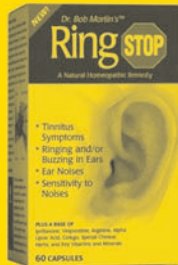

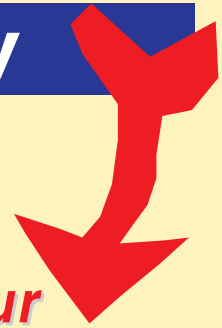

This 3-day meeting gives the opportunity for the ACTA sub committees to meet and discuss a range of issues. The Saturday and Sunday is set aside for the Full Executive to debate various proposals.

I hope all shooters appreciate that your Executive members do put considerable time into their role, being part of at least 2 sub committees as well as the full National Executive.

Issues like ensuring we maintain an effective and affordable insurance cover for our clubs and individual shooters will certainly be discussed at length. Constitutional reform as deferred at the AGM and also the restructure of the Australian Shooters Association will be part of the agenda. We are also currently negotiating for members of the New Zealand Executive to also possibly meet with us at this time.

Elections will also be held for all leadership positions within the National Executive for the 200/2004-year.

MAJOR STATE CARNIVALS

I am unaware of any major state carnivals being conducted in the month of July. These carnivals however become frequent events during spring and the next few months.

DARWIN SHOOT

ACTA National Sporting Clays 2003

The 10th National Sporting Clays were again held at the ACTA National Ground in Wagga Wagga on the 17th and 18th May. Participation at this years Nationals increased again on the previous year and visitors were again attracted from many states within Australia with members from the SSAA and Field & Game also represented.

Saturday saw 86 competitors contest the ACTA Sporting Clays Championship on an overcast autumn day. The overall winner of this event was John Younger with a score of 98/100. The grade placings for this event were as follows: AA Grade - 1st Sox Pilipasisidis 97/100, 2nd Peter Tobin 96/100; A Grade - 1st Bart Brighenti 97/100, 2nd Alec Ceccato; B Grade - 1st Denis Coaker 89/100, 2nd B Ritchie Tupp 85/100; C Grade - 1st Robert Hall 83/110, 2nd Rick Mathers 81/110. Robert Hall won junior section with a score of 74/100, Women's section by Toni Henshall 62/100 and Wilson Ronald won the Veteran section on a score of 82/100.

The grade placings for this event were as follows: AA Grade - 1st John Younger 111/120, 2nd Peter Tobin 110 120; A Grade - 1st Max Kavanagh 89/100, 2nd Bart Brighenti 86/100; B Grade - 1st Brian Hutson 88/100, 2nd Milton Cartwright 80/100; C Grade - 1st Robert Hall 72/100, 2nd Aaron Mackay 70/100. Robert Hall won Junior section with a score of 72/100, Women's section by Toni Henshall 61/100 and Bruce Papst won the Veteran section on a score of 76/100.

NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIP

Dubbo club member Denis Coaker with a score of 165/200 took out third place in B Grade. Lawrence Irons from Frankston placed second in B Grade with a score of 169/200 and Brian Hutson from the Kerang

Club claimed first place with a score of 172/200.

Max Kavanagh took out third place in A Grade with a score of 183/200. Second place went to Griffith Gun Club member Alec Ceccato with a score of 179/200 and first place in A grade went to another Griffith Gun Club member Bart Brighenti with a score of 183/200.

In AA grade, third place went to Marty Seymour from the Victorian Field & Game on 180/200. Second place went to Mildura shooter Peter Tobin with a score of 189/200 from first place winner Field & Game shooter John Younger on a score of 191/200.

The overall winner and National Sporting Clays Champion for 2003 with a score over the two days of 193/200 was Sox Pilipasidis from the Aruzzo Gun Club. Sox received the Royal Blue Sash and silver belt buckle for his efforts.

The ACTA would like to thank the Wagga Gun Club for their continued assistance with these Championships.

The 2004 Sporting Clays National is scheduled to be held 15th and 16th May at the ACTA National Shooting Ground.

VICTORIAN STATE SKEET CARNIVAL 2003

Currently there are only two Gun Clubs in Victoria who have the minimum requirement of four Skeet Layouts required to conduct the State Skeet Carnival. They are Melbourne Gun Club and Frankston/Australian and this year it was FACTC's turn to stage the event. Thus on the Labour day week-end of March 8, 9 and 10, seventy three competitors from five States made the journey to the Melbourne bayside suburb of Carrum Downs to contest the various State Titles on offer.

