WORLD CUP

Congratulations to Adam Vella on winning the World Cup trap event and to Russel Marks on winning the Double Trap event in the Perth round of the World Cup. Adam also finished second in the Double trap event. Congratulations to both of these competitors on this outstanding effort.

The bonus is that they also earned quota spots for Australia participation at next years Olympics. Michael Diamond had previously also won a quota spot in the trap event.

News received today indicates that Adam Vella also finished 2nd in both trap events at the World Cup in India, his fine form continues.

STATE CARNIVALS

The South Australian Skeet Championships will be conducted on the long weekend, May 17th to 19th at the South Australian Gun Club. This is usually a popular carnival with the skeet shooters.

NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS

On the same weekend May 17th and 18th the National Sporting Clays Championship will be conducted at the National shooting ground in Wagga.

EASTER SHOOTS

Several clubs around Australia conduct major carnivals over the Easter period. We hope these are well supported and enjoyable fixtures for all concerned.

WEST DARLING CHAMPIONSHIPS - BROKEN HILL

This carnival on May 10th and 11th is one of the most popular with shooters from several states participating. The hospitality and quality of organisation has ensured its ongoing success for many years. I would encourage any shooter who has not visited Broken Hill that it is worthy of a trip. I am sure that you will enjoy yourself and find it to be an excellent shoot.

ISSF WORLD CUP PERTH 2003 TRAP, SKEET DOUBLE TRAP

The team of Trap Shooters for Australia arrived in Perth on the 5th March, along with Team Coach Greg Chan and Massage Therapist Darien Roach. The morning arrivals of Adam Vella, Russell Mark, Nessa Jenkins, Stacey Roiall, Susie Balogh and Deserie Baynes went straight to Whiteman Park to practice. Nathan McDonnell and Myself were on a later flight and were kindly greeted by Jim West, Dave Knight and Co. When Team arrived back at the Hotel a Team meeting was held. Late that night Tom Turner and Diane Reeves arrived.

The next morning saw all the Team go to the shooting range for unofficial practice. Official Practice was held on the 7th March with some shooters happy with their practice rounds and others not so pleased. Greg and I attended a Technical Meeting at 3.00pm. The Opening Ceremony was held that evening and attended by all of the team that had arrived. Often these Ceremonies are a very long drawn out affair but the Organising Committee put on an interesting and short Ceremony. The competitors from overseas enjoyed seeing the kangaroos come across in front of the main clubhouse. That night Nathan McDonnell took all the Australian Women Team members out to dinner. We learnt that you can ask Nathan any question and he will answer it.

Saturday 8th March was competition day for Womens Trap and Day 1 of competition for Men Trap. The weather was a hot 39 degrees. Nessa Jenkins, Deserie Baynes and Susanne Balogh were competing in the event with Diane Reeves and Stacey Rioall shooting as MQS shooters. This was Stacey's first World Cup and she shot well in her first and second rounds with a 20 and 22. Unfortunately, Stacey was not well when shooting her third round and shot a disappointing 14, to finish on a 56. Diane Reeves shot quite well, shooting a 19, 22 and 23 to finish with a score of 64, which gained her an MQS score. Deserie Baynes after shooting very well in practice finished in 12th position with consistent scores of 21, 21 and 22 and a total of 64 to finish as the top Australian. Nessa Jenkins was disappointed with her first round of 17 but rallied for a second round score of 23 and 20 in her third round. Nessa's total was 60 which placed her equal 24th with Susanne Balogh. Susanne was devastated with her first round score of 15. She proved in the second round that she could shoot with a score of 24 and followed this with a 21. The Women were disappointed with their results.

Winner of this event was Sarah Gibbins of Great Britain with a score of 68 +23 in the final. A shoot-off was held with Wang from China who finished 2nd and Susan Kiermayer of Germany 3rd.

