PRESIDENTS ANNUAL REPORT 2003



My first term as National President has been quite an experience. I would like to thank John Byrnes for his previous effort as National President. My thanks also to the Executive Committee and in particular Vice President Ron Traill who is always there when needed. To Andy and his staff, once again another great effort, they are the people who run our organisation.

2003 saw a number of changes including the Australian Shooting Association and its constitution still under review. Our own reviewed constitution has again been placed as a notice of motion to be accepted at the AGM. I encourage all clubs to vote in favour of this constitution as many months of hard work have gone into providing a document that will lead us forward over the next few years.

Our costs have been held steady over the past financial year including the never-ending battle with insurance that appears to have levelled out but still remains expensive. All Australian Sports Commission funding for the Association has now stopped which means a "stand alone" situation exists and we need to be mindful of our spending. Australian Sports Commission funding is now directed to the Australian Shooting Association who has complete responsibility for its distribution. They therefore

have responsibility for International Shooting Sports Federation events, team selection procedure and travel arrangements. Our assistance is always requested with respect to administration for international events held in Australia (world cups for example). Our valued expertise is always available and my thanks to Andy and Elaine in this department.

Progress on the National Shooting Ground continues, as funding becomes available. Four additional traps have now been added thus allowing a more flexible National Championship to be conducted. Consultation continues with Wagga Wagga City Council in respect to additional land with Andy and myself attending meetings with the council over this issue. Thus far, these meetings have produced favourable outcomes.

The ACTA National Junior Development Program now in its fifth year continues to encourage and develop junior shooters. Over the past years, some 120 juniors have now taken advantage and I look forward to the program being given further support by the National Executives.

National Championships were conducted in all disciplines with again some outstanding results.

The Olympic Discipline Nationals were recently conducted in Sydney with testing conditions prevailing.

National Doubles Trap champion was Steve Haberman with Megumi Inoue from Japan, the Womens winner.

The High Gun went to Russell Mark, Junior Dustan Barry and Susan Trindall Womens.

National Trap Champion was again Adam Vella with Deserie Baynes the Womens. Adam was also successful in the open High Gun, Junior Marcel Tigani and Suzanne Balogh the Womens.

Congratulations to all competitors and good luck to those shooters returning for the Australia Cup mid February.

The National DTL Championship will be held at the National Grounds March 31st to April 4th. I look forward to seeing you there where the new format and additional shooting facilities should ensure you all have a good time.

I would like to say thanks to all those club administration staff who voluntarily gives their time and effort to enable Clay Target Shooting to continue. Without your help, we would have nothing. If you can find the energy please keep going.

Registration figures for the year ended 2003 showed a modest increase over 2002, a trend we should all strive to continue.

I look forward to 2004 and with your help am sure our Association will continue to achieve.

The Orange Clay Target Club Official Opening, New Grounds and Clubhouse

The Orange Clay Target Club was formed in 1968 and one of the founding members, Merv Williams allowed the club to operate on his property, which was not far from the town's boundary.

By 1985 there was pressure from urban sprawl and the club started to look for another location. After almost fifteen years of constant looking, inquiring and trying we finally found 15 acres, which the Club could afford and which looked eminently suitable. Having put in the development application to Council it was a bitter pill to swallow when we were knocked back because

we did not own the entire safety zone. Having told our troubles to the owner of the property Doug Dwyer, we were amazed and speechless with gratitude when he quietly replied that he would give another fifty acres at no extra cost and no strings attached. "Lets see if they can knock you back now!" Well of course they could not and did not. The Club was freehold tenure and completely secure over 66 acres now all we needed was a small fortune to build a club worthy of the land and the gift.

Among members we have a wide variety of skills from the most willing labourers through to the builder himself. Our President,

Joe Caltabiano has the greatest skill of all - the supreme fundraiser. Letters to members, phone calls all round, quiet talks in the pub, clubhouse etc. finally all members had been made offers they could not refuse. At the latest count members donated almost \$40,000 without any strings attached. What a mighty effort from 60 members. No bank loans, no funding from Sport and Recreation just our own efforts.

