








Its that time of the year again where I hear mates whinge about the cost of shooting membership etc and yet shooting has never been cheaper compared to golf,karting or building and flying model planes etc etc .You don't have to change shotguns every 2-3 years to stay competitive or that cartridges are cheaper today than in 1990,think about it you can still buy a case for \$120 or often less.

Where they have an argument is the the tripling of bureaucracy,I am yet to be convinced, even when I had the privilege of being a club secretary, that eastern Australian members have ever got a real benefit from state or zone body's, other than the sponsoring of sashes and please don't give me the argument that they "organize" the shooting programs, please! eg1; this years NSW blue book for Olympic Trap was a disaster.

This can all be just as competently done by the ACTA especially since the NSW state body is now at Wagga. There is a \$12 saving or at least \$6 using some for extra staff better still use the other \$6 to give every member a current rule book.

Then of course there is politics, where the national directors are chosen by the state body's irrespective of expertise. Do you, the reader honestly believe that the NRMA board all know what a diff from a distributor is? They don't have to because they are chosen for their, in theory, expertise and it has now become past half time for the ACTA to get organised as such i.e.; being a business, especially when some are earning fees or benefits, when is the last time it published in the newsletter a business plan and mission statement if one exists?

The fighting fund is fighting for nothing it sits there as a power base in various accounts eroding away with inflation."Use it or loose it" not for advertising but for lobbying for legislation changes such as the current proposed bill in NSW to allow shooters back on to state land to eradicate feral's or new shooter have a go days, not in 3 weeks time when the permit comes through and they have forgotten and the club has forgotten to phone them and or when they turn up to a club and they get a short reception with no hand outs about the sport or how to do it, because we all know.It happened to a friend of mine.

If the current policy, if there is one? (business plan), is not changed then who will get the money when there are no clay target shooters left? what does the ACTA constitution say? as I have never seen one.

All of us however have a responsibility to the sport that the reader might not have thought of and that is that we all know people with other interests or groups and we should all be encouraging others to have a go at clay target sports but some of us forget, often.

I would like the ACTA to consider for this coming membership year a BOUNTY and introduction manual for new members to remind us to encourage others and reduce membership costs (save money) that the ACTA credit back to the introducing member \$10. per new member to the level that an existing member could get their membership and newsletter from the ACTA for free, the clubs would still get their membership because that's how many survive.

The real cost is negligible to the national body if at all as they might enjoy themselves and renew for many years.

What business wouldn't take up an offer to get six fees for the cost of one?

A Win Win all round, please consider!

Thursday, 8th November - The Teams assembled in Melbourne, Brisbane and Sydney for their flights to Auckland and many excited new faces made up this Oceania Team, many wearing their Australian track suits proudly for the very first time. This was great for the A.C.T.A. and Australia's future in shooting.

The Teams arrived in Auckland over a 6 hour period as we flew with both Qantas and Air New Zealand. After clearing Customs in Auckland, the Melbourne and Sydney Team members went directly to Hamilton on our mini buses (complete with drivers) to our accommodation at the Alcamo Hotel/Motel. I stayed on to bring those flying in from Brisbane and would follow later. The motel, which has a 4 star rating, has well presented rooms, many with a full sized spa and mezzanine floors, with the bedrooms upstairs and the kitchenette, lounge, bathroom and spa downstairs. I can fully recommend this as a place to stay at \$85.00 per room, per night for 2 people. The Team by 9 p.m. was settled into the accommodation.