The committee and workers at Frankston had been very busy in the days and weeks leading up to the Carnival and the club and grounds were in pristine condition for the events. One of the few complaints that shooters have had at previous major Skeet events, when ground number one (the ISSF ground) is reset and included in the Field Rotation, is the inequity of that field by virtue of the treed background rather than the sky background of the other three fields.

I don't know how much two-stroke fuel had been consumed, but a breathtaking pruning exercise had clearly been undertaken during the week leading up to the Carnival, with the result that blue sky was now the order of the day on Ground One. Great job guys. From the competitors viewpoint it was well worth whatever effort was expended. The weather over the long weekend was best described as workable. It ranged from partly cloudy with light breezes to overcast and gusty. Although it often threatened to rain, it never really did, with most people staying dry and only a few getting a little damp.

The winds on Saturday morning were just tricky enough to prevent any possibles being shot in the 20Gauge event and so three 49s shot off for the overall placings. Paul Johnston exited first and claimed third place after getting a very difficult pair on Station Two in the first round. Upon returning to Station Two in the second round, Gil Farish let the high bird go, thus settling for second overall and leaving Adrian Cousins to claim the State 20 Gauge Championship with a score of 79/80.

48s shot off for AA with Gary Dennison running out the eventual winner on 62/64 and Peter Vella from Sydney finishing 2nd on 61/64. A grade was won by Laurie Durham on 48/50, with R Holloway 2nd on 47/50. B grade went to Locky Irons on 47/50 and Billy Hine 45/50. C grade was a close battle with Leonie Johnston on 40/50 finishing ahead of G Addario on 39/50. Ladies winner was Karen Cousins with 45/50 and the Veterans division was taken out by Danny Parsell on 46/50. Unfortunately no juniors contested the event.

After lunch the weather improved somewhat and the State Skeet Handicap got underway with about half the field qualifying for the shoot-off. Thus it wasn't until almost the end of the second round that enough people had been eliminated for the paying places to start being decided. So when Wally Diston missed his high 8 it allowed him to claim fifth place. Halfway through the next round "Dangles" McDougall missed a high 5 to claim fourth and shortly after G Addario missed one in the pair on seven to finish third. Then began the battle of the Roberts boys from Bendigo, which went on for another 21/2 rounds before Andrew Roberts finally succumbed to his brother Leigh, who shot a magnificent 187/187 off scratch to become the 2003 State Skeet Handicap Champion.

Sunday was reserved for the main event of the Carnival, the 100 target State Skeet Championship and the "Bendigo Bandits" of Leigh and Andrew Roberts and their friend Scott Nelson were all looking pretty good on 98/100 until Adrian Cousins ruined their day by shooting the only 99 to "skin" the event. On recent form, everyone assumed the "captain of the Bandits" would polish off his accomplices to finish second, but it was not to be. Leigh dropped out first to win AA grade and left his brother to defeat Scott and thus finish second and third in that order.

Peter Vella managed another AA 2nd with 97/100 and Laurie Durham hinted at things to come with his strong 95 to win A grade. Chris Hughes joined the placings with 93 to finish 2nd in A grade. B grade was a battle between "the old boys from Melbourne Gun Club" with Clyde Bennett on 93 getting the better of Wally Diston on 91. C grade went to G Barry on 89/100 and M Smith on 86/100. In the divisions, Wendy Wellam won the Ladies with 97/109, Hayden Mountjoy the Juniors with 97/108 and Reg Clarke the Veterans on 119/125.

Following the shoot-off, the State Postal Teams took to the fields and recorded Victoria's scores for the Interstate Postal Match. State Team High Gun winners were: Open - Adrian Cousens 58/58, Ladies - Wendy Wellam 22/25, Juniors - Hayden Mountjoy 33/35 and Veterans - Danny Parsell 25/25. Shoulder to shoulder teams to represent Victoria at the Skeet Nationals were then established from a combination of the Postal Team scores and the qualifying scores.

The Open Team will comprise Leigh Roberts 196/200, Scott Nelson 195/200, Gil Farish 195/200, Pedro DaSilva 193/200 and Paul Johnston 192/200. The Ladies Team is Wendy Wellam 155/175, Karen Cousens 147/175 and Julie Durham 140/175. The Veteran Team is Wally Diston 160/175, Clyde Bennett 158/175 and Danny Parsell 157/175. The Junior Team is G Barry 156/175, H Mountjoy 154/175 and M Smith 148/175. Following presentations Frankston Australian provided a free barbeque and opened the bar to Happy Hour, which was enjoyed by all. Thanks to Paul Calvi and his committee for this wonderful gesture.