Day 1 of the Mens event was shot on the same day as the womens. Adam Vella shot very well with scores of 24, 24 and 25 to finish Day 1 with a 73 and in equal 2nd position. Russell Mark finished Day 1 in 41st position with scores of 22, 23 and 21. Tom Turner shot 21 in his first round followed by a 24 and 22 to finish Day 1 with a score of 67 and in 34th position. Nathan McDonnell shooting as an MQS shot well with scores of 22, 24 and 24 and total of 70. All were very tired and hot and the men were able to gain lifts home to rest for competition tomorrow, while the rest waited for the official buses to arrive. Double Trap shooters Dot Trindall and Steve Haberman arrived during the afternoon.

Day 2 of Trap Men competition saw the Trap Women leave for home except Deserie who was also shooting the Double Trap. Weather today was a mere 42 degrees. Russell Mark improved on the 2nd day with a 24 and 24 to finish with a total of 114 and equal 20th. Tom Turner finished with a 24 and 23 and also a total of 114. Nathan McDonnell was disappointed with his 1st round score of 20 but shot a 23 in the last round to give him a total of 113 and an MQS. Adam Vella shot brilliantly the 2nd day of competition with a 25 in both of his rounds to finish with a total of 123 and position 1 into the final.

Adam shot a further 24 in the final to finish 1st in the ISSF World Cup Perth 2003 Mens Trap and also gain a quota place for Australia at the 2004 Olympics. Adam was extremely happy and proud to win this event. Shoot-offs were held for the placeget-

ters before Fabbarizi from Italy was declared 2nd Glenn Kable Fiji 3rd Lance Bade USA 4th Bindrich Germany 5th and Gavin Paton New Zealand 6th. After the Award Ceremony was held, the Team left for the Hotel to wait for Adam to finish at drug testing. Susie Trindall was waiting at the Hotel to greet our smiling faces. Well Done Adam.

Monday March 10th saw Nathan fly home and Double Trap Official practice. Not a date to forget as it was the hottest day in Perth in 80 odd years. Temperatures measured at Whiteman Park were 44 degrees, under the tent was measured at 45 degrees and on the layouts at 50 degrees. Oh, and there was this wind that felt like it was coming from a fan heater on full blast. Darien was getting complaints that his bed was too hot. I should say his massage table. There was one great advantage to the heat and that was that most of the overseas competitors had just come out of weather of around MINUS 20 - 30 degrees. Fluid intake was extremely important on all days of the Perth World Cup but particularly today. Some competitors shot all of their 3 rounds of Official Practice, some more and others shot just two rounds as the heat was unbelievable. All finished practice with differing results and we all just wanted to get back to our hotels and the air conditioning. Unfortunately, there had been an accident and the official buses were unable to get through. Two hours later (I've got no idea it seemed like forever) the first bus arrived and most competitors ran for the bus. The bus driver had also had a bad day and he tried to give us Aussies a huge advantage by running most of our overseas competitors over. The Australian Team waited ever so patiently for the 2nd bus to arrive. Neil felt sorry for us and got Rosie out only to be all on board when the bus arrived. Thanks Neil.



The Barton Boys (Clive and George) along with Lauryn Ogilvie arrived while we were out having dinner. Russell kindly offered to meet them at our hotel. He is ever so thoughtful. Around 11.30pm, I met the other Skeet Shooters when they arrived in Neil Rundal, Paul Rahman and Natalia Rahman. Buses were now running from the hotel at 7.00am and 8.00am to the range. The bus trip with other pickups took about 45 minutes.

Double Trap Competition was held on the 11th March. Both Men and Women shot their full program today as well as final. The Women shot in the first squads in fairly windy conditions. We had three women shooting this event. Deserie Baynes started well with a 32, Dot Trindall 29 and Susan Trindall also starting well with a 32. Competing for Australia in the Mens event were Adam Vella, Russell Mark and Steve Haberman. Tom Turner was competing as an MQS shooter.

