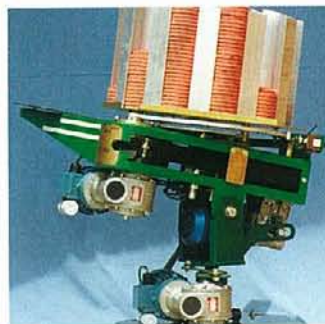

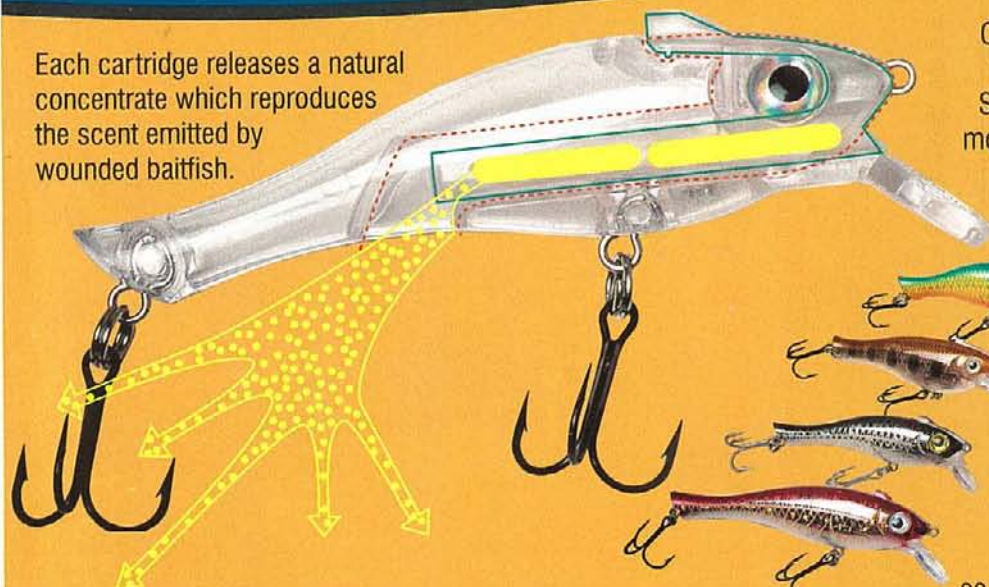

Commonwealth Games Manchester 2002

The Team

The team departed Finland on the 12th July, having just contested the World Championships and landed at Heathrow some two and a half hours later. Clearing Customs proved to be easier than we thought but getting our hire cars was a mission that turned out to be nearly impossible. To cut a long story short, we sat for nearly two hours before we were finally on the way to our hotel in Slough, which would be the team base for the first three days.

The English double trap trials were being shot that weekend on the Games range at Bisley and we wanted to take the opportunity to shoot as much as possible on the grounds that would be used for the Games in the following weeks. Russell shot a great 146 /150 but was edged out by Richard Faulds in the final 193 /200 to 190 /200. Suzy Balogh also shot a terrific 182 / 200 to head the women's section.

On the 15th July we moved into the games village which was located in the Surrey University at Guildford some 25 minutes from the range at Bisley, and 4 hours by train from Manchester. The accommodation was the student houses each of which held 12 people, in a combination

of single and twin rooms. Meals were served in a huge mess hall, and an entertainment centre was set up to keep the shooters amused in their spare time. The village was home to 400 odd athletes and officials, and as there were only shooters there everyone had something in common.

From the 15th till the 21st when the Badge Matches started, we trained almost daily but had the odd day off to break up the routine and be careful not to over train or get into a rut. As with Finland most things in England were about the same price as in Australia except in English Pounds which when converted to Aussie dollars turns out to be three times the price. A steak at 15 pounds doesn't sound too bad, but in real money equates to \$A45! A round of trap was 5 pounds and double trap 6 pounds so the budget with all the training we were plan-

ning was always going to be stretched, as were our wallets and credit cards.