Labour Day Monday saw the running of the City of Melbourne Skeet Championship with five possibles tying for the shoot-off. Danny Parsell exited first taking AA 2nd with 54/55, followed by Paul Johnston with 67/68 to win AA grade. Neil Dimmick from Queensland finished with 69/70 and third overall, leaving only Adrian Cousens and Laurie Durham to start the second round. Having never shot 100 straight before, Laurie was very happy to complete the second round clean, but then missed in the pair at his next visit to Station Two, finishing second overall with 107/108 and leaving Adrian Cousens on 108/108 to take his third Overall win for the week-end.

The last event of the Carnival was the State Skeet Doubles and Gil Farish avenged his loss in the 20 Gauge by shooting the only 49 to win the event outright. In the shoot-off for the minor placing Neil Dimmick triumphed to take 2nd with 59/62, leaving Mal Briggs to take 3rd on 58/62. AA grade was won by Leigh Roberts 48/52 with Adrian Cousens 2nd on 47/50. A shoot-off for A grade resulted in Gonzo Young shooting 51/54 to defeat Craig McDougall on 50/54. B grade winners were J Tombolato with 43/50 and Billy Attwood with 42/50. C grade went to J Armao 38/50 and C Peak 37/50. Division winners were Linda Watson in the Ladies with 40/50, Hayden Mountjoy in the Juniors with 43/50 and Neil Dimmick in the Veterans with 48/50.

Gil Farish's excellent shooting in the Doubles put him back into contention for the Overall High Gun and a shoot-off with Adrian Cousens, as they were both six targets down for the program. After two brackets of the 14 target shoot-off sequence, Gil finally succumbed to give Adrian his ninth Victorian Skeet High Gun with a score of 273/278. Other High Gun Winners were Ladies - Wendy Wellam 220/250, Juniors - Hayden Mountjoy 218/250 and Veterans - Neil Dimmick 240/250. The Two Person Open Team was won by Gil Farish and Adrian Cousens on 488/500 and the Five Person Club Team was won by Melbourne Gun Club with a score of 1096/1250.

After presentations on Saturday evening a Skeet Meeting was convened by the VCTA Vice President, Adrian Cousens, to discuss any Skeet related matters and collect feedback for the State Association. Most competitors seemed very happy with all aspects of the Carnival except the new date. This year a long weekend format had been trialled in an attempt to solve the Postal team selection issue. However it was decided that the benefits of either this weekend or the Queens Birthday weekend in June were far outweighed by the disadvantages. Thus a motion was passed unanimously to revert to the first weekend in May for next year.

Dear Shooters,

No doubt I am not the first to ask why our shooters score/record book isn't issued on an as needs basis. I have no idea how much the printing or distribution of the score book costs us each year. The only reference I could find in the latest "Statement of Financial Performance" was under the heading of "Printing and Stationery" \$9913.

The score book has provision for at least 175 DTL events and of the entire one and two day competitions advertised in the latest CTSN there is an average of 5 events per comp. Do some math's and you get a bit under 36 comps that could be attended before you need a new book. If only 50% of shooters attended one shoot per month then the book is good for 3 years. Using my assumptions the \$9913 could be halved and over 3 years, \$14,000+ could be saved.

Club secretaries could hold a supply of books for issue to shooters as required. Not only would this save a considerable amount of money over time it would also eliminate a lot of heartache by shooters waiting for new books but it must save time for admin staff.

Saturday night the 26th of April & four squads of shooters arrived at Echuca Clay Target Club to decide who was going to get the sashes for the State NEZ Night Mixed Target Championship and the 50 Target State Night Handicap events on offer.

A calm mild night ensured competition would be keen amongst the shooters and so it was with three shooters on a score of 56/60 in the 40-target event one.

The first round of 14 points in the shoot-off saw one shooter out, another 14 points and we had a

winner, Rod Flower (Bendigo) taking AA & Overall Sash & Trophy on 82/88. A Grade was Murray Holme (Cosgrove) with an 81/88, B

Grade trophy was collected by a Veneto (Werribee) shooter Fabian Gobbo on 64/74, and C Grade was taken out by a new shooter from Echuca, Simon Boyd with a score of 39/60, a very happy shooter.

