With only a slight breeze, and clear conditions, the shooters posted some very good scores, particularly Gordon Fletcher who only dropped one point, to collect Overall and AA in the first event. Veteran Echuca member, Barry Rogers shot the Pointscore leg clean, to collect B Grade with a 131/145, and the congratulations of all the Echuca members for a fine performance.

The Skeet was a complete sweep by Echuca members. Craig Scott took A Grade on a 24/25, Murray Roberts B Grade on the same score of 24/25, and C Grade, club President Ron Traill posting a 23/25 score.

It was surprising the local members did shoot so well, as most have been devoting a lot of their time and energy in the last few weeks helping to prepare the Echuca grounds for the Victorian State Carnival, which should see approximately 250 to 300 shooters and most of their families move into Echuca for 3 to 4 days.


Kevin Perkins

He has always lived around the Illawarra area. Kevin is well known in all disciplines of Clay Target shooting. His down the line achievements include:

NSW Postal Team 1982 & 1990; NSW Shoulder to Shoulder Team 1983 & 1991, NSW Team High Gun 1983 & 1991; NSW Champion of Champions 2nd 2002. Australian Titles Winner Single Barrel 1990; Overall Trap High Gun 1990. Runner Up Double Barrel 1972; Single Barrel 1983; Double Rise 1985; Double Rise 1993. 1983 1985 1990 1991 1993 1994. Australian International Teams 1982. Kevin's Career Highlight was winning the National Single Barrel Championship in 1990, after being runner up three times previously. Pud Burgess had explained to him years before that he needed to do his apprenticeship before he could take out the winners trophy. Kevin said the celebration of the win started with a quick 9 schooners then a couple of hours break, and he then continued celebrating on late into the night. The next day Kevin courageously made it out to shoot the Pointscore event although feeling quite under the weather. He took out the National High Gun beating Doug Smith by one.

Michael Diamond OAM

Born 20th May 1972. He started shooting at the age of 8. Michael won his first national open title in 1987 the year he turned 15. Over the next 13 years, Michael collected another 9 National titles and 7 state titles. He has also been National runner up 4 times. In March 1994, Michael set the World Down the Line Break record of

2048 at Belfast Gun Club in New Zealand. During his shooting career he has also won numerous other sporting and community awards including shooter of the year on numerous occasions. He was named Australian Sports Junior Male Athlete of the Year in 1988 and 1989, and was awarded an OAM for service to our sport in 1997. Shooters from around Australia and New Zealand again came to the National Shooting Ground in Wagga Wagga to renew old friendships and enjoy the annual National Skeet Carnival.

NATIONAL 20 GAUGE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The first event for the national carnival saw 66 competitors line up for the National 20 gauge Championship. At the end of qualification three shooters stood alone with a perfect score of 100/100 with the shooters now taking to the field to determine a winner. 16 targets later Gil Farish claimed victory from Laurie Sceresini with Jamie Cameron in third place on a score of 111/112. Gil received the Royal Blue Sash, Silver Australia Badge and John

Withers Memorial Trophy.







Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

Social Learning Theory and Clay Target Shooting

In my last article I touched on learning and briefly mentioned behavioural approaches to learning. For example, classical conditioning with Pavlov's dogs and operant conditioning with the example of poker machines. Other theories of learning take into account our cognitions or thinking. Social learning theory emphasises the interaction between behaviour and environment. The reason why I mention this is because from a sport s perspective we can use social learning theory to help us promote our sport. On the last weekend of October, Downside Clay Target Club that operates from the National Shooting Ground at Wagga held its once a year "come and try" promotional day. Wagga Wagga has a population of about 60,000 people and even though Wagga Gun Club held a promotion day in August, another 85 people turned up to try clay target shooting. What thoughts, feelings and actions were happening for those people who had never fired a shotzun?

Now it's been a long time since I fired my first shot at a clay target, so I have no idea what it must have been like for those people who turned up. However in the same week, I was lent a kayak by a friend because I said I should use the river to help me keep fit. I live at Narrandera and have Murrumbidgee River frontage so it seems reasonable that I should use the river to help me exercise in a low impact way; I don't like running and it's hard to cycle over the corrugated road. So whilst I was excited about hitting the water, once on the river, which was high and flowing fast, I suddenly realised that I knew very little about kayaking and this boat was extremely unstable. I paddled and paddled and probably went about 50 metres, continually trying to focus on keeping myself above the water. To be honest I found the first attempt scary; I was out of my comfort zone, I didn't feel confident or competent and I realised that there was some risk involved.

In the twenty first century we've made our lives comfortable and have taken out most of the risks (other than getting in a car each day) so for the people; children, mothers and dads that turned up at Downside Gun Club having a loaded gun in their hands made the participants feel excited. In a safe and controlled environment, the newcomers were able to do something exciting and thrilling because it has an element of danger. At the same time they were trying something new and learning. Hopefully they were having fun. As one of the coaches I was ever vigilant regarding safety and making sure that the participants actually hit some targets. Now this is where the club cheated a bit: the targets were backed off, they were going the standard height but only about 35 metres. The traps were set on straight-a-way targets and the shells being used were RIO subsonics. These shells, because of their low speeds, pattern well and have practically no perceived recoil and are relatively quiet. My group of about 15, I'll call them new shooters, went through a full case of shells, 500, in the three sessions, broken only by lunch and afternoon tea.

