As usual the number of entries was high, as this range is located close to the Perazzi and Beretta factories. Double Trap was first with training going without any hitches. Double Trap competition day was a little windy and targets were higher than usual. Russell finished with 134/150 to be in 11th position; Steve had 128/150 for 25th and Tom with 124/150 for 34th. With the heavy concentration of specialist Double Trap shooters the scores have been going up and we need to address this discipline with more training and competition to become competitive again like we have been over the last 10 years.

During the Double Trap Competition Ben and Michael arrived. Ben looking like a 2nd hand rugby player with a swollen ear and Michael minus his gun (it was taking a little holiday in Zurich.) By the start of trap training Michael had a gun (thank you to Mr Perazzi for the loan of the car to go back to Milan to collect the gun) and Ben's ear was getting bigger but all else was under control. At the end of the first 75 targets Michael was in 1st place with 73/75, Ben was 15th with 68/75 and Russell was 19th with 67. The team was 2nd behind Italy by 5 targets. The second day saw Michael shoot 48 to go into the final 3 ahead on 121/125. Ben despite surgery at the local hospital finished on 115/125 and in 9th position and Russell had 47 to finish on 114/125. The team result is one of the most competitive areas of Italian shooting and with 1 round to go the Aussies were still 1 behind. The last round blitz of 73/75 by Aust. saw us win over Italy by 6 targets. Its almost 10 years to the day since Australia won their first team shoot in Italy and again in the last round was the killer which is still talked about in Italy as Aust had to shoot 75/75 in that round for the win. Nowdays they expect us to be there which is an indication of how strong the Aussie trap team has become. Michael continued his



George Thomas

The Finley Gun Club regretfully informs the shooting fraternity of the passing of George Thomas at the age of 87 on the 9th of June 2001.

George spent his early life in the Barham - Wakool district in southern N S W, where, with his cousin Newton Thomas, they learnt their shooting skills, shooting foxes, rabbits etc on the properties along the Wakool river, and then working together as a shearing team up until George enlisted in the army in 1941.

After army service George took up a soldier settler's farm near Finley in 1949 and after a period of establishment, joined the Deniliquin Gun Club where he served on the committee for a number of years. He was also successful on the layout and soon earnt the handicap of 27 yards (one of only a small group in Australia at that time). He was a regular competitor at other clubs in Southern NSW ,

Northern Victoria and Melbourne during the 1960s and 70s. He was fortunate to be a member of the 1964 MacIntosh Team. George then joined the newly formed Finley Gun Club in the late 1960s where he also served on the committee and then after a period away from the sport returned to shooting and to serve as chair person for two years in the early 1990s.

George had a deep love of the sport and over the years was able to encourage many new and old shooters in their shooting development. He was also a keen observer of nature and had wide knowledge and a deep appreciation of the environment around him

He is survived by his 4 children, Douglas, Margaret, Elizabeth and Bickley. His wife Annie predeceased him.

Quality Shooting Facilities a Boom for Regional Tourism

Quality shot gun, rifle and pistol shooting facilities in the Sunnraysia and Robinvale districts have begun generating a valuable new tourism option with groups of up to 300 people regularly coming to the region for a weekend's competition.

Victorian Licensing Services Branch Policing Support Services manager Senior Sergeant Dennis Tocock said at a meeting held recently at Mildura Gun Club to present range approval certificates to club administrators, that the spin - off of range improvements and a growing interest in shooting was proving to be a bonus for regional centres. "There are quite a lot of competitions here already and we expect this interest to grow as more people take up one of the various firearm options as a sport. Already, a few locals have done well in shoots at a national and international level, and we expect a lot more in the future as the sport grows and people accept the new regulations".

Work during the past three or four years upgrading gun clubs and rifle and pistol ranges was also paying dividends in firearm safety. "We have re-addressed firearm accidents through providing safe instructions and safe ranges, particularly in rural areas where firearms are common."

Sen. Sgt. Tocock was presenting seven certificates of range approval at Mildura Gun Club. "These ranges have been working for several years to meet all the requirements relating to the new Firearms Act which became law in 1997", he said. "We started two years ago and have now inspected 245 of the 320 ranges in Victoria. Of those, 175 have now been approved, and only 12 have been closed for safety reasons. When we inspect a range, we itemise all the elements that need fixing and upgrading. Most of these can be done over a reasonable time, although there are some temporary closures".

