# World Cup **Final 2004** Slovenia

Coach: Greg Chan Trap: Adam Vella, Suzy Balogh, Stacy Roiall Double Trap: Tom Turner. Suzv Balogh.

Outside of the Olympics, and the World Championships, the World Cup final is the most prestigious tournament on the ISSF shooting calendar.

It is held every year and is an invitation only event that brings together the world's top 12 shooters in each of the three Olympic clay target disciplines. The twelve contestants are made up of the defending champion, the three Olympic medallists (in the Olympic year) and the top 8 shooters from the World Cup series for 2004.

This year we had a record number of shooters qualify which is a good indication of the shape Australian clay target shooting is in. Others to qualify but unable to attend were Michael Diamond, Susie Trindall, Steve Haberman and Lauryn Mark.

The team travelled for 28 odd hours via Singapore to Frankfurt then on to Ljubljana in Slovenia, then just to top it off, a two hour bus trip to our final destination of Maribor in the west of the country.



World Cup Team

Slovenia is a very small country of some two million people nestled between Italy, Austria, Hungary and Croatia. It was a part of the old Yugoslavia and as you would expect of eastern Europe, is very mountainous. The area is famous for it's wine and honey and during winter is a popular destination for skiing. Our hotel was in fact a ski resort with ski slopes and chair lifts right outside the door.

The shooting range is privately owned, with 3 trap layouts and 4 skeet ranges, all equipped with Mattarelli machines. Next year it will be expanded to 6 trap and skeet ranges for the European Championships, then to 8 ranges in 2007 for a world cup. There are two clubhouses, an original small one and a very large new one

just being completed when we arrived. The grounds were beautifully maintained and one look at the background of grass, green meshing and trees indicated that scores would be fairly high, weather conditions not withstanding.

The weather on arrival was perfect at around 23 degrees, but as is normal, deteriorated to cold, rainy windy 14 degrees when competition started.

A tremendous effort by Suzy to shoot her personal best of 72 in qualifying. Unfortunately a sub standard final relegated her to a shoot off for the silver which was won by the Chinese shooter Gao. Stefecekova the Slovakin shot a tremendous 24 in the final to clinch the gold. A bronze at the world cup final against this class of competition is a fantastic achievement and showed that Suzy was able to maintain her Olympic form and well and truly deserving of the number one world ranking she currently holds. While Stacy was disappointed with her result she can be proud of her achievements this year in winning a world cup and qualifying for this event in her first year on the circuit. We all know what she is capable of and with the international competition she has experienced this year will be one of the top women over the next few years.

What a superb effort by Adam to win in this field! His 122 in qualifying made light of the unpleasant conditions but an ordinary 22 in the final pitted him up against the Olympic gold medallist Alipov for the gold. Alipov drew the favoured number one shoot off position and they went shot for shot until Alipov missed his third to give Adam a much deserved win. An Olympic bronze, now a world cup final championship, truly an amazing year for one of the best trap shooters in the world. The bronze was won by the Italian Pellielo the Olympic silver medallist, which confirms why these three are at the top of the current world ranking's.

Conditions for the double trap had deteriorated even further making the targets difficult to break. Scores were lower than expected as most struggled to cope with it. Suzy never found her timing, which is so important in doubles while the winner Li of China managed a good final to come from behind and overtake Hansen of Sweden, with the Olympic silver medallist Lee of Korea taking third place.

The Italian Innocenti defied the conditions to shoot a fantastic 140 in qualifying and a respectable 45 in the final to win by a comfortable 6 targets. Eller of the USA had a great final of 47 after a low qualifier to snatch the silver from the Italian Di Spigno. Tommy battled all day and shot consistently to miss the final by 3 targets.

We had a record number of shooters qualify for the world cup final which is an indication of how well the team has done this year and it augers well for the Commonwealth Games in 2006 then on to Beijing in 2008.

Day 5 what an interesting day this turned out to be. We found out Glen and won A class Singles from 2 days ago with 250/250 as well as A class Preliminary High Gun, if anyone thinks that is not that big of a deal that is OK but he ended up 15th Overall in the High Gun and I personally think that is a pretty fair effort for his first lash in the States.

Day 9. 200 Singles Class Championship, Glen Shoots a 197/200, John Crompton 199/200, Lynne 196/200, Laurie 192/200, Simon 197/200 and I managed to scrape through and shoot a possible. Old Pete whot a 199/200. I was informed I should be at the sign up desk at 8.00pm for a 9.00pm shoot off - 57 possibles out of 3,550 shooters 17 of which were in my class "AA".

