

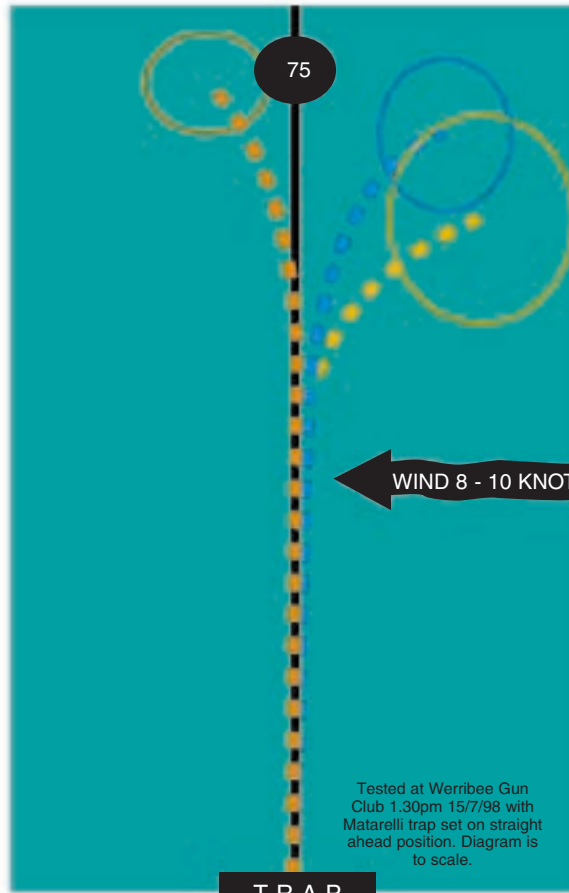

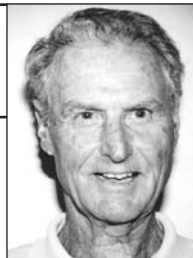

COACHING ACCREDITATION

At the full Executive meeting in July 2001 a decision was made that a moratorium be run for a period of six months on coaching. The following exceptions are being offered during this period:

- 1) All coaches that have let their accreditation expire will be re-accredited on application.
- 2) Level one coaches who feel that they meet the requirements for Level 2 can apply through their respective State Associations for accreditation to Level 2. State Associations will then forward their applications and recommendations to the ACTA Coaching Council for approval.
- 3) Shooters who feel that they meet the requirements for Level 1 accreditation can apply to their respective State Associations. State Association will then forward their applications and recommendations to the ACTA Coaching Council for approval.

This moratorium will run for a period of six months starting on 1 October 2001 and concluding on 31 March 2002. Questions on the moratorium can be directed to the Chairman Coaching Council, Mr. Gary Cassells, on 03 5461 4435.

Dear Sir,

On behalf of the many clay target shooters in this area, who have up to date enjoyed shooting skeet, as well as most other clay shooting sports, I submit the following for consideration by your readers: -

There seems to be developing a situation in the A.C.T.A whereby a single interest group appears to be almost dictating to the majority of members. This is the sort of scenario that we as firearm owners and shooters must avoid. You are all aware, no doubt, there is already too much division and rivalry between shoot organisations and we certainly don't need that extended to within the A.C.T.A.

In various issues of "Cuzzo's Rambling's", Adrian emphasises that the NSSA is the worldwide governing body for skeet and that the overall operation and administration of skeet, including World Championships is their prerogative.

That's fair enough I suppose, if we are prepared to accept that the USA and possibly, Canada comprise the world. However Great Britain shooters have their own adaptation of skeet - naturally called English Skeet, which amongst other things does not have a station eight. I have never noticed any adverse comment in

various shooting publications about this by either NSSA or English Organisations. As far as Europe and the rest of the world (except us and NZ) they apparently couldn't care less about American Skeet and vice versa, seemingly preferring to shoot the accepted world wide and internationally administered discipline of ISSF.

The ACTA's changing of the NSSA rules in the late 1970's was an improvement and a result of evolution, as indeed was American Skeet, which was invented by a Charles E Davies, his son, and a friend W.H Foster, before WW1. The original layout was circular, with twelve traps around the clock. This became a half circle with a central station (8). A gradual interest in this new sport led to a competition in 1926 to give it a name. This earned a \$100 prize for Gertrude Hurlbutt who came up with the Scandinavian word "skeet" meaning "shoot".