Building commenced in the winter of 2003 and this was done part-time by all members. People who had no affiliation with the club or with clay target shooting turned out to be exceedingly generous. Bricklayers, concreters, suppliers of all commodities either gave their time or donated goods.

The end result is a club building which will easily seat a hundred people. Spacious kitchen and catering areas, a fully equipped office and bar area. Full toilet and shower facilities, including disabled toilet and shower. Camping and caravan sites with power to all caravans. Four-trap layouts on level ground so that each trap is almost identical shooting. The whole facility stands as a statement to the vision, skill and hard work of members and the generosity of the community at large.

Planning for the two-day open shoot had been happening for months and the committee's biggest worry was how many will turn up? We had nothing to judge by and no past history. We were scared we would not get eighty shooters and scared we would get more than 120 shooters.

By Friday evening we had Caravan City happening on site and almost forty shooters setting up camp and preparing for a BBQ and a couple of cold ones. Shooters from Queensland and from all parts of NSW were represented.

Saturday morning was very hot and oppressive with very uncomfortable shooting conditions. Before shooting could commence the official opening had to be attended to. The Federal Member for Calare, Peter Andren M.P. did the honours and congratulated all members on a wonderful effort. The Mayor of Orange and the Mayor of Cabonne Shire spoke and both were full of praise. Finally John Finn spoke as the representative for the NSW Clay Target Association. As with

all previous speakers John was full of praise for all the members.

With the ceremony complete the shoot marshals called for the first four squads to take their mark and get competition under way. With a very impressive 102 nominations for Saturday the shoot Marshall's worked tirelessly to ensure the smooth and swift turnaround of all squads. By the end of day one the only event left to shoot off was the double barrel. This event had to be shot to finality and had to be finished on the day. The shoot went until dark and all shooters missed simply because the target could not be seen. Dave Perri emerged as the winner and in doing

so established the club record with a great break of 486. With shooting finished for the day the bar was well attended and a large crowd sat down to a great meal prepared by Chris Durack and all his many helpers. Later in the evening we were all entertained by great Country and Western Bands who were greatly appreciated by all who sat under the stars and sang along with the help of a few beers and the odd rum!

Sunday morning saw a change in the weather and the temperature dropped by ten degrees. This was really welcome as nominations for the Golden Cartridge event climbed to 115. Shooting got under way at 9.30 am and throughout the day top scores were recorded by all grades and many possible were shot.

By days end two shooters stood alone to contest the overall result and the coveted trophy. Glen Castellaro from Griffith Gun Club had shot a perfect score and those who had watched him shoot through the weekend were not surprised. Glen must be at the top of the tree in D.T.L. shooting in Australia. The shooter who equalled Glen's score was none other than the great J.W. Smith who is a member of the Canowindra Club and is well known throughout Australia. Both these shooters were recently inducted to the NSW Hall of Fame. At the completion of the shoot off Glenn Castellaro stood victorious, not only the winner of the Golden Cartridge event but also the High Gun winner for the two-day shoot.

Time for the presentation and \$6,500 in prizes to be distributed. All shooters were warm in their praise for the way the shoot was run the target presentation and quality of the trophies. The office

Psychological Skills for Shooting

ATTITUDE

No two people are alike. We all see, hear, feel, smell and taste things differently. The same event or situation will be seen differently by two people. Some people perceive events or situations in a positive and optimistic way, whilst others see the same things in a negative and pessimistic way.

