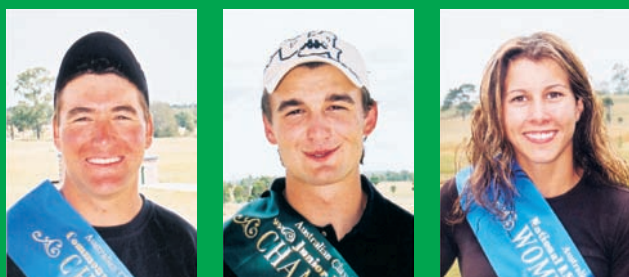
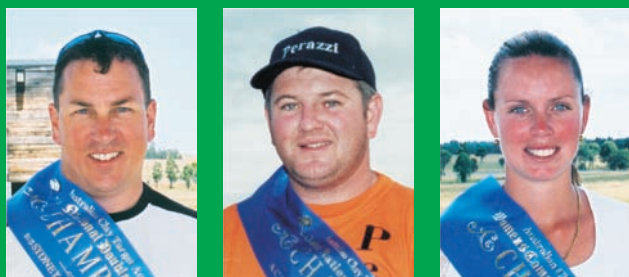

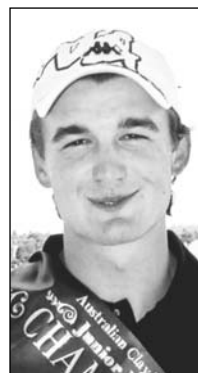

Good Shooting

Commonwealth Games Shooting Venues

Melbourne Gun Club Melbourne International Shooting Club Wellsford Rifle Range.

At a ceremony held at Melbourne Gun Club on 25th May, the Minister for Commonwealth Games, the Hon Justin MLC, officially announced the shooting venues for the Melbourne 2006 Commonwealth Games.

Shotgun

The ceremony was attended by representatives from: Melbourne Gun Club, Melbourne International Shooting Club, Victorian Rifle Association, Victorian Clay Target Association, Sporting Shooters Association (Vic), The Shire of Yarra Ranges, Office of the Commonwealth Games Coordination and Melbourne 2006, who were loud in their applause of the Minister when the announcement was made.

Following the announcement the Minister, while resisting the opportunity to "have a shot", pushed the button when Lauren Mark (Ogilvie) Commonwealth Games Gold medalist 2002, Athens Olympian 2004, gave a demonstration of skeet shooting, which was followed by a demonstration of trap shooting by four times Olympian Russell Mark (1988-1992-1996 (Gold)-2000 (Silver).

As a result of their selection as Commonwealth Games venues, each venue will be the recipient of a legacy from the Commonwealth Games which will make Victoria a focal point for shooting in Australia. An extensive upgrade has already taken place on the full bore range at Bendigo, with major work exceeding \$1.5M which includes the installation of Sius Ascor electronic targets, expected to commence shortly at Melbourne international Shooting Club.

Some minor works are required at Melbourne Gun Club as well as the re roofing of the existing trenches prior to the installation of the latest Matarelli traps. The Shire of Yarra Ranges has already indicated its strong support for Melbourne Gun Club's selection as a Commonwealth Games venue, with the decision to seal over 1km of Victoria Road leading to the Gun Club.

The choice of each of the shooting venues is seen as being ideal for both the sport and the M2006 Organizing Committee, as they are ideally located for the various disciplines and will show case shooting in 2006 in a manner never seen before in Victoria. Each of the venues will also host the 2005 Commonwealth Games Shooting Federation Championships in March 2005 which M2006 will use as a test event for the Commonwealth Games which will take place in March 2006.

With four shooting disciplines, three more events and three venues, the 2006 Commonwealth Games, while not on quite the same scale overall, is a larger sport for shooting than the Olympic Games and will prove to be an exciting time for shooting in 2006.