The original rules also required participants to shoot "gun down" and there could be up to a three second delay. This has carried on to ISU skeet but has long been abandoned in our version. Over the years there has been a gradual but continuous change in distances, angles and rules which brings us back to the point made earlier that our improvements of the 70's and 80's were natural evolution. I suggest that if the NSSA were aware of our existence and our (previous to January 2001) improved rules, they would eagerly adopt them.

In his "Rambling's" in August, Adrian facetiously suggests that he would like to hang various shooting administrators from the High house, although he hasn't specified by which part of their anatomies. In the same vein I suggest that a more sadistically suitable punishment for anyone he disagrees with, would be forced to squad up and shoot one thousand targets from stations seven and eight, using NSSA rules.

Finally, I have observed that both Adrian and Chris Hughes have used the terms "un-Australian" and "Fair Go" several times. I am interested to know what their interpretations of these terms are - as I notice, frequently, they are used by a vocal minority when

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 may be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

2. Squads of 5 (or 6 if necessary) to shoot 100 targets per day, in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps, 2nd 50t moving up one trap. eg 1-2, 2-3, 3-4, 4-1, etc.

3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.

4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets. Shooters are expected to perform changeovers (between rounds as well as between squads) as quickly as possible, and certainly not exceed the maximum time limit allowed of two minutes. Anyone exceeding that time limit may be penalised.

5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be resquadded later in the event, but resquadding is not guaranteed, and non-participation is a possibility.

6. Should a shooter being late for his squad not be resquadded or elect to withdraw from the event, any refund of nominations paid is not guaranteed.

7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.

8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the loss of one target in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the loss of one target may be incurred in the event concerned.

9. Shooters will be selected from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, any penalty for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.

10. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised.

11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

13. Optional purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.

14. Optional purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however overall event winners cannot take any section prize.

17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals, trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.

18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00 am. or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.

20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

22. Reduced Nomination fees are applicable to Juniors and second Family members, they being wives and husbands, entering into the same event whose nomination must be lodged at the same time as a family members paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.

23. All competitors must comply with Firearm Licensing Laws in their state of residence and in the state hosting the National Championships.

Peter Field McBride ("Coach or Mac") 20 June 1924 - 14 July 2001

It is with regret and sadness that the West Australian Gun Club (Inc) acknowledges the passing of a good club member and friend after a second battle with a major illness.

Peter Field McBride was born in Burra - South Australia and moved with his parents to West Australia to continue their farming interests. They eventually took up residence at Gindalbie Station outside of Kalgoorlie in the heart of the gold and nickel mining country.

Peter pursued many a pseudo career throughout his lifetime as pastoralist, motorbike rider cum prospector, Light Horseman, pilot and clay target shooter. The two that were to last the longest were those of being a pilot and clay target shooter. He got his first plane by swapping some mineral claims on Gindalbie Station for a 6 seater Cherokee, which later became a charter company flying out of Perth to all round the state of West Australia with many and varied cargo.

Throughout his time Peter was an avid clay target shooter and people can remember this larger than life character from the 1950's when they were teenagers. Peter was active as a shooter at the Eastern Goldfields Gun Club and over many years amassed Commonwealth and State titles around West Australia. A very "titled" champion shooter.

Peter joined the West Australian Gun Club (Inc) and immediately took to coaching, assisting new shooters through to AA graders. In this new role, Peter put in some 300 hours plus per year and recognition of his efforts and achievements were rewarding with him being awarded the inaugural "Club Coach of the Year" from the ACTA (Inc) Coaching Council. He then several years later, won the prestigious award again, the only coach to do so. Hence the name "Coach" became his nickname. Peter, through his coaching, helped him to get together teams of Junior clay target shooters and prepare them for the Annual Winchester - WACTA (Inc) Junior Shield shoot. This he and his teams won for three consecutive years.

