PRESIDENTS ANNUAL REPORT 2004



It is with pleasure I bring to you my 2004 Annual Report, my second as President of the Australian Clay Target Association.

2004 saw our Association produce gold medals in Olympic and World DTL competition. National championship standards are first class and with a modest financial surplus our net assets now total in excess of 1.3 million. This gives us a very strong base for 2005.

These results are only achieved with the help of each and every member, in particular the clubs' volunteer workers' who help to keep the Association going. I congratulate you all and look forward to your continuing help.

During the year we experienced some staff changes with Tina Hoban returning from maternity leave and Maureen Ryan joining the ACTA in the receptionist/typist position. To Andy and all staff another great effort.

Many hours of tireless work is put in by our National Executive members to ensure the best for all. During the year we experienced several changes within our National Executive and I would like to extend sincere gratitude on behalf of our members and the National Executive, to Mark McInnes (NSW) Peter Field (Qld) and Nanette McCallum (Tas) for their service to the ACTA. Similarity, I welcome their replacements to the Executive in Mr. Daryl Pasfield (NSW), Mr. John Mack (Qld) and Mr. George Pinner (Tas).

Our membership numbers have shown an increase for the second year running. This trend is continuing and it is hoped that new shooters, old friends rejoining and our current members will be able to continue to enjoy this sport for many years to come.

Our international representatives have continued to display the form we have become accustomed to. Suzy Balogh's Gold Medal effort at the Athens Olympics was no doubt the highlight of the year. Adam Vella is also to be congratulated for his Bronze medal and World Cup Final wins. The remainder of the ISSF teams also producing world class results at the various World Cups throughout the year.

Our World DTL team that travelled to England was also successful with Brendan Burgess achieving Junior World Champion status. Ray Collinson shot extremely well to be placed 3rd overall. Our teams also placed well with the Veterans and Juniors team placing first in their respective sections and taking out the Gold medal. The Open team placed third and took the Bronze medal with only a few points behind the eventual winners. This is a reminder to everyone of the highest standards our representatives continue to achieve.

Our National Championships numbers continue to grow and scores obtained in all disciplines are first class. The introduction of new grading percentages is causing some concerns and you should talk to your state delegates should you wish to have your voice heard.

2004 saw the introduction of the ACTA Hall of Fame and the first inductees. We were delighted to induct Mr. Fred Burns (posthumously) Mr. Newton Thomas (posthumously), Mr. Jake Blake, Mr. Warren Charlton and Mr. Doug Smith at a gala dinner where some 290 members attended. Russell and Brian Mark entertained the members during the evening and I extend my thanks for their efforts.

The Hall of Fame has been established largely due to the effort of Mr. Mark McInness (NSW) for which I thank him on your behalf. It is the intention of the Executive to establish a purpose built Hall of Fame building in or around the National Office site as a permanent tribute to our high achievers.

I am an enthusiastic supporter of junior development for the future well being of our Association. To this end all three camps conducted in 2004 were well supported by juniors and their families. We were able to secure the services of Russell and Lauryn Mark as head coaches who together with the established staff make these camps a delight to attend. I am reminded of Russell's comment to me when approached to help. "I will do anything for juniors". Words we could all do well to follow.

Development on the National Shooting Ground continues to progress, as funds become available. All 15 DTL and 9 skeet layouts are in the process of being re built and re-fitted ready for the 2006 World & National Championships.

The possibility of a major sponsorship agreement between the Association and one of our sport specific businesses is presently being discussed. I look forward to an announcement as soon as the agreement is in place.

Whilst I understand not all shooters are in favour of the National Shooting Ground the decision has been taken and I therefore urge you all to lend your support towards the future of our sport. My thanks to Fred Rapley and Dave Jocelyn for their effort in the re construction work.

I have endeavoured to keep you all informed of the continuing saga of the Australian Shooting Association constitution. Various discussions have taken place throughout 2004 between the major Affiliates and the Australian Sports Commission. Several constitutions have been suggested and finally a new draft constitution was produced in December 2004. This document names the "First Full Members", one of which is the ACTA, together with 5 others. There is to be six directors together with one ASA Athletes Committee nominee. You will be informed when an agreement is reached. My thanks to Elaine and Glen for their help and advise in this matter.