Russell shot very well in his first round with a 48. Adam shot a 44, Steve 47 and Tom a 42. All the Australians looked good. This was the first World Cup with the new rule where the targets have up to a 1 second delay. Some countries due to their freez-



ing conditions had been unable to practice before they arrived. Our hot dry climate has its advantages. In the second round, Deserie shot a great score of 34, Susan Trindall 30 and Dot a 26. Adam scored a 46 missing his 4 targets very early in the round. Russell shot a 45 and Steve a great 46 and Tom a 40. Things were still looking really good for the Australians.



The third round was quite nail biting, for me anyway. Dot Trindall finished with a 24 and total of 79. Susan Trindall was disappointed with her score of 27 and total of 89. Deserie shot a 29 and finished with a total of 95. She thought she was out of the final but I was still hopeful. We now had to wait for the other rounds of women to finish. Meanwhile, the Mens event also continued and Tom finished with a 43 and total of 125 and an MQS.

Russell shot a 46 in his third round after some varying targets. Adam shot an outstanding 49 and Steve was very disappointed with his score of 40. The shoot-offs were called and we had Deserie to shoot-off with Li from China for a place in the final. We also had Steve Haberman shooting off with Khangasem from THA and Holguin from USA for one position in the final. Unfortunately, Deserie and Steve missed out on the final and both finished in 7th position. Kimberly Rhode from USA won the Womens Double Trap event with a score of 107+28. Lin from TPE 2nd and Nadine Stanton from New Zealand 3rd. 4th was Gelisio from ITA, 5th Hogan USA and 6th Li from China.

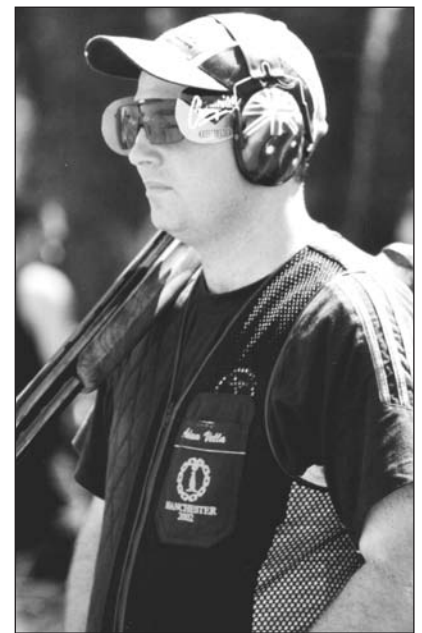
Adam Vella became the number 1 shooter into the final with his

total score of 139. Russell Mark became the number 2 shooter into the final with a score of also a 139. Adams shooter number for the World Cup had been number 1. He was number 1 shooter for Trap final and came first. He was number 1 shooter for the final again in Double Trap. He felt good and maybe there was something in this number. Russells shooter number for the World Cup had been number 2. His shooter number for the final was number 2.

Scores in the Mens Double Trap final were down from their competition scores. It was overcast for the final and the targets were harder to see. After a see-sawing final Russell Mark finished 1st in the ISSF World Cup Perth Mens Double Trap and a quota for Australia at the 2004 Olympics. Adam Vella

finished in 2nd place. 1 and 2 to Australia. 3rd was Hu from China, 4th Eller USA, 5th Di Spigno ITA and 6th Khangasem THA. We were a very happy team. Congratulations Russell and Adam.

At the Award Ceremony it was wonderful to see 2 Australian flags flying. More drug testing for Adam and Russell after this event saw the Team waiting anxiously back at the Hotel. A Team meeting was held this evening. It must be noted that in the Double Trap event we also made history by having a mother and daughter representing their country in the one event at a World Cup. Congratulations Dot and Susie Trindall. We all celebrated at an Irish Pub with the Kiwi Team but for some reason the Kiwis all quietly disappeared during the cricket.



Wednesday 12th March

saw Deserie, Susie, Dot and Steve fly home. Unfortunately our Team Massage Therapist also had to fly home due to family illness. This was Official Skeet Practice day. Again some shooters had their full three rounds while others had more or less. We were home earlier today, so most of the guys travelling from here to the India World Cup bought up on grocery items to take with them.

