2005 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Australian Clay Target Association National Trap Championships for 2005 were conducted at the West Australian Gun Club in Perth WA with the championships running from Tuesday April 5 to Sunday April 10. Unseasonably fine warm days greeted the shooters so some good scores were expected.

Prior to the Opening Ceremony, teams from all states and territory competed for the Australian Clay Target Association Cup presented to the winning state team in Open, Women's, Juniors and Veterans divisions.



Queensland successfully won the Open team event, being represented by Ray Collinson, John Maxwell, Bruce Powell, Kevin Jarick and Gary Wright with a score of 125/369. One target behind in second place was the team from Victoria with a score of 124/369. Third place went to the team from Tasmania on a score of 124/368. Fourth place went to New South Wales 124/363, fifth place went to Northern Territory 123/353, sixth place went to South Australia



121/358 and seventh place went to Western Australia 120/350. The Ladies from Victoria were successful in winning the Women's Team event. The team was lead by Michelle Felmingham with Amanda Holt and Catherine Skinner scoring 74/214. Equal second place went to Western Australia and the team from Queensland with a score 70/204.



In the Junior division the team from Western Australia comprising of Darren McMichan and Nigel Miller with Chris Vodden were the winners on a score of 75/220. Second place went to the team from Victoria with a score of 74/218 and third place went to the team from New South Wales with a score of 74/215.



Five Veterans teams competed for their shoulder to shoulder badges with the New South Wales team of Jeff Nash, Peter Fitzalan and Kevin Heywood shooting 75/222 to take the event from Western Australia who shot 73/215. Victoria was placed third with a score of 71/212.

Opening Ceremony

Constable Doug Kirkwood from the WA Police Pipe Band led all the state teams in the traditional march past the crowd.

National President, Mr. Bill Jones introduced the dignitaries that were present: The Hon Bob Kuchera, APM MLA, Minister for Sport & Recreation; Mr. Ivan Halbert, President WACTA and Mrs. Christine Alexander, President West Australian Gun Club.



Members of the Official party judged the best presented teams and awarded the SACTA Perpetual Trophy to a very well presented West Australian Team.

The Hon Bob Kuchera, APM MLA, Minister for Sport & Recreation then welcomed all present to the 2005 National Championship and the visitors to the city of Perth. He then declared the event officially under way. Bob then attempted to get the event under way by firing the first shot. After several attempts a target was broken and was warmly noted with much clapping and cheering from the crowd.

4th National Deauville Doubles



65th National Champion of Champions

The first event for the 2005 Nationals attracted three hundred and fourteen competitors and at the end of qualifying two shooters had shot the perfect score. At 76 years of age, Raymond Mason from the Devonport Club was the oldest competitor at the 200 National DTL Championships.





Psychological Skills for Shooting

Action Readiness

During the last month I have been giving a lot of thought to fear. Not because I've been scared of anything but because last month I mentioned a story about a shooter who was scared before a big event, this made me think that fear is more difficult to deal with than we imagine. During this month a book arrived that my wife had ordered: "Move Closer; Stay Longer" by Dr Stephanie Burns. The book is about not letting fear keep you from getting what you want and doing what you want. The philosophy is part of the Parelli Natural Horsemanship program. The book looks at fear from a horsemanship perspective but there a number of parallels for shooters, most other sports and life in general.

Burns starts by explaining that the brain has its primary function to keep us alive and in good shape long enough to reproduce. As a result emotions, like fear are essential and come as standard features in all humans and animals. Fear therefore has a purpose to protect you from loss. This loss might be a loss of resources (money, friends, things), loss of love, loss of self-esteem, loss of face or confidence and most importantly, loss of life. Fear therefore keeps you safe and out of harms way. I've mentioned before about the flight or fight response when dealing with a stressor that may be life threatening, this response provides us with options to deal with what we are scared of. So how does the emotion of fear work?

Burns argues that each emotion is a unique program that the brain executes to quickly get the rest of the body and your mind ready to do something specific. Therefore emotions are called action-readiness programs. Your whole body becomes part of this action-readiness program and when caused by fear the responses are to run, duck and weave if you can, to turn and fight if you are trapped or to avoid doing things that scare you when you can get away with it. Burns continues by describing what happens when the emotions start in your brain and slowly take over the rest of the

body. Your heart rate changes to push more or less blood through your system. Your skin might flush with increasing blood flow; you may blush, get tingly skin or sweat. Your muscles can change tension and cause you to clench your fists, or scrunch up your brow, or shrug your shoulders. Your stomach juices get active which can cause you to have butterflies or feel nauseous. Your hair can stand on end and you may experience movement tics such as rubbing, scratching, tapping, picking or biting. Finally unbidden vocal bursts can spew forth like 'oh no', 'Arghhh', f*#k!