Insurance continues to be a matter of concern. Costs continue to be high at \$150,000 per annum. However, these costs have stabilised somewhat in the last 2 years. Insurance is an essential part of our sport at ACTA, State and Club level. The ACTA will continue to bring our members the most cost-effective insurance available.

In conclusion, I am confident our Association is well positioned to grow and move forward. With each and every members support we will continue to be the premier shooting association in Australia.

AUSTRALIAN YOUTH OLYMPIC FESTIVAL Sydney Jan 19 - 23, 2005

The Youth Olympics is conducted every two years in Sydney and is the Australian Olympic Committee's contribution to the development of youth in sport. 14 Olympic sports are contested and for the first time shooting was included in the program.

The idea is to give young athletes the opportunity to experience a mini Olympics with all facets of the real thing.

The athletes were all accommodated in a village with athletes from different sports, with meals in a common dining area, sharing all facilities and replicating what happens at the Olympics.

ATTENTION SHOOTERS

On 1 January Rule 2.01(i) was amended to include the following wording:

"Once obtaining A grade a shooter cannot be regraded to C grade and once obtaining AA grade a shooter cannot be regraded to B."

Rule 2.04(g) states the following:

"Club Management, Rules Supervisors, State, Zone Handicappers or a member of the ACTA Executive Committee have the right to re-handicap or re-grade any obviously under-handicapped or over-handicapped, under-graded or over-graded shooter immediately. The Association is to be notified within 14 day with the reason given on a handicap return form."

SPORT SCIENCE

Providing our athletes with a competitive advantage Travel and monitoring athlete wellness

Travelling regularly to compete is not a foreign concept to our national ISSF shotgun squad. With four World Cups, a World Cup Final, a World Championships on every year and the Olympics and Commonwealth Games thrown in every 4 years our athletes certainly need to learn how to travel in order to compete at their best.

Monitoring athletes on a daily basis can be an effective tool to minimise the impact of various things on performance once you arrive to compete.

There are many things you can monitor and the following is a list of things that we tracked prior to the Athens Olympics for one international event. We used the data to gain a greater understanding of some of the demands on the athletes, to educate them on effective strategies to reduce any impact on performance and also to plan for support services.

Wellness database

* daily cough cold symptoms (special focus following the long haul flight)

- * muscle soreness (both athlete numbers and severity)
- * general illness
- * injuries
- * general wellness
- * resting morning heart rate
- * dehydration (morning urine sample)

How is it administered?

On the trip where we collected data daily from each athlete with a small diary and a simple daily survey. The survey was a tick box type survey, with yes no responses to illness or levels of soreness and overall wellness rated on a scale from 0 - 5. The diary along with a morning hydration urine sample (discussed last article) was given to me just prior to breakfast.

The results

The first display page shown here is a summary of the team data that we are able to view on a daily basis as the event progresses but also as a review tool after the event is completed.



The second page is a sample page showing an individual athletes' data highlighting the individual issues encountered by this athlete.

Issues addressed

By considering the group and the individual athlete data these



were some of the issues we were able to address:

 \ast make a concerted effort to direct athletes to mass age services in the 24-48 hours after the flight

 \ast encourage physical activity on arrival to reduce stiffness and soreness

 \ast target hydration during the flight and test immediately after the flight (data not displayed)

* monitor any sick athletes to aid recovery and limit contact with rest of touring group to minimise cross infection. We actually had to isolate an athlete in the Olympic Village for 3 nights after arrival

* morning heart rate in order to see which athletes were coping with the physical demands of travel. The heart rate is usually elevated for 1-2 days post travel (from baseline collected for a week before travel) and then settles. If the heart rate continued climbing we had a good idea the athlete would become sick or was not recovering well from the trip, as shown in the athlete data displayed

* from individual comments pages we understood the increased physical demands of the Athens range on the Athletes. With all the stairs and limited lift facilities athletes were forced to carry heavy gear long distances and over stairs causing soreness. Some fitness programs were altered to account for this

 \ast get athletes to take their own pillows on tour to reduce neck soreness and disrupted sleep

The management of athletes whilst travelling is a critical role of the coach, team manager and sport scientist. With a simple monitoring tool such as this we are able to document issues that may arise and address them in a meaningful way for the group or for the individual immediately or on return home. For example whilst on tour the data can be shown to support staff, say the masseuse/physio to speak to those who have sore spots or injuries that have flared whilst travelling. Many athletes might not generally seek out treatment as it is only a minor issue but left untreated may escalate and impact heavily on performance.