The range at Bisley is set amongst pistol, rifle and full bore ranges and the whole complex has a history that dates back a hundred years or more. There are dozens of different club houses, administrative buildings, hotels, restaurants, gunsmiths, gunshops and even a caravan park that has permanent sites and a ten year waiting list to

get on to. A trip to the UK by any shooting enthusiast would not be complete without a visit to this truly amazing shooting complex. The clay target range is new and consists of four trap and skeet fields superimposed with covers, and DTL ranges in between. This facility is alleged to have cost some 4 million pounds (A\$12mil) and is as good as any in the world. The background is grass that drops away to a full bore range, so the targets hit the sky quickly and were great to pick up early. Scores were always going to be high providing the weather played it's part.

Between the 21st and the 24th a series of Badge Matches was shot in each disciplines as a warm up for the medal events. All of our shooters shot well, and all was looking good for the Games competition. The opening ceremony was on the 25th and all the team, with the exception of the coaches and the trap shooters made the long trip to Manchester on a charter train, returning immediately after the opening and arriving back at Guildford at 04:30 in the morning.

Both Aussie girls were on at the same time and as Nessa's squad finished first, all eyes turned to Di. She had no idea of what the other scores were, but her team mates were nervous enough as it was, and the tension was unbelievable. She had to run the last 6 targets for a 24 to clinch the gold. Each target was agony to watch and when she finally broke the last target and was told they had just won the gold medal, she just burst into tears. These are the moments that make all the sacrifices and hard work worthwhile.

At the halfway mark Australia was 4 targets behind the Welsh team, 1 behind the English and in a bit of trouble. When both those teams posted 49s in their third round we were even further behind with only one round to go. To their credit Adam and Michael never gave an inch and shot a 48 in the last whilst the English could only manage a 46 and the Welsh succumbed to the pressure and came in with a 44. Our boys had won the gold on a comeback in what was one of the great comebacks of the tournament.

Two events on day one - two golds to Australia, what a start!

New Zealand's Nadine Stanton shot a fantastic 39 in her final round to carry her team to the gold medal just edging out the Canadians. The Aussie girls found it difficult to find their rhythm and timing but held on for the bronze, well done ladies.

We had tied with the Indians on 184 but lost on a count back 94 to 92 on the last round. We were a little disappointed to have got so close and be counted out but we had the silver medal and Russell's 97 / 100 was a great sign for the individual event in a few days time.

As there were only three teams entered only the gold medal was awarded. The fact that Australia had won with such a great score took nothing away from the lack of teams entered. In fact our ladies score

would have had them in equal first place at the halfway mark of the men's event. A fantastic effort from Lauryn and Natalia that had everyone looking forward to the individual ladies skeet.

Again a count back decided medal positions, this time in our favour as we had tied with the English for second on 188. As we both shot 47 in the last round it went back to the third round where we shot 49 to their 47 to give us the silver medal. The Cypriots had shot well, particularly Kourtellas who shot 99/100. To say David was happy with the silver would be an understatement. One would be forgiven for thinking he and George had just won tattslooto, a great result against very high quality competition.

That completed the pairs competition and our focus now turned to the individual events. Here the task was even harder as we were now competing against our own team mates. Coaches dream of gold and silver to their shooters in any competition, and with the quality of our team, this scenario was a real possibility in this competition.

Unfortunately our girls weren't able to feature among the medals but the two Canadians shot brilliant 25s in the final to come from behind to take the gold and bronze.

The coaches dream becomes reality - Australia gold and silver! How good is Michael Diamond? 124 plus 24 to smash the Commonwealth Games record by 4 targets. You have to feel for Adam, running the 25 in the final, breaking the old Games record along the way to a 146 and winning the silver medal, it doesn't get much better than that. A 146 in any competition in the world is going to win more times than not. Brilliant shooting from these two extremely talented Aussies. These two are still only relatively young in shooting terms and are going to be around for many years to come.

The two Aussie girls had nervous starts and never recovered to display the sort of form we know they are capable of. They will benefit from this competition and hopefully go on to become a force on the international scene. The young 15 year old Charlotte Kerwood from England turned on a powerhouse display, particularly in the final with a 37 to demolish her far more experienced competitors and walk away with the gold. An awesome display from one so young and a bright future is predicted for this young lady whose maturity is way beyond her tender years.