The thing about an action-readiness program triggered by emotions is that they lead to and affect behaviour. Fear is always about something. Fear can never be about nothing it must be due to a person, thing, place, situation or task. For shooters the thing that is causing you to be fearful is rarely out there and may have no basis at all in reality; so it must be something you are thinking about. And if you're thinking about something scary then it's because you've moved from the present and started thinking in the future. What if..... If we continually focus on the "what ifs" and the "what might happen", then we lose focus and concentration for the job immediately at hand and for shooters we miss.

This then leads us to be more fearful and we tense up even more, andwell you know the rest of the story. In previous articles I've written about staying in the here and now, remaining focused on the present and avoiding shooting in either the past or the future. Fear makes us lose sight of the here and now and we anticipate what might happen; we move into the future and we lose track of what we are doing now.

So how do we stay in the here and now? The short answer is to focus on your breathing because it will bring you back to the present. Then, when you have a chance practise some out of competition exercises that will help you focus and more importantly help you regain your focus when your mind wanders.

I noticed in the June CTSN an advertisement for Randolf Ranger shooting glasses. Glasses are now mandatory whilst shooting so when I had the opportunity to try these new CMT (Colour Mag Technology) glasses at the Nationals, I gave them a try. Now approximately 5% of males have a disorder called red vision defect so some shooters out there are always going to have problems with fluro targets. These glasses, as the advertisement says increases the contrast between the background and the target. When I put these glasses on I immediately noticed that red and orange seemed to literally jump out at me; sometimes it was nearly painful to look at bright red. So were they any good? At the nationals there were too many broken orange targets in front of every trap house so the targets were the same colour as the background until they got into the air. Figure Ground is a construct where we are able to discriminate a form within a series of other forms or the background. Anyone who has seen a "Where's Wally" book will know what I'm talking about. So with a background the same colour there was no perceived difference. I noticed a significant difference during the double rise. Because I knew where the targets would be I could look for them above the background; this is where they showed promise. Recording a personal best for the double rise also made me feel better about the glasses. Since the nationals I've used them for skeet, DTL and Ball Trap. What I have noticed is that by bringing the red up faster means that target acquisition is made earlier, thereby allowing the shooter to know its' path earlier. I personally believe that it is necessary to protect our eyes when shooting; just as I wouldn't use an angle grinder or a chainsaw without wearing safety glasses. Therefore, if we need to wear glasses we should use ones that the technology has been developed to make the task easier.

A "please explain" from the Anti-Gun Lobby would be very difficult to defend under these circumstances.

I think this committee have become victims of there own egos and should resign before they do further damage to the sport of Clay Target Shooting.

This training camp was conducted at the Melbourne Gun Club to give the juniors attending the ISSF World Championships in Italy in May some technical assistance, an introduction to sports science and an insight as to expectations at the major event on the ISSF calendar.

all the information received and sections to record all training and competitions. This is required to be filled in and maintained at all times so the information along with the video footage can be used to build a profile of each athlete.

The day was rounded out by another two hour practical training session

Saturday night a barbeque was held to keep the group together followed by a session and discussion on the expectations and experience the World Championships would bring, and how to handle them. A video of the Athens Olympics was then viewed to provide motivation and instil a sense of pride to be representing Australia.

Sunday started with urine samples that showed none of the

athletes had implemented the hydration strategy discussed the day before. with only one being in a border line acceptable level, two being dehydrated, two severely dehydrated and one very severely dehydrated. Had this been a competition day the latter three would have had absolutely no chance of performing at their best, and the next two little chance. Such is the importance of these strategies.

Then dietary issues were discussed and how this impacted on performance along with strength and conditioning and fitness.

A short training session was then held followed by a presentation on the mental side of the sport including

goal setting and how to handle pressure and expectations. Drugs in sport was discussed and the requirements of ASDA (Aus Sports Drug Agency) explained including the forms that require each athlete to nominate where they will be every day for the next three months in case they are required for out of competition drug testing

A three round competition was then conducted to see if the athletes could put in place some of the suggested technical changes.

The camp was rounded off by a review of all items presented.

A big thank you must go to all the people who contributed to make it a success. Special thanks to Bob Buchan and the Melbourne Gun Club for making their range available and to the ASA for making it all possible.

If the athletes learn from this camp and it assists them to be better shooters in the future, then it has all been worthwhile.

The intention of this program is to fast track the development of our junior talent, so that we have a succession plan in place to keep producing world class shooters to follow those current Australian shooters who have helped us achieve international success at the highest level.

Junior development is the key to the future of ISSF and I trust that this will be the forerunner of many more such junior camps.

Mid afternoon lecture revolved around travel strategies and how to combat the effects of a long flight to the other side of the world. Hydration is a major factor in this strategy and the results of the samples were revealed to show that all were dehydrated to some degree. The effects of dehydration on performance was then explained and a plan put in place for that night to increase hydration.

The athletes were then given a training and travel diary which has