To make a long story short, I felt good and just wanted to stay there as long as I could and "see what happens", quite a lot dropped out early including the "AAA" graders and I missed my 24th target, the disappointing thing was my sight picture looked good and I thought it should have broke, never mind still had a good

experience. The guy who won it shot 550 straight which I reckon is pretty good going.

Harold Loper, one of the local gentlemen who look after us each time we come to the States tells me Lynne and I are no in "AAA", the strange thing is I have won stuff all, yet Glen is giving it to them in A class and hasn't been re-classified - such is life.

Before the shoot off at 6.30 there was an exhibition by a Muzzle Loading Association, this was reel good fun and our association could learn a lot from the yanks in how to have some fun after the shoot and having people join in and stay at the club.

Day 10 100 Doubles, Simon 97/100, Glen 97/100, Lynne 95/100, Laurie 92/100 and myself 97/100, not enough! 100 Handicap, Lynne has his first miss at number 50, Simon dropped his 47th and Glen at 24, I dropped everywhere.

Glens second miss was at 96, a very costly target.

I ended up on 94/100 and Lynne on 95/100, Simon and Laurie let a few breeders land. At the end of the event there was one 100/100, ten 99/100 and twenty five 98/100.

What I witnessed that night at the shoot off which Glen was in was something I will never forget and something he should be very proud of.

Most of the big names were there, Leo Harrison, Ray Stafford, Harlon Campbell etc. Glen shot 25/25 in the first bracket, this meant there was only five left in the shoot off. His second bracket he let one land but so did everyone else. His last bracket he nuked the 25 and everyone else missed at least two targets there was quite a few asking who was the little stocky bloke from down under? Glen was presented with his 27 yard pin - top job!

Day 11 the Clay Target Championship of America. 200 16 yard Singles. I missed three targets in the first 20 or so, had the concentration span of a grasshopper! Great shooting especially when you are on the back fence.

Finished shooting at 1.00pm so off to the Air force Museum and some more shopping. This museum is an absolute beaut, although I have been there before you really leave yourself a full day to have a real good look about.

For our evening meal we went to the Rib House in Vandalia with Peter and Jackie and Harold and Pat Loper and just to say thank you to them both for their wonderful hospitality, they really are a great couple.

It should be mentioned what a great help Ray and Pat Mack have been to us whilst we have been at the Grand.

Day 14. The big one, The Grand American Handicap, once again we are down in the boondocks targets were little bit higher but looked good. I shot 77/100 yes this is not a misprint, I tried all sorts of things and it just got worse, but you get that on the big jobs, there is always another shoot somewhere where I hope I might get lucky even it is a small one.

Glen shot 92/100, Simon 90/100, Lynne and Laurie low 80's.

Not what we wanted but anyone who has been at the Grand would appreciate how hard it is to win anything.

We take Lynne and Laurie to the airport at 3.30 for a departure at 5.30pm, I expect Laurie will be hit for excess baggage as he has bought up for his wife Julie and kids like I have never seen before, a very generous bloke.

Day 15. Last day - back to Pro Bass in Cincinatti as Glen needed more fishing gear and I bought more things for Hun and the kids. In the afternoon we just relaxed at Pete's as we new we were in for a long trip to get back to Oz.

On the big leg of the trip home (L.A. to Sydney) I drew the crow again, I had a bone head next to me who had the light on for 12 hours reading some stupid book on the similarities between humans and chimpanzees.

## **Psychological Skills for Shooting**

#### SUPERSTITIOUS SCHEDULING

There are several schools of thought in psychology; I often joke at work that if you put six psychologists in a room you'll come up with seven opinions and each school of thought is designed to explain human nature. Common theoretical frameworks include psychoanalytical (Freudian), behavioural, cognitive-behavioural, Gestalt, Existential and so on.

Behavioural learning theory argues that we learn to do something if we are reinforced. The most well known example of this was Pavlov and his experiments with dogs. He noticed that when he went to feed his dogs they salivated. So he then rang a bell every time he fed them and the dogs learnt to associate the bell with food. Soon the dogs would salivate at the sound of the bell even though no food had been presented. If the experience is pleasurable then the reinforcement is called a reward and we will be more likely to do what is expected of us again. If the experience is not pleasurable then the reinforcement is called a punishment and it is hoped that we will not do that particular behaviour again. If we get reinforced for a particular behaviour then we will most likely do it again. Take for example a poker machine: the machine is programmed so that it gives intermittent reinforcements so as to keep the player hooked. Sometimes the reward will be in the form of a jackpot and some times it will only be a token amount; what is important is that the punter knows that soon he will be rewarded in some way so keeps playing the machine. If you go to a particular gun club and you shot well then you'll probably go back to try and repeat the performance. If you shoot poorly, you may be reluctant to go back there.