A world class display of double trap shooting. To witness two 49s shot in a final is just mind boggling at any tournament, let alone at the Commonwealth Games and under extreme pressure. It doesn't get much closer than a target between each of the medals. To have the current Olympic champion Richard Faulds not feature in the medals gives an indication of the class of the field contesting this event. When the Indian Singh missed a target on his 19th pair and Russell was still clean, we thought it would at least go to a shoot off, and then things would be in Russell's favour. However it wasn't to be and as Russell said, he was beaten by a better performance on the day. A silver with 190 is a tremendous effort, well done Russell.

That dream again Australia one, two! Lauryn had shot brilliantly in the qualifications with a 71 while Natalia posted a respectable 68. In the final Lauryn stumbled momentarily to shoot 22 whilst it was Natalia's turn to return a brilliant 25. With the scores locked on 93, one was going to walk away from the sudden death shoot off disappointed. Lauryn shot the first pair on station three but Natalia missed the low and it was a highly emotional Lauryn that claimed the gold leaving Natalia with the silver. Both girls shot tremendously well and should be proud of their achievement. Our future in ladies skeet seems bright when we have two great talents in Lauryn and Natalia.

After a slow start David came home very strongly for his 120 in qualifying, and his 23 in the final left him only one short of a shoot off for a medal. He had a determination to do well in this competition and should be well pleased with his effort. George had shown in winning the badge match that he had regained form, unfortunately he was unable to maintain consistency after a good start to figure in the final.

That night was to be our last in Guildford and most shooters spent the night at the Uni pub having a few drinks and saying our goodbyes.

The next morning we boarded another charter train for Manchester to attend the closing ceremony. Unfortunately it rained for the duration of the closing ceremony although that did little to dampen the spirits of those attending. The games village put on a huge party after the closing and there were many weary people packing their gear to board the Qantas charter flight to Melbourne the next day.

All gold medalists were upgraded to business class which was a fitting reward for their achievements. The whole Australian Commonwealth Games Team was on the flight and we rubbed shoulders with some of the cream of Australia's athletes. On arrival in Melbourne we attended a reception with the Prime Minister then took part in the home coming parade through the streets of the city, ending up at the Town Hall. A fitting finale to what had been a record breaking Commonwealth Games for the Australian Team.

Conditions of Competition - Entry

Entry into the 2002 Australian Skeet Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2002 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors must produce their 2002 registered shooter record book before nominating.

DIVISIONS

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Ladies, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before sashes/medals/cash/trophies are awarded.

When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which

team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.

To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

AGE QUALIFICATIONS

Veterans - are those competitors over the age of 65 years on November 11, 2002.

Juniors - are those competitors under the age of 18 years on November 11, 2002.

Sub Juniors - are those competitors under the age of 14 years on November 11, 2002.

STARTING TIME

Each day's event shall commence at 9.00am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.

Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

CARTRIDGES

For 12 gauge events, load size is limited to 28gr struck measure or equivalent shot size not larger than No.7.

For 20 gauge events, load size is limited to 24gr struck measure or equivalent shot size not larger than No.7.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships.

TARGET AND TRAPS

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Championships Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers.

All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

CLASSIFICATION

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - and indication can be obtained for the daily scoreboard. This applies to skeet grades, Open, Ladies, Juniors and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Note: A fee of \$20 may be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

2. Squads of 5 (or 6 if necessary) to shoot 100 targets per day, in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps, 2nd 50t moving up one trap. eg 1-2, 2-3, 3-4, 4-1, etc.

3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.

4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets. Shooters are expected to perform changeovers (between rounds as well as between squads) as quickly as possible, and certainly not exceed the maximum time limit allowed of two minutes. Anyone exceeding that time limit may be penalised.

5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be resquaded later in the event, but resquading is not guaranteed, and non-participation is a possibility.