Brazil World Cup

Americana, May 29th - June 5th 2004

The Melbourne contingent of Greg, Darien and Paul arrived in Auckland where they met up with Tom and George, to continue the trip on Lan Chile airlines together to Santiago in Chile. From there we flew to Sao Paulo in Brazil. Brazil has a land mass greater than that of Australia and Sao Paulo with its population of some 20 million ranks around fourth in the world's largest cities.

On arrival and clearing customs with the firearms we boarded a bus for the two hour trip to Campinas, the small town of one million where our hotel the Nacional Inn was located. From there it was a daily trip of around forty minutes to the shooting range in Americana.

The range is situated in a gully with the club house perched on the top and overlooking three trap and skeet fields which were superimposed. The traps in use were the Italian made Serenas which have short throwing arms and propel the targets with a higher than normal initial velocity which many shooters are not used to. The prediction was for lower than normal scores to make finals and this fact would be borne out over the following days. The weather was

cooler than expected with nights down around 14 deg and days 18 - 20 deg. The first few days were fine then it became overcast and eventually rained as the tournament progressed.

George had an infected tooth that started to affect him on the training day and after some medical advice, painkillers and antibiotics thought it would start to clear up by the next day which was the first of the competition. The only consolation was that it was on the left side and he was still able to shoot. By the end of that first day it had not gotten any better and by the start of the final comp day it had it fact, become so bad, that we withdrew him from the competition to take him to an emergency dental clinic. There they drilled through the tooth to release the pressure and gave him some strong medication. By the time he returned to the range, his squad had not shot it's first round, so we reinstated him to the comp and he went on to score his best two rounds of the whole event.

Paul struggled with a couple of targets which shook his confidence and this was reflected in his score.

The Italian Di Spigno continues to dominate the world double trap, having won in Athens the month previously. He took a massive 9 target lead into the final shot a 47 in the final to win by 10 targets, a tremendous effort. Tom made his first double trap final and whilst the scores were not great the experience of competing in a final will do his confidence good coming up to the Olympics.

Conditions for the trap event had deteriorated somewhat, which only shows how well Herman shot to record his 121 to lead into the final. He had a shaky final but hung on to beat his team mate, Bade, in a shoot off and win his first world cup. Michael and Adam never felt comfortable in the conditions and their timing and rhythm suffered through not being able to see the targets as quick as they normally do. Shooters are like all athletes, they cannot be expected to perform brilliantly every time they compete. The trick is to be at their peak for the major events on their schedule and that event is the Olympics in August. Read absolutely nothing into those scores, come August both Michael and Adam will be at the top of their game and ready to give it their best shot.

From a results perspective the Brazil world cup was not one of the best we have produced but it gave the team an opportunity to bond together and appreciate the fact that they will all be representing Australia at the Olympic Games in Athens.

Department of Community Development, Sport & Cultural Affairs

RULE CHANGES AS OF JANUARY 1, 2005

The National Executive meeting held in May approved the following rule changes effective 1 January 2005:

RULE 1.01(q)

Delete in full and replace with:-

(q) "Ear and eye protection is compulsory for all ACTA disciplines for all employees, volunteers and competitors whilst present at the firing point or trap area."

RULE 1.01

Add new paragraph (s) at end -

(s) A gun must not be used that will accept more than one gauge of cartridge at the same time and a gun must not be loaded with different gauge ammunition.

RULE 1.22(e)

Delete in full and replace with:-

(e) "Distance - the low target shall be thrown 46 metres (+/- 2 metres) in still air."

RULE 2.01(e)

Delete in full and replace with:-

(e) "Grades shall be: AA 98% and over; A 95% and under 98%; B 88% and under 95%; C under 88%."

RULE 2.01(i)

Add at end of paragraph -

"Once attaining A grade a shooter cannot be regraded to C grade and once attaining AA grade a shooter cannot be regraded to B grade. Other than in the authority vested in Rule 2.4(g)."