I am reminded of a story that explains the difference between a pessimist and an optimist. One day a psychiatrist was worried about his two young sons; one was an optimist and saw everything as good and the other was a pessimist who saw nothing but troubles and obstacles. Both boys had the same opportunities in life, they were loved and well looked after but still they saw things very differently. So one Christmas the psychiatrist decided to try an experiment. On Christmas Eve he filled the room of the pessimist with as many parcels and presents he could manage. Everything the boy wanted would be there. For his other son, the optimist, he filled his room with horse shit. The next morning the psychiatrist walked past the pessimistic boy's bedroom and the child was sitting amidst toys, games and wrapping paper. He looked despondent and worried and asked his father, "What's the catch?" The psychiatrist then walked past his other son's room. He was jumping up and down, laughing and throwing great handfuls of horse shit in the air. The boy was obviously excited and the father asked why. The optimistic son replied; "Well with all this horse shit, there must be a pony.'

So what is the difference between the attitudes of the optimist and the pessimist. Mack & Casstevens in their book, Mind Gym, claim that optimists have a positive expectancy that helps them achieve their goals. They have a can-do attitude and they take action that is empowering. Pessimists on the other hand, take a passive attitude and play the blame game or focus on what they can't do, and in doing so become victims of a self-fulfilling prophecy.

So why would anyone not want to be an optimist; research shows that optimists, on average, live longer than pessimists do. They enjoy life more and have far more success. They see their failures as learning experiences rather than setbacks. I often listen to other shooters talk around the traps and its' amazing how often people, shooters, friends put themselves down. I've often said to people at shoots; "you would get angry if anyone else spoke to you like that but you're prepared to speak to yourself that way". Be careful of the language you use; expressions such as "single burial" for single barrel only reinforce the negative beliefs you have about your ability. Having a positive attitude doesn't mean that you'll always win, but having a negative attitude will almost always guarantee you will lose.

Attitudes are learned so therefore they can be unlearned. The qualities of pessimism are permanence, pervasiveness and personalisation. To change these qualities to an optimistic attitude you have to believe that when you miss a target, lose a competition or have a set back, that this will be temporary. Secondly, rather than let your doubts and troubles affect every area of your life, you need to put your problems and distractions in a "box" so that you are not bothered by them during the competition. Finally, optimists internalise victories and externalise defeats. That is, if you win or shoot well it must have been due to something you did well. Whereas if you perform poorly or lose it must have been due to something outside your control; the wind, shells, targets, lunch, etc. This doesn't mean your making an excuse, it means that you are going to take responsibility for achievement but not take the responsibility for your failure.

Finally, Mack and Casstevens claim that if you think you can, your right. And if you think you can't, you're also right. The way you choose to think will decide if you can or can't.

Dear Your Say

I would like to make comment on Rick Hackers article. Three or four things he said made my blood pressure jump but I want to focus on just one.

This is not a criticism. As I did enjoy the article, however, I am personally worried that some people may follow some of the advice hoping that they will be rewarded by an extra bird to help win that shoot off, or maybe just to get into one.

Most better grade guns have a nice figured walnut stock. I would put my arm in a pool with a hungry white-pointer before I would let anyone put my stock in a heat and twist jig, designed for bending it or putting in a bit of cast-on or cast-off (if you're a righty).

The quality better figured dense hard burl walnut, (Jugians Regia) no matter where it came from - Turkish, French, Italian, Circasian or California Claro. These top dense woods have had to fight for their very survival. Most in terrible climates for 150 years with frost, snow, rain, heat and cold, harsh times usually up high with little water.

Where as the trees that had it good down in the valley with plenty of water and high growth rates, in comparison are more porous, open grained, less figured. The wood needed for bulk supply in lower graded guns usually is kiln dried which takes years to reduce the moisture content to 50% weight.

All dense woods, like steel, can have memory and in the warm sunlight can return to the original position or shape or worse, somewhere in between. So should they survive the twist-jig you would have risked destroying your stock spent a lot of money and maybe ended up back at square one. Don't risk it. Go with an adjustable comb. You have it all. Cast in two directions and comb drop. All burl is rootstock. Save that beautiful wood for another day - its cheaper and safer and Rick, Big mistake, you should have bought that Parker. Good shooting.

from computer-data bases and wonder if I was targeted. I was informed that day that there had been several thefts of firearms

from local gun clubs.)