6. Should a shooter being late for his squad not be resquaded or elect to withdraw from the event, any refund of nominations paid is not guaranteed.

7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.

8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the loss of one target in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the loss of one target may be incurred in the event concerned.

9. Shooters will be selected from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, any penalty for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.

10. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised.

11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

13. Optional purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.

14. Optional purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however overall event winners cannot take any section prize.

17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals, trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.

18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00 am. or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.

20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

22. Reduced Nomination fees are applicable to Juniors and also second Family members, they being wives or husbands, entering into the same event whose nomination must be lodged at the same time as a family members paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.

23. All competitors must comply with Firearm Licensing Laws in their state of residence and in the state hosting the National Championships.

The Team met in Sydney for the QANTAS flight to Frankfurt via Singapore. On arrival at Frankfurt it was a four-hour drive by mini bus to Suhl (a smallish industrial city located in the former East German part of the country). Suhl is known for the Simpson/Merkyl gun factory which employed 5000 people but has been cut back to around 300 and now only makes sporting rifles and shotguns.

The Suhl shooting range is well known for its almost perfect location and background (flat terraced layouts with a pine forest backdrop) and world record scores. At first sight everything appeared perfect and the practice day began with high expectation only to be greeted by new traps and targets since our last visit. It was not long before some long faces appeared, as scores were low and there seemed no explanation as to why??. It seemed the new environmentally friendly targets were not shooter friendly and the big scores and happy shooters were a thing of the past.

The competition started with Double Trap and the Ladies squad's shot first followed by the men. It was indeed strange to see targets break after shooters had opened their guns or in some cases in the Doubles the first target would break after the second. At the end of the qualifying rounds Australia had no shooters in the final in either the Ladies or the mens event.

The trap event was next and again the shooters expectations were for good scores based on the past experience and excellent target visibility. The ladies squads started again with the men following. This was a real slaughter with some of the lowest scores ever seen in a world cup. At the end of the first day the ladies final had scores from 61 to 67, which is extremely low for a good range with good weather conditions.

At this point the men had shot only 50 targets due to the large number of entries on the second day they shot 75 + the final. From a field of 130 shooters only one 50/50 with no one on 49/50. A quick calculation meant everyone with a score over 40 still had a chance so all our shooters were in the game for day 2. At the end of 125 the top score for the final was 118 and the last place was 155. Adam Vella had shot the last 25 to keep his hopes alive for the final but missed by 1 target.

The junior team departed on the 29th June for Finland, via Singapore and Frankfurt to meet up with the seniors who were competing at the Suhl World Cup. Thirty two hours later we finally touched down in Helsinki to find the customs department had virtually shut down as the World Cup Soccer Final was about to start. Michael's shooting bag and Steve's gun were both missing and after reporting this to airline officials we strolled through customs without so much as a glance from anyone, and boarded a bus for the one and a half hour trip to Lahti. So much for security. On arrival we were taken to the armoury to deposit the guns, then to get our accreditation and finally to the Hotel Musta Kissa, which means the Black Cat.

Finland: Population 5.2 million. 65% of the country is covered with pine trees, and has 188,000 lakes. The sun sets at 10:30pm and rises at 2:45am and in between is still not completely dark!

Prices are much the same as Australia except in Euros, which means that everything is double the price due to the exchange rate. A practice round of trap is 7 Euros or A\$14, double trap 14 Euros or A\$28. This was the second World Championships to be held in Finland, the first being in 1999 in Tampere some 40 minutes flying time to the north.

The Range: Four trap and skeet ranges superimposed with three having covers and the finals range being uncovered. At around the 70 metre mark there is a huge retaining mound, topped by a fence which was all covered in green plastic to catch the shot. It made for a terrific background but also created some up and down drafts which would affect some of the targets on windy days. A huge athlete rest tent was erected on site and this was to prove invaluable as the weather was unstable and could start raining at any time.