Skeet Competition for Women and Day 1 of competition for Men followed. The weather was warm with gusty winds at times.

We had Natalia Rahman and Lauryn Ogilvie competing in the Womens event. George Barton, Paul Rahman and Neil Rundal competing in the Mens event, with David Cunningham and Clive Barton shooting MQS. Lauryn shot really well in her first two rounds with scores of 23 and 25. Natalia shot a 23 and 22 in her first two rounds and shot a great 24 in her third round to finish on 69. Lauryn was a little disappointed with her 3rd round of 22 to give her a total of 70. This score put Lauryn in 5th place going into the final. Natalia's 69 put her into a shoot-off with Wei from China and Van Der Valk from the Netherlands. Unfortunately Natalia missed out on the final and finished the competition in 7th place. Wei from China made it through to the final and after



the lead changed many times throughout this final Wei finished equal with Stanovska from Slovakia and Cainero from Italy. The first shooter into the final Zhang from China finished 4th. Lauryn and Igaly from Hungary finished equal 5th. After the shoot-offs, Lauryn finished 6th, Stanovska finished 1st, Camero 2nd and Wei 3rd.

In the Mens Competition, Neil Rundle started the day very well with a 25 and a 2nd round of 23 and finished the day on a 24 and total of 72. Our hopes were with Neil for Day 2 of competition. Paul Rahman shot scores of 23 24 and 23. George Barton had problems with his first round and was not happy with his score of 21. George improved his scores in the other rounds shooting a 23 and 24. Clive Barton shot well in his first two rounds with a 23 and 25 but shot a 20 in his 3rd round. David Cunningham put the scores on the board in day 1 with a 24 25 and 24.

Tonight Coach Greg Chan, shooters Russell Mark, Adam Vella and Tom Turner leave for the World Cup in India. We wish them well.

Friday 14th March Lauryn and Natalia fly home and the Men Skeet Shooters and myself arrive at Whiteman Park for the last day of competition. The weather is hot but perfect shooting conditions. Neil shoots a first round score of 22 but follows with a 24 to give him a total of 118. George does not start well either with a score of 21 but shoots his final round like he would have liked to have shot the others with a 25 and total 114. Paul Rahman shot a good score of 24 in his first round to race out onto station 1 in his last round and miss all three targets. He was fortunate to shoot the rest to finish on a 22 and total of 116. Clive shot his first round with a 23 followed by a 22. Clives total was 113. David Cunningham Shot Day 2 with scores of 23 and 25. Davids total score of 121 and MQS made him a happy guy. The placegetters for the Perth World Cup Mens Skeet were 1st Tishin from Russia with a score of 122+25 in final. 2nd Wegnar from Germany, 3rd Nicolaides from Cyprus. Todd Graves USA 4th, Jensen Norway 5th and Watndahl Norway 6th.

Following the Mens Skeet Final and Award Ceremony, the Closing Ceremony was held. A BBQ was held in the afternoon. The Organisation Committee must be congratulated on a job very well done. I have never seen so many willing volunteers at any shoot within Australia. You should be very proud.

Finally thanks to the Australian Team for making my job enjoyable. It was great.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS

May 2003

Last month I started a two-part article on **Shotgun Stocks and Gun Fit**. In the first instalment I detailed the terminology and technicalities of the subject and this month I intend to air my personal views and theories on this most critical aspect of our sport. Note that the views expressed here are relevant to "Target Stocks" (ie those used for Trap and Skeet, using a pre-mounted gun) and may not be applicable to those shotgun activities commenced from a "gun-down" starting position, such as ISSF Skeet, Field-and-Game, or field shooting.

I believe that the **Length** of a shotgun stock has very little to do with its shootability and is mainly set for its comfortability. The range of suitable lengths is dictated by the height and build of the shooter but is usually somewhere between 13½" and 15". For the average person anything over 15" will generally become awkward to mount and feel cumbersome and front-heavy and anything under 13½" will generally feel bunched-up and probably cause your thumb to strike your nose under recoil. With a correctly fitted gun and a good stance there should be about a 1" gap between your nose and your thumb. However good scores can certainly be attained with a stock that is not technically the correct length.