Friday, 9th November - A Team meeting was held the following morning by the side of the pool at 8.30 a.m. A few of the Junior shooters slept in but everyone soon became acquainted. I outlined what the procedures were to be for each day and what was expected of the competitors, the details of the competition and any other relevant information that was asked for. We then went out to the Waikato Gun Club which is about a 20 minute drive out of Hamilton. Quite a nice Club and grounds which contain 10 DTL Traps, 5 Skeet, 2 ISSF Trap plus Field shooting platforms. After organising cartridges all competitors started their practice - 2 rounds were given to each person in the nominations and after that the competitors had to pay for their own. After a few small problems (with funny targets) where traps were adjusted, I believe everyone was satisfied with the targets and conditions of the grounds and left the Club feeling a little less nervous and were eager to face the competition which was to begin the next morning. The weather was great, around 22 degrees C. The background at the Club, which on my last trip here, was paddocks of 2 metre high crops of maize/corn, had been harvested and cut down, leaving flat open paddocks. The targets used were CC1 and were very good.

As it was still relatively early after practice, some of the ladies/girls wanted to go shopping down town and a few of the guys went to a gun shop looking to fix Andrew Norman's middle sight which had been broken off. After about 2 hours of driving all over Hamilton trying to find this particular part, we arrived back at the gun shop to find Andy had gone back to the motel in disgust at having to wait so long and to add to his misery, the other mini bus that he had picked up had broken a clutch rod ! We also missed picking up the ladies from their shopping expedition down town by an hour - in all, I was not very popular but over the years I have grown to know where most of the gunsmiths and their shops are in Hamilton, and yes, we did get Andy his new sight !

Saturday, 10th November - Competition was about to begin. As we arrived at the Club, I was informed by the Tournament Director that the Team competition format had been changed and would be shot over the 200 targets in both DTL Trap and Standard Skeet. Nothing like waiting till the last minute to change the Rules ! A few of our shooters were a little disappointed but as I said to them, "If you are good enough to win on one day, two days should not make much difference" and that "it was going to be the same for everyone".

I must admit there were many of our Team members that I did not know before coming to New Zealand, and the only information that I had on them was what I had seen from the eliminations and Club results as seen printed in the C.T.S.N. - I was certainly impressed ! After the first day's competition the results were very exciting with all competitors putting in 100% and it was great to see that the 'A' and 'B' Teams were not only trying to beat New Zealand but each other - there was great rivalry. Joshua Daly had trouble with his injectors in his gun and had to use another one that put him off a little. I was able to take his gun in and get it fixed by one of the gunsmiths I found the previous day - so some good came out of it. At the completion of the competition everyone headed back to the motel to have an early relaxing night.

Sunday, 11th November - The Juniors were up early and eager to get out to the Club where they could get stuck into the competition. Wednesday, 14th January - Competition was about to begin for

A relatively new shooter at Double Trap, Nadine is improving all of the time. Our own Suzanne Balogh was not shooting as well as she normally does (her scores have been world class) and she came in 2nd place on 123/160. Sissy shot her personal best and she was very excited about that, and so she should be, as she has only just started shooting this discipline. I left Lauren in charge of the camera and the organising of the shooters for presentations and Team photographs. She had all of the Team under control and had taken some good shots by the time I got back. Well done everybody and thank you Lauren.

The Team ended up winning the Silver Medal shooting a score of 310/375. New Zealand won the Gold Medal on 338/375 but their Team was made up of very experienced competitors.

Our Men's Trap Team of Russell Mark, Nidal Asmar and Brett Dunstan dominated this event shooting 348/375 and winning the Gold Medal. In the Oceania Individual Trap, Russell won the Gold

Medal and Frank Minici won the Bronze Medal. Frank's grin went from ear to ear and he later, very proudly, showed off his sponsor's name on his T-shirt and jacket - Tower Insurance. In the Men's Individual Trap, after the Final, Russell again won the Gold Medal with 146/150 over Brett Dunstan who took the Silver Medal with a score of 141/150 + 1. 



## CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS

### March 2002

Last month I began elaborating on some ideas recently suggested to me by Steve Haberman and then broadened by the input of a number of other experienced shooters. This month I intend to continue on with that project and examine another one of them. I'm going to start with the one that created the greatest amount of interest and enthusiasm at the "big guns" meeting in Echuca recently: an ACTA National Hall of Fame, similar to the State Hall of Fame recently introduced by the NSWCTA and clearly driven and guided by Mark McInnes. I guess one of the reasons for the prominence of such a concept in this company, is that most of the people present would have an imminently vested interest in it, if it evenuated.