Double Trap: This was shot over two days with two rounds on the first day and the third round and final on the second day, juniors did not have a final. The weather for this event was miserable, cold, wet and windy.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS

October 2002

This month I intend to print the last chapter of my World Skeet Shoot advice collection. It started in December 2000 as part of a story about the Australian Junior Team's World Shoot visit and continued in October 2001 with a specific World Shoot article. In December 2001 and January 2002, I published two more installments and this is the last segment of that trilogy, which encompasses almost twenty years of practical experience.

BUDGETS

One of the first questions I'm usually asked about the trip is how much does it cost. Back in the days when the Aus\$ was worth about 80c, I used to work on work on around Aus\$5000. However, I suggest you work from US\$4000 and convert it by the prevailing exchange rate. At the moment, with the dollar hovering around 50c, it equates to about Aus\$8000. And don't forget this figure is calculated on basic necessities and expenditures only, at economically frugal but realistic levels, and that any "tourist money" required is an added extra. The main budgetary items are Airfares, Accommodation, Rental Car, Meal Allowance, Entry Fees, Ammunition and Practice costs.

MONEY

Over the years I have tried all the various money options including US\$ travellers cheques and cashing Australian Dollars at US banks as required. Travellers cheques involve a certain amount of hassle to obtain and then to reconvert when you get back and some places still won't take them. Australian dollars can be a problem with varied exchange rates and the risk of loss or theft. For the casual traveller I believe that about \$1000 in cash, which you

change into US dollars at the airport when you arrive, and a Visa or MasterCard for the bulk of your expenditure is the most viable option.

You'll find that America really is a "plastic money" society and that almost everything can be paid for with a credit card, which leads me to one of my few warnings. Cash is self regulating - credit cards aren't! If you go the plastic money route, have an expenses book and keep it up to date. I've heard of people getting home and going into cardiac arrest when their first credit card statement arrived. On the flip side of that, don't even think about going without some sort of recognized credit card, even if you plan to use some other payment system. You won't get a rental car without one and most accommodation places won't even guarantee your booking unless you quote one. Plus if all else fails, by showing your passport, most banks will give you cash against them.

THE US FREEWAY SYSTEM

The US is linked by a grid system of interstate freeways and almost all major US cities are intersected by at least two of these freeways. One will be an East-West route and will have an even number, and the other will be a North-South route and will have an uneven number. In San Antonio the East-West route is Interstate #10 and the North-South route is Interstate #35. San Antonio also has a "Spur Link" which connects it to the coast at Corpus Christi and this freeway is Interstate #37.

Almost all US cities also have at least one ring-road around them. San Antonio has two. The Inner Loop is Interstate #410 and the Outer Loop is Route #1604, also known as the Anderson Loop. These freeways and State routes make getting around much easier and as an additional benefit, each side of the freeway is signposted differently to indicate which way it heads. For example, if you approach I-10 from the south side, the signs will indicate that if you take the ramp down to the right you will be on I-10East (which will take you via Houston to Jacksonville in Florida) and if you cross the freeway and take the ramp down to the left it will put you on I-10West (which will take you all the way back to Los Angeles)

Theoretically I-10 should enter San Antonio at 3 o'clock and exit at 9 o'clock, and I-35 should enter at 12 o'clock and exit at 6 o'clock. In actual fact I-10 enters at about 11.00 and exits at about 3.00, and I-35 enters at about 1.30 and exits at about 7.30. I-37 originates in San Antonio and exits at about 5.00. A rough understanding of this layout will help you with your navigation. All of the freeways have service roads running along beside them when they are in built-up areas. These are one-way roads that parallel the freeway and are basically used to get on and off the freeways. If you have all day and love stopping at traffic lights, you can actually get around on just the service roads, but I don't recommend it.

NAVIGATION AROUND SAN ANTONIO

The Airport is almost due North of downtown San Antonio and is right alongside I-410 on the North side of it.

For Accommodation I strongly recommend the Hawthorn Suites, which is a Serviced Apartment Complex and is right alongside I-10, on the West side of it, outside I-410 and about 1/4 of the way out to Loop 1604, at about 11 o'clock from downtown.