RULE 3.01(c)

Delete - "Ties to stand"

RULE 3.15(a)

Delete - "20 metres" and replace with "15 metres "

RULE 3.15(b)

Delete - "20 metres" and replace with "15 metres "

RULE 3.15(c)

Delete - "20 metres" and replace with "15 metres "

RULE 3.15(d)

Delete - "20 metres" and replace with "15 metres "

RULE 3.15(e)

Delete - "20 metres" and replace with "18 metres "

RULE 3.15(k)

Delete - "20 metres" and replace with "15 metres "

RULE 4.03

Add new paragraph (d) at end -

(d) "Trap houses shall be used to give full protection to the trappers. All traphouses constructed after 1st January 2005 shall be 0.8 metres high in the front, tapering or sloping to 0.65 metres at the back and shall be 2 metres from back to front and 2.5 metres wide. A tolerance of 10 centimeters either way is permissible on these dimensions. All height measurements shall be taken from the level of the centre lane. The trap shall be mounted in a manner which will bring the top centre pivot point of the throwing arm 25 centimeters above the level of the centre lane and 0.5 metres from the front of the traphouse and 30 centimeters left of centre. A tolerance of 10 centimeters either side of this dimension is permissible."

RULE 4.11

Add at end of paragraph -

"Automatic traps are compulsory for trap and skeet disciplines from 1st January 2009."

RULE 4.14

Add new paragraph (j) at end -

(j) "All competitors are required to dress in an appropriate manner with the wearing of singlets and thongs/scuffs prohibited. This applies when competing and when they are to be presented with any prize or trophy."

RULE 4.19

Add new paragraph (e) at end -

(e) "Handicap cards must be produced upon request by either Club Management, Zone or State Handicappers, Rules Supervisors, State Associations, National Executive members of the ACTA. In the event of an investigation by any listed parties they have the right to retain the Handicap card for the period of time necessary to undertake the investigation."

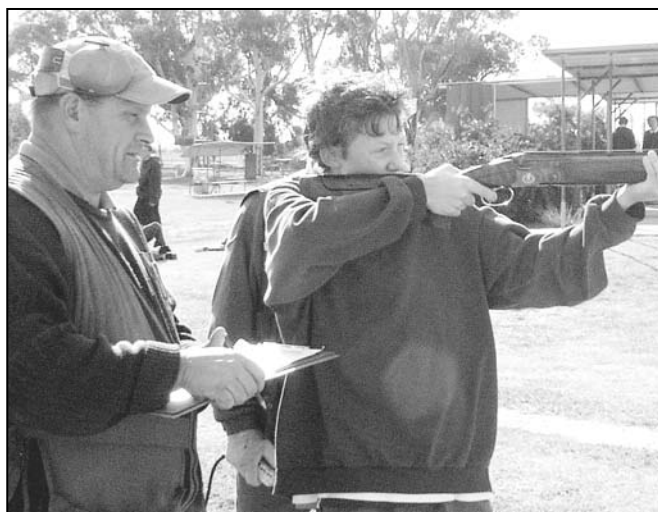
Faced with the task of shooting ten targets, single barrel twice, some good scores were achieved considering that most of the

students had never held a shotgun before.