However another equally important reason for its eminence was that most of the people concerned were very outspoken about it and have very fixed and passionate ideas about how it should and shouldn't work, to the point where almost everyone agreed that if it wasn't going to be done properly, it shouldn't be done at all. Actually, it turned out to be a bit like the Silver Australia Badge issue, where very little disturbance showed on an apparently calm surface, but the current and turbulence that existed just below it, would drown you in a second. Another Pandora's box containing a can of worms on steroids.

All of my various wives have at some time or another enlightened me that one of the most mystifying and frustrating things about me is how someone who is usually so logical and clear thinking, can sometimes be so naive. One used to refer to it as my Gyro Gearloose Syndrome, whereas another simply told me that sometimes I could be thicker than a house-brick. This spill over of passion regarding a proposed Hall of Fame proved to be another perfect example of this trait. For a start I could not figure out why nearly all the top shooters present were so "het up" about the whole issue, but as the debate progressed, the penny suddenly dropped.

I guess that in every sport there is a certain amount of suspicion and mistrust between the participants and the administrators, and unfortunately in this country the Tall Poppy Syndrome tends to accentuate this. However I was quite unprepared for the level of inherent mistrust that surfaced in relation to this issue. Right from the start almost everyone was adamant about it needing to be a Shooters Hall of Fame as opposed to a Shooting Hall of Fame and that administrators should neither be eligible for induction nor involved in the selection process.

As the discussions proceeded, it became very apparent that this "them and us" situation had recently suffered a very serious setback over the awarding of the Australian Sports Medals. I must admit

that at the time I was not conversant with how these awards were allocated, but since becoming aware of the level and scope of the upset caused by them, I have done a little homework on it and found that the situation is more complicated and less tainted than many people think. I guess it is natural for shooters to see things from a shooter's perspective and thus wrongly assume that these medals should have been allocated on a performance basis to all of our top shooters in order of the magnitude of their accomplishments.

Therefore the retention of a large percentage of them by the administrators charged with the responsibility of allocating them is seen as somehow fraudulent or corrupt. In fact this is not the case, as the intention of the awards was always that they go to people for recognition of their service in advancing the operation as well as the image of the sport. Thus, the administrators in question certainly have a very arguable case in relation to their decisions as to who is the more deserving of the awards. I have no problem with the fact that my name did not make the cut at the VCTA and I personally believe that if, for instance, some lady has been running the canteen at the local Gun Club every Saturday for the last thirty years, then she has as much right to an award as Russell Mark or Doug Smith.

Notwithstanding this, I'm sure the crux of the matter lies somewhere between the extremities of the two viewpoints and human nature being what it is, I suppose it's only natural that a disproportionate share of the medals ended up in the hands of the people allocating them. Anyway, as a result of this and a number of other historical differences and misunderstandings between the participants and the administrators, I guess it's no wonder that the shooters as a whole fear that if a National Shooting Hall of Fame were set up and run by administrators, it could easily digress into an "old boys club".

The general consensus of opinion was that for the thing to work properly, it needed to get started by setting up a steering committee of about ten or a dozen people, who would be selected on the basis of being the most accomplished shooters still living at that time. This committee would then establish the rules and regulations governing the system and lay down the criteria by which inductees would be selected, but again that it would basically be in line with the way that the NSW Hall of Fame is run, as everyone agreed that they were definitely on the right track.

The NSW system provides for the allocation of points for the winning of certain events, with a minimum total required for eligibility. In their case it is 100 points for a World Championship, 20 points for a National Championship and 10 points for each of the group of State Championship events that are normally conducted at the State Carnival. The careful wording of the State events criteria was to prevent the unlikely, but possible situation, of someone who no-one had ever heard of, technically qualifying with a collection of such things as the State Night Mini Continental Walk Up, conducted at the Nowheresville Gun Club, one Wednesday evening, where 13 out of 20 was enough to beat the seven other B and C graders in attendance.