The ASA and the VIS would like to thank David Milne for his work on this database monitoring system.

Nick Sanders is a Sports Scientist working through the ASA and the Victorian Institute of Sport. He assisted the national teams in preparation for Athens and is now helping to prepare the teams for the Commonwealth Games Melbourne 2006.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

PERFORMANCE BREAKDOWN

I subscribe to an American Sport Psychology Ezine written by Dr Patrick J. Cohen, which turns up regularly with my e-mail. Usually it's just a set of advertisements for courses he is running or accreditation programs but in the last few months the subject matter examined what he called "performance routine breakdowns".

I have mentioned in previous articles the dangers of distractions. Distractions deny us the opportunity to pay attention and concentrate. Distractions come in two forms: external distractions and internal distractions.

External distractions include noises from behind, the loudspeaker, a shooter coughing, tapping the Phono pull, throwing empty cartridges on the ground, etc. When you are in the zone and focusing well, external distractions are not issues. The targets seam like dinner plates and your gun seems to just seek them out. However, when you're not shooting well everything seems more difficult and you see and hear everything that is going on and it just feels more and more difficult to focus your attention.

According to Cohen, internal distractions are the ones that cause us most of our problems. Internal distractions or negative thoughts such as doubt or indecision can ruin a focused routine. A doubt or negative thought can derail confidence and sabotage trust. Doubt and confidence are polar opposites. If you are completely confident, you are not having doubt. If you have doubts about your ability to perform, you are not fully confident. Cohen believes that an important strategy in dealing with internal distractions is to have a "pre-match routine" to concentrate your focus on the task at hand and if necessary a "during match routine" to help you regain your focus. The main purpose of the routine is to help you feel confident when you execute your performance. When you have a doubt during the most important phase of your pre-performance routine, you are undermining your ability to perform. Some doubts are very straightforward while other doubts are more subtle.

What are the common types of internal distractions? These are not new and regular readers of this column will have heard some of this before. The first type of internal distraction is indecision. Indecision is a common breakdown. Cohen sees indecision as wavering between two or more possible courses of action. Indecision starts from a lack of resolution or decisiveness in the planning and programming phase of the routine. Anytime you have two options about how to perform; your body becomes confused because you have not committed to a clear plan of action. For example, when a golfer cannot decide on what club to use to hit and is vacillating between hitting a seven or eight iron, he is indecisive or undecided. If indecision remains until you execute the shot, it will lead to an indecisive swing. This can change the tempo and timing of the golfer's swing all because he is undecided about the club he has selected. The same is true with shooting; changing chokes, adjustable combs, shot size, cartridge speed, etc all equate for the shooter what the golfer goes through. The indecision leads to uncertainty and doubt which in turn tightens up our muscles and makes our movements less fluid.

The second type of internal distraction is fear or anxiety. This, according to Cohen, is a mental breakdown that can disrupt a focused routine. Most fear stems from thinking about the results of your action such as missing a shot, striking out, and allowing a score to occur, or losing a match. As I have said in the past being fearful puts you either in the past, where you can think about previous losses or missed targets on projects you into the future where you think about missing a target and therefore missing the prize. To deal with fear you need to stay focused in the here and now. Cohen believes that over analysis can certainly cause a breakdown in your routine. Thinking too much, analysing your game, focusing too much on technique, and worrying about the conditions or the environment are all examples of over analysis. In sports, trying hard does not always help you perform better. In the Inner Game of Golf, Tim Gallwey said "trying fails". This is important to realise because we are often conditioned as children to believe that if we don't succeed at first we should try again. Sometimes trying again will not help and instead we need to do it differently. If you need to analysis any part of your performance then you should be analysing what you are doing right so that you can keep doing it.