"The only ranges we close permanently are those where there is a serious safety problem that cannot be fixed. Some of these local ranges have had to do a fair bit of work and I have to congratulate Mildura Rural City Council for its help in the regard. Local members and council have done a very professional job, in fact, I am taking some pictures for a trip I making to the United States.

An early difficulty was that there were no manuals for range operators to comply with. "So we had to establish our own, and this has now become a model for other States and could eventually be the basis of a national range manual". Sen. Const. Tocock liaised with

the American National Rifle Association when developing the manual.

He has been invited back to lecture on the changes in Victoria and the implementation of new gun laws and firearms safety courses. "We have put 11,800 people through these courses in the past 12 months. The long arm course was introduced in 1988, and a course for hand guns started in 1997. We now have 250 hand gun and 650 long arm instructions across the State."

Once local ranges are approved, regional firearms officers (RFO's) ensure the standard is maintained and continued. "This has

been a major element in reducing firearm accidents."

Certificates were presented to the Red Cliffs and Mildura Small Bore ranges (now Target Rifle Victoria); the Victorian Rifle Association Yatpool full bore range; the Pistol Clubs of Victoria, Amateur Pistol Association and Mildura Pistol Club range at Koorlong; and the Sporting Shooters Association of Australia Cardross range complex and sub clubs, the Sunnraysia Pistol Club, the Mildura Military Rifle and Pistol Club, the Sporting Rifle Club, Field Conservation Club, Western Action Club, and the Arms and Military Collectors Guild.

Also awarded were the shotgun clubs, the Mildura Gun Club (Australian Clay Target Association) and Sunraysia Field and Game (under the Field and Game Association).

Sen. Sgt. Tocock congratulated the instructors at local ranges "and the hundreds of volunteers" who have offered their services and helped in the transition to new gun laws and safety training. "Now these ranges are approved, we are encouraging people to consider using them", he said. "This region has some very good facilities, there is only a small charge and there is also the opportunity to talk to others interested in the sport".

Dear Sir

It is very disappointing that the present debate on skeet rules has sunk to the level of arrogance and rudeness evident in the August volume of the Clay Target Shooting News. There needs to be a return to the sort of fair mindedness that has always characterised the management of clay target shooting in Australia.

There also needs to be more balance in the debate on the skeet rules. Some of the arguments being put for the NSSA rules are inaccurate and misleading.

The article in the August edition of Clay Target Shooting News by Adrian Cousens said that the skeet rules were 'bastardised' by the inept people in ACTA. He is entitled to his opinion, but that's all it is - his opinion. It is certainly not shared by the majority of shooters in Western Australia, and I believe Australia. The continuing debate on the skeet rules suggests that many members of ACTA believe that the Australian skeet rules modernised and improved the shooting procedure and that reverting back to the NSSA rules was a backward step. Adrian's attack on the ACTA is an insult to people who have worked hard to lift Australian shooting to its present high standard.

In all the thousands of words that have been produced in favour of the NSSA rules there is not one shred of evidence that the NSSA rules improve the shooting procedure. The NSSA rules have been in place for almost eight months and the feeling in Western Australia is that they are inferior to the Australian rules. This is well illustrated by station 8 where the NSSA rules are clumsy and illogical in comparison with the Australian rules.

The latest argument that the ACTA has unilaterally changed the

world standard rules of our sport is a complete nonsense. American skeet is not a world sport because it has no world governing body like cricket and tennis. It is controlled by an American Association - the NSSA- and is a purely American sport. If American skeet was a world sport, Australia would be represented on the world governing body and would have input to the rules as it has in other sports.

Excluding ISU Skeet, there are at least three forms of skeet. There is American skeet, Australian skeet and UK skeet. The UK shoots a similar type of skeet to Australia, but does not have station 8. The two targets that we shoot at station 8 are replaced by a double from station 4 and the optional 25th target is shot from station 7.

If one of the objectives of adopting the NSSA rules is to promote international competition between America, Australia and other countries, the people advocating the NSSA rules could spend their time more profitably in establishing skeet as a world sport with a governing body made up of representatives of the participating countries. But if they succeeded, the new sport could be very different to the NSSA rules. Look at what happened when skeet shooting was accepted as an Olympic sport. They threw out the NSSA rules and adopted a very different set of rules.

