I have recently returned from a full Executive Meeting in Wagga. All States were represented over a 3-day period. Input was received from all the State Associations with various recommendations put forward.

We were pleased to welcome Ewin Perie, Dean Everett and Trevor Mason from New Zealand whose input was very useful.

National Ground preparation for the World Championships 2006 continues with all 15 trap houses in place and 2 sets of lanes left to be poured. All other 13 are complete.

Pre nomination continues to be received with some 440 accepted. It will shortly be necessary to create a reserve list. It is now anticipated a full field of 675 will compete.

Your committee expects 14 overseas countries to be represented with a full international competition expected.

HANDICAP & GRADE CHANGES

Club Management and Secretaries are reminded that after any event the Management must immediately re-handicap each and every shooter who for any of the reasons prescribed in the ACTA Handicapping Formula qualified for any movement of his handicap. Such adjustments are to strictly conform to the handicapping formula. No shooter is to be permitted to compete in another event should he refuse to accept his new mark.

A Handicap Return must accompany EVERY result sheet forwarded to the ACTA office within FOURTEEN DAYS of each shoot being held.

It is very important that all the information requested be provided - membership number surname and club.

If some clerical error appears on a shooters replacement handicap card when it is issued, it is the shooter's responsibility to have the mistake corrected and to shoot off the correct handicap mark. The Club Secretary, a member of the Executive Committee of the ACTA, Rule Supervisors or the State Handicapper, may correct errors and/or amendments. Correction to errors and amendments must be ruled out and signed with the correction or amendment clearly visible. Correction fluid or the likes of are not permitted to be used.

It is the shooters responsibility to ensure that all handicap and common mark scores have been entered correctly, and progressively totalled.

Club Managements, Rule Supervisors, State or Zone Handicappers or a member of the ACTA Executive Committee have the right to re-handicap or re-grade any obviously underhandicapped or over-handicapped, under-graded or overgraded shooter immediately. The Association is to be notified within 14 days with the reason given on a Handicap Return Form.

ACTA NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS, 2005

The 12th National Sporting Clays were again held at the ACTA National Shooting Grounds in Wagga Wagga on the 21st and 22nd May. Participation at this years Nationals was slightly more than the previous year and visitors were again attracted from many states within Australia with members from the SSAA and Field & Game also represented. This year the ACTA had decided to use a new grading system which placed shooters in divisions at the end of the day.

Saturday saw 76 competitors contest the ACTA Sporting Clays Championship on bright sunny autumn day. The overall winner of this event was Bart Brighenti with a score of 103/110.

The division placings for this event were as follows: Division 1: 1st Max Kavanagh 102/110, 2nd Brett Dunstan 101/110, 3rd Peter Hall 101/110; Division 2: 1st Ian Stewart 93/110, 2nd Brian North 92/110, 3rd Rod Walton 91/110; Division 3: 1st Kelly Norris 99/130, 2nd Jarad Cartwright 94/130, 3rd Steve Sayers 85/110; Division 4: 1st Alex Mikolajewicz 67/100, 2nd Barry Wild 67/100, 3rd Brad Wignall 66/100. Robert Hall won the Junior section with a score of 87/100, Women's section by Kelly Norris 79/100 and Tom Harris won the Veteran section on a score of 84/100.

Sunday and another day of sunshine. 75 competitors turned out for the Commonwealth Sporting Clays Championship. The overall winner of this event was again Bart Brighenti with a score of 95/100.

The division placings for this event were as follows: Division 1: 1st Peter Hall 101/110, 2nd Brett Dunstan 97/110, 3rd Soc Pilipasidis 100/110; Division 2: 1st Rod Walton 91/110, 2nd Milton Cartwright 104/130, 3rd Brian North 103/130; Division 3: 1st Ian Swindley 92/110, 2nd Noel Watchorn 91/110, 3rd Kelly Norris 90/110; Division 4: 1st Clive Peacock 75/ 67, 2nd Toni Henshall 75/110, 3rd Alex Mikolajewicz 71/110. Robert Hall won the Junior section with a score of 86/100, Women's section by Kelly Norris 77/100 and Tom Harris won the Veteran section on a score of 80/100.

National Sporting Clays Championship

The format at this years National Sporting Clays Championship was unchanged from the previous years with the event being decided over both days.