The National Gun Club (where the World Shoot is held) is on Roft road, which runs off Calebra Rd (Texas FM-471), which intersects the two loops at about 10 o'clock from downtown.

The San Antonio Gun Club (which is the old gun club) is in the heart of the city, just North of downtown, close to and on the west side of Route #281, which is the northern extension of I-37 and which runs up past the airport.

From the Airport to Hawthorn Suites: As you exit the airport take I-410W to I-10. Take I-10W towards El Paso, looking over to the Left for the Hawthorn Suites (or the Alamo Café, which is right out the front) Take the next exit onto the service road, cross over or

under the freeway at your first opportunity, and follow the service road back. Turn right into the access road at the far end of the Alamo Café carpark.

From Hawthorn Suites to the National Gun Club: Turn right onto the service road. Drive down to the first exit and cross under the freeway, turning left again into the north-bound service road. Take the first entrance ramp onto I-10W. Get off at the Anderson Loop exit (Route 1604) and go left on 1604W until you come to Culebra Rd (FM471). Go right onto 471 and follow it until Roft Rd runs off to your left.

CLASSIFICATION & GRADING

NSSA have six grades in all the events (AAA, AA, A, B, C, & D) except the 12gauge where there is also an E grade. Grades are normally established on the percentages you shot last year plus any upgrades you may have had during the current year. If you are a new member, you will not have any grading and thus there will be three options available to you. These are:

Shoot in the Non-Classified Section. This is like shooting "birds only" except that there are awards for the winners. It's OK to shoot here if you wish, but it is a sort of Claytons event.

Attempt to shoot a minimum of 1000 targets (200 in each gun) after you arrive in order to establish a grading (classification) in each event. Be careful with this, as it is unlikely, for a number of reasons, to give you a grading that is indicative of your true ability. It may put you in a "no-win" situation that could harm our International relations, because experienced Australian shooters attending the World Shoot for the first time are in a unique position to slip through a loophole in the grading rules and destroy the trust and integrity that the system is based upon. In the late 1980s, one of our leading shooters did just this, cleaning out B grade and winning a lot of money and it has taken us many years to live this down.

Self declare into AA across the board. Unless you really are an inexperienced shooter, this is the most feasible option and as you will be seen to be representing Australia, it is probably where you need to be seen to be. For the same reasons, unless you are a genuine C grader, don't enter the Novice section, which is reserved for first time attendees, but which you may technically qualify for. At the other end of the spectrum, you don't need to be concerned about AAA grade. These people have the knowledge, experience and skill to shoot beyond your ability and will not expect you to be able to compete against them. Anything that you can win in AA is something that you can be very proud of, and if you do happen to win an event outright, you will not be the first AA shooter to do this and you will still be looked up to. Anyway as the rules only allow AAA to be achieved by shooting the necessary percentages, it is looked upon as a prestige grade and the American shooters guard that quite zealously. In the entire history of the NSSA I believe there was only ever one occasion where a foreign shooter was granted a special dispensation to shoot in AAA and it involved an extraordinary meeting of the Board of Directors.

FIREARMS PAPERWORK AND PERMITS

Since I last covered this subject, the September 11 tragedy has caused major changes to take place at the US end. Foreigners can no longer bring firearms into America without authority from the US Department of Alcohol, Tobacco & Firearms. I suggest you contact NSSA well in advance to get advice and assistance with this new requirement.

PUNCTUALITY

Always be at your designated field at least 15 minutes before your scheduled flight time. Plan to start shooting as soon as you are all there and the referee arrives, hopefully a few minutes before your designated starting time. Do not waste any time at all while shooting, as it is imperative that you finish before your allocated time is up. Keep an eye on your watch. Take all your shells and your gear out onto the field and put them on the bench beside station one. It's OK for the first two shooters to go and get their shells while the last three finish up on station eight, so that you are ready to start again straight away. The last three can be getting shells as the first two make a start. The referee won't mind because any time you make up increases the length of his rest period between flights. Remember that on the two days of the Main 12gauge, you have even less time per round to use. Any time you break a 100 or 125,

go straight to the Stadium Field and make sure this is not one of the events where you shoot your first round of the shoot-off straight away.