His time though, was not only spent coaching, as he took on ISSF Judging after the 1991 Perth World Championships, which led him to being a Line Referee at the 2000 Sydney Olympics. Something he took absolute pride and enjoyment in having achieved. This was Peter, the man who was a dedicated shooter, a Judge, Coach, committee member, recipient of the WAGC (Inc) "Club Person of the Year" and most of all a man who enjoyed telling stories of the old days to new shooters along with his mate "Monty" - the NT red heeler. Peter had time for everyone.

"Coach" will be sadly missed by all at the Club and by those who helped throughout the time as they became a member of the West Australian Gun Club (Inc).

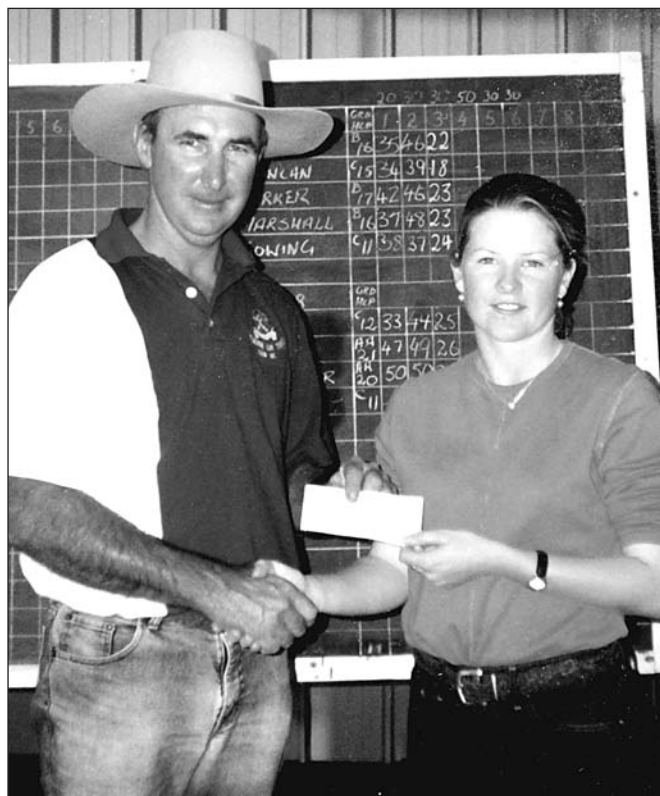

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS OCTOBER 2001

Whenever I think of October, my mind immediately focuses on memories of the World Skeet Shooting Championships. I guess the main reason for this is because for many years my entire existence revolved around this great event, and October is the month when it is traditionally held. Actually this wasn't always the case. When I first started attending the World Skeet Shoot, it was conducted in July, because that is the middle of summer in the Northern Hemisphere and thus the time when schools are in recess for "summer break" and the time when many people choose to take their annual vacation to enjoy the warmer weather.

Back in the days when the Shoot rotated all around North America, the practicality of the holiday period probably made this the best time of year to hold it, as most of the continent experiences good weather at this time, the only exception being about half a dozen states in the south-eastern corner of the country, in an area known as the Deep South. The West Coast area enjoys a very pleasant and temperate climate all year round, somewhat similar to that of the lower half of the east coast of Australia. However, once you cross the Rockies, that situation changes.

The South tends to have mild winters with very hot summers and the North is the opposite with mild summers and very severe winters. During my time in America, I lived in Connecticut for a couple of years, which is situated in the northeastern corner of the US, in an area known as New England. Although the summers are very pleasant there, for three months of the year during winter, the average daily temperature is below freezing and you shovel snow from your driveway almost every other day.

Later, whilst working for the NSSA, I resided in Texas and although the winters there were every bit as pleasant as the Northern summers, summertime in the South needs to be experienced in order to be fully appreciated. How people lived there prior to the advent of air conditioning is totally beyond me. Not only does the daily high exceed the benchmark figure of 100 degrees Fahrenheit (about 38 degrees Centigrade) every day for weeks on end, peaking occasionally as high as 115F (over 45C), but there is also generally no respite in the evenings, as the night time low rarely drops below 90F (about 32C).