The next internal distraction according to Cohen is rushing. Rushing your routine can also cause a breakdown as you may skip important components in the routine. Rushing can happen for many reasons, but the most common are when you are anxious and want to get your performance started or finished quickly. Rushing means that you are not fully focused in the here and now and that you are not focusing on the process involved in completing the shot.

Finally, Cohen sees laziness as an internal distraction. Laziness or a lack of mental discipline during the routine not only can lead to a breakdown but often results in not having a routine at all. This is less common with high-level athletes, but necessary to mention. You might have heard of the phrase "going through the motions," which falls under a lack of discipline. When you are going through the motions in your routine, you are executing the physical parts of the routine, without intensity or focus. You are present physically, but not mentally dialled into your routine.

It is important to be in tune with the ways you personally get sidetracked when you are performing. Knowing what your personal routine is will help you identify if you are on track or sidetracked. Knowing what is normal means that you're able to recognise when things are abnormal and you can start your refocussing. In individual sports such as shooting, refocussing can be hard after a missed target but it should be practiced so that you are able to regain yourself and not slip further behind.

Cohen says the first step is to list the top three or four ways that your mind may wander or gets distracted during your preperformance routine so you can recognise when it happens in competition. The next time you do become aware, do something about it instead of going ahead anyway with your performance. The last step is to use your refocus skills to refocus on the fly as needed or restart your routine from an earlier stage to clear your mind of the distraction and get back on task. For the shooter an example of this is when you shoulder your gun and it doesn't feel right; do not think it will be OK, stop, and start again.

Cohen uses a simple three-step method to help you remember how to refocus. It is called the Three R's for Refocussing;

• Recognise that you are not on task or are out of your mental routine.

• Regroup and break the current distraction or thought.

 $\bullet \ddot{\mathrm{r}}$ Refocus on the task-relevant cues of the next play, shot, or routine.

Again, the refocussing process requires that you recognise when you are not following your regular routine. Ideally, you want to catch yourself before you start to execute so you can regroup and refocus with a clear mind on the task. Recognising you are distracted is only for the purpose of helping you refocus on the task and engage with your routine.

Dear Your Say

At the recent Skeet Nationals the sun was a problem during shoot offs. Not with standing the rule that the sun is a natural hazard, if this situation can be avoided then it should. As I understand it medical opinion is firm in that looking directly into the sun can result in serious eye damage.

I believe that this problem can and should be avoided by adoption of one of the following:

A) Move the Skeet Nationals to a time when the sun is in a different position.

B) Shoot offs to be doubles at 3,4 and 5 thus avoiding looking directly into the sun.

C) Fluro targets to be used throughout the program and shoot offs started at say 5.00pm when the sun is not a problem but still bright sunlight. The lights to be turned on at the same time and the shoot offs to be continued until finality. By doing this, the transition from daylight to dark is seamless. Such a system is used successfully in day/night cricket and at the World Skeet Championships. This system both avoids the sun hazard and an uninterrupted shoot off. How often does such an interruption when the shoot off goes over to the next day - result in an anticlimax to the event. This could also be useful in the Trap Nationals (?)

I favour C. One of the major advantages of the National Grounds specific location is that being in an industrial area it is or should not have its use limited by unreasonable restriction during National Championships.

Dear Your Say

Having just read the comments by Geoff Ervin (March CTSN), I must say I totally agree with most of what he wrote.

The percentages for two of the four grades were quite OK until the Rules Committee (chaired by Mark McInnes) and the National Executive decided that wasn't good enough, and the goal posts had to be moved after 22years of some resemblance of sanity for the top two grades at least.

The only problem with the percentages of the four grades, prior to the rule changes effective 01 Jan 2005, is the point where a C grader becomes a B grader. This should have been raised from 87% to 89%, leaving the other grade percentages as they were.