Everyone in the group hit some targets; some hit most and some only a few. Each broken target represented a real expression of joy and achievement. The American, Psychiatrist William Glasser believes that to learn something it must be fun. I have mentioned before that Glasser believes that for humans to be well adjusted they need to have a sense of belonging, acceptance and approval, freedom to make decisions and fun. As clubs or associations trying to promote our sport we should look at how we can best use social learning type theories to maximise getting people involved in our sport and providing the best possible result for those trying it out.

Downside, whether they planned it or not, did all the right things. What Downside Clay Target Club did, as Wagga Gun Club did previously, was to combine the opportunity to come and try shooting with a promotion in the local shopping centre, handouts and personal invitations, radio commentaries, newspaper articles and television advertising. Having the National Ground at Wagga has been an advantage but both clubs have successfully used the services of a local ABC presenter (the father of a new shooter) to help lift the media profile of our sport. Coupled with this, the New South Wales Clay Target Association, contracted a local experienced journalist and media presenter to visit the National Ground to talk with some of the executive and develop a media plan that the association and clubs can use to lift their profile of the sport and local sports people. The media will not come to us and ask for stories; each association, zone and club has to be proactive in getting our story out to them. The starting point is the local area media and all clubs should be making sure their shoot reports, together with photos if possible, get into the local paper and that readers expect to read something about our sport each week.

So with the background work complete, the clubs then made sure people were welcomed. Everyone was greeted and introduced to others. Name tags were a must and after being welcomed by the president they were introduced to the coaches, given a quick basic lecture on safety and gun-handling and then sent off to the traps.

What these people went away with, after one day of shooting was incredible.

Firstly, they had attempted something new. Something that had an element of danger, thrill and was difficult. Secondly, they realised that those stories about shotguns and shotgun shells were basically myths as no one was laid on their back by the recoil and even the smallest of participants were able to pick up the gun and have a go. Thirdly, these 85 people went away with a different perception about guns, gun owners and shooting. We were able to paint a picture in their minds that was not sensational or negative. Next, these people saw trap shooting as a skilful and difficult sport. Finally, it gave them those aspects that are important for human beings; a sense of belonging, acceptance and approval, freedom to try something new and different, and fun. The next time they try to shoot the task will be easier, just like my ability to kayak has gotten easier with each day.

There's a part of our brain that controls motor movements and has a motor memory. What this means is that once we have learnt how to ride a bike we never forget. It's the same with snow skiing, water skiing, golf, shooting etc. So it doesn't matter if these people come back next month or if they leave it for some years the next time they pick up a shotgun their muscles will remember what do.

The participants on this day were made to feel welcome and valued. They were treated with respect and dignity. They were fed and were given ample opportunity to have a go.

And their interest will be followed up to get them to become members of the clubs involved.

Every NSW club can have one promotion day each year (I'm not sure of the other states). If the day offers good coaching in a safe environment, with food and overwhelming hospitality, coupled with extensive media coverage and the involvement of a well known shooter, then we should be able increase the participation in our sport.

North West Zone Carnival — Jeparit Gun Club

The North West Zone carnival was held at the Jeparit gun club on the 17/10/04 on a fine sunny day, with four layouts operating to conduct the four-event program.

There were sixty-seven shooters competing for the Grade High Guns of \$100.00 and the Overall High Gun of \$500.00.

The first event on the program was a 25 target Handicap with five possibles lining up for the shoot off which was won by Marc





TRAVELLING WITH A FIREARM INTERSTATE

- * Contact the airline involved and explain your situation
- * Ask to speak to the person who handles the 'Dangerous Goods Compliance'
- * If travelling with Qantas ring Laurie Willoughby on 02 9691 8463
- * You will be required to fax or email a request including:
- 1. Flight details (booking reference)
- 2. Details of the firearm/s you wish to transport
- 3. The amount of ammunition you wish to take

The conditions for approval are that:

- * The firearm is securely boxed
- * The ammunition is in the original or equivalent packaging
- * The total weight of the ammunition does not exceed 5kg.

These items must be checked at the baggage counter and can not be carried on to the plane. It is also a requirement that you do not have any markings on your case or baggage that would draw attention to the contents.

On the day of travel, you present the approval with your luggage at check-in. A special baggage tag is attached to your gun case that incorporates a declaration that you sign stating that:

- * The firearm is unloaded and securely packed
- * No ammunition is packed within the firearm package
- * The separately packed ammunition weighs less than 5kg
- * The carrier (airline) has provided approval for its transport.

By signing the tag you also indemnify the carrier for all loss incurred as a result of non-compliance with the above conditions. After you have signed you are given a copy, which has a normal bar-coded baggage tag for collection at the other end. You may then be requested to take the firearm and ammunition to the bulky items counter for carriage to the plane.

On arrival at your destination it is requested that you collect your gun case from the baggage services desk which is normally located in the same hall as the baggage carousel. You present your baggage tag as proof of ownership and collect the case/s.

Always collect your normal luggage first, as there have been instances where firearms have been put on the carousal with the other luggage.

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations." The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.