The NSWCTA require a minimum of 100 points, gained under the above criteria, to qualify for either their State Trapshooters Hall of Fame or their State Skeet Shooters Hall of Fame, which they keep separate, for reasons I don't quite understand. Anyway, it is envisaged that the minimum qualifying score for the National Hall of Fame should be doubled to 200 points, with at least three (possibly four) National Titles included. Although formidable, this is not as difficult as it first seems, as State Titles can be accumulated from all States and overseas National Titles are also permissible.

I would not like to see the ACTA National Hall of Fame segregated into the two separate disciplines for a couple of good reasons. One is that if you do the arithmetic on it, you would find that I am possibly the only one who would qualify for the Skeet section at the moment and maybe for quite a long time, and even I am not egotis-

tical enough to want my own private Hall of Fame. Another is that it may preclude some of our more versatile shooters, who may not qualify over either of the two disciplines separately, but who are far too accomplished to be excluded. One typical example that immediately comes to mind is Ken Lowry, whose five National Trap championships and three National Skeet titles provide 80% of the stipulated requirement when amalgamated. And I would be extremely surprised if he did not have at least the four State titles required to qualify him on a combined system, whereas ten more State Trap titles is a big ask. Even Jimmy Ellis may find the 20 points for his 1979 National Skeet win handy when tallying up all of his Trapshooting titles.

It was proposed that the inductions be done at the Trap Nationals, and that it be done at some sort of Shooters Party, or similar function, probably on the evening of the National Double Barrel. This particular day has numerous advantages, such as it is early enough in the week to maximise attendance and is generally the only day on which you can almost guarantee that the shooting will continue until dark. Thus a predetermined itinerary could be arranged which would co-ordinate the finishing of the day's competition with the start of the cooking and the entertainment, as well as enable an official starting time to be established for the festivities, for those people who either weren't competing or wanted to go away and change for the function.

The next matter to be determined was how many eligible people should be inducted each year in order to keep the process relevant and interesting over a suitable period of time. The dual criteria to be balanced was the fact that for a start there would be a large number of shooters who already qualify, but after this backlog had been cleared, then the additions would slow to a trickle with probably most years without any candidates, interspersed with individual entrants. After much discussion it was decided that an inaugural induction of four people, followed by an additional two each year until the current crop was exhausted would be the best plan.

Another important issue was the order in which the existing candidates would be inducted. This matter was quickly put to rest by a suggestion from "Habie" which reflected the amount of thought he had obviously given the whole matter. His proposal went something along the lines of: "We need to start out with all the old stiffies who are still with us, before they fall off their perches". Although this was initially treated as a joke and created much amusement for all those in attendance, both young and old, it was quickly seen as the optimum starting point and unanimously agreed upon. Once this section had been tidied up, the general consensus was that we should then induct one deceased person and one "current" competitor per year until the waiting list was cleared.

And the final point I want to make on this subject is that although I agree that administrators should be excluded from participation in both the selection process and the establishment of its criteria, I do not believe that they should be excluded from eligibility into a special section of the Hall of Fame itself. In the US, the NSSA induct several people into their Hall of Fame each year, but at the same time they present one administrator per year with a different award, which admits them to a separate administrators section of their Hall of Fame. In their case it is called the Ray Boller Award, as Mr Boller was some famous ancient NSSA administrator. I believe we should honour our most worthy and long-standing administrators in a similar way. The award could probably be called something like the "J M Wilson Award" in recognition of Mr Wilson's many years of service to the ACTA.

# CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps.

Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.

Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.

Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.

Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred in the event concerned.

Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.

Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.

All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be a different location of the area accepting shooting event nominations.

Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.

Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.

Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.

An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.

Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors and second family members only, they being wives or husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.