This would have made the percentage ranges for the top three grades much more realistic, instead of the new percentages where AA & A have a 3% range and B have a 7% range.

Under the pre 1983 rules, there were three grades for 15m common mark shooting, but their percentage ranges were excessive, which was probably why the rules were changed by elite shooters who were in A grade and looking after the elite, whilst completely ignoring the lower grades who, I might add, make up the majority Of ACTA registered shooters.

Dear Your Say

I haven't seen much in "Your Say" for a bit so thought I'd pop in, say G'Day and hit you with a hot little topic on "Popular and wide spread cheating".

I want you to visualise this scenario. The shoot is on, anything from a State or National to your own monthly comp. A lot of hard work has gone down to get you into this shoot off. Now it's your turn, you call the bird flies up, your ready, swings good nice rhythm on line leads right NOW click! Nothing - panic attack! Bird lands down range unhurt. Your hand fly's up. Refs coming over. "Yeah!" says your mate "I heard the gun click. It's a dud primer, a bad shell, gun malfunction (whatever)". The shooter - he knows his B25-D5G has never malfunctioned and never will.

The voluntary and maybe inexperienced referee who doesn't want an argument with a line of experienced shooters, agrees. Ok, reload and try again. This shooter, with a little test should have got a LOST bird. Most all of these so-called malfunctions are nothing more than a shooter failing to load correctly, by not dropping the barrels all the way down so that the cocking rods can rotate the hammers back to their second groove. The sears are pinned to the top of the frame waiting to click in and hold the hammers.

What is happening? The hammers almost go right back, but don't. Then they return. The sear can only slide along the curved top and drop into the closer slot holding the hammer into a half cocked position. At trigger pull there's NOT enough distance to generate Clear sky and about 24 degrees with a gentle southerly breeze meant it was going to be a very enjoyable night of competition. Warnings of a mosquito plague seemed to be unfounded, possibly because of the breeze keeping them at bay.

Five shooters found the eye opener 10 tgt Double Barrel an easy task, being Murray Roberts (Echuca), George Bradley (Mathoura), Phill Hart, Rob Collicoat, & Glen Higgins all from Deniliquin, all scoring 10/10 to share the cash divide.

Graham Hall (Mathoura) demonstrated to all how to shoot night tower in the second event a 25 tgt Double Barrel tower, being the only shooter to down all 25 targets to collect Overall & A grade. Shepparton competitor Alf Hearn after a one shot shoot-off collected B grade on a 24/26, and local member Harry O,Connor, (under the watchful gaze of the handicapper), Harry (Snow) shooting tower so well lately, collected C grade on a very good score of 24/25.

The last chance to collect a trophy, event three a 15 tgt Single Barrel, and G Bradley demonstrated how it should be done by downing all 15 to take out first prize. Rob Collicoat after once again, a very short shoot-off, of three targets collects 2nd place on a score of 17/18 and G Hall 3rd with a 16/18 score on the board. Very pleasant conditions, a friendly atmosphere, and a good time was had by all.

the inertia hit on the firing pin to reach the anvil in the primer. You have an impression on the primer but, not deep enough for a detonation. You can never get enough hammer speed from half cock. So, most times the trophies are going home with the wrong people, after a malfunction decision. At our club's last monthly comp shoot Doug Mitchell collected four live shells from refs who in turn took them from shooters who had apparently got away with it. Doug was intending to dispose of them safely when I found out the circumstances and after sighting the much smaller indents on the primer face I said: "Dougie you have just been conned. Put them in your bag and shoot them off there Ok". Doug wasn't convinced so we put a gun together and went out on the tracks. Every one of those so-called dud shells fired more than perfectly. We are now going to modify procedure dealing with malfunctions during competition.

1. Never open gun. Failure = Lost target.

2. The shooter will be instructed to drop barrels fully until pivot is stopped mechanically to our satisfaction then close and shoot over trap. If it now fires and it will. Too bad. Bring the colours down. Lights out = Lost target.

So what's happening at your club and what are you going to do about it. For those who have not read the RuleBook for the definition of a lost target, better do it. Have a great year in 2005 and good shooting.
