespread use of Phono-pull equipment, this danger is now even greater, as accidental failure to switch the equipment off, could result in an idle conversation seriously harming someone.

20. Always wear eye and ear protection while on the shooting range. This applies equally to shooters, referees, scorers and trap personnel. Ear plugs are necessary to prevent long term hearing loss, and safety glasses are required, even when you are near a field, to prevent serious eye damage from wayward target pieces or ricocheting shot pellets.

REMEMBER

Firearm safety is no accident.

Most accidental shootings occur with "unloaded" guns.

You may know that your closed gun is unloaded, but how can others be sure of that.