Anyway, getting back to the World Skeet Shoot, as I said, after much soul-searching, NSSA moved the date of the Shoot from July to October in the late eighties. The reason they moved away from the practicality of the Summer Break was two-fold. The first was to extend the Skeet Shooting season, which traditionally didn't start until the Northern States thawed out in April, but which for practical and statistical reasons, pretty much ended with the World Shoot, thus limiting the season to a little over three months, and effectively wasting another couple of months of good weather.

The second reason was purely geographic. As the size of the Shoot grew, so the number of gun clubs big enough to hold it diminished. By the early seventies, when anticipated attendances had reached 1000 shooters, only two clubs remained with adequate facilities to stage the event. These were the National Gun Club in San Antonio Texas and the Forest City Gun Club in Savannah Georgia. Unfortunately, both these venues are located in "the South". So in July, at one you could fry eggs on the pavement, while the other had a lot in common with a sauna. Thus the move to October also made excellent meteorological sense. However, since 1992, Savannah has fallen out of the rotation and with the recent expansion of the National Gun Club from 38 to 50 fields, I cannot see the Shoot ever moving from San Antonio again.

I am often asked by intending or wishful attendees, what a visit to the World Skeet Shoot would be like and just what is required

insofar as planning and preparation is concerned. So I guess October is probably a relevant time to discuss this and explain the unexpected differences that anyone embarking upon such a venture might encounter. For a start, you need to join the NSSA, because unlike ACTA and NZCTA, they do not offer reciprocal membership rights with any other Shooting Organization, and you cannot even begin the entry process without current membership status. This costs US\$30 per shooting year, which runs from the beginning of November to the end of October.

The next and most important step is to select a shooting rotation, obtain squadding space on that rotation, and then secure that space by the payment of a holding deposit. This is completely different to the way that you would go about entering any major shoot in Australia, and thus is a potential pitfall with the gravest consequences. Although there are no Shoots in Australia of such magnitude that you cannot simply roll up unannounced on the day and compete, this luxury was long ago outgrown by the World Skeet Shoot. These days, the number of anticipated entrants has the potential to greatly exceed the capabilities of the infrastructure, and thus participation in any event is not guaranteed until you have your squadding confirmation receipt.

In order to be fair to all concerned, squadding space is made available on a "first-come first-served" basis, and after the squadding board is filled, applications are recorded in order of receipt on a waiting list. The reason why enrolment is done on the squadding board, rather than simply on an entrants list, is because once you grasp the concept of maximum facility usage, it then makes sense to preset rolling flight times, so that everyone gets to shoot at each of the various times of the day. The flow on from there, is that some rotation sequences may be more desirable than others and again, to be fair, rotation times are also allocated on the "first come" basis.

Actually, rotation preference is no longer anywhere near as important as it used to be. Originally there were five days of shooting and six rotation slots, causing each of the rotations to have a bye at one of the shooting times. These "timeslots" are an hour and a half long and ran from 8.30am until 5.30pm each day, except during the two days of the 12gauge, when they were 1.40 long and ran from 8.00am until 6.00pm. This is because the 12gauge is qualified on 250 targets over two days of 125 each, whereas all the other events involve 100 targets, all shot in one day.

In the Northern Hemisphere, Skeet fields face North rather than South, so the sun rises from behind the Low House rather than from behind the High House, as it does here in Australia. Thus looking into the sun is a problem early in the morning, when shooting all targets on stations one and the low targets on eight. (A mirror image of the problem we have shooting Skeet at Wagga in the late afternoon) Accordingly rotation two was the most popular slot, as it was the only one that avoided the first flight. For the same reason, rotations one and six were the least desirable, as they shot early on the two 8.00am start days. If you missed rotation two, then you simply hoped for overcast conditions on the day you shot early.

Later the Doubles event was included in the Main Rotation, which theoretically evened up the playing field, as there were now six events for six slots, so every rotation had one early start day. In practice however, rotation two still retained its desirability, as the Doubles were simply added into the blank spot on each rotation, and thus rotation two shot them at 8.30. For the uninitiated, doubles are easier to shoot into the sun, as you only shoot 12 targets per 100 on station one, as opposed to 16 in a regular Skeet event. And instead of shooting between 4 and 8 targets at low 8,

depending on how well you are going, in Doubles you never shoot there at all.