All sections were again well represented and Field & Game member Robert Hall securing victory in the Juniors division with a score of 173/200. Tom Harris from the Tumut Club was successful in the Veterans division with a score of 164/200 and Kelly Norris won the Women's section with a score of 156/200.

The division placings for this event were as follows: Division 1: Brett Dunstan 185/200; Division 2:

Craig McNeil 180/210; Division 2: Division 3: Ian Swindley 158/200; Division 4: Barry Wild 136/200.

The overall winner and National Sporting Clays Champion for 2005 with a score over the two days of 188/200 was Bart Brighenti from the Griffith Gun Club. Bart received the Royal Blue Sash and pewter belt buckle for his efforts.

Most of the shooters were staying at the Grand Prix Hotel while 6 pistol shooters and the 3 officials were to stay at the Grand next door. After allocating rooms for the team at the Grand Prix I made my way next door to the Grand. On arrival I was told the other two Officials had immediately left to try and find other accommodation as it was definitely not Grand. We were able to move from the Grand to other accommodation a half an hour away from the rest of the team. The Grand Prix proved to be definitely different accommodation to what we are used to but unfortunately, this was the only accommodation available.

The weather was light rain and cold. The Trap Team of Michael Diamond, Tom Turner, Adam Vella, Simone Tigani, Emily Signorotto and Michelle Beecham practiced well but realised the targets were not as easy to see as first thought.

Learning this day were a group of school girls from a nearby school. They were being taught how to use the Official Flip Scoreboard. I attended a Technical meeting where the New Rules for 2005 were discussed.

We woke the next day for Trap Competition which was to be 75 Targets for women plus Final and 75 Targets for men. Raining Cold Very Wet. The ground was covered in water. Trouble with the Traps, broken targets and speakers not working. It was going to be a fun day. The Program had to be changed because as of 12 noon Range B was 2 hours behind schedule and Ranges A and C 1hour

Simone shot 22 20 22 = 64. Michelle 22 19 22 = 63 and Emily 19 20 23 =62. Simone was only one target off the Final. They finished well and never gave up. This was a great effort for these girls in the Development Squad. They did us proud under extremely difficult conditions. Their fashion statements on the shooting ranges could bring a whole new look. They had wonderful support from the Trap mens team. Thanks guys.

The Trap womens Final was shot under extremely cold windy conditions under the new single barrel rule. Ma from China with a score of 70 went into the Final leading by 3 and missed her first 7 targets and finished with a total of 11. After a shoot off finished in 4th place. Inoue JPN shot 67 and a great 21 to finish 1st. Giansanto ITA 65+14 5th and Dewitt USA 66+13 6th.

Day 2 of Trap Men 75 Targets. Still so wet underfoot and cold. Would have loved a pair of gumboots. A lot of broken targets and as yesterday I was kept busy checking flipboards as the school girls were having trouble with correct scoring. Tom Turner shot 25 22 23 22 21 to finish on 113. Adam Vella 24 24 23 24 23 = 118. Adam shot off for the Final but missed out and finished in 7th place. Michael Diamond shot very well scoring 24 25 24 24 25 = 122. Michael was in first place going into the final. Michael shot a 20 in the final to finish in 2nd place behind Pelliello ITA on 121 + 23. Bade USA 121+18 3rd Fabbrizi ITA on 118 + 21 4th Filipovic SOV 118 +16 5th and Lee SNG 118 + 15 6th. As you can see the majority of the scores in the final were not high and I think some thought has to go into the humiliating single barrel finals which can not be good for the sport especially when it is shown on television. Craig Trembath arrived today to a room of luxury.

The 12th was Double Trap Official Practice. It was also a day of teaching the school girls how to use the flipboard for Double Trap. A lot of broken targets or no targets coming out at all. We could sense big problems. Michael and the girls left for home today.

As was sensed not a good day for double trap competition. Continuous broken targets or no targets and to add to this shooters not excepting legal pairs when they came out, especially if they missed their 1st target. Refereeing was not the best. A lot of disputes and hold-ups. The Double Trap Team of Tom Turner, Adam Vella and Craig Trembath had to try and hold their composure. Criag and Adam shot well but were disappointed, particularly with their final rounds. Craig 44 45 41 = 130. Adam 41 47 42 = 130. Tom went into the Final with a score of 39 to finish 6th. Eller USA 136 + 44 1st Di Spino ITA 136 + 43 2nd Hu CHN 133 + 43 3rd Almaktoum UAE 134 + 42 4th and Rathore IND 133 + 39 5th. George Barton arrived today.