The amount of **Pitch** set on the butt is also not a primary contributor to the shootability of a shotgun and is mainly altered to increase the comfort of the recoiling gun. If the stock has incorrect pitch then either the heel or the toe will dig into the shooter's shoulder and increase "felt-recoil" by distributing it over a smaller area. Incorrect pitch can also decrease muzzle steadiness between shots by causing vertical movement of the barrels under recoil and in extreme cases may actually move the point of impact marginally up or down.

Although **Cast** is arguably warranted on stocks used for some "gun-down" activities, I firmly believe that it is absolutely undesirable and potentially disadvantageous on a Target Stock for two fundamental reasons. It requires the face to be positioned at exactly the same place on the comb for each shot or it alters the gun's horizontal point of impact, and it causes the recoiling stock to smack into the face rather than moving along it. Cast originated on field guns, where shooters can often find themselves suddenly standing quite "square-on" to their respective live targets and thereby need a degree of cast. Thus I consider field shooting to be the only activity where cast could be an acceptable design feature.

As the other two main "gun-down" activities, ISSF Skeet and Field-and-Game, allow the shooter to preset the "approximately 60 degrees body-line offset to the line of fire" that most Trap and Skeet shooters adopt, I see no reason for any cast in the guns used for those purposes. If a straight stock requires some lateral movement of the face to cause the eye to become aligned with the line of sight, then it is far more advantageous to gain this adjustment by altering the thickness of the comb and thus preserving the parallel relationship between the side of the comb and the line of sight.

The **shape, height and angle** of the **comb** are unquestionably the most important dimensions of a stock as they critically

affect both the comfort and the shootability of the gun. The shape of the comb mainly controls comfort. A thin comb with a sharply curved top will quickly cause discomfort to the face and the cheekbone, thus the comb should be as thick and as rounded as possible, without requiring the stock to need cast off. The height of the comb dictates the pointability of the gun, as the eye is effectively the rear sight of the shotgun. Thus it is critical that the comb causes the master eye to line up vertically accurately with the sighting plane of the gun when the cheek is comfortably but firmly pressed onto the stock.

The angle of the comb is important to both the comfort and the pointability of the gun. The less angle the better, and a comb that is actually parallel to the line of sight has two major attributes. Similarly to no cast, it allows the face to be positioned on the comb at places other than the normal without altering the gun's point of impact and it also allows the recoiling stock to move across the face rather than smacking into it.

Drop at heel is important to both comfort and shootability. Once it is accepted that a parallel comb with approximately 1½" of drop is the optimum design, then it is necessary to find a way to position that comb under the eye, with the head erect, and the butt correctly positioned on the shoulder. If a straight comb is used with this concept, one of two problems will occur with shooters of average build. If the head is kept erect, then the top of the butt will usually protrude above the top of the shoulder, and thus "felt-recoil" will increase due to it being distributed over a decreased area.

If the butt is correctly positioned, with the heel level with the top of the shoulder, then the face will generally need to be lowered to align the eye with the sighting plane, and this increases the chances of missing the target due to involuntary lifting of the head at a critical time. To solve this dilemma and keep everything in correct perspective, a Monte Carlo stock design should be used, which provides additional drop away at the heel of between ½" and 1" depending upon the build of the shooter and particularly the neck length.

Probably the greatest advancement in stock design in recent times has been the advent of the adjustable comb. Length and pitch are fairly easily altered or reversed by removing wood or adding spacers between the stock and the recoil pad, but drop and cast adjustments require major stock surgery and their reversal can be equally difficult. Adjustable combs, which move up and down, from side to side, and allow angular changes in both dimensions, in infinite increments, effectively solve this problem by allowing easily reversible trial and error adjustments to get these dimensions just right.