Superstitious scheduling involves believing that something will happen (usually an unpleasant experience) based on something that happened before even if there is no rational or logical explanation. A good example of this is; you go out to a new restaurant and you order the prawns. Later that night you are violently ill with food poisoning. This experience will mean that you will be unlikely to go back to that restaurant again and if you do you will definitely not order the prawns.

Superstitious scheduling is very important in sport and especially shooting. Some people will refuse to play their sport if they are not wearing their lucky charm or favourite earmuffs or if they have to change something that they consider important. The trouble with superstition is that it clouds your ability. If you worry because you're not using you regular brand of shells, or the targets are black when you prefer fluro, then you will start focusing on those things that are different and not the target. This will lead to doubt and as I have said before when we experience doubt we tense up. When we tense up, our muscles lose the fluidity they need to perform well. We focus on the past or the future and forget about what we are doing at the present. We make mistakes and miss. And because you might attribute your failure to some outside variable it is easy to develop a belief that "I can't shoot well over these traps" or "I never shoot well at .....". This doubt becomes a selffulfilling prophecy and until the irrational belief that is fuelling the superstition is challenged it is likely that you will be right and that you will never succeed.

The reason that I mention this is that at the NSWCTA AGM there was some debate by a couple of shooters about the traps at the National Ground. For whatever reason, these shooters believed that it would be impossible to shoot "good scores" with the current traps. These shooters believed that the traps should be replaced because in their opinion a better product was available. Unfortunately for these shooters the results of the double barrel didn't support their argument, because at the conclusion of the double barrel, 5 shooters had shot over 550 each and the only thing stopping any of these shooters going on to shoot a state record was that we run out of time. There were 72 possibles in the double barrel and to get into the state team you had to shoot off for the last four places if you were three points down. Brian Manns from Cobar shot over 650 and I'm sure that if time was on his side he would have kept going. Given their criticism of the traps and the outstanding scores achieved at both the Nationals and the State Carnival, I'm at a loss to understand what a "good score" (by their criteria) is. As I stated in an article after the Nationals human beings are able to discriminate things that are the same and targets are recognised as targets. But whether an individual shooter can discriminate further than that, I am not convinced.

If you believe you can't shoot over the traps at the National Ground then you will probably not be disappointed because your irrational beliefs will cause you to doubt your ability and you will tense up and become anxious, lose concentration and you will miss. You will miss because you will believe this to be certain; it is not because of the traps or the targets. I often say that every target is missed by 6 inches; the distance from one ear to the other. But if you believe that you can shoot well regardless of the trap, the targets, the weather and the location, then you will be able to maintain your concentration, focus on the target and the process of shooting them, stay in the here and now, and maintain fluid and loose muscles, then you will shoot well.

Watching the last stages of the double barrel shoot off it was apparent that all the shooters were focusing on the process of shooting the targets. They all appeared relaxed and the targets seemed to break with effortless ease. These shooters were not going to let irrational belief or thoughts get in their way. They all wanted to win and performed accordingly. Maybe we should just focus on the target and not worry about what type of machine is in the trap house; for most shooters, it is none of our business. The reason we go to a shoot is to do just that, shoot. It is a disappointment that we can allow our beliefs to hamper our ability when we should be enjoying our sport.

#### Dear Sir,

We have just completed the NSW Trap Championships held at the National Grounds on 1st - 4th October and I wish to put the following points before ACTA Members.

1. The Shoot Marshal is to be congratulated on the smooth, competent & friendly running of all Events.

2. The Trap Mechanics and Target setters did a terrific job to give us great and consistent targets - see below.

3. The above two points resulted in a Carnival where there were numerous possibles in the 50 tgt SB, heaps of possibles in the 50 tgt DB and plenty of possibles in the 50 tgt PS Events with the DB shoot off going well over 600 before they moved into pointscore to resolve the Event. Even with the event resolved there were still 4 or 5 shooters still clean on targets. That is GREAT shooting at a GREAT Event.