Event Two, the 50-target handicap shot in two waves of 25 targets. Once again Rod Flower showing other shooters how its done, no shoot-off needed no one matching his excellent score of 47/50 shot from the 21 meters mark.

Coaches Corner . . .

QUESTION 1.

Should I leave my shotgun cocked, or let the "hammers" off when storing it ?.

Regards Tom Hancock.

It is always desirable to store your shotgun with the "hammers down". The reasoning being that with the hammers cocked there is unnecessary strain placed on the compressed hammer springs, in time this could lead to their weakening and the possibility of "light strikes" causing misfires. i.e. The hammer fall onto the firing pin not being of sufficient strength for the firing pin to activate the cartridge primer resulting in a malfunction. Unfortunately the cause of this particular type of malfunction is reasonably hard to define except by shooters of considerable experience, the first thought is usually that there has been a faulty primer in the cartridge, not that there is a problem with the firearm itself.

Better for all if your firearm is stored with the "hammers down".

QUESTION 2.

I am a AA trap shooter and every time I am in a shoot off I get very nervous. It seems to get worse when all I have to do is hit the next target and I am the winner. I tend to miss. I have tried not to think so far ahead but my brain just takes over. Any suggestions because I am sick of always being first loser!

Firstly, before going into some detail in reply, let me make some observations from your question.

All competitors of all grades feel somewhat nervous when faced with the shoot off scenario, it is how they direct that nervous energy or adrenalin flow that will ultimately determine whether they are the winner or runner-up. Early in my own shooting career I had the opportunity to ask a very similar question to one of the doyens of Australian shooting.

"Why do I get so nervous when going out for a shoot off, when all the others don't seem at all effected?"

The reply. "They are all like ducks on a pond on a windy day, calm as can be on the surface, but underneath paddling like there is

no tomorrow." This has stayed with me for my whole shooting life and when faced with a crunch scenario I will often think of those ducks.

The next target is must always be the objective, the focus of all your attention. All the targets you have already shot are history and there is nothing that you or anyone else can do to change that, the only target that is of any consequence is the next, you will call for it, engage it and the result will be included in history with all your others. Whether you are subsequently the winner or runner-up is totally in your hands, there is nothing the other competitors can do to effect the result of your target. The fact that you refer to yourself as "being sick of being the first loser" is in itself indicative of your problem. If you do not think you can win why go out and waste the cartridges? Try thinking of the shoot off targets as free targets, those you get to shoot for nothing, and enjoy the experience.

There is no magic formula for your problem. As a AA shooter your results are already there for all to see, believe in yourself, act confident, be confident. Self criticism is probably the most destructive, to achieve at the highest level it is important to believe in self. The answer lies in your ability to believe in yourself, your ability to succeed and to stay focussed on the task at hand, not to get involved in mind games either your own or those of somebody else's making. How often have you witnessed or fallen victim to the gamesmanship that some of our contestants play so well. Do not get involved in the fatal mistake of evaluating your opponents as better than yourself based on reputation. Clay target shooting is not in itself difficult, what makes it difficult are the mind games that we play. You must want that target. In competition of any type try and reduce the task to the basics, execute the same proven pre-shot routine and if your pre-shot routine incorporates a statement ensure that it is positive, one that results in the target being broken. If for any reason during the pre-shot routine the sequence is broken then put the gun down and start again. Any thought you have during preparation for your next target must be positive to result in that target being broken.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS

July 2003

Most sporting activities consist of four major aspects and Clay Target Shooting is no exception. These aspects are: 1) The physical condition of the athletes. 2) The quality, suitability and scope of their equipment. 3) The quality of their technique and their advancement with the perfection of that technique, and 4) Their mental strength and control. The ability to succeed in any sport is directly related to each person's current level of attainment and/or proficiency in each of these aspects.

Where Clay Target Shooting differs from most other sports is the order of importance of these aspects. In most other sports the correct order of importance is probably the order listed above with maybe some scope to interchange between numbers two and three. However I believe that for Clay Target Shooting the correct order of importance is the reverse of the above and that is what makes our sport rather unique.