If we want to improve the skeet shooting rules, we should pick the best aspects of all the current skeet disciplines. We should not revert to the older NSSA rules, which both Australia and the UK changed because they believed that they needed modernising.

Adrian's article also has some unfounded criticism of Australian trap shooting. He says that our rules lie in the twilight zone between ATA Trapshooting and ISSF Trench. The reality is that Australian trapshooting strikes an excellent balance between the very demanding discipline of Trench and the much easier ATA. Australian trapshooting is a challenging and popular discipline and one that has provided an excellent skill base for people wanting to graduate to Trench. Australia's three Olympic gold medals should be proof enough. I am sure that the majority of ACTA members will support me in saying "Hands off our trap shooting rules."

The letter by Chris Hughes in the August issue suggested that it was un-Australian to change the NSSA rules. There are no legal, ethical or moral reasons why Australia, the UK or any other country, should not adopt their own skeet rules. I am sure that NSSA could not care less.

My final point is that it is hard to escape the obvious conclusion that the continued debate on the skeet rules indicates that there is a widespread feeling that we have been conned into a set of rules that are inferior to the Australian rules. The proponents of the NSSA rules have failed to convince us otherwise.

Dear Editor:

I feel I have no option but to write to the ACTA magazine in the hope that some constructive changes will occur to the present way we look at our sport, our handicapping system and also ourselves as sports people.

In 1983 I joined the ACTA as I believed that was the direction I would get into good competition and at the time I also regarded the ACTA as the best administered organization running clay target shooting. By 1983 the sport had established itself into various forms of shooting and had compiled an extensive history of champions, past and current. Having joined the ACTA, I then identified the form of shooting which was of most interest to me. The skeet.

Upon turning up to shoot my first competition, I was promptly told I was graded into A grade for the events. This was based on the knowledge the handicapper had of me from my days of shooting at Sporting Shooters. Now to some people this might have seemed harsh and unfair, however I saw it differently as I joined the ACTA to learn from the experienced shooters.

For the next two years I did what I call my apprenticeship, learning to shoot better and refine my technique. During those years I got to meet some legends of the sport in Trap, Skeet and Olympic disciplines.

By 1985 I made my first State Team and earned the honour of representing my state at the Skeet Nationals (which by the way we were successful in). However on an individual basis I didn't travel too well and was beaten by more successful and seasoned shooters. By 1988 I had attained a constant AA grade standing and was rewarded with wins at both Olympic and American Skeet Nationals. All of a sudden I could match it with the good shots when I had a good day. All the time whilst competing I was proud of the fact I was a AA grade shot. I accepted you have good days and bad days, after all that was what competition was about.

However I guess you are wondering where I am coming from in this letter. Let me begin by drawing a couple of deficiencies to your attention.

The days of people shooting in their correct grades appears to have to a large extent disappeared.

The days of the handicapper re-handicapping under-graded shooters has almost ceased.

The sport has been brought into disrepute by an element of shooters who manipulate the card systems.

New shooters join the sport with a view of being competitive, only to find the current system doesn't allow that, due to under-handicapped shooters. Let me suggest a positive way to improve our sport and membership numbers.

Adopt the officially recognised Skeet grading system for Skeet, rather than using the ACTA Trap grading rules by default, as we now. This does not permit any down grading during the year, only up grading. This is much more likely to result in AA grade shooters shooting in the correct grade.

Review and regrade at the end of the year only, based on their best 75% of scores. Drop the worst 25% of scores from consideration as these generally are shot on poorly set traps, windy days, rainy days, or some other influence and thus do not genuinely indicate the true ability of the shooter.

By encompassing both these ideas we should end up with a fairer system to all.

My other suggestion to restore some honour to the sport, would be to bring in mandatory AA grade for a minimum of two years for a shooter who wins a State Title and also AA grade rating for five years for a National Title with the exception of a shooter sixty years or over who would incur two years mandatory AA.

Now I know there are a few out there who don't agree with me, but why give out a Silver Australia badge and sash or a State Silver badge and sash as recognition for a fine display of shooting, only to find these same shooters turn up a couple of months down the track as A grade shooters. It has always been an honour to wear the badges and win them and therefore it should be an honour to stay in AA grade. Also at the end of the day they know and so do we that they really are AA grade shooters.







CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS NOVEMBER 2001

Back in August, Karen and I went up to Wagga for the NSW State Skeet Carnival. By lunchtime on the Sunday, I had not won any Red Sashes, and in fact had only managed a minor placing in a single event. However, I had been plodding along quietly like "the old bull" and had myself in a pretty handy position. When I went out to shoot the last event, which was the State Doubles, I was only down two targets over the program. Moreover, as I was in the last squad, the dust had pretty much settled by then, and the job ahead of me was "crystal clear". The best HOA score in was three down, and 49s were "the main" in the Doubles, so a 49 would put me in both shoot-offs and a 50 would make a real nuisance of myself.

The conditions were quite good, the targets were flying pretty nicely and I quickly settled down into a smooth rhythm. About half way through the second round, I was fairly "drillin' em" and the bookmakers were starting to calculate their losses. But then disaster struck! The day that I had been secretly dreading for a long time now, finally arrived. That tremendous mental control that God gifted upon me at birth, finally found the edge of the envelope in the most spectacular way. My mind spontaneously "imploded" and I began freezing on the first shot so violently that I was unable to even get the second shot off. After stringing together a run of zeros that looked more like a little league baseball score than a Skeet tally, I eventually had to quit, rack my gun and walk around with the others, for the rest of the round, just to keep them company.

Following this, I slinked off back to the parking lot like a mongrel dog, with my tail between my legs, and lay low until "stumps". The only redeeming feature of this whole fiasco, was the fact that the Shoot Organisers were gracious enough to mark me up on the scoreboard as a scratching, rather than a "thirty something". So this month I figure it would be pointedly topical to revert back to examining the Mental Aspects of shooting, which I broached upon back in the August 2000 issue of the CTSN, and promised to continue to elaborate upon from time to time.

The relevant matter here is not actually one of the six major categories that I usually break the Mental Aspects of shooting down into, being Concentration, Visualisation, Determination, Motivation, Familiarisation and Confidence. It is really more of a peripheral issue, and as such I have addressed it in one of the related appendices, attached to the bottom of the Mental chapter, in the book that I am currently writing on Skeet Shooting, but will probably never finish. The topic is Choking, Flinching, Freezing and Release Triggers.

But let me digress for just a minute. About eighteen months ago, at the New Zealand Nationals, Billy Iles announced his official retirement from top level competitive shooting. Like most people, I was somewhat surprised by this, and took the time to sit down and discuss it with him at my first opportunity. Bill explained that the decision was a rather complex one and related to a combination of a number of different matters, but the deciding issue was a personal one of a physical nature. As we all grow older, various parts of our bodies begin to degenerate and let us down, and in Bill's case it was his eyesight.

He explained to me that this problem had been plaguing him for quite a while, and that he had seen the writing on the wall for some time that it would eventually cause the demise of his dominance of Trapshooting in this country. Thus he had been mentally preparing himself for the point where he could no longer hide the problem, and would have to openly address it. He said that as it had gradually worsened, he had been able to progressively make adjustments and corrections that allowed him to work with it. But all of these methods have a use-by date, and were simply forestalling the inevitable, which was now fast becoming imminent.

During this discussion with Bill, I immediately saw a situation within myself, that paralleled his. I have also had biological problems creeping up upon me over a period of time, which I knew would eventually spell the death knell of my own serious compet-

itive shooting. However, unlike Bill, whose problems are physical, and therefore easily understandable and possibly correctable, or at least treatable, my problems are in my mind. Finally, the tremendous mental strength and control that I have always enjoyed in shooting, and that has enabled me to achieve some quite spectacular and "world beating" performances on occasions, is slipping away from me.

To put the situation into a graphic perspective, I see my mind somewhat like a worn-out racing engine, that has been over-revved too many times in order to squeeze itself first past the post. Like the aging engine, which is probably still quite OK to idle around doing the shopping and go on short low-speed trips, my mind is quite stable for shooting practice and indulging in casual social competitions. However, in the same way that the old engine is likely to run a bearing, or drop a valve, if you get it hot and ask it to develop 600hp, my mind can no longer withstand the immense pressure of high-level competition. As it did at the State Shoot recently, it is just as likely to mentally "poke a con-rod out the side of the block" if you try to "run it at 8000rpm" for extended periods of time.