The bottom line of this whole gun-fit and stock design scenario is to end up with a package where the shooter stands up reasonably straight, with perhaps a slight lean forward to attain a 2:1 weight distribution favouring the front foot, and keeps his head erect and his eyes level. Then with the body facing 60-degrees away from the line-of-sight, the gun should be able to be mounted naturally and easily with little or no adaptation on the shooter's part to make either the mounting or the eye alignment correct.

The gun-fit is correct when the gun can be mounted in this manner and provide a situation where the butt is comfortably

positioned in the shoulder pocket with the heel almost level with the top of the shoulder. Without lowering the head, the face can be gently but firmly pressed against the comb with the cheekbone resting comfortably on top of the comb and the eye is then aligned with the centre of the rib. Horizontally the eye should either level with the rib, or purposely slightly above it in order to raise the point of impact a pre-determined amount, depending upon the degree of elevation built into the barrel-rib by the manufacturer.

Provided that the dimensional variations are not too extreme, it is possible to shoot reasonably well with a stock that does not fit the shooter precisely, by compromising and adapting the stance and head positioning to suit the stock. However, this is undesirable because by making the stock fit the shooter as naturally and correctly as possible, you gain the advantages of the "principle of minimum adaptation" whereby the less that you have to wrap yourself around a stock to make it fit, the less you are able to unintentionally unwrap yourself during the process of making a shot, and thereby cause the shot to miss.

The major advantage of a correctly fitted stock is the consistency it provides between sight picture and point of impact from shot to shot. Conversely the major disadvantage of a stock which requires physical adaptation, is the frustration that it causes when one shot with a given sight picture works well, but the next shot with the same apparent sight picture misses because the shooter unintentionally and unknowingly partially unwraps himself from the stock and upsets the alignment of the eye and the sighting plane.

I personally take the parallel comb theory one step further. After eliminating all cast from the top of the comb, I actually set my comb-drop to a small negative amount, maybe minus two or three degrees. This is similar to the way that some powerful centre-fire rifles are set up, and for the same reason: recoil transference away from the face rather than into it. This not only allows me to lock tightly into the gun as I fire, rather than subconsciously backing away from it to avoid the recoil, but it also allows me to stay locked into the gun between shots in doubles. This latter point is fundamentally important, as this is what gives you a consistent sight picture on the second shot. Many people can't work out why the same sight picture for their second shot gives inconsistent results. The main reason is partially backing out of the gun on the first shot to avoid the recoil smack and then only partially and inconsistently getting back in.

I'm sure that some people will be somewhat sceptical of my comb angle and cast theories and I would be too if it hadn't been brought home to me very painfully some years ago. For many years I used a standard Belgian Browning Trapgun, which come with both a little cast and some comb angle drop. I believe that I shot it passably well, it never kicked me in the face and I would have been horrified if anyone had suggested that I was "backing out" of it as I fired it. However, I later went to America and was fitted up with a Krieghoff K-80, built to the stock dimension theory detailed above, and was taught the importance of "locking in the gun" whilst shooting. During a brief visit home, I blew the dust off the old Browning and took it out to a local charity trap-shoot. I only fired one shot for the day, after which my eyes watered for several minutes and I was unable to use any gun again for about a week until my cheekbone recovered.

This month's Shooting Trivia Question: The format for the National Double Barrel shoot-off changed in 1963. What altered? Mail your answer to Shooting Trivia, P.O. The correct answer to March's STQ is: The only person to ever be credited with 50/50 in the

qualifying rounds of a National Skeet Championship after firing only 49 shots was a visiting American named Gerry Williams. It occurred in Adelaide in 1973 when he was ruled "lost target" after several warnings for refusals. After shooting the repeat he finished with 49/49 and accepted the referee's decision in good spirit. However, the ACTA Executive later decided that in the best interests of international relations, he should be given "another chance" and actually changed his score from 49/50 to 50/50 without requiring him to at least go out and fire the 50th shot. No correct answers were received for this most interesting trivia question so a free entry to this year's National Skeet Championship has been awarded to Ken Lowry from Coffs Harbour in NSW for submitting it.