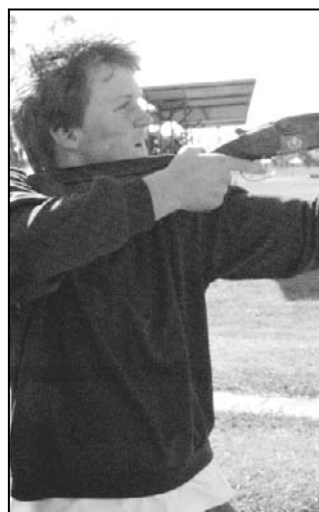

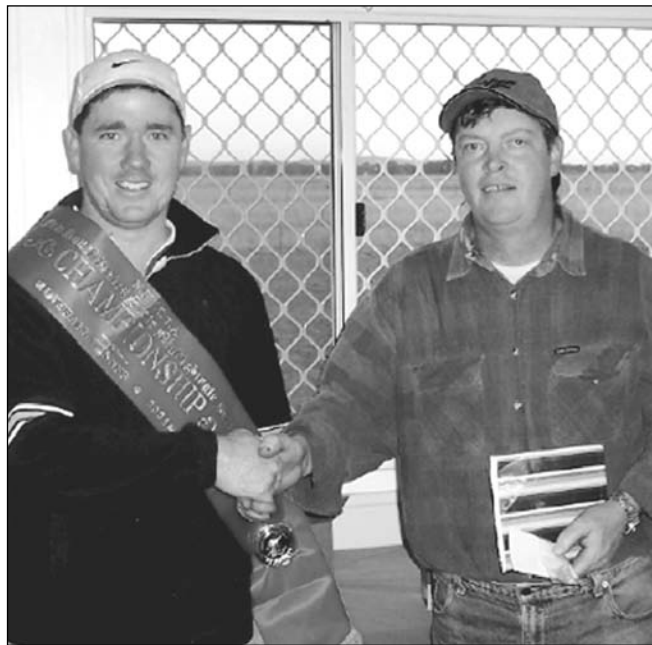

The main question regarding these new sites is not where they are but what about the shooting grounds the ACTA has invested money in?

The National ground at Wagga isn't called the national ground for no reason. Using the Sydney International Shooting Centre is also a wise move considering the centre is 5 years old. I've lived in Adelaide, Melbourne and Albury over the last 2 years. I have gone to the National title events over the last few years from these cities. I accept the travel because I wish to enter in the events. I don't mind going to Perth or Brisbane for competition. But I and other ACTA members would mind the resources of the ACTA being spent at these venues if they won't be used every year. Will there be a levy or ground fee on top of the entry fees to pay for the competition to be held interstate?

For the people that live in other states that have to travel to Wagga or Sydney every year for the Nationals, remember you make that choice. If I want to go to the world DTL titles in New Zealand then I will pay the money and go.

The ACTA doesn't have a bottomless pit of money, it must be spent wisely. If the ACTA puts all their eggs in one basket and builds a national ground with DTL, Skeet & Trench to host these events, then so be it. It will cost less in the future to have one ground then to get other clubs to host it. We will not pretend to be like the commonwealth games and hop all around the country, at our ACTA's expense.

We are a business so not every member will be satisfied where competitions are held.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Outcome or Process

I recently bought a copy of the April 2004 issue of the UK magazine Clay Shooting. I do not normally buy foreign magazines but an article caught my eye as I was reading it in the newsagent, the article was called "Process or outcome?" and was written by Olympic coach and Olympic gold medallist Lanny Bassham and what struck me was the similarity to two articles that I had previously written on goal setting and motivation.

Regular readers of these articles will be aware of my belief that goal setting is an important aspect in any shooter's development because goal setting allows us to have a vehicle by which we can focus our attention and evaluate our performances. Other previous articles looked at motivation and the difference between being either task orientated or ego orientated. To recap the difference is that if you are task or process orientated it implies that you participate in an activity for its own intrinsic properties; the enjoyment of shooting, the way it feels to pull the trigger and smoke the target, etc. On the other hand to be ego or outcome orientated you participate to demonstrate superior ability compared to everyone else.

Bassham sees goal setting as outcome oriented. Whether you are setting realistic goals or big-sky goals you are focusing on your score or whether you will win the competition. He claims that you cannot control what score will win the competition and you cannot control what other competitors will shoot. Focusing on the outcomes leads you to focus on something you cannot control and this will lead to disappointment and failure. If however you concentrate on the process you are focusing on those things that are within your control; the competitions you enter, the disciplines you shoot, your training methods both physical and mental, and your coach. Bassham advises that "only set goals on the things YOU can control. Keep your focus on you, not your competitors. Rehearse in your mind the process of executing a combination of moves that breaks targets. You cannot break more targets than you have shells in the gun. Your year is determined more by how well you can control just two shots than all the worrying about outcome."