Anyway, let's get to the crux of the issues I want to examine this month. Choking is the most prevalent of the three mental ailments. It affects 98% of all shooters and is the basis for the famous one-liner: "the world is full of good practice shooters". Choking is the result of the adrenalin generated by the stress of competition, acting in a negative way, and causing the mind to panic and go into self-destruct mode, just as you call "pull" at the crucial time. Thus, the perfectly timed, beautifully smooth move that you have been honing up during Wednesday afternoons practice sessions, becomes a completely mistimed wild jerking action on Saturday.

Although a good shooting coach, with intimate knowledge and experience with this phenomenon, can probably be quite a lot of help with the problem, and offer a few tips and pointers to help you through it, most people simply have to try and shoot their way through it. The bottom line is: some do, some don't. Thus, unfortunately, a lot of people never reach their full potential because they don't ever learn how to channel adrenalin into becoming a positive factor in their repertoire. And make no mistake, no great achievements were ever accomplished in a complete state of calm, because calmness will only ever allow you to operate at the extremities of your ability. Nearly all truly outstanding performances are the result of people correctly using adrenalin, which is the only "legal" performance-enhancing drug, to elevate their achievements way beyond their normal physical capabilities.

Fortunately, I am in the 2% minority of people who have never suffered from choking, and I have always been able to positively channel my adrenalin flow. I have always been able to shoot more targets on Saturday, than I could on Wednesday, and it is the main reason why at times I have been able to achieve performances that defy logic, and that even I sometimes look back upon in awe. The year that I shot 650x650 over the course of the week, at the World Skeet Shoot, to win both the HOA and HAA, my two-man team partner told me afterwards that I had shot the last two rounds with the 410 in the wind, on the last day, almost as if I was in a trance. He said that my eyes looked almost glazed, and I seemed to have no perception of anything else going on around me, and that he had never seen me shoot smoother, better, or more technically correctly. He said it never occurred to him that I might miss, and that I had hit every one of the last 50 targets right in the middle of that tiny pattern. Thank you God!

The other two mental shooting diseases are Flinching and Freezing, and although they are similar and related, they are not the same, and are in fact uniquely different. Thus, one of the major hurdles with either or both of these problems is people's inability to differentiate between them and/or likeliness to confuse them. The problem is that they are similar in their symptoms and are usually generated by almost identical stimuli, but manifest themselves in different outcomes. Flinching occurs when your mind has control over everything else going on around it, other than the

muscles in your trigger finger, and you simply cannot pull the trigger when you want to. Freezing is when your mind temporarily loses the plot completely, and simply can't, doesn't or won't go ahead and perform the act of shooting at the required time.

Unlike choking, where most people usually start out with a full blown dose, which they have to slowly and progressively get on top of over a period of time, each of the other two problems slowly and progressively sneak up on you over a period of time. People often tell me that they flinch or freeze a little bit sometimes, and that they are concerned that it seems to be escalating. Unfortunately, both ailments are very complicated and are usually generated as a result of, and worsened by, differing combinations of various causes. These include, but are not restricted to, competition induced stress, fear of missing and/or other issues, age, total length of time shooting, extent of recent shooting workload, firearm recoil, muzzle blast noise, fatigue and extraneous worries. Thus, both problems can be lessened or improved by analysing and counteracting or diminishing any or all of the above related causes, but an actual permanent solution is another matter entirely.

Now for the good news and the bad news. Both problems are similar in cause and effect. However, due to the differences in their manifestation, one is generally curable and the other generally isn't. Most cases of flinching can be cured fairly quickly and easily by conversion to a release trigger. This is because with flinching, at least a partial effort is generated by the mind to pull the trigger, and with a correctly adjusted release trigger, this is usually more than enough to discharge the firearm at the required time. Thus the "reverse trigger" arrangement not only solves the problem in the first degree by usually defeating it when it tries to arise, but also undermines it in the second degree, by lessening the stress and fear associated with it's impending occurrence, which compounds the effect and generally lessens the number of attempted occurrences. Since changing to a release trigger, the frequency of my attempted flinches has dropped almost to nil.