Tom, Adam and Craig left the next day which was Official Skeet Practice and I'm busy sewing and then resewing Georges jacket. With the ongoing problems at the range they automatically change the program of Men's Skeet event to 50 targets Day 1 and 75 Targets Day 2 plus Final.

Skeet scores are normally very high so it was surprising at the end of Day 1 to see only one 50 on the board. George could see that the scores were not going to be high and was ready for Day 2 after shooting a 24 and 23.

Day 2 of Men's Skeet and George was in early Squad. Great weather quite warm and sunny. George shot a 23 in his first round at some very loppy targets which just got slower and slower as the round progressed. After supposedly fixing trap for the next squad they still did not lock in the spring and it just kept loosening off. George shot a 24 in his second and third rounds to finish on 118.

One shooter shone out in the Men's Skeet event - a young 16 year old from USA named Vincent Hancock. He shot a 124 + 25 to win this event by 3 targets to Elevteri ITA with 122 + 24. Third was Achilleos CYP 120 + 25 Sychra CZE 121 + 24 4th.

I left for home and left George all alone to fly back the next day. It was great to have the Rifle and Pistol shooters show a real interest in our Clay Target events. They supported us in a big way and I would personally like to thank all of the shooting team for their attitude in a trying World Cup. I'll just finish with IN OUT.

Past Club President, Paul Tattam, presented Frank with a sash titled "Living Legend" from the Club. "Frank has supported the Club for many years. He is always willing to help other shooters, giving encouragement to people new to the sport. Four years ago the Club decided to dedicate an event to the Living Legend. The Frank O'Neill Trophy Day is growing larger each year." Mr Tattam said.

"It's all about doing something I like and having fun" Mr O'Neill said of a shooting career that has spanned over forty years. "I've



been to a lot of places, made some great friends and enjoyed myself. I encourage anyone thinking of giving the sport a try to come to the club and see what we do."

59 shooters lined up to the compete for prestigious Frank O'Neill Trophy. Competitors travelled from Armidale, Inverell, Glen Innes, Brewarrina, Guvra, Goondiwindi, Texas and Tarawera to compete in the annual event. A full programme followed a successful open day at the Club on Saturday.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

CHEATING

In last month's CTSN, Tony Edgar commented about those shooters who manage their percentage so they can stay in "their grade" as he calls it. In the area where I live there are some shooters who are well known for "managing their percentage", and I'm sure this is the case in most areas around Australia and perhaps around the world.

Tony also suggested that I might like to look at this behaviour. So I decided to take Tony's challenge and look at why shooters behave in a way that would be considered as cheating by the rest of us. Now I know I will be criticised by what I'm about to write but I've always lived by the credo that "If you walk on thin ice, you may as well dance."

I began my research by typing two words into a search engine on the net: cheating, sport, and received 815,000 hits. Most of the hits dealt with performance enhancing drugs, ethical behaviours of coaches and officials, modifying genes and cheating on your partner. Initially, I thought that I was not going to find anything that would offer Tony or others an insight into this behaviour. So I went back to my collection of textbooks, and to an article I wrote in June 2001 called "Motivation". Now I don't pretend to an expert on cheating behaviour, but after 20 years working as a psychologist, I have come to realise that we need to look at the motivation behind people's behaviour if we are going to explain it, or more importantly, understand it.

The problem with cheating is that it is tied up with so many other beliefs and attitudes that we hold. Cheating is a coping strategy; it is how some people cope (Christopher Skase was a good example). We also have to remember that tied up in this is our belief about the world, right and wrong and what we believe to be just: our moral autonomy.

A part of the answer of why people cheat lies in the motivation behind why they participate in sport. There are three main theories underlying motivation in sport; Achievement goal theory, Attribution theory and Need Achievement theory. For the purpose of our discussion here I will be concentrating on Achievement goal theory. Achievement goal theory suggests that two major goal perspectives operate in an achievement context such as sport: a task orientation and an ego orientation.

Put simply, a task orientation implies that one participates in an activity for its own intrinsic properties. The enjoyment of the game, the way we feel when we smoke the target, or catch a great wave, or sink a tricky putt. There is a great inner sense of satisfaction

Ego orientation (or outcome goal orientation) on the other hand has participants striving to demonstrate superior ability compared to everyone else or avoiding the demonstration of incompetence. The need for some athletes and coaches to use performance enhancing drugs would also fit into this area as athletes want to be the best at all costs or at least do not want to look poor compared to others. To this end, cheating is a justifiable means.