Re Mental: My reasoning for rearranging these aspects in such an order is because Clay Target Shooting is unquestionably primarily a mental exercise. The game itself is not terribly difficult or complicated. Hitting a moving clay target with a shotgun is a relatively easy task, in which most people enjoy a fair degree of natural ability, and those who don't can usually respond satisfactorily to some fairly simple tuition. Someone once said that you could probably teach a chimpanzee to shoot clay targets and although I suspect that this is probably true, I hope no-one ever performs the exercise. A monkey probably wouldn't confound himself with all the mental handicaps we humans manifest within ourselves, and thus such a comparison would only highlight our weaknesses and in doing so, put a serious dent in our egos.

And that in reality is the bottom line with Clay Target Shooting. Once the theory and mechanics of the game have been learned and perfected, it then becomes not really a game of who can hit the most targets, but actually a test of who can go the longest without making a mistake and missing one. And as nine out of ten mistakes that cause a miss are mental errors rather than a physical inability to point the shotgun in the right place, it simply bears out the commonly quoted adage that the game is 90% mental and 10% physical. I have already touched upon the mental side of shooting, and my ideas thereon, a couple of times in this column and hope to revisit that aspect again at length in the future.

Re Technique: Understanding the theory of shooting a moving target with a shotgun, and then developing the simplest technique compatible with that theory, is the key to the whole mechanical aspect of our sport. I firmly believe that confidence in the knowledge that your technique is the best, easiest and simplest possible, is the most valuable confidence you can develop. This fact alone is one of the main reasons why the shooting lessons that I give are heavily weighted with classroom type theory explanations, rather than simply "shoot-and-see" sessions on the field. Shooting techniques and their underlying theory is another area I intend to address here shortly.

Re: Equipment. The selection of shooting and safety equipment is undoubtedly the first important aspect of our sport that the novice shooter encounters. Unfortunately it is often also the most ongoing of all the other related aspects, as a fair degree of evolution is often required before the perceived advantage of cost effectiveness gives way to an appreciation of the real advantages of having quality equipment. However advice on the content, selection, storage, transportation and accessibility of that equipment is often overlooked by both coaches and instructors when advising novice and experienced shooters alike. For that reason I wrote a dedicated chapter on this subject in my "never to be completed" shooting book. Next month I intend to elaborate on my ideas on that aspect in this column.

Re Physical: Unlike most sports, with Clay Target Shooting the physical condition of the athlete often has very little bearing on the outcome of the competition. How many sports can you think of where a slightly built sixteen year old girl, a sixty five year old retired invalid pensioner, some bloke who looks like Arnold Schwarzenegger and a paraplegic in a wheel chair can all compete together on a reasonably equal plane.

During the late 80s and early 90s I resided and competed mainly in the United States and was adjudged by my peers to be amongst the top half dozen Skeet Shooters in the World. Throughout that time I won three North American National Championships, two World Championships and established several World Records. However, during that time I was also beaten at various times by other competitors who conformed to each of the four examples listed above.

I don't think that it is possible to fully understand the ramifications of being the World Champion or truly grasp the concept of humility, until you have walked out onto a shoot-off field in front of the "who's who" of shooting, with the stone in your World Championship Ring glinting in the sunlight, and then been sent back to the parking lot with your tail between your legs by a little girl, a paraplegic and someone's grandfather.

But that is the most wonderful thing about our sport. It is the thing that sets it apart from not only most other sports, but also most other hobbies, leisure activities, or fields of human competitive endeavour. It is the thing that makes our sport one of the few true "family sports", where up to four different generations of the one family can not only play together, but can actually genuinely compete together, with each individual having a realistic chance of "unassisted" success.

It is certainly the reason why, almost thirty years ago, I decided to invest an enormous amount of time, money and effort into this particular sport. It was at a point in my life where the availability of leisure time had suddenly and unexpectedly returned to me, as a result of leaving the interstate transport industry and taking on an eight-to-five job. It also coincided with a disenchantment at being very mediocre at a number of things in the leisure activity field and a desire to excel at something (anything).

After realistically assessing the very limited skills and natural abilities that I possessed in the sporting areas, I decided that I clearly needed to find an endeavour where time was not an issue and age was not a handicap. Being in my late twenties, it was obvious that the best years in a lot of sports had already passed me by, and that in most others, the ravages of age would overcome me long before I could attain the skills and experience required to be competitive at the elite level. In the end it was a toss-up between shooting clay targets and flying model aeroplanes.

As the mistakes inherent with the learning curve of both these options appeared a lot less spectacular and/or expensive with shooting, I opted for the former and the rest is history. I think the best illustration of the correctness and wisdom of my assessment and decision is found by examining the time line around my first National Skeet Championship win in 1981. The people whose names are engraved on the trophy, on either side of mine, have long since departed for the Big Gun Club in the Sky.