Having read Trevor Gurr's article on the future of Clay Target Shooting (CTSN August 2002) I felt compelled to write to support his comments and also to encourage Clubs to take up the challenge to obtain quality positive publicity at the local level.

At risk of appearing boastful, I would like to point out that the Castlemaine Gun Club consistently has one of the highest shoot attendance rates of any rural Victorian Club and I believe part of the reason for that is the Club's high public profile in North Western Victoria, achieved through active use of the media (we have a slight advantage - media liaison and PR is my livelihood, and has been for almost 30 years).

Achieving a good public image at the local level is not rocket science, it's simply a matter of letting the local newspaper, TV or radio station know what's going on in your Club, supplying results after each shoot and inviting the media out to cover an Event from time-to-time; for example, when the Club is hosting a Zone or State Title Event.

After all, the local media can't publish the information if they don't have it!

Trevor's point that marketing and promotion rests with the ACTA and should be carried out by professionals, is very valid.

While it's appropriate to promote our sport at a Club level, I believe the ACTA should oversee or manage that promotion at a national level to ensure the 'right' message is going out to the public. As for using a professional - it's what that person is trained to do.

A number of Clubs are already discovering that as more people become aware of the sport, more are seeking to 'have a try' and some of those are taking up the sport and becoming dedicated shooters.

If your Club doesn't promote its activities, and its results, in the public forum can I urge you to try to find a volunteer and give it a go, in the interests of furthering the sport?

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

ANNUAL SHOOT IN FEBRUARY

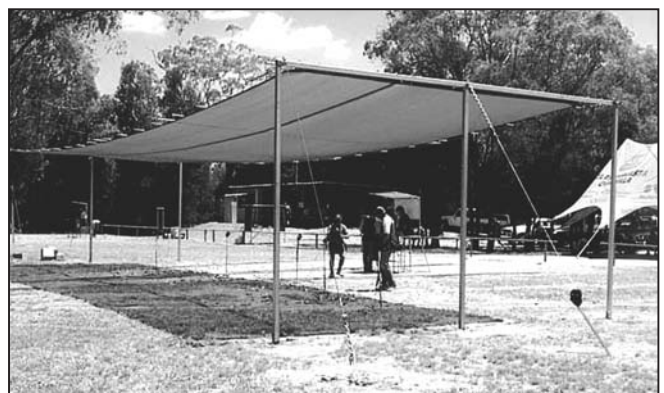

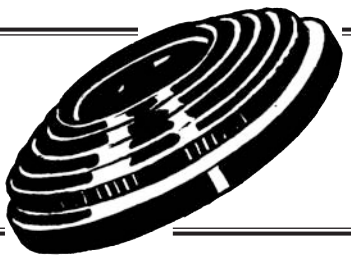
It does give the shooters excellent shade and protection so much so that the shooters did not wish to shoot off on the trap without shade.

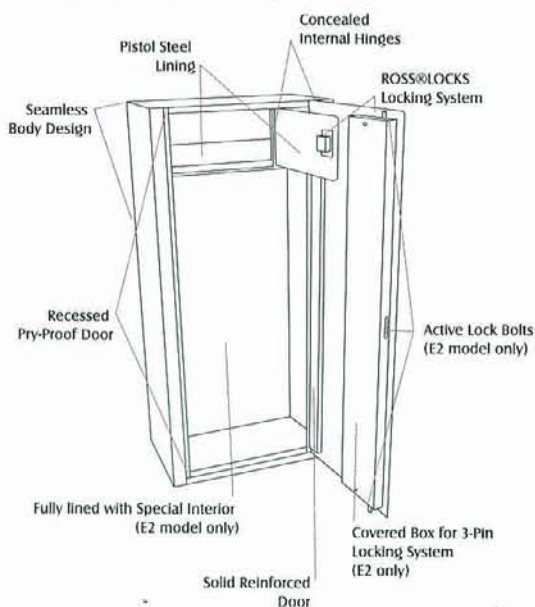