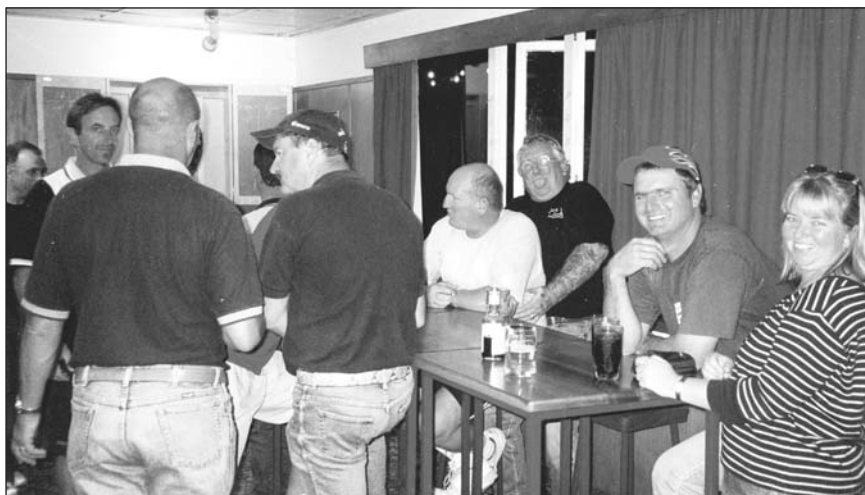
TUESDAY 11TH.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Mental Toughness

A couple of weeks ago I took my youngest son Paul to Sydney to enrol at University of New South Wales. While I was there, trying to fill in the hours, I wandered through the bookshop in search of something to read. I came across a book called *Mind Gym; An Athlete's Guide to Inner Excellence* written by Gary Mack and David Casstevens. This book looked OK. It was written in 2001 therefore it was up to date. It was written by two sport psychologists and it had two pages and a back cover of glowing testimonials about how great the book was. I parted with the money and decided to take the challenge to see if the book really warranted all the good things that had been said about it.

One chapter that was worth reading was the chapter on mental toughness. Mental toughness is defined as the set of behaviours and beliefs about yourself, your work, your sport and how you interact. This chapter looks at the seven characteristics of mental toughness.

1. COMPETITIVE

Being competitive and being in the competition are what counts. Whilst it's good to win, the process of being competitive means that if others want to win then they have to work hard at it.

2. CONFIDENCE

Being confident means that you see yourself as the favourite every time you walk out onto the tracks. This doesn't mean that you see yourself winning overall, but it may mean you see yourself winning your grade or section. Being confident means that you never allow a victim to self-defeating thoughts; to be confident you need a can-do attitude, a belief that you can handle anything that comes along.

3. CONTROL

To be a successful athlete you need to be able to control your emotions and behaviour; that is, focus on what you can control and don't allow the things that are beyond your control to affect you. To be mentally tough you need to be able to maintain poise, concentration and emotional pressure under the greatest of pressures and challenging situations.

4. COMMITTED

Mentally tough athletes focus their time and energy on their goals and dreams. Have a vision and set realistic goals to achieve your vision. Be self-directed and motivated towards both the process and the outcomes of your goals and dreams.

5. COMPOSURE

To be mentally tough you need to be able to stay focused and deal with adversity. Missing a target isn't the worst thing that can ever happen. But if you dwell on it and get angry with yourself then you are changing the focus of your attention and you will miss again and again.

6. COURAGE

Mentally tough athletes need to take risks. Peak performers only win because they're prepared to lose. If you stay with your comfort level you may never get to experience what happens when you are truly "in the zone".

7. CONSISTENCY

Mentally tough athletes possess an inner strength. They often play their best when they are feeling their worst.

As I read this book which is basically a series of psychological skills with real life, albeit American, examples of great sportsmen and how they developed these skills and how they helped them win. There were lots of sayings from the greats of American sport but the message that was made clear was that the competition is won or lost on the six-inch playing field between the ears. Give some thought as to whether you possess the seven characteristics of mental toughness.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