Both orientations are present in all of us; and the goal to achieve is what drives us to attend the next shoot. For the clay target shooter, task orientation occurs when we shoot a possible, or shoot a personal best, overtake our previous longest break or just absolutely smoke a target. The break badges section of the CTSN is a perfect example of this. Task orientation is what drives us to practise, visualise, concentrate and do any of the numerous physical and mental skills that enable us to perform well. Ego orientation occurs when we focus on comparing our performance on the personal standards of others.

Standing in front of the score board looking at the scores and feeling good because I shot better than so and so, is a perfect example of ego orientation. So too is the feeling we get when the sash is put over our head or when we shake everyone's hand on the way back to the clubhouse.

Ego orientation, however can get in the way of sportsmanship, dimensions of "respect for social conventions", "respect for rules and officials", respect for one's full commitment" and "respect and concern for the opponent". These dimensions determine whether or not we are good sports. The issue about ego orientation is that it is not all bad. It would be impossible for elite athletes to perform well unless they had a goal to become the champion by beating other people. There is somewhat of a contradiction here but the research shows that serious negative motivational consequences may arise when high ego orientations are combined with low perceived competence. So getting back to Tony's question about shooters feeling that they own a grade and managing their scores to stay there; it is proposed by the researchers in this field, that ego orientation would be more strongly related than task orientation to a willingness to cheat. Research by Duda (1992) found his results showed the predicted positive relationship between ego orientation and cheating, but not between task orientation and cheating. One of the problems human's have is that to achieve, learn, have fun, or improve it is necessary to take risks. We have to move out of our comfort zone and participate on an equal level with everyone else. Those shooters who "own their grades" do not want to take the risk of achieving a better result because that may mean that they are just participating and not winning. Their ego orientation and possible belief that they are not able to cut it in an open competition, means that they will not try to take the risk of performing better and being regraded. To do that would mean that they are task orientated and the fun and enjoyment of the sport is enough of a prize. Being ego orientated locks them into a pattern of behaviour that focuses them on winning something at all costs.

I hope Tony; I have answered your question, "What makes people think they own a grade?" It is easy to oversimplify behaviour and we must remember that we are human and therefore very complex beings (no matter how simple we seem to behave).




Later in the day the carers' themselves had a go and judging by the smiles on their faces and the cheers when a target was hit they also had a great time.

Dear ACTA

Proposed Introduction of \$10.00 Levy

It has come to my notice recently that the Victorian Clay Target Association is going to introduce a \$10.00 levy in the near future on every Victorian Registered shooter.

This levy will be collected at the start of each year for the previous 12 months registration of each individual club member, meaning that if a club has 45 registered members for 2005 they will be billed \$450.00 in 2006 and the club will then have to charge its members accordingly.

What is the motive behind this levy that the VCTA is going to introduce?

Well I can tell you this much the VCTA can and will be able to do whatever they like with it, but there is a definite push from the elite shooter's to have a substantial amount of it earmarked for extra prize money towards the Victorian State Carnival.

My argument is why penalise 95% of registered Victorian shooters for the benefit of 5% that may wish to compete at a 3-day carnival. If they want more prize money to compete for let them put their hand further in their own pocket, the same as we all do when we decide to compete at any of the big 2 day shoots, irrespective of where they are held.

Some people may say "What's this bloke on about it's only \$10.00 the price of a couple of packets of shells." It is the principal of the thing that matters to me, and remember who knows what the levy might be in 2 or 3 years time if we sit back and let it be introduced now, it could easily be \$20.00 or \$30.00.

As this proposed levy is going to be administered by the VCTA I would urge all clubs to reject it outright and refuse to pay the levy as it is unjust and unwarranted, after all what can they do about it if clubs refuse to pay.

To the Victorian shooters who have an opinion on this matter irrespective of whether you agree or disagree with what I have had to say put pen to paper and give your opinion.

I would like to add that I have been a registered VCTA shooter continuously since 1965 and have competed on a regular basis at all clubs throughout the Western District of Victoria, Colac being my home club and this is the first time ever I have felt strongly enough about an issue to put pen to paper.

Warning to all Clubs.....

I wish to advise you of a recent occurrence at our Club, and to warn other clubs and Committees against allowing groups to shoot at or visit their grounds on a regular basis. Individuals should always be made welcome.