However, when the National Gun Club was expanded to 50 fields, the last rotation slot of the day was deleted in order to get the shoot-offs started earlier, which effectively did level up the playing field, as now everyone shoots one of the regular events on an early slot. Accordingly, the Doubles reverted back to a separate rotation, and so now the only advantage of squadding early is to get a late time for that event. However, even this is a bit of a moot point now, as the 8.30 slot on Doubles day is used for a special event called the Champion of Champions, which is the only event that has qualification restrictions on the entrants, so the Doubles don't start until 10.00am anyway.

Most of the "big hitters" still shoot on rotation two, but these days it's more a matter of a "historical prestige" issue, than the gaining of any real material shooting advantage. In fact most people now make their rotation selection based on more practical aspects, such as shooting early on a day when they have business commitments or want to go sight seeing. Others will arrange to shoot late on the day after the Hall of Fame Banquet or the Shooters Party, so that they can stay out later and/or indulge in the refreshments with greater abandon.

Anyway, provided you make your rotation selection and submit it to NSSA, along with your holding deposit, early enough to avoid the waiting list, they will send you back your squadding confirmation sheet, which gives you all your shooting times and field numbers for the whole week. You then have until September first to withdraw and still get you money back, after which time your deposit is forfeited if you cancel or don't show. Pre-nomination and prepayment facilities are available, however most people simply wait until they arrive at the Shoot and go through the registration line, ending with the cashier.

Once you have your confirmation/receipt, you can proceed confidently with your travel arrangements. If you are at all serious about trying to be competitive, then I strongly suggest that you plan to arrive at least a week before the competition starts, in order to allow yourself time to recover from the exhaustion of the trip and the effects of jet-lag. A couple of other handy hints are: Rental cars are relatively cheap in the States, especially if you hire them on a weekly basis and most "gold" credit cards offer a free insurance cover that allows you to avoid the rather expensive insurance option that rental companies offer. Also serviced apartments are generally better and cheaper than motels and usually have greater amenities and more fringe benefits.

This month's Shooting Trivia Question: At the Trap Nationals, only a handful of shooters have ever successfully defended National Titles, and only two people have ever managed to perform that great feat twice. Who are they? Mail your answer to Shooting Trivia, P.O. Box 265, Bairnsdale 3875, to arrive by 20-10-2001. The first correct answer drawn shall receive a free entry to next year's National Double Rise. The correct answer to August's STQ is: There appears to have only been three instances where parents and their children have each won open events at the Nationals. Initially, the only candidates I was aware of were my good friend Gordon Wakefield, who won the Skeet in 1974 and his daughter Desiree, who won the Macintosh High Gun in 1992. But I later discovered that Brian Thomson's father "Johnnie" had won the Pointscore in 1964, which qualifies them, as Brian is a five-time winner at the Skeet Nationals. However Doug Smith added a very interesting story about the father and son combination of John and Joe Raleigh from Queensland, who were both multiple winners at the Trap Nationals in the 50s and 60s, which wins him a free entry to next year's National Trap Handicap.

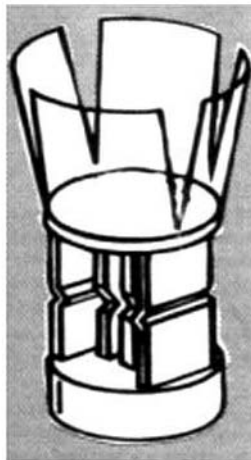

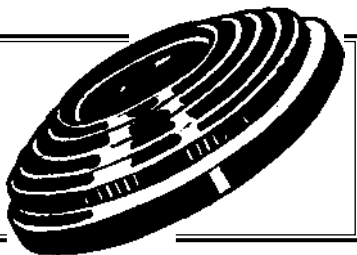

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the follow-ing particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts and maximum fine of \$5,500.

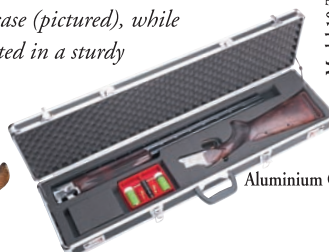