Fortunately both these great shooters stayed around long enough to become very close personal friends before signing off on the bottom of their last scoresheet. The upside of that is that I am assured of having plenty of mates to shoot with when I get to the only Gun Club where the practice tickets are free. To put the situation into numerical perspective, I believe that George Biggs was 65 when he won his National Skeet title in 1980 and I think that

Ray Melville was about 63 when I passed the baton to him in 1982.

Thus when you look at it in this light, you see that our sport has not just one but two excellent promotional and/or marketing points in its favour. First you don't need to be young, and second you don't need to be fit or athletic. How many other sports can you think of where even one of these assets can be done without, let alone both of them. Please don't overlook this most vital point when you are next discussing our sport with potential members, or defending it against the attacks of the anti-gun brigade.

Now this is not to say that youth or athleticism play no part at all in our sport, as obviously that would be an unrealistic assertion. Clearly there are times when stamina is a major asset and the young and fit will thus have a perceptible advantage over the rest of the field, however that advantage exists on a much smaller scale in our sport than nearly all others. Consequently if your intention is to become an elite athlete in our sport, and the availability of training time is not an issue, then I suggest that you start young and divide your training time between shooting practice and working out in the gym.

However, if you started late, are not athletically inclined and have limited time to devote to your training schedule, do not despair. You have chosen the right sport, and if you are prepared to apply yourself to the best of your ability, and are blessed with a little luck, you never know what you might achieve. And when appropriating your training time, leave the gym work until last and spend as much time as you can either shooting practice or taking lessons.

Quote of the month: I was saddened recently to hear of the death of Robert Stack, who is best remembered for his role as Elliot Ness in the 1960s TV series The Untouchables. However, what very few people outside the shooting fraternity realise is that he actually did more shooting in real life with a shotgun, than he ever did on TV with a Tommy Gun. I had the great pleasure of meeting and chatting with him at the World Skeet Shoot about ten years ago. He was one of the first members of the NSSA, an inductee into their National Hall of Fame and the 1936 World 20 Gauge Skeet Cham-

pion. His philosophy on Clay Target Shooting was simplicity in itself and very relevant to life in general. "If you win, don't brag and if you lose, don't cry." Thanks Elliot. RIP

This month's Shooting Trivia Question is unique in one important aspect. It is an occurrence I have pondered upon for a long time, and yet even after a great deal of research and investigation, I have been unable to unearth the answer to it. Thus I will be most interested to receive this month's replies, so here it is: The Grand Australian Handicap is one of the six major events conducted each year at the Trap Nationals. It originated in 1949 and has been conducted every year since, with the exception of 1961. Why was it not held that year? Mail your answer to Shooting Trivia, P.O. The correct answer to May's STQ is: In 1963 the format for the National Double Barrel shoot-off changed from brackets of five shots in Indian File, to the current miss-and-out squad system. 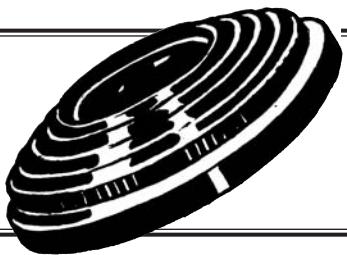

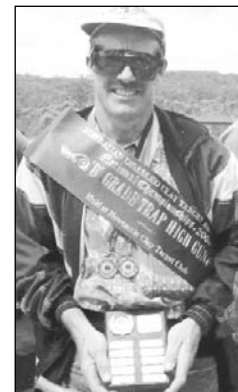

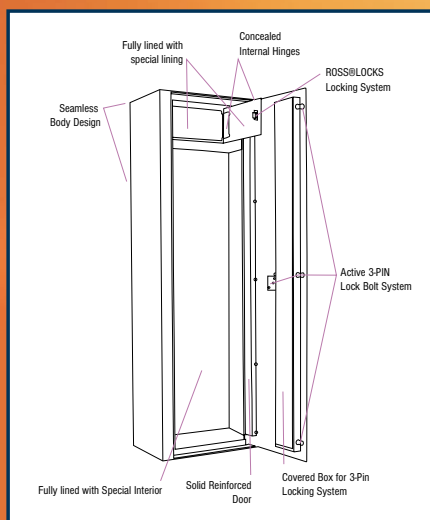