Setting goals is still important if you want to move up a grade or make a particular team but the goal should focus on the process of attaining the goal and not just the goal itself. It is important here

to look at the difference between attainment and accomplishment because they are not the same thing. According to Bassham, accomplishment is about outcome. It is the score, the colour of the sash or the trophy. What it does not measure is you have learned about your growth as a shooter. It doesn't measure who you have become. Attainment is the total of accomplishment and becoming. Bassham believes that shooting is more than just a way to measure outcomes; it also reflects the person we have become. How we compete on the field and in life in general. Therefore attainment, consisting of becoming something should be our goal - not simply the accomplishment. You do this by setting goals for what you want to accomplish and who you wish to become in the process. It is important here to realise that that you should not equate your worth as a person with whether you reach your goals or not.

Bassham concludes by giving three pieces of advice. Firstly, for most of us shooting is a sport and a game. It is not life or death and it should be fun. Our shooting shouldn't do anything to add stress to our lives or increase our blood pressure. Secondly, if you are going to set goals have others ready if you attain the one you're currently seeking. It is not unusual for athletes to feel depressed and flat upon achieving a highly sought after goal. You will need to have other goals ready. Edmund Hillary was asked after he climbed Mt Everest what he was going to do now that he had climbed the world's tallest mountain. He looked at the reporter and pointed to another mountain and said "I haven't climbed that one." Finally, set your goals over a longer period than just one year. This will take the pressure off performing well this year and really it doesn't matter when you achieve your goal the important thing is that you did achieve it.

Over the years I have seen many good shooters come and go and the reason people often leave a sport is because they continually focus on the outcome with their beliefs about their own self-worth being tied to what they can accomplish. If you enjoy the sport then look at who you are becoming not just what you can take home from the trophy table.

Event Three, A 15 Target Double Barrel Championship with first, second and third placings on offer.

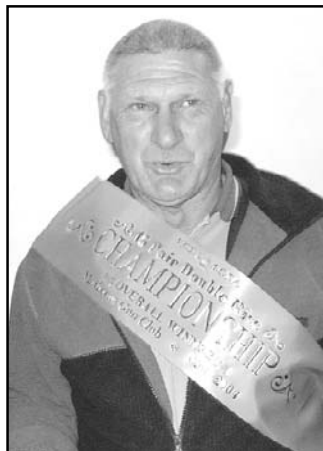

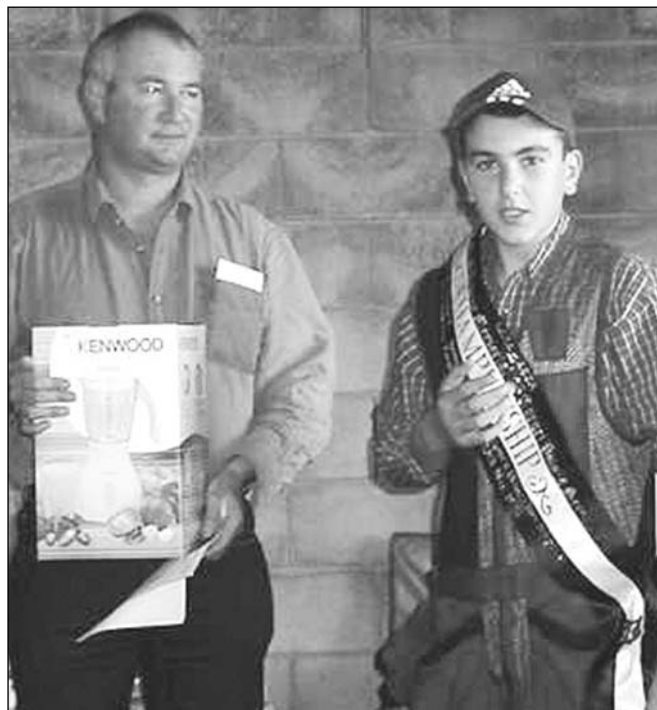

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

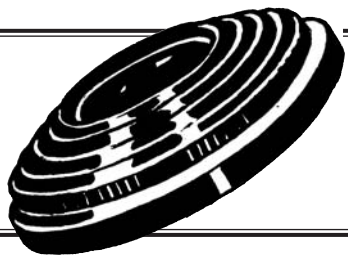