4. Now even with scores like those, there were a very few shooters, often operating in complete squads, who complained about the targets and there rests a couple of my problems with their activities as set out in the following:

I am sick and tired of hearing either Sales Representatives or Agents of alternative Trap Suppliers trying to sow the seeds of discontent amongst competitors by unfounded criticism of the targets that are thrown at this State Title or at the Nationals.

I have no problem with commercial competition between trap suppliers and that is to be encouraged, however for it to proceed in the underhanded way it is at present is sowing discontent in a manner that verges on conduct that is prejudicial to the sport.

This is done without those people declaring that they have a commercial interest in denigrating the existing equipment at the National Grounds and is often done through their squad-mates or cohorts, again, without declaring a commercial interest.

This type of behaviour appears to be a modus operandi of some in the Trap Supply business as the same approach was taken a year or 2 ago in the USA on trapshooters.com before the accusations were retracted by the agent of one of the trap suppliers.

What we had at the NSW Titles was an agent of an alternative Trap Supplier whingeing about the targets that were coming off the Gemini Traps and when his squad shot a 299/300 in the 50 tgt DB, his response was that the only way that was possible was that the targets were being "lolly-popped" to 40 metres and were landing short of the peg. As no lane 3 straight-away target had been missed to see if this was a fact, the Referee then threw several targets to demonstrate that they had been set, and were landing, absolutely correctly.

One of our veteran shooters who also has a set against the existing traps was loud in his criticism of the angles being thrown on his

I have nothing against targets being questioned if they are incorrect, but what we appear to have at present is an orchestrated attempt by commercial interests to discredit existing equipment without justification through a campaign of persistent bitching, sniping, whingeing and moaning so if ACTA members experience this on the grounds or even at a State Meeting, just have a look into the background and see where the money might flow if they are successful in weaseling a change.

And what they are winging about is a system of Gemini Traps and Corsivia Targets in the trap-houses at the National Grounds that gave us even and consistent targets, and almost record good scores in all events at the NSW Championships, as set out above.

From memory, the scores were also pretty good at the Nationals on those grounds earlier this year.

To be fair in all this, I need to declare that I have known Ludwig Kohler for about 20 years and in that time we have been friends, but we have also had "words" at times. I have no commercial interest in Gemini Traps or in anything to do with his businesses. While I am at it, a couple of other Rule and Shooter behaviour issues came up at those Championships:

1. Kevin Perkins and I refereed and scored a full Squad of mates, or business associates, where there were more hands going up than at a Kindergarten News Day. Various squad members were spotting chips for their mates, when neither Kevin nor I could see anything come off the target on each occasion. We disallowed all of these and several squad members had another go at us in the break after the 1st 25 targets. I would suggest that if that Squad had been refereed by a couple of C Graders who might have been more easily intimidated, rather than two AA Graders who were prepared to stand their ground, some scores would have been 1 or 2 higher.

2. What is also appears to be occurring more and more are that spectator shooters are walking forward onto the lanes to check scores of those in a Squad while it is shooting. In some cases this involves competitors who want to see how their arch-rival is going. In this latter category, some even use the tactic of standing beside the scorers for a long time to make sure that their arch-rival is affected to the maximum degree.

I urge the ACTA to have a look into all of these practices, which are poor behaviour at best, and cheating at worst.

### A Club Reborn

It is not often that we hear of a Gun Club opening (in this case

Reopening). The Dysart Gun Club in Central Queensland is located next to a railway line. In 1998 the Gun Club approached the Queensland Rail (QR) for firing rights over the rail corridor, which was 183 metres from the 11 metre mark. QR refused and asked the club to stop shooting. This was yet another casualty of the gun law shake up and things did not look good for the club.

The interesting thing was that the Gun club existed before the railway line and the railways opted to build the line through the Gun clubs safety zone.

I was nominated to pursue this matter on behalf of the club. Now as you can imagine, I could rave on here for hours, as this story could probably be a best seller. I dealt with the QR hierarchy, local member, native title, surveyors, land clearing, stock route, council, Ergon Energy, earthmover, concreter, builder, electrician and the weapons branch. Out of this came three very important things to remember, never throw any paper work away. If laying concrete ALWAYS write the date in it and if you want it done, do it yourself!

On 6th February 2005, the Dysart Gun club will hold its opening shoot. We have a new clubhouse and one DTL trap is finished and the second one will be completed by February. NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless: (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations". The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