Some two years ago our then President was invited to attend a shoot at another grounds. He thoroughly enjoyed his day and saw the potential to bolster his aging Committee with some young blood from this other club.

Pretty soon a 'gentlemens agreement' was reached and the other club was shooting at our grounds on a monthly basis.

Everyone was happy - the visiting club had a verbal assurance of facilities being available and our club had help on the Committee.

After twelve months the 'visiting' club offered an injection of funds to be used for facilities for their benefit and requested a written agreement or sub licence to ensure security of their investment. At this stage the visiting club was paying less to shoot on the grounds than the host clubs members and the injection of funds was suggested as a way on balancing the books. Over time costs had risen and the monies being paid per round resulted in a profit of approx 31c per 25 targets to the club who had the facilities, with this host clubs members paying an average of \$8 more per day to shoot.

So negotiations began - understandably, the visiting club pushed for a reply to their letter offering funds and solicitors became involved advising host clubs that sub licences , indeed any formal arrangement was not possible and would contravene their lease agreement and furthermore to accept any large sums of money would give the visitors a legal right to their name being on the lease.

This all came to a head at one of the host clubs ordinary Committee Meetings where five of the twelve committee present were identified as members of the visiting club, including the visiting clubs Vice President. So discussions on what to charge the visiting club resembled a "How much would you be happy to pay?" scenario - at which point - I as President realised money was a side issue and what was really being established was who was running the club.

These smooth talking visitors have our Committee convinced that their presence on the grounds will save the club - the Committee fell over themselves trying to please these 'visitors'. With no

Remember 5/12 or 6/15 people on a Committee- 'for the good of the club' becomes the visiting club not the leaseholder or host club.

I am writing to all clubs and warning you not to allow visiting clubs to shoot their own program on your grounds. And above all visiting clubs should NOT have representation at Committee level. Otherwise you'll be working and they'll be shooting.......for less than you.

Now, would probably be a good time to look at your constitution and amend it so that shooting members of another club of the same discipline, within the same locality can't be office bearers at your club.

Arafura Games 2005 - Darwin

The Arafura Games are a sporting and cultural festival held in Darwin every two years. They host a range of sports from the Asia Pacific Region, including traditional sporting events such as swimming, track and field etc. It also exhibits some more exotic and spectacular sports such as Sepaktakraw, a South East Asian sport, which is a cross between soccer and volleyball, played with the feet, mostly overhead. That's an interesting concept isn't it? If you want to know more best you come to the next games. Bring your trap or skeet gun or both. This year's games attracted entrants from as far away as Europe, North America, South Africa, New Zealand, India, Asia, and the other Australian states. The Darwin Clay Target Club hosted the clay target events.

Events contested between 16 and 20 May were ISSF Trap, Double Trap and Skeet. The competition was an international affair with shooters from Chinese Taipei, Brunei Darussalam, and Papua New Guinea as well as Darwin and Top End Gun Clubs competing. Naturally the competition was shot under international rules and the Tournament Director was International Referee and Judge, Elaine Forward of Tambellup WA.

What an eye opener for local shooters! Elaine enforced the rules! All clothing, guns and cartridges were inspected prior to competition to ensure conformity with the rules. No talking on the walks (this might be construed as coaching). Shooters were penalised for time breaches and for opening guns between single

In doing so he also shot what, but for technical reasons, would have been a Commonwealth games qualifying score ie had the shoot been registered with the Australian Shooting Association etc. Congratulations, Vince, on a well-earned victory and a job extremely well done.

The competition produced a number of surprises, not least for the PNG team who were expecting a DTL competition! None of them had shot ISSF events and had little knowledge of the rules and procedures that applied. Regardless they applied themselves and took home several medals and a lot of experience. It is apparently extremely difficult to obtain legal firearms in PNG. This resulted in their shooters having unsuitable guns for the competition ie trap guns for all events including skeet, left handers having to use guns with right handed stocks etc. Darwin Club members assisted with left handed stocks and loans of skeet guns and equipment to assist this affable and determined group. (The local gunsmiths also gained a lot of work.) Darwin and Top End members wish them all the best in developing their club and hope to see them back here for the next games.