The Police investigation was completed on Sunday the 14th Dec 2003. I was informed that I may be liable to a charge for insecure firearms, despite the fact that they were locked in storage, but not in the safe provided for the purpose, as the firearms should have been removed from the safe just before my leaving the house (interval of time not defined) next morning.

In Queensland, where travelling away from home and stopping at a motel, the regulations state that the firearms, etc, are to be stored in a locked boot overnight.

It would appear that packing one's car ready for early departure next morning the night before is illegal. May I ask, what is the difference where one, while travelling with firearms to or from a shooting venue, is accommodated in a private home and there is no safe, or legal cabinet, in which to put the firearms, where does one secure the firearms? For motel, it is the boot. In the home, the safe. Overnight in another house, where?

So, the message I give is very clear - be very mindful of how you transport your firearms and when and how they are secured under those circumstances.

Not to be discouraged, my daughter and I elected to attend the Christmas shoot at our club. We arrived late at the Club and the news travelled very quickly. I was astounded at the large number of shooters who told me that they do exactly what I did that night. I would like to warn all shooters of this situation, and to advise them to desist from this mode of pre-packing the vehicle, as no matter how conscious and conscientious one can be of the law, the burglar, one way or other, is quite likely to get at you, the lawful and caring citizen, in the end!!! This recommendation has been reported to the QCTA, and is also passed on to other State C.T.A.s' for their action.

As one who has been involved with firearms and firearms safety for 77 years, both in civil and in military circumstances, I feel that I have a civic responsibility to make this information, concerning my ill fortune, available to all legitimate shooters. I find it ironic that the very law, which is supposed to protect citizens such as myself, renders me the criminal rather than the thieves who violated my premises and stole my property!

My Experience

Subject: stolen firearms.

During the night 13/14th December 2003, my residence was burgled and two guns stolen. The circumstances were as follows:

At around 8.00pm, 13th of December 2003, I drew my Perazzi Trap Gun (Model SC3 -serial No. 57197) and my daughter's Miroku Trap Gun (Model 9000 Gd 1 - serial No. 7131 INZ) from the secured safe and secured the firearms in the boot of my station wagon in readiness for an early departure.

After the guns were stored, all the necessary shooting components (ear-protectors, lubricants, cleaning materials, rags, First Aid kit, shooting jackets, and gun-rack) were stored in successive order. All the ammunition was carefully sorted out and locked in the ammunition container, which was chained to the floor, after which the ammunition cupboards (steel) were locked. After the loading was completed, the luggage compartment roller cover was drawn across and seated in the respective brackets, hiding all from view. I had much earlier (shortly after purchase of the vehicle) gone to the extra expense of fitting a barred grid behind the back seats and the end of the boot to deter theft from the storage boot from inside the car. The boot lid was ignition key + button locked with the other doors, and all doors tested for positive lockage. The roller door was activated, and the garage closed, (later inspected by my wife around 9.15pm), the gun safe and ammunition storage all securely locked beforehand

During the night, burglars managed entry into the garage via the

roller door, got into my locked car and stole the firearms listed

above, plus a few other hardware articles from the garage. (I have

firearms, was by then owned by the Lithgow volunteers and today is arguably the only museum in Australia specifically related to firearms and firearms manufacture.

The threat to our existence is now however emerging from another quarter. ADI, who now owns the factory, is about to demolish most of the buildings and redevelop the site for sale. Unfortunately the museum is situated on the prime part of the complex and whilst ADI had previously stated that they wished to evict us they have, for the time being, relented and renewed our lease until 2009.

This however only delays the inevitable. ADI has made it clear that they have fulfilled their commitment to both the museum and the



community and that if we wish to purchase the museum building and land, we will be expected to pay the market value.

The museum, through good management, has already accumulated some funds but to make a realistic offer to ADI, we will need the further support of the community at large.

The museum's members are therefore asking for your assistance to ensure that this important part of Australia's industrial and military history has a permanent home. (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned." The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the