Unfortunately, release triggers generally have no beneficial effect on freezing and in fact can have a reverse and worsening effect. This is because a person freezing with a pull trigger generally does not ever actually fire a shot. Whereas with a release trigger, after the initial freezing up, the victim then generally relaxes to some degree, thereby discharging the firearm at some later delayed time. The surprise, embarrassment and heightening of the problem by this undesirable by-product, generally increases the mental anxiety and stress of the overall problem, compounding its effect and the frequency of its occurrence. A sort of "catch 22" situ-

Thus, people should be very careful when deciding on or advising other people upon cures for these types of mental ailments. Fortunately, the prevalence of flinching far outweighs the number of people who develop a freezing problem, and thus the blanket effect of trying to solve all of them with release triggers, at least cures the vast majority of cases. However, this is not much help to the freeze victims, who are generally devastated by the outcome of this incorrect diagnosis and treatment. So what can really be done about freezing? Not a real lot that I'm aware of at this stage I'm afraid, other than scaling down both the extent and expectations of the victim's shooting.

My current personal situation? I've been through all the dramas of flinching, and the joy of obtaining a successful solution to it. And now I've been through the heartache of seeing freezing creeping up upon me, and the trauma of the day when it finally overpowered me. However, I am extremely fortunate that this problem has happened to me at the end of my career, rather than at some earlier point in it, and thus I can empathise with those people whose attainment of these types of mental problems is not anywhere near as timely as mine. The only real effect it has had on me personally, is to hasten my eventual retirement, which probably wouldn't have been all that far off anyway. And at least I can now sit back and console myself with the fact that it is better to be a "has been" than a "never was".

Seriously though, all I have to do now is taper off the total amount of shooting that I do, combined with a lessening of my ambitions and expectations at major shoots, and not participate in any team

shoots, other than ones where all the other members accept the possibility of me breaking down and putting us out of contention. Anyway, my wife is still "dead keen" on her shooting, and I'm sure will thereby keep me involved in the sport for the foreseeable future. Thus, over the next twelve months or so, I will probably decide whether or not to just ease off and concentrate on the social and vocational aspects of shooting trips, combined with the shared pleasure of my wife's achievements, or whether I go ahead and become more heavily involved in the administration and politics of the sport.

Anyway, that doesn't matter at the moment, because the prize was offered for the most correct answer submitted prior to the closing date, and that goes to Bill Attwood from West Coburg in Victoria, who suggests that the oldest living ACTA National Champion may currently be Bob Mules from South Australia who won the Double Rise in 1972. Bob's wife assured me that "the old feller" will turn 80 this New Years Eve. Good on ya Bob! And for his offering, "young Billy" has won a free entry to next year's National Champion of Champions.

Once settled into our hotel, an early night was in order to try to shake off the effects of jetlag and to simply catch up on much needed sleep.

The next day was unofficial practice and an opportunity to visit the range to suss out what and how everything was going to work. Imagine our horror when we found out that Italian ammunition was \$A21 per packet and even the local ammo was \$A13. 

The Gold Coast Club Committee has worked extremely hard over the past 18 months with their aim being to conduct the best 2 day trap shoot they possibly could.



Before the club could start making plans for their new grounds









AFFILIATION RENEWALS:

That time is upon all Members and Clubs again - a reminder to all Club Officials of the need to include CHRISTIAN names and dates of birth for all affiliations - be they new members or those renewing after a break.

If you are unsure as to how to complete the affiliation paperwork for the ACTA - refer to page 7 of the April, 2000 Shooters News. Shooters can also assist by providing these important details to your Club Secretary when you complete your 2002 Membership renewal.

CLUB AFFILIATION PAYMENTS:

A timely reminder also, that the ACTA will not process your members affiliations and send out the 2002 score books until their home club has paid the Club's annual fees.

Clubs pay a fee to the ACTA and also a fee to Q.C.T.A. - two separate payments to two separate organisations - pay them promptly and your members will receive their 2002 score books promptly.

QLD. RANGE REGISTERS:

These are located at every Qld. Club and under that States Weapons Act must be signed by any person discharging a firearm at that particular range. Even if it is one shot - the register must be signed. As these registers are a requirement under the Act - they are a legal document and must be treated as such.

ANNUAL SHOOT CHANGES:

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,