Local shooters performed well with Vince Mollica winning gold with 135/150, Christos Despotis silver with 127/150 and Dwayne Devanney bronze with 120/150 in the mens Trap. Hjh Norash bte Hj Abu Talib won the women's gold, None Azlenna bte Khaldon silver and Siti Aishah bte Aji Hj Ali the bronze, all from Brunei. Tom Hamilton of Darwin won the Junior's gold medal, the silver went to Darren Short of PNG and bronze went to Angus McDonald of PNG.

The men's Double Trap gold medal was won by Christos Despotis with 150/200, the silver went to Dwayne Devanney with 137/200 while the bronze was won by Saiful Rezal Japar of Brunei with 123/200. The women's Double Trap gold medal was won by Hjh Norsah Haji AbuTalip, silver to None Azlyenna Khaldon and bronze to Norsizellawati bte Basri, again all of Brunei. Israel Yama of PNG was the best Junior.

The men's Skeet gold medal was won by Rizali Tagal with 132/150, the silver went to Kamis Juing with 130/150, both of Brunei while the erstwhile John Doyle of Darwin picked up the bronze with 126/150. The women's Skeet gold medal was won by Siti Aishah bte Aji Ali, and silver to Norsizillawati Basir both of Brunei while Israel Yama from PNG was again the best Junior. A remarkable

effort from this youngster as he has only been shooting for three weeks!

Naturally enough events of this nature require a lot of planning and effort to bring them to fruition. Bob Fox of Darwin, Clay Target Sports Coordinator for the tournament, was heavily engaged in the planning and organisation, even to the extent of arranging import and export permits through Customs for our international visitors. He also ran the office and assisted with all aspects of refereeing, scoring etc throughout the competition. These duties prevented him from shooting. A very big thanks goes to Bob for all his efforts. Thanks must also go to all the volunteer's who assisted, in particular to Tom Farmer and Sacha Keronen of O'Loughlin College who worked as line markers, scorers etc for the entire tournament. The club was fortunate to receive a grant from the NT government for the new Laporte traps, which worked wonderfully well. They were installed for the training camps run here for our Olympic shooters prior to the Athens Olympics. A requirement was that the club establishes a junior coaching program. Perhaps Tom and Sacha, who have, since joined the Darwin club, might become part of that junior program.

Clay target shooting received great media coverage throughout the games, both locally and internationally! Results were emailed to the games media centre daily and were printed in the next day's NT News. There was also coverage by TV crews from Brunei, Chinese Taipei and the local

networks, particularly Channel 7 who featured clay target shooting in a promo ad for the Games. The Arafura Games media centre also did a human-interest story on the PNG juniors - focussing on Israel Yama.

Dwayne Devanney was the most consistent shooter of the games making the finals in all three events and finishing out of the placing's only in the Skeet where he came fourth. Dwayne is a young bloke who knows how to enjoy life. He was a great ambassador introducing our PNG friends in particular to Darwin's nightlife. Dwayne, a wordsmith by anyone's measure, observed in anticipation of the closing ceremony "Its going to be messy, like a bulldog eating custard."

Riverina Zone Trap Carnival and Junior Classic

The Riverina Zone Junior Team is Aaron Turner (148/150), Tom Brandon (142/150) and L. McMullen (133/150). Shooters also turned up from Victorian clubs; Mansfield, Werribee, Mt Bogong and Wangaratta and NSW clubs including Orange, Canowindra, Cowra, Warren, Majura Park, West Wyalong and Gunning-Dalton.

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.





CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NSWCTA SKEET CARNIVAL

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce their handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the Carnival. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A fee of \$20 may be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

2. Squads of 5 to shoot 100 targets per day, in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps, 2nd 50t moving up one trap. eg 1-2, 2-3, 3-4, 4-5, etc.

3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.

4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets. Shooters are expected to perform changeovers (between rounds as well as between squads) as quickly as possible, and certainly not exceed the maximum time limit allowed of two minutes. Anyone exceeding that time limit may be penalised.

5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be resquadded later in the event, but resquadding is not guaranteed, and non-participation is a possibility.

6. Should a shooter being late for his squad not be resquadded or elect to withdraw from the event, any refund of nominations paid is not guaranteed.

7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.

8. Competitors will be called upon to referee or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee or score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the loss of one target in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the loss of one target may be incurred in the event concerned.

9. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised.

10. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with an appointed jury.

12. Optional purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

13. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

14. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.

15. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals, trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.

16. Nominations will close 10.30am Friday, 10.00am Saturday and Sunday or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the NSWCTA Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

19. All competitors must comply with Firearm Licensing Laws in their state of residence.
